True Love and Faith Toward Jesus Christ

There is no word misunderstood or misused as the word of faith. True faith is the knowledge of our own sin, and that Christ can redeem us by the shedding of his blood and only through His Grace and mercy and through true repentance can we accept so great a salvation. Most people have faith in Christ and it is not just knowing of Christ but knowing Him personally. As it says in John 17, this faith is not human but divine, a free gift from God Almighty. . . .

No one has a right to boast of his own works. Our repentance is grant-

ed to us by God, through the precious blood of Jesus Christ, and the seal which makes us a child of God is the Holy Ghost. Our salvation is of Grace. The true faith is revealed by James in the words, "the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory." Our own faith like our works can never get us into heaven. This explains why so many that profess to be saved fall by the wayside. Faith can be misused, as James refers to the twisting of true faith in these words—have not the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory,

with respect of persons. Paul warned Timothy. "I charge thee before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, and the elect angels, that thou observe these things without preferring one before another, doing nothing by partiality". I Tim. 5:21.

The Apostolic Church requires men who are full of true faith and full of the Holy Spirit. What a wonderful church we can have, if we all together be faithful men, able to teach others the true word of God. I Tim. 4:16 "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." We must examine ourself from time to time and give ourself to constant prayer. The word of God, which unfolds the glory of God must be given first place. Everything else is secondary.

And what is that thou would put with Christ? What are thy good works? No one is righteous but God alone. Rely on Him and we cannot fail; He is the rock of our salvation.

The Apostles devoted themselves to prayer. (Acts 6:4-5) They were ministers to the New Testament. We can refresh ourselves before the Lord in the knowledge of the Scriptures. How wonderful to read out of God's Holy book; let us seek it prayerfully. Let us be upright in our walk of life, doing all the good we can to those around about us, always esteeming others higher than ourselves.

If the church is to prosper spiritually it must be founded on love toward God and our fellowmen. The Holy church at Ephesus lost their first love. The members unconsciously turned their eyes away from the great God who redeemed them. They were no doubt praising and honoring one another, glorying in their own accomplishments. When men belittle the value of faith and uphold the merits of good works, they do not have

God's point of view. I do not know of any other way for the child of God to walk, than by true faith. The Lord knoweth them all and let anyone that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity, strife, and contention. Guilty is the soul who is charged with this. If a church is to prosper spiritually it must be founded on Love. The whole law of God can be put in one word, and that word is **LOVE**.

I would beg you to read your scripture prayerfully with an upright heart, letting nothing come between you and God. Make it a rule in the morning to never see the face of man until you have seen the face of God. We should finish each day as we began it, on our knees asking forgiveness of every idle word or evil thought, and never let the sun go down until you have made right any wrong or unkind thing you have done toward anyone. . . . Otherwise God cannot hear your prayer.

We may think we are right, but we could be so wrong. Let us be careful in every little thing we do. God knows what our every thought is and He takes it close. If the righteous scarcely be saved it is something to think about. We must be holy or we cannot enter the realms of Heaven.

Time passes so quickly; like the clock on the wall, how quickly it ticks out the seconds. Every tick tells us the time is going swiftly by and near approach of Eternity. It is my sincere prayer daily that when that hour comes that I can rejoice in the language of the Psalmist, "He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust." Enable me to keep Thy commandments; empower me for Thy service; and preserve me blameless before thee until the coming of Christ . . . Amen.
