Job 40:15-24 and Chapter 41; and I Thessalonians 2

He says to them in the second verse here, "...we were bold in our God to speak unto you the gospel of God with much contention." I Thessalonians 2:2. When they ministered in the various cities, we know at this particular period of time that there was persecution of the church. When he makes this statement to them then. I have to think about how it is today. I don't look at those that stand at the pulpit as the ministers of Christ. I look at the whole body, each one of us individually as ministers of Christ. Actually, we are told in His word that we are each one to be ministering the Word wherever we go. Our speech should be seasoned with salt and with grace. That we would be always ready to give an answer in love.

I have to look inside and ask myself first, how bold am I to-day? It is easy to be bold here in a group of believers and boldly speak the Word. But when we go among the unbelievers in the world, how bold are we? I know sometimes I am not as such that I would fall into that category; boldness. I say that to my shame.

It says that, "...we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, which trieth our hearts." I Thessalonians 2:4. That means a great deal to us if we stand

here and open God's Word. But it also means a great deal to each of you wherever we go among men here below. Each one of us has been put in trust. We have all received the spiritual blessings. We have received the joy and the truth and the peace of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the good news. Then wherever we go out into the world, whether it would be our place of employment or a place where we would meet with others, whatever the occasion would be, perhaps in a place that we live, our neighbors, each one of us has been put in trust with the gospel. Each one of us is carrying it around with us. And each one of us is called to be a steward of it and of all that God gives us; the spiritual things and everything else.

Then that we would speak and not be pleasers of men, but God which trieth our hearts. If we spoke the gospel where we went, and I am thinking of where I work, if I would speak it in boldness always, it is not always pleasing to men. It is convicting. Sometimes they don't really want to hear it. Yet we are not to be seeking after so much the pleasing of men, we are not to be scratching their itching ears, but we are to be sowing seeds that will go deep into their heart. Some days the ground is fertile and some days it is not. We go on our way and

another comes along and perhaps waters it. Then by the grace of God and the power of God, one day hopefully and we pray, that that seed will grow

Light From The Word



Writings based on God's Word

February 2003

"The time flies on; and death draws nigh;..." ("Redeeming Our Time" Zion's Harp p. 188). Each of us knows that we have limited time on earth. Solomon wrote that there is "A time to be born, and a time to die;..." (Ec. 3:2). Time can be defined as the interval between two events. The time in question, of course is our life. What we do with that time will determine where we spend eternity.

What does it mean to redeem our time? How can we redeem this valuable commodity? "Redeem" has a variety of meanings. Perhaps the meanings that are applicable here are to convert into something valuable and to set free or to ransom.

The scripture reminds us that our time is short and we need to use it wisely. The Psalmist wrote "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Ps. 90:12). Solomon wrote "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them;" (Ec. 12:1). Paul wrote "But this I say, brethren, the time is short:..." (I Cor. 7:20).

As children we may have thought that eighty years was a long time. However, those who attain a high age can readily identify with the Psalmist who understood the brevity of life. "The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, ... for it is soon cut off, and we fly away" (Ps. 90:10).

Since our allotted time is short, we want to use it wisely. The scripture gives us guidance on how we can accomplish this.

Paul wrote "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil." (Eph. 5:15-16). Circumspectly means to give careful attention to all the circumstances that relate to an action or judgment.

Although we may not be able to see all the circumstances that relate to what we think or do, God gives us enough insight to help us make good decisions. A fool would give little attention to the results of his behavior. He would do what appeals to the

flesh and then suffer the consequences of his decision. Since "The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God..." (Ps. 14:1), we should not be surprised that he would not use his time wisely.

A wise man, however, will give careful consideration to what he is planning to do so he can weigh the likely results. The wise man may not be able to consider every detail nor understand all of the potential results of a decision, "For now we see through a glass darkly;..." (I Cor. 13:12), but he will, by the grace of God, see many potential pitfalls that must be avoided.

God has given us a variety of tools to use that will help us make wise decisions including prayer, reading His Word, and speaking to faithful brethren.

Through prayer we have a special opportunity to seek help in learning to use our time wisely. There are many examples of prayers in the scripture, in which wise men of old entreated the Lord for wisdom and guidance. Because Solomon recognized that he needed help to rule the people wisely, he entreated God to "Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart ..., that I may discern between good and bad:..." (I Ki. 3:9).

Job sought wisdom in his time of distress. He asked "But where shall wisdom be found?... Man knoweth not the price thereof; neither is it found in the land of the living" (Job 28:12-13). He acknowledged that "God understandeth the way thereof, and he knoweth the place thereof. For he looketh to the ends of the whole earth, and seeth under the whole heaven; (Job 28:23-24).

As Paul was giving Timothy instructions, he told him "Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding..." (II Tim. 2:7). Paul knew that true understanding comes from the Lord. What we say, by the grace of God, may be worth considering, but understanding comes from the Lord.

The Lord also helps us gain understanding by providing faithful people in our lives. Many of us were blessed with parents who studied the Word of God and applied it to their lives. The scripture explains the im-

pact that parents should have on their children. "And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up" (Deut. 6:7).

The thoroughness of this command makes it clear that the time fathers spend in instructing their children is very valuable. "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Pr. 22:6).

We do not find scriptural references that advise us to simply fill our time. We do, however, find numerous admonitions against slothfulness. The servant who hid his lord's money was called "... wicked and slothful ..." and was admonished for not having "...put my money to the exchangers,..." (Mt. 25:26-27). The Apostle Paul rebuked those who did not put their time to good use. "For we hear that there are some which walk among you disorderly, working not at all, but are busybodies" (II Thess. 3:11).

We also know that our time must be used to free ourselves from Satan. Jesus paid the ransom that was required to free us from sin. We must make good use of our time and take advantage of this opportunity.

Timothy was encouraged by the Apostle Paul to "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (II Tim. 2:15). Paul also applied the need for diligence to himself. "Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:13-14).

The time we have is limited. The energy and resources are also limited. Let us not waste the most valuable resource God has given us. Let us redeem our time for we "...know not when the master of the house cometh,..." (Mk. 13:35).

Opportunities to Serve in the U.S.

Have you ever had the desire to volunteer on a World Relief Work Project? This would give you an opportunity to join with others to "do good unto all men, especially those of the household of faith".

Have you been unaware of the needs or of the opportunities to serve? The World Relief Committee provides opportunities for service in many areas such as food packaging, building new buildings, cleanup and rebuilding after disastrous storms and floods or serving on medical work teams.

Are you feeling that you do not have a skill to offer? Work teams include those that have skills who can give guidance to others and also those that come with willing hands and hearts and the desire to learn.

Recent projects in the U.S.

Are you concerned about traveling long distances or going to a foreign country? The U.S.A. Board of the World Relief Committee provides involvement in projects in the United States. A recently completed project is the construction of a group home for abused children, which will be operated by the Navajo Christian Foundation. The home is located in Dilkon, AZ. The dedication of the facility has been set for January 25, 2003.

Another project that was completed during the last year is the education building at the Galilean Home, located in Liberty, KY. We have had numerous projects at this location during the past years. Among these projects are the "Angel House" and the "Mary and Martha House". We are continually looking for projects like these in the U.S.

Disaster response

The Disaster Work Project Sub-Committee, under the U.S.A. Board, has a First Response Truck which is fitted with equipment to cleanup after storm or flood. It has been used for cleanup projects in Kansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, and Ohio. Area representatives were added to provide greater local involvement. This sub-committee also has an equipment trailer, which has been used for rebuilding projects after tornados in Georgia and Mississippi. The equipment trailer has been used at our church building sites and other projects that World Relief has sponsored.

Local opportunities

We want to encourage local projects, which will give opportunities for each congregation to help meet the needs of their communities. An effort has been made during the last two summers to promote local projects for each congregation in central Illinois. These activities have been well accepted as they have allowed many individuals to spend an hour or a day, volunteering close to home, rather than having to travel a distance and take unavailable time. Plans are being developed to expand this effort to additional areas.

New church building

A new church building project is scheduled to begin in April 2003. It will be located at Bloomfield, IA. This is a replacement edifice for our Pulaski congregation, which has been blessed with growth, necessitating the construction of a larger building. All of the building trade skills will be needed. A more defined schedule will be listed as plans develop.

New work projects

Work projects do not just happen. Each begins with an individual's recognition of a need. If anyone believes he or she has a good suggestion for a work project, the local World Relief Representative should be contacted. He will then investigate and discuss his findings with his local Elder. If it is considered to be a possible project, the recommendation should be sent to the area World Relief Committeeman, who in turn will forward it to the U.S.A. Board, for approval.

After the approval process, the funding and logistical planning would begin. Do not let the approval process, nor the recommendation details, dampen the resolve to suggest a new project. There are also updates on our brethren in Eastern Europe. If you have a heart for serving others, we encourage you to take this opportunity to see the many opportunities in World Relief.

So Send I You

s we consider being a laborer Ain the "fields that are white unto harvest", it is important to consider what the harvest is and what preparation is necessary to be a laborer. The "harvest" can be our workplace, a school classroom or any place where there are people. One example in the scripture of the Lord preparing a laborer is the prophet Isaiah who was active during the reign of five kings... but he did not set out to be a prophet. Isaiah had a position as a scribe in the royal palace of Jerusalem. It was a respectable career, but God had other plans for his servant. In a dramatic vision, God revealed His holiness to Isaiah. The following verses contain Isaiah's response to this revelation from heaven:

"Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with the tongs from off the altar:

And he laid it upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged.

Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I: send me." (Isaiah 6:5-8)

Isajah realized he was common and unclean before God, with no hope of measuring up to God's standard of holiness. When his lips were touched with a burning coal, however, he was told his sins were forgiven. It wasn't the coal that cleansed him, but God. In response

he submitted himself entirely to God's service. The painful cleansing process was necessary before Isaiah could fulfill the task to which God was calling him. Letting God purify us may be painful, but we must be purified so that we can truly represent God, who is pure and holy. Also, after we have experienced God's forgiveness, we will have a desire to share that forgiveness with others. Isaiah responded in gratitude. No matter how difficult his task would be, he said, "Here am I, send me." He was God's laborer.



And Jesus said unto them, (ome ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men.

Mark 1:17

Seven hundred years later, in a demonstration of mighty power, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ rose from the grave. His disciples, who had been filled with fear, shame and discouragement after his crucifixion were gathered in a small room:

"Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.

And when he had so said, he showed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord.

Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you."

(JOHN 20: 19-21)

Jesus reminded them that it was by God's authority that He did his work, and then passed the job of spreading the Gospel of salvation around the world to His disciples. It is so with us also, that we are under the authority of God, but also under those that God has placed in positions of authority here on earth. With the attitude of Isaiah and the blessing of God we can joyfully go forward into the harvest.

Our Mission Policy outlines the path by which individuals may be assigned to specific mission work away from their home environment. They must be directed by the Holy Spirit into this work and be of good report. When this is confirmed and adherence to the Apostolic Christian Mission Guidelines is assured, such individuals will be sent by the church on specific assignments to a particular area of need. There must be a unity of direction given by the Spirit working in the heart of the individual and through the church.

The Apostle Paul received a divine call when he was told "Depart, for I will send thee far hence unto the Gentiles" (ACTS 22:21). The church at Antioch was then directed by the Spirit to consecrate Paul and Barnabas and send them forth to spread the Gospel (Acts 13:1-3). Later, Paul sent Timothy to labor in Corinth: "For this cause have I sent unto you Timotheus, who is my beloved son, and faithful in the Lord..." (1 Cor. 4:17).

When we follow the pattern established in the Word, the blessings of God will come forth. We plan to share examples in future articles of brothers and sisters who have followed this biblical path and who have been assigned to labor in the harvest fields.

In the midst of contemplation concerning the content of this article, I decided to ask my class what would be their message to readers. After a few minutes of mindless chatter, the question I asked slowly developed into, "What is the prevailing issue facing teens today and why?" The students then as a group started listing issues of loneliness, lack of security, poor self-image, hatred, and lack of respect for authorities. As these issues came out, my students slowly started internalizing what they were saying, and the questions started forming in their minds. "How do you continue to serve God when it feels like all I do is get let down?" "How do we sustain desire in the face of ongoing failure and loneliness?" "Will life ever be what I so deeply want it to be, in a way that cannot be lost?" All of these questions have the ruthless ability to cause me to put my tail between

my legs and run, but by the grace of God, and the help of a hot cup of coffee, we started to address these issues. Maybe I didn't come up with the perfect answer, but as I spoke, I realized that I wasn't just talking to them, but also to my own heart. So as I spoke, a message came out that maybe should be considered by all and the following is the essence of our discussion that day.

The issue in its broken down state comes to why we do what we do and feel what we feel. We all too often search within ourselves for answers, which makes us like the blind man in a dark room looking for the black cat that isn't there. Or maybe as scripture would say it, as we look for our life, we lose it, but as we lose it, we find true life. With no purpose, we are helpless to do anything except ask questions like "Why this" and "Why that." Purpose is such that it gives us vision into the future, and also allows us confidence in the present. Obviously, purpose, true purpose, only comes from a commitment to something beyond ourselves. As the great scientist Blaise Pascal once said, "Not only do we know God through Jesus Christ, we only know ourselves through Jesus Christ." Jesus is the only commitment that meets all of our needs. God, through His Father heart, Christ through His perfect sacrifice on the cross, and the Spirit through His indwelling of our heart, meets our needs. Sermon continued from page 2 into fruit and the fruit of repentance. How important it is that as the stewards, God has blessed us with so much. He has blessed us with so much spiritually, that for us not to go out and share that would really be

"For neither at any time used we flattering words, as ye know, nor a cloke of covetousness; God is witness: Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, nor yet of others, when we might have been burdensome, as the apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children:" I Thessalonians 2:5-7. We have to be that way when we go out in the world. We do not want to 'be in your face', obnoxious, anything like that. We want to speak everything that we speak with salt and grace and love. Every word that we speak should be spoken completely encapsulated in love. If we do that, people notice the difference between our speech and the speech of another. Sooner or later they start paying attention. Even when we may think that we are having no effect around us, wherever God has placed us, we really don't know. You may be touching an awful lot of souls that you don't even realize it, if we are being true to Him and if we are being loving with those around us.

"...we were willing to have

imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, because ye were dear unto us." I Thessalonians 2:8. As the body of Christ, I sometimes wonder if we really share deeply enough with one another. I often wonder, if we cannot share our burdens one with another, then what we are really doing is shortchanging the power of God, in that there could be many others praying for a specific need. And there is such great power in prayer. If we can just come one to another and unburden ourselves, and you know what? We are so hesitant to do that sometimes. Each and every one of us, we don't want to be a burden. The Word tells us that there are many burdens that are never meant to be borne alone, but they are to be shared with others. Not only with our Lord but with one another, other believers.

On the other side of that, if somebody does come and share a burden with you, they are sharing that burden with you. It does not need to go any farther than the two of you at that point. We have to be discreet and discerning.

"For ye remember, brethren, our labour and travail: for labouring night and day, because we would not be chargeable unto any of you, we preached unto you the gospel of God. Ye are witnesses, and God also, how holily and justly and unblameably we behaved our-

selves among you that believe:" I Thessalonians 2:9.10. Paul was making a point there. But here again, I believe that each and every one of us in the body of Christ should seek to rise up and live holy and irreproachable, unblameable lives. We cannot do it of our own power. but through the power of God, we can do that. We can live as overcomers. We have been freed from the bondage of sin. Not that we won't be tempted and not that we won't stumble sometimes and make mistakes. But God has given us the tools. If we can trust in Him, tap into the power of God, then we can rise above our sinful nature. What we have to do is be able to trust only in His ability to keep us clean in this life.

Today, I went out to work construction for the first time since I injured my foot. I was pretty pleased with myself; I thought I had found a really good way to keep this cast clean. I had tied up a pillowslip around it thinking this will keep all the dirt out. At noon I checked it. My shoes and my socks never get anywhere near as dirty as this thing was. Somehow the pillowslip let all the dirt and the dust and the sand in and just completely saturated this cast.

I had to think, isn't that so like each one of us if we try to go through this life trying to keep our garments clean under our own power and leaning on our own ability or understanding. We slip and fall into that self-reliance. That is just so sad. I am sure it makes our Father very sad when He sees our attitudes ever get that way. He has to give us a little reminder here and there and remind us just how weak and fallible we really are when we get to relying on our own ideas. It was humorous and vet it drove home to me, really, a good example of just how impossible it is for us to go through this life of our own power or leaning on our own understanding as Proverbs says. (Proverbs 3:5) But rather that we would be trusting in Him and letting the leading of the Holy Spirit carry us through. That we would not ever get too far ahead or too far behind but that we would walk step in step with the Holy Spirit.

"As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children, that ye would walk worthy of God, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory." I Thessalonians 2:11,12. Here again, I think if anyone of us reads this verse, we have to look inside ourselves and say, worthy of God and His kingdom and glory - worthy is almost like saying deserving of. None of us really deserves it. Yet by His grace and His kind and gentle mercy and His longsuffering and patience with us, He continues to work with us. Just as a piece of clay. He is still pruning a little here and there. We thank Him for that.

We realize that really the only way we will ever walk worthy of God is not through our own righteousness or our own deeds or doings, but only when we put on that righteousness of Christ. When we take and put on the robe of His shed blood and allow it to completely cleanse us and wash us. We have to keep going back day by day. We have to keep the garment unspotted. We have to walk carefully and prayerfully, leaning wholly on Him. We have to always remember that it is Him who gives us the power to walk even one hour or one day as an over comer, not our own, nothing that we can do or say or think.

"For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men. but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe." I Thessalonians 2:13. Aren't we thankful that we can come to church and know that we will hear the word of God? We thank God for that without ceasing. And as we receive it, it is not the word of man, but through the Holy Spirit it is the Word of God. We know it is the living Word. Each one of us receives what we need from it.

"For ye, brethren, became followers of the churches of God

which in Judaea are in Christ Jesus: for ve also have suffered like things of your own countrymen, even as they have of the Jews:" I Thessalonians 2:14. When we stop and think how little we suffer for the cause of Jesus Christ and to further the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ, how little we really suffer for it. The worst that we suffer, sometimes a little ridicule, perhaps a little embarrassment and just think of how so many even today of our brethren suffer right down to the giving of their lives for this cause of Jesus. We really have so much to be thankful for in this country, that we do not suffer this persecution where we have to watch terrible things done to our families and our loved ones.

The religious leaders of that day were "Forbidding us to speak to the Gentiles that they might be saved, to fill up their sins alway: for the wrath is come upon them to the uttermost. But we, brethren, being taken from you for a short time in presence, not in heart, endeavoured the more abundantly to see your face with great desire." Thessalonians 2:16,17. When we give our greetings here in our congregations, I have to often think how it would have been in this day, when they traveled by mule and camel, and walking. How for long periods of time there would be no communication. Nowadays we can email, phone,

fax, mail. So many ways that we can communicate. Just think how it would be when they would not see their loved ones for years and then they would give greetings and salutations one to another when they would gather together and worship. I think sometimes maybe we take our greetings too lightly. 

In re-establishing a new church based solely on the Word of God, Bro. Samuel Froehlich wrote many petitions, both to the state and to the hearts of men. In 1856, a vear before his death, Bro. Froehlich was invited to a general conference of Baptist preachers in Germany, France and Switzerland in an attempt to unite all the various congregations. He declined and wrote a lengthy manuscript to the Conference. Below is Reugger's account in "History of the Apostolic Christian Church. Volume I".

"First and foremost, I have a poor opinion of such conferences, as to their good and result, at least as to what concerns the truth and the kingdom of God, by trying to substitute for the truth, that is lacking human opinion and learning, to the great harm of the truth and the church of God. For as truth is only one, so the true church also is only one and this unity is not first determined and mediated through conferences. Here the words of the high priestly prayer of our Lord (John 17:21) do not apply, for Jesus did not pray the Father that many already existing congregations, each resting on its own foundation, might be made one, as no other foundation can be laid under the already existing congregation than that which it has.

But that is the prayer of the Son

of God, that all who are converted to Him and through the word of the apostles believe in Him, are completely one, even as He and the Father are one. This unity, accordingly is given and exists through the true faith, by virtue of Jesus' prayer, and can and should not first be striven after, between different already existing and for themselves established congregations, through conferences and all sorts of human efforts.

The proposed union is impossible on the basis of the Word of God. For the very reason that the divine Word is not the foundation of the individual congregations. otherwise it would not first have to be fabricated. If a congregation rests on the foundation of truth, it will not afterwards confer with other congregations, else it would have to mix the truth with strange additions and errors, and what is worse, no congregation resting on error is inclined to depart from its false foundation. How can there be a union therefore on the basis of truth?

I maintain that every congregation which teaches and believes that also the man in Christ is a sinner (I John 3:5) like the man in Adam, rests on a false foundation. And if such, in addition, confidently believe that they establish a congregation according to the will and Word of the Lord, I must deny it. No apostle of the Lord

would acknowledge it as such, in as much as they say that the different congregation, regardless of their differing views should work together for the kingdom of God.

In a true congregation of God, one does not permit a differing view to arise. There must be unity and harmony, even in minor points; for it is just in this caprice of views that Satan has his holiday, and the door is opened to error (Phil. 3:15-18; I Cor. 14:33-38; I John 2:22-27; II John 10; Tit. 3:10-11). Separation is better than union of dissimilar elements.

In the end we would have to unite with those congregations which have received those who have gone out from us or were excluded by us; this proves sufficiently that we do not belong to one congregation; for the one congregation of Jesus Christ does not have different doors, but only one. Generally, differing congregations cannot become one in Christ. For the many local congregations, in apostolic days, were in fact only one congregation of Christ."

"A Well of Water"

Jesus said to the woman at the well, "But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life." (John 4:14). This spiritual well is to have a continuous flow, like a spring in the meadow.

The world is full of people who need that kind of water. In fact, we all need that kind of water but some of us receive more of it from others because we are in the fellowship of the saints.

We need that kind of water from others but most of all we need the water from God's well which springs up into everlasting life.

The words, a well of water, strikes a chord in our hearts of something which meets a great need which we all have. We need someone who has the water of respect, love, patience and forgiveness. We need someone who has warmth, humility, and gentleness. We need someone who doesn't criticize or condemn us, but someone who explains to us in love where we may be mistaken, in light of the Word of God. We need lots of that kind of water and then maybe we ourselves can become a well of water from which someone else has the opportunity to drink.

We join with the Samaritan woman in saying in John 14:15, "Sir, give me this water that I thirst not." Then let's pray that God will make each of us a well of water from which others may drink, someone whom others like to be around.
