

"COMPASSIONATE FATHERS" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

Fathers need to be strict, but the problem is, we may have a tendency to be stricter with our children and with others, than we are with ourselves. This is a concern to me because I realize that we really should be the strictest with ourselves. Jesus said, "First cast out the beam out of thine own eye." (Matthew 7:5)

In contrast to being strict and stern, we have the statement in the story of the prodigal son, "His father saw him, and had compassion." (Matthew 15:20) It's this matter of having compassion that intrigues me. To have compassion alone will not cure an alcoholic or a drug addict. In some cases, enlightened compassion may require a strictness in order to prevent our children, or others, from getting into a place of suffering and heartache.

In the army, I assisted a German born doctor who was known to be very rough with his patients. He told me, "They will never get well if I stand there and feel sorry for them." I haven't forgotten his statement and the element of truth it

contains, but I think a gentle approach would probably not detract from the effect of his treatment. The same is true in regard to how we treat our children, our spouses, and others.

Father's Day is a day to show honor and respect to fathers, and this is proper. While being so honored, let's try to set high standards of conduct while being filled with compassion. Others hurts and sorrows may be greater than we know, and it is also true that our hurts and sorrows may be greater than others know. Compassion is a wonderful thing. Let's have it with each other

Quite often we read in the New Testament of the Lord Jesus Christ having compassion. The Apostle Peter, himself a rather outspoken individual who suffered for it afterwards, wrote, "Having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous." (I Peter 3:8)

GOD'S PLAN FOR FAMILY UNITY - II

This second in a series of articles considers the blessings of the extended family as well as the great need for guidance from the Lord in bringing up children in a godly manner.

The value of the God-given family structure extends beyond the nuclear unit of parents and children. Grandparents and other extended family members and friends can also reap benefits from, and be blessed by, our children. They can help bring generations together and provide a special joy to grandparents. "Children's children are the crown of old men" (Prov. 17:6).

The experience of godly grandparents and other faithful older family members and friends can be a valuable source of advice as young parents seek to raise their children according to God's will. Much can be learned by spending time talking with and seeking advice from those who have successfully guided their children to adulthood. Children also can benefit from time spent with grandparents and other older faithful servants of God. As our children grow to adulthood, we must not overlook the valuable resource God has preserved for us in these experienced soldiers of Christ.

As valuable as the relationship between generations is, there are, however, pitfalls to be avoided. Parents must not take unfair advantage of the grandparents in placing too much of the responsibility for raising the children on the grandparents. They have raised their family and should not be too tied down with excessive babysitting for grandchildren.

Grandparents, on the other hand, must be careful that the advice and assistance they provide for their children does not become overbearing and meddlesome. Too much influence can cause friction within the family and a lack of confidence in the parents. Godly wisdom and restraint are in order and a realistic balance must be sought. Grandparents must be careful that they do not undermine the authority of the parents with well intended but misdirected com-

passion when children are in need of parental discipline. Also, the excessive showering of material gifts must be avoided. Cooperation, love, and understanding are in order as we work together to teach our children the proper relationship they need to develop with God.

Although children are a blessing from the Lord, being a parent is a responsibility that at times can seem overwhelming. The physical needs of children must be supplied, the emotional needs must be tended to, the social development is a challenge, and most of all, the spiritual needs of children are of great concern. The pressures brought on by a very materialistic and worldly society can cause parents to lose focus and to have inappropriate priorities. The advice from many modern day child rearing professionals runs so counter to the Word of God that it can cause a great deal of confusion. We really should not seek the counsel of ungodly people, especially as it relates to rearing our children. "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful" (Psa. 1:1). The salvation of the souls of our children is far too important to entrust their future to the ungodly or to those who espouse questionable doctrines. God gave us our children and he expects us to teach them properly.

God did not place this tremendous responsibility upon His people without providing instruction on how to accomplish this task. His Word provides the principles upon which we can build a solid, stable family structure. However, since these instructions are not conveniently located in one place, one must search the Scriptures for the guidance that is needed. "For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little" (Isa. 28:10).

Preparation for parental wisdom should begin before the first child is born. The first step in fulfilling parental responsibilities is

self-examination. Many times in the Scriptures God's people are advised to examine their lives in the light of God's Word in order to be at peace with God. "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves" (2 Cor. 13:5). "Beloved, if our heart condemn us not, then we have confidence toward God' (1 John 3:21). In His sermon on the mount, Christ explained very clearly how important it is for us to cast the beam from our own eye so we can see clearly to remove the mote from our brother's eye (Matt. 7:4-5). If our lives are not in good spiritual order, it will make our task as parents much more difficult. If we are not submissive and obedient to God's Word and are not supportive of the church, how can we expect our children to learn obedience and submission to their parents?

Prayer for guidance in raising children should begin very early—prior to a child's birth. Manoah, the father of Samson. prayed fervently that God would show him and his wife how to raise their child, "O my Lord, let the man of God which thou didst send come again unto us and teach us what we shall do unto the child that shall be born, And Manoah said, Now let thy words come to pass. How shall we order the child, and how shall we do unto him?" (Judges 13:8, 12). Likewise, Hannah, the mother of Samuel, prayed fervently that God would bless her with a child, and she promised to lend him to the Lord as long as he might live (1 Sam. 1). These early prayers can help us focus our attention on the importance of entrusting our children to God's care and keeping and teaching them by word and by example of God's plan for the life of each of His children.

A life of much prayer and sincere dedication to this sacred task of childrearing will bring boundless blessings to a family circle. Although the Apostle John spoke of spiritual children, his profound words echo the heartfelt longing of every believing parent: "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth" (3 John 4).



As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. GALATIANS 6:10

The Mission Committee is the arm of the Church with the responsibility of carrying out the goals and purposes of spreading the gospel. But each of us can have a part in this endeavor. One way that we can be involved is through the distribution of Bibles. In the darkness of this present age the seriousness and the significance of this work cannot be emphasized enough. The following article is to remind each of us of the purpose of the Bible in our lives, the urgency of sharing this truth with a lost world and suggestions to accomplish this important mission.

The Purpose of the Bible

The Bible has been given to mankind as a witness of one God, who created and sustains the universe, and of His holy son, our Lord Jesus Christ. The story it tells is continuous—that of the perfect redemption of fallen mankind.

This story unfolds as one reads through the books of the Bible. The great truths of redemption are given through history and prophecy. By studying these truths, one can understand the divine role of Jesus Christ as redeemer. God's plan for man in time and eternity are set forth in this cherished volume. It is divine inspiration which sets the Bible apart from any other book in the world, for it is the mind of God.

Jesus Christ is the Center and the Heart of the Bible

The Old Testament is the account of a nation. The New Testament is the account of a man. The nation was founded and nurtured by God to bring the man into the world.

One can read at the beginning of Genesis that God made man in His own image. Man is the highest form of life on earth, and alone has been given the reasoning ability to make personal choices. In exercising this right of choice, man willingly disobeyed God, and the sentence of death was placed upon him and his posterity.

In the fullness of time, God Himself was born as a man in the person of His only son. First man in God's image, and then God in man's image as an offering for sin. Christ's appearance on the earth is the central event of all history. The Old Testament sets the stage for it. The New Testament describes it with deep passion.

As a man, He lived the most beautiful life ever known. He was the kindest, tenderest, gentlest, most sympathetic person who ever lived. Multitudes, weary, worn, painridden, and heart-sick came to Him, and found relief. It is said of Him, and none other, that if all the deeds He did were written, the world would not contain the books.

Then, He died, cruelly tortured, to pay the price for sin. He rose from death, and lives today, not as a character of history, but the true redeemer of mankind. The Bible was written only that men might believe, repent, be converted, serve their God in loving obedience, and finally inherit life eternal in heaven.



How Can They Believe if They Have Not Heard?

"How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? ...So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

ROMANS 10:14&17

It is by grace that we are saved through faith. Being justified by faith, we have peace with our Lord Jesus Christ. This faith was made possible by having and hearing the word of God. Truly we are undeserving of such an opportunity and unworthy of this gift of salvation.

We now have the privilege and responsibility to share this good news with our fellow man—the good news of the Gospel recorded in the Bible.

Ways That We Can Share the Gospel

Bibles are available from distribution centers in Leo, Indiana and Eureka, Illinois. Several foreign language Bibles are also available for distribution in other countries. Listed below are some suggestions on how we can bring the bread of life to a hungry world:

- Plastic boxes are available that hold New Testaments. These can be placed in businesses, hospitals, motels, gas stations or anyplace where people can take them. On the front is a small decal that encourages anyone to take one free.
- Newspaper ads can be placed in your local paper offering a Bible free to anyone who requests one. These can be delivered in person, offering an opportunity to meet both physical and spiritual needs.
- Ask those who you work with if they own a Bible and offer to get them one if they express an interest.
- Keep Bibles available in your car to give to someone who has a need.
- Invite someone to church. Have Bibles available to give them when they leave.
- Large print Bibles can be placed in doctor's offices, hospitals or anyplace where they would be read.

These are only a few suggestions. Each of us has unique opportunities to confess our faith individually and give a testimony of the work Christ has done in our life. May we encourage each other and pray for one another that our efforts will bring honor and glory to our great God and Lord Jesus Christ.

Am I getting them all?

"When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. And I say unto you, that many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Matthew 8:10-12.)

Here He is showing that there is going to be a remnant in all parts of the world of those that do love Him. They are going to come from the east and the west and they are

going to sit down in heaven. But the children of the kingdom of this world shall be cast out into outer darkness and there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Remember the rich man that had a nice home and a nice gate and Lazarus was laid at his gate where the dogs came and licked his sores. Then the rich man was cast into that place of torment. He said, "Could you send for Lazarus, so that he could dip his finger in some water and cool my tongue?"

They said, "Remember, you had the good things in your earthly life, but Lazarus was tormented. Now he is comforted in Abraham's bosom and thou art tormented." (See Luke 16:19-25).

That goes right along with what we read this morning, doesn't it? In Ezekiel it said about those that were a comfort to the poor and helped others. They were not self-centered and thinking just about themselves. That man was blessed of God. Those who live for themselves in this time will have to suffer in eternity.

If we have faith, the Bible says that we can remove mountains. But we have to have that faith to believe the Lord will do it, and not be doubting.

"And when Jesus was come into Peter's house, he saw his wife's mother laid, and sick of a fever. And he touched her hand, and the fever left her: and she arose, and ministered unto them. When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick." (Matthew 8:14-16)

Here this woman, Peter's mother, was sick; and the Lord healed her. The Lord can heal, if He wants to, today. He can heal our sicknesses. But we should say, "Not my will, but Thy will be done, Lord."

When He touched her hand, it was a beautiful thing, because the fever left her and she arose and ministered unto them. It just shows us that she took care of others. Once she got to feeling better, she wanted to minister unto them.

It says that He cast out devils and spirits with His Word, and He healed all that were sick. (See Matthew 8:16)

There are devils today, aren't there, in this day and time? We think back to when we were a teenager, and see the youth today. We see the rock music and see the things that are devilish. We have seen people where the devils have been cast out of them, and out of our lives.

There was a young man once who got caught up in drugs, alcohol and different things of this life. He was trying to find happiness. He was not from our church, but he came to the point where he didn't know where to go. Those things had messed up his mind. His parents never taught him of Jesus Christ and how you can repent and how you can be born again. He had never heard of the way out.

Are we not thankful, loved ones, that we knew a better way? We knew that if we would humble ourselves, the Lord would be merciful to us. There is more to life than living in this world and time. There is more to life than heaping up riches which cannot bring happiness.

It seems like when we want something and then get it, then we want something else, don't we? The material things of life just don't satisfy, do they?

But if we put our faith and trust in the Lord and possess as though we possess not, then we can be

happy.

"And another of his disciples said unto him, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father. But Jesus said unto Him, Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead." (Matthew 8:21-22) We might think, "Well, that is pretty cruel." A person's own dad and He said, "Do not even go and bury him."

Have we ever woke up some morning and there was no food in the refrigerator, or the cupboards were empty? No, the Lord has provided for us. The Lord says to us, "Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith?" (Matthew 8:26)

"Then He arose, and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm. But the men marvelled, saying, What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey Him!" (Matthew 8:26-27)

We do not have that privilege to see the Lord in the flesh, do we, today? He is up in heaven. Back then, there were people that did not believe and there are today.

When Thomas came to Him and doubted and wanted to see the nail

prints in Jesus' hands and the sword that pierced His side, He said to Thomas, "Blessed are your eyes, because ye see, but blessed are their eyes who have not seen and yet have believed." (See John 20:29)

SERMON BY BRO. DEAN A. STEFFEN OF BELVIDERE, IL

"Faith in God Reaps Blessings" Matthew 8:1-27

We marvel at the Lord's teachings and how His Word was so powerful. He told that one man, that certain scribe that followed Him, "The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head." (Matthew 8:20) He was unattached to this world, wasn't He?

For ourselves, we live in homes, and we have things real nice. It is a distraction to us sometimes, isn't it? But here the Lord was not distracted with the things of this world. He spoke the Word of God in truth. He was concerned about the eternal souls of men.

Here in the beginning of the chapter, He came down from the mountains and "there came a leper and worshipped him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean, And Jesus put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed." (Matthew 8:2-3)

What did this man, this leper, have that was so important? It was faith, wasn't it, to believe that Jesus could heal Him? Now, He can still heal today -- the lost and sin-sick soul. Jesus was pleased because he had this faith. He said, "if Thou will, Thou can cleanse me."

We can look back to the time of our repentance. Maybe even before, when we were wandering in sin, we always kind of wanted to repent. We would even pray that some day we could repent. Yet. until we came to that time when we just gave up everything and said "Lord, Thou canst make me clean," then the Lord heard our prayer, didn't He?

Jesus said unto him, "See thou tell no man; but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them." (Matthew 8:4) In the old law, the lepers had to go without the city and they could not associate with people because they were a leper. If they were healed, they had to go and show the high priest.

Remember that other time, when Jesus spoke to the ten lepers? They came and He healed them all. He said, "Go and tell the high priest." There was only one that came back to give Him glory. (See Luke 17:11-19). That man was thankful and the Lord loves thankful children.

Even ourselves, we love it when our children are thankful. Maybe Mom makes a good meal or we do something for them, and they say, "Thank you" from their heart. Oftentimes we try to pry it out of them. We try to tell them to thank people for what they do. But when it comes from their very own heart, that is when it pleases us the most, doesn't it?

That is surely what pleases the Father the most, when with a true and sincere heart, we are thankful.

"When Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed," (Matthew 8:5-8)

Here this man was of a humble heart. He just said, "Speak the Word, Lord. I am not worthy for you to come under my roof." He had to be humbled. We know that pride separates us from God. We have heard it many times.

We know that it is not our human nature to be humble. We want others to think of us to be better than we really are. We know that has been the downfall of this earth, that man has not wanted to humble himself under the almighty hand of God. When we can come to that point, when we see our own wretchedness, then the Lord can work with us.
