Comfort Ye One Another - II

As we seek to comfort one another, it is important to never underestimate the power of God and His boundless love and mercy. He is able to heal all wounds and to provide comfort and strength in the most difficult situations. In times of deep distress, the grieving soul often becomes so discouraged that it is difficult for them to pray or to read God's Word. The very time when someone least feels like praying and reading God's Word is the time when it is needed the most. If we can encourage them to continue praying and reading-perhaps by praying and reading with them it will help them draw closer to God. We have His promise that "...His mercy endureth forever" (Psalm 136). We can be comforted by the example of the children of Israel when they were in dire straits and "...they cried unto the Lord in their trouble, and He saved them out of their distresses. Oh that men would praise the Lord for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men!" (Psalm 107:13 & 15).

Satan will use any method he can to bring grief to the children of God. If he cannot lead us into sin, he may try to make us believe that we have done wrong even when we have been faithful. We need to be careful that we do not become judgmental. If someone is depressed, we dare not assume that they have sinned. Depression can be caused by a variety of conditions which may include long-term illness, significant amounts of stress or other non-spiritual factors. It may be that there is a spiritual problem but if there is, time, prayer and patience will reveal it. If it becomes apparent that there is a spiritual problem that needs attention, encouragement should be given to the troubled individual that they seek spiritual counselling from their Elder or minister. If they are unable to go alone, offer to go with them. It is best not to apply too much pressure, but neither should the

problem be allowed to go on too long. Although the situation is not exactly the same as those described in Matthew 7:1-5 (removing the beam from our own eye so we can see clearly to remove the mote from our brother's eye) or Matthew 18:15-17 (approaching a brother about a trespass), the advice in the Word is certainly applicable as it teaches us how to approach situations in which cleansing and forgiveness are needed.

It is critically important that, rather than heaping guilt upon a distressed soul, they need to be reassured that where there is sincere repentance there is forgiveness. "So that contrariwise ye ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow" (II Cor. 2:7). This is not to say that sin should be ignored nor covered but rather that it be dealt with using love, compassion and forgiveness.

We may feel we have so little to offer that we should not even try to help. However, let us not overlook the value of even a small amount of help. When Christ was in the wilderness with the multitude, He didn't provide them with a large supply of food. He only gave them one meal and then He sent them away (Matthew 15:32-35). In the parable of the talents, the master did not require that every servant gain ten pounds. He was satisfied with a small return by those who did the best that they could do with what they had (Matthew 25:23). Christ also reminded us that "...whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward" (Matthew 10:42). One talent properly used, one cup of cold water given in love or one meal provided to the hungry will be blessed by the Lord.

Sometimes problems are such that an individual may need professional help. Some situations are very delicate and

require special care and consideration. If we are uncertain about the need for the individual to get professional help, we should seek the advice of someone who has had more experience. Getting involved in problems that are too deep for us to handle could cause additional problems or allow the existing problems to go on longer than is necessary.

Finding the right kind of professional help is very important. Many professional counsellors do not understand the importance of faith and the value it has in the healing process. Counsel from the ungodly can cause serious confusion and could lead to spiritual shipwreck. There are individuals within our brotherhood who have training in these delicate areas and who will give godly advice. Limited counselling is available through a special service that was established for our brotherhood. Initial help in this area is available by calling 1-800-747-9049. Those in the brotherhood who are providing this service will try to put the inquiring individual in contact with someone who can provide the kind of help that is needed. This service is not intended to replace the spiritual counselling of the Elders and ministers. It is designed to be used when there are problems that may not be of a spiritual nature. The world has forsaken godly counsel and has turned to the knowledge of man which sometimes may be harmful instead of helpful. Read Psalm 1.

Satan is cunning and is seeking whom he may devour but God is still in control. Although Satan brings much distress upon the world and even upon God's children, God's people have the privilege and duty of being our brother's keeper and helping those who are in need. By taking the time to be available, by listening with a compassionate heart or by helping someone in distress to find godly counsel we can help comfort one another.

MeetingReport

The Mission Committee met on May 2, 1995, and the following items were included in the agenda.

European Building Fund

This fund is used to assist in the building or remodeling of houses of worship in Romania, Hungary, Yugoslavia, Slovakia, Ukraine, and Germany. Inasmuch as our fund has a balance of only \$10,512, we have approved giving our brotherhood an opportunity to contribute to it once again. A letter to this effect was mailed early in June.

The greatest need is in the former Yugoslavia where buildings have been somewhat neglected due to the strife of civil war. Our brethren, however, are not directly in the war zone. There are additional needs in Romania and Ukraine, where we hope God will provide a measure of stability so work can progress.

East European Trip

Lord willing, brothers again plan to travel into Europe this September. They hope to visit Hungary, Yugoslavia, Romania, Ukraine, and Germany. Agendas are being prepared for meetings with elders and others in all these lands. We need to assess the progress of ongoing programs, determine needs for winter, and discuss various other matters.

Romania

The purchase of a building for worship in Caransebes has been finalized. Payment has been made, and the Romanians are remodeling the facility to be suitable for services plus a dwelling for a caretaker.

There was again much discussion on

a self-help plan for our Romanian brethren. It has been proposed that a fund be provided to loan operating capital to Romanians interested in establishing their own businesses. Interest rates are high there, and we hope that this program can be implemented if the way opens for brethren to visit them this fall.

Slovakia

Brethren here have purchased a house to be used for worship services. They have often expressed their thanks to us for help received.

Caribbean Work Teams

The Mission Committee reaffirmed a willingness to provide for the spiritual needs of brethren going to Haiti or Jamaica on work teams and that they should avoid intermingling with others of different doctrinal beliefs. Ministers have been accompanying these teams regularly and hope to continue to do so in the future.

RGMMI

Bro. John Klotzle gave a report on the Rural Gospel and Medical Missions of India. A trip to India is planned for the fall of 1995, and he suggested that a member of the Mission committee who has not been to India would be welcome to accompany them on this trip.

Mexican Project

Since January, 1995, Bro. Marshall and Sis. Jan Heinold have been living in Ixtlan, Mexico, and have started a ministry there. They report to us monthly on their activities.

It was agreed that elders representing the Mission and World Relief Committees should visit Ixtlan as soon as feasible. They will have a

chance to observe the spiritual activities as well as inspect a parcel of land available for purchase. After they have reported back to both Committees and the Elder Body, we anticipate direction for future involvement.

Committee Rotation

Members of the Mission Committee are appointed for an eight year term. They may be appointed for a second term and after that they cannot succeed themselves. The term of Bro. Phil Stettner of Bluffton North, Indiana expires in August, 1995. It will be recommended to the Elder Body that he be reappointed since he has not completed two full terms.

Silver Lining

A financial report from the Silver Lining indicated a slight operating deficit the past few months. Paper costs are increasing dramatically, as some of us are well aware when we buy household and office supplies. This indicates larger deficits in the coming months, and several ideas were considered as to how to deal with this. They included increasing the subscription rate, reducing type size and/or number of pages, and a contribution from the Mission Committee. This will be considered further, but we approved a contribution of \$10,000 at this time to cover present financial needs.

Suggestions Appreciated

The next meeting is scheduled for August 1. Anyone having a matter you would like to have discussed should contact any Mission Committee member or your local elder. Suggestions are always appreciated.

Humanitarian Aid Shipment into Ukraine April1995

Translated from the German language.

Note: Last year the furniture for the new church in Breidenbach was purchased and shipped from the USA. Since there was much room in the shipping container, it was filled with clothing and shoes purchased with World Relief funds. This is a report of the journey taking it from Breidenbach, Germany to Korovia, Ukraine.

The semi truck was loaded at our I new church in Niederdieten, just a short distance from Breidenbach with 24 metric tons of clothing and shoes on April 22. Shortly after 10:00 PM on April 23, the truck left and we followed later meeting them on April 24 in Hungary at the last filling station before the Romanian border. Here we met Bro. Janos Namenii from Budapest, and his daughter Tündi. Shortly after 9:00 PM, the entire group was together at the Romanian border. We discovered a line of 45 trucks waiting for clearance through the border. We drove past this entire line to the first barrier, where our truck was stopped by a soldier. Hella went with our car to the customs office where she appealed for permission to enter the country. This took only a few minutes.

This was the beginning of our struggle with hostile forces regarding our papers. Bro. Ernst Pfister had been informed by the Romanian officials in Bonn via telephone that the necessary papers to permit transit through Romania could be acquired at the border. Inasmuch as our trailer had not been sealed, the officials viewed it as impossible to grant us

this permission. We went back and forth for about an hour and one half until we asked to speak with the chief customs officer. After a while, he came. Accompanied by another man, and as he approached, he greeted us with the words, "Christ is risen", since it was the Monday after Easter on the Romanian calendar. At that time I sensed that the way would open for us. It was a result of the prayers of the brethren and the entire church. The chief ordered the customs officials to approve our papers. We all thanked our great God.

Inasmuch as our drivers had been underway for more than 24 hours, we

mania from border to border is 325 miles, which we covered in about 12 hours with two or three short stops.

About 2:00 PM we approached the Ukrainian border. Here began the most difficult struggle with the authorities.

(Translator's note: Former shipments have nearly all taken a route leading through Ukraine instead of Romania, crossing into Ukraine from Hungary at Zahony/Chop, where the officials are used to dealing with our people. We have been through that border crossing many times, and it is easier to deal with the officials due to their previous experience in such matters.)



Journey from Breidenbach, Germany to Korovia, Ukraine (32 hours)

stopped after 24 miles for a rest of three hours. April 25, about 3:00 AM, we continued on our way through the lovely mountain country of Romania. The roads are very good in comparison to those in Ukraine. However, we needed to take detours through the larger cities because of the size of our truck. The driver was stopped once because he had not noticed the sign for a detour, and had to pay a fine of about \$9.00. The stretch through Ro-

The problems began with issuance of visas. The officials demanded \$150 per person from us, without looking into the semi trailer. Things went back and forth for about four hours until we resolved things with the help of the Lord. Our patience always seems to run out, but the Lord is faithful, even in our weakness. Here, too, there were men whom we needed for such

If we put ourselves close to sin situations, we don't have control over our point of numbness. Let us cling to the Rock of our Lord Jesus Christ and the light of His Word, the warmth of His love--where we remain attached by our continued obedience.

June is a rainy season here in Japan. We usually have rain two or three times a week. Most people don't like a rainy day, but it is not bad to stay at home reading books, listening to music, and talking with family or friends on such a day. Depending on the way of our thinking, we can feel more comfortable under the bad situation.

We have had awful experiences since the beginning of this year. In January, a very big earthquake attacked Kobe area, which was bigger than San Francisco quakes in 1989. We felt sad to know a lot of people were killed and lost their houses by the earthquake.

Another awful news made us tremble soon after that. A series of terrible happenings were caused by Oumu Shinrikyou, a crazy religious group. They made sarin gas five times, one of the most terrible gases that we human beings have ever had. Needless to say, most of us didn't know of this gas before that. And as an experiment, they first sprayed that gas in Matumoto, Nagano prefecture next to our prefecture last June. And next time they put several plastic bags with sarin in them in the subways of Tokyo on March 16. Many people were killed and injured.

On the very day I happened to get on the same line of the subway the direction of which was just opposite about at the time. I trembled to think of it afterward.

Because of Oumu matters, people began to think that religion is a very suspicious thing. They have tended to have suspicious eyes toward religion. I hope they will tell Christianity from crazy cult.

In a sense, it was the greatest shock that a lot of young people with high intelligence were attracted to Oumu and joined as believers. What made such young people walk toward the cult? What attracted them? Many of those young believers seemed to be seeking for the meaning of their lives and the place their hearts and minds could rest in.

The importance is that they could not find an answer for their seeking among traditional religions including Christianity. We should think what we can do for such seeking persons. If our church is not attractive enough to make their eyes gaze at our Lord Jesus, what is our church for? And for whom is our church?

work, and God provided for us. Weary and exhausted, but with thankful hearts, freed from all our worries, we set forth for Korovia in Ukraine, which we reached between 9:00 and 10:00 PM. There were about 20 brethren waiting for us, prepared immediately to unload the truck. After greeting one another, and a short discussion, we agreed that we would need to unload the next day under the supervision of customs officials.

Bro. Namenji and his daughter were picked up by his son, the drivers stayed in the apartment in the Korovia

church, and Hella and I went with Peterbatschi (Elder Peter Karcia) to his house. We got to bed about 11:00 PM.

On April 26 about 8:00 in the morning, we drove with Peterbatschi to Korovia. The road was bad, and he drove his Mazda through a field. Inasmuch as it had rained hard during the night, shortly before we got to Korovia, we drove into a mudhole and got stuck. The wheels spun and threw mud, but the car didn't go anywhere. Finally, a

stranger came along and helped, and the three of us were able to free the

In Korovia, we took Elder Vasile Paladean with us and drove to customs to pick up an inspector to observe the unloading. After an hour's discussion, an official went with us to Korovia. Under his observation, the truck was unloaded in just under an hour. About 12:00 the trailer was empty, and Bro. Grischa Jakobec drove the official back.

Now I had an opportunity to talk with the three elders, Peter, Vasile, and Dmitriv Hretschka, and give them the money we had brought in, plus relay the instructions from Bro. Ernst Pfister.

From this conversation, it became evident that the situation in Ukraine is worse than before. Presently great hunger stalks the entire land, including among our brethren. We could feel this as they served us meals. Our dear ones live off the land. They have no store of food, nor money to buy any. It is the time when one first plants the land, and can only harvest after some months. It is the leanest season of the year. Peterbatschi said that he has already looked at swine ready for slaughter, but didn't want to spend the last

but also the money.

We took tearful leave of one another, and they gave us their most hearty greetings to all we meet, as is written in song #7 in the Hymns of Zion. It was about 4:00 PM when we got into our vehicles to begin our return trip with the help of the Lord. As we left the church at Korovia, they all waved to us until we were out of sight. To our great surprise, when we got to the main road about five minutes later, the entire group was there to show us their great love and appreciation one last time. After about

one half hour we got to

the border.

At the Romanian side of the border, the officials demanded a fee of \$500. After a half hour of this sort of thing, the Lord intervened once again. A soccer game began on television, and since the Romanians are addicted to soccer, and we spoke the same language, we got the thing cleared up.

It was about 6:00 PM and the Carpathian Mountains and darkness lay before us. But God be praised,

thanked, and honored, that He conducted us over the mountains and through the night without problems.

About 8:00 AM on April 27, we were prepared to go through the Romanian border. There we met the same officer who had cleared our papers on our way in. After some time, we were allowed through.

This is where our united trip ended. We bade farewell to our drivers who had been so faithful. They drove home, and we stayed two days with relatives in Budapest.

To God alone, the great, almighty, loving and faithful God be all praise, honor, and thanks.



money he had on them. Since our time was very limited, we had no opportunity to visit the open markets, in order to evaluate the situation. The brethren told us that goods are available, but very expensive.

"JESUS IS THE CENTER OF THE BIBLE"

Sermon by Bro. Peter Petrovic of San Diego, CA Ezekiel 20:39-44 and Mark 14:66-72

Some of you might say, "Well, I know this portion of the Scriptures so good. I have read it so many times, and yet, we are reading it again." But that is what this Word of God is all about, loved ones. When I open the Holy Scriptures to read it at home, I ask the Lord to bless His Word in my heart so that I can learn something. That is not something that I haven't read before, but it is something, perhaps, that I quite do not understand.

So often we read the Word in the same chapters and we think we know it. "I read it before." Yet, as we concentrate and as we pray to the Almighty God, He sent His Holy Spirit to reveal something. Maybe the smallest thing, but it is very important in your life and in my life. That is how our Heavenly Father cares for each one of us. He reveals to us as much as we can grasp and understand and as much as we ask.

We heard in this morning hour (as the brother even mentioned) about prayer and the importance of it. What is the Scripture telling us? Ask. Knock. Are we asking? Are we knocking? Are we receiving? Maybe we are not receiving because we are not asking, as another Scripture tells us, but the loving Lord reveals to us.

I am sure that each one of us have such a burning desire in our heart that we will love the Lord so much. I am sure that each one of us would agree with the Apostle Peter here, even when he said, "If all of the disciples and those that were there will deny You, I would not." I am sure each one of us would say that. Perhaps all of us feel that we are that strong as he felt. Well, I hope that we are a little bit stronger as we have the Holy Spirit. He did not have it at that time.

But I still know that I am weak. I am sure all of you brothers and sisters will agree with me that we are weak. We live in this flesh and blood. There is someone out there in the world that wants to take our mind and wants us to think about something else today, and not to think about spiritual things. Satan doesn't want us to grow spiritually, but the Scripture is encouraging us to grow. Why do we have to grow? So we can become strong in the Lord. We want to establish our roots as the trees need to have these established roots.

We have had a lot of rain in the last few weeks and in the last month in California. We have seen a lot of trees down, and I am sure you have had similar problems here with the weather. You look at some of those roots and you see how shallow they are. The tree looks beautiful. The branches are nice and green, and there is so little of roots therein. Sometimes we can say, "I wonder how it is that this tree was standing there for all of those years." But when it falls down, it cannot get up anymore. That is it.

I pray that you and I will have these roots established and that we can be firmly grounded on that foundation which is our Lord Jesus Christ. As the Apostle Paul tells us in I Corinthians, chapter three, nobody else can lay another foundation that is laid. Our Lord has done His work, but it is up to us now. Are we going to build wood, hay, stubble, precious stones, gold or silver? That is up to you and me. The Lord has left that up to us, beloved, but I can just encourage each one. Let us hold on fast, as the apostle was encouraging us, hold on fast to this wonderful doctrine that we have. People did not have it always, loved ones, we know that.

Go read a history of Christianity between, I believe, 200 A.D. and 1400 A.D. Someone had to translate the Scriptures to common people. They did not have it as you and I have it. I am so thankful that for some reason, God has been so merciful to us and that He has given us Holy Scriptures and that we can have more Bibles than we can read at home. I don't mean by every translation, but the translation that we appreciate and that we can understand. I am so thankful that I can have twenty Bibles if I want at home. If I wear one, I can get another one.

I don't like to stray too far from the subject that we have read in here, but I would just like to say this. Some people have intended to keep the Bible on the shelf so a child can't touch it and no one can touch it. That is a Holy Book. You know, it is holy. But to you and me, it is holy as you and I are holy. If we never touch it, it is not holy to us. We can just say that it is holy. Let us use our Bibles. It is wonderful to read in the mornings and evenings.

It contains precious words of everlasting life -- a history of Christianity. A lot of things we can learn from somebody else's mistakes, as we have learned, even from reading. In our first reading in here, about Israelites, they have given themselves to idolatry. Something else in this world became more precious to them than the commandments they had received from the Almighty God, loved ones. God was not

very pleased with that. We know that very well.

When I think about society today, someone might say, "We don't have any idolaters. We don't have any idols today. That was all many, many years back. We read about it as history." Examine your life, and I need to examine my life.

Think about all the things that you possess, just things that you have, physical things. If the Lord would take all of these things away from you, would you still love Him and serve Him the same? If you have a college degree, if you have been schooled for a certain profession and then all at once the government would issue a decree that all the true fundamental Christians will lose their jobs and have to go and work as laborers, perhaps, where they would earn minimum wages, would you still love the Lord the same and say, "Lord, what are You doing?"

You know, that has happened in Europe in my time when I was growing up. Our brothers and sisters were not able to get, first of all, schooling and hold such a position that many of us here can enjoy. But that is past. Let us look at ourselves. Is there something in this world that is more precious to us than loving and serving, praising and glorifying the Almighty God? You have to answer that for yourself, but look about the Israelites. There was something that was more precious to them than serving the Almighty God.

Don't forget about this. The Israelites were called "hard-headed", "hard-necked" and a lot of other terms that I don't even remember. Maybe we think we don't fall into that category at all. We have a lot of Christians around us, but where is our heart? I know we all believe in Jesus Christ. How much have we grown since we accepted that Jesus is the Son of God? Since we were rescued from the claws of the enemy of our souls, how much have we grown, beloved?

Look now a little bit in the Apostle Peter's history. He thought that he was something strong. He was the one that walked with Jesus on the Sea of Galilee, I believe, and how is it that he is going to deny the Lord when he is so strong? That is what happens when we put too much confidence in ourselves when we think that we can do something. The Lord tells us as He did speak to the Corinthians through the Apostle Paul, "What do you have that you have not received?" Whether it is your health or

physical or material things that you have, what do you have that you have not received?

The answer is that we do not have anything that we have not received. That is the way I believe it. Everything that I have, it is not mine. It is the Lord's -- He gave it to me. I often sing it, "I am a pilgrim here below. I am traveling to a promised land."

Beloved, so often we get attached to material things. So often we rely on our own wisdom, which is foolishness before the Almighty God, the Scripture tells us, instead of relying on the Holy Spirit.

How much is the Holy Spirit revealing to us His will in our personal walk of life? Or have we come to the position in our spiritual walk of life that we ask the Lord, "Give us some signs so that we know that the Holy Spirit is still within us." Where do we stand? Loved ones, I am not criticizing. I am really speaking to myself. I need to be awakened as everyone else as we look into the Word.

I hope and pray that the Holy Spirit of God will really do the things that we read in the Gospel of John in the fifteenth, sixteenth and seventeenth chapters as He tells us how He would manifest His power in our lives. Is it still so hard to worship the Lord, the Almighty God as it was before we repented? If it is, maybe we are not walking on that narrow path. Maybe we are not praising the Almighty God as we ought to praise Him. We are not as appreciative as we ought to be to the Almighty God. Maybe we have not learned to depend on Him.

We have now learned that the power comes through the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is preparing you and me for eternity. I cannot prepare myself. I can try it, but I know it won't work. I can try to do things in my profession and that even may not work if God doesn't give me strength --physical strength.

We need to depend on our Lord Jesus Christ as every member of this body must depend. The Scripture tells us that the Lord Jesus Christ explained to us that He is the Head and we are the members. He is the True Vine and we are the branches, loved ones. How thankful we are that we are attached to the True Vine, which is our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we heard this morning how He loved so much this world that He gave His only begotten Son to die for each one of us. I am so thankful that He was so mindful of me. I am not worthy to receive His grace and mercy. That is how much He loves every soul in this world.

I talked to a friend not too long ago (a few weeks ago) and he was brought up in a Christian family in Europe. He said, "I feel that I am not chosen." We became pretty

close friends and I asked him, "Well, what is keeping you away from God for so long?" He said, "Pete, I feel that I am not chosen." I said, "Are you sure about that? What do you mean, 'You are not chosen?' Can you find that in the Holy Scriptures?" Of course, he cannot.

But he feels that there are certain people who are chosen to be saved and the rest will just go to perdition, or that they will be damned. I said, "You are wrong. There is so much yet to be done in this world and the Lord is waiting for you. There is something that you ought to do. You are wrong. Have you been exposed to this precious Word?" I said, "Read the Book of Romans and it will tell you there that you are chosen!"

We all came short of the glory of God, we know that. The Apostle Paul and the Apostle Peter and Jesus Christ Himself....I don't need to go through the verses now as I don't think it is necessary, but He tells us that the Lord is not slack in concerning His coming, but He is waiting! He wants all men to come to repentance and to be reconciled with Him.

Encourage, dear ones, those who are confused yet. Where is this idea coming from? From somebody else? Yes, from somebody else, and that somebody else is the enemy of our souls.

The same enemy that deceived Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden is trying to deceive you and me in these latter days. He has brought a lot of confusion into this world. There is a lot of corruption in this world, and we ought to stand. If Christians ever needed to stand and be firmly grounded in the Holy Scriptures, this is the day and time when you and I must know the Word of God.

There is a Scripture that crossed my mind right away, "Knowledge puffeth up, but charity edifieth." I Corinthians 8:1. Not to be puffed up, but to admit that we are just the servants of the Almighty God -- each one of you that are seated here.

You don't have to be a minister or you don't have to be an Elder. Each one of us is equal in the sight of Almighty God and we are all ministers of the Word of God.

Let us not be ashamed of this holy and precious Word. We are our Lord's ambassadors today. The Apostle Peter understood that later on when he was anointed with the Holy Spirit. He said, "No, Lord, I am not going to deny You." He said that before he was empowered by the Holy Spirit, and he needed to learn the lesson so that he could become one of the leaders of the church—the early church. And he sure did learn!

There are some beautiful Epistles that you can read. They are so encouraging today when He tells us that we should not fall asleep. He did fall asleep spiritually and physically when Jesus was in the garden. He was praying to the Almighty God and there was no one there to comfort Him. Peter, James and John were sleeping there. "Oh, we are so strong. We do not need to pray just to pray." Pray. No, they don't need to pray. They felt they were strong enough, and they sure learned a good lesson.

Sometimes you and I learn good lessons through our mistakes. Sometimes I feel, as I was talking to Bro. Loren last night, even when you do your best, we still have the enemy that comes before the throne of the Almighty God and he is accusing you and me. He says, "Look! He loves you and He serves you. He understands you where He has given you understanding. Please don't understand enough so that he can find his soul's salvation or the way to Heaven. Just touch this or that that he has, and you will see where you stand and how much He loves you."

Let us not be deceived. We have the same enemy as Adam and Eve had. One day that enemy will be bound, the Scripture tells us. What a glorious day that should be when Jesus will come back and show this world what is like Heaven, a righteous government. That will come to pass soon, beloved, I believe that.


The Book of Revelation tells us that it might be around the corner. Then you and I that have been faithful here on this earth will rule over this world with our Lord Jesus Christ for one thousand years. Aren't we looking forward to that?

Once we pass from this life to eternity, we will never die. But we will live forever and forever. Even when we must leave this flesh and blood, which is passed from death unto life, to live eternally, what a glorious day that will be!

Let us remain strong. Let us not rely as the Apostle Peter relied on his own strength. I am thankful that even the Apostle Peter was given grace to repent. He went out and wept bitterly. Then when Jesus rose from the dead, we know He loved him. His soul came to Jesus. He knew that that is not really what he had in heart to deny Him, but God gave him grace to repent.

You and I have denied our Lord many times prior to our conversion, and I hope that it wasn't after our conversion. If it has happened in anyone's life, where can we go? The Scripture tells us to go to the Lord...run to Him! He is our Shelter!

As we read the beautiful Psalms -- Oh, they are so encouraging! So uplifting! We belong to Him! We are His peculiar people. We are His and He is ours. Let us love Him and serve Him with all our heart and mind.





The persecution of Samuel H. Froehlich and his faithful co-workers came from three primary sources---the Swiss State church, the Swiss civil government, and later from a schism within that resulted from doctrinal challenges. The major causative factor to all the troubles and distresses of the Froehlich-led believers in Christ stemmed from his challenge to the rationalistic doctrines of the state church. This brought endless rebuke from the authorities.

Not only did Froehlich face retribution from the state church, but also from civil (governmental) officials, of which the state church was a part. Because the church and the state were one entity, a long-held belief prevailed that disloyalty to the state church was disloyalty to the civil government, and thus treasonous.

Also, because Froehlich's followers refused to have their infant children baptized in the state church, they were scorned and often fined by the state. Interestingly, the Anabaptists (300 years earlier) who refused to have their children baptized were called "soul murderers". In Froehlich's time, the state attitude was less harsh, but deep criticism still prevailed.

Early in his ministry, Froehlich suffered from poor health. Chest pain and respiratory problems plagued him throughout his years of preaching and pastoring, and his medical situation was aggravated by religious tensions and distresses. It contributed to an early death at age 53.

On September 2, 1832, Froehlich preached to a large audience at Lang-

nau. About 500 were present. He preached for three hours from the text of John 16:7. The next day his preaching of salvation was reported to the civil authorities. He was arrested and told to leave the area within 24 hours.

In Leutwil, where author Herman Reugger reports 45 souls had one time been baptized, fines were levied on anyone who permitted religious meetings in their homes. Reugger further writes, "He (Froehlich) held meetings everywhere and persecution followed him at every step."

Froehlich writes, "As long as I kept silent I was left alone. As soon as I began to testify of Christ, persecution came."

By 1842, trials and challenges were ever-present. Reugger writes, "The persecutions ever and again posed new questions and tasks. New problems arose almost daily, and the more so, because so many people of many trends and varied circumstances were gathered together."

Froehlich met persecution (i.e., harassment by the state) almost everywhere. Fines were commonplace. Once, in Thurgau, newly-baptized souls were beaten with clubs, and nearly drowned in watering troughs. But such treatment drew the brethren together, and energized their tendencies to spread the gospel.

In 1843, Froehlich was expelled from Zurich and branded a "sectarian". Bounty was offered for his capture. The brethren, amid these distresses, resolved to hold fast to their religious principles "according to the Word of

God, and to carry them out, whatever the cost might be."

Froehlich's travel patterns were monitored. Once his enemies were waiting for him. It was thought he would walk under a viaduct to reach a certain gathering where he was to speak. His opponents waited on top of the viaduct where they intended to pour scalding hot water on him. He learned of this trick, and walked on another path to the meeting. He escaped their wrath.

Despite ongoing setbacks, a thirst for God grew. Believers were determined to meet for worship. Sometimes meetings would be held at 3:00 a.m. Often, this would occur three times per week. Church and civil attitudes toward the believers necessitated secret meetings.

An arrested believer once told a judge that the difference between the sermons of Brother Froehlich and those of the state church were like the difference between day and night.

Persecutions, distresses, and suffering did not deter the establishment and growth of a true, Bible-based faith. Such patterns enhanced it! We, today, are its beneficiaries.

"Puppies" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

At the breakfast table I was reading along in the Japanese Bible from the Gospel of Mark. Lois follows in the English King James Bible. In 7:27 Jesus said to a Greek lady who wanted the devil cast out of her daughter, "It is not meet (or proper) to take the children's bread, and to cast it unto the dogs." Jesus may have been testing her humility with such a statement.

The lady responded in verse 28, "Yes, Lord: yet the dogs under the table eat of the children's crumbs." I noticed that in both verses, in Japanese, dogs is written with two kanji or characters which mean "little dogs" or "puppies". This gave me a vision of puppies scrambling around under the table to catch a crumb or two.

What is our position? Are we willing to be called "dogs" or "puppies"? In II Cor. 1:1, believ-

ers are called "saints", and in II Cor. 6:3 it is written, "Know ye not that we shall judge angels?" This is quite a contrast from being puppies under a table looking for crumbs.

Generally speaking, the Pharisees felt themselves to be better than others. We read in Luke 18:11 and 12, where a certain Pharisee prayed, "I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess." They didn't consider themselves to be unworthy puppies, looking for crumbs that might fall from the table of those who are more worthy.

Lazarus is another Bible character who "desired to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table." (Luke 16:21). Dogs were also involved as they

came and licked his sores.

Both the Greek lady and Lazarus were commended in the Bible. The lady took no offense at being called a "dog" or a "puppy". Lazarus would have been, oh so happy, to have been given some of the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table, but the crumbs were not forthcoming. Are we like them, or do we expect more and complain more? I keep seeing puppies under the table looking for crumbs and wonder how I measure up.

We should follow the example of the Greek lady with whom the Lord Jesus Christ was so pleased. She was humble and humility is something we have long advocated. Let's be like puppies under the table, enjoying every crumb that comes to us from the hand of the Master.
