Mark 14:6— "Let her alone; why trouble ye her? she hath wrought a good work on me."

In this chapter we find Christ had gone to the little town of Bethany, where he met His devoted friends Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. Not long before this He had raised Lazarus from the dead.

Many were present this day also to have a glimpse of Lazarus. As they sat at meat, Mary brought a box of ointment of spikenard, which was very costly, and poured it upon His head and His feet. We might wonder what caused her to perform such an act as this. But if we think how Jesus had relieved her of the many sins she had committed; how he told her of His heavenly home which could be hers; and most miraculous of all -- raised her brother from the dead — no wonder she was prompted to use ointment worth three hundred pence to pour upon her Saviour in appreciation of His great love.

As one writer said: "Her soul filled with loving devotion, she came to her Lord and breaking an alabaster box of Indian spikenard, poured it over His head and feet. It was a precious perfume, but nothing was too precious, too costly for Him whom she loved so devotedly."

icance connected with that holy day, to be concerned with the resurrection of the body of Jesus Christ, which is the most remarkable manifestation and declaration of the power of God.

For all things were created by the word of His power (Ps. 3:6-9), all

things as sustained by the word of His power (Heb. 1:3), and God is working all things after the counsel of His own will (Eph. 1:11).

But when He raised the body of Jesus Christ from the grave, God showed the exceeding greatness of His mighty power (Eph. 1:19-20). He not only raised Him from the dead, but set **Him** at His own right hand in the heavenly **places**, Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come (Eph. 1:21). Christ was crucified through weakness, yet he liveth by the power of God (II Cor. 13:4).

The believer in Christ is assured that the eternal God is working in him that same mighty power, which He wrought in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead (Eph. 1:19-20). He is kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time (I Peter 1:5).

No doubt it was in view of this power working in the believer that caused the apostle Paul to be confident in writing to the church at Philippi: that he which hath begun a good work in you will perfom it until the day of Jesus Christ (Phil. 1:6). He assured the Christians at Rome that God had power to establish them (Rom. 16:25). He prayed for the saints at Colosse that they might be strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joy-fulness (Col. 1:11).

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead not only demonstrates the mighty power of God, but enables the believer in Christ to appropriate the fulness of that power for daily life and labor. We have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us (II Cor. 4:7).

The Mighty Saviour

When Peter went to Caesarea on a special mission, he told Cornelius and his household how God had anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power, and how He went about doing good, and healing all who were oppressed of the devil; for God was with Him; but the people slew Him and hanged Him on a tree.

Then Peter declared, him God raised up the third day, and showed him openly; Not to all the people, but unto witnesses chosen before of God, even to us, who did eat and drink with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach unto the people, and to testify that it is he which was ordained of God **to be** the judge of quick and dead. To him give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins (Acts 10:38-43).

Upon hearing this message, Cornelius and those with him believed on the Lord Jesus Christ unto the remission of their sins, and the Holy Spirit was given to them. Then they were baptized in the name of Jesus Christ as a testimony to their faith and their identification with Christ in His death and resurrection.

They were saved that very hour in the name and by the power of a risen and living Saviour. So what shall we say (of Him), I **am** he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death; (Rev. 1:18).

To know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, we must be made conformable unto his death (Phil. 3:10). Dear friends, why not let your hearts cry out to God for His mercy, grace, and truth, which came by Jesus Christ (St. John 1:17). Go with Him to Calvary's hill, where Jesus died

and shed His blood as a ransom for all that acknowledge themselves as sinners. Beg the almighty God in heaven, who alone is inviolable and omnipotent, to give you grace to go through the process of true repentance, a real heart searching; and a consuming of things that pertain to this world by a purging and cleansing of the heart with the shed blood of the Lamb. Through this make that happy experience of a spiritual regeneration, thereby becoming reconciled with God through Jesus Christ and through the same become spiritually minded, which is life and peace *(Rom. 8:6).

We are told that some years ago one of the Chicago stockyards had a trained ox, which they named Judas, whose only business was to lead thousands of cattle to their slaughter. The new animals, coming in the daily herds, were suspicious and shy of the road or passage way that led to death. They had an instinctive terror with which nature had endowed them for their protection. But "Judas," calm and serene, walked hopefully ahead of each new installment of meat cattle, disarming their fears. Leaving them to their fate, he found a private passage way by which he could return and get some more victims.

"... but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose." (Luke 3:16).

"Art thou he that should **come**? or look we for another?" And in that same hour He cured many of THEIR infirmities and plagues, and of evil spirits . . . tell John . . . how that the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, to the poor the **Gospel** is preached." (Luke 7:20-22).

"Jesus . . . preaching the **Gospel** of the **kingdom of God**. And saying, the time is fulfilled, and the **Kingdom of God** is at hand: repent ye and believe the gospel" (Mark 1:14-15).

"He preaching and shewing the glad tidings (good news) of the Kingdom of God" (Luke 8:1).

The person, the position, and the ministry of John the Baptist is a unique and interesting one, in that he is the last Old Testament Prophet and one of the greatest men ever born of women. His ministry represents the dividing line between Old Testament inspired prophetic "promises MADE unto the Fathers" of Faith, OF One and IN One, which was to come, and Christ's New Testament ministry of CONFIRMING—in Word and Deed—these promises so made (Rom. 15:8).

The language which John uses also clearly indicates that they were looking for a MIGHTY ONE to come with POWER and Authority to JUDGE in Righteousness, with a "wrath to come" from which the impenitent cannot flee, and ONE having so GREAT A GLORY, as to make a great Prophet unworthy to stoop down before Him and unloose the latchet of His shoes. KINGDOMS, their Thrones, and to Rule over them, are always associated with the idea of "power and great glory" (Luke 21: 27). Even Satan must share this viewpoint, because in tempting Christ, he speaks of the power and the glory of the Kingdoms of the World, which he offered to Christ by the short-cut of devil worship, thus proposing to eliminate the weakness and the shame and the beforehand suffering of the Cross. It is ever God's holy and righteous way to exalt Him with Power and Glory and a Name above Names, who humbleth HIMSELF most, with Christ having the pre-eminence also in these things.

On the other hand, is it ever the devil's way to eliminate Righteousness from the Power of Rulership, making it a "Might without Right" and without GLORY and degenerating it into oppressive Violence and brute and blind FORCE; a basis for war and a hindrance to Peace. The Glory likewise, which the Devil claims is "delivered" to him (Luke 4:6), is a perverted one; it builds great monuments to forces that destroy as a price which the opponent must pay to make oneself secure, rather than to pay a price himself to reconcile an opponent, and make Security and Peace and Life and the pursuit of common possession. The "endtime" will worship the god of forces (Dan. 11:38), and the perversion of God-and Christ-delegated governmental Power and Glory will find its Zenith in the description of Revelation 13, where the anti-Christian World Ruler, and the many with him, finally shall have paid the devil's price and worship the devil in the bargain for his kind of Power and Glory will bring in the greatest tribulation of all time upon our race, instead of the promised cure for its ills. To "ENFORCE" international PEACE, apart from Righteousness among the Nations, in the hope to bring "Joy to the World" and the Kingdom of God to men on earth, the essence of which is: "righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost" (Rom. 14:17), and do it without the KING of that KINGDOM upon His rightful Throne, and the Government "upon His shoulder," (Isa. 9:6) and do it without men being born again of the Spirit, as a must condition to "see the Kingdom of God or to enter into it (John 3:3-8); to undertake to bring in the KINGDOM conditions of "PEACE and JOY" thus by FORCE, while the devil is unbound and not in prison, (Rev. 20:1-3), will prove one of the greatest DECEPTIONS OF ALL TIME and mis-directions of

man's efforts and resources in a Zeal that is "not according to knowledge" and in a self-effort of UNBELIEF and PRIDE, that blinds man to God's "way of peace" (Rom. 3:17).

John the Baptist together with all the holy Prophets since the world began—like Enoch, the seventh from Adam (Jude 14)—looked for ONE TO COME, upon whose shoulder shall be the GOVERNMENT, and who shall be "called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." They looked for a rod to come forth out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch to grow out of his roots, The "Holy One of Israel in the midst of thee" (Isa. 12:6), upon whom the Spirit of the LORD will rest in all the fullness of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Might, and Knowledge and of the Fear of the Lord; to judge in Righteousness and to reprove in equity and to "smite the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips" slay the wicked (Isaiah 11). They looked for "the tabernacle of David, which is fallen down, to be built again, and the ruins thereof again to be set up, that the residue of men might seek after the LORD" (Acts 15:16-17). They looked for "the increase of HIS government and peace" to have no end, "upon the throne of David, and upon his KING-DOM, to order it, and to establish it with JUDGMENT" and JUSTICE, from henceforth and for ever, (Isa. 9:6-7).

They looked for the mountain of the LORD'S house to be established in the top of the mountains and exalted above the hills-that is, the Kingdom of God to be established above the Kingdoms of men and exalted above the Nations of the earth, and learn the ways and walk in the paths of the God of Jacob, and beat their swords into plowshares and learn WAR NO MORE. They looked for the wolf also to dwell with the lamb, the leopard to lie down with the kid the lion to eat straw like the ox, a little child to lead them and the suckling child to play on the hole of the asp-the poisonous serpent perfectly harmless. They looked for the earth to be full of the knowledge of the LORD

and a root of Jesse to stand for an ensign of the people. (Isa. 11:1-10). They seen in the prophecy they uttered, the desert to blossom as the rose, the eyes of the blind to be opened, the ears of the deaf to be unstopped; the lame man to leap as an hart, and the tongue of the dumb to sing. (Isa. 35).

They waited, like Simeon, for the "consolation of Israel"; they longed to see the Lord's Christ (Messiah) and His Salvation and the GLORY of the people of Israel and "looked for the Redemption of Jerusalem and of the Nation of Israel"; the "RESTORING again of the Davidic KINGDOM to Israel, the natural Seed of Abraham, with His great Son upon the throne of His father David,-to FIRST to bless them and then "all the kindreds of the earth." (Acts 1:6 and 3:25-26). They saw Jerusalem the Center and Israel the lender among the Nations and not the borrower, and the "head, and not the tail" (Deut. 28:12). They forseen the Davidic Kingdom RE-STORED TO ISRAEL, expanded and extended until "The kingdoms of this world are become THE KINGDOMS of our Lord, and of his Christ" (Revelation 11:15) and "The LORD shall be king over all the earth." (Zech. 14:9).

Such then were "the TIMES OF REFRESHING" to "COME FROM THE PRESENCE OF THE LORD;" and such was and still is the amazing and glorious PROGRAM prophetically outlining the "RESTITUTION OF ALL THINGS," which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began. A PROGRAM, which last but not least, will RESTORE "DOMINION (TO OUR RACE) . . . OVER ALL THE EARTH . . . and SUBDUE IT" (Gen. 1:26, 28) in the "last Adam," which was lost in the First Adam, that "all things" so RESTORED will bless man with Peace and Security and Prosperity, instead of cursing him with more sorrow and sweat and blood and tears. Once more "ALL THINGS" will blend together into a harmoniously functioning Creation, free from groaning and from pain, approximating the GOODNESS in the which it was originally created.

The consummation of this future

prophetic Program is bound up in Israel's earthly destiny, and the visible and temporal blessings of Israel and the Nations of the earth, and centers around the kingdom of God or OF HEAVEN, with God's Will done on earth, as it is in heaven, to be realized in the near "at hand" dispensation of the millennial KINGDOM OF POWER and GLORY, "the GLORY THAT SHOULD FOLLOW," when God, through His Christ, the Messiah with His Saints, shall RULE and REIGN in the earth and the affairs of undone man at the end of his rope. (Revelation 5:10)

The blessings of the Kingdom of God cannot prosper with the curse of Sin side by side. Therefore did John the Baptist, in announcing the KINGDOM OF HEAVEN as being "at hand" and introducing the KING to Israel, call them to REPENTANCE and to his Baptism for the REMIS-SION OF SINS. Israel did not repent then, and John lost his head as a gift to a dancing damsel by a vainglorious ruler. Christ preached the same message of REPENTANCE, and his disciples baptized even more than John for the REMISSION OF SINS. But again Israel's Rulers "rejected the counsel of God against themselves," they were not baptized, their sins remained, and the KING WAS CRUCIFIED. After His resurrection, another and third effort was made to bring in the KINGDOM and now on a world-wide scale, as we read: "And that REPENTANCE and REMIS-SION OF SINS should be preached in his name among all nations," but,and THIS IS THE PIVOTAL POINT: "Beginning at Jerusalem" (Luke 24:47) and "both IN Jerusalem, and in ALL Judaea, and Samaria, and (then) unto the uttermost part of the world." (Acts 1:8). Again the Apostles called on the "Men and brethren" of Israel to "REPENT, and be baptized-in the name of Jesus Christ for THE REMISSION OF SINS" (Acts 2: 38). According to verses 5 and 14 they remained at JERUSALEM as they were instructed (Luke 24:49) and addressed their message to the "men of Judea, and ALL YE that dwell AT JERUSALEM."

Once again did Jerusalem NOT RE-PENT, but continuing in their former tradition, they killed the Prophets and stoned them that were sent to her, by which most of the Apostles lost their lives. And until Jerusalem and all Judaea will REPENT, the KINGDOM with its temporal Blessings in POWER and GLORY will not come with "OBSERVATION."

To look upon the "Great Commission as Christ's instructions applicable today,—while Israel is still scattered among the Nations and in traditonal blindness, and expect Christ's ALL POWER to back it up with signs and miracles following, is undispensational and ineffective, a human effort, and God's Program in Reverse. To separate the signs from the Commission is unscriptural.

From Isaiah 11:1—"And there shall come forth a rod [a shoot] out of the stem [stock] of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots [shall bear fruit]:

Revelation 11:15: (from the Jamieson, Fausset and Brown commentary): The kingdom (sovereignty) of (over) the world is our Lord's and His Christ's. The kingdoms of the world give way to the kingdom of (over) the world exercised by Christ. The earth-kingdoms are many: His shall be one.
