Fifty feet under the sea's surface in the Caribbean Sea are sights most of us will never see. Coral reefs with great French Angelfish (cover) swimming around gives meaning to the Word that God's dominion is above the firmament and in the depths of the sea.

"O Lord our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth!" (Psalm 8:9).

It does not matter where we look--we see God's handiwork. We also see His awesome power and judgment.

"And God said, Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place,...and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas:" (Genesis

It is sobering to think that all this beautiful creation shall melt with fervent heat. Those who know the Lord and follow His ways shall be the bride of Christ. Can we possibly conceive in our mind that the Creator of Heaven and earth would be wanting us who are a part of His creation to be the bride of Christ, and minister unto Him for eternity?

God created man for a special pur-

pose when He said,

"...Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea. and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth." (Genesis 1:26).

Man was made to worship His Creator. Unto the creation called man, God gave intellect to choose right from wrong and breathed into him a living soul. This soul, which is the undestroyable part of us, will make mistakes and

sin will come to man.

We are thankful that God has provided a plan of salvation because we all are prone to make mistakes and are born into sin. To escape God's judgment, we must partake of the plan of salvation and repent for our sins. The fish swim in almost total silence to man's ear, but yet God has given them the ability to interact and communicate. They can sense a predator fish and will sound a warning to others. Thus, they help to protect each other from imminent danger.

A very unique invertebrate is the anemone. This sponge-like creature has tentacles that sting the prey, which are then consumed. The clown fish, however, is immune to the sting and by God's direction finds safety by hiding inside the tentacles of the anemone where no predator will venture. Many of the large fish will remain very still with their mouth open and a little fish called the cleaner fish will clean the debris from their mouths.

It is like another world under the sea, but still a part of God's wondrous creation.

Like the little clown fish who finds safety inside the area protected by the anemone, we find protection in the arms of Jesus Christ, our Saviour.

Without faith and the love and direction of God, we would be aimless on earth.

How often we have said, "Thank you for praying for me." We all, young and old, have dreary days that seem almost as if God is nowhere to be found. It is sometimes difficult to remember that God is only a prayer away. It is then that the prayers of the saints lift us up into Jesus' arms or He reaches down to touch our meek and humble life.

We are not worthy of this love, but we are responsible to God for that love.

Just as each little fish contributes to the habitat in the sea, we each contribute to life above the sea's surface.

There is such a wonderful thing that God has provided us with and it is called fellowship. When one is hurting in our group or church, loved ones will rally around us and give courage.

Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou has put all things under his feet and the

fish of the sea, and whatsoever pas-

seth through the paths of the seas."

I am reminded how God provided for Elijah by sending the ravens to feed him in a way so similar to how loved ones will bring a coffee cake or peach cobbler to cheer us up when we are down and out.

I am reminded also how the fish provided a coin for our Lord, and how God made a great fish to swallow Jonah

As the fish in the sea or the lilies of the field or even the sparrow, we (God's creation) are cared for by Him. His loving grace is sufficient for everyone, so we can take courage, and look to Him for all our strength.

May God's grace rest on each one so that we can find courage to go on.

God's Plan For Family Unity - VII

This seventh part in a series of articles on family unity addresses the issues of clear, reasonable expectations, recognizing the positive side of discipline and our response to our children's unacceptable behavior, such as temper tantrums.

Much has been said about the importance of unity and consistency in training our children. Although it is vital that parents are united and consistent in their approach to training their children, unity and consistency are not enough. Children need to know what is expected of them. Parents must be sure that the expectations that they have for their children are very clearly defined and explained in a way that children can understand them. They cannot know unless they are taught.

The Bible makes it abundantly clear that it is the duty of parents to teach their children the commandments of God, to pass these commandments from generation to generation and to be sure that our children clearly understand the difference between right and wrong. "And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children,..." (Deut. 6:7) "That the generation to come might know them, even the children which should be born;" (Psalm 78:6). "And they shall teach my people the difference between the holy and profane, and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean." (Ezekiel 44:23).

In an age when society is blurring the line between right and wrong and approving many alternate lifestyles that are thoroughly condemned by the Word of God, it is vitally important that God's people always recognize and make the distinction between right and wrong. Our children must understand that it is never right to do wrong and never wrong to do right.

In addition to being clear and consistent, we must be reasonable and realistic in the expectations that we have for our children. An unreasonably harsh taskmaster can cause discouragement. Just as we want and need forbearance from

our Heavenly Father, we need to extend it to our children. "And, ye masters, do the same things unto them, forbearing threatening: knowing that your Master also is in heaven;" (Eph. 6:9). Age, maturity and ability are all factors which should be taken into account. A child should not be punished for what he is unable to do. Overreacting, unrealistic expectations and unreasonable punishment can bring rebellion and defiance.

Be careful in the use of extremes. When we use the words "always", "never", "forever" and others similar to them, there is little room for adjustment if we realize that we have made an error. It is possible to be clear, firm and precise without being extreme.

Sometimes as parents we make the mistake of focusing too much on the negative. While it is appropriate that unacceptable behavior has its consequences, we need to recognize when our children do what is right. Often children are more in need of words of praise and appreciation than words of rebuke. We need to share words of approval for good behavior. "Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do it" (Prov. 3:27). If we use rewards for good behavior, caution must be exercised to provide assurance that the technique of reward does not become bribery. How we approach our children in this matter is vitally important. If we use a reward as a way of recognizing and sharing our appreciation for good behavior after the behavior has occurred rather than promising them a reward is they behave during a certain event, it is less likely to become a bribe. Most of the time we should recognize good behavior with words rather than gifts or treats. This also will help keep things in their proper perspective. If children reach the point where they expect a material reward each time they do something well, we may be bribing instead of rewarding. This should cause us to reexamine our approach and make the necessary adjustments.


Frequently children learn that they can get what they want by threats or temper tantrums. This may cause parents to yield to their demands or to try to "negotiate" with their children to gain peace or acceptance by the child. We ought not to negotiate in matters of right and wrong. The end result is trouble. "And he gave them their request: but sent leanness into their soul" (Psalm 106:15).

To allow a child to get what he wants by having temper tantrums simply encourages inappropriate behavior in the future. Our response to that kind of behavior should be firm, calm and crystal clear so the child knows that it will not be tolerated. It is very important that we do not become too angry with our children in these situations or we will be guilty of doing the very deed that we are trying to prevent our children from doing. We must confront the situation but we must do it in an acceptable manner. "A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger" (Prov. 15:1). "Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him. (Prov. 26:4).

Children often misbehave when they know it will be very difficult or embarrassing for parents to do any thing about it, such as in a grocery store or restaurant. If this occurs, it may be necessary to try and find a place that offers reasonable privacy to handle the situation. If there is no place available, it should be dealt with as soon as possible after getting home. It is important that it not be ignored; problems that are ignored tend to grow.

Parents who are clear, consistent and reasonable in their expectations for their children, who provide a good example and who recognize and respond positively to appropriate behavior will do much to help their children learn to do what is right.

World Relief Project at Galilean Home is Completed

fter about four months of work and effort by around 170 volunteers, the World Relief approved project at the Galilean Home in Liberty, Kentucky has been completed. Late in June, the keys to a new nursery were given to Jerry and Sandy Tucker, administrators of the home.


A Brief History of the Home

This couple had a deep love for children, although doctors told them it was highly unlikely they would ever have any of their own. In 1969, they adopted their first child, the son of an unmarried mother.


Contrary to their expectations, about a year later, Sandy gave birth to their own daughter. In 1972, they opened their home to two little Indian girls whom they later adopted as their own.

Their daughter now had sisters, but Jeremy, their adopted son, had no brothers. Sandy asked their social worker to seek out a boy, and soon a family of two boys and two girls came into their home.

In about four years, they had become a family of 10, and in February of 1974, the birth of Sandy's second child



They continued to take in homeless children. By 1985, fourteen were in their home, and four



Children From Many Lands

In 1986 they became aware of dire needs of children in Haiti and Central America. They began to make trips into



underdeveloped countries bringing distressed children back with them. In 1988 they named their ministry "The Galilean Home". As of this writing, there are around 70 children in the home, about half of which have been adopted by the Tuckers. Most of these children have mental or physical handicaps, all of them with no home or parents to love them.

How We Became Involved

Several years ago, our brethren in Lexington, KY, about an hour and one-half away, became acquainted with this work. Since then, a number of our brethren have gone there and assisted in various ways. One facet of this work is the care of babies born to women in prison. The program, called "Born Free", takes these newborns and cares for them until the mother is released and able to do it herself, if possible. However, many of these babies remain as a part of the extended family in the Home. Last year, the World Relief Committee approved construction of a large nursery to care for these babies.

Construction of the Nursery

Ground was broken on February 14 for a building equipped to care for around 40 children up to age two. During the construction period, several brothers served as on-site superintendents, providing coordination and supervision as the project advanced. Looking back on their work, our volunteers each feel they themselves really benefited the most.



When our brothers and sisters came and lent their assistance, they were touched by what they saw. The very sight of so many children with such great physical and emotional needs brought tears to nearly every eye. The challenges faced by operating such a large undertaking never seem to end. However, the deep love for children evidenced by the Tuckers and their 51 employees seems to be the catalyst which brings the solutions.

About the New Building

Their new nursery, which they have named "Angel House", provides a vitally needed facility. The Colonial style building, 36 by 96 feet, is built on a sloping site with a walk-out basement which could be finished at a later date.

Ten nursery rooms are each equipped with 4 cribs and one single bed for the nannies who alternate serving 24

hours each day. The babies are cared for in custom designed counters with built-in bath facilities. There also is a small kitchen which serves as a break area and a place to prepare 40 separate formulas which are refrigerated.

The full porch across the front of the building provides a place where the nannies can sit in rocking chairs while they care for the babies. Great care is taken to give the unfortunate little ones as much love as possible. "Whosoever shall receive one of such children in my name, receiveth me..." MARK 9:37





Free Water


While working in my garden,

"GODLY MOTHERS HAVE INFLUENCE"

Sermon by Bro. Ronald E. Joos Proverbs 31:10-31 and Mark 7:1-31

Truly, dear ones, God has been near us already, as we could read there in the Old Testament of the virtues that a Christian mother should have. As we did open this Word to the New Testament, we have here before us the verse that contains therein, "Honour thy father and thy mother." (Mark 7:10)

Yes, first of all, we honor God. We honor His Son, Jesus Christ, the one who brought the plan of salvation upon this earth; the one who made that plan of salvation available unto mankind.

Then we honor those who brought us into this world---our father and our mother. We honor those who cared for us as babes, those who brought us to God's house of worship, those who taught us from this Holy Word. How often, as we grow older and as we go upon life's pathway day by day, do we think back to the days of our childhood...the days of our youth?

Yes, there was a time in our life when we wanted to cast off the things which we had been taught. The devil came forth in our lives and he wanted us to try to put into our minds that we wanted to leave behind what we had been taught as children.

But thanks be to our Heavenly Father, and thanks be to our Lord and Saviour, Jesus, that, yes, they brought back into our hearts and minds those teachings. They impressed upon our hearts those teachings from this Word.

Yes, as we grow older these thoughts become more dear by realizing that we have been given the privilege to have Christian fathers and Christian mothers.

It is so easy for us to look out

Yes, this is Mother's Day and we should speak probably more directly to the mothers, to those who bring those dear children into this world. Maybe you care for those dear children a little more when they are in those young and tender years. Yes, it is important! We are not saying that it is all up to the mothers because the fathers must be there also.

We want to speak to the dear mothers in this morning hour to encourage them onward and forward to take this Word in hand...to read in His Word and to truly pass that Word on. Pass it on, dear mothers, as you have been taught and you have been given the privilege, you must carry it out.

We speak again of those mothers out in the world. Do we look at them with criticism? No. We look at them and feel sorry for them. They were not given these teachings. They did not have it handed down, many of them. Yes, I am sure there are some out there that were taught in the right way and had forsaken it. Those, likewise, we feel sorry for because there was something that hap-

pened there and that communication was broken between them and their God.

But for those of us who are in the household of faith, those dear Christian mothers, hold that banner high. Stand up for what you have been taught. Stand up for what the teachings are in this Holy Word. You are going to be rewarded on this earth and in Heaven above. The reward is going to be yours, and the joys are going to be yours.

Any example that comes forth, the words that are spoken, the kindness that is shown to those dear little ones, the love that is shown there is going to spring forth day by day. As those little ones grow to adulthood, it is going to then be passed on to them.

But your job and your duties are not yet fulfilled until Jesus comes to call you Home. Yes, for the mothers here that have raised their children and they now have grandchildren, the duties are still there. But yet you can look back and you can see the rewards and joys of your efforts as your children grow to the age of accountability, or have grown and are now passing it on to their own children.

Yes, as we speak to the mothers, we speak to the fathers also. It is important for each of us to carry onward and forward.

I want to read again from the twenty-fifth verse in Proverbs thirty-one, "Strength and honour are her clothing; and she shall rejoice in time to come. openeth her mouth with wisdom: and in her tongue is the law of kindness. She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness." (Proverbs 31:25-27). Such important teachings! Strength and honour are her clothing and she shall rejoice in time to come. Strength and honour! Where does that strength and honour come from? From God. As we have said, there is going to be a rejoicing.

"She openeth her mouth with wisdom..." Where does the wisdom come from? Not of man, but of God. "...and in her tongue is the law of kindness." (Proverbs 31:26). So very important. So very, very important in the life of a Christian mother. Kindness.

Those little ones are going to look up and they look there for an example. When they see that kindness, whether it is in an expression or whether it is in words or whether it is in our deeds and our actions, they are going to see it. It is going to be a reflection to them...a reflection from Jesus Christ through the dear mothers to those dear children.

"She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness." (Proverbs 31:27). Is that a problem in this day and time, dear ones? Staying there at home where the children are and being there when the children are needing a parent, when the children are needing someone to look up to, someone to talk to, to get encouragement upon life's

pathway. She looketh well to the ways of her household.

Then it speaks of idleness, "...eateth not the bread of idleness." (Proverbs 31:27). Maybe another problem area in this day and time is idleness. We have many conveniences and many comforts in this life. God has blessed us abundantly in this manner. What do we do with our time? Are we too busy going here and going there enjoying the pleasures of this life? Do we forsake the needs of those dear children?

"Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her." (Proverbs 31:28). Her children arise up, and call her blessed. Now for those of us who are children, those of us who still have our mothers with us, those of us who have grown to adulthood, and I think we speak to each one here in this morning hour, who yet have our mothers with us in this life, do we give honor to our mothers? Do we give that Godly honor to our mothers? Do we encourage them, we as children, encourage our mothers?

Those who have gone on before and have done the work that God has asked them to do, do we sufficiently honor our mothers?

We should day by day, whenever we see them, whenever we are around them, whenever we visit with them, let us show forth those Christian virtues in our life.

Let us thank our dear mothers. Let us encourage them upon life's pathway. They have days, also, when they might become burdened or downcast for one reason or another. That is when it is the duty of the children to lift them up...to encourage them onward and forward...to strengthen them through Jesus.

"...her husband also, and he praiseth her." (Proverbs 31:28). Now it is time we speak to the

husbands...those of us who have dear wives, Christian wives...who labor so diligently for our Lord and for our children. Do we give due recognition to our wives? Or are there days when we expect more out of them than what feasibly they are able to give? When they put in a hard day with the children or when they put in a hard day in the home working, laboring for our needs and for the needs of our children, do we give proper credit where the credit is due?

Do we praise our God that He has given us a wife to mother our children, to care for them, and to look after them? Or do we just take it for granted? Let us give much thought to this. Let us take this thought with us and let us apply it more fully. I think each of us in our own life take too much for granted in this day and time.

If we can look at these blessings that God has given us and we can realize where these blessings come from, we can be thankful and we can use those blessings according to God's will.

"Many daughters have done virtuously, but thou excellest them all. Favour is deceitful, and beauty is vain: but a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised." (Proverbs 31:29-30). How beautiful that verse is...verse thirty! "Favour is deceitful, and beauty is vain." Let us remember that!

"But a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised." (Proverbs 31:30). A woman that feareth the Lord, that is when the praise is going to come in...the praise from God and His precious Son and the praise from the Christian people around you. That praise is not going to come to cause pride, but that praise is going to come to cause encouragement and strengthening of the spirit to carry on what we have

During the more than a century and a half of our church's existence, our spiritual leaders have always wisely and unmistakenly focused major attention on the Lord Jesus Christ. To its credit, the church has not put any primary focus on Samuel H. Froehlich, the man God raised up to lead a spiritual revival, and to subsequently re-establish a church on the foundation of Scriptures.

Brother Froehlich, like all of us, was human. He, like us, had his strengths and weaknesses. To the extent that he became humble and surrendered before God, he was able to overcome human frailty and to eventually fulfill the will of God. Our objective in "Remembering" has been to focus on what God did through Brother Froehlich, rather than on what he personally was able to "accomplish".

Brother Froehlich was born on July 4, 1803, in Brugg, Switzerland to Samuel Heinrich and Gottlieben Berger Froehlich. He was the sixth and youngest child of this union. In following a family tradition of that era, he was chosen by his parents to study for

the ministry.

During the years of preaching and founding churches, he received no salary for his work. This was the case during his 25 years or so of active ministry. Rather, he lived frugally off the annual stipends from his wife's family who were above moderate means. This allowed him to devote full time to the establishment and nurturing of congregations. He wrote and traveled widely.

His parents, Samuel and Gottlieben, were bitterly opposed to their son's leaving the state church. Also, his five siblings opposed his views, although later his sister, Catherine, joined his

group.

Samuel Froehlich was married to Susette Brunschweiler on August 26, 1836. She was his faithful wife of 20 years until he passed away in 1857; and she willingly endured all the joys and often severe sorrows associated with his church work.

How they met is an interesting story. One evening after dark about a dozen believers gathered quietly on the shore of a lake in Switzerland in the Canton Aargau. They met in secret to avoid state authorities. Singing, prayer and a sermon by Brother Froehlich followed. During the prayer two young women who were out for an evening walk heard him. They stopped and peered at the group from behind some bushes.

Froehlich then began to speak about the Holy Spirit and the believer's mission here on earth. One of the young girls, Susette Brunschweiler, was deeply touched by the mellow, earnest tone of his voice, and the stirring message of his words. Eventually, Samuel Froehlich met her family and explained his views. As a result of his spiritual influence, Susette, her elder brothers and sisters, and several people in her parents' factory, were converted to the new faith.

Susette Brunschweiler was born in 1803 in Hauptwil, the daughter of Johann Joachim Brunschweiler, a wellto-do factory owner. The union of Samuel and Susette Froehlich bore three children. Theophanie, the firstborn, died on July 3, 1841, at age 2 1/2. Her father, having been deported to France, was not permitted to attend her funeral---a grievous sorrow for the family. Eugenie Salome was born on January 12, 1840, and died in 1917. She never married. A son, Samuel Gershom, was born on April 12, 1842. He had 21 children, from two successive wives.

One of Samuel Froehlich's biggest trials was the state's failure to initially recognize his marriage to Susette Brunschweiler despite their being married by church ministers in the Evangelical Baptist Church (our faith's name in Switzerland). The state would not recognize any marriage solemnized outside the state church. Because Samuel Froehlich was already a marked man for having formed a new church denomination, the state harassed him unmercifully because his wedding took place outside the realm of the state church. He and his wife suffered terribly for it.

At one point Froehlich was deported, and his children placed in an orphanage. State authorities were harsh and abusive. Karoly Eotvos, in <u>The Nazarenes</u>, describes this tragic incident of the Froehlich family being dispersed:

"The officials of the state went to his house. Froehlich was given an hour to make preparation for his exile. Then he was seized, and pushed out of the house. Two strong prison guards, one on each side of him, guided him as far as the frontier in the direction of Strasbourg.

His wife and children were weeping beside him. One of them was still a babe in arms just having a sound sleep on her mother's breast. They simply wrenched the baby off her breast and carried all the children away as if they had been motherless and fatherless."

Froehlich's marriage, while always valid in the eyes of God, was finally sanctioned at the Strasbourg City Hall under the Napoleonic Code of Law.

"The Selfishness of Selflessness"

Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

Before I was baptized, my Elder, Brother Schupert, talked to me about being dead to sin. I remember him saying that, in the physical sense, it is not good to bury someone while that person is still alive, and likewise, in the spiritual sense, it is not good to bury a person in the waters of baptism until that former person is dead. Romans 6:4 reads, "Therefore, we are buried with him (Christ) by baptism into death."

I understand that this death is to render us dead to sin and dead to self. One of the ministers in my Princeville church at that time told me that "I" should no longer be the center of my life but that "Christ" was to become the center of my life. This translates into selflessness. What the child of God wants and thinks is no longer to be the criteria for living. Bringing glory to God is to be the criteria; we are out of the picture. Anything is to be all right with us so long as it is not against the Bible, nor

against God, Christ, or the Holy Spirit.

This involves a struggle for the children of God because we are still in the body. Nevertheless, we may reason that we must make the sacrifice in order to please God; give up this pleasure and that pleasure, pray and read the Bible every day, as well as attend all meetings at our church, in order to be loyal and to please God.

So far, our theology is intact, the cost is great but it's worth it. Jesus did teach us to count the cost. Luke 14:28 reads "For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first and counteth the cost...?" He didn't want anyone to start serving Him and then quit.

In spite of all this talk about sacrifice and giving up things in order to serve the true Creator God, in reviewing my own life I get the feeling that, in my repentance and conversion, I was motivated by selfishness to repent and to try to get rid of self and to

be dead to sin. I wanted to go to Heaven instead of to Hell and although that brings glory to God, my real concern was not God's glory but my own situation after this earthly life is ended.

Jesus also taught, "He that loseth his life for my sake shall find it." (Matthew 10:39). This teaching that a child of God should lose his or her life for Jesus' sake certainly includes a state of selflessness where we don't throw our weight around about what we think or want. Once again, we must be out of the picture except to say that we want God's will to be done, and if necessary, would die a physical death for that purpose.

I didn't know it but I'm beginning to realize that if we, by God's grace, can attain to a state of selflessness, the intangible and tangible benefits are so great that we will probably begin to feel guilty and selfish about accepting it all.
