

"WE HAVE TO HUMBLE OURSELVES"

Sermon by Bro. Steve Sauder, Tremont, IL John 12:27-50

The setting here is right before the crucifixion. Perhaps you read this just a few weeks ago, but isn't it always appropriate? Even if we would read of the last hours of Christ's life and read it daily, it would be appropriate because as His time drew short, He spoke of very important things.

He said, "Father, save me from this hour:" John 12:27. We feel He was human, and wouldn't we if we knew we were heading to the cross? If we knew that this was our end, wouldn't we plead with the Father to save us? Yet, He realized that this is why He came. He said. "I came on this earth to save sinners." Then He gives us an example back to the Old Testament. It is always amazing how the two tied together and how Christ so often referred to the Old Testament. We can think about this a little bit because in case there are doubts in our minds or in case it is hard for us to believe.

We are given a wonderful mind. We have been created that way and we can think very quickly. At times it is just hard to accept that we are sinners because we are told in school and we are continually told that we are intelligent. We are reminded of the wonderful things that man can do and we start to forget as a people in general. As for the population, we start to forget. Really, we were just created sinners. That is our natural state, and that our natural state is not good. So we forget that we have a need and even when we get into trouble. Even if we get in trouble with the law or in trouble in marriage or in trouble of all kinds of

personal problems, it is still very difficult to admit that our problem is sin and we are in need of a Saviour.

The people in Old Testament times had that same problem but we can look back in the old books that were written thousands and thousands of years ago by different authors, completely different authors. We should ask ourselves, "What did the old writers say? What did the old Scripture say? Did they say that man needed a Saviour?" Let's look. It talks about how Christ said, "Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out." John 12:31. First of all, we know who that was. That was the devil, the evil one, the deceiver, the murderer, the liar, this is Satan and he wants our doom. That is his goal. All of his energy is put forth to that purpose that we would be doomed.

But Christ said, "Now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me." John 12:31-32. What is He referring to? I believe He is referring back into Numbers. Let me read a few verses where it talks of this same thing and we can see proof therefore that the Word is one. For untold generations and thousands from the millennium, thousands of years before, it was written that there is coming One who will be lifted up and He will he a Saviour.

The setting is back in Numbers when the children of Israel were walking through the desert, and they were like we are today. They started mumbling and murmuring because they did not have water. They didn't have food and they didn't like their bread and they couldn't figure out why they were out there. They thought that God had left them.

God was so displeased with their murmuring that He sent serpents among them, little fiery snakes, and they crawled in

Delayed Blessings

"The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness...;" (II Pet. 3:9). The scripture contains many promises that God has made to His people. To a child of God, these promises are comforting. However, to the unconverted many of God's promises are distressing. Although some of the promises have come to pass and are understandable, others are somewhat mysterious and have not yet been fulfilled. Nevertheless, one thing is certain: all of God's promises will be fulfilled in His good time.

We are living in a time when patience and a willingness to wait are not among our strengths. Many, if not nearly all, people in America have reached the point where they expect instant service. We have fast food restaurants, fast credit banks, automatic teller service to get money from our bank accounts, almost instant entertainment, instant information through the internet and a variety of other services instantly available.

We do not want to wait on anything. Even the short wait at a traffic light causes some to express impatience. But the Lord still operates on His time table, requiring us to approach Him in a manner that may be different from what we are accustomed to doing.

Many places in the scripture we are encouraged to slow down and to learn patience. Interestingly, we are instructed by the Apostle Paul as he lists the fruits of the Spirit, that there is no law against longsuffering

When God pronounced a curse upon the serpent, He made a promise to Adam and Eve, and hence to each of us, that He would "...put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel" (Gen. 3:15). As evidence of God's patience, His promise of a Saviour was not fulfilled until approximately 4000 years later. To mankind, it seemed like a long time in coming. To God, the Saviour came at just the right time.

There are numerous promises given to those who wait patiently. "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint" (Is. 40:31). The rewards of waiting are made clear in another of Isaiah's writings "...Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us: this is the Lord; we have waited for him, we will be glad and rejoice in his salvation" (Is. 25:9).

David also teaches us a lesson on patience. "I waited patiently for the Lord, and he inclined unto me, and heard my cry" (Ps. 40:1), and "My soul waiteth for the Lord more than they that watch for the morning:..." (Ps. 130:6).

Although David understood the value of waiting on the Lord, at times his patience also was tried. "How long wilt thou forget me, O Lord? for ever? how long wilt thou hide thy face from me?" (Ps. 13:1). "I am weary of my crying: my throat is dried: mine eyes fail while I wait for my God" (Ps. 69:3).

Occasionally, Jesus required those who followed Him to learn the value of waiting for God's time to act. Perhaps one of the more trying times of waiting was the time of Lazarus' death when Christ could have easily gone to Judea earlier and cured him. Because Jesus chose to wait until Lazarus died before He went, both Mary and Martha were heartbroken, and said exactly the same words to Him after He arrived. "...Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died" (Jn. 11:21 & 32). The events that occurred during the period of waiting (Lazarus' death and burial) were not only difficult for Mary and Martha, but they were also difficult for Jesus. It would have been easier for Him to have gone earlier and spared His friends of their grief.

It was not in the long term best interest for Jesus to have gone earlier because there was much to learn by waiting. Jesus told His disciples "And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, to the intent ye may believe;..." (Jn. 11:15). If Jesus would have healed Lazarus before his death, the impact of the miracle would undoubtedly have been lessened. Raising him from the dead was a much more profound miracle, and therefore, the delayed blessings that Mary and Martha received have been a powerful lesson for generations to follow.

The delayed blessings received from waiting are not always immediately evident. Shortly before Christ's trial and death, He took Peter, James and John to a separate place where He could pray for strength to fulfill His mission. Three times He left these three disciples to wait while He went and prayed. All three times they fell asleep. Christ said unto them "...What, could you not watch with me one hour?" (Mt. 26:40). Undoubtedly, this experience was a very humbling one for those disciples and it helped them to realize that of their own strength they could do nothing, not even stay awake. They would need this lesson of relying on strength from God many times later as they spread the gospel.

In the early Christian church, the Apostles were promised that they would be baptized with the Holy Ghost and were instructed to go to Jerusalem to wait for the promise to be fulfilled. They were in one accord, waiting patiently for the promise to be kept. As they waited "...suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind ... and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost,... (Acts 2:2&4). What would have happened to the Apostles if they would have become too impatient to wait upon the Lord? They may have missed the opportunity to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Many more examples could be cited from the scriptures that would show us the benefits of being willing to wait for the Lord to send His blessings when He was ready.

We face many pressures in our daily walk of life that tend to make us grow impatient when we are required to wait. Although we may find that there are some material benefits to the rapid pace we face in society, to gain the spiritual benefits we need, the scripture encourages us to "Be still, and know that I am God:..." (Ps. 46:10). As Elijah was seeking assurance that God was still available to help His people, it was necessary for him to wait quietly until the strong wind passed, the earthquake ended and the fire burned and then he heard the Lord in "...a still small voice" (I Ki. 19:12). God's blessings are never late, but sometimes we must be willing to wait for them.

Brethren Attend Two Dedications in Europe

In May, 2001 three Elder Brothers and their wives from the USA traveled to Europe on a Mission Committee trip. They were Peter and Marian Petrovic from San Diego, Gene and Mary Marti from Kansas City, and Roy and Dona Grimm from Taylor. The purpose of the trip was to attend two church dedications, and meet with brethren from the various countries which receive assistance from the World Relief Committee as well as the Mission Committee.

They arrived in Budapest on Friday morning, May 18. They were met at the airport by Hungarian brethren, and taken to the Budapest church where they stayed overnight.

Saturday, May 19

After breakfast, they left in two vans for a short visit to Slovakia. The brethren reached the Slovakian border in about two hours, and crossed with only minor delays. They reached the church at Bernolakovo about 11:00 AM. They had a worship service conducted by Bro. Roy in English and translated into the local language.

Following a noon meal, the group met with Elder Jan Zibritovski and discussed their needs. Only eight young people have jobs, and the remainder are older persons. They have very few converts. They are faced with higher utility costs as we are here in the States. Much of their pension is used just to cover these expenses. We do send them some assistance and intend to increase this as it is needed.


About 3:15 PM the group began their return trip to Budapest. There was a singing in the church in the evening, but they were able to get to bed by 9:45. It had been a very productive day.

Sunday, May 20

The group departed for Szentantalfa at 5:45 AM. This was dedication day for a new church that was made possible by the generous gifts and contributions of our US brethren.

It was a beautiful morning for travel, and they arrived at the church about 8:00 AM. Breakfast was waiting for the visitors, who came from many different congregations.

Services began about 9:00 AM with Elders Janos Papp and Ferenc Kovacs delivering the message of dedication. This is always the first service held in a new building.

Following the worship service there was a report on the history of the congregation plus a financial report. The town mayor was present and made some very nice remarks.

Building costs were reported at about \$331,000, of which our American brethren and friends contributed \$180,000. These funds come from the European Church Building Fund, administered by the Mission Committee in conjunction with the European Board.

There was a tour of the building, and after a singing, lunch was served. Following lunch, our brethren met with the Hungarians to discuss some

matters in which we work together.

There was more beautiful singing and the afternoon service started at 4:00 pm. In accordance with an agreement made some years ago, the Hungarians had the scripture reading, prayer, and a brief meditation. All three of the Americans were then asked to speak with Hungarian brother Zoltan Szabo serving as translator. There was a closing prayer and hymns, followed by other remarks, greetings, and announcements.

There was a short recess and then singing at 6:00 PM, followed by an evening meditation and more singing. This was beautiful and very impressive.

The group finally left Szentantalfa and arrived back in their rooms in Budapest at 11:50 pm. It was quite a long day, and they were tired but very inspired. The weather was just about perfect. It was 1:00 AM before they got to bed, but they knew they did not need to start early in the morning.

Monday, May 21

The weary travelers could sleep in this morning, since breakfast was at 9:30 AM in the apartment of Peter and Erika Gal which is across the courtyard from the church building.

Following breakfast the Hungarians took our group to view a site where they may possibly build a rest home sometime in the future. They stopped at a home of one of the brethren for lunch, and then toured the city of Budapest. This is an interesting city with a long history.

Supper was served in the church, and then there was a meeting with the local brethren concerning the ongoing work in Hungary. Some of our brethren took a night tour of Budapest. This is a beautiful sight. The others were glad to just rest because there was a full schedule for the next day.

Tornado Disaster Recovery in Pontotoc, Mississippi

On Saturday, February 24, 2001 a tornado packing winds of more than 140 miles/hour cut a 1 mile wide and 24 mile long path of destruction across Pontotoc County. The tornado killed six people, injured dozens more, destroyed 93 houses and damaged over 200 other homes and buildings in Pontotoc, the county seat. One person described the area as looking "like an atomic bomb hit it."

Your help is needed

Emergency relief organizations responded immediately. Months later, this small devastated community is now faced with tremen-



dous recovery efforts. The World Relief Disaster Committee is planning to build three homes for families that had their houses completely destroyed. Construction started in June 2001.

One of the families selected for a new house lost their only child, a 10 year old son, to the storm. This work project is a wonderful opportunity to communicate the love of Christ to three families in need... and build lasting friendships with those that you work with.

What type of work will you do?

We need all different levels of volunteer help, from first timers to experienced carpenters. Several different activities are available: Foundations, concrete, framing, roofing, siding, hanging drywall, stripping, mudding, painting, wallpaper, carpet, trimwork, hanging doors and helping with electrical, HVAC, and plumbing subcontractors.

We are not required to have state licensed craftsmen. This enables us to use our own volunteers in any craft when needed.

Where will you stay?

We have use of a gymnasium for housing volunteers at no cost. There are separate rooms and showers for men and women. Volunteers should bring their own linens & towels.

For those who prefer not to stay in the gymnasium, arrangements have been made for volunteers at the Pontotoc Inn. A special room rate of \$40.66 (including tax) per night for rooms with two double beds was negotiated. This price does not include breakfast. There are a number of good restuarants and fast food businesses close by.

Suggested items to bring

- 1. Plenty of work clothes.
- 2. Tools
 - a. Hammer
 - b. Leather apron
 - c. Measuring tape
 - d. Utility knife
- 3. Clothes for after work to go out to eat.
- 4. Money for meals or anything extra.
- 5. Song books, Bible.
- 6. Linens & towels if staying in the gymnasium.

After services we were served a Mexican lunch prepared by the local ladies who cook for the work teams



amongst their tents and bit many of the people, and the people started dying. They realized then, why they were dying. They realized it was because they were murmuring and they cried out to Moses, and said, "Save us." Moses asked God, and I will just read here, "Therefore the people came to Moses, and said, We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD, and against thee; pray unto the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us. And Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said unto Moses, Make thee a fiery serpent, and set it upon a pole:" Now does this make us think of anything?

He said make a brazen serpent and put it up on a pole. That should make us think of something. "...and it shall come to pass, that every one that is bitten, when he looketh upon it, shall live. And Moses made a serpent of brass, and put it upon a pole, and it came to pass, that if a serpent had bitten any man, when he beheld the serpent of brass, he lived." Numbers 21:7-9.

Wasn't that quite a thing? Can you imagine? Let's just put ourselves back a couple thousand years now and be wandering in the wilderness. We murmur and we grumble and we probably even tell our neighbor that Moses isn't a good leader. We murmur against the leadership and we grumble and then we are bitten. Then our children are bitten. Then we get down on our knees and realize that we maybe only have seconds or hours until our death.

Then someone comes and tells us. Maybe Grandma or maybe one of our daughters comes in and says, "Do you know what? Moses said that if we would go out and look upon this snake that is up on the pole, that we would live." So what do we do in our need? Wouldn't we crawl out of our tent door if at all possible and look upon that snake that is hung upon the pole? Then we would live, even though we had suffered a fatal bite. A miracle! How could it be?

But even though we don't understand how it could be, what would we do? We could say, "Well, I am intelligent to know that that brazen serpent hanging up there on that pole has no life. That can't help me. I am either going to die or I am going to live, one or the other."

Yet, in our need and because we had observed that some of our neighbors have lived when they looked upon the pole, I think I would look upon the pole. Once I was healed, I believe that I would start to tell others that if they were bitten and the snakes came into their tent, that they should look upon the pole. Don't we see the analogy?

It is becoming very plain when we read of Christ in John twelve when He said, "And I," He is speaking of Himself, "if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me." John 12:32. What happened that day, dear ones? There is a reason Christ was crucified. There is a reason that He was not stoned, or that He was not beheaded. He was crucified because in that manner, He was lifted up so all men could see Him, just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness.

"The prince of this world will be cast out," Christ said. Then that day, the prince of this world was cast out. Christ took sin upon him-

self and that day the devil lost. He was beaten and he was cast out. The devil did not want that sacrifice to be made. I think this is one case where the devil did not fully understand. He thought he was winning that day, and he inspired men to put the Son of God to death, the Holy Seed to death. All down through the ages, Satan has always been working against the Holy Seed of God and trying to kill it. He did it with the babies and he did it in Moses' time. He did it in Christ's time and he tried to kill Christ when He was a baby. They tried to kill Christ during His life and push Him off a cliff, but it never worked.

Finally, Satan thought he was winning victory and he thought, "I will put Him on a cross and kill Him." Satan didn't realize what was really happening. Christ became cursed for us as He hung on that tree.

Now, we have already spoken of the Israelites and the tents and how hard it maybe would be to go look upon the pole. Yet, when we would see our neighbors being healed and our children perhaps being healed, wouldn't we, too, want to be healed and look upon the pole?

This is the way it is with Christ. It is so hard to humble ourselves, the natural hearts of man in many cases, but not in every case. In many cases, it is so proud and hard that it does not want to acknowledge that it will take a miracle to save us. We do not want to say that or to admit that. So we in our unconverted state, especially if we are of some age, and if we have rejected the Lord for some time, we really don't even want to look upon the pole. We don't really

want to look upon Christ on the cross. We will maybe turn in that direction, but we will kind of look down because we don't really want to speak to Him. We know that He will ask us a question if we look into His eyes. We know there is power there but we don't want to admit it.

Dear ones, we have to humble ourselves. The way of salvation begins with a humble feeling and an acknowledgment of need and an acknowledgment of sin and of a pleading. It can be in various words and various phrases. That is why we don't write it out. We don't write out exactly what the sinner's prayer should be. I have seen where they tell you what the sinner's prayer is. If you are of a humble mind and of a seeking mind and know your needs, you can pray in your own words and Christ will hear it, whatever those words are. "Lord, help me." It doesn't have to be any fancier than that.

Look upon that pole. Talk to the Saviour who died and took all sin upon Himself when He hung upon that pole for us. He will draw all men unto Himself. Isn't it amazing that One Man several thousand years ago died for all? There have been many men executed, many men and women have been executed throughout history, untold millions, but only One can draw all men to Him. That is correct. Then there were the questions and if we were there in that day, we would have asked many of these same questions. They wondered and couldn't understand how the Son of Man, how their Messiah, how God manifested in the flesh, they didn't know why He should be crucified. They just

couldn't understand that. It wasn't revealed to them yet.

But we do not have the excuses that they had. The people in this time, even the people that lived with Christ in that same era, they did have some excuse, maybe not much, because they could see the wonderful works. They surely couldn't deny the miracles and they couldn't deny His love. A man that never did wrong, how could they deny Him?

But, still, it was not fully revealed until after the resurrection. Only then could they understand the Old Testament prophesies that Christ was going to come twice - once to suffer and once to reign. So they did have, could we say, a small excuse if they rejected Christ if they lived when He lived. But what about us? Do we have any excuse when these Scriptures are so plain and when it has all been fulfilled? Not all prophesies have been fulfilled, but all the prophesies of Christ's first advent have been fulfilled. It is now plain as to the method of salvation.

"Yet a little while is the light with you." John 12:35. Do we notice as we read through Scripture, Christ is always compared to light; the devil is always compared to darkness. "Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you:" John 12:35. There is always a great contrast. Dear ones, how are we walking today? That is a question that we should ask ourselves whether we are a believer or not. Even if we are a believer and if we have been in the light, do we wander into the dark areas? There are dangerous dark areas, even if we have been in the light. Let us stay in the light.

Dear friends, if you could freely

admit that your deeds are evil and you are still hiding deeds and you still love darkness, Christ is the Light. He is the answer.

"...for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth." John 12:35. This is our condition while we are yet unconverted. We really don't know where we are going. If someone asks us ever, "Where are you headed? What do you plan to do in the future?" we should never respond, "I don't know where I am going. I don't know what I am doing." Because as a child of God, we know what we are doing. We are following God's will and we are trying to do His will and we are heading to heaven.

"While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light." John 12:36. It is a miracle, I can't explain it. It is more of a miracle than looking on a brazen serpent on a pole and being healed. But if we believe in the light, we will be children of the light. We won't just be a relative of the light. We are not just an acquaintance of the light or a friend of the light, we are children of the light. We can be children of the Living God.

"But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him:" John 12:37. This was a problem then and it is a problem today. Now we have to ask ourselves, is it a problem with me? Because the whole reason we read Scripture together and the only reason we have gathered today, is that God can speak to our heart and then we need to do self-inspection.

"He hath blinded their eyes, and hardened their heart; that

they should not see with their eyes, nor understand with their heart, and be converted, and I should heal them." John 12:40. That is an interesting Scripture. We can understand the scene with

our eyes. I don't know why they couldn't see the miracles that He did. But then it says, "...nor understand with their heart." Usually we think we understand with our mind and our heart is just an emo-

tional center of our being, but evidently, the heart is more. When the Bible speaks of the heart, this is the center of all spiritual activity and spiritual thought. So we

Gateway Woods Illinois Family Services Central Illinois Local Work Team Projects

Over the years, more and more of our people are getting involved in work projects in other countries such as Jamaica, Mexico, and Haiti. Brethren and friends, young and old, have received many blessings as a result of these work team experiences. At the same time, it has been observed that there are also many needs right here in our own communities.

Last year, Illinois Gateway Woods Family Services organized and successfully completed a Local Work Team Project of this type in an attempt to bring the work team experience closer to home without the need for traveling thousands of miles. Arrangements were made for the volunteers to stay together over night at a church family's home simulating the remote work - team experience. Other volunteers furnished the noon and evening meals. The workers had evening devotions with a minister present, just like is practiced in Haiti and Jamaica. The projects will follow the same guidelines established for the overseas work teams with regard to who can participate and the expectations for the workers.

We have already been given a van and a job trailer which we hope to fill with tools and travel around Central Illinois this summer using God's people, and our blessings to let our good works so shine before men that they may see our good works and glorify our Father which is in Heaven. We look forward to seeing many of you this summer and thank you in advance for your participation in this exciting opportunity.

Sermon continued from page 46 have to understand with our heart. Medically that is maybe not possible, but spiritually, it is very important that we have to understand with our heart. We really can't separate our heart and our mind, can we?

We see that the chief rulers had a problem. This, too, can have application today. Often it seems like not many of the Pharisees believed, but evidently they did. Evidently much of the leadership there at that time among the Jews did believe, but they did not confess Him. In other words, they did not publicly confess Him. This can be a problem today. It is tempting since there is a cost to following the Lord and since there is some

reproach to being a believer and since sacrifices ask once we repent. It is very tempting to believe privately and personally but to not tell anyone. Then we think that we will have some of the benefits but none of the sacrifice. This is not what Scripture teaches.

I don't know the final end of these chief rulers who believed but did not confess publicly because they valued the praise of men more than the praise of God. I don't know their end. Hopefully, they still had time and after Christ's resurrection. Hopefully then they publicly confessed, but think what they missed out on. Think of some of the other rulers

that did and I am thinking of the two that came to the tomb. The man who furnished the tomb and took Jesus down from the cross and begged His body. He was willing to openly confess and acknowledge and to place his lot with the Lord. He openly did this.

Now some years later, maybe twenty years later (I don't know how long he lived) if we would have met him, and if we would have asked how was it taking Jesus down from the cross and how was it preparing Him for burial, was it worth it? What do you think that man would have responded? How would he have responded? I am sure he would have said it was worth it.

Dear ones, we miss out if we think we are going to have a private salvation or if we become misled and think that it is really only between us and God. In some ways it is, it is personal and it is only between us and God, but there is still a need for public confession and public acknowledgment. Then and only then can we receive the full blessings.

"Jesus cried and said, He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me." John 12:44. We can see that no man cometh unto the Father but by Me. There is only one way to the Father's heart and that is through

the Son. We cannot separate the two. We cannot be a part of any religion that acknowledges God but does not acknowledge the Son. That is false, dear ones.

"I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness." John 12:46. Again we see this great contrast. I don't know if there is any darkness in any of us today, but Christ is the answer and Christ can eliminate all the dark corners of our life.

Here as we get to these last verses, we have quite a sobering reminder. A lot of the Word is just a reminder, isn't it? We don't have it new. When we come to church, we don't usually hope to hear something new or something fantastic, but most of it is reminders of things we have already heard. It is because we are forgetful people. Most of what we hear are reminders of things we have already heard.

What I am reminded of this morning is that this Word is going to judge me, not Christ, but the Word. In other words, the things that we have read and been taught and know and heard, that is what is going to judge us. Something that cannot change and has not changed through all the transcribing of Scripture down through the thousands of years and then the

printing of Scripture. A lot of it was hand transcribed and hand-copied and in all of that, there is no conflict. It was perfectly preserved until now for us, and this is what is going to judge us in the last day. It is this Word, dear ones, and how well do we know it.

If our reading and our study is somewhat lackadaisical, or if it is intermittent, is it that way because we are just afraid of what we will find out if we read here? We are always going to be motivated. We are always going to be pricked when we read this good Word. As we continue to do it and if we allow the Word to prick us, then God through His Spirit, (and we can't explain this) gives us a desire for more.

It isn't always prickly. It isn't always all conviction because interspersed among that will be so many wonderful comforts and so many wonderful promises that will give us a hope for the next life.

"And I know that his commandment is life everlasting: whatsoever I speak therefore, even as the Father said unto me, so I speak." John 12:50. We have heard words from the Saviour as many of these are written in red, dear ones, let us heed.





The renewal of true spiritual life continues in Switzerland and other portions of Europe.

Persecution in Switzerland

You may, perhaps, not know the reason for the persecution. There were these reasons: First, it was forbidden to preach in houses, so the one who preached, the one who gave the house, and the ones who attended these meetings were all guilty. Once a brother was preaching. He had a beard. The police came and tore his beard out. The whole cheek was bleeding, and that is the way he was taken to jail for ten miles. You have no idea what they suffered, just because they had meetings and meetings were forbidden.

There was another reason for persecution. There was not compulsory military service, but one question was capital and that was the question of marriage. No one had the right to marry people except in the state church, the Catholic, and the Jews. So if you were not Catholic, Jewish or state church, you could not get married; you had to remain single or join one of these churches. They married anyway, and Brother Froehlich married, too, but the authorities would not recognize this marriage. His wife was punished and fined for each baby she had. They did not have the right to live in the same house, not even in the same village. He had to live separated from his family for seven years.

Once he received news that one of his boys was dying. He wanted by all means to go to sit at the bedside of his dying son, but he expected to be put to jail any moment. But God had mercy on him and on that night a terrible fire broke out and the police were kept busy at the fire, and they left this man sit at the bed of his dying boy. However, he was not permitted to go to the funeral.

Another reason for persecution was that since the church was considered as the State Church, everything the church requested was obligatory. The baptism of newborn children was compulsory. I know of a believing father who was put in jail so that the police were free to bring the newborn child to the official church where it was baptized. The father was compelled to pay the fees and expenses incidental to this.

Endurance

Attendance at training lessons for confirmation and the confirmation itself were compulsory. I know of two girls who died as faithful sisters, who were put to jail on Saturday night and then brought by the police the next morning to Sunday School. At the confirmation ceremony each pupil received a Bible verse as a dedication. These girls received the quotation: "Depart from Me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire." Another girl whom I knew well when she was a grandmother had spent time in jail at the age of 13 because she had visited our Sunday School.

Even funeral services for our people were considered an offense. At one funeral, the police had been instructed to arrest Samuel Froehlich as soon as he would appear. When he did not come (because he had been warned), the police beat the brother who held the services.

Froehlich Leaves Switzerland

The time came that Samuel Froehlich could not live in that wonderful country which people call "Paradise" and in 1844 he was told once more to leave the country. But he did not know where to go. Here comes a wonderful story, the story why I am here. It was always so; the persecution in Jerusalem brought the Gospel to Arabia, to India, and to Europe. The persecution at that time brought the Gospel to other countries, and Samuel Froehlich received the call to come to France.

France

They started small. When they had the Lord's supper for the first time at the end of one year, they were twelve; one year afterwards they were thirty-five, then sixty-five, and they were growing from time to time.

How poor they were and how modest their means can be illustrated by the following story: Every week they had a brother meeting on Friday to evening to speak about questions that came up during the week. Once they had a discussion on the following matter: "What should we do on Sunday when we have guests and have nothing to eat?" The brothers decided that the families should fast in order to have enough to receive guests on Sunday. Such was the spirit at that time.

Germany

The Gospel went joyfully through all of Alsace from one town to the next. But do you know why? Brother Froehlich had a rule,

"Never more than two preaching brothers in one room on a Sunday, and the others go on the road." Where to? God knows - the Gospel had to be preached — the Spirit of God will guide them. My grandfather Diebold was ambitious; he was young; he was 19 or 20. He was one of the youngest and he went to work. He was always on the road, and on Sunday evenings, for a rest, he was in jail. Just an example of how they were working: He heard that on a farm seven hours away was a man seeking God. He went there and this man said, "Oh, no," and as he wanted to get rid of him he said, "I know a man who is more interested than I; go and visit him." This man was two hours away.

He went to this man; that totaled nine hours walking. When he came to this farm — it was a beautiful farm — the windows were all open and he heard a loud noise. When he looked, there was a large number of guests in the house. The people called out, "This is a new house and a new barn, and he has invited the whole village because the whole village helped him to build, so now the whole village is here." What would you do in such a case? He had wanted to speak in secret to this man and now he found the whole village; is that not wonderful?

So he came to the house hungry — after walking for nine hours he must have been hungry! The owner was full of joy for this beautiful farm, and he said, "Come in, have a meal with us." My grandfather went in and enjoyed the meal with them. When he was through and satisfied, this ambitious man said, "Now friends, we had a wonderful meal and we all enjoyed it," and he started to speak of the meal, and of the invitation to the feast at the marriage of the Lamb. While he was preaching, the wife of this man ran out and fell on her knees and prayed the Lord that this terrible sectarian would be chased out of the house. But he was not chased, and this wife was a very dear sister afterwards. This beautiful farm was just built for a church, and it became a church and is still a church now.

"It Works"

An Afro-American teacher of education at Kansas State University in Manhattan, KS, once told his class, "Every kid (child) is different. Do whatever works with that kid." I assume he was talking about motivating the child to learn. It does raise the issue about what works and what doesn't work.

Do the teachings of the New Testament work? By faith we believe that the atonement Christ made for us, as recorded in the New Testament, works, that if we repent, believe and obey, we are forgiven, sanctified, and will surely go to Heaven. We have not yet gone to Heaven, so this is based on faith, not on empirical truth or knowledge.

What about Christ's statement in Luke 10:30, "He that findeth his life shall lose it: and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it." I understand this to mean that finding your life is to live selfishly, and to lose your life is to live very unselfishly, to

forget self, to be dead to self. The former way of living seems to be very attractive; you do what you want to do and get what you want to get. However, you are never satisfied. There is always something more, or better, that you want. In the latter way of living, you start with nothing and you are dead with Christ, so you have nothing to lose, and every little thing God gives you seems like an enormous blessing.

In Luke 18:29-30 we read, "And he (Christ) said unto them, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the kingdom of God's sake. Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time. and in the world to come, life everlasting." Jesus is not teaching us to leave our wives and children; they need us, but He is teaching us that whatever we give up for Him and God's kingdom will be recompensed to us in an abundant manner already in

this life. Does it work? I believe it does and this is not just a matter of faith. It is a matter of observation. It really works that way. You have probably experienced it.

If you operate on this premise that you are dead to self and willing to do anything for the Lord. you do need to be careful that others do not take advantage of you. To make it really work, all the believers in a church should operate on that same premise. I had someone in the States say to me, someone who knew of my convictions on the matter, "Ehnle, it doesn't work. The more you are willing to do anything and everything for the Lord, in the church, the more others sit back and let you do it." This concerns menial tasks, not preaching the Word. If others tend to take advantage of you, you need to say, "I'm willing to do it, but I think everyone should do his share. There is a blessing in doing it."
