"SEEK THE LORD AND LIVE"

Sermon by Bro. Elmer Witzig, Gridley, IL Luke 13

Dear ones, these are the words that the Saviour spoke when He was here upon earth. What would be more pleasant and of greater value than if we could sit at Jesus' feet and learn of Him? We do not have the privilege today to see Jesus, or to hear Him speak, but we have the privilege to hear the words He spoke many years ago.

We are thankful that God preserved these words, even unto this very day and hour. We are thankful that Jesus did speak these words. We are thankful that He was that perfect example for you and me. We are thankful for the blood that flowed on Calvary's cross. We are thankful for the promises that are given to the faithful ... to those that will believe in that shed blood.

How thankful we can be that these words have been preserved for us. As I mentioned, we do not have the privilege of having the Lord in person with us, but we are thankful that we have the promise in His Word that His Spirit will be among us. How often we have felt His Spirit!

We trust this afternoon that we might feel the Spirit of God in our midst and that He will be the One Who will speak to us through His Word. The Apostle Paul said we can plant and we can water, but God must give the increase. (I Cor. 3:6).

We are thankful that there are souls in our midst today — a goodly number — who have just recently turned and given their hearts to the Lord. It thrills our hearts when we think that God's mercy is still extended to us today. It is not anything that we have done, but it is God that works in the heart. God converts the soul. We are redeemed through His precious blood and through faith in His Word and in that blood.

As we began to read here, "There

were present at that season some that told him of the Galilaeans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And Jesus answering said unto them, Suppose ye that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things? He said, I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ve shall all likewise perish. Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." (Luke 13:1-5)

These are the words that Jesus spoke, and they cannot be altered. We know that Jesus, after He was baptized, was driven by the Spirit into the wilderness. He was tempted for forty days and forty nights. Why was He tempted? Not for His purpose, but we know that through the overpowering strength of our Lord and Saviour, you and I, too, can overcome.

We might think that because He was the Son of God, He was able to overcome. But the enemy brought Scripture before Him and said, "If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down: for it is written, He shall give his angels charge concerning thee: ...lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone." (Matthew 4:6)

"Then saith Jesus unto him, Get thee hence, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve." (Matthew 4:10)

At three different times, the enemy brought temptations to Him, but He used the Word of God to drive away the enemy. You and I have the Word of God before us, and we, too, can drive him back through the Word of God.

But, what I was going to say, that immediately after He left the wil-

derness, the "...angels came and ministered unto him." (Matthew 4:11). At the beginning of His ministry, He preached repentance for the kingdom of God is at hand. (Matthew 4:17)

John the Baptist, the forerunner of Jesus Christ, preached repentance for the kingdom of God is at hand. (Matthew 3:1-2)

In Froehlich's writings, the founder of our faith and who estab-

Too Late

There are many times in our lives that we have an opportunity to accomplish a task and we wait too long to take advantage of the opportunity. Sometimes the results of waiting too long are insignificant, but in some situations the results are very serious.

Just as when someone puts off seeing a doctor for an illness and later learns his disease is too advanced for a cure, there is even more serious spiritual consequences for those who resist God until it is too late.

We know that God is "...a God full of compassion, and gracious, longsuffering, and plenteous in mercy and truth" (Ps. 86:15). But we also know that if we tempt the Lord beyond His patience, God will reject us, "So I sware in my wrath, They shall not enter into my rest" (Heb. 3:11). If we persist long enough, God will "...(give) them their request; but send leanness into their soul" (Ps. 106:15).

There are numerous examples where individuals or groups pushed the patience of the Lord too far. In many of these examples, by the time they realized the seriousness of their error, it was too late. Romans 1:21-32 reminds us of the sad consequences of those who "...do not like to retain God in their knowledge..." (Ro. 1:28).

At the time of the flood, Noah warned the people for years that there would be a flood that would destroy all "...wherein is the breath of life,..." (Gen. 6:17). After many years of preparing the ark and giving those who lived around him plenty of time to learn about the impending disaster, the time came when the ark was completed. After Noah, his family, and the animals entered the ark, "...the Lord shut him in" (Gen. 7:16). Undoubtedly after it started to rain, there were those who would have been glad to enter the ark, but it was too late. God had closed the door.

The Egyptians had numerous examples of God's power and they had numerous opportunities to turn away from their sin but they ignored the warnings of the Lord and the nation was nearly destroyed.

Likewise, the Children of Israel, after seeing numerous miracles as they were

leaving Egypt, so often tried the Lord's patience. Time after time they longed to return to Egypt, but God gave them more time and more examples of His love and power. When it was time to enter the Promised Land, they forgot what God had done for them. They ignored the message of Joshua and Caleb. All they could think of was how big and strong the enemy looked. They did not trust God in spite of the many times He had given them proof that He was with them. Finally, the Lord told them they must wander in the wilderness for forty years because of their unbelief.

Upon hearing this sentence, the Children of Israel realized that they had sinned and then decided they would fight their enemy and enter the promised land. Moses told them not to go, because it would not prosper. "But they presumed to go up unto the hill top:... Then the Amalekites came down, and the Canaanites which dwelt in that hill, and smote them,..." (Nu. 14:44-45). It was too late. The Lord refused to help them because of their unbelief and complaining.

We can also learn the value of yielding to God's wisdom before it is too late from the experience of Esau and King Saul. Esau realized he made a serious mistake in selling his birthright but "...when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears" (Heb. 12:17). King Saul finally recognized his sin in trusting in himself rather than obeying God. He said "... I pray thee, pardon my sin, and turn again with me, that I may worship the Lord. And Samuel said unto Saul, I will not return with thee: for thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, and the Lord hath rejected thee from being king over Israel" (I Sa. 15:25-26).

Esau and Saul both came to the point where thy realized they had made serious mistakes, but they waited too long and they suffered the consequences of their behavior.

Although not everyone who waits too long is involved in what we might regard as serious sin, some simply put off doing what

needs to be done to obtain their salvation.

For example, the five foolish virgins knew the bridegroom would soon come, so they "... took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom" (Mt. 25:1) at the proper place to wait for his arrival. The virgins even went so far as to trim their lamps, but they took no oil with them.

When the bridegroom came, they had to go get oil for their lamps. By the time the five foolish virgins returned "...the door was shut" (Mt. 25:10). They were too late. When they knocked and asked admission they were denied the privilege of going to the marriage.

Learning from the mistakes of others can be helpful in times of conflict. Knowing the Lord offers salvation and has even sent His Son to pay the price of our sins, the unconverted soul must decide to accept this gift. As Satan tries to convince him to wait a little longer before turning to the Lord, he faces a conflict that has eternal consequences. Jesus warned his disciples to not be deceived "...for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh" (Mt. 25:13). Once we have been called from time into eternity, it will be too late to choose salvation through Christ because where "...the tree falleth, there it shall be" (Ec. 11:3).

Perhaps one of the saddest verses in the hymns that we sing is the last verse of "Almost Persuaded" (Hymns of Zion p. 212). "Almost persuaded, harvest is past! Almost persuaded, doom comes at last! Almost cannot avail; almost is but to fail! Sad, sad that bitter wail, Almost, but lost!"

We need not suffer that fate. God is calling His people to come unto Him through repentance and conversion, giving time and grace to begin serving the Lord. God is longsuffering, but there will come a time when the unconverted will hear that they have waited too long, that the door of grace is closed and they are not saved. "And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal" (Mt. 25:46).

Church Dedication in Timisoara, Romania

In last month's issue, the Mission Committee reported on the dedication of a new building in Szentantalfa, Hungary. On Sunday, May 27th, 2001 the same group was also present for the dedication of a new church building in Timisoara, Romania. Nearly 1,000 people from all across Europe attended this service. The following is taken from diaries kept by American brothers.

Saturday, May 26

Breakfast this morning was served at the bed and breakfast facility in Szeged, Hungary, where the group spent several nights. The group loaded their luggage into a late-model Peugeot van driven by a Hungarian brother. It had air-conditioning, which is unusual in this part of the world. They did appreciate the traveling comfort very much.

After about an hour they reached the Romanian border. Children were walking around with sponges and squeegees, wanting to wash the windows of vehicles waiting in line to cross. There was the usual long line of trucks, many of which wait long hours or even days to get through the tangles of the officialdom. This is a big problem, and seems senseless to Americans, but there is little to do about it. It took about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours to cross.

The roads in Romania are quite good, much better than a few years ago. Wheat looks good and is beginning to turn ripe. Many laborers are in the fields working by hand hoeing corn or sometimes a horse was pulling a small plow.

The noon meal was served in the Arad church where visitors from Ukraine were also beginning to

assemble for the dedication. Following the meal, the group met with the Romanian elders with three elders from Ukraine sitting in as observers. They discussed the Romanian self-help programs that are for the most part successful.

A big concern on the part of our group was the overnight accommodation. They didn't want to be a burden to anyone and the local brethren had much on their hands already as they have the meals to prepare and many visitors to accommodate. They discussed this with elder Ladi Augustinov who then agreed to take them to a hotel in the city. This hotel is about 15 stories high and in need of renovation. It is scheduled to be closed in July for two years to bring it back to three star standards. They were able to get four rooms on the fourth floor. They were clean with old but functional bathroom facilities. The brethren were quite grateful for the room and especially the bathrooms. They were able to rest well in this place so far from home.



Church in Timisoara, Romania

Sunday, May 28

After a good breakfast in the hotel, the group loaded into their van about 7:30 and drove for about one hour to the new church in Timisoara. This is the largest church in Romania with about 130 members. It had been nearly disbanded under Communism. There

are around 300 seats in the assembly room in this church. Total membership in the country of Romania is about 1,200. Many are elderly sisters, but there are some families.

Services started at 9:15 AM with the singing of "Christian Greetings" for which everyone stood. The dedication service was conducted in Romanian by several elders. At 10:15 they sang Hymn #220 and Bro. Roy Grimm closed in prayer. Then Hymn #236 and another elder spoke in Romanian. This was followed by a report of the financing of the building, much of which came from the USA brethren.

Elder Augustinov mentioned how Nazarenes had suffered in the past and now we can worship freely. He thanked everyone including the city officials who were present. There was singing until 11:10 AM at which time a meal was prepared.

There was considerable discussion as to how to conduct the afternoon service, and in what language, and since there was no qualified English translator the Americans were pretty much excused. It was decided that brothers would speak in Romanian, Hungarian, and Serbian, and the suggestion was that all should be short. The service began at 4:00 pm in Romanian, and Bro. Peter Petrovic then spoke in Serbian. Hungarian was spoken at 5:00 PM and at 5:15 PM a 91 year old elder from Ukraine selected Hymn #50, which was followed by a prayer in Hungarian. The final remarks were in Romanian.

Following the services, greetings were extended, with many being expressed. About 15 or 16 elders were present from Europe, Canada, and the USA. Nine languages were present.

Following a meal, the group returned to Arad for the night.

Work in Mexico

A postolic Christian World Relief efforts in Mexico are centered in Imuris, Juarez, Agua Prieta and Rio Bravo.

Work teams are needed in Imuris

Imuris is about 30 miles south of Nogales, AZ. World Relief has been involved here with the Casa de Elizabeth orphanage. World Relief has built a wall around the compound and a home is under construction for the administrators, as well as a small place for volunteers to sleep.



A work team is needed August 23-25 to put the roof trusses up and roofing material on.

Juarez

Many people from the interior of Mexico flock to the border at Juarez in hopes of a better life. Because of this, the city is growing very rapidly, and many people are unemployed. The people that do find work get low wages, and have difficulty finding housing. World Relief has been feeding children for years, and work teams build small homes for the very poor.

World Relief sends 2 medical teams annually to Mexico, providing basic care and training in hygiene and dental care, as well as general check ups.

Agua Prieta

Agua Prieta is located just across the border from Douglas, AZ. World Relief has been involved in building a school, and also building a fence at an orphanage.

Rio Bravo

Rio Bravo is across the border from McAllen, TX and is a deaf ministry similar to the Jamaican villages that World Relief has been involved with for many years. The organization is known nationally as ICCD, International Christian Center for the Deaf. They are building a deaf school campus and World Relief has sent several groups to help.

Six groups have traveled to Rio Bravo to date and bring home reports of the blessing of fellowship and service to the Lord. The housing is on campus and is dormitory style, making this an inviting Sunday School or young folks work project. They feed the team daily and the work is done on campus.

Many of our groups are choosing to drive to Rio Bravo in order to cut some travel costs. The close proximity of Zapata makes Rio Bravo a great place for Apostolic Christians that have a desire to give of their time in this labor of love. The people who run the organization help our teams cross the border, and take the groups to the campus in old school buses. This saves the cost of buying Mexican insurance.

The work schedule is close to the same for each team. After unpacking and picking your bunk, supper is served and a special week of fellowship is well underway. Each evening, there are devotions and hymns are often sung. This always seems to

be a highlight for most team members. Prayers are offered for God's protection, blessings, and nearness. Quiet time is provided after breakfast before job assignments so that everyone can begin their day focused on Christ. Sunday is a day of rest and fellowship following the services led by the ministering brother on the team.

The group looks forward to the work which consists of various jobs. Block work, concrete work, brick making, plumbing, electrical, painting, and cleaning are just a few of the jobs that teams do. Everyone takes their turn helping with dishes and many team members get to help prepare the food in the kitchen with the excellent Mexican cooks.

At this time, the deaf children are not housed on campus, so team members look forward to the morning that is set aside to meet and play with them and to meet their families. After having lunch with them, goodie bags are passed out and good-byes are said.



Tears are mixed with smiles as team members watch the little bus filled with happy children wind down the lane leaving the campus. Upon returning home we bring a bit of Rio Bravo with us, and leave a part of our heart with the children and those who are involved in the work at Rio Bravo.

There are many opportunities to be used in Mexico, and if you feel a need to be involved, the door is open.

Following is an article submitted by Sis. Jennifer Kellenberger about the work being done in Rio Bravo, Mexico: Apostolic Christian work teams to Rio Bravo, Mexico

In February of the year 2000 the first AC work team headed to Rio Bravo, Mexico, to work with **International Christian Centers** for the Deaf (ICCD), otherwise known as Mexico, Centros Cristianos para Sordomudos (MCCS). I was fortunate enough to have been on that team. The team was led by Bro. Chad Lantz (Bluffton, IN) and the team minister was Bro. Ted Hirstein (Morton, IL). There were 29 of us from various churches and we had a wonderful time as we worked together helping in the construction of the school for the deaf children of Rio Bravo.

In June of 2000, the second AC work team arrived in Rio Bravo for a week of hard work in the hot sun. The team was led by Bro. Marvin and Sis. Gail Hodel (Peoria, IL) and the team minister was Bro. Lynn Fiechter (Bluffton, IN). It truly was a blessing for me to be in Mexico again. It was on that trip that I first felt God was really calling me to Rio Bravo, Mexico, to serve in the mission field. Maria is in charge of the kitchen, which is a huge task, especially considering that we have teams of up to 150 people. It is quite a feat to make sure things run smoothly in the kitchen when you are feeding that many people. Both of the girls have done an excellent job and have been a blessing to have around. The rest of the summer staff include: Oliver McLemore (Montgomery, AL), Michael Godwin (Brewton, AL) and Phillip Reagan (Montgomery, AL). We have also been blessed with some short-term summer staffers. which include Ruthie Martin (Murfreesboro, TN) and Bethany Parker (Budapest, Hungary). They have all been a huge help to all of us here at ICCD/MCCS.

In June, our first summer teams arrived, two of which were AC teams. The first team was led by Bro. Joe and Sis. Denise Maller (Bluffton, IN) and consisted of 35 people from 14 different AC churches. There was no team minister; however, we were once again blessed by having Bro. Leland Plattner (Zapata) here with us. The rest of the Zapata congregation also joined us for the Sunday service. We took the team to a

small Mexican church where Bro. Leland had the service. The following week we had a team of 27 here with us, all of which were from Leo, IN. We were blessed to have two team ministers, Elder Bro. Lynn Stieglitz and Bro. Brace Wieland. The teams worked hard on the maintenance building and on the children's dormitory, which will eventually be home to 150 deaf children.

All of us here at ICCD/MCCS hope you will return some day soon to continue in the work here. We look forward to the future AC work teams that will come to Rio Bravo. lished our faith as we know it today, said, "John the Baptist preached repentance. The Lord Jesus preached repentance. It is our obligation to preach repentance likewise."

Here we read it together that Jesus said, "...except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." (Luke 13:5). We are thankful for everyone that can believe in these Scriptures and that can, by the grace of God, be able to repent, acknowledge their sin, acknowledge their lost condition and their need of a Saviour.

Come to the foot of the cross and humble yourself before His Almighty hand, and He will lift you up. A broken and contrite spirit, the Lord will not reject. (See Psalm 51:17). So we are thankful for His Word and for His teachings.

We read here another very important passage. "He spake also this parable; A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?" (Luke 13:6-7). We could compare this to a soul that would continually put it off, and that finally, He would say, "Cut it down."

But we are so thankful for the love, and the mercy, and the long-suffering of God and that He is still extending His day of grace.

We believe that so it was even in the lives of many throughout the generations that if it were not for the longsuffering of God, that He could have tired in calling them from time to time. But He was willing to be patient and longsuffering and gave them more time so that they would finally surrender.

The time is going to come when the Lord will say "to here and no further." As the tree falls, then so shall it lie. Our wish and our prayer is that all of you, dear friends, that have not yet surrendered your hearts, that you would have this prayer. We would encourage you to have this prayer within your heart.

The hymnwriter wrote, "Jesus Saviour, hear my humble cry; While on others Thou art calling, do not pass me by." The Lord will not pass anyone. But He is beckoning. He is "…longsuffering to usward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" and the knowledge of the truth. (II Peter 3:9)

We would encourage everyone that when you hear that call to heed the call. You are in the midst of God's people today and hearing the kind invitation, "Come unto me, all ye that labour (are weary) and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest for your soul." (Matthew 11:28)

We have every reason to believe that there are many, many souls gathered with us even this afternoon that would have a longing and a desire to have that surrendered heart, but the enemy has ways and means in causing you to put it off until some more convenient day.

We have every reason to believe that you, our dear old friends, who have surrendered your hearts, are thankful that God has given you grace to repent. Likewise, to the dear young converts, how wonderful it is when you in your tender years of life can surrender your hearts unto the Lord.

We would say to the youth, that you are our hope and fond expectation. Hark to the voice which is calling a kind invitation, and obey the hand which often has pointed the way to our dear Saviour's salvation.

To those who have come to their older years of life, we would encourage you to not put it off another day because it is not worth taking the chance. What if the Lord would say, "Cut it down, Why cumbereth it the ground?"

If a person is willing to surrender, the Word teaches us that they who come in the eleventh hour will have the same reward as those who went through the heat and burden of the day. We are thankful that God has promised that in His Word because we are thankful for every soul that can come in the eleventh hour and still receive that eternal reward.

But see how many years have lapsed that you were not able to enjoy the peace and love of God, and that could have been yours if you would have only surrendered. But thanks be to God that He has given to those who have surrendered, the grace to surrender. We plead for those who have not yet surrendered. There are many, many that should yet be saved.

We heard this morning that only God knows when He will make an end of all things, or when He will come and call His church, or when He will begin the great tribulation. We have no promise that we will not endure trials and tribulations. We might even experience a measure of tribulation.

When we look and search the Word, we can see that everything is pointing to that time when the Lord will return. We are thankful that the waters have been troubled and that souls are turning to the Lord.

We can read in that one chapter that when the waters were troubled, an impotent man was there for many years but could not step in because someone stepped in before him. (See John 5:2-9). We are thankful that is not the case today. Just because someone else turned to the Lord, that did not exempt anyone that wants to repent.

"Whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely." (Rev. 22:17)

It says here, "And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath day?" (Luke 13:16). Jesus saw this woman and had said, "Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity." (Luke 13:12)

Right away the Pharisees murmured because Jesus healed on the Sabbath day. How sad it is that the enemy can work such in the hearts of people. No doubt that was the work of Satan in the heart of that Pharisee, and then he murmured because Jesus did good on the Sabbath day. But Jesus said, "Thou hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or his ass from the stall, and lead him away to watering? And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath day? And when he had said these things, all his adversaries were ashamed: and all the people rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by him. Then said he, Unto what is the kingdom of God like? and whereunto shall I resemble it? It is like a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and cast into his garden; and it grew, and waxed a great tree; and the fowls of the air lodged in the branches of it." (Luke 13:15-19)

So it is when a soul surrenders their life. They hardly know which way to turn. They do not know what is required of them, but they know that they need to repent. If they come to the Lord Jesus at the foot of the cross and commit their life and their all unto Him, then He will unfold and He will increase their faith and He will give grace and obedience to His Word and His teaching.

That is why we have to search the Word and give heed to the entire Word of God. We are thankful that our faith is not based upon any one certain passage of Scripture, but it is based upon the entire Word of God. The Old Testament is for our learning and admonition and we can see how God dealt with sin and iniquity. The Apostle Paul said that the children of Israel were examples to us of how God dealt with them (See I Cor. 10:6). So it is in the New Testament. We have to be followers and faithful servants of His. May God give each one of us that necessary grace so that we might be led by His Spirit into all truth.

In another passage of Scripture, the Apostle Paul reminds us, "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard," considering the whole Word of God, "lest at any time we should let them slip. For if the Word spoken by angels was stedfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense of reward; How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard him." (Hebrews 2:1-3)

We are thankful that (even though we have not heard the words of the Saviour) we have His Word recorded. Then we have the words of the apostles recorded and it was confirmed by those who heard them how the apostles were endowed by the Spirit of God to teach and preach and to be the proper examples. God expects no less from you and me. We, in this generation, even in 1988, God requires of us that we will be those examples.

Where we fail, may God reveal it to us so that we can all be that proper example and that we might be a help to those yet outside of the fold so that they will be brought into the Inn. The Inn is where they can hear the Word and where they can be convicted and then find the Lord, and make a covenant with God to be faithful and true even until life's end.

We are thankful for the provisions. We are thankful for the heritage that is ours. We are thankful for every soul that has come into the faith and have been exposed to the Word and that they could come and taste and see. Many have experienced and testified that when they heard the truth, they were convicted and then they came to the knowledge of the truth.

All this has to be revealed by God Himself. We are only instruments in God's hands. We, as the body of believers, are the salt of the earth. If the salt has lost its savour, wherewith shall it be seasoned? (See Matt. 5:13). May we be a light in the world and walk as though it were our last.

But we must occupy until the Lord comes. (See Luke 19:13). We cannot wait and think, "The Lord is soon coming so we will just lay our hands in our laps." That we cannot do. He said one time that we should work and labor as though we will live here a long time. Still at the same time, live today as though it were the last. If we can do that, as we heard this morning, then we will watch and pray.

In another chapter of Luke's gospel, it says, "Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man." (Luke 21:36)

In the conclusion, it says, "The same day there came certain of the Pharisees, saying unto him, Get thee out, and depart hence: for Herod will kill thee. And he said unto them, Go ye, and tell that fox, Behold, I cast out devils, and I do cures to day and to morrow, and the third day I shall be perfected. Nevertheless I must walk to day and to morrow, and the day following: for it cannot be that a prophet perish out of Jerusalem. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not! Behold, your house is left unto you desolate: and verily I say unto you, Ye shall not see me, until the time come when ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord." (Luke 13:31-35)

He was speaking here to the children of Israel. "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem ... how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not!" (Luke

"How often have I wanted to gather you in, and ye would not." May none that are here, or none that should have been here and are not, be of those that would have to hear those words. But may we be of those that hear, "Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord." (Luke 13:35)

May we search the Lord. May we find the Lord. May we be of those that keep His Word.

The first Psalm says, "Blessed is the man that walked not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But His delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper. The ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away. Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish." (Psalm 1:1-6)

May those words from the Psalmist sink deep into our hearts. May we look to the Lord Jesus Christ for our strength and for our help. Then we will be blessed.

World Relief Haiti

Previous articles in the Silver Lining outlined the focus of the World Relief efforts and the organizations we, as a National Church, work with in Haiti. This article will focus on the experiences in Haiti from the viewpoint of a work team volunteer. While the work, emotions and spiritual experiences of each volunteer is different, the basis of this report is personal experience and discussions with other volunteers over many years.

As with any work undertaken in the vineyard of the Lord, if we approach the work with the humble heart of a servant, God will bless.

The decision to participate: Haiti is a country of contrasting extremes. Side by side, throughout the country is prosperity and poverty, wealth and want, the 21st century and 19th century practices, and a culture steeped in a blend of African roots, French colonialism and modern western influences. When one hears of the great physical need in Haiti, given our abundance in America, we are moved to help. First time participants decide to participate on a work team by this desire to help. Returning work team members are drawn for additional reasons, which is difficult to

place into words. Hopefully as you read further, you will understand the depth of the reasons. Regardless of first time travelers or experienced work team members, the primary decision factor should be prayer. We do not understand the depth of God nor His will for our lives, but if we approach this work in prayer, God will provide direction on our participation.

The work in Haiti is not a vacation. There is a great deal of work to be done. Specialized skills are not necessary for most of the work teams, yet one should be willing to work wherever the needs are and the Lord leads. The work can be hard, especially if you do not routinely perform physical labor. Yet there is always some task available for each person's ability. Likewise, the travel and living conditions in Haiti are vastly different from our lifestyles in the US. When work teams travel to remote villages to work, the accommodations are more primitive than our campgrounds in State Parks.

Preparation for the Trip: Without seeming redundant, the most effective preparation one can focus on is prayer. We make preparation for what to wear, what to leave behind, our tools needed, etc. All reasonable considerations. But if our heart and minds are not in concert with the heart of God, we will miss many blessings on the trip. A first time team member to Haiti recalled looking at the new roof put on a school for a poor rural community, what a wonderful job he and the other

brothers had done, helping these poor and disadvantaged people. God immediately convicted his heart by reminding him that the work is God's and the talents men used to build the roof were given of God.

Arrival in Haiti: Deplaning in Haiti is an experience. Not your modern International Airports, Haiti has one concrete strip used for landing, take off and taxi. Chaos awaits as you pass through immigration, customs and onto the street. This has improved greatly in the past several years, yet upon leaving the terminal building, there is a flock of Haitian workers willing to carry your bags or simply watch your bags; for a fee of course. Traveling in the back of a truck or the newly acquired van, one begins to experience the sites, sounds and smells of Haiti. Roads are rough. In many areas, the pavement on the main roads has been destroyed by heavy use and lack of repair. Throughout most of Haiti, the roads are not paved. Traveling distances which would take one or two hours in the States will take four to eight hours. Some areas are so remote that vehicle travel is impossible. Mule and foot prove to be the most effective way to travel.

The food of the Haitian people is likewise very different. Rice and beans are a staple at every meal. While in the villages, the adventuresome diner can experience many unique foods such as goat, or new ways to


prepare standard foods such as turkey. Fruits abound in the country of Haiti, which always adds a sweet touch to every meal. In the guesthouses in Les Cayes and Port Au Prince, conventional western cuisine is served.

As stated previously the work is hard, yet rewarding. The Haitian people

have a willingness to help, especially when it comes to pounding nails and sawing lumber with power tools. The World Relief work team projects generally consist of installing roofs on schools, building benches, painting and other odd jobs. The agricultural work teams also provide specialized care for the agricultural industry such as conducting seminars, agronomy and animal veterinary care.

The tie that binds: We sing in Hymn 156 "Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian Love; The fellowship of kindred minds is like to that above." A lasting memory of trips to Haiti is the Christian Friendships made. Quite often, many of the work team participants have never met, yet there is that immediate bond of the love of Christ. Reunions and friendships have lasted for many years following a trip. Most importantly is the friendships made with the Haitian people. Though we are very different from the Haitians culturally and economically, we have one important element in common. The shed blood of Jesus brings victory to all peoples of the world. The

Pray that the Caribbean Board be given wisdom to discern the heart of God and make wise choices in the use of His money. Pray that the work team coordinators be of a

humble spirit to lead the teams in accordance with our faith and doctrine. Pray for the work team members to have a safe and blessed trip. Pray that the Haitian people will see Jesus in the lives and hearts of each one of our team members.

A closing scripture sums it up nicely. "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it:" Ps 127:1.



Gateway Woods Illinois Family Services Central Illinois Local Work Team Projects

Over the years, more and more of our people are getting involved in work projects in other countries such as Jamaica, Mexico, and Haiti. Brethren and friends, young and old, have received many blessings as a result of these work team experiences. At the same time, it has been observed that there are also many needs right here in our own communities.

Last year, Illinois Gateway Woods Family Services organized and successfully completed a Local Work Team Project of this type in an attempt to bring the work team experience closer to home without the need for traveling thousands of miles. Arrangements were made for the volunteers to stay together over night at a church family's home simulating the remote work - team experience. Other volunteers furnished the noon and evening meals. The workers had evening devotions with a minister present, just like is practiced in Haiti and Jamaica. The project involved reroofing an older woman's home that had recently adopted her two great grandchildren. The time spent working and fellowshipping was a blessing to all participants.

At the recent Elder Conference, the counseling Elders from both the Illinois Gateway Woods Family Services and World Relief met and approved a proposal for encouraging these local work projects, and the Illinois Gateway Woods Family Services program has been given permission to coordinate a local work project in any of the Central Illinois church communities. Letters have been sent to the Elders offering coordination of such projects, and Elders choosing to participate can initiate an invitation. The projects will follow the same guidelines established for the overseas work teams with regard to who can participate and the expectations for the workers.

We have already been given a van and a job trailer which we hope to fill with tools and travel around Central Illinois this summer using God's people, and our blessings to let our good works so shine before men that they may see our good works and glorify our Father which is in Heaven. We look forward to seeing many of you this summer and thank you in advance for your participation in this exciting opportunity.

The work of the church in Switzerland continues on. Bro. Froehlich has begun establishing congregations based on the Word's messages. As he and other devout, converted brothers preached directly from the Scriptures — and heralded the truths of repentance and conversion — souls in many places began to repent. In time, they were baptized and live unitedly in brotherhood.

In 1947, Henry Michel, a Swiss minister, made a historical presentation at Lake Bloomington, IL. He summarized the origins of Bro. Samuel Froehlich's work, and the subsequent development.

This column ends the European phase of the work of forming new churches.

Establishing Churches

Let me relate a story about Bro. Froehlich: He was hungry at noon and went into a restaurant in a small village to have a meal. He started to speak with the proprietor, a lady. He spoke of the Gospel, and she said, "Oh, I know somebody who is interested; he lives on the next farm."

He went to the next farm and spoke there, and a church was started. He went to the next village where there was a restaurant and a big hall for dancing. Do you know that a dance hall is a wonderful place for a church? It became a church.

These people became converted and changed this dance hall into a church, and it was a church for perhaps 15 years, until it was too small. But that is the way they were working. That is the reason why we have congregations.

They never stayed at home to take it easy. They went on the road, and when they had a call of the Spirit of God, they went long distances in spite of all the dangers. So the Gospel came as well to France. The congregations were increasing, and it was wonderful how everything fit together.

More Preaching

Once a young shoemaker came. This young shoemaker had the name of Andrew Braun. He went to a Swiss place, near the border, and found a job with an established shoemaker. The shoemaker was a believer! During the repairing of shoes and the ham-

mering of the soles, he preached the Gospel to this lad. Andrew was a receptive man. He repented and became converted. He went to Strassburg and was baptized; and afterwards he went to Germany (his home country) to his home town and after a very short while, a church existed in that town.

So the Gospel came to Germany. Is not that wonderful? We can be in a town for 50 years and there is no church. But at that time when they were somewhere, after a few months believers were to be found there. My grandfather had to go there to baptize and later Andrew Braun was made an elder at 22 years because they needed him in that country. He came to Strassburg and was ordained an Elder there. So they went this same evening to my great - grandfather's farm to have a meeting. This farm was near the Rhine. During the winter, the Rhine was overflowing and the road was covered with water. But the one of them was a very ambitious man and the one elder took the other elder on his shoulders and they went through the water.

I am sorry I was not present with a camera at that time taking the picture of one elder having the other elder on his shoulders. I think that would be a marvelous picture. One of the fellow elders of Samuel Froehlich and of my grandfather was the grandfather of David Mangold of Roanoke IL.

Into the Balkan States

It happened that two men — not tailors or shoemakers — but Locksmiths, came to Switzerland. Their names were Denkel and Kropatschek. Coming into Switzerland, they became acquainted with us and came to the assembly and found peace with God. They went back in 1829; and when they had returned, they found a very ambitious and zealous young man called Louis Hencsey.

As soon as they told him of the Gospel, he repented; and he was the one who went to all these countries — Jugoslavia, Hungary and Romania — to bring the Gospel, from one village to the other. Persecution followed — I may say a 100 years of persecution followed — and has still not stopped. That is probably one reason that these churches

were always increasing and that in these countries we had a total of 50,000 - 100,000 members in our congregations there before World War II.

Bro. Josef Bela

So the Gospel came to Austria-Hungary, Jugoslavia, Romania. From one village to the other came the joyful message of Jesus. See how wonderfully the Lord prepared everything! Hencsey himself found another young man whose name was Josef Bela, a very zealous man. And this man had been prepared for you, for America, for the United States! Although Hencsey was not so persecuted, Bela was so fearfully persecuted that he had to leave his country and come to America. He was persecuted terribly day after day.

Do you know how he was kept in jail? They bound hands and feet together and then hung him up on a ring on the wall, so he could neither sit, nor stand nor lie. That is the way he had to be in jail. He suffered so much that even the authorities said, "We cannot watch this anymore; something has to be done." So they gave him the license to emigrate to the United States. But before he emigrated, the jail keeper and his wife were converted. That was in 1861.

They told him that he could emigrate, but that was just for the sake of the public, to make them think that the authorities were being good to him. But they made arrangements that on his arrival at the harbor of Bremen some wicked people would way-lay him and kill him. On the way, by the inspiration of God, just like it was with Joseph, he was warned, and instead of going to Bremen, he went to Hamburg and boarded his ship and went to the United States.

"Response Requested"

At least twice in the Bible, the Lord Jesus Christ made as if He would go past His disciples, indicating that He desires some kind of a response from us.

In Mark 6:48 we read, "And about the fourth watch of the night he cometh unto them, walking upon the sea, and would have passed by them." The disciples were in their boat and about to sink and He would have passed by them. However, in verse 49 we read that the disciples cried out. At least there was a response. In Matthew 14:28 we see that Peter decided he was interested in walking on the sea, storm or no storm. He did all right at first, but then failed and began to sink. Jesus helped him because he had responded. Jesus also quieted the storm.

After the resurrection, the Lord Jesus Christ joined two of His disciples as they walked on the road to Emmaus. We read in Luke 24:28, "And they drew nigh unto the village, whither they went: and he made as though he would

have gone further." Once again, Jesus kept walking, waiting for a response. This time the disciples did not cry out but they constrained Him and said, "Abide with us." (vs. 29). That was their response. We read further, "And he went in to tarry with them."

It appears that the Lord Jesus Christ desires to receive an invitation from us for Him to come and help us. In Revelation 3:20 we read, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him and will sup with him, and he with me." Here no mention is made of Christ walking past us but at least He is not trying to force open that door. A sister in our church in the States once told me that she did not choose or decide to repent but that the power of God came upon her to such an extent that she had to repent. There is some scripture for that. We read in Luke 14:23, "Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." The Holy Spirit may sometimes operate in this manner, but there is no indication that Jesus Christ, God's Son, came on that strong in offering us His assistance or salvation. The ministry of God's Son and the ministry of the Holy Spirit may be different.

In John 6:67 we read, "Then said Jesus unto the twelve, Will ye also go away?" From the previous verse we learn that many of His disciples walked no more with Him. He didn't beg His twelve disciples to stay with Him but simply asked if they also would go away. This was right after He had exhorted the people that they should eat His flesh and drink His blood in order to have eternal life. This was a spiritual teaching that His broken body and His shed blood was necessary for their salvation.

The Lord Jesus Christ is walking by. By His actions He is saying to us, "Do you desire my fellowship or do you want to go alone? Response requested."
