Writings based on God's Word

Light From The Word

"The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple" (Ps. 119:130).

Teaching Children to Respect God

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Prov. 9:10). A proper respect or reverence for God is a key element in developing true faith. This can be nurtured only if those who teach this principle exemplify it by their attitudes and actions.

The mind of a young child is quite subject to being shaped and directed. Believing parents must seize the initiative and make concerted effort to exert godly influences during this time of great potential. Indeed, the Word says, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Prov. 22:6).

True respect for God requires understanding of one's relationship to his Creator as well as recognition of God's supreme authority over all of humanity. These concepts cannot be taught as abstract truths. They must be conveyed spontaneously and prayerfully as a part of everyday experiences. They are best understood through simple examples, just as Christ taught by parables and by His own actions. The key to teaching is to reduce the complex to a simple level so that it can be understood. Parents' attitudes toward other authority figures as well as toward those who are subject to themselves should impart to a growing child a beautiful picture of godly order and loving submission. This will be of great help in developing a child's respect for his parents. "Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right. Honor thy father and mother: which is the first commandment with promise: that it may be well with thee. and thou mayest live long on the earth' (Eph. 6:1-3)

Many today consider man as only a soul-less animal. To such individuals there is no absolute, God-directed moral order; also, the origin of man is mysteriously evolutionary, and man has no eternal destination. Such viewpoints suggest that life is meaningless.

Rather, the Bible teaches that a child should learn to see himself as a special creation of God, uniquely made in His own image (Gen. 1:27). If a child believes that he has been created for the purpose of serving God and someday devoting all his talents for the glorious cause of Christ, his self-concept and reason for existence will take on a special meaning. His sense of self-worth and his awareness that he must submit to God's moral order will add a positive, disciplined quality to his life. It will motivate him to learn to pray and draw close to God, especially as he observes this consistent pattern in his parents

Children will respect God if they are taught about His power (Ps. 147:5) and His abundant grace (2 Cor. 4:15), as well as His receptiveness to prayer and supplication (Phil. 4:6). Parents' diligent reading of Bible stories and conveying of their own spiritual experiences to their children will enhance their comprehension of the love and mercy of God.

A mother has a special gift of influence over her children. Born with an instinctive bond of love for her offspring, a mother should fully exercise her honorable God-given role as "keeper at home" (Tit. 2:5). "And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up" (Deut. 6:7). It would be far better to adapt to a more modest standard of living than to relegate this golden, one-time opportunity to a "substitute mother" while pursuing a career. It must also be recognized that motherhood is a most demanding role and that parenting should be a mutual responsibility in which husband and wife faithfully support each other

Children must develop a deep appreciation and respect for the un-

changing Word of God. If the spiri tual aspect of a father's life is truly paramount, he will surely strive to place more emphasis upon God's Word which deals with the Eternal than upon material things which will pass away. Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6:21).


Active participation in the church provides many valuable learning experiences for children. Respect for godly order and submission to one another are prominent features of a unified, loving body of believers. As a child observes consistent obedience to truth, he will become aware of the Holy Spirit's work in the lives of the believers. Observance of scripturally based church traditions and common patterns of lifestyle will provide a sense of identity with a loving, trustworthy support group. A most beneficial experience consists of seeing the transforming power of God in the life of an acquaintance who turns to the Lord in repentance. This helps develop respect for God's life-changing power.

Cultivating a child's respect for God is not easy. Our society is ignoring more and more the existence of the laws of God. The insidious forces of Satan are spreading many influential themes (such as evolution, relativism and individualism) which can undermine a child's respect for authority. An alert parent must work diligently to arm a child against these vain philosophies (Col. 2:8).

Sincere efforts to teach children to respect God and love His Word will never be regretted. Such teachings will serve to keep their hearts tender and make them more willing to turn to Christ in true repentance when they come under conviction. Then they will be able to rejoice in the wonderful promise, "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Ps. 23:6).

WORK PROJECTS School Buildings, Nursing Home and Hospital Additions

SEVEN PROJECTS

Plans are being made this "winter work season" for a more varied list of projects. Five schools, a nursing home addition, and improvements to Hospital Lumier are scheduled.

NEEDS ARE GREAT

Your help is needed as greatly as ever and is deeply appreciated by the poor, but pleasant, and friendly Haitian Christians.

CROSS-CULTURAL EXPERIENCE

Testimonies such as "unforgettable," "life-changing," and "I'll be more appreciative of what I have" are heard from each returning volunteer.

COUPLES

Certain projects may be open for couples. At this time it is hoped that they can be included in project numbers 1 and 2.

TRAVEL CONDITIONS

The U.S. State Department and several missionary advisors tell us Haiti appears peaceful and conditions look good for travel and work this season.

What do I do if I am interested in going on this mission?

Contact the World Relief representative from your local church or one of the brothers listed as the project representative for your area.

You will receive an information packet which includes:

1) a map, 2) background information on Haiti, 3) a calendar, 4) healthcare form, 5) list of items to take with you, 6) commonly used words in English/ Creole, 7) gift suggestions, 8) volunteer form.

What is my church area?

Your church is located in one of the designated areas on the map on page 4.

What are the dates for the project? See the schedule on page 4. Teams usually leave on a Friday and return nine days later on Saturday.

Do I need a Passport or Visa? No. Your birth certificate and other proof of U.S. citizenship is all that is required.

Who do I contact? Your local World Relief representative or the project leader(s) for your area are shown on page 4.

May I choose any date? Yes. Crossover volunteering with another area team is allowed, even encouraged, to meet with your time schedule or to help fill a team.

What type of skills do I need? Construction experience is appreciated, but basic handyman talent and a



desire to serve the Lord is all that is required.

What type of projects are done? Roofs, mostly for schools, made of poured concrete or sheet metal over wood is our part of this shared building program. We also build plain wooden school benches. The Haitian people build the walls and work with us on the roofs.

What will it cost?

A package plan of air travel from Miami to Port-au-Prince and back, food, lodging, transportation, and insurance in Haiti costs \$500.00 per person for the nine days. The trip to Miami and back from your home church would be additional.

GOD LOVES A CHEERFUL GIVER ...

II Corinthians 9:7

Giving! At a time when we're hearing about business losses, bankruptcy, crop failures, lay-offs and wage cuts, this sure doesn't seem like an appropriate topic. But let's take a second look.

God LOVES a cheerful giver. That's a promise! In II Corinthians 9:8 we discover that God is able to make all grace abound toward us, that we, having ALL sufficiency in ALL things, may abound to EVERY good work. In the tenth verse we find that our God not only ministers (supplies) bread for our food, but He also multiplies the seed that we sow and increases our fruits of righteousness. Our giving not only meets needs, but most of all it brings God thanks, praise and glory.



But what about when times are "tough". "Tough times" can offer us more opportunity for blessing than times of plenty. In Luke 21, Jesus commended the widow who, of her penury (or poverty), had cast in all she had. Her two mites were probably a far cry in comparison to the gifts of the rich men, but she received the greater blessing. Let's ask ourselves, is it a true sacrificial gift to give only out of our abundance? There is a saying that says, "Give until it hurts, then keep on giving till it feels good!" "Tough times" may be discouraging, but let's use these trials to strengthen our faith (James 1:2-4). God challenges us to place our trust in Him. In Malachi 3:10 He commanded His people to "Bring ye all the tithes inato the storehouse . . . and **PROVE** me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing that there shall not be room enough to receive it.

So we see that our opportunity to give cheerfully is not limited in any way by what we have or how hard the times are. Let us throw off any inhibitions in this area and allow our God to use us and multiply that which we sacrificially offer to Him.

(Continued from Page 36) We should give of ourselves in a responsible and accountable way, not in man's wisdom, but in wisdom among them that are perfect. It is not in our own perfection, but in His perfection. Like Elijah said, "I will rejoice exceedingly in the Lord for He hath clothed me with a garment of righteousness.'

We are born in sin, naked, unclothed, in shame, doomed for wrath and judgment. But, in faith in this testimony of God's love for the world, His providence as a Saviour, we become clothed with a garment of righteousness. It also says that we are adorned with this garment of righteousness. Our garment comes from the Lord. How humble we should be and grateful to yield ourselves to His righteousness and not our own unrighteousness!

It goes on to say, "But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory." I Corinthians 2:7. Unless we are willing to submit to Calvary, follow humbly the steps of the Lord Jesus and be willing to serve, then we will not be able to understand the hidden wisdom which God ordained before the world unto our glory.

He goes on to say, "Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory." I Corinthians 2:8. We believe that is true today for those who do not know the mystery of this hidden treasure. If they knew, they could not continue to crucify the Lord of glory.

As unregenerated men, before we are enlightened by the power of the Holy Spirit who illuminates our hearts, we crucified the Lord daily. We are sympathetic and our prayers go out for those who are still living in this unregenerated state in darkness and have not been illuminated.

The Lord Jesus Christ as the Light of the world enlightens our hearts. When light comes into our hearts, it exposes the darkness. Therefore, we cannot have darkness in His marvelous light.

He goes on to say, "But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God." I Corinthians 2:10. We need to take time to read the Bible and search the deep things of God. None of us will ever be able to give an excuse for not knowing what the Bible, the Word of God, says. The more we search and the more we tremble at God's Word, the more He reveals to us.

In the night watches when we are awake and sleep seems to escape us, we can just get up and open the Bible. We can search the Word of God and let that Word search our hearts and prove us. The Lord will search us to see if there is any wicked way in us.

Not only does the Bible reveal, but the hymn book. We have a heritage that is often taken for granted. In one of the darkest hours of my life in the night when sleep was gone, I sat on the couch and opened the hymn book. It fell open to one hundred ninetynine and that song was like a breath from heaven: "To thee, Oh God, do we sing our thanks and praise." There is inspiration there as well and we know that came from this Book. The mystery, the marvel and the wisdom behind that book by unknown authors is that we can sing these songs and not know the human element that bore those thoughts and melodies into existence.

God is able through His Spirit to reveal Himself to any soul that is wholeheartedly without reservation yielded to His will. To anyone who is not prepared and has not learned to know the voice of the Spirit, all God is waiting for is a broken and contrite spirit to yield and submit without reservation to the entity of the Word of God.

The real reason people still do not find God is because of their reservations about God, His will and His Word. We are not here today to add to or take away from this power and this Spirit of the Word of God.

Isaiah said, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God." Isaiah 41:10. When we think of these words, dismayed means to diminish the power. When we begin to fear and not have faith to believe in the Word of God, we defeat the power. When we begin to fear and not have faith to believe in the Word of God, we defeat the power of God. So we should not be dismayed. We should be strong in the Word of God. If it strikes us down, we would rather be down than up, if it is the Lord's will in this life.

I often think of those who suffered physical affliction. We like to think that people who get well had strong faith. But who has the strongest faith? The one who gets well, or the one who must endure and actually succumb to affliction? That has often challenged my faith. We don't like to be the one to suffer, but if it's God's will that we yield to His will and not ours, then we are on the path of the cross that leads home.

That was the prayer and experience of our loving Saviour Who has gone before. That was His cup. Are we willing to drink of that cup? Are we willing to suffer for His sake and His cause if it be His will?

These are things that pertain to the flesh, but how much more should we be willing to suffer as you and I are caretakers, as it were, of this bride of another, our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. We will suffer the afflictions of the Gospel which the Apostle Paul spoke about to Timothy, "Do no be ashamed of me and the afflictions of the gospel." (See II Timothy 1:8).

They may be sufferings we go through to live out the Bible in our lives. May we appear as the Word of God, and as God's people. Then we will have that identity when He reappears . . . and He will know us by the harmony and unity of this beloved Apostle Paul and the rest of God's family.

Last night we were singing in a home with young people. We were singing melodies of praise to God. It was a heavenly sight that you just don't find hardly elsewhere. We might think that is old-fashioned, but it is good to know that the old prophets said that we should ask for the old paths for therein is the good way and then you shall find rest for your souls.

The Bible is not a modernistic book, but we are living in modern times. But, we don't succumb to defeat when it comes to the Word of God. The Word of God will have free course and it will not diminish from us. When a soul finds grace to fall prostrate at the cross of Christ and is willing to give the offering of a broken and contrite heart, then they might still remember where there is an inn that they can share this experience.

We read in the Bible where the Lord requires the past. (See Ecclesiastes 3:15). We cannot shrug our shoulders at the past. We need to realize that when we come to the Lord, He wants our all. He can't accept partiality. He will not give fellowship with another. Our God is a jealous God and He will not give His glory to another.

God is the same always...yesterday, today and forever. He changes not. "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today and forever." Hebrews 13:8. We have a glorious future, a glorious heritage and a glorious faith! We should be positive and never negative about the Word of God! We should never consider alterations or deviations from the Word of God. Then it becomes precious, more significant and more enjoyable than the food we eat. It is more necessary than our daily food.

May God give us grace that when we fellowship around the Word of God and when we sing these great songs of the faith (the great songs of the church), that we know where it is coming from. May we have communication inside and know that it is a reality.

We are not hypocrites speaking lies and hypocrisy. When we get contentious about the Word of God, the first thing you know the devil succeeds in getting us to twist the Word of God. Then we become guilty of speaking lies and hypocrisy, and pretending something to be this way when it is really another way. When we really accept the Word of God for what it says, then we become free. We are then free from sin against the Word of God.

The Bible says we should search the Scriptures (see John 5:39), study the Scriptures (see I Thessalonians 4:11), be accountable servants to God (see Romans 14:12) and be able to rightly divide the Word of God (see II Timothy 2:15).

Let us be thankful today that the grace of God is still present and that the Lord is waiting to see if there would be any yet that would seek the Lord.

To any unbelievers, the Bible is still here. This place of refuge is still current. It is like the market, where you can still sell a bushel of corn and you can still buy a bushel of corn. You can still come and buy this salvation without a price tag, other than your total surrender which He deserves.

He has the right to ask for your heart and mine. He has the right and the authority to ask for our soul. The Bible says, "All souls are mine." Many times we get burdened about certain friends and we take their souls upon us like they are ours. It is the Lord's business. All souls, even our children, are the Lord's and they belong to Him.

The loving invitation still goes out to whosoever will come and taste and see that the Lord really is good. Though your sins be as red as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow. (See Isaiah 1:18). We don't have to worry how terrible our sins are, because He wants them regardless of how dark they might be. That is what He wants, for us to bring them to light. Let the light come and expose the darkness. It is such a beautiful experience to walk in the light.

The Bible says, "If we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another . . ." I John 1:7. People that you really never knew before, you can come to know. You can have fellowship about the deep things of God.

When we greet one another with a holy kiss, we embrace the kiss of the Saviour. Where can you go and find an example of this? This should humble ourselves in gratitude to God that we can share that kind of relationship on this earth. We can face a Saviour some day, not contentious, but broken and meet for His use.

May God bless His Word in these last days that we will be revived by the things that still remain. As it says in Revelation, "Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain ..." Revelation 3:2. The church is still here. We should be courageous to stand for the faith of our forefathers. We know that they were not perfect, but they had the record straight. In their weakness, the still knew what they believed, like the Apostle Paul.

We are subject to discouragements, trials and tests that often weigh us down. We become depressed, almost to despair. You and I have in our relationship a gift or a heritage that we should never be discouraged. We should never complain. We should never utter a word of murmuring or complaining. We should never be contentious or disenchanted with what we have in God.

When we read the Word of God, it should revive us and create vitality, causing us to be ashamed of ourselves, fall on our face and ask God for forgiveness. We can accept the Word of God which is filled with promises for faith to be as Paul said, not only conquerors, but more than conquerors! (See Romans 8:37).

When we come together to share this faith, we should encourage and lift up the faith and the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. He suffered so ultimately in such shame and agony for your and my soul. When we die, our soul can live again in Paradise with the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Who gave us His all. He gave Himself!

As Paul said, he thought it not robbery to be equal with God (something to grab at or steal) but made of Himself no reputation, and took upon Himself the form of a servant (a slave) and became obedient unto the cross, even the death of the cross. (See "God's Word For Today" Job 14 and I Corinthians 2

Philippians 2:6-8). He had to endure this experience for you and me. If we all go back to the day when we were called to repentance, we remember the fears and anxiety. We had no sleep at night and could not rest. We sought the Lord day and night until we could find rest for our soul.

Because of this urgency and relationship, the Spirit of God causes us to come together. "But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God." I Corinthians 2:10. When we found ourselves weighted down with our soul's condemnation for sin, we began to search for something, farther and deeper than we could find here on this earth. We could go and share our concerns with our parents, but we had to go in the spirit to seek the Lord on our own to find the answer to a troubled heart and undying soul.

The Apostle Paul was a chosen vessel for you and me. How we should appreciate that! The Lord Jesus saw fit to call Paul, foreordained before he was even born, to administer the gospel message to the church, the bride of Christ. The message was to be prepared, redeemed, saved and kept spotless and blameless for the return of the Lord Jesus.

He says in verse eighteen of the previous chapter, "For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." I Corinthians 1:18. The preaching of the cross is seldom preached. I admit that I do not relate to this enough. We think of salvation as something that is a gift that is received lightly, often without real experience or judgment.

The Bible says, "The preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness..."I Corinthians 1:18. How well we know that today. People don't really appreciate the cross as much as they should.

We think of salvation as an escape from the judgment and wrath of God. Job says, "Till this wrath be passed until the day when He will return, and the graves will be opened and the dead in Christ will rise, and those who live will be transformed in the twinkling of an eye."

Our salvation is encompassed in the cross. The way of the cross leads home. Too often we find that we would like to have all heaven and no cross.

The Apostle Paul had to admit and confess that his declaration, his voice and his message were not with human power or man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of the power of God (See I Corinthians 2:4). Since this was Paul's purpose, today it should be yours and mine. We should not seek to present self, but humble ourselves "under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time." I Peter 5:6.

"That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." I Corinthians 2:5. When we sense we have God's power, the things of this earth will grow strangely dim. If we really embrace and know God's power and God's presence, this world will not have its affect on us.

Paul said, "My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom . . ." I Corinthians 2:4. We realize that we do not come before you as those of recognition, but as a servant or a slave. The true definition of a servant is a slave. When we stand before God's people, the bride of Christ, we are God's slave to take care of His Son's bride, the church.
