"THE LIGHT OF JESUS SETS US FREE"

Sermon by Elder Bro. Wes Knapp, Goodfield, IL Judges 7 and John 8:12-59

Loved ones, we have read a few verses together and it is a tremendous amount of comfort and encouragement to every one of us. We could have read the whole chapter, but my eyes fell on verse twelve when I first opened this. "I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." John 8:12. We are in a time and we are in a situation like we have never been in before in our life. We have a beautiful opportunity today to be encouraged to stay in this Light. If we are truly walking with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, we are not walking in darkness. If we are truly walking with our Lord and Jesus Christ, we are in the Light.

Now we can be so thankful that we do have that Light shining in us, because as the days proceed, we don't know what they have to offer. But we do have that beautiful, beautiful Light that we can have confidence to know that irregardless of what they are, there is that glorious end to each one of our lives that some day every one of us gathered here can enter those realms of heaven. Brother Jeff shared that with us this morning and how true that is. Sometimes we can kind of take it for granted and sometimes we can kind of let it pass over us, but we are in reality now.

I was reading in the paper, I think it was yesterday, when in the town of Bloomington, the increase of people going to church is from twenty to sixty percent more than they ever had. Bibles and Bible story books are being sold at an increasing rate. They have never seen anything like it before. People have gotten their eyes open and they do not realize what is ahead of them but realize not knowing not realizing what is ahead of us. There is evidently a degree of concern and perhaps fear in the hearts of many, many people. Lately, there should be.

I just hope for the American people for our nation, this is not foxhole religion. When things get tough, we have a tendency to turn to God. Brothers, sisters and friends, we need to stay on track and stay tuned to God every day of our life, even when things get better quickly and it doesn't look like they are going to. But we do have a God in heaven who knows our hearts and knows our desires and how thankful we are that we have this God in heaven who is looking over us. It is pretty evident in the very new future there might be an invasion in Afghanistan.

I am not here to preach the world situation but it does tie in. If that invasion takes place, you can well believe that we here in America might come under some things that we have never ever seen in our country before. We have been witness to that nearly three weeks ago. We haven't even begun to see what could happen in our country with the way the things are going on in the world—the terrorists. Evidently they are planted throughout a lot of nations in the world just waiting to strike and we do not know where that strike may be. Where will you be tomorrow? Where will I be tomorrow? If the electricity is out, not just a power failure for a few hours or a few days, I am talking about the electricity out and gone!

Light From The Word



Nominal Christendom espouses the philosophy that if you accept the Lord Jesus Christ you will be saved. It is true that we must be willing to accept the instructions of the Lord and to have faith to accept the redeeming power of the shed blood of Jesus Christ. We also need to be willing to accept the instructions of the Word of God and to be willing to accept responsibility for our behavior. There is, however, no scripture in the King James version of the Holy Bible that gives us hope of salvation by merely "accepting Christ". There are many scriptural passages that instruct us that we must follow His teaching in order to prepare ourselves so He will accept us.

There are many passages of scripture that contain the exhortation "except ye". "Except" when used in this manner means "unless". Therefore, when scriptural instructions are accompanied by "except ye", there is a requirement that must be fulfilled if we want to gain the acceptance of the Lord.

In the Old Testament account of the defeat of the children of Israel by the men of Ai, Joshua asked the Lord why they were not delivered from their enemies. The Lord told Joshua that there was sin in the camp and He would not "...be with you any more, except ye destroy the accursed from among you" (Jos. 7:12). Sin separates us from God. Only if we are willing to remove sin from our lives can we have confidence that the Lord will be with us and bless us. It was not until Achan and the forbidden goods were destroyed that the fierceness of the anger of the Lord was turned away from the children of Israel.

There are numerous instructions in the New Testament that are just as definite. In response to a comment about some who had lost their lives in terrible circumstances, Jesus said "...except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). Therefore, the scripture is very clear that repentance is a requirement for salvation. This is reinforced by the teachings of the disciples after Christ's resurrection. "Repent ye, therefore...that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord;" (Acts 3:19).

Except Ye...

Jesus also made it clear that we must become converted and turn away from sin. When the disciples asked Jesus who would be the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven he said "...Except ye be converted...ye shall not enter into the kingdom of Heaven" (Mt. 18:3)

This concept is reinforced in numerous passages throughout the scriptures. Peter was told that after he was converted, he was to strengthen his brethren (Lk. 22:32). In one of Peter's sermons he instructed his listeners that they should "Repent... and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out..." (Acts 3:19).

Repentance and conversion are necessary steps to become a child of God. There are additional requirements. Christ told Nicodemus that "...Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (Jn. 3:5). Nicodemous could not understand this. Christ explained that it was the love and power of God that made it possible. From the human point of view this certainly seemed impossible, but from God's point of view it is not difficult for those who will love and serve Him.

We can be born again and have our sins buried in the death of Jesus Christ because "...God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved" (Jn. 3:16-17).

After the death and burial of the old sinful nature, there must be fruit. In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explained that it was not enough to appear to be righteous and to outwardly follow the commandments. In a statement that must have been shocking to those who were listening, Jesus said to the multitude, "...except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven" (Mt. 5:20). Most people thought the scribes and Pharisees were righteous, but clearly they were condemned because they laid heavy burdens on "...men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers" (Mt. 23:4). To be of value, righteous appearance and words must be accompanied by righteous behavior. It is not enough to merely look and speak like a child of God. There must also be fruit.

We are also commanded to remember that Jesus willingly gave His life to pay the price for our sins. "...Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you" (Jn. 6:53). We must be so much "at one" with Christ that we must take part in His suffering and death by being in communion with Him and our brethren.

Faithfulness is also required. After we have received the blessings of repentance, conversion and baptism, we must continue to remain in His service: "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me" (Jn. 15:4). We must be committed to be faithful to God as long as we live. We cannot be as the dog that "...is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire" (II Peter 2:22).

We must be willing to give all for the Lord. "Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit" (Jn. 12:24). Jesus gave His life for us. We must be willing to dedicate our lives to Him.

Our service to God must be complete and without reservation. If we do not serve the Lord consistently, we send a very confusing message. Paul instructed the Corinthians that "...except they give a distinction in the sounds,...who shall prepare himself to the battle?...likewise ye, except ye utter by the tongue words easy to be understood, how shall it be known what is spoken?..." (I Cor. 14:7-9).

Not every issue that is important to be a child of God has been included here. God has provided us with an opportunity to learn what is necessary for salvation. We must be willing to search the scripture and to submit to His plan so He can accept us into His kingdom.

The Mission Committee is the arm of the Church with the responsibility of carrying out the goals and purposes of spreading the gospel.

This committee was first established at a conference in Bluffton, Indiana in 1958. Presently 9 elder brothers serve in carrying out its functions.

The Mission Committee works in cooperation with the World Relief Committee to meet spiritual and humanitarian needs around the world.

Before reaching beyond the local level with the gospel, there must be a firm foundation built upon hearts cleansed by the shed blood of Jesus Christ. Therefore, the primary effort of the church is to communicate the gospel through the example of a sanctified life with a ready testimony of what Christ has accomplished.

Having experienced the blessings of the love of God and fellowship within our brotherhood, we extend our hands of love and mercy toward all mankind, in fulfillment of the scripture which says...

...Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. MARK 16:15-16

How it is funded

The Mission fund is dependent upon contributions from Apostolic Christian congregations as well as other generous individuals. Collections are taken up on the local level, the funds being forwarded to the secretarytreasurer.

In recent months, donations have leveled off. This comes at a time when our opportunities for spreading the gospel message are rapidly increasing. There are always more needs than available resources.

The Mission Committee counsels together as often as necessary,

discusses requests and projects, and appropriates the funds. Any work which is considered to be of a spiritual, as opposed to humanitarian effort goes through this committee.

The primary goal of Apostolic Christian World Relief is to provide humanitarian aid and volunteer labor to alleviate human misery and suffering throughout the world. World Relief projects provide blessed opportunities to serve our Lord by sharing our resources and abilities to benefit both the soul and body of those in need. Work teams have opened the door for participation by many brothers, sisters, and friends and involve helping those in the USA, as well as in foreign lands.

Many have made experiences that have altered their priorities in life and brought new appreciation for the teachings of Christ. The World Relief Committee works in cooperation with the Mission Committee to meet humanitarian and spiritual needs around the world.

May God richly bless every effort as we seek to work in unity to serve others by meeting human needs and thereby communicate the love of God through His Son, Jesus Christ.

How Projects are Selected and Funded

Collections are taken on the local level, and forwarded to the national World Relief Treasurer. The World Relief Committee meets on a regular basis to review existing programs and evaluate new ones. Funds are then allocated to finance approved projects. The World Relief Committee communicates these projects to the churches through local representatives.

Four counseling elders serve as chairman and vice-chairmen. Twelve other brothers are chosen as regional committeemen from areas representing our brotherhood across the nation. This committee sets policy for the entire organization.

Serving under the direction of the World Relief Committee are five boards based on geographic areas: Caribbean, European, Mexico, India and US, each of which is chaired by a member of the national committee. These boards manage projects, sending material aid and work teams in response to needs. The Child Sponsorship Board and the Distribution Center Coordinators board also are under the direction of the World Relief Committee.

As is often the case in humanitarian efforts, needs far exceed our ability to assist the unfortunate. The World Relief Committee endeavors to assist those who need it the most, prayerfully considering each case. They rely upon your prayers and support. Funds are disbursed in the following areas:

USA

- Helping rebuild and send materials to areas throughout the country devastated by floods, earthquakes, fires, droughts or storms.
- Material aid for prison ministries, children's homes, halfway houses, and food pantries.
- Distribution centers to inventory and distribute clothing, food and medicines.

Europe

- Food, supplies, medicines and self-help for Ukraine, Yugoslavia, Romania, Croatia and other countries.
- Vehicles for transportation and distributing food.

Caribbean

 Work teams in Haiti and Jamaica for trade schools, medical assistance, water well drilling, food distribution, veterinarian and agriculture assistance.

Mexico

- Medical/dental work teams.
- Home construction work teams.
- Lunch programs and health kits for disadvantaged families.

India

• Oversight of Rural Gospel and Medical Missions providing humanitarian aid for food, medical needs, orphanage buildings, and education.

How Can | Be involved?

Sewing, Crafts and Soap Making There are many opportunities on a local level to make quilts, bandages, layette kits, sewing clothing and several essential craft items. Tons of soap are made each year, and shipped to needy countries. There's work for everyone!

Distribution Centers

Many opportunities exist for personal assistance in our seven Distribution Centers, sorting clothing for distribution, repairing furniture, packaging food and medicines as well as other items.

Child Sponsorship Program

An opportunity to be directly involved in the lives of children born in economically distressed areas of the world.

Work Teams

Work teams are organized frequently for projects in the U.S., Haiti, Jamaica, and Mexico. Schedules are published to give volunteers the opportunity for service.

Representatives

Each local congregation has its own representative. This is a vital link in our chain of service. He can provide answers to questions about the opportunities mentioned above.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN COUNSELING SERVICES Part IV - Professional Counseling

"Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ." *Galatians 6:2*

One component of Apostolic Christian Counseling Services is professional counseling that occurs at the office in Morton. The office is located at 73 East Queenwood Road in Morton, IL. Because of the location of the office, most of the clients seen at ACCS are from Central Illinois. However, at times, individuals travel to Central Illinois for a one-time consultation visit.

Members or friends of the church who want to enquire about counseling services can call the toll free number 877-370-9988. This number can also be found in the minister book and in the Silver Lining. All calls coming into ACCS are answered by an automated voice-mail system. The person making the call is asked to leave a message with information about how to contact them. All information left on the automated system is completely confidential. One of the counselors will return the call within 24 hours to talk about the type of services needed.

Before setting up the first appointment, the counselors talk with interested individuals about what their needs are, how urgent the concern is, and how closely it is related to doctrinal or spiritual issues. If there are currently no openings in the counselors' schedules, the caller must decide whether to go on the ACCS waiting list or to accept a referral to another counseling service. Usually these services are local counseling practices that have met with ACCS staff and been educated about specific Apostolic Christian Church doctrine and practices so that they can provide services in a supportive way.

When someone comes to the office for counseling, they are asked to complete a number of forms common to any professional service. These are used to develop a treatment plan, coordinate with medical providers and provide mailing and billing information.

The number of times a client is seen for counseling entirely depends on the individual needs of the person. Some people may only be seen once or twice while others may be seen regularly for a year or more. The frequency of appointments (i.e. weekly, monthly, etc.) will also vary by the client and the counselor.

Services to clients include teaching and reinforcing the application of Biblical truths to life, education and treatment for concerns like depression and anxiety and teaching new skills to help couples and families communicate and understand each other better. The need for a physician to assess medication and medical concerns is also considered.

The issues that clients discuss in counseling are kept confidential in accordance with the law. However, sometimes it is helpful to work directly with a person's Elder/minister or with a family member. In these cases if the client is willing to sign a release of information, the counselor will involve others in the counseling process.

The Apostolic Christian Church Elders have always had the responsibility of assisting people with mental health and relationship problems in the course of shepherding their churches. They have sought to better understand the needs of people in their churches and to support them in a way that encourages their spiritual soundness. Over time there has been a growing recognition that in some cases it can be helpful to seek out professional counseling to address some of these problems.

Naturally, Elders are concerned about whether a professional counselor will support a struggling person in their faith. Some Elders have found professional counselors in their communities that they have been comfortable referring people to. However, at other times there have been concerns raised about the counsel given by certain counselors.

One of the main reasons for the creation of ACCS came because people wanted the assurance that their faith would be respected by the counselors they work with. The development of the counseling services was a specific response to those concerns. Since ACCS opened March 1, 2000, there has been a very positive response to ACCS offering professional counseling.

"I am the light of the world." That is what Jesus said. So if it would go out, you and I need to realize that Jesus Christ is the Light of the world. He is the bright and shining Light that we can look to. Let us not just look to Him now when things are a little bit tough. We should have been looking at Him every day of our life and we need to continue to look to Him, because He is our only hope. He is the only refuge irregardless of what might happen.

You can say, "Wes, that is pretty easy for you to say." It is, but it is a lot harder to live, isn't it? Let us take courage. We have a God in heaven, so lean on Him and He will stand beside us. Maybe it will cost us our life, I don't know. You don't know. But the ultimate of your soul and my soul, where can it go? Where is it going? Where would it be tomorrow if something disastrous would happen right now? But that answer isn't heaven. I have some work to do. I need to get to the Light. We need to come into the Light. He promises that if we stand in the Light, we won't walk in darkness. Let us not let the darkness come by candle light. We staggered around and we didn't know where we were going. Some of us stumbled and fell and we had to pick ourselves back up. We had to get on track. We don't want that anymore, do we?

We can be encouraged — so encouraged! — by the Word of God when He said, "...he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." John 8:12. Not this physical life, but the spiritual life we are talking about here—that life that is going to last for an eternity. Not one that is going to last sixty, seventy, eighty, ninety and maybe one hundred years old. That is not the life we are talking about. We just use that life to prepare for the spiritual life for eternity.

I don't have so many concerns about myself, but for our children and our grandchildren. I don't know what they will have to go through. I don't know what I am going to have to go through yet.

It just really hit me. "I am the Light of the world." It doesn't say just us here in Goodfield. It doesn't say the Apostolic Christian faith. He said the Light of the world — the whole world is entitled to this Light. They didn't believe Him. There were so many that did not believe Him. There were so many in the past right here in our own nation that did not believe Jesus Christ. They were probably going to church and might have even confessed themselves as to be Christians, but I don't know whether they believed and that is not for me to judge because God is going to judge them.

But there is something happening that all these people are beginning to see the church is the place where they should be going, and not the golf course, or watching the TV, or ball games or whatever it might be. They finally decided, "I had better go back to church. I had better get close to God." There is something lacking. Brothers and sisters, that should not be lacking in our lives. I don't want to walk a life without God. We have that beautiful heritage. Church should be our priority. Reading the Word should be our priority. Is it? What about God shining from our light? What are you? We are a minority.

God opened the door to the Book of Judges. Evidently there were twenty-two thousand and it was narrowed down to ten thousand. Finally it was narrowed down to three hundred and they were in three companies of one hundred and they overcame. God was with them. They were victorious, if you will remember compared to the world. Brothers and sisters, we can be victorious! We are going to be victorious over other nations and over other countries. That is not the victory we are talking about. We can be victorious over the spiritual death of our soul. That should turn a light on for every one of us.

As we sit here today, I know that I am on the winning side. I know that my God and my Saviour Jesus Christ lives and I want to be committed to that winning team! Most of us have taken the opportunity to be a soldier of that winning team. Let us stick with it because we know that is the only way that is going to win. Nation against nation, kingdom against kingdom, we don't know who is going to win. But we know who the winner of our spiritual soul is going to be. We make ourselves available and that is Jesus Christ and God. That is where our victory is at!

"Thy Word, O Lord, forever is a mirror where we see." That is why we come to church. That is why God parts the pages for us. We SILVER LINING

don't come with a prepared sermon. I didn't know what was going to be opened this afternoon. Brother Jeff didn't know what was going to be opened this morning. It really didn't make any difference, but the Word of God is new every time we open it. "Our faults and duties as they are, are likeness unto Thee." The wrath of God lies on the world. On those thousands that laid on, and three hundred conquered them.

"The wrath of God lies on the world on whom its ways pursue. Yet, grace enough is found in God to live in him anew."

That is the calling that you and I have today, to live in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ anew. Just because we happen to consider ourselves members of this precious faith, we don't have it made vet. We don't have it made yet, and we won't have until we enter those realms of heaven and Jesus Christ can meet us there and He says, "Come in, good and faithful servant, come in." How sad it is going to be and I hope not one assembled here this afternoon will have to hear the words, "Sorry. I don't know you." That is going to be sad. You know, loved ones, it is going to be for eternity. There is going to be no time to turn around. There is going to be no time to make any changes. That is over with. You have to make up your minds right now to come to the Light.

Verse twenty-one, "Then said Jesus again unto them, I go my way, and ye shall seek me, and shall die in your sins: whither I go, ye cannot come." John 8:21. Kind of sad, isn't it? There are people in the world who let Jesus Christ go by and not acknowledge Him for what He is. In the attack day, and what was happening then, that is what Jesus was trying to tell them. He said, "I am here. I am walking with you. You see the miracles and you have a partial belief in me, but not completely." He said, "You are going to die in your sins." Because the other day, there was something there in their lives that was maybe a little bit more important to them than Jesus Christ.

We can be encouraged if you will today. Do not let anything come in our lives that is more important than Jesus Christ because I tell you if there is, it is an idol. It really is. It is an idol. I am not going to point them out. We have various idols. We probably all do but it can be an idol to us. We have to put ourselves in perspective. Who are we? What do we think we are? Who created us? We are absolutely nothing here on this earth. Sure, we got jobs and we like to think we are something and I guess we are. We are trying to do God's work. aren't we?

"Ye are from beneath; I am from above: ye are of this world; I am not of this world." John 8:23. Jesus was trying to show them. He said, "I am not of this world. I was in heaven and God sent Me down here to help you people get to heaven. You are from heaven. You were created from heaven. You have mothers and you have fathers." He said, "I am from above. God sent Me. You don't understand that." Do we? Beyond a doubt? Do we?

"I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am he, ye shall die in your sins." John 8:24. That is a concern, and it is probably going out to part of the world today. Do we really believe in the atoning blood of Jesus Christ, and that alone? Or, are we trying to climb up some other way to enter in, rather than through the doorway of Jesus Christ and His atoning blood? If we are, we are the same as a thief and a robber. We know that a thief, robber or liar will not get to heaven. Plain facts. Written in the Word. If we believe the Word, we believe that.

Jesus goes on and said, "I have many things to say and to judge of you: but he that sent me is true; and I speak to the world those things which I have heard of him." John 8:26. This isn't Jesus' words; He was inspired by God even though He was the Son of God. He said, "I am telling you what God wants me to tell you." Think of it. This is taking a little more elevation. He is sharing with you and me this afternoon what God wants us to know. It is written in red letters and that is what we believe to be what Jesus said. He was inspired by God to show those people and to show you and me that this is what God wants us to know, to believe on my Son, Jesus Christ and you will have the Light of the world.

"And he that sent me is with me: the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him." John 8:29. Brothers, sisters, friends and entire congregation, I don't know what is going to happen this week. It doesn't look good, but we have confidence. We can be encouraged that God our Father will be with us irregardless of what we are doing, irregardless of what might

If we will make ourselves adaptable to Him, He is going to continue to love us and He will love us wherever we are at. We can be one of those three hundred that overcame those thousands. We can be overcomers just as Jesus Christ was an overcomer of death and grave. He is at the right hand of God the Father.

We have no privilege to ask to be at the right hand or the left hand. God just help me to get to heaven. "If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:31-32. I will let you at that. There was a lot that we read. One of these other brothers can finish it up. Do you want to be free in slavery? Do you want to be free as a prisoner? Do you want to be free in a country where maybe our luxuries are going to be taken away? We can be free. We can be free if we go to that Light of Jesus Christ and irregardless of what might happen in the very near future. If there is an invasion and if there is a counter attack in America, our power plants, our refineries, whatever it might be that might really jeopardize this nation as a whole, and it wouldn't take that many things to really bring this nation down to its knees. Brothers and sisters, let us be encouraged and let us take this encouragement with us every day of our lives that Jesus Christ said, "I am the Light of the world." We will not be in darkness.

Light...heaven...darkness...hell...for my soul...for your soul...for an eternity. Let us take courage and let us be encouraged by God's Holy Word.

In this instance, a letter is shown written by Elder Isaac Gehring of Sardis, OH. It is dated December 9, 1892, and is directed to a family in Wayne County, OH (the Rittman area).

In this letter, Bro. Gehring refers to when he formerly walked from Sardis, OH, to the Rittman, OH, area.

In our Lord and Savior, Dear Beloved Brother,

With a heart's desire I wish to visit you with a letter as a sign of love, which love is by the Holy Spirit imparted to us. So I wish you and the dear sister in Christ, your wife, like unto myself and all the saints there and in our place of abode, God's rich grace, His peace and love betide the good communion of His Holy Spirit, for a hearty greeting.

Dear Brother, I received your letter of the 24th of November. It was a blessing and consolation and joy in spirit. Yea, our precious faith that we have in common is so loving that we by it can have a foretaste of Heaven. Joy which the blest can feel, like the poet writes, "Joy that the world does not know."

I thank the Lord and you for your blessed writing. Not so, though we are not acquainted with each other personally, just the same we love each other with a sincere brotherly love, for we are true children of the Heavenly Father and have the same Savior and Redeemer who is not ashamed to call us His brethren. And we are all members of His Holy Body; by one spirit baptized into Christ's Body, notwithstanding who we were before, and so in the Spirit we can visit each other, even if it cannot be in person.

Of course, it would be more perfect, but as it cannot be, we will be satisfied the way the Lord has left it for us and will strive to help each other to be true and faithful so we can enter into the promised rest which is promised to the children of God. Where there will be no more parting, where there will be well resting on the bosom of our Heavenly Father, and where the earthly children will forget their pains and sorrows.

Yea, the suffering of this earthly life is only a moment compared to the long eternity. The author of Psalms writes, "The evening long lasts the weeping, but joy in the morning," and this has now come to pass with our dear sister Roth, whom we buried last Sunday (a week ago). Who thirty years and two months was sick, which can be looked on as an evening of long weeping. With a strong desire, she was waiting for this morning where she in the evening said, "In this night the Lord will come." Yea, He came towards the morning, where not only the morning star arose for her, but also the full day of Eternity and the blessed rest. Oh, such a home going; it is so beautiful, also, for such who are left behind - it shall be an inspiration to us to be true and faithful that we may then all be counted with the countless throng.

Last year I had a faint hope that I could visit you dear ones, but this hope soon faded; my leg got worse all

the time, besides other ailments. Oh, I know we could enjoy each other in the Lord and I would be heartily welcome. Some 35, 36, 37 years ago I used to walk when there were no trains to ride, but those times were also blessed times. The Lord gave me strength and inspiration, and I am glad I did go and so it always fills my heart with joy when I can hear that it is well with all the dear ones in Wayne County – and that there are still souls that come to the Lord.

I was also joyful for the dear young Sister Horn. I knew both of her parents also; slept by dear Brother Horn on the place where Brother and Sister Levi Steiner now live. At that time, Sister Beery lived there. I think it will be 35 years this winter. I will never forget that time Sister Horn and Sister Sommers were baptized; not far from Kansas or Flint where I waited a week on Sister Sommers. During the week I was at Schye's. On Sunday there was not enough room there.

I was young and could walk good. Now I am like an old horse which at any time may break down. But if I only then can receive a house not made with hands from God; Eternity which from all my heart I wish for myself and all the true and faithful, I will be satisfied. If I can live till January 19, 1893, I will be 74. Usually I can go to church yet. Oh yes, dear ones, if we as dear children follow our Lord, then we can as you mentioned, join in the hymn #145 Zion's Harp, "Our Lot is Found in Pleasant Places."

"Confidence" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

When I was in elementary school, we were taught, "Knocking out the 't'." We were taught that we shouldn't think that we "can" do something but that we "can" do something. It is important that both children and adults have confidence, not only to achieve, but also for their emotional well-being and for self-worth.

In Isaiah 30:15 we find the words, "In quietness and in confidence shall be your strength." This quiet confidence is a powerful force, for good and for health.

In regard to confidence, there are two extremes. Those who think they can't do anything and those who think they can do everything. Both extremes are dangerous.

The Bible teaches that human life is sacred. Matthew 10:30, "The very hairs of your head are all numbered." Therefore, we should teach all people that they are precious and of great value. In this way we should encourage those who lack confidence. Even a severely handicapped person teaches the rest of us to have patience and understanding.

Those people who think they can do everything are probably a greater danger. Over-confidence sank the Titanic and Hitler's over-confidence that Germany would rule all of Europe for the next one thousand years, brought on World War II. It is important that we all realize that without God's approval and blessing, none of us can do anything. James 4:15, "For that ye ought to say, 'If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that.""

Clearly, our confidence should be in the Lord and not in ourselves. Proverbs 14:26 "In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence." In the church, if we are overly confident, we may think that God has called us to set others straight. However, if our confidence is in God rather than in ourselves, we are apt to kindly and lovingly point out things in the scripture that may be neglected by some of the brethren. We should never put ourselves above anyone else. "In lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves." Philippians 2:3

The question may arise as to how the leaders in a church can keep order if they don't put themselves above the congregation. It is my understanding that leaders in the church are to exhort and admonish with all long suffering by explaining and teaching what God says in His Word. What you think and what I think really doesn't carry much weight.

In the case of a judge out in society, he must make his decision based on what is written in the law of the land, not on what he thinks.
