HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

Northwest of Morton on the VFW Road, the home is sponsored by the Apostolic Christian Churches of America and will be situated on a 40-acre tract $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Morton.

A Washington, Ill., firm, Koehl Construction Company, has been awarded the general contract. Meister Brothers of Peoria has the plumbing and heating contract, and Stephens Electric Company of Morton will install electrical service. The home is scheduled for occupancy in June, 1971.

The one story brick structure will accommodate 50 mentally or physically handicapped residents in a home-like atmosphere. The building will be air-conditioned, provide space for therapy and crafts, and provide a living room with fireplace.

Thomas N. Landes & Associates of Chillicothe have incorporated a variety of features into the design with use of different materials and colors to minimize the institutional appearance of the residence. The building design will provide capacity to accommodate expansion

of the facility to 100 residents in the future.

Policies and plans of the home, established by a board of directors representing Apostolic Christian churches throughout the U.S., have provided for 24-hour residential care and limited activities, plus planned purchase of diagnostic treatment and training services.

A simple and brief yet very impressive service was held on Sunday, June 7 at the site. It was attended by an estimated 250 people from a number of the surrounding churches.

Elder Bros. Russell Rapp and Roy Sauder were in charge. Russell read from John 9: 1-4, and Galations 6:2. These particular portions of scripture should be a great source of comfort to families who have a handicapped child, and are certainly an exhortation to all of us, that our being spared from the care and heartache does not exclude us from the responsibility of helping those loved ones who do need a home for their handicapped. I believe it is a wonderful opportunity that is afforded us to have

a part in such an undertaking as this.

Russell reminded us that there have been many tears shed over handicapped children and that it is wonderful to see this Home becoming a reality, after years of study and planning. Roy asked that God might bless this undertaking, as he led us in a closing prayer. Frank Honegger, treasurer, turned the first spade of ground to complete the service and mark the beginning of the construction.

Earth-moving equipment was on the grounds, and work was officially begun on Monday morning, June 8. The estimated time of construction is 10-11 months.

Again we want to thank every one that has helped in any way toward the furtherance of this Home for Handicapped and pray God's richest blessing upon you. It is the intent of the committee to visit as many of our churches as possible to answer any questions and resolve any doubts that are it the minds of our brethren an friends.

We are very much aware of our dependency upon God's blessings and your prayerful, moral, and financial support. May He continue to move the hearts of the brethren and friends to that end.

To receive from the Lord is really great. Reading is good, yet this is more than reading. "For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you," ... When we receive from the Lord, it is written in our heart. It prompts and moves us to live those words. To move men in the deep reality of truth, that only the Lord

Why was there this bread? Why did the Lord give this, about breaking? Jesus said that He was the bread of life. What is life? Glorious love provided, "That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread:"... We humans had disobeyed God.

In that day, we surely died. We died into darkness. Without God. We couldn't appreciate Him. He is life . . . the bread . . . the joy, the beauty, the breath of kindly living that knows no shadow of turning. . .

We know what good food here can do: appetizing menu, skilled cooking, pleasant smells from the kitchen. We are hungry. We sit down to a good meal. We like it. How much more, beyond measure, is it to find God, real bread, real life. Nothing outside of God can satisfy our soul.

He is from everlasting to ever-

lasting. He always was the same, perfectly beautiful. He died for us. 'And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me."

Never can we exhaust. Nor reach all while here. This far-reaching love. Time's reckless logic falls. Ahead was Gethsemane. Death visited there. What whirlwind of anguish was this that made Him so heavy? His soul sorrowful even unto death? His heart was pressed, and His eyes wet. Through the mists, we grasp the sweetness of One who was atoning in the travail of His soul. Never, never had there been anything like this.

He won there. That was the night, and the morning came on, and night again at noon. For God, the Son, the cruel hurts flung from bitter mouths was felt in so loving a heart. But bearing night on the nails! Every hot moment pressed a pain in the soul. Then that cry, "Why"! He doesn't say, Why do I feel, or Why does it seem, but "why hast thou forsaken me?"

Love splendored in such greatness will take eternity to show all His kindness. Here was a test of endurance no other could possibly trod. The angry thorns laced their wound; a blood-drop would star The nails, those nails of man's inhumanity, and breakers of our Lord's body, strode the shouting nerves. His blood, sinless, pure, and innocent, was there. Then the body hangs; the spirit has flown. One comes and with the speared point breaks the body . . . there flows out blood and water.

This, mark you, from the body of God, the Son, He did not deserve the slightest mark of criticism. There is a fellowship in His suffering. We could not be comfortable otherwise. What opportunity to be a companion, a brother, to the incomparable Christ. We are saved by His suffering, and daily must we feed in this fact. It needs to strike home. We need to show The trumpets for the soul point us to this place of continuous victory: "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come."
