
The Silver Lining



"NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE WITH GOD"

Sermon by Bro. Dale Stoller, Fairbury, IL Proverbs 31 and Mark 14:1-42

Have we ever felt totally left alone? Have we ever felt so forlorn and forsaken and thinking that no one ever cared? No one cared a thing about us? No one loved us? We were going to have to face something in our life and we would have to do it all alone? Can we imagine what Jesus felt like when He went out there to pray and yet His disciples could not be watchful? They just did not see the importance and the significance of what was really going to transpire. They just couldn't grasp it, could they? Can you imagine how Jesus felt?

We know that He is so good and so faithful, that He turned unto God. How it is for you and me, when we finally reached that point in our life when we knew we had no where else to turn, that we had to turn to God? There was not a thing that anyone else could do for us-not a thing that anyone we love so dearly here upon this earth could do for us, but only in direct communication with God. We could turn our hearts and just lay it all on the altar where God hears those prayers. God heard those pleas and He heard those cries, those sighs and moans. He heard them all, and He answered our prayer, didn't He?

Not a one of us would be sitting here today as a child of God on our works or our deeds, but it is only by the grace of God and His mercy and Him hearing our cry unto Him that we needed help. He could hear our plea and He answered our prayer. We were able then to come unto Him in repentance and find our salvation.

Do we appreciate it enough, dear ones? Do we appreciate enough the merciful God and Fa-

ther in Heaven who does answer prayer? As brothers and sisters, we are still faced with the trials throughout our life. There are times in our life when we know that we cannot do it alone. We cannot do it alone any day of our life. When the trials and burdens are heavy upon us, we have that faith and confidence we know that God does hear our prayers, and He will once more hear.

So there is nothing that is impossible with God. All things are possible with God, but impossible with man. So if we can just put our faith and our trust in God, He will help us through each situation in our lives. We don't have to carry that burden alone. We don't have to walk alone upon this earth, but God will walk by our side. Jesus Christ is dwelling within our hearts and interceding for us, and the Holy Spirit is directing our paths. The Holy Spirit is giving us direction, warning us, and advising us on what to do or what not to

As we think back to our unconverted life, dear ones, isn't it wonderful when we can think of how the Holy Spirit works within us and warns us and guides us compared to the conscious of an unconverted person? The conscious only made us feel bad after we did it, but the Holy Spirit warns us that we don't have to do those things.

We have read here that the spirit is strong, but the flesh is weak. (see Mark 14:38). We all carry flesh and blood, dear ones, for we are all human. We are all fighting those battles. Inwardly, we want to do what is right and by the grace of God, we can. We can overcome! But the flesh is still

there, isn't it? We have to battle that flesh every day of our life. It is a daily battle.

When we can overcome, what a joyful feeling that is! When we are tempted to do something and the Spirit speaks to us and warns us, we can fall upon our knees and thank God for that Spirit. How joyful it is when we feel that nearness to the Lord. We can feel the presence of His Spirit within us so that we don't have to succumb to the things and the wiles of the

Marriage in Faith II

*mortify our members which are upon the earth

*put off anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication

*lie not one to another

*put on bowels of mercy, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering, forbearance, forgiveness

*put on charity, the bond of perfectness *let the peace of God rule in your hearts *let the Word of Christ dwell in us richly *do all in the name of the Lord

With our attitude tempered by the above concepts, it will be natural that "Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands, as is fit in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives and be not bitter against them" (Col. 3:18-19).

Additional instruction is given in the Epistle to the Ephesians. The atmosphere of our home, how we use our time and the thoughts that control our mind, all have an impact on our marriages.

We are taught to "...walk circumspectly...Redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:15-16). We should give serious thought and prayer about the impact that our decisions have on those we love.

Husbands and wives must use wisely the time they are given to be together. Time spent together doing the work of the Lord will do far more to strengthen a marriage than time spent together in pursuit of worldly entertainment of the mind. If we fill our minds with holy thoughts, we will establish a pattern of life that will serve us well throughout our marriage. By "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;" (Eph. 5:19-20) we will give the Lord the proper place in our homes.

Husbands have a special charge to "be the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church:" (Eph. 5:23). Wives need the comfort and assurance that their husbands are fulfilling their godly role in the home. To accomplish this the scripture teaches "Husbands (to) love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and gave himself for it;...so ought men to love their wives as their own bodies..." (Eph. 5:25 & 28).

Christ never made a decision nor used His authority to hurt the church in any way. He always worked to strengthen and support the church. Husbands are charged with the same responsibility in fulfilling their role as the head of the wife. If husbands are willing to fulfill their role in the home as Christ fulfilled His role in the Church, even to the point of giving their life for their family if necessary, wives will have no reason to fear to follow the scriptural directives to be submissive to their husbands.

Wives provide a support to their husbands. The commandment to wives that they "...submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord..." and "...as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything" (Eph. 5:22 & 24) can be fulfilled much more successfully in homes with a godly atmosphere.

It is very difficult for wives to submit to husbands who rule the home in a selfish manner. It is very difficult for husbands to be the proper head of the wife if the wife refuses to be a submissive mate. However, if both husband and wife follow scriptural directives it will be a blessing for a husband "...to love his wife as himself..." and for the wife "...to reverence her husband" (Eph. 5:33).

Both husband and wife must be willing to be totally committed to following the scripture in a way that will bring stability to their marriage and to their home. Pursuing selfish interests will bring a strain into a marriage that will bring sorrow. Following the Golden Rule while applying the Word of God to our lives will assure us of a fulfilling relationship with the one that the Lord has provided to be our lifelong partner.

The next article will examine some of the problems that are likely to result from basing our marriages on the customs of the world rather than the principles of God.

The previous article dealt with preparation for a marriage in faith and following God's direction in finding a mate. This article will expand upon some of the scriptural passages that provide sound principles upon which a marriage of faith can grow.

Parents have a responsibility to set a proper example to their children in all aspects of their lives, including their relationship with each other. We are taught "that the aged men be sober, grave, temperate, sound in faith, in charity, in patience" (Titus 2:2). These are characteristics that husbands need to exhibit to be a proper head of the household.

Older women are given very specific direction to follow in helping younger women learn their role in a godly family. "The aged women likewise, that they be in behavior as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things; that they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children, to be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God be not blasphemed" (Titus 2:3-5).

If we as parents provide this example to our children, they will see the Word of God in action. They will have the opportunity to learn the scriptural directives that provide the foundation for a godly marriage and be in a better position to heed the scripture in their own marriage.

Young women who observe older women fulfilling a godly role in the home will know how to "be in subjection to your own husbands" (I Pet. 3:1). They will know to obey the Word, have chaste conversation, and proper adorning. Young men will know to "dwell with them (their wives) according to knowledge, giving honor to the wife, as unto the weaker vessel,...that your prayers be not hindered" (I Pet. 2:7).

The Apostle Paul gives much sound advice to husbands and wives. In Colossians, Chapter 3, he was inspired to write about the attitude that a child of God should display. The following are related to having a godly attitude:

*set our affections on things above

Helping Hands Give Hope to Haiti

In Haiti, the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, Apostolic Christian World Relief efforts have been brightening the lives of Haitians for many years. In 1982 we came in contact with a Haitian missionary, Eris Labady, who has helped guide some of our World Relief work teams to different areas of Haiti that would benefit from our labors.

He, like his father, believes that education is extremely important. Our efforts have helped to build one school administration building and 8 schools within 20 miles of where he was born. Eris, with the Lord's providence, was one of the few children in Haiti to complete an education to our high school level.

At one point, an individual told Eris he would pay half of his education for a year. However, he only paid for half of the first three months. Since Eris could not pay the tuition, he would jump out of the window when the officials would come to school to collect. It took several years to repay his debt to the school. He has used his education to bring hope to the lives of his fellow Haitians by focusing his efforts on providing better education and the basic necessities of food and water.

The first World Relief project with Eris was a school lunch program. This was started when some of our brethren met him for the first time and accompanied him to the school at Puits Sales. The children walked to school, some up to 10 miles, sat there from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., then had to walk home again, having had nothing to eat. The reddish color of evidence of hair was malnutrition. There were no funds for school lunches. The school at Elgin, IA donated school lunch plates, and ACWR sponsored the food shipments

to provide daily hot lunches. The program is still ongoing, and the children's hair is black once again.

Brethren in Indiana donated and built a grain bin in Haiti that is used for storage of supplies, food, and grain. This has helped store ACWR grain shipments, especially during times of famine. Another project recently completed is a water project that brings water to the village of Puits Sales. A well was drilled, and the water is pumped by a solar powered system into a 25,000 gallon reservoir from which it is piped down to Puits Sales.

Haitians gathered eagerly to dig the two-mile trench in rocky ground, in anticipation of having fresh water to drink. The trench was dug by hand within three weeks. The water flows by gravity from the reservoir to five distribution stations. A smaller reservoir at the school is filled each time water is available. Although fresh water comes only twice a week, it is a great miracle for the people of this land which experiences frequent drought conditions.

There are always ways to help the people of Haiti. One of the projects in which brethren have assisted is a trade school that would be added to the back of the current administration building. This would help young Haitians further their education by learning a trade.

The Apostolic Christian World Relief Child Sponsorship Program is yet another way for us to help the people of Haiti. This sponsorship program is in place, and many of our brethren have begun to help more Haitian children gain an education. Two of the above mentioned schools already participate in the program, with more planned.

A "Self-Ĥelp" project has recently been started to assist people living in the Puit Sales area. This program will help various individuals start a small

business, providing a way to make a living for themselves. ACWR is cooperating in this in hopes of assisting several people in each new endeavor. The recipients will make payments back into a fund that will be used to assist more people. The program is especially offered to those who attend church regularly, and have abilities, ideas, and ambition, but lack capital to start a business.

Efforts are being made to research the possibility of a major irrigation project in the area of Gode. There is a sizable river that goes through two or three hundred acres of fertile land which is farmed by many small farmers in the area. Due to continual lack of rain, this fertile land does not produce very well. Although very costly, this irrigation project, completed over a period of time in small segments, would improve the lives of many Haitians. It is hoped that a percentage of the increased crop yield would be given back to a co-op that would market it and use the funds to start new projects or expand this

World Relief has been involved in Haiti for many years. Our brethren have completed many projects with several faithful contacts and organizations in Haiti, and it is a blessing to see God's work unfold.

We always appreciate it when we find faithful, God-fearing natives of Haiti, or for that matter, any other land, with whom we can work. They provide an essential link to the residents of the country, and help us to channel our efforts where it can be most beneficial.

When asked if Apostolic Christian World Relief could better help by sending additional funds instead of spending so much for travel expenses, Eris said, "No, your work teams give our people hope and that is something money alone cannot buy."

North American Church Building Fund Building Advisory Committee

Several years ago, the Mission Committee appointed a National Building Advisory Committee (BAC), which was approved by the Elder body. The purpose of the committee is to assist local congregations as they consider building projects. Members are Bros: Brad Eisenmann (Chicago) Chairman, Wayne Grimm (West Bend, IA) Sec.-Treas., Bill Masters (Bloomington, IL), Orin Rufener (Rittman, OH), and Bob Schieler (Goodfield, IL), who has recently retired. The Mission Committee will appoint another brother to take his place. Counseling Elders are Bros. Phil Stettner and Gene Marti.

Available to all churches

These brothers have been helpful in working with small congregations such as Atlanta, Prescott, Kitchener, Portland, as well as several others. However, their guidance is not offered just to small or beginning churches, but also to assist in church building for the entire brotherhood, whether the congregation is large or small.

How does a congregation proceed?

So often a new congregation begins when a few brethren move into an area. This is quite consistent with the spread of our faith over many decades. We do our best to support these groups as they grow and need a place to worship.

Finally there comes a point where they need to provide a permanent place of assembly, and are faced with the problem of how they can pay for it. What should they do next?

Brethren counsel together

After discussion of this matter among themselves, the Mission Committee brought the subject to the entire Elder body. Their recommendation was that we should establish a North American Church Building Fund to further the effort.

Purpose of this fund

For many years we have used our European Church Building Fund to assist our brethren in Europe to finance houses of worship in several countries. Actually several million dollars have passed through this fund and without this help, church buildings could not have been constructed or repaired in these areas.

We are very thankful that the Lord has provided that assistance could be given in Europe, but we also feel there is a need here in the United States to assist our new or needy congregations. This is the purpose of the North American Church Building Fund.

The source of the money

In years gone by, our Brotherhood Assistance Programs were created and used to cover losses incurred from misfortunes. After prayerful consideration and much discussion, it was agreed that these programs should terminate. It was also agreed that \$4,000,000 from the reserves of these Assistance Programs be transferred to the North American Church Building Fund. The administration will be by joint counsel of the Mission Committee, the BAC, and the Elder body.

Small congregations

The brethren hope to use some of this money as grants to small or needy congregations that need help in providing a place of worship.

Local congregations who feel they

could qualify should proceed according to the following method. The information printed here is very general, and specific needs should be forwarded to the BAC at the address listed at the end of this article.

- The first step is approval by the local brethren and elder, after which the BAC can become involved. They will assist in developing a plan for building or remodeling a suitable facility.
- The BAC will assist in the development of a financial plan. Members and friends of the congregation will be asked to estimate the amount they hope to contribute over the next 5 years.
- The local congregation must be incorporated and legal documents submitted for approval to the Mission Committee.
- Approved projects will be financed from the fund as needed to supplement local resources.
- As contributions come in after the project is complete, wherever possible, money should be returned to the national fund so that other congregations can also benefit from this program.

Established congregations

Loans from this fund may be approved for congregations that have a building or remodeling project but are not eligible for a grant from the fund. These loans should be of a relatively short duration, no more than 5 years. Loans must be approved by the above channels, with a reasonable rate of interest being charged.

Satan is powerful. Satan is crafty. He is our evil adversary, and he doesn't care who he hurts. He just wants to disrupt our life. He doesn't need one hundred percent of us; he only needs a portion to distract us away from that true love of our Heavenly Father...that true love...that close communion with God. Isn't it wonderful to have that close communion and we can feel His nearness? By His grace, we can continue on.

Those disciples just could not quite understand it all, could they? Jesus knew their thoughts and He knew what was in their minds, and He knew how to talk to them. Jesus knows the thoughts in our minds today, too. Through His Spirit, He talks to us. He said what was going to happen and that He was going to have to go to that cross.

"And Jesus saith unto them, All ye shall be offended because of me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered. But after that I am risen, I will go before you into Galilee." (Mark 14:27-28). He promised them that He would be leaving them, but He would still go before them and give them the direction they need.



The series on the persecution of the Nazarenes in Yugoslavia continues. Nazarenes, in this instance, are brethren of like precious faith in eastern Europe; and are not to be confused with the Nazarene denomination in the United States.

Our brethren, during the early part of this century, took a stand for their faith. Their refusal to bear arms (in Yugoslavia) invited severe persecution. Yet, they stood firm and suffered the consequences.

Excerpts from the *Nazarenes In Yugoslavia* follows:

It is said that Nazarenes have been cruelly mistreated. They have been knocked down. They have been loaded down with sandbags until they nearly suffocated. Afterwards they were struck in the abdomen and forced to cry.

Nazarenes were sentenced to one and a half years in prison for belonging to the brotherhood of the Nazarenes.

1925, the Minister of the Interior (Home Affairs) sent out a decree that the Nazarenes are to be prevented from holding meetings, even in private homes, if need be, by the use of force.

Nazarenes are sentenced for "insubordination" to the severest kind of unmerited punishment, up to ten years in prison at hard labor. Austria-Hungary released these Nazarenes from taking the "oath" or to "swear," by a law enacted in 1886, Art. 54, paragraph 242, chapter 2. They were treated very humanely by Austria-Hungary even during the World War of 1914-18 whenever there was a question of "swearing" or of taking up arms.

Why are Nazarenes and Nazarenes only, called again and again into the army up to 50 years of age? Is it to punish them again and again, each succeeding time with greater severity? They have been treated badly in spite of the fact that Nazarenes have given demonstrable proof of their love for Serbia before and during the World War by very creditable deeds, and in spite of the fact that their names were even recommended to the king for the purpose of "decorations," and although the public holds them in high esteem.


It happened that Nazarenes, some incapacitated by the war, others unfit for military service, were called into the army for "military drill." When they declined to take the oath and to take up arms, they were beaten at times and then sentenced up to 10 years in prison. Under Austro-Hungarian rule the Nazarenes found it possible to do their military duty in the sanitary service of the army.

It happened that priests forcibly baptized children of Nazarenes, from a few weeks up to 14 years of age. When the parents protested, they were sentenced to pay a fine. It is said that children of "Nazarenes" are excluded from the higher institutions of learning, if they have not been baptized in a religion (church) recognized by the state!

The marriage of Nazarenes is not to be considered as valid, unless it was contracted in a church (in a religion) recognized by the state. It is said to have happened that married Nazarenes, who had lived in legal wedlock for many years, were enjoined by church officials: To be married subsequently in the established (state) church, otherwise their marriage and their children would be declared to be "not legitimate." (Treaty of Peace of St. Germain, Art. 2-6).

It was mentioned that on the 7th of March 1927 the king "pardoned" more than 200 Nazarenes. Among them were three, who were not set at liberty in spite of the "pardon," because an ordinary military chaplain prevented their release, and they had to remain in prison.

Are struggles good for you or bad for you? The discussion is on-going. If you are in the midst of a deep struggle, you probably wish it would go away, and you may even pray to God that He will please take it away. Yet there is much to indicate that struggles build faith and character, that they make you a much better person. It can probably be stated with authority, that the most spiritually minded people are those who have had more than their share of struggles.

In the King James version of the Bible, the two synonyms for struggles, trials and tribulations are often used. In Romans 5:3 we read, "But we glory in tribulations also; knowing that tribulation worketh patience." Most of us do not glory in tribulations or struggles; we are not happy about it when it is happening. However, if we think and believe that it will be good for us in the long run, we can accept it better and later we may even glory in what took place in the midst of

the struggle, that is, we were changed for the better, including being made more humble.


Struggles tend to break a person, leaving neither hope nor desire for recovery. Jesus said in Matthew 21:44, "And whosoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken." He spoke of Himself as being the stone. Repentance itself is a struggle between the idea of remaining our own boss or permitting the Holy Spirit to live in our hearts and control us. The Bible teaches that we should remain broken so far as confidence in ourselves is concerned, but strong and confident because of our faith in God and in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Many years ago in early American history, there was a man in New England named David Brainerd, who traveled on horseback to preach the Gospel to the American Indians. He felt so sure that he should suffer and struggle for Christ that he purposely prayed out in the cold and did not attempt to keep his body warm

and comfortable. He died of tuberculosis at the age of 29 years. I cannot hope to be as sincere as he was in his calling, but I believe he was mistaken about trying to suffer. I understand that we are to do our best to take care of our bodies which are the temples of the Holy Spirit. I Corinthians 3:16, "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?"

Although I realize that struggles are like steps on a ladder which carry us to higher levels of spirituality and holiness, I am ready to leave everything in the hands of God that I can't do anything about anyway, and to sit back and relax in the bliss and tranquility of faith in God and the Lord Jesus Christ. Struggles have their place but let's not go looking for them. If we need to be criticized in order to be made more humble, God will probably permit someone to criticize us. We do not solicit struggles.
