Greetings in our precious Saviour's name.

Many of our brethren from our congregations have been active in giving and distributing the Bible. Many accounts have been heard of the blessings realized in visiting the homes, rest homes, prisons and rescue missions, when inquiry and request has come from someone wishing to have a Bible or Testament. Many requests come from individuals who have sight problems, where a large print Bible or Testament enables them to read again. We now have the KJV of the Bible on cassette tapes for those persons who can no longer see. For the blind, we have sets of braille Bibles in stock, ready for those needing a braille Bible.

During the past two years, 24,702 Bibles and Testaments have been shipped to our congregations for distribution by our brethren.

Paul said, "I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee...". We need faith to please God. A simple faith in God is necessary for our salvation because without it we cannot get going, can we?

Belief that Jesus is seated at the right hand of God interceding for us, belief that Jesus died and shed His blood for our sins, the faith that we have in His name and in the work that He did is the catalyst that brings forth the response, the action and the results.

Jesus was powerful. He could heal anyone who was brought to Him, and yet He once said that He couldn't do many good works where He was because of unbelief. How important it is that we have an unfeigned faith. We desire it. We work on it and hold it precious. This saving faith is most precious to us.

Paul said, "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." II Timothy 1:7. When we compare the time before we were converted with the time after we were converted, compare ourselves when we were serving the god of this world by fulfilling our fleshly desires with our attitudes and behavior when we are under the love of Christ and want His will in our lives, then we see the truth of this: "God hath not given us the spirit of fear . . .".

What happens when we give our lives to Christ? We say, "Lord, come in and take over." He can indeed remove all the fear, and He does remove it. There is no question about it. He takes away that fear of hell. He takes away the fear of death which we are subject to when we don't have peace within our hearts.

I was talking with my wife yesterday about the reason we repented. I said that I had never had a fear of death or a fear of hell at any time. I just wanted to get the most out of my life. She told me that she had been plagued with a fear of dying before making preparation. There are different ways in which we are called to God, but indeed we are all called.

I wonder how many in this audience today have not made their preparation and do not feel right in their hearts, how many have that fear. How terrible it is to live with fear! A fear of death, a fear of dying, a fear of tomorrow, a fear of what is going to happen. Only the Lord and Saviour can take away that fear... and He will take it away. He will give us peace so that we don't have to fear death. We don't have to be afraid of dying. We don't have to fear hell because Jesus paid the price.

His way is the only way. Jesus said, "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved." John 10:9.

"I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing. If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch . . . withered . . . and burned."

John 15:5, 6.

That's how serious and how important it is. That is how much love there is. It's got to be Christ. Christ is the answer.

Paul said, "Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me his prisoner: but be thou partaker of the afflictions of the gospel according to the power of God; Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began." II Timothy 1:8, 9.

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:" Ephesians 2:8. Think about that. He called us with a holy calling; and by His grace, the undeserved gift of God, He has given us eternal life.

The Lord didn't want us to go through life thinking about what is ahead and preparing for our retirement, and then die and have nothing left. Why did He give His Son? Because He has instilled in us a never-dying soul!

We have rules and regulations, haven't we, in whatever business we are in? We need those to keep order. We need laws in our land to keep order. It is for our own good; it is for the benefit of all. When someone is disobedient, he needs to be corrected, chastised, disciplined and warned. Otherwise there is no substance and no order. There is only confusion.

Have you ever been in a situation where you had to discipline or correct? Sometimes it is hard to do because we feel for those who receive it. We see their weaknesses and yet, if they are disobeying, it must be done.

It is the same with God. God said that His Word is faithful. He cannot change it. That is why Jesus wept when He cried out to a disobedient people, "How often would I have gathered thy children together as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings (I would protect you), and ye would not!" Matthew 23:37.

Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest (for your soul)... For my yolk is easy, and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28, 30. Just "come".

The Lord gave us examples of those who followed Him unto the resurrection of life, and of those who were rebellious unto the resurrection of damnation

We are reminded of the wonderful love of Jesus Christ and of God the Father in heaven. We can only acquire Him as our Father and speak to Him by the spirit of adoption (whereby we cry, Father) through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. We must cast aside our old self, repenting with a Godly sorrow, and walk in newness of life.

"For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation..." the Apostle Paul said. II Corinthians 7:10. That's the only way to salvation.

We realize that we are as grasshoppers before God. He is as a Potter making a vessel. He forms us, He shapes us, and He can do with us what He wills. The very hairs of our head are numbered, and He can put an end to our life whenever He sees fit. That's the kind of God with whom we deal.

Do you remember what Jesus told us? He said, "Fear not, . . . it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Luke 12:32. Those of us who have made the beginning are still on the way. None of us can enter into heaven without Him; we need Him every day of our lives, don't we?

We are often perplexed by the afflictions and the sufferings that go along with human flesh, by human nature, and by life itself. But we can say, as the Apostle Paul said, "I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I've committed unto him against that day." II Timothy 1:12.

May we be stirred up again this morning, loved ones. May we be reminded that there is a day coming when, looking to Him, we can enter into heaven and enjoy the realm of eternal life with our Lord and Savior.

SERMON BY BRO. BYRON J. STOLLER OF GRIDLEY, IL

Text: II Timothy 1

Paul began his letter with gratitude for the blessing of God and for the faith of Timothy. Then he went on to tell Timothy to endure and to keep the precious faith that was delivered into his heart. Paul told him to hold fast to the precious truth of the gospel. The advice that he gave Timothy applys to us also. That's the magnitude and the power of God.

There are hundreds of people here today in this congregation, and not two of you look alike. There are billions of people in the world and no two people are exactly alike. Yet, we can all take the Word of God and apply it to our hearts and lives. It is the living Word. It is the Word of God that we live by, that we will die by and that we will be judged by.

God is merciful and compassionate. He sent His Son into the world, and the Lord said, "This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent." John 6:29.

It is the will of God that no one who believes upon the Lord Jesus will be eternally lost. It is the will of God to "have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth." I Timothy 2:4.

This letter to Timothy was written by the Apostle Paul who said that he was, "an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God . . ." II Timothy 1:1.

Probably we all know of the calling that the Apostle Paul had from God. It was a very forceful calling. It was most unusual. The Lord spoke to him personally, talked to him and struck him down. Paul responded to that calling. He was a man who had been serving sin and doting the work of the devil, but he was under a cloak. A thought of righteousness was in his heart, and yet he was wrong. The Lord called him, had mercy upon him and drew him.

The Apostle Paul then went forth and was obedient to the Lord. I think

all of us can take a lesson from that. When we are called, when we are told what we need to do, we should not be disobedient to the call.

God specifically points out in the Word that it is His will that all men should be saved. Jesus said, "Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of Man (Jesus), and drink his blood, ye have no life in you." John 6:53.

"Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." John 3:3. That's the message of the gospel of Jesus Christ!

It is not that we wish to threaten or try to force anyone, but God in His love has provided only one way. He said that the way is narrow; He said that it is straight. Loved ones, that means just what it says.

It is a straight and restrictive way. How? In the fact that we have to do what the Father in heaven tells us to do. We have to aspire unto holiness... "without which no man shall see the Lord." Hebrews 12:14. That's the Word of God.

Salvation is through Jesus Christ, and that was the calling of the Apostle Paul. That was the word that he preached to all who would listen to him. He said he counted everything that he had before that as dung. Nothing could compare with the word that he needed to preach to the people who were lost in sin, to make them realize their condition and to prepare their souls for eternity.

I was talking with a sister who had in turn been talking with a young man of high school age. He said that he is not going to do anything until he feels the calling of God. He doesn't feel as though he has been called; and until he feels that he has been called, he is not going to do anything about his soul's salvation.

Maybe we have all gone through that

at one time or another, perhaps thinking, "If God is there, why can't He do something to call me and shake me into what I should do, if I need to do something?"

Loved ones, today is the day of salvation. The Lord is calling through His Word. If we have not availed ourselves of what the Lord wants us to do, if we have not repented and been born again, if we have not believed upon and confessed His name, then we are not free before Him, according to the Word of God.

We praise God for the convicting spirit that can go into a heart when he asks the question, "Am I saved?". There is nothing more precious, I believe, than when we ask ourselves that question, "Am I saved? What have I done with Jesus Christ, and Him crucified?"

Many heard the Word, pointed a deaf ear, and walked away in the Apostle Paul's time. There probably will be many today who will hear the Word of God, and walk away with a deaf ear. But we cannot help that. The Word must be preached. The gospel must be preached. Self justification can come into a heart, but that won't stand before an Almighty God.

We must all stand before the judgment seat of Christ and give an account of how we have lived. The Books will be opened. We will not be able to utter one word of self defense. May we be covered by the blood of Jesus Christ.

Paul wrote, "To Timothy, my dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day." II Timothy 1:2, 3.

Let's never underestimate the power of prayer. When we have a need for
