Sermon by Brother Loren Schrenk, St. Louis, MO

#### Jeremiah 52:1-16 and James 2

The scriptures must be examined with respect to the judgment of God, with respect to the revelation of God, with respect to the guiding of the Spirit. The scriptures are to be taken as a whole, not one small part to be taken out of context and used to justify our actions.

Now the apostle here shows us how the simple truths, the simple principles of God are to be applied in specific instances. Christ said. "On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Matt. 22:40). "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment." (Matt. 22:37-38). And we should have no other gods before Him. That is the first principle. It is always the first principle. It was the first principle in the Commandments. It was Christ's principal when He said He submitted Himself to God and all the things He spoke came from God. He honored God. And He said the second is like unto it, "...Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself..." (James 2:8).

So the Apostle James here shows us how to apply these things. If we perfectly understood those two principles, we would not need the rest of the scriptures. We would not need the advice of the apostles. The church would not need the advice of the apostles. The Corinthians would not have been misled. The

Galatians would not have been misled. We would not have conflict within the church. The church would be perfect. There would be total love but also perfect understanding. But because we are not fully spiritual, God continues to work with us and to instruct us. We have instructions given through the Spirit to us by the scriptures, by faithful brothers, by their examples and by their words.

Here the Apostle James uses the principle of "Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them..." (Matt. 7:12) to examine our actions with respect – or the actions of at least of the church, and we can look in our own hearts – with respect to riches in this life. Apparently there was a problem in the church in general.

This is written "...to the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad..." (James 1:1). This is written to the brethren of Jesus Christ. These twelve tribes, whether he meant only those that were Jewish and saved by the faith in Christ or whether he meant that we are as spiritual Israel, which is probably what he meant. But an any rate this is written to believers.

He talks about in the church there was a problem perhaps in some of the places where those who were wealthy were treated differently than those who were poor. This is not a new thing with the church of God at that time. It is not a new thing in our society. It is observed in many societies.

I just got finished reading about Job. Job bemoans the fact that whenever he was wealthy he had the same spirit in him but men deferred to him and they asked for his advice. They treated him with respect (Job 29). And he said, then when he became poor, the sons of the vil-

#### All Things Work Together for Good

"And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Ro. 8:28). "In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (I Thes. 5:18). These are such beautiful and comforting verses of scripture when everything is going well. They are verses that all of us want to believe and apply fully to our lives. However, at a time of tragedy they can be difficult verses to embrace.

Nearly all of us at one time or another have had situations come into our lives where we have felt a heavy burden or serious heartache. When the situation passes and time brings an element of healing we can see that the experience did enable us to increase our faith by the grace of God.

But what do we do when we or a loved one face a situation where we know that there is virtually no chance for a speedy recovery? There are situations in which there seems to be no way out. How do we take comfort or how do we encourage others when there is not much hope of a brighter day? The death of a loved one who did not appear to make preparation for eternity, an accident that leaves a permanent and nearly total disability, or parents who face incredibly painful situations in raising their children are situations that do not appear to give much hope for relief.

When we are not the one who faces the affliction it might be rather easy for us to use the opening verses to encourage others. While we certainly need to use scriptures to encourage each other, we must be careful that we do not demonstrate a lack of compassion toward those who are suffering.

There are examples in the scripture that describe situations where men of God found themselves in situations in which they felt they had no hope. King David, who was described as a man after God's heart, at times felt completely deserted. He uttered words that are virtually identical to Christ's words on the cross: "My God, my God why hast thou

forsaken me..." (Ps. 22:1)? There was a time that he felt so low he said "...But I am a worm, and no man..." (Ps. 22:6).

Elijah was so discouraged that he "sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die: and said "...It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers" (I Ki. 19:4). Moses, Job, Joshua and others in the Old Testament also experienced times of distress and doubt.

Even John the Baptist experienced doubt. While in prison, knowing that his work was nearly complete, he questioned if Jesus was the Christ. He sent two disciples to ask Jesus "...Art thou he that should come, or do we look for another?" (Mt. 11:3). In time of deep distress John needed to be reassured that Jesus was the Christ and that the power of God was manifest in Him. At the time of His crucifixion, even Jesus felt deserted when He cried out "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani, which is, being interpreted, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Mk. 15:34).

If some of the most faithful servants of God struggled from time to time, we undoubtedly will also face situations which bring doubt. How do we encourage someone who is facing extreme difficulty?

The scriptures provide us with a wide variety of options when we try to comfort those in need. When someone is in deep distress, it is very helpful to share encouraging scriptures with them. God allowed Moses to see his back parts, but not His face, when Moses needed extra strength (Ex. 33:23). In blessing the children of Israel Moses reminded them that God "...shall thrust out the enemy from before thee;..." (Deut. 33:27). David, though often distressed, wrote "...in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his pavilion:..." (Ps. 27:5) and "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Ps. 46:1).

Jesus, after telling Peter that he would deny his master three times, comforted him when He said, "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me" (Jn. 14:1). At that time Jesus knew His disciples needed comfort. He also knew there were occasions when it was necessary to "...upbraid(ed) them with their unbelief and hardness of heart;..." (Mk. 16:14). Jesus knew when to upbraid and when to encourage. We also need to work on learning to discern when someone needs chastisement and when they need encouragement, and then follow the appropriate scriptures.

If a sincere soul is trying to do God's will and they are carrying a grievous burden, they hardly need to be made to feel even worse by inappropriately using scripture that will add to their burden. Paul recognized that there will be times when we are almost overcome by distress when he wrote "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed;" (II Cor. 4:8-9).

It is not a sin to feel heavily burdened at times. It is not that we do not trust God. It is more likely that a soul is simply going through a time of struggle that will ultimately make him stronger and he needs to be encouraged.

We do not always understand why we face certain trials. We are sometimes allowed to go through difficult situations when, from our perspective, it may not make sense. We do not always see accurately but the time will come when we will. "For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known" (I Cor. 13:12).

If we can encourage and uphold others as they go through dark valleys of distress, if we can help them retain a measure of faith when all seems helpless, if we can provide a measure of hope when there seems to be none, then by the grace of God, the time will come that they can see that all things do work together for good and that we can give thanks in everything.



As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:10

### Child Sponsorship in Juarez Mexico

The Apostolic Christian World Relief Child Sponsorship Program began in 1998. Its purpose is to give members and friends of the Apostolic Christian Churches an opportunity to be involved in the lives of children in economically distressed areas of the world.

The program provides opportunity for sponsorship for children in Haiti, Jamaica, and Mexico. This month's article focuses on one of the participating schools, Granjas in Juarez, Mexico.

### Love is a universal language

The children that are sponsored in Juarez, Mexico are truly precious in His sight. Their enthusiastic personalities radiate love and warmth. Love is such a universal language and one realizes this when meeting children from another country who can't speak English.

When one visits the school located in a community called Granjas, the children stop focusing on their school work and focus on the visitor. We found it best to visit during recess where we received hugs, coins, drawings and candy.

What sacrificial love these children exemplified. None of these children have the luxuries that children in the states have, and yet they were willing to give us everything they possess in their pockets and book bags!

#### History of the school

The school began several years ago because Chito and Lydia Aguilar saw this as an opportunity to share the love of Jesus to local children and their families. Chito and Lydia are the Mexican missionaries that World Relief has been working with in Juarez since the late 1980's.

We began sponsoring students at this school in September 2001. We currently sponsor 110 students, but the school has grown and there is potential to sponsor more students.



#### Classrooms and students

There are eight classrooms of students ranging from preschool age through grade six. The rooms are painted a brilliant white and each has a dry erase board. The classrooms look so inviting! Some of the desks are the same style as the ones in Haiti. They can be used as a desk or a bench and they accommodate more students than traditional desks.

The children are fed a hot lunch several days each week and they pack their lunch on the other days. The children wear uniforms to school everyday. We purchase shirts for all the students and pants for the boys. This fall, the girls will be wearing culottes and jumpers that have been sewn by our World Relief sewing ladies. At Christmas time, we ask the sponsors to give a little extra for a sweater that matches. The children look so nice and clean!

#### A new building is provided

Just before school began in the fall of 2001, the old building burned to the ground. We know that God's timing is always perfect, but in our

finite minds, this seemed like a big step backward. School began that fall in a very small, rented 4 room house and in 2 rooms of an existing medical clinic. To see 100 students in 6 small rooms was something to remember. The kindergarten room had a dirt floor and the stench in that room was awful. However, the children were smiling and anxious to learn! Several of us had packed children's clothing in our luggage and the teachers distributed the clothing so every child had at least one "new" thing. They were so appreciative. You would have thought it was Christmas.

At this time, the school is in a brand new community building that was built by World Relief funds and workers this past spring.

#### Blessings of sponsorships

We feel that these children are very blessed to have sponsors here in the United States. They have someone praying for them here and the students are encouraged to pray for their sponsors. Because they are sponsored, they have other advantages over other children in their neighborhoods.

Most importantly, they hear the Word of God everyday. Secondly, they are being taught English, which hopefully will broaden their job opportunities as they reach adulthood. We are grateful to every sponsor and we trust God to lead these children into repentance and then a dedicated life of service to further His kingdom.

# Apostolic Christian Church in San Diego

Services in the San Diego area began in mid 1983 for those of the Altadena, CA congregation that lived in the San Diego area. They were held once a month in the home of Brother Victor Jevremov. Ministers from Altadena, Phoenix, and Tucson served the congregation.

The frequency of the services was increased to twice a month, and alternated between Bro. Victor Jevremov's and Bro Peter Petrovic's homes. Attendance was bolstered by several families that moved to the area from the Midwest.

#### **Facility rented**

As regular attendance increased, it was decided to rent a facility in a central location. In late 1985, services were held in the activity room of the Meadowbrook Middle School in Poway. This facility served well, but required all books, kitchen supplies, and baby beds to be brought in each Sunday. Sunday school was held outside when the weather permitted.

#### Ministers selected

On July 5<sup>th</sup>, 1986, Bros. Peter Petrovic and Doug Wagenbach were chosen to serve as ministers for the congregation. Services were then held every Sunday as well as midweek.

#### A store-front facility rented

In April, 1988, two suites in a small shopping center at 410 W. Felicita, Escondido, CA were rented. A baby room and a Sunday school room were built and a small kitchen installed. Pews and a pulpit were built with volunteer labor. There

was permanent seating for approximately 70 persons. This facility served well, but the Sunday school and fellowship area were very limited.

#### A new church

In 1993, a 2 acre parcel on the west edge of Escondido was purchased. Plans were drawn, and after a lengthy review process, building permits were secured. Extensive grading was necessary to lift the elevation of the building pad. The building project began in May 1994.



San Diego Church

This facility consists of three main wings that project off a central fellowship area. The assembly room has seating for 112. The Sunday school wing has 4 rooms and the dining room contains a kitchen and seating for 88.

#### An elder is chosen

In 1998, Bro. Peter Petrovic was ordained as deacon and on March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2000, he was ordained as elder for the San Diego congregation. On March 11, 2001, Bro. James Koehl was appointed as the 3<sup>rd</sup> minister.

"For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved. How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?

The San Diego congregation currently consists of 32 members with an average Sunday attendance of fifty persons.

#### An interesting area

San Diego is located on the Pacific Ocean coast very near the southern border of California. The mild climate makes this area a lovely place for family vacations and relaxing get-away trips.

There are many beautiful places to visit, including pristine beaches, rugged back country, and a diverse culture. There are numerous museums in the area filled with wonders that appeal to just about any taste. Many of the area's most popular museums are clustered in Balboa Park within walking distance of each other. The San Diego Zoo and the Sea World Park are world famous.

#### **Employment opportunities**

There are numerous opportunities for employment in the area including commerce and industry. Families seeking to relocate in this area are most certainly welcome to contact any of the local members for more information.

#### Visitors are appreciated

The San Diego congregation is always happy for visitors, regardless of the time of year. The nearest congregation is Altadena, and other than that, there are no nearby churches. Therefore, as in all small churches, visitors are important, and receive a warm welcome.

#### APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

The Board of Directors and the administration for the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped (ACHH) have implemented our Outreach and Communication Plan by making presentations at six regional meetings. It was felt that our churches needed to be updated about the work done at our ministry and about our current needs. The cornerstone of the presentation is a new computer slide show put together to show the services of the agency. This is an update of a previous video presentation. The Elders, ministers, church representatives and parents of developmentally disabled residents have been invited to these presentations. The hope is that these individuals will tell others more about the Home. When these regional presentations have been completed, we hope to offer presentations to individual churches as a whole.

The presentations are a combination of pictures and narrative that tells the story of who we are, what we do and why we do it. Specific discussions concerning our mission and our vision statement are presented along with information about who is eligible for services at our facilities. Career opportunities and training which exist now and which may exist in the future have been presented. Also, because our financial needs have changed over the thirty years of our service, it is expedient that more individuals

have knowledge of the operating income and expenses, trends in costs, changes in profit and loss, trends in government reimbursement and how the church and others can help with regular donations and by supporting the endowment fund in one's estate and financial planning.

Four Outreach and Communication presentations have already taken place. They were held in Forrest, IL; Morton, IL; West Bend, IA; and Bern, KS. Lord willing, an upcoming presentation will take place in Rittman, OH, on November 23. Also, on January 5, 2003, a presentation is planned to take place in Bluffton, IN.

Thus far, we can testify to you that the Lord has used these meetings in a positive way. By letting our needs be known, the church has been prompted by the Holy Spirit to pour out compassion by lifting the Home and the residents in prayer, volunteer and financial support.

The call for help for reshingling two roofs for ACHH went out over several central Illinois Apostolic Christian church pulpits. The morning of September 28 the head of the maintenance department only knew he had several skilled men who had committed to work as team leaders. He had no idea if enough laborers would arrive to reshingle the large bus garage at Timber Ridge and our community home at 241 S. Minnesota, Morton, IL. When the beautiful fall day arrived, the Lord provided just the right number of men with willing

hearts and backs. The men were divided into two groups and began their workday at 8:00 a.m. By 3:30 p.m. both jobs had been completed.

#### GATEWAY WOODS APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN CHILDREN'S HOME Kent Kloter

What is meekness? Meekness is often compared to weakness. but this is not true in the biblical sense. Meekness has been described as "power under control". God exemplifies power under control in the first recorded dialog 1 in the Bible. It begins with a question directed to Adam after he and Eve had sinned in the Garden. Why a question? Couldn't God find them? Did He really not know where they were? Of course not. This was a meek God giving Adam the opportunity to think about his behavior before He confronted his rebellion. God is the model of meekness.

Jesus was another example of power under control. The first recorded conversation of Jesus was of Him asking questions and listening. "And it came to pass, that after three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the doctors, both hearing them, and asking them questions <sup>2</sup>." Consider the scene. This is God in the flesh asking questions of the very people He created. Admittedly, Jesus was only twelve years old, but He was still God <sup>3</sup>. He knew more than all of the "doctors" combined, yet he asked them questions. Jesus is the model of meekness.

The Lord's meekness is also shown in the temptation in the wilderness 4. Jesus had the power to instantly create a lavish meal, yet He chose to fast for 40 days. He had the power to turn stones into bread, yet he submitted His power to the authority of the Word 5. Jesus created the very tempter standing before Him, yet He calmly responded to Satan's taunting with nothing less than Scripture, even though Jesus could have annihilated him in an instant. Jesus is power under control.

The last hours of Jesus showed Him exercising power under control. He allowed the illegal courts to condemn Him, the soldiers to mock Him and nail Him to the Cross. He had the power to stop all of this cruelty 6, but He chose meekness. He modeled meekness and showed us by walking in the power of the Spirit; meekness is possible, even in the worst of circumstances. Jesus is the model of meekness.

Col. 1:28 reminds us that our goal should be to become "perfect in Christ Jesus". One of Christ's greatest attributes is meekness. If your desire is to become "perfect in Christ Jesus", you must learn meekness.

What enabled Jesus to be

meek? Jesus' outward meekness began with meekness towards God. He completely surrendered himself to the will of His father. ""..for I do always those things that please him?" "My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work 8."

How can I become meek, you ask? Meekness in outward behavior is certainly important for you to practice, but God is more concerned with the attitude of vour heart. True meekness therefore begins in your attitude and relationship toward God, in your "heart". Jesus sates that your actions stem from the condition of your heart. "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things 9."

The biblical definition of meekness is more than outward behavior. The word meekness in the Bible 10 is defined in Vine's Expository Dictionary as not just outward behavior, but "...it is an inwrought grace of the soul; and the exercises of it are first and chiefly towards God. It is that temper of spirit in which we accept His dealings with us as good, and therefore without disputing or resisting; it is closely linked with the word [humility] and follows directly upon it, [see] Eph. 4:2, Col. 3:12.11

Outward meekness means nothing before God if it is not first based upon a meekness towards God stemming from a complete trust in God's sovereign power and authority over your life. True biblical meekness generates humility and total obedience. Like faith <sup>12</sup>, without meekness it is impossible to please God.

Are there circumstances in your life that you have been fighting?

Are there situations about which you are complaining?

Are there people in your life that you resent, against whom you are bitter?

A sovereign God has allowed them to come into your life to make you more like Christ <sup>13</sup>. Are you willing to allow these difficulties to produce meekness towards His Sovereignty?

Are you willing to accept them as coming to you from a holy, good, faithful God and therefore without disputing or resisting?

How are you doing in the area of biblical meekness in your relationship with God?

Meekness ought to be a dominant characteristic of the believer's daily life.

"Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with

grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him." (Col. 3:12-17)

We at Gateway Illinois Family Services have been busy presenting seminars along with our normal counseling opportunities.

Bro. Jeff Thames presented our child-training seminar "Bring Them Up" at Francesville, IN, in September. He also presented our marriage seminar "No Greater Love" at Akron for the Akron, Smithville and Rittman churches.

Bro. Kent Kloter presented our "Growing Godly Men" seminar at our West Lafayette, IN, church in September. He also gave two presentations on Growing in Godliness to the Florida Family Camp in October.

est men, men that he would not have had work for him because they were not honest, because they were not faithful, those men despised him and spit on him and treated him ill (Job 30). They had respect of persons. So Job noted these things. He noted that this was the way men were. He knew that this was not right. His own friends said, "Well, surely you must have sinned. You are poor now. You were rich. In the judgment of men you must have sinned." God tells us that this is not true. He is sovereign.

The church of God in the time of James fell into the same error. And we ourselves are tempted by those things. So the scriptures are given to us that we might look into our own hearts. We might look into our own actions and examine our thoughts. Are our thoughts evil? Men often don't examine the reasons that they act. The true thoughts of their hearts, they don't examine them. It is best if we examine our thoughts.

In this issue, he examines the thoughts of the hearts for these men, to show them how they have come short of God's love. He says, why is it that you treat the wealthy better than the poor? Have you not judged that the poor are not right? Have ye not judged the poor have sinned? Have ye not judged that God's grace is not upon them? Otherwise, why would you in the Spirit treat them so? Christ says "...whatsoever thing from without entereth into the man, it cannot defile him; ... That which

cometh out of the man, that defileth the man." (Mark 7:18,20).

In the last part of this chapter the Apostle James is telling us to examine our deeds. Examine the efforts that we make. Are they consistent with the faith and the confidence we have in Christ working within us? The efforts that we make, are they made submitting ourselves to Christ? Or are they made for our good upon the earth?

Now the Apostle Paul tells us that even as we labor upon the earth, that can be done in submission to God's will. If we do it that way there will be a blessing. If God would lead us otherwise but we would continue to perhaps even do the same thing, the same work, it would not be a blessing from God. So when we examine our lives, our lives should not flow from happenstance. They should flow from direction by God. We should examine the desires of our heart. We should examine the work of God in our heart.

God does not have the same work for me as He has for you. But God will teach you the place that He has. If we want to fulfill the faith that He gives us, if we want to fulfill the promise that God has given to our hearts to have the blessings so that when we lie down on our bed at night we can feel the comfort and the blessings of God, we have to propose in our heart to follow that which God has shown us. That may be different for each of us at different times. But that's what

he is talking about, about works.

"What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? Can faith save him?" (James 2:14). That seems obvious to us but how do we apply that to our own lives? The Apostle James says, "Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin." (James 4:17). This is part of this faith, letting faith work in us and letting the faith that we have honor God through works.

Works is not a bad thing. The problem with works is the temptation that Satan can bring with them. It was the problem with the law. It is part of our being in the flesh, that we want to be in control. One of the hardest things for us as men is to submit ourselves to God. To allow God to control us. Sometimes when we are led of God, we resist it. I do not know if you have known vourself to resist it, but I have known myself to resist it. One of the ways that I find out that I am resisting God's will is I have a little hard time praying.

But one of the reasons that the law did not work, not only was it only for judgment, and it says here, "...and mercy rejoiceth against judgment." (James 2:13). The way of Jesus Christ was salvation and mercy is better than the way of the law and judgment. The law only could condemn, it couldn't upbuild. But part of the problem with the law and what the church such as the Galatians fell into is that we can

Sermon continued from page 45 by our works secure our salvation. So that is a trap. Therefore we are taught that faith in Jesus' blood saves us.

But what is Christ saying we will do if we have faith? We will keep His commandments. It is a result of the heart that has changed. Therefore it is in the praise of God because of our own selves we cannot please God. Men without a converted heart don't even understand what God wants. Even if we were able to copy the ways of God, it would not be of any blessing for us. God tells us that plainly in Ezekiel when it says that when a man turns from me, then all the good works that he has done, I will reject. "...if he trust to his own righteousness, and commit iniquity, all his righteousnesses shall not be remembered..." (Ezekiel 33:13). We cannot please God, He is not happy with us unless first we honor Him with our heart and our faith. Then the works that we do are acceptable to Him.

He says by the same token, that when a man turns to me, when he submits himself to me, when he believes in Jesus Christ, I will forget all his sins. "...as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall thereby in the day that he turneth from his wickedness;..." (Ezekiel 33:12). He was pleading with Israel. He says, my ways are not double but your ways are double.

Even if we did not agree with this judgment, we must submit ourselves to God.

But He is faithful. He is faithful to forgive us our sins and then we are able to please Him. Not just because of the works that we do, but most importantly because we do the works with the right attitude for His praise. If we do works, give to the poor or whatever we do, we help, we give that glass of water to the thirsty where there is a blessing, but we do it that we might be honored of men, it will not honor God. If a man asks us why we are doing this and we look in our heart, we say it is to honor God. We do this because of the love God has given to our hearts. And He is honored.

If we do it that we might be, we probably would not be so crass as to say that you will appreciate me or you will honor me, but if we do it for that reason, we do not honor God. And if we do it for that reason, men sometimes perceive that even if they don't recognize it. They sometimes perceive that and God is not honored. But our faith can be demonstrated by the works that we do.

One of the greatest witnesses that we can give which is one of the hardest things to do, is to not respond to evil in kind. Meaning that if someone does evil to us, if someone, as Christ would say, takes our cloke, give him our coat also. "And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away

thy coat, let him have thy cloke also." (Matt. 5:40). We call it going the second mile. Christ in His 'Sermon on the Mount' also tells us "and whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain." (Matt. 5:41). We cannot, as a converted person if our heart is right, stop from doing works. Because the Spirit of God that is in us will cause us to do that. That is not bad. That is the work of God. That is God's will that we work upon the earth.

"For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills." (Psalm 50:10) He does not need us to do that. He can heal people better than we can. He has wealth. He can give wealth. He can build things. He can do whatever He wants to. But it is His will that we honor Him, that we praise Him by the works that come through our faith. The blessing is not only for His name. But the blessing is for our heart upon the earth and we will judge rightly that our labor in Him is not in vain. The fulfillment of our faith is that we will have laid up treasures in Heaven. Let us pray that God not only gives us this heart to serve Him but then that He allows us to have the blessings in this life that we can feel His comfort and that it will then encourage us to be more faithful as our life continues.



This continues the two part series on the life of Bro. Benedict Weyeneth (1819-1887). He served as our first American Elder. Excerpts are taken from Marching to Zion.

#### A Young Leader

Bro. Benedict Weyeneth was a young man, 29 years old, when he was ordained in Europe to come to America. He applied himself devotedly to the glorious cause of Christ. God used him. The fields were white unto harvest and by God's grace, he was able to establish churches.

It is instructive to note that he did not comprise doctrine or lifestyle, but labored with resolution to draw souls to a true conversion and upright living.

#### Dillon to Roanoke

He moved from the Dillon area and located permanently at Roanoke in 1857, acquiring land from the railroad. He had heard a railroad was being built from Pekin to Streator and thought this would be a good place to purchase a farm. He was also aware of a settlement of Swiss people in nearby Partridge Prairie.

He probably viewed this group as lively prospects for evangelization. These were people of Mennonite persuasion, and several later became a part of Weyeneth's group. This followed a pattern that have been established in New York, Ohio, Indiana and Iowa.

#### **Ingatherings**

In 1869, 34 souls were taken into the Roanoke church. Then, for an extended period of time, no baptisms occurred, and Weyeneth became anxious and concerned to the extent he sold his farm and prepared to move to Kansas where he thought the spiritual soil might be more fertile. He thought the Roanoke area had become spiritually barren with respect to adding more souls into the church. Then, he suddenly changed his mind, bought another tract of land, and remained at Roanoke. It was a wise decision. Of the 159 souls he baptized in 1879, 94 were at the Roanoke church.

#### **Persuasive Leader**

He was a man of great persuasion. One time he had to reprimand some young non-members who were out of order. The young boys decided to get even with him. The next time they were gathered at his place, they planned to treat him coldly and stay out in the barn. When Weyeneth learned this, he headed for the barn, and with his gracious and winning personality said, "Come on boys and have some lunch." At this, the boys simply melted and yielded to his request. He had an excellent manner with people. He is remembered as one who, when his children quarreled among themselves, always instructed them to "make up" before the sun went down.

Benedict Weyeneth was an extraordinarily gifted speaker and ef-

fective in God's work of persuading souls to embrace the faith. He, with God's grace, could point men to Christ. He was particularly successful in drawing people of Mennonite and Anabaptist background to his doctrinal precepts of salvation.

Weyeneth's zeal knew no bounds when it came to caring for his church and preaching the gospel of salvation. Not only did he seek to win lost souls for the Saviour, but he was diligent as an Elder in traveling to and fro in an attempt to care for them spiritually. He took the lead in attempting to keep the churches he established spiritually strong and pure. The early leaders (and those today) stressed the Biblical point that if a soul repented, and thence fell away, they were/are "worse off" than if they never repented.

#### **Untiring Efforts**

It is reported that one time he and Nicholas Baumgartner walked from Elgin, IA, to Illinois (probably the Morton/Peoria/Roanoke area) in the winter. When they arrived in Illinois, their leather boots were frozen to their feet and they had to open the seams to take them off. As one author wrote, "This they did in the service of the Lord."

# "Respect for the Elderly"

September 15 is Respect for the Elderly day in Japan. Several days prior to that date, a man and a woman appeared at our door and presented us with two envelopes, each containing 3,000 (\$24), one envelope for me and one for my wife. They explained that the gifts were from our town of Ichinomiya in regard to Respect for the Elderly day. They said that we had just reached the required age.

On September 15, Sunday, while we were eating our noon lunch in our church, two neighbor men appeared in our church entrance, one of whom I know very well. He came to our Sunday School when he was a little boy. They told me that they were bringing us gifts and I said that we had already received gifts. They said that they are bringing us gifts, 3,000 each for my wife and myself, from Shioda Ku, which is a group of houses within our town. I was quite amazed but received the gifts with appreciation. I later learned that it is a national law in Japan that the elderly must be so respected and honored.

This got me to thinking about what the Bible teaches regarding respect for the elderly. We are all acquainted with Leviticus 19:32, "Thou shalt rise up before the hoary head, and honour the face of the old men, and fear thy God: I am the Lord." Respect and esteem are both words which are synonyms of the word, honour. We spell that word, honor, but in Britain they spell it honour. Either way, it is a stronger word than respect. Esteem, on the other hand, gives the impression of looking up to.


Getting back to Leviticus, this verse teaches us to stand up when we come into the presence of someone older than we are, man or woman, as the word "man" is often used to mean a human being. Where did we lose this kind of etiquette? And what does this have to do with fearing God? These two commandments are tied together

in this verse in Leviticus so there must be a connection. And then Jesus said, "He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me." (John 14:21). If we consider this verse in Leviticus to be one of Jesus' commandments, it looks like we have some work to do.

Luke 6:31 reads, "And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise." Let's be thankful and treat others as we would like to be treated.
