SISTER NEEDED TO TEACH IN JAPAN

Dear Brothers and Sisters-in-the-Lord,

We send you warm greetings of love in Jesus name. Our precious Word tells us, "... the prayer of a righteous man availeth much . ..". And we are so appreciative of the prayers many of you breathe for the brethren, friends and work here in Japan.

We write you today with a specific need we wish to share, however. As many of you know, our church operates two basic outreach programs here in Japan: an English school and a private kindergarten. And our need today has to do with finding a sister to teach in our kindergarten.

The Shioda-American kindergarten is located in the country about one and a half hours drive from the western suburbs of Tokyo. It is a 2-year comprehensive, Christian-based English kindergarten program for 32 Japanese children. This program has served area children for nearly 20 years, and our Lord who knows all and sees all has continued to provide for our needs.

Over the years our system has developed to include a classroom for 16 four-year-old entering students and a classroom for 16 five-year-old second year students. God directed, willing sisters have been offering services for these precious children on a two-year or longer rotation plan. The sisters' transportation to and from America, housing, health insurance, a monthly expense stipend (approximately \$600), a domestic travel package (approximately \$450) and an annual bonus (approximately \$600) are provided.

Sis. Sheila Moser (Lester, IA) will be completing 3 years of service in July, and is scheduled to return to the States. Therefore, we are praying for God to provide another willing sister to teach. We are searching for a sister who:

1) Is a mature Christian woman and a sister in good standing with the church.

2) Feels she is unquestionably led by the Father for humble service.

- 3) Holds a bachelors degree in education in the fields of either English as a second language, elementary education, special education, speech pathology, early childhood education or a related field.
- 4) Is an individual that is flexible, willing to begin studying/using a foreign language and is able to fully support a church which is located in a different culture and a country with less than a 1% Christian population.

We would like to leave you with several scriptural passages:

— Luke 1:37; With God all things are possible.

- Isaiah 6:8; I heard the voice of the Lord saying, whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I, send me.
- Matthew 28:18; Go ye therefore unto all nations, teaching them all things whatsoever I have commanded you, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. And lo I will be with you alway even unto the end of the world.

If the spirit is speaking to your heart today, we beg you to confer with your local elder, who in turn will contact our Missionary Committee representative, Elder Bro. Ben Maibach. He will then contact the team here in Japan. If you do have questions concerning your role here or any other details, feel free to contact us. If you are not eligible for this position, we humbly ask for your sincere prayers.

eous person as somebody that is up on a plane, way up here, and we are way down here. We think of someone who is perfect or far better than anybody else.

Righteousness means to be right with God, and it is not out of the reach of any person.

We read that through conversion and being born-again by the Spirit of God, we will have that imputed right-eousness of Jesus Christ. It is not our own self-righteousness. It is not the things that we have done. It is the righteousness that Jesus Christ imputes (or we would say, gives) to man when we are converted and born-again.

"Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy." Matthew 5:7. Mercy. There is not one of us here today who would have a hope of eternal life if it were not for the mercy of God.

Mercy simply means to be forgiven. If we would get what we really deserve according to this Word, we would all be cast into hell. The Word says, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23. But because of the mercy of God and His love extended to mankind, we can have the hope of eternal life. We call upon the mercy of God daily because, as we go through this life, we fail and we fall short. We look to the Lord and beg Him to forgive us. How many times at the end of the day do we plead to God to forgive us for something foolish we have said, done or thought?

We depend upon the mercy of God. Then, dare we not be merciful to one another? God has been so compassionate and forgiving to us, dare we be harsh in judging one another?

The Word teaches us that what we mete to others, so shall it be meted out to us again. If we are harsh and unmerciful to one another, can we expect to receive the mercy of God? I don't think so. The Word demands that we be merciful.

"Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God." Matthew 5:8. Here, dear ones, is the key to Spiritual life... the pure in heart.

The Bible teaches that all men have been sinners. Every person in this room is or has been a sinner. We are in one of two categories. We are either sinners or we are saved by grace.

If we are a sinner and have refused the love of God, refused to come unto Him to be converted and have our hearts cleansed and purified through the washing of the Word, then we are condemned.

When the opportunity is there, the gift is there. The offer is just come and be saved. Come, repent and be converted. If we spurn that opportunity, that offering, we shall not be blessed.

"Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God." Matthew 5:9. The peacemakers. How can we be a peacemaker? In a lot of situations in life, we can promote peace or we can cause heartache.

The Word says, "Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth." Proverbs 26:20. That describes a wonderful area to be a peacemaker.

We should exercise the saying, "If you can't say anything good about somebody, don't say anything at all." I'll confess that I have failed in that area. I haven't been able to live up to that standard. But, beloved ones, it is well worth striving for.

If somebody comes to us and has a complaint or a criticism about someone else, how do we react? Do we say, "Yes, I agree with you. I know what you are talking about. That is just the way he or she is?" That encourages them. Or, do we say, "Oh, now just wait a minute. If you knew the path they have walked, or if you've walked in their shoes, maybe you would react the same way?"

There are simple little ways to be peacemakers among our neighbors, our family, our brothers and sisters and our friends. Do we encourage and promote peace?

Sometimes we wonder how we can spread the gospel? How can we influence the lives of others to come to church, repent and be converted? The Word says in James, "The fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace." James 3:18.

The fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace. So it is the peacemaker who spreads the gospel of the love of God. It is the peacemaker who is influential and instrumental in the hands of God for teaching and promoting the way of salvation.

The Word says, "For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and

every evil work." James 3:16. Blessed are the peacemakers.

"Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake." Matthew 5:10, 11.

Have you ever had that experience? We don't live in a land (and we can thank God for it) where we are persecuted by governments and where we are forbidden to assemble and worship God.

Persecution may come in more subtle ways than that. It might be the rejection of a friend, snickering behind our backs or feeling left out of a conversation because we are a child of God and our thoughts don't entertain the things that someone else is talking about at that moment.

Persecution comes in subtle little ways. But it may be just as effective, if not more so. Do we rejoice?

"Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake." Matthew 5:11. It is not saying here that we should rejoice when we are persecuted for our own mistakes. Persecution for Christ's sake is the only type deserving a blessing.

"Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you." Matthew 5:12. We look back into the Old Testament and we see where every faithful man of God at some point or another in his life was persecuted.

Think of Moses, Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel, all the prophets and the men of old. Think of Jesus Christ... the greatest Man that ever lived, and what they did with Him. We can read in Timothy, "All that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." II Timothy 3:12.

There are many blessings, beloved ones, for a child of God. We have read them here. Let's keep our faith strong. Sometimes in life, we get weary and tired. We get tired of the battle, the strife and of fighting the devil. Sometimes we would just like to lay it all down and give up.

We read in Galatians, "Let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not." Galatians 6:9.

THE SILVER LINING

Text: Matthew 5:1-12 . . . Sermon on the Mount

"A CALL TO ACTION"

"And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him." Matthew 5:1. Right there, we see that they put forth the effort. We have to put forth an effort in life to follow the Lord and become His children.

If we think we can come to church when we want to, read the Bible whenever it is convenient, pray only when we have a need and forget about God at other times, we are going to experience

His disciples came unto Him. The effort was made to come to Jesus and only by coming unto Him could they receive the blessing that He was about to give them.

"And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying, Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:2, 3. Blessed are the poor in Spirit. The Pharisees had a problem when they didn't think they had a need.

We can turn back to Revelation where Jesus told John to write unto the church of Laodiceans, "So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth. Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing . . ." Revelation 3:16, 17. Doesn't that sound like society today? "I am rich! I am increased with goods. I've got a house and I've got money in the bank. I've got a farm. I've got a job. I've got all these things. Do we really need God?"

and blind, and naked . . . I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see." Revelation 3:17, 18.

What is that gold? It is the Word that we read right here. What is the white raiment? It is the righteousness, the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ. What is the eye-salve? It is the Spirit that opens our eyes unto the knowledge of God.

Are we poor in the Spirit this morning? Did we come this morning dependent upon God's Spirit? Did we plead to God to feed us today? Or, did we just come and think, "Well, today is Sunday ... the day to go to church. I'll get out of it what I can. I hope the preacher is interesting and keeps me awake."

Did we plead to God on our knees this morning that He would stir our hearts and feed us? Did we prepare our heart? Were we hungry for the Word?

"Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted." Matthew 5:4. Have we come to the point in our life when we have mourned for the life of sin that we have lived? Have we been born-again? Have we wept at the foot of the cross and acknowledged that we were sinners without hope? Or, have we not yet acknowledged that to God and man?
