

...and the birds of the air have nests;

The stork may make her house in the fir tree, but the robin will build almost anywhere. On the threshold of a door, under a gutter, on a machine shed door track, and maybe in a tree. I have seen nests as high as thirty-eight feet in the air or three feet off the ground. Robins can build a nest in a few hours if the proper building materials are handy.

It is a wondrous thing how the Lord provides for His creation. The birds of the air begin the productive part of their life when the flowers appear and their blessings come to us often through their song.

The purple martin can bring hours of joy on a summer evening as they sing and feed their young.

The eagle, on the other hand, is a bird of majesty and strength.

Love is Our Defense

It is the eagle that bears the image of strength as it soars high above the fruited plains, from mountaintop to mountaintop. The grace and beautiful motion almost leaves one without words to describe the majestic beauty of the great bald eagle.

But it is a truth that an arrow from the hunter can still the great heart of an eagle as easily as a false accusation can bring down a man.

An eagle can defend itself by soaring out of range, but a man can never outdistance a false accusation. The only defense is love on the part of the accuser.

It is without a question that the birds of God's creation provide much for our better living on earth.

Some birds provide song, some eliminate vast amounts of insects, some provide food, while others clean up the dead carcasses strewn across the land.

We can learn immense lessons from birds. Take, for example, the robin. They put great care into making a very shapely nest which will hold two to four eggs. Not much to start out a home, but the Lord tells us He is mindful of even the sparrow and we know He watches over other birds too. Well then, why does the Lord allow a predator to destroy a nest full of young? (Why do we have trials in life?) The lessons learned by the birds are very similar to what the Bible teaches us in Romans 5:3-4:

"...but we glory in tribulations also; knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience, experience; and experience, hope."

Sometimes it is the trials of life that make us "build our spiritual nests" just a little higher next time, keep a little better watch for trouble, and trust completely in God for our strength.

The robins share in gathering the food. I have noticed that the female makes about three trips for food compared to one by the male (no comment on that from me).

On the cover, we see a new nest which produced two young. What a wonderful experience it is to see those young leave the nest. Each seems to have its own special gift

away from the nest. Whether they fly or hop on the ground, it seems they grow and become mature birds after leaving the nest. (I have noticed that the parents still feed their young after they leave the nest.)

This is a time of the year when our youth are graduating and will be leaving the nest in some cases. If we can instill the virtue of God's love in each heart before they fly out of the nest, it will prove so beneficial to them when the trials of life beset them.

We thank God for the lessons of life learned from His creation and the beautiful birds.

Comfort Ye One Another - I

We are living at a time of rapid transportation, almost instant communication, abundant material possessions and technological advances that make our lives easier. The world offers us "instant" gratification, fast service and encourages us to participate in the good life. There are more "helping" professionals now than ever before in the history of mankind. In spite of all these things that are supposed to make our life happier and in spite of all the help that is available, loneliness, discouragement and depression are affecting an ever increasing number of people, including the children of God. We often feel our inadequacies as we try to deal with this situation. However, we should realize there is no need for the believer to despair and become overwhelmed by the magnitude of the problem. If we look to the world for help, we most likely will fail but God's people need not fail because help is available through our Lord and Saviour. "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly..." (Psalm 1:1). God will not desert us nor will He place us in a situation where we cannot do according to His will. The Spirit of God will not lead us where the grace of God cannot keep us.

Many times when we are in need of help, God provides what we need through His people. Each of us has a duty to help those in distress. We are instructed in God's Word to "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people..." (Isaiah 40:1). In many places in the scripture we are encouraged to comfort one another and to "Bear ye one another's burdens..." (Gal. 6:2). Throughout the scripture we see the harmful results of avoiding this important responsibility as Cain tried to hide his guilt by asking "Am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen. 4:9). In Matt. 25:45-46 we read the indictment of the King to those on his left "...Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to me. And these shall go away into everlasting punishment..."

How can we comfort one another? How can we be our brother's keeper with-

out becoming meddlesome in the lives of those who need help? Throughout the scripture, and especially in the book of Job, we can find valuable instruction that can help us as we try to be of comfort to those who are in need.

When Job's three friends heard of his afflictions they went "to mourn with him and to comfort him" (Job 2:11). Their initial response was appropriate and undoubtedly helpful as they wept with him, they sat down with him and they took the time to make themselves available to him. For seven days they were very patient, giving their total support. However, as soon as Job expressed his concern, and began to share his burden, his friends reproved him. They made many and grievous accusations against him which proved to be unfounded. They did not take the time to listen to what Job had to say, nor did they take the time to find out if their accusations were true. They took turns chastising him and adding to Job's grief. As may be expected, this tended to make Job defensive and thereby contributed to the problem rather than to the solution. Let's be careful that we don't become "miserable comforters" (Job 16:2).

Perhaps one of the great lessons to be learned from this is that when a soul is in deep distress, they need someone to listen to them with an uncondemning heart. They need someone who cares enough about them to take the time to hear their concerns and to help them through the situation. We may not agree with what they say, and we may find that there are things in their life that need to be changed, but the time of crises is not the time for reproof. It is a time for additional compassion, patience and prayer. If reproof is needed, it can come later.

In time of such distress, we may feel that it is our duty to "solve" their problem and immediately tell them what they have done wrong and what they should do about it. Under difficult conditions it is usually best to take time to pray about the situation and seek for God's direction.

"Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the Lord." (Psalm 27:14).

By speaking too quickly we may well be trying to solve the symptom before we know what the problem is. Many times when people are in distress, they do not expect us to solve their problem—they just need to know that someone cares and that someone will listen to them and be available. At a time of distress, godly companionship is often the most valuable help that we can give.

After listening to what they initially have to say, it may be best to try to ask questions that will encourage them to continue to talk about their problem. When they have talked as much as they seem to need to, we should respond to them carefully, being aware that if someone else is involved, we should hear them also. The book of Psalms is a great resource to give comfort and direction. Psalm 31:22 is a blessing to many: "For I said in my haste, I am cut off from before thine eyes: nevertheless thou hearest the voice of my supplications when I cried unto Thee." Encouraging words of comfort that provide spiritual support will do much to assuage the grieving soul.

It is not easy to know what to say to try to encourage someone who is sorely distressed. We often cannot find the right words to say. That is why God's Word is so necessary. The Word of God provides us with the most valuable resource on earth to heal the distressed and broken-hearted. "Wherefore comfort yourselves together and edify one another..." (I Th. 5:11). To edify means to build or construct, to instruct or improve morally or spiritually. Someone in deep distress needs to be encouraged that God loves and cares for them and that there is hope for them. We need to encourage them that time has a way of healing even the deepest of wounds if we can continue to be faithful "...for the Lord preserveth the faithful..." (Psalm 31:23).

After the fall of Communism in the early 1990's, contact between our brethren in Eastern Europe increased greatly. The churches in free lands became much more aware of the suffering and hardship endured through the years of oppression. Efforts have been going on for over twenty years on behalf of these struggling souls, but the opportunity to assist them is now greater than it has ever been before.

The instability of the governments in the former Communist countries is a source of concern to us all, because we have no way of knowing how long it will be possible to continue the work we are presently involved in. This brings a certain sense of urgency. We are trying to accomplish as much as possible in a short time. The cultural and language differences bring with them challenges with which we must cope at each stage of the effort. In this article, we want to bring our readers up to date with the existing situation.

European Church Building Fund

In the past several years, we have given our brethren and friends several opportunities to make contributions to the building fund for European churches. The response has been excellent, and well over one million dollars has been given up to this time. We have reported on a number of these projects, including articles on the completion and dedication of the facilities at which our brethren have been represented.

However, this fund has now been once again depleted, and there continues to be a great need. When our brethren visited Europe in 1994, they met a number of times with the elders and deacons of each country.

The churches in Hungary have largely been completed and paid for, but a substantial debt remains in the congregation at Breidenbach, Germany, which has been reported in previous issues. However, the greatest hardship continues to be in Eastern Europe.

Yugoslavian Church Construction

As of information available to us in May of 1995, perhaps the greatest need lies in Yugoslavia. Although most of our brethren are not directly in the war zone, they have by no means escaped the effect of the turmoil. Life continues to be very difficult for them, and they are having a hard struggle in holding, as one might say, "body and soul together." We are sending funds in for physical needs on a monthly basis following the recommendations

of the European Board representing both the Mission and World Relief Committees.

Information recently received indicates a total of over 150 Yugoslavian churches with somewhat more than 3,000 total members. Because of the internal unrest, and the age and original quality of the structure, many of these houses of worship are in poor condition. The Yugoslavian elders feel that the time has come to try to repair or rebuild them to encourage the brotherhood in the spirit of love.

The sum of \$80,000 was recently wired to them, and they have given us an excellent accounting of how it was used. In spite of the difficulty and stress of the times, this work is progressing, and we sincerely hope that funds from our US brethren continue to come in. They have given us cost estimates, and the needs exist for several hundred thousand dollars of assistance. Our hearts go out to these faithful souls who have stood so bravely in the face of severe tests and persecution. We feel helping them build or repair churches shows how much the brethren in America really do care as we encourage them in their struggles.

The Situation in Romania

We have assisted the Romanian brethren to build or remodel many houses of worship, but there remains much work to be done. The church in Caransebes is quite small and overcrowded. The 60 members of this congregation are unable to raise the necessary financing for a more suitable facility.

When our brethren visited this congregation last year, they agreed that more space is needed, and it is not feasible to enlarge the existing building. Upon viewing a building that is for sale, they felt it could be made suitable for worship services and an apartment for a caretaker.

We have been negotiating with the owner of this building who lives in Cleveland, Ohio, and have agreed upon a price of \$35,000. We are now trying to finalize the details of this purchase, which will be funded by the Mission Committee. It takes a lot of patience, but it finally happens. Thank you for your support and prayers!

World Relief

The Communications Committee for World Relief has developed three audio-visual programs to portray the work being done through our brethren in the USA and around the world. They consist of a World Relief Overview, a program covering our work in Europe and a new Caribbean program. Another is planned for Mexico. Each of these are described below in more detail.

World Relief Overview

This program covers the entire scope of World Relief and Mission Committee efforts. About 50 minutes long, this replaces the original slide program done a number of years ago. It shows the ongoing work in many foreign countries as well as here at home in the USA. It has created considerable interest in the areas where it has been shown, and our goal is for all of our brethren to have the opportunity to see it.

European


A second program showing the work in Europe has replaced the original one on Ukraine, and shows our efforts in Romania, Hungary, and Yugoslavia as well. This 35 minute program is scheduled to be updated

this fall after a trip by brethren from the European Board into Eastern Europe planned for September of this year. However, the existing slide program is still available, and experience has been that it moves hearts as they see the conditions of our suffering brethren.

Caribbean

Efforts have been going on in Haiti for over 20 years. During that period of time over 600 of our brethren and friends have become involved in the work. In January of 1995, teams of brothers representing the various groups serving the Caribbean Board entered Haiti and Jamaica for the purpose of evaluating the current situation and planning for the future.

Using pictures taken on these trips as well as some which have been on file taken by others in the past, the Communications Committee assembled this program with the help of the Caribbean Board. It is about 35 minutes long and covers all the various areas in which we are working in the Caribbean. At the World Relief Meeting in Rittman, Ohio in April of this year, this program was approved for showing to our brethren.



Self-contained Programs

All the slide programs developed by the Communications Committee are self-contained. Using two Kodak slide projectors, coupled with a programmable dissolve unit, the entire program is controlled by an

audio cassette. The equipment fits in a sturdy case, which can be shipped anywhere by UPS or checked in as baggage on an aircraft. World Relief owns two identical sets of equipment, giving a lot of flexibility for viewing the programs. A simple set of instructions accompanies the equipment, and our experience has been that it is easy to set up and operate. We encourage our churches to make use of it.

Of Interest to Everyone

Much time and effort has gone into preparing these programs, and there is no benefit unless they are seen by our brethren. We encourage all Treasurer-Representatives to arrange for showings in the congregations you serve. Often churches join together and show the slides in a convenient central location to several churches at a time.

Although many of our congregations have seen one or two of these programs, as of this writing, none have seen the Caribbean. These audio-visual efforts show the viewers what is happening in a real and personal way as they see the faces and hear the voices of those being assisted. Pictures showing how work teams function and the results of their efforts generate enthusiasm for future projects.

CASSETTES FROM EUROPE

We still have a supply of the cassette tapes produced in Austria and Hungary containing beloved hymns of our old Heft (Long Book) and Zion's Harp Hymnals.

All profits from the sale of these tapes go to Europe, where the money is distributed among our very needy brethren in the Eastern European countries of East Germany, Hungary, Romania and others.

The Heft or Long Book tapes were recorded by Bro. Josef Farkasch, who is a music professor near Salzburg, Austria. He plays the classical guitar and many other instruments on three tapes of songs from the Long Book. Some include singing.

"Holy Love" and "Blest Be the Tie" tapes recorded in Hungary, feature orchestra and choral renditions of songs from the Zion's Harp and Long Book, as well as many of their Hungarian hymns.

We have received a great response in the sale of these five tapes and wish to thank everyone for their past support.

The Heft (Long Book) tapes include three volumes. Volume I includes songs 1-11, 13-18; Volume II includes songs 12, 19-31; Volume III includes songs 33-48. Each tape costs \$8.00. Children's Home for nearly twenty years. Many members and friends have been blessed by giving of themselves in this "work of faith, and labor of love" and this is reason to rejoice and give thanks.

Unfortunately, the efforts of our adversary continue to encroach upon all that is good and holy, especially those divinely created institutions of marriage and family. No doubt you are well aware of what is happening in our society on this front and some of you have experienced tragedy in your own family or church.

What would the Lord have us do in response to the needs of our day? Would it please God for His children to be rebuilders of the broken families all around us? God's Word in Isaiah 58 answers this question by listing many rewards for serving the burdened and oppressed. Verse 8 of this chapter includes some of the blessings mentioned:

"Then shall thy light break forth as the morning, and thine health shall spring forth speedily: and thy righteousness shall go before thee; the glory of the Lord shall be thy reward."

Thus, the question that we should consider and that the Board of Directors weighed was not if, but rather how should we help. This was the topic before the brothers on the Board as they sought God's will in this matter. After a great deal of prayerful planning over the past two years, Gateway Woods' Board of Directors wants to make known God's direction regarding a new program in Illinois. This article describes past progress, present status, and future plans of the work.

Progress to this point has included several major steps. Re-

search was approved, conducted and the results accepted regarding the needs and types of programs Gateway Woods could develop in Central Illinois. The next step, developing a plan to meet these needs, was completed and sanctioned at the West Bend Elder Conference this past February. Finally, the Illinois Elders appointed three brothers to serve as Counseling Elders for the program.

Presently, Gateway Woods is preparing to start a Home-Based Support Service in Central Illinois. This program is designed to help those with marriage or family difficulties in the context of their own homes providing both physical and personal services. Physical services might include home maintenance, auto repair, child care, or domestic help while personal services might involve training or counseling in family principles. This program is intended to serve non-church families from Tazewell and Woodford Counties and members and friends from local congregations. This component will provide numerous opportunities for committed brothers and sisters to serve the Lord in their communities and churches, as volunteers will be an integral part of the service.

Plans for the future include an educational component which will provide seminar presentations or classes designed to strengthen marriages and families. These classes would concentrate on topics relevant to families such as communication, building relationships, resolving conflict, child training and discipline. This component would be available for those receiving Home Based Support Services or other interested members and friends.

We are thankful for the opportunity God has given us to be servants in our church and

communities in Central Illinois, and there are many furrows to be made as we turn over new ground through this expansion. We don't have all of the answers for we continue to discover new questions; however, we would be glad to hear from you if you would like to know more about the effort. 

The babies are returned to the prisons, once each week, to maintain the tie between mother and child. When the mother has finished her sentence, if found capable by the courts, the child will be returned to her. The need has increased as they are now receiving babies from a greater number of penal institutions. Plans have been made to construct the dormitory (shown above) of wood frame de-

sign, to house the babies and their nannies. The plans call for construction to begin between February 6 and 15, 1995, with completion expected in 16 weeks. The building will have a walkout basement, which can be finished at a later date when additional rooms are required.

"THE GLORY OF HIS PRESENCE"

Sermon by Bro. Floyd Frieden of Elgin, IA

Exodus 9:19-35 and Acts 7:30-60

It would seem that the Lord would have something to speak unto us concerning the Old Testament times. He opened unto us in the first reading, the Book of Exodus, which spoke of Moses and the many plagues that were brought upon Egypt and how they were all directed of the Lord.

In the second reading, we opened up to the Book of Acts, where the Lord again spoke to us of Moses and Egypt. It even started somewhat before.

"And when forty years were expired, there appeared to him in the wilderness of mount Sina an angel of the Lord in a flame of fire in a bush. When Moses saw it, he wondered at the sight: and as he drew near to behold it, the voice of the Lord came unto him, Saying, I am the God of thy fathers, the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Then Moses trembled, and durst not behold." (Acts 7:30-32).

When we think that that same God---the same God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob---is our God today. That same God wishes to speak unto us today to lead us, guide us and direct us just as He did His own children, the children of Israel, many years ago.

We find that we are just like them in so many ways even though we are the Gentile people. We have been grafted in. We have been given the opportunity for a way that was not originally for us.

Jesus made the way. He paid the price. Yet, we walk in the way of disbelief. We find that it is hard to accept God's Word just the way we should and apply it to our walk of life just the way we should.

Many times our faith is so weak that we find it hard to believe

everything the way God would have us to believe. Sometimes, when we say that we believe, we find that we are just too weak to carry out God's plan and to do everything according to His will.

We find ourselves just as God's servant, Moses, did when it said, "Then Moses trembled, and durst not behold." (Acts 7:32). We find in ourselves, so often, a trembling because we know what God has in store for us and we know what we need to do.

Many times we tremble because of our weaknesses. We really do not need to do that. If we commit our lives unto our Heavenly Father and we ask Him to come into our heart and into our life and to do the work, He will do just that. We, of ourselves, cannot carry out those things that God asks of us, but if we lay our lives in His hands, He will take care of us. But we have to submit. We have to move away the pride that we carry.

"Then said the Lord to him, Put off thy shoes from thy feet: for the place where thou standest is holy ground." (Acts 7:33). We might think on that. It is not maybe our shoes today that the Lord is asking us to take off, but He is asking each one of us to remove something from our life, and that is sin.

God is asking us to remove all sin from our life today. There should be no place that sin can be collected and gathered in our life. It should all be left outside, for today we are in a holy place. Today we are in God's house.

We think of it so often---the security and the safety that we feel when we come into God's house. When we are with our brethren in the Lord, when we are together,

we find strength. There is so much to be thankful for. Then, as we depart and go throughout the week with our daily work and daily cares and concerns, that strength can soon fade away.

Satan comes to us and tries us and tempts us. What is our faith really like? For each one of us, it is very different; yet, we all have very many similarities. There are not any of us who are exempt from trials and temptations. We all have them. The difference is that if we commit those trials to God when they first show up, or if we pray to Him after we fail and tell Him that we are sorry.

"I have seen, I have seen the affliction of my people which is in Egypt, and I have heard their groaning, and am come down to deliver them. And now come, I will send thee into Egypt." (Acts 7:34). God hears our groaning, He hears our murmuring and He hears our complaining. God knows our every care. He knows our every need. There is nothing at all that is hid from God.

The beautiful part is that God can look into our heart. He knows if our heart is sincere or He knows if our heart is false. He knows if we have the desire in our heart to make a change in our life and to turn to Him even though we may speak differently and say that we do not believe and we are not going to make a change in our life. He knows inside if the desire is really there.

I really believe that all of us who are seated here this morning have come for a reason. I think we all believe that there is a God in Heaven and that God has provided a way of salvation.

I really think that we all know

what is expected of us. He leaves that choice up to us. He does not force any soul to change their ways and turn unto Him. Even after a soul makes that commitment unto God, He does not force us to serve Him. He allows us to go day by day doing our own will.

What we need to do is to blend our will into His will until they are the same and it is no longer ours. Then it is God's will completely.

"This Moses whom they refused, saying, Who made thee a ruler and a judge? the same did God send to be a ruler and a deliverer by the hand of the angel which appeared to him in the bush." (Acts 7:35). This was Moses whom they refused. Now we can think, "Are we going to refuse God?" We can. We have that right if that is our choice. It is up to each one of us.

As long as we stay without, that is really what we are doing. We are really refusing God. We are really refusing His ways and we are refusing to give ourselves to Him.

Perhaps we are saying that same thing to God. "Who made thee a ruler and a judge?" (Acts 7:35). We know that He is our ruler and He is our judge. Some day we will be judged, each and every one of us. What will it be like for us?

Today, for as many of us who are assembled here, we have the opportunity to live for Him, to accept His ways, and to give ourselves unto Him. Tomorrow we do not know about. We really do not know about the next hour. But right now we have the opportunity.

"He brought them out, after that he had shewed wonders and signs in the land of Egypt, and in the Red sea, and in the wilderness forty years." (Acts 7:36). God shows unto us signs, too. We can look around about us in this world

and time that we are living. Time is moving on and the end is drawing closer.

Whether or not we want to accept those signs and whether or not we want to commit our life to God, it is still our choice. Inasmuch as many times parents or grandparents or sometimes children would like to make the choice for others, that is not given to us. It is only given to self.

"This is that Moses, which said unto the children of Israel, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear. This is he, that was in the church in the wilderness with the angel which spake to him in the mount Sina, and with our fathers: who received the lively oracles to give unto us: To whom our fathers would not obey, but thrust him from them, and in their hearts turned back again into Egypt, Saying unto Aaron, Make us gods to go before us: for as for this Moses, which brought us out of the land of Egypt, we wot not what is become of him." (Acts 7:37-40).

This prophet Moses, who was sent of God to be a deliverer of His children, they turned back from. They wanted idols. They wanted to go back to Egypt after a period of time after they had left.

There is a similarity between Moses and the Lord. The Lord also came and He provided a way of escape. He likewise was rejected by God's people, even as Moses. By some, not by all.

Then there are those sometimes that wish to turn back, those who wish not to travel forward into God's kingdom. They feel that the ways are too thorny and too steep and wish to return back to Egypt and the ways of the world.

If we do such things as that, if we turn our heart and our back away from God, our way is woe. Actually, worse than if we had not

made the beginning. But if we do not make a beginning, what do we have to look forward to? We need to have faith. We need to commit our lives unto God.

"And they made a calf in those days, and offered sacrifice unto the idol, and rejoiced in the works of their own hands." (Acts 7:41).

Don't we often rejoice in the works of our own hands? Something we do or something we accomplish, how we want to pat ourselves on the back and say, "Look what I did."

Yet if the Lord had not given unto us health, strength and physical fitness, we could not build up, make or create. If God would not have given unto us a sound mind, we could not think properly.

"Then God turned, and gave them up to worship the host of heaven; as it is written in the book of the prophets, O ye house of Israel, have ye offered to me slain beasts and sacrifices by the space of forty years in the wilderness? Yea, ye took up the tabernacle of Moloch, and the star of your god Remphan, figures which ye made to worship them: and I will carry you away beyond Babylon. Our fathers had the tabernacle of witness in the wilderness, as he had appointed, speaking unto Moses, that he should make it according to the fashion that he had seen. Which also our fathers that came after brought in with Jesus into the possession of the Gentiles, whom God drove out before the face of our fathers, unto the days of David." (Acts 7:42-45).

We think a little bit about whom God drove out before the face of our fathers. God causes a separation and a dividing. There is coming a time again for that separation and dividing.

He will direct and drive out those who are not prepared.

Those who have not given their heart to Him are going to be separated to go a different direction than those who have been sincere in their walk of life...those who have had a firm foundation built and have stayed with it.

We would really like to think in this morning that when that time of dividing comes, that all of us gathered here in this room this morning, and in this building, can all be traveling in the same direction---that we would all be going home to spend eternity with God, our Father.

The other side is not a pleasant side. It tells us that there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. There will be much pain and sorrow. In Heaven there will be no tears, no sorrow, no pain, but all will be joy and happiness.

Things that we just cannot really, fully understand. We do not know time without an end. Everything in our life here has an end. We do experience pain and tears and trials. But if we are faithful until life's end, those things will cease and joy will be continued.

"Who found favour before God, and desired to find a tabernacle

for the God of Jacob. But Solomon built him an house. Howbeit the most High dwelleth not in temples made with hands; as saith the prophet, Heaven is my throne, and earth is my footstool: what house will ye build me? saith the Lord: or what is the place of my rest? Hath not my hand made all these things?" (Acts 7:46-50).

We each one can make a house for God. We each one can build that house, and it is expected of us. It is right in our heart. If we are willing to open our heart and let Him in, God will dwell there. His Word tells us that -- that He will dwell within our heart if we will provide for Him a place of abode, a place to dwell, and a place to live. We really all do want that. We all do want Him within our heart to guide us and to direct us that we can someday be with Him in Heaven above.

The fifty-first verse speaks to some of us..."Ye stiffnecked and uncircumcised in heart and ears, ye do always resist the Holy Ghost: as your fathers did, so do ye. Which of the prophets have not your fathers persecuted? and they have slain them which shewed before of the coming of the Just One; of whom ye have been now the betrayers and murderers:

Who have received the law by the disposition of angels, and have not kept it." (Acts 7:51-53).

Again, it is our choice. Do we want to be a stiffnecked and uncircumcised-in-heart people? Do we wish to plug our ears unto the Word of God and not hear because we are afraid to make a change in our life before our friends or those whom we work with or walk with?

It does not get any easier the longer we wait. Today, we have the opportunity. Satan is never going to let us rest. He always is going to have an excuse. No matter what it is. Each one of us can think of our own walk of life. We can think how many years we have gone until this day. There has always been an excuse. It has maybe changed over the years.

Maybe it started in school. We couldn't do it when we were still in school. We couldn't do it then because we went to college. We couldn't do it because maybe we went to the military. We couldn't do it because we just got employment. And on and on and on it goes and it will continue that way if we continue to listen to the devil. God is beckoning us today. Let us open our ears and our hearts. Let us receive God today.

REMEMBERING

Our Spiritual Heritage

In the context of present-day American religious freedom, it is difficult to comprehend the difficulties our forefathers in faith endured in 19th century Switzerland.

In Samuel Froehlich's time, the state church was still in force and to oppose it and practice another doctrine was a dangerous vocation. While the harshness had diminished from that exerted toward the Anabaptists of the 1500's, a firm hand from the state and the state church was a reality for Froehlich and his followers. They were still hated as "re-baptizers" (as were the Anabaptists). Because the church and the state were one entity, any who worshipped in other churches were considered both heretics and traitors.

Often, when our forefathers were hailed before Swiss courts, they would confess they were only preaching the Word of God according to Christ and the Apostles. A judge once told them, "We don't live anymore in the time of the Apostles. It has become different now." Such was the blunt, stern attitude of the state.

Samuel Froehlich and his zealous new ministers were the new "literalists" who preached directly from the Word, using it as the final rule of doctrine and life. If suffering and oppression was to be their lot, they saw this as the cost of being faithful to God---and they were willing to suffer.

Froehlich wrote on February 26,

1836, "...that followers of Christ must walk the narrow way and at a price in which often nothing remains but the grace of Christ."

His new churches challenged the concept of infant baptism. This brought enormous rebuke from the state church. Also, the teaching of a pure church upset the theological leaders of the state church because the latter felt the church was to consist of both the devout and the wayward. To them, all citizens, from infancy on, were a part of the state church.

As the preaching and establishing of new churches took place, Samuel Froehlich wrote, "I am oppressed on all sides. I have great conflict within myself." Over the years of his short life (he died at age 53), he suffered deep mental anguish as a result of both civil and religious opposition.

Many souls embraced the doctrines of repentance and conversion and God blessed the preaching of Froehlich and his co-laborers. As state authorities took note of this, they began to exert themselves, much to the detriment of the new churches.

In the early 1830's, Froehlich was known and reviled throughout Switzerland as a "dangerous sectarian". Newspapers called for his progress to be halted. Once in Appenzell, believers were given bloody beatings and fined up to 100 gold pieces each.

On April 13, 1831, he was

warned by authorities for preaching in Leutwil. On May 6, he was dragged from a meeting to police headquarters. Officers tore his clothes and emptied his pockets looking for books and writing materials. He was banned from Canton Aargau.

On September 2, 1832, Froehlich spoke to nearly 500 souls in Langnau. The next day he was arrested and told to leave the area within 24 hours. Such was the cost of faithfulness.

When Froehlich spoke in Hauptwil in 1834, a storm of protest and conflict broke out. Public warnings and hostile newspaper editorials were lodged against him. Twelve state church pastors demanded his removal from Switzerland. He became a hated figure by governmental and church officials across Switzerland. Police began watching his every move. Yet, he remained faithful.


Sometimes local mobs were incited to charge worship services. Listeners were manhandled, beaten and shoved around. Using sticks and stones, opponents would unleash their hatred and blood would be shed. Once, a mob of several hundred destroyed a believer's house. The owners managed to escape with their lives.

"A Father's Dilemma"

The dilemma I'm talking about has to do with being strict and kind at the same time. That's enough to make any father throw up his hands in despair.

Let's start with the parable of the prodigal son. The father could be faulted for giving the younger son his inheritance just because he asked for it. It may be that the father simply wanted to be kind and had no idea that his son was going to waste it on sinful things. When the younger son returned, the father was blamed by the older son for celebrating his homecoming. The father responded, "Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine." (Luke 15:31). Obviously, this was a kind father, but he suffered very much waiting for his younger son to come home, and then he suffered again because he was blamed by his older son.

We could conclude that this father was at fault and that he

should have followed the teachings in Proverbs about correcting your sons and he would have saved himself a lot of heartache. But let's not be too sure. He may have spanked his children when they were small but there comes a time when they outgrow that. Also, the New Testament wisely teaches, "And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4).

Something else to consider is the teaching in Luke 6:31, "And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise." If we are to treat people outside of our families like we want to be treated by them, how much more should we treat those of our own families like we want them to treat us, including our children so far as respect and consideration is concerned. This is not a simple matter. As a young person, I requested my father, Pa Ehnle, to talk things

over with me if he felt I had made a mistake but I'm not sure I always gave our own children that much consideration. Surely we should be stricter with ourselves than we are with others, including our own children. If we could be more perfect ourselves, we might be a better inspiration for our children.

In I Corinthians 4:15 we read, "For though ye have ten thousand instructors in Christ, yet have ye not many fathers:". Spiritually, too, it is difficult to be the father we are supposed to be. I was taught that love alone is not enough. Evidently, you have to be very strict while being very kind, and I'm back in my dilemma again. To all of you who are not fathers, please forgive us and try to understand. We're trying, but this business of being a father is a complex assignment. I call it, "A Father's Dilemma". We should do the best we can and leave it with God.
