"WE SERVE A LIVING GOD"

Sermon by Bro. David Obergfel, Peoria, IL Judges 4 and Hebrews 9

In our first reading, it is kind of an interesting story. It is kind of a gruesome little story but it is a sad story because the nation of Israel really should not have been in the position they were, and that is under the lordship of an evil king. What they really did is that they got into their own little thing once they had crossed over and had taken some of the lands. They did not push everybody out and there is a multitude of different things but they began to trust in the idols and gods that they were supposed to destroy in this land. This is where it got them.

It says, "And the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD..." Judges 4:1. So this isn't the first time they did evil and it isn't the last time as we can read on a little bit. It will happen again and again and again. You get into the Kings and the same thing happens over and over again. It is kind of like our nature. We learn for awhile and as we learn what Brother Mike said today, "When the pressure is on and when we feel like there is nothing that we can do, who do we turn to?" Of course, we turn to God.

Sometimes we don't always do that. We kind of drift away slowly. You know, Satan likes us to do that. He likes us to kind of drift away. We usually don't walk away from him very quickly, but we drift away. It is kind of like those shows. Have you ever watched those animal shows when they have those documentaries? There is always, like a lion, or something out waiting and watching the herd of gazelles or whatever the animal might be. He is looking for a certain type. He is looking for either a sick one, a young one or someone who is not paying attention. We can understand the sick one and the young one because of inexperience, but it is sad when something is caught, like one of those animals, because it is not paying attention to what the rest of the group is doing. It wanders off on its own. Yet,

that animal is there waiting and waiting and at the right minute he will pounce on that gazelle or whatever in the world those things are out there and it is too late.

You know, that is something that happened here with the nation of Israel. They kind of slowly begin to drift away, and Satan had them. But yet, listen to what they did. They finally turned back to God and called upon Him and Deborah was able to help deliver them. When we talk about being faithful, basically the battle was already over - it was already won and Deborah knew that and she tried to convince Barak that by saying, "God is going to deliver this so go out there and do what you need to do." Barak said, "No, you need to come with me." Sometimes we feel a little insecure. It is nice if we have a buddy to go with us, a brother and a sister, or someone that can be with us through this.

She said, "You are going to miss a real blessing if you take me because Sisera is going to be put into a woman's hand, and she will deliver him." So the battle goes on and we hear the end of the story that all the men are killed. Isn't that amazing? They killed them all except Sisera. He runs to that tent and Jael is there and she takes a nail and pounds it into the ground and through his forehead, and he is dead. Just like Deborah, the prophetess, said, "What happened? Why is that?" It is because if you go back into what we read in Hebrews. there is a verse there, number fourteen, and if you would take a look at that, it says, "...purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?" Hebrews 9:14.

You see, that is what it is all about here when Paul was writing to the Hebrews or when he is looking back at history, he said, "We have a Living God we serve." It is not a God of the past or God of the present, although he mentions that there is going to be a judgment in the future. But he said, "We serve a Living God right now." When the nation of Israel believed that and trusted that and they were faithful, then they had victory and they had that abundant life God had planned for them. Just like John says, "We are going to have an abundant life." We are not going to have an abundant life when we do things on our own, or when we don't trust in Him, or when we don't believe we have a Living God because He is

Flee

Numerous times in the scripture we are admonished to flee. Sometimes the danger is physical, sometimes it is emotional and sometimes the danger is spiritual. Whatever the case, the warning is given to help us escape the danger.

To flee means to go swiftly or to move rapidly. When faced with physical danger we recognize the need to quickly move out of the way of the danger. Do we have the same reaction when faced with spiritual danger?

Too often sin is regarded as an inconvenience or an attractive nuisance rather than as an attempt by Satan to destroy us. If we truly believe the Bible, and if we believe there are only two destinations for the souls of mankind, then surely we must take seriously the threat that Satan poses to us. His goal is to cause us to spend eternity in hell, forever separated from God.

God, however, has the opposite goal for us. He wants us to spend eternity in Heaven with Him, forever protected from the temptations and deceitfulness that Satan brings before us. In His desire to help us win our battles with Satan, He has left us with clear instructions that, if followed, will help us to be successful in those battles.

As God's people, we are instructed to stay away from sin and to "...come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing;..." (II Cor. 6:17). In spite of our best efforts to remain separated from the evils of the world, we sometimes find ourselves in situations that are dangerous to our spiritual life. When that happens, the Lord wants us to recognize that situation and act quickly to protect ourselves from spiritual harm.

We have a faithful God who will not let us "...be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape,..." (I Cor. 10:13). How can we escape? "...flee from idolatry." (I Cor. 10:14); "Flee fornication..." (I Cor. 6:18); "Flee also youthful lusts:..." (II Tim. 2:22); and finally after being

warned of the dangers of coveting, we are told, "But Thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness" (I Tim. 6:11).

Although the scripture only ties a few specific sins to the commandment to flee, it is apparent that a child of God is advised to flee from all sin. The Apostle Paul has numerous strong admonitions that encourage us to avoid sin. "...Abhor that which is evil;..." (Ro. 12:9) and "Abstain from all appearance of evil" (I Th. 5:22). If we are to abhor evil and not even have the appearance of evil, quite clearly we must flee all evil.

If we heed the advice we are given in the scripture and quickly remove ourselves from temptation, we have the assurance of escaping the temptation. As an added comfort, we are promised that if we "...Resist the devil ...he will flee from you" (Ja. 4:7).

Therefore, if we follow the instructions that we are given in the Word of God, we have a double portion of protection. If we flee from sin, we will be separated from evil, and if we resist the devil, he must flee from us.

What will happen to us if we do not flee from sin? If we allow ourselves to be deceived and ensnared by evil, we will pay for our foolishness in this life and in the time to come. Guilt that we have as a result of sin brings fear. In the Garden of Eden Adam said "...I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid,..." (Gen. 3:10).

Belshazzar, King of Babylon, committed a great sin by taking vessels from the temple and using them in his heathen feast. The hand writing on the wall caused such fear that "...the king's countenance was changed, and his thoughts troubled him, so that the joints of his loins were loosed, and his knees smote one against another" (Da. 5:6).

If we live in sin, the Lord will set his face against us, causing such fear that "...ye shall flee when none pursueth you" (Lev. 26:17). Solomon reminded

us that "The wicked flee when no man pursueth:..." (Pr. 28:1). Sin ultimately will make us powerless. When the children of Israel were rebellious and self-willed, trusting in swift horses, they were told that not only will they be unable to escape by trusting in themselves but that their enemies would be swift and cause them great fear. "One thousand shall flee at the rebuke of one; at the rebuke of five shall ye flee:..." (Is. 30:17).

Therefore, we can readily understand that if we do not flee from sin, the time will come when we will be so confused and so overcome with guilt that we will flee as a result of the guilt brought on by sin. Fleeing at that point, however, will be of no avail. We will not be able to outrun our fears.

If we choose not to flee from sin, we will try to flee from our fears brought on by sin. When we understand that we cannot outrun the consequences of sin, unrepentant sinners will make a final attempt to escape. Unfortunately, the time will come when sinners who ignore God's warning will be unable to flee. They will realize too late that they have ignored the opportunity to escape destruction and will "...say to the mountains, Fall on us; and to the hills, Cover us" (Lk. 23:30), but it will be to no avail. The situation will become so dire that "...shall men seek death, and shall not find it; and shall desire to die, and death shall flee from them" (Rev. 9:6).

Therefore, in dealing with sin we must follow scriptural teachings to flee from sin. If we ignore that warning, we will try to flee from the fear brought on by sin. After we understand that we cannot escape this fear, we will ultimately try to flee from the wrath of God. This, too, shall fail. Only by fleeing from sin, and keeping ourselves pure, will we find comfort in God's Word: "... cleave to that which is good. Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;" (Ro. 12:9&12).

First Response Disaster Work Team Project

The Disaster Work Project Sub-Committee, under the USA Board, was given a mandate by the World Relief Committee to develop opportunities for volunteers to help victims of storms and floods in cleanup and rebuilding of their dwellings. The Camilla, GA Project, of last year, was the first opportunity for rebuilding houses. A tool trailer was purchased and fitted with equipment for building applications. It was found to be very useful and provided most of the tools needed at the job site.

The Sub-Committee has been developing plans for cleanup projects. This type of project requires different tools and equipment than for the rebuilding phase. A donated box van has been fitted with shelves, bins, and racks, and equipped with chain saws, pumps, tarps, shovels, wrecking bars, and many other tools required for this

type of service.



This equipped "first response" vehicle was on display at the Western Churches World Relief Informational Meeting held at the Roanoke Church Fellowship Hall on March 10. The display was well received. A number of welcome suggestions for additional items that could be beneficial for cleanup service were received.

The plan is to use this first response truck to assist in cleanup activities,

within, but not limited to, a day's journey from central Illinois. The estimated day's journey with the truck is 550 miles. In considering locations relative to our congregations, we have the following areas:

- Southeast, Athens, AL 550 mi
- Southwest, Lamar, MO 480 mi
- West, Bern, KS 516 mi
- Northwest, Lester, IA 550 mi
- North, Winthrop, MN 520 mi
- Northeast, Bay City, MI 421 mi
- East, Sardis, OH 511 mi

The distance limitation consideration is due to the time element of getting the truck and volunteers to a job site, be able to work for a minimum of three days, and return home within five days. Should the cleanup require additional time, a second team would be sent to relieve the first team.

At this time, the Disaster Work Team Sub-Committee (DWT) is in need of:

- 1. Storm Watchers for First Response A storm watcher's responsibilities are to monitor weather and storm conditions in their geographic region and to relay information as to size of disaster area and type of damage to the DWT. This individual may become involved in making decisions regarding the sending of truck and teams. Qualifications are:
- Availability
- Internet Proficiency
- 2. First Response Truck Drivers
 The truck driver responsibilities include driving to the disaster site and to check out the tools to the team members.
 Oualifications are:
- Must have a drivers license for driving a truck of up to 26,000 GVWR, or Illinois License C or higher.

- Able to leave within 24 hours and be away up to 5 days, and be able to work 10 hours a day for 3 consecutive days.
- 3. First Response Team Workers The team workers must have the following qualifications:
- Be able to leave within 24 hours notice.
- Be able to work hard for 10 hours, 3 days in a row.

We are asking individuals interested in this work to contact Bro. Jerome Witzig and provide him with the volunteer category you desire and qualify to fill. His contact information is listed below.

One or two drivers will go with the truck, depending on the distance to travel. It is expected that the local congregation will try to furnish the six to eight volunteers needed for a project team. If the local congregation is not able to provide enough volunteers, the committee will enlist volunteers from other congregations.

Berean Prison Ministry Has Many Programs

For a number of years, brethren and friends in central Illinois have been carrying out many programs through an organization that is now called Berean Prison Ministry. Located in Peoria, this ministry is supported nearly 100% by the Apostolic Christian Church. The Mission Committee furnishes funds to help finance a number of their activities.

Bible Distribution

Any time a person enters a prison in this country, they are given a number which remains with them for life. The Berean Prison Ministry enters these numbers in their computer. Upon written request from a prisoner, the Ministry sends one Bible to that person. The computer records allow the volunteers to know who has already received a Bible. About 2,000 Bibles are sent out each month.

Bible Study Program

Our own brethren have developed a basic Bible Study Course, which is sent to each prisoner along with their Bible. In order to answer the course questions, one must read the Bible. When they complete a lesson, the prisoners return it to the Ministry in a postage paid envelope. The lesson is graded, and another 3 lessons mailed to the prisoner. There are 50 lessons in the basic course.

At this time the Ministry receives about 5,000 lessons per month to grade. Brethren from the area churches plus young group members participate in grading. The current course is very basic, and the Ministry could use one that would carry on from this course. If anyone is interested in helping

compile such an intermediate course, kindly respond to the address at the end of this article.

Russian Program

The Ministry also sends Bibles and Bible study courses in the Russian language to prisoners incarcerated in the Republic of Karelia, Russia. A retired English teacher of the Russian school system is coordinating this program in her country.

Colonel Alexander Safonov is the Director of the Department of Corrections in the Republic of Karelia. He has been to several of our churches in the USA and is truly a friend of the Apostolic Christian Church. He had heart surgery this year in Finland, and our brotherhood helped cover his medical costs.

This is amazing when one considers that only a few years ago the Bible was banned in Russia. Last year Brothers Jim Hoerr, Paul Meister, and Howard Getz traveled to Russia to evaluate this work. Mr. Alan Tadlock from the Illinois Department of Prisons also went along.

Jail, Youth, and Prison Ministry

Our church has the Chaplaincies of the Peoria and the Tazewell County Jails, the Youth Farm, the Juvenile Detention facility, and the State of Illinois Hanna City Work Camp. They hold Sunday services, mid-week Bible studies, and do counseling at these facilities. This work is carried out under the direction of the local elders and ministers.

The Chief Chaplain of the State of Illinois works with our brethren to carry out this ministry. He has asked if the Ministry would consider holding Sunday services at the Galesburg, Illinois Prison, but as of this writing, they have not found volunteers to do this work.

Food Program

The Berean Prison Ministry gives away about 200,000 pounds of food per year. This work is done in cooperation with the World Relief Committee. Food is supplied to all of the missions, food pantries, and soup kitchens in the Peoria area as well as in McClean County and the Aurora area. Last year they sent seven loads of food, furniture, and clothes to the Charlotte, NC area damaged by floods and hurricanes.

Jewel-Osco Program

In 2000 the Ministry received eight semi loads of products from the Osco Drug Stores. These are items on the shelves when a store is closed or remodeled. Everything handled in a modern drug store except for prescription medicines is included in these loads.

Items received in this manner have been distributed through our World Relief Distribution Centers. Goods have been sent to many of our church homes as well as all the organizations mentioned above. Many of these products are included in overseas shipments to various destinations.

Appreciation to volunteers

The brethren working with this Ministry are grateful to God for the many avenues of service that have opened up. This work involves hundreds of volunteers, and there are many needs to meet. Without this support, this Ministry could not reach so many whose needs are so great. If anyone would like to participate in

The third boat owner would rather be out to sea than anywhere. He never bothered to check a weather report and an approaching storm excited him. He seemed happiest being behind the wheel with the waves crashing and the wind howling. He and his boat had been through a lot together. He called it "Wave Dancer" and he knew what it could do. Storms did not frighten him.

When it comes to the life of faith, some believers don't trust enough to even cast off from the dock. They stay where it's safe and secure. Others make quick little jaunts out into the deeper waters of Christian experience, but they scamper back as soon as things start getting a little tough. Over the years, more and more of our people are getting involved in work projects in other countries such as Jamaica, Mexico, and Haiti. At the same time, it has been observed that there are also many needs right here in our own communities

The words that Brother Mike read today, that whole chapter is just an amazing chapter because it is about the Living God, who is there in our hard times and in our good times. Wherever and whatever circumstances we might come under, He is there because He is living! The amazing thing is when he read those words "abba", that has special meaning to me because we talked about it the other night in our "Feeding On The Word" class of some of the names of God. But that word "abba" is very special because it is the word much like when we would use "daddy".

The nation of Israel or the priests and that, they would never use that word in the Old Testament. It is never found there, but the translation in the New Testament, I think, there are 156 times in the book of John alone, it uses that reference to daddy. It shows me that He is like our father but He has a very close relationship between a father and son or daughter and a father. It is a very close relationship. It is because He is living. He is not somewhere far away but He is very close to us, just like Brother Mike said, "When we need Him, He is there." That is exciting because we don't always know what is going to face us this week or what is going to happen to us but we know one thing, we serve the Living God. He does and He will go before us. and that is exciting.

As we read through these things here, it shows two pictures. It shows the Old Testament way of priests going into the Holy of Holies one time a year. Isn't it interesting that he has to first make it right for himself? Then he can offer sacrifices for the nation of Israel. Then they contrast that with Christ who did it one time. This says every year, time and time again at a certain date, they would go in and do the same thing.

It is very interesting where I read once that they tied a rope to the foot of the priest, and I did not know that. They did that because if God was not happy with the sacrifice and the priest died, they had to have some way to get

him out. Just think about that. Yet, they offered blood and those sins were only covered because there was going to be a time when the Messiah would come. When Christ would come and take away all those Old Testament sacrifices, then there would be One Sacrifice. The exciting thing is you and I are now under that second system.

If you haven't given your heart to the Lord, now is the time. Later on it says, "Today is the day of salvation." (See 2 Corinthians 6:2) And we read, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever." Hebrews 13:8. You see, He is living! He is the One Sacrifice for our sins to make us worthy to worship God.

As we look at this, it says, "But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come;" Hebrews 9:11a. Isn't that true? We don't know all the good things because we can't understand Heaven. I don't know what it is going to be like up there, but I have a vague, very vague and probably very small understanding what that will be. But he says we have good things to come, and you know, not just in Heaven, too, but we have good things to come here on this earth. That may not be financial prosperity and it may not be that we get away from all sickness or those kind of things, but what it means to me, the good things to come are that we have a Living God who is going to see us through every day.

There is one verse that I have kind of clung to lately. It is Psalm 68 and verse 19, it says, "Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with benefits, even the God of our salvation." Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with benefits! That is the good things to come - those special benefits! I guess I look at it from this way. Every morning when I would wake up, there is a spiritual knapsack sitting there for me, because God knows that I am going to leave and I am going to go out into the work place or I am going to go out into the world somewhere and He has packed it exactly with what I need.

Maybe one day I will open it up and there is a nice little note and it says, "It is bright and sunny out and we are going to have a good day and here are all the things that you need." Then maybe one day the note might say. "It is going to be stormy and raining out. I put in a coat for you and I got you an umbrella, but you are still going to have to go through the storm. Enjoy the day." Maybe it is hot, and there is extra spiritual water in there for me when I get thirsty. But whatever it is, He knows ahead of time the benefits that we need — the blessings that we need — and the help to get through.

I don't think that David just wrote that verse that He is going to load us with benefits just for a nice thing to say. I think he did it because he understood it and I think he did it because it is true. What we have to do is pick up our spiritual knapsack and trust that everything in there is what we need for that day because He is the Living God. He knows ahead of time what we need and what we need to serve Him and worship Him.

Then it goes on and says, "...by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands... Neither by the blood of goats and calves," and then later on it goes on and talks about the blood of bulls and goats. But it says, "...by his own blood he entered in

once... "Hebrews 9:11-12. That is all that it took. The priest did this year after year and think about the thousands of years that they did this system and how many animals died, and still it wasn't enough. Then Jesus came.

We sang the song, "The Love of God", this morning. Isn't that amazing? He did that and sent His Son because He loved us. There was not any other reason. It wasn't because we are good enough or that He needed us. He did it because He loves us! That to me is very humbling. Why would He love someone like me? Why would He be willing to die on the cross for something like me? He does it because He loves each and every one of us.

morning, "He doesn't make junk." And that is true. But we junk ourselves sometimes. We settle for less. We want the things that rust, but He wants better things for us.

Then he goes on and talks about different things throughout this verse. I would like to (and I know we are short on time here), but I would like to just touch on one little thing. In verse twenty-seven, it says, "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:" Hebrews 9:27. We all know that is true. Somewhere along the line, unless the Lord returns and raptures us out, we are going to be dying. It said, "after this the judgment."

The thing I like about the Bible and the thing I like about God and Christ and the Spirit is that they tell us ahead of time what is going to happen. They give us a glimpse and they give us enough to know. They said, "You are going to live and you are going to die and there is a judgment." Where will you stand on the judgment? Some people may say, "Well, I haven't done anything with Christ so I guess I will

be out of luck. I am going to take my chance because I have been a good person." You know, that is not going to be good enough, because the question is, "What have you done with Christ?" That will affect what type of judgment you will have.

By all rights, all of us probably should go through a damnation judgment because of the blood of Christ and His cleansing power. Then we can give Him honor, praise and glory for all eternity. That concerns me because there might be people here today, or there might be kids in Sunday school or adults that are sitting here today that haven't really thought about the judgment. I hope we all think about the judgment because it is very, very important.

I would like to close with this verse because I thought about it this morning as Brother Mike was speaking. I think it applies now how do we win or how do we be victorious. This verse in 2 Corinthians 2:14 says, "Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the sa-

vour of his knowledge by us in every place." Thanks be to God, which always causes us to triumph! No matter what happens to us physically, we triumph in the end spiritually.

The following are comments by Henry Michel of Switzerland who once spoke about how the church began in Europe. He focuses on the initial preaching efforts of Bro. Samuel Froehlich.

Souls Respond to the Gospel

After a year of his preaching there, nearly everyone in the congregation had come into repentance and many had found peace in the Lord Jesus. On Good Friday, two days before Easter, he was told that he had to leave quickly and go to his home town. During his evening sermon, on the day commemorating when Jesus was crucified, he spoke once more of the Lord Jesus, and then said, "I must go. I received the decision that I have to leave the church.' There followed a lamenting, a weeping aloud of all, and they asked him not to go. But what could he do? He left these poor ones who really were afterwards like sheep without a shepherd.

Then he came back to his home town, Brugg, and wondered, "What shall I do?" For a whole year he was quiet there, sitting, as he said, like Joseph in his prison, until the Lord would let him out. As his diary reports, he felt as though he was being shaken through a screen or sieve, being prepared for his

ministry.

Pondering the Future

He wrote in his diary: "It was never in my mind to create a new denomination. My goal was to help gather the children of God. If I would not put all my trust in God, my Lord, that He has called me to preach the Gospel, I would have to regret to have started something to which He would not grant His blessing and that would not be according to His will."

But now the official church had rejected him. They did not allow him to speak. Shortly afterward, they took his license away, and it was forbidden him even to preach in homes and to travel across the country.

He cried to God, "What shall I do?" He said, "I am putting everything into the hand of the Lord that He shall decide according to His good will." Then suddenly, he had the fire in his heart again, and he had to go. "A living spring of water cannot be stopped." So he went.

Beginning Anew

The first place he went on his missionary journey was to the village of Leutwil where he had preached, where he had been forbidden to go, and where many had heard the call of the Lord Jesus. He came at night so nobody would see him, but like a fire, the rumor went through the whole village, "Samuel is here." They all came (about two hundred) before the house, and he had to go out of the house and preach to them in the open air. It was a joyful meeting, and they all thanked the Lord and said, "Oh, we are so thankful that you came back; nobody took care of us in the meantime."

Evening after evening they had a meeting in the open air, and evening after evening, he preached of the Lord Jesus. The next week he baptized 38 believers. That was the beginning, the first time he baptized; these were the first who as a result of his ministry were baptized.

Encountering Police

But you can understand that the authorities were not happy. Complaint after complaint came, and six weeks after he had returned to this village, the police came and said that he had to leave within 24 hours. He did so. He went from place to place, from village to village. He was chased from one to the other. No rest was given and there was no place where he could go. Everywhere someone who heard he was there told the police, and he had to depart.

One day he was preaching in a small town, and it became known, and the police came during the meeting and took

him away. He had to go for many miles and appear before a judge. The judge asked him, "Who told you to speak, from whom have you the authority to speak? Where is your license?" He answered, "I have a license." The police said, "No, your license has been taken away." Samuel said, "I have one," and the police said, "From whom?" "From Jesus." Then he said, "Ask this Mr. Jesus" (he said Mr. Jesus as a joke), "Ask this Mr. Jesus to give you this in writing." He answered, "I have it in writing right here," and he showed him his Bible. The officer wanted to put him in jail, but he could not do it, and the officer, after mocking him, after insulting him, released him and allowed him to go on. This is the way he went from town to town.

Sickness

In one journey he took, he had to cross a mountain. A terrible thunderstorm came up and he had to go seven or eight hours in a most dreadful storm and rain. He arrived in the city of Bern (which is our capital) shivering from fever and so sick that he went directly to the doctor. The doctor said, "Poor man, you are in a terrible condition. I cannot let you go away." So he put him to bed in his sleeping room, and he was there for six weeks during which time the doctor took care of him. This doctor incidentally was a good friend of the President of the Swiss confederation, the President of the country. Later on, this doctor was very helpful in time of persecution. So everything that happened really was a miracle.

"FORGETTING SELF"

God made mothers with an intinct to forget self in the interst of their children. When the nother of Moses prepared the rk of bulrushes with slime and itch, she wasn't thinking about er own safety but about the afety of her baby, Moses. (see lxodus 2:3)

The noble virtue of forgetting elf in the interest of others has nany applications. The Lord Jeus Christ forgot self in order to the will of the Father. In Jethsemane, Jesus prayed, "Not ny will, but thine, be done." Luke 22:42)

The Samaritan who helped the vounded man lying by the side of he road, probably had a busy chedule of his own, but he forgot elf out of concern for others. And when he saw him, he had ompassion on him."

Each of us should forget self in our daily relationship with mempers of our own families. We should praise other members of our families for their many good points and refrain from any criticism, especially of our spouses. Criticism from someone near to us is painful, but loving and soft voiced encouragement to do something in a different way, or not to do it at all, is readily accepted, in most cases. To conduct ourselves in this manner requires that we forget self in the interest of others.

The women who visited Jesus' grave early Easter morning, forgot self and concentrated on what they considered to be the right thing to do out of respect for their fallen teacher, who by His resurrection, became their Saviour.

The Apostle Paul forgot self when he wrote in I Corinthians 8:13, "Wherefore, if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend."

In our church fellowship, we should forget self and try to be a friend to those who are lonely and in need of a friend. We should never criticize our brothers and sisters but encourage them by forgetting self and looking for the good points in others, even while pleading with them, if necessary, to live a more spiritual and wholesome life. If anyone is living a selfish life, he or she is to be pitied. Jesus said, "He that loseth his life for my sake shall find it." (Matthew 10:39). I understand this losing your life to mean forgetting self in order to do God's will and help others.

If a baby cries during the night, the mother arises to take care of the needs of the baby. She forgets self.

Mothers, those of you who are faithful mothers, and I believe that all of you who read this, are faithful, you have much to teach us about forgetting self and not being so concerned about what we want and like. As children of God, we are called to live on a higher and more noble plain.



The Spirit of Teamwork and the Flight of the Great Northern Geese





I. Formation Flying - Flying in a V formation, the noble geese travel thousands of miles with ease and precision. As each bird moves its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird following. Formation flying is 70 percent more efficient than flying alone.

III. Everyone Leads - At a distance, the flock appears to be guided by a single leader. The lead bird does in fact guide the formation, winging smoothly through the oncoming elements. If the lead goose tires, however, it rotates back into the formation and another bird flies at the point position.

II. Accept and Give Help - When one of the great birds out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resist of trying to fly alone and quickly rejoins the formation to advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediate front.

IV. Honk and Encourage - Each flock finds its own rhy. The pulsating sound of the great wings beating tog excites and energizes the whole formation. The g honk from behind to encourage those up front to kee their speed.

V. Good Times or Bad - When a goose gets sick, wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay with it until it is able to fly again or dies. Then launch out on their own into another formation, or they catch up with their flock.
