"For they cast down every man his rod, and they became Serpents; but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods." (Exodus 7:12).

It is not so much our purpose, at this time, to look into the question as to what the rod of Aaron, and the Serpent it became, may be symbolic of, but rather to observe a general

Truth from this verse of scripture, namely: where God presents the GENUINE, Satan at once produces COUNTERFITS. Since the Counterfit or Imitation is produced for the express purpose to DECEIVE. it must needs be so near in APPEARANCE to the Genuine, as to make it difficult, and for many impossible to SEE the difference, and be confused and accept the COUNTERFIT FOR THE GENUINE.

In the matter of merchandise or money, deception may not be too bad, but in matters of religious Beliefs and Doctrines involving Truth and Error, and even Life and Death, a proper discernment is of the greatest importance. No generation which ever lived before us, needed to heed the words of the Lord more carefully than we today: "Take heed that no man deceive you; For many shall come in my Name saying: I am Christ: and shall deceive many." "And what I say unto you, I say unto ALL. WATCH!" (Mark 13). Our text in Exodus suggests, what also is observed in daily life, that, while there is only ONE GENUINE, there are, as a rule, MORE IMITATIONS: "For they cast down EVERY MAN HIS ROD, and they became,-like Aaron's rod-Serpents." One can readily imagine, how for the moment, Moses and Aaron, the Servants of God, must have been perplexed and shocked at the sight of the numerous Serpents, brought forth by their enemies, moving around in aimless confusion, in which to them, for the moment, the identity of their OWN Serpent may have been lost. But God. to them that obev Him, brings victory out of apparent defeat and failure: for

"Aaron's rod had power and swallowed up their rods." The GEN-UINE will always DESTROY the COUNTERFIT, which has the appearance and the form but not the Power and the substance of the REAL. "For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers . . . yet they will have "a FORM of Godliness, but denying the Power thereof: from such turn away." The outward CON-FORMITY to Godliness of the Ungodly, makes the "last days," in which we no doubt live, "perilous times," as Paul had prophetically foreseen and forewarned in his epistles. (I Tim. 4; II Tim. 3). THE WOLF has learned how to wear SHEEP'S clothing. "And no marvel: for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light . . . and his ministers . . . as the ministers of righteousness." (II Cor. 11:13-15).

"false We read of "false Gods," Christs," "false Prophets," "false Apostles," which say they are Apostles and are not, (Rev. 2:2) and those which say they are Jews and are not, (2:9) and of Sardis: "that thou hast a name that thou livest, and art dead," and of Laodicea: "thou sayest I am rich . . . and knowest not that thou art . . . poor and blind and naked." There is a "First Love," which can be left, as Ephesus did, for a love, which is not love, and there are "First Works" from which this Church fell, to do "Works" which are not works and which cannot ABIDE, but are reduced to ashes in the fire of Judgment, before the Judgment Seat of Christ, which "shall try every man's work, of what sort it is." (I Cor. 3: 11-15). There is a "Love in word and in tongue" and "a love in deed and in truth" and "without dissimulation." (I John 3:18; Rom. 12:9).

There is a "Preaching which is in vain," a "Faith which is in vain" a "Hope which is in vain" and a "Worship which is in vain." There is "Lip service" with far from God and hardened hearts and a multitude of "false doctrines of the devils" (I Tim. 4:1) and many winds of doctrines. which carry about and toss the children to and fro, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive." (Eph. 4:14)

THE SILVER LINING

These quotations are from the Word of God and it is awful and shocking to realize that we "dwell even where Satan's Seat is" (Rev. 2:13) who also is a liar and the father of lies, and who is permitted to produce, right alongside of God's GENUINE and TRUE, his COUNTERFITS and IMI-TATIONS and the FALSE, not only of false Gods, false Christs, false Christians and false Ministers, preaching a "perverted" or "another Gospel, which is not another," (Gal. 1: 6-7) and false doctrines, but also make void and in VAIN man's worship vain his preaching, vain his faith, and vain his running in a false or "blind" zeal which is not according to knowledge, to establish a righteousness. which is likewise in vain.

In such a spiritual wilderness of Babylonian confusion, how can I know the Voice and the Way and the Truth and the Life and the Light to come unto the Father? By the WORD OF GOD, which is Truth (John 17: 17). Spirit and Life (John 6:63) and Light (Ps. 119:105) and using the written WORD OF TRUTH,—and not our thoughts, reasoning or visions, the SPIRIT OF TRUTH as the second witness to Truth, will faithfully lead the teachable and obedient INTO ALL TRUTH. (John 16:13-15).

It should ever be remembered that the Holy Spirit "shall not speak of himself" and that "He shall teach you ALL THINGS, and bring all things to your REMEMBRANCE. whatsoever I (Christ) HAVE SAID unto you." (John 14:26). Even as the Word which Christ spoke, while He was in the world was NOT HIS, but the Father's. which sent Him; (John 14: 24, 17:8) likewise the Holy Spirit. now in the world, represents Christ and speaks not of Himself or HIS OWN WORD, but Christ's, which sent Him. To say, therefore: The Lord told me. or the Lord showed me, imitating direct revelations by the Holy Spirit. without a written Word to back it up. is taking a great risk, and may be the forbidden "adding unto these things" or "taking away from the words of the book." (Rev. 22:18-19).

Again Christ not only spoke on

earth to His disciples, where He had to leave "many things" unsaid (John 16:12), but He also spoke from heaven, (Heb. 12:25) and gave BY REVE-LATION the Gospel of Grace, (Gal. 1:12) and the "Mystery," (Eph. 3:3), revealed especially to the Apostle Paul. The Revelation of the "Mystery" which hath been hid from ages, fulfilled or completed the Word of God, (Col.1:25-27) and God's good and acceptable and holy WILL, is found and proven within His holy WORD ALONE, with NO FURTHER REVE-LATIONS apart from the Word and with no recognition of dreams or visions or signs as valid considerations in the proving of the PERFECT WILL OF GOD. And "Father not my but thy WILL BE DONE" must ever be the supreme prayer and object of every Christian, even as it also was Christ's. The "first principles of the oracles of God" (Heb. 5:12-14)-or as we would say the A-B-C of the Word of God,-show the WILL of GOD readily even to children and babes in Christ, as laying evidently on the surface, but if we are to leave the first principles and GO ON TO PER-FECTION,—which here does not mean "faultlessness" but in "Faith and Knowledge" a "man fully grown up" unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ" (Eph. 4:13),then "childish things" must be put away. (I Cor. 13:11) and some "skill" (Heb. 5:13) needs to be acquired in "rightly dividing the Word of Truth" and the "Word of Righteousness." (II Tim. 2:15). For Satan, too, does ouote scripture as well as Christ, (Luke 4: 4-12), and the Egyptians,-the World -too can produce Serpents, like as Moses, the Servant of God.

It is a certain fact that all things some time must come to an end. History gives us the sad account of the end of a whole civilization:

"And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth. And God said unto Noah, the END of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and behold, I will destroy them from the earth" (Gen. 6:12, 13).

"Then the LORD rained upon Sodom and upon Gomorrah brimstone and fire from the LORD out of heaven; And he overthrew those cities, and all the pain, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and that which grew upon the ground . . . and, lo, the smoke of the country went up as the smoke of a furnace" (Gen. 19:24, 25, 28).

This already partly answers the question, "WHAT SHALL THE END BE OF THEM THAT OBEY NOT THE GOSPEL OF GOD?" (I Pet. 4:17).

THE END MAY BE SUDDEN DEATH—"He, that being often reproved hardeneth *his* neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy" (Prov. 29:1).

But is this all? Let us note from the New Testament Scripture written several thousand years later that death did not even end it for the people of that early day.

"Even as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves over to fornication, and going after strange flesh, are set forth for an example, SUFFER-ING THE VENGEANCE OF ETER-NAL FIRE." (Jude 7).

WHAT THEN WILL BE THE FINAL END FOR ALL UNGODLY PEOPLE OF THE PAST AND PRESENT?

1. It will BE spiritual and eternal death. "For the END of those (wicked) things is death." (Rom. 6:21).

2. It will BE eternity without God. "Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power" (II Thess. 1:9).

3. It will BE eternal damnation. Jesus said: "So shall it be at the END of the world: the angels shall come forth, and sever the wicked from among the just, And shall cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth" (Matt. 13:49, 50).

In II Thessalonians 1:7, 9, these words are found, "When the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be punished with everlasting

Ye Must Be Born Again

When Jesus spoke to Nicodemus recorded in John 3 and impressed upon him the necessity of being born again, and explained to him how it should be brought about, Nicodemus in perplexity said, "How can these things be?" We may in a like perplexity say the same thing; but it is of the utmost importance that we acquaint ourselves with this subject, as it is as true now as it was then, that "except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Let us briefly look into the necessity of the new birth; what it is, how brought about, and its effect upon our lives.

As we can infer from the subject, we need something better than we have of ourselves. We may be outwardly moral in our lives, clean in our speech, honest in our dealings with our fellowmen, and as far as man can see, live lives above reproach. But if we are honest with ourselves, we know that we are not what we ought to be. That deep down in our hearts there is the blackness of sin; that we are disobedient to and rebellious against God: that "all we like sheep have gone_strav": that we need a new spirit, a new life, a nature in conformity to the will of God. which He alone can supply. In other words we need to be born again.

What, then, is this new birth? It is not a reformation. It is not turning over a new leaf. It is not doing the best we can. It is not haptism. or ioining the church, or doing good works. All these things will follow in their place. But the new birth is more than these. As some one has said: "The new birth is the impartation of a new nature. even God's own nature to the one who is begotten again." We must according to I Pet. 1:23 be "Born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible by the Word of God which liveth and abideth forever." Titus 13:5. "Not by works of righteousness which ye have done. but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration. and renewing of the Holy Ghost." It. is a new life received through the

power of the Word of God, and the Holy Ghost.

It is the fulfillment of Ezek. 36: 26-27, "A new heart also will I give you and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh and will give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments and do them." In the receiving of this nature we pass from spiritual darkness to spiritual light, from spiritual death to spiritual life; from the service of Satan to the service of God. Not only are we in the service of God, but we being born into the family of God, are the children of God. Rom. 8:17. "And if children then heirs: heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ." As the children of God whole nature, and object, and desire of our life is changed. While the flesh with its natural inclinations still lives, the new life has the desire to overcome all sinful inclinations, and can do SO through the power of the Spirit.

How is the new life brought about? Not by anything we can do of ourselves. The most earnest longing, the most intense desire, or even the most fervent praying in themselves can not bring it. It is absolutely out of the power of man in himself to receive this blessing. The longing, the desire and the prayers are necessary. but there must be more than these. There must be a yielding to God. There must be faith in the Lord Jesus Christ who as the Son of God made atonement on Calvary for the sin of the world. There must be acceptance of him as our Saviour, and obedience to God's will, a submission to him in every respect. Then even though our faith is weak. and our will is weak. we can through the power of the Spirit and of the Word receive this blessing. Torrey says: "In the new birth the Word of God is the seed. the human heart is the soil: God by his Holv Spirit. opens the heart to receive the seed. (Acts 16: 14) the hearer believes: the Spirit quickens the seed into life in the receptive heart; the new Divine nature springs up out of the Divine Word; the believer is born again, created anew, made alive, passed out of death into life."

Such an important event can not Mave an effect upon the life. The life to a greater or lesser degree is changed. II Cor. 5:17, "If any man be in Christ he is a new creature. Old things have passed away; behold all things have become new." Life has a different meaning. While pure lawful pleasures and the natural desires of the body can be enjoyed in God's appointed way, yet the glory of God, the advancement of the kingdom, and the good of our fellowman rather than the advancement of self hold first place in our lives. Many things we formerly loved we now detest. Other things which once had no attraction for us we now love. We have a desire to do the will of God, and to follow the plan He has mapped out for our lives, and to keep His commandments. We have a love for the brethren, and have a concern for the salvation of all men. As we have opportunity we desire to do good unto all men. Gal. 6:10. Bible reading. secret prayer, and attending worship are now a delight unto us. And as we exercise ourselves in the privileges of members of the family of God. these things become part of our lives and we can sav like Paul in Gal. 2: 20. "I am crucified with Christ, nevertheless I live: vet not I but Christ liveth in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me."

May we have an earnest desire and a great longing for this blessing. May we fully understand that in order to have salvation we must be born again. And may we through faith vield ourselves in humble submission to God's will, and as we ask we shall receive.

"As many as RECEIVED Him, to them gave He the power to become the Sons of God, even to them that believe on His name." John 1:12.

They put us in camps and we get soup and a little bread. To live from that what we get, it is too little; to die, too much. If we would not have you dear people overseas I don't know how it would have been already. Therefore we are thanking you with all our heart for your very kindness to us. You dear people know just what we need. It is good to have something to wear because the winter is coming again. I remember back two years when I had to go barefoot and had nothing but a thin dress. Back in our home town they have taken everthing away from us; but one thing they can't do is take away our faith in God although we have lost everything in this world that we loved. All the tears that we cry in the still nights that we can't sleep God alone knows. May God bless you for your very kindness to us .
