My dear son:

Your letter was received yesterday. and I was very much pleased to learn how you are feeling at heart. Yes, He also shed His holy blood for you and your sins at the cross, and that out of pure love and mercy for all mankind, for we would all have had to be lost in all eternity, if our loving Saviour had not come into this world to pay for our sins with His precious blood. Therefore, we should love our Saviour above all, from all our heart and all our soul, and follow Him in obedience all the days of our life. O, my dear son, there is a difference between those who repent only out of fear of punishment and damnation and do not have the love for Jesus; such do not have the strength to endure on the straight and narrow path of life. The yoke of Christ becomes too heavy for them, and becomes a burden to them, and the way becomes too narrow, because they lack the love for the Saviour.

Dear son, it is of great importance that you fully comprehend the great love of God and our dear Saviour, and out of love give your heart to Him. Call unto Him earnestly that He may be merciful to you and save and rescue you from your lost estate. Alone the blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, can cleanse us from our sins. The loving Saviour is today yet sitting upon the mercy seat and is calling through the gospel to all mankind, Come unto me all ye who are weary

and heavy laden, I will quicken you. Take upon you my yoke and learn from me. For I am meek and lowly at heart. I will give you rest for your soul.

Therefore, do not let the evil enemy hold you back, even if you are still young; just become really childlike. true and upright, and pray to the dear Lord that He may enlighten your heart and show you everything where you have done wrong, so that you may be able to bring real fruits of repentance. Should the enemy come to you and tell you that you did not commit this or that sin, still you will find in your heart the sinful root upon which the curse of God was pronounced. But, through real repentance and conversion, we can find pardon and forgiveness in the blood of Christ.

O, my dear son, learn clearly how the sinful lust of the flesh, even in early youth, leads to that which is evil, and no one need feel ashamed to confess before God and man, for this is an evil root from which man must be thoroughly cleansed and purified.

Even before the flood, God did say, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for he also is flesh or fleshlyminded. Therefore, God destroyed

them through the flood.

Now, my dear son, that you ask me for forgiveness pleases me from all my heart, and I gladly forgive you everything from all my heart, and will also pray to Jesus for you, that He may be gracious to you, and show His mercy, so that you may become a lamb of Jesus Christ, and also praise your Redeemer with all children of God.

So may the dear Lord give His blessing to these words which I have written unto you, that they may bear good fruit.

Greetings to you from all my heart. I wish for you the grace and help from God to break through from death unto life.

SOJOURNS TO ALABAMA

Henry Kilgus (Continued)

The first visits to Alabama were made in the year of 1939.

The first members baptized were at Hillsboro.

Henry Stricklin and his wife, Pearl, were baptized April 28, 1940; Edgar Sides and his wife, Mary, Sept. 1, 1940; Dessie Siniard and Ruth Smith, Nov. 18, 1940. They were the first six members. A little later on, Martha Evans, Louis Goode, Inez Brooks, and Minnie Kyle were added.

They were all baptized in a spring stream, running through Bro. Stricklin's pasture, where quite a number more were baptized by Bro. Bauman and I since.

The first elders and ministers that visited Alabama, during the year of 1940, while the first souls were prov-

ed and baptized, were Elder Noah Hartzler and his brother—Amos, Elder Bro. Ernest Graf, Bro. Henry Sabo and Bro. Henry Beer, who also spent three days there, together, October 7, 8, and 9 in the year of 1939. (Except probably Bro. Sabo.)

During the week of February 9 to the 16, in 1940, Alabama again was visited by Elder Bro. Graf, Elder Bro. Schrock and Bro. Henry Beer.

On April 26, 1940, Elder Bro. Graf, Elder Bro. Hartzler and Bro. Henry Beer spent a few days in Alabama.

During the week of June 21 to 27, 1940, Bro. Ben Heiniger, Elder Bro. George Yergler and Bro. Henry Beer visited Alabama.

August 30 to Sept. 5, 1940, by Elder Bro. Sam Aeschliman, Elder Bro. Phil Beyer and Bro. Jonas Virkler of Castorland and Croghan, New York.

From Nov. 11 to Nov. 18, 1940, Elder Bro. Noah Schrock, Bro. Fred Gutwein and Bro. Henry Beer, with a number of others, visited Alabama.

As the group of believers grew, and many friends and children gathered, it made too many to have the services at Bro. Stricklin's home, so the brothers began planning what could be done about building a church. Mr. Graham, a plantation owner for which Bro. Stricklin worked a long time, offered to donate a piece of ground on which to build.

In 1940, a small church house was built on the Graham land near Hillsboro by brothers from Rittman, Ohio. Bro. Amos Hartzler was the leading

carpenter.

They enjoyed this new church for a short time, but it soon burned down; again services had to be held in homes, school houses, or churches that were not in use.

Later, in 1942, a roof was built over the basement foundation, which is

now again their church. This was built by a group of brothers from Rittman and Bluffton.
