Sermon by Brother Brad Gudeman, Bradford, IL

Isaiah 16 & St. Mark 3

We don't read in the scripture too many places where Jesus became angry. We know that when He came into the temple in Jerusalem and found the money changers there, buying and selling in God's house, He fulfilled the Word, "For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up..." Psalm 69:9. He was angry at them for selling and buying in the house of the Lord. He drove them out with a scourge. The Word tells us that (St. John 2:14-17).

We read here that He looked about them and He was angry. If we read in another one of the Gospels this very same incident that happened here, it was because of their unbelief. They did not believe Him, they did not trust Him. They were seeking to destroy Him. They did not want Him to do good works. They were so steeped in the law and in their own righteousness that they could not see the righteousness of God. They were blinded to it.

He was angry with them because they would not believe. Because they would not accept the way of salvation. Because they would not allow Him to perform God's work to heal the sick, to bind up the broken hearted, to bring the day of salvation to mankind as they could read in the Word. As they well knew, it was prophesied that this was going to happen. He was fulfilling it and yet they would not believe and He became angry because of their unbelief

The Word tells us that God never changes. God and the Lord Jesus are One. He hasn't changed. Does He still become angry because of unbelief? Dear friends, is the Lord angry with you because of unbelief?

The way of salvation is held out to everyone. He has given His life on the cross for every soul that has ever lived upon the face of the earth. The blood is there to atone the sins of all mankind. It is a free gift. All we had to do was accept it, loved ones. All we have to do is turn our hearts to the Lord. All we have to do is have a longing to be free from sin. It is there. He is holding it out. He is calling today.

The Word of God is not bound. The Word is still free, especially in our land and nation. Is He becoming angry with the unbelief of the nation? Is He becoming angry with those who know the way of salvation and reject it?

How long will the Lord tolerate sin and unrighteousness? How long will the Lord tolerate unbelief? How long will God tarry before He says to here and no further and sends the Lord Savior to redeem those who are the true and the faithful and the over comers? We don't know.

Let's not anger the Lord by our unbelief, dear friends. Seek Him while He may be found. Call upon Him while He is nigh. He wants to heal you of your sin. He wants to free you from the guilt of sin. He wants to give you that hope and that peace and that joy that we, His children, have and enjoy. He wants to give you salvation. He wants to walk with you through life so you don't have to walk alone. But you have to seek that you may be found of Him. You have to call upon Him.

It is humbling, isn't it? None of us want to admit that we need help. That is just the way of man. Because Satan is a part of our life when we are unconverted, loved ones. Satan is a part of every man's life because the original sin and Satan is pride - I don't need any help. I can pretty well handle things the way they are myself. That is what is permeating the world today. That is what is taught in the schools. That is the way Satan has gotten this world and this nation of ours. I can handle things myself, I don't need anyone else's help.

Who gave unto us the last breath we took? Do we look at God that way? Do we look at God as He gives us everything? Even the small things that we take so much for granted? We wake up in the morning and we are breathing. We just expect to step out of bed and go about our daily tasks and labors, whatever it is, and today to come to the Lord's house. We come here expecting a blessing. We just go about and we don't even think, do we, on a daily ba-

sis that God has given us the breath.

God has allowed this day to be created. It is a new day. It is a Sunday. Of course it is a Sunday. It is the first day of the week on the calendar. But this day has never been created before. God created this day. We get in a rut of just living our lives and everything just goes on and this is the way it is and

Give Thanks Unto the Lord - I

Writings based on God's Word

"Now thank we all our God with heart, and hand and voices" (Zion's Harp, No. 236). Many of our hymns kindly remind us that we have so many reasons to thank God. The scripture encourages us many times to give thanks unto the Lord and gives us many reasons why we should be thankful. Numerous Psalms begin by encouraging us to give thanks or praise unto the Lord. "O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good: for his mercy endureth forever" (Ps. 107:1). "Praise ye the Lord. O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good:..." (Ps. 106:1).

Although it would never be possible to list every reason for giving thanks and for praising the Lord, we are reminded in a hymn that there is much to be gained by spending some time and energy to focus upon the reasons we should thank God and to count our blessings. "When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, when you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, count your many blessings, name them one by one, and it will surprise you what the Lord has done" (Count Your Blessings; Hymns of Zion, p. 116).

Among the many reasons to thank God are His power, His grace, and His mercy. We should also thank Him for sending His Son, for His Word, wisdom, compassion, orderliness, goodness, presence, love and protection. Other reasons to give thanks are for deliverance, triumph over Satan, victory over death and sin, forgiveness, His people, the Holy Spirit, life, sustenance and many others. The implications of the concepts in this list, which could be much longer, are almost beyond human comprehension.

To think of the power of a God as great as the one true God is somewhat over-whelming. His power to create the universe and all that it contains is evidence of a loving and gracious God. The earth is but a dot in

the vast universe, yet it contains all that we need for life and many luxuries that go far beyond "need". The air we breath, the water we drink and the food that is available are given in abundant measure. The other planets would not sustain human life for one or more reasons. In addition to providing needs, the earth contains many of God's creations that make it a pleasant place to live. The vast array of color, the numerous kinds of plants and animals, the variety of formations and the seasonal changes on the earth all provide us with examples of God's goodness and power.

In spite of the magnificance and detail of the earth, God's power is so great that it took Him only six days to create it. Add to this the power of God to attend to all the details of keeping the earth and the life thereon going, the vastness of the universe, and the interrelatedness of the parts of the universe. Thus, we can soon understand that God's power is reason to give thanks.

Beyond the physical needs that He provides are many spiritual blessings. There are many times when we need love and help that we do not deserve. There are other times when we realize that we have failed to achieve the standards of His Holy Word. In the times of need He provides us with "...an abundance of grace..." (Ro. 5:17) that gives us love we do not deserve and help to serve Him in ways far beyond what we could do ourselves.

The Apostle Paul prayed fervently that God would remove his affliction. God's reply to this request was "...My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness..." (II Cor. 12:9). He was not granted relief but he was granted the assurance of strength to endure. There are times when we may be too persistent in making a request that is not good for us. God may give "...them their request; but (send) leanness into their soul" (Ps. 106:15). We must be thankful that God does have the compassion to say "no" to us from time to time because He does not want us to experience spiritual leanness.

Many times we fail and realize that justice would require that we pay a penalty for inappropriate behavior. In times such as these we should thank God "...that (we) may find mercy of the Lord in that day" (II Tim. 1:18). We can be thankful that He withholds from us many hardships that we

deserve as we err from time to time.

Although His great love for us is manifested in many ways, it is demonstrated most powerfully in His willingness to send His Son to earth to fulfill the old law and to open the way of salvation to those who will submit to His call and plan. He devised a plan of salvation that had a cost beyond our ability to pay. Knowing we could never pay the price, He sent His Son to pay it for us. This gift of His Son fulfilled a promise contained in His Word that has been preserved for us for thousands of years.

In addition to being thankful for His Son, we rejoice in knowing that He inspired faithful servants of old to write and to preserve His Word. His Word provides us with all of the instructions we need to work out our salvation. The unchanging stability of His Word enables us to know what is expected of us to truly be His child. He didn't make His Word so complicated that we can't understand it, nor does He change it every so often to make it impossible to know what is required. We can be thankful that His Word is so powerful that its truth and application fit all people for all times. Its timelessness makes it just as applicable today as it was at the time it was written.

The words that man writes need to be revised and refocused frequently and there is no end to what man will write. "...of making many books there is no end..." (Ec. 12:12). "But the word of the Lord endureth for ever..." (I Peter 1:25).

God's wisdom and His compassion assure us that He will provide for all our needs and yet withhold what is harmful if we will allow Him to do so. He knows our needs and in His infinite wisdom He "...shall supply all (our) need..." (Phil. 4:19) and eliminate from us some of the things that we desire that may harm us. He does not always grant our request, but "...no good thing will be withheld from them that walk uprightly" (Ps. 84:11).

European Board Visits Eastern Europe

From May 1 to May 20, 2003, a team of brethren from the USA visited the countries of Germany, Romania, and Ukraine. Those traveling were Elders Marvin Leman (Bradford), Andrew Stoller (Smithville), Bros Rod Stoller (Latty) and Bro. Gene Lehman with his wife sis. Verna (Wolcott).

Breidenbach

Some of the group went already on Friday, May 2, spending a few days with the Ernst Pfister family, who is well known to the European Board. He is deeply involved in our efforts across Eastern Europe.

Bros. Andy and Rod Stoller flew into Frankfurt, Germany on Sunday morning, and managed to arrive in church just as services were beginning. The group spent the day together, everyone sleeping overnight at Pfisters. On Monday morning, the trip into Eastern Europe began.

Budapest and Timisoara

Normal driving time between Breidenbach and Romania is about 17-18 hours. The last several times our groups have made these trips they have flown. While this does not allow us to visit in Hungary along the way, it saves time and energy, both of which seem to be always stretched to the limits.

The flight from Frankfurt to Budapest lasted about 1½ hours, and the next leg to Timisoara took 45 minutes. The group was met at the airport by Bro. Filip Augustinov, who speaks both Romanian and German. He is our contact from home via e-mail, and our driver and guide when we are in Romania and Ukraine. The group ate supper at his parents', the Ladi Augustinov's. Bro. Ladi is elder of

several Romanian churches. Monday and Tuesday nights were spent in a hotel in downtown Arad.

The Romanian Corporation

Within the last couple of years, the European Board after much thought and prayer created a new corporation under Romanian law to manage our humanitarian efforts in the future. It is called in English, "Antioch International". Our brothers met on Tuesday in a building complex that was bought for this corporation and will serve nicely as a Distribution Center to handle and disburse the food packages that are being sent regularly from the Bluffton Distribution Center. Potential for future use is virtually unlimited, and the brothers were in agreement that this has been the hand of God working in our midst.

Small self-help projects

In recent months substantial funding has come to help our suffering brethren become more self-sufficient. Wages are somewhere between \$85 and \$150 per month, with prices in stores and markets nearly as much as here. There is no way to make ends meet, and the families must do other things to survive.

Most of them have small parcels of ground, and we have purchased dozens of garden tillers with attachments to help them work their gardens. They have been of enormous aid. This program is ongoing not only in Romania, but also in Ukraine and Yugoslavia. We are working with the local leadership to make a fair disbursement of available assets in order to help the most people.

Another effort currently underway in Romania is the financing of small livestock projects. Those who have a place have already received three baby pigs, with enough money set aside in an account with a treasurer who will pay all feed bills. When the animals are raised, the family will keep two of them, and the third one will be slaughtered to give to those who have no opportunity to care for animals themselves. This is also being done with chickens and geese. Upon leaving Romania, we had about 30 such projects in place. Bro. Filip reported that without exception the brethren wept when they learned of this new program of self-help.

Another way we are helping is by purchasing hand made needlework from old sisters. One old sister, a widow living in an apartment with no refrigerator, has a pension of \$38/mo. Her heat costs average \$31 per month, electricity is \$6 monthly and water is \$4. She made 17 pieces of hand work for which she received \$490. One can only imagine how great a help this must be.

Altogether the brothers purchased over \$2,200 of lovely hand needlework from poor and elderly sisters. Anyone having an interest in buying any of these, to share the costs of the program, may contact any of the brothers who went on the trip.

Into Ukraine

The group also drove to Ukraine and visited the brethren whom we have been supporting there for over twelve years. The many projects we have had going for years were visited, new programs installed, and meetings held with the local brethren.

The new church at Ostrita has been completed, and was dedicated for use on May 25. It was not possible for any of our brethren to stay due to time constraints. The brethren from Eastern Europe, without exception, thank God first of all and then our faithful American brethren who do so much for them.

Our Churches In The Orient

Our church began activities for the Lord in the Orient in January of 1951. The Korean War was underway and some of our brothers spent time in Japan. Our Brother Willis Ehnle was instrumental in sharing the Gospel in that nation, with the blessing of our church.

As a beginning effort, Scripture portions were distributed at a large train station in western Tokyo. In addition, an orphanage was visited and Bible stories were told to the children, with Japanese young people doing the interpreting. Through contact with a young man named Asakawa, children's meetings were begun in Yamanashi Prefecture, about 80 miles west of Tokyo. These efforts were well received.

Establishment of churches

In 1955, Elder Brothers Noah Schrock and Dave Mangold visited Japan to review this work. Later Elder Bro. Ben Maibach became very involved in these efforts. The elders were favorably impressed with the politeness and the humility of the Japanese people and with the many children who gathered out-doors for Sunday School lessons, in rural Japan as well as in Tokyo. The elders encouraged the building of a church house where the children could gather indoors. This was accomplished and the Shioda church was dedicated in July 1956. Adult services were held in the evening, as the farmers worked seven days a week.

In 1958 elders visited again. During that visit, ten people were baptized at the Shioda church and a Japanese brother was made a minister. It was

decided that a church building should be built in Tokyo, which was dedicated one year later. Three years later, a third church was built and dedicated in Tamahata, the home of the Inoue family.

The churches suffered a hard blow in 1963 when Bro. Yoshito Inoue, older brother of Bro. Akito, died of cancer. He was 23 years of age and was serving as a minister. Other losses were suffered in the mid-60's, but the Lord was always faithful to those who persevered.

Over the years the churches have recovered from their losses and have been blessed with spiritual growth and with the addition of a number of stable brothers and sisters. Also strengthening the church were the ordinations of Brothers Akito Inoue and Willis Ehnle in July 1977.

Visits to Japan

Through the years, there have been frequent visits to Japan by American brethren. Visitors included many service men stationed in Korea, and later, in Vietnam. In 1966 an American elementary school and an American kindergarten were started at the Shioda church, in which Bible stories were taught. The elementary school was primarily for American children associated with our church and the kindergarten for Japanese children living in the area.

The elementary school continued for eleven years and the kindergarten for 26 years. During this time many sisters and several brothers came to assist in the schools and to let their lights shine. Their families also came to visit. Brethren traveling to India have usually stopped in Japan as well. Visiting brethren have brought many blessings to the churches in Japan. Now there

are three young brothers from Japan who are studying in the US. They were sent with many prayers that they might grow in faith, learn from good examples in America, and eventually return to Japan.

Present condition of the churches

At the present time, the Shioda church has eleven members, most of whom are elderly. There are three members at Tamahata who attend services at Shioda. The church building at Tamahata is no longer used.

The Tokyo church has sixteen members. There is a very good relationship between the churches, and frequent visits among them are enjoyed. Twice a year the churches get together for a special fellowship meeting, and once a year they get together for the reading of the memorandum and to discuss other issues pertaining to the Japanese churches.

On January 5, 2003 an addition to the Tokyo church was dedicated. Previously the one main room was used for services, dining and fellowship. The dwelling house beside the church was removed and that area was made into a parking lot. Over the parking lot on the second floor, a dining room and Sunday School rooms were built. An elevator was installed making it easier to get to the dining room on the second floor.

All this was made possible by the support and encouragement of the American churches. When everyone works together, much can be accomplished. All glory belongs to God for the establishment of churches in Japan and for the opportunity for many dear souls to hear the Word and receive the wonderful gift of salvation.

Sermon continued from page 2 we expect it that way.

Do we give God thanks for the small things? He has given us everything. All He asks is that we give our life back to Him in return. He has created us. He has given us a soul that will live forever. Originally, when He created heaven and earth, there was only one destination for the soul. That was heaven. Because we were created for His glory, He wants us to be there to honor and to glorify Him forever.

But Satan lifted himself up in pride. Now there are two destinations. There is heaven and hell. And the soul will live forever. The soul will never die because the soul is of God. It is created of God. It is eternal. The choice is ours. He holds out salvation. Let's not make Him angry. Let's believe unto salvation.

The devils believe, we can read that in different places in the Word. The devils believe. They know there is a God. We read it here a little bit, about the devils that were cast out. They said, "...Thou art the Son of God." St. Mark 3:11. They understood that. They know that. They believe but they are still condemned to hell. They don't have a hope.

We that are humans that dwell upon this earth, we have a hope. We have life and breath. As long as we have life and breath, there is hope. There is still a way of salvation available. But it is up to us to take advantage of it by faith.

We all believe, in this room, I am quite convinced, that we all believe that God is the only God. The Creator of heaven and earth. That Jesus Christ is His Son. That He died on the cross and shed His blood for the sins of all man. We believe that. But it is not enough to just believe that. We have to believe unto salvation. That belief has to become so much a part of our life that we commit our life into His hand. That we give ourselves unto Him. That is believing in something.

There is an illustration I have heard and we have all heard before about the man who went to a school and he would throw knives at things and he was very good at it. He had an assistant who placed something on his head and he would throw a knife and split it. He did it several times and the children believed they were wonderful. He said, "do you believe I can do it again?" They said, "yes we believe you can do it again." He said, "okay one of you stand up there." None of them would do it. They saw it. They did not have to have any faith at all. They believed it. But none of them were willing to stand in front of that knife.

We have the way of salvation before us. We believe it. But are we willing to stand before a righteous God and acknowledge our sins and let that knife cleanse us and cut away that which is evil? And purify our hearts and free us from that sin? Are we willing to acknowledge our sin before God? Until we get to that point, we don't believe. We say we believe, but it is a false belief. It is not a saving belief. While He is near, call upon Him that we may be saved.

What about us that are His children? How much do we believe? How firmly do we believe in God? We read in the Word, "...all things are possible to him that believeth." St. Mark 9:23. And the man who had a child that he wanted Christ to heal, the Lord said, "...If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief." St. Mark 9:23,24.

Is that our prayer, to help our unbelief? Because there are things that go on around about us and we wonder and we doubt and we fear. Fear has torment, the Word tells us that. But perfect love casts out fear (I John 4:18). What is that perfect love? God is love. God can cast out fear. When we have a love for Him, enough to believe unto salvation, to give our self completely into His hand, all the fears vanish. Because we are then safe in the hands of Jesus. He carries us on and provides for our needs. But do we believe enough to simply give our life freely into His hands? Not fearing the future.

So often we look ahead and we see things go on around about us, or presently in our lives and we analyze things. Now if I respond this way, this is going to happen. If I go this way, this is going to happen. We analyze and try and choose the best way.

What is faith? "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." Hebrews 11:6. If we diligently seek the Lord and have faith to simply give our life into His hand, He will reward us. Not in any way that we want to be lifted up. We don't want to be lifted up. But He will reward us. How? He will answer prayer. He will provide for us. He will sustain us and fill us with His peace.

Do we believe enough when the trials of life are upon us to simply sit back and place our life in the hands of Jesus? Or do we look at what might happen if we do so? Do we look at what might come our way if we go this direction or that and not have faith? Unbelief is not just for the unbeliever. It is for the believer also. We have to believe everyday. BELIEVE everyday and have that faith that God will provide.

God is in control of our lives. Why should we not trust Him? He created us. He knows all of our anxieties. He knows all of our fears. He knows all of our temptations because God became flesh and dwelt among us. So He knows all those things and He intercedes for us. He knows the end from the beginning. So why shouldn't we trust in Him? Why do we hesitate to simply give our life into His hand? He knows the future. Let's let Him lead us to the future. Let's let Him lead us this day and not worry about the future. Because He will be there. And if we don't make it there, then we are more blessed than ever. Because then we have left this life and we have left it in faith, believing that He has redeemed us and that we are His children. Let's not anger the Lord by unbelief in any

So He healed the man and the Pharisees went forth straightway to destroy Him. Satan is so powerful. Satan is so in control of this world and the

people of this world that he is opposing God an every side. We are God's children. He is opposing us. He is trying to deceive us. Because, loved ones, all we have to do is simply miss the mark. We don't have to miss it by a long shot. Just simply miss it. It is like a target with a bull's eye. If we don't hit the bull's eye, we missed the mark. We may be right beside it, but we've missed it.

When it comes to judgment day, there is one judgment. It is final, it is eternal. It is righteous and it is perfect. We can't be as Agrippa and be almost persuaded (The Acts 26:28). We can't almost make it to heaven. There is no such thing. We either make it to heaven or we don't make it to heaven. There is not an almost. There is nothing in between. It is salvation or it is death. It is heaven or it is hell.

Satan is trying to deceive us, loved ones. Trying to dilute our faith. Trying to dilute the church. Trying to bring in false doctrine. Trying to broaden the way, cause our understanding to waver. Looking out unto the world. And Christianity says its so popular in the world. There are many Christians out there. And we are not going to judge any of them, loved ones. But for us to reach out and embrace them, we are dropping the standard that God has set - not us, not the church, not man, but God has set the standard.

What is the way to salvation? There is one way, there is one faith, there is one hope, there is one baptism. There is one Spirit, there is one church. What is the way to salvation? Repentance; sorrow for sin, a Godly sorrow, a turning away from sin. Being converted by the Spirit of God, and being born again out of water and of Spirit and walking a separated, sanctified life. Those are the true believers.

Let's not lower the standard by saying that all people that profess Christianity are Christians or brothers or sisters of ours. We don't know where they are at. God will judge that. We don't know what they have gone through. We of this church and household of faith know where we stand. We

know what we have been through. We know what the Word says. We know the doctrine that we embrace. Let's not cheapen our faith. Let's not try and drop the standard of God because God has set it and it will not change.

There is not almost a Christian. There is not almost a believer. We either are or we are not. Unless we have come that way through the door into the sheepfold, we are not. It is that simple. The Word says that.

Let's not let Satan destroy us. They tried to destroy Christ here and He got away. He understood it and He knew it. He fled from them. That same Spirit of Christ is within us. We can flee those things. We don't have to put up with those things. We can separate ourselves from the things of this world. We are to separate ourselves. "Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty." II Corinthians 6:17,18. That is what He wants of us. Let's believe it enough to do it and obey it.

"For he had healed many; insomuch that they pressed upon him for to touch him, as many as had plagues. And unclean spirits, when they saw him, fell down before him, and cried, saying, Thou art the Son of God." St. Mark 3:10,11. The unclean spirits... Every man that is born is born pure in the sight of God. They come to the age of accountability and they transgress the law of God. They go their own willful way. It is the nature within us. And they become guilty before God. All flesh is guilty before God.

So we all have that unclean spirit within us then at one time or another in our life. Because we all come to that point. That unclean spirit is of Satan and it has to be cast out. God and Jesus are the only Ones that can cast that spirit out. We cannot. We simply cannot. We are flesh and blood.

We are that temple. The Word tells us we are the temple of the living God (I Corinthians3:16,17). When we are called and sanctified and purified, the Spirit dwells within us. God dwells within us. We are the temple of God. So our body is a temple. This flesh and blood, this earthen vessel is a temple.

Until it is purified, it is the temple of Satan. It has to be cast out. It has to be changed. It has to be done away with. That evil spirit has to be put out. It is a spiritual thing, loved ones. We ourselves as humans are merely the temple. There is a spirit dwelling within us. It is either the spirit of the anti-Christ or it is the Spirit of God. The Word is plain in that. And only the spirits dwell there.

So if we have the spirit of unbelief, if we have the spirit of anti-Christ, it has to be driven out by another spirit. We can't by ourselves. It is Christ, as He drove out the evil spirits here. When they fell down and acknowledged that He was the Son of God, then they had to leave because He commanded them to leave. That is the way it is in our lives. That is the only way to salvation. When we humble ourselves before God, when we beg of Him to free us from sin, then He can cast out the spirit. But we have to be willing. We have to be desirous. Then that spirit is cast forth. That temple is changed. It is purified.

Just like the woman who swept her house and garnished it and it was clean and spotless. But she did not fill it up with the Spirit of God. She left it vacant and empty and the spirit of unbelief came back seven times worse than the first.

We can't live in a state of in-between. We are either for or against the Lord. The choice is ours. That Spirit has to fill us completely, loved ones. And only God's Spirit can reside there. He is a jealous God. He will not take up residence with a partial heart. Even though it might be 98%. He is a jealous God. So when we come to the Lord, we have to come completely, that we can be cleansed completely. That that evil can be cast out completely, 100%, so God can dwell freely within us.

Acknowledge that Jesus is the Lord and walk in the straight and the right way. As the man that dwelt among the tomb. He cut himself, he was in chains and he broke them asunder. Remember that? And Jesus healed him. Jesus cast out that evil spirit. And the people of the town were amazed when they came because he was clothed and in his right mind and he was contented (St. Mark 5). That is what happens when God casts out the spirit. That is what happens when we become a part of the family of God. That is what happens when our temple is holy and pure and when God lives within us.

He continued casting out devils and the scribes blasphemed. They said, "...He hath Beelzebub, and by the prince of the devils casteth he out devils." St. Mark 3:22. They understood the spiritual end of this warfare. They understood the spirits about them. But they accused the Son of God of casting out evil spirits by the power of Satan, the anti-Christ.

What did Jesus tell them? "...How can Satan cast out Satan? And if a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand." St. Mark 3:23,24. Something very simple, isn't it? Just take an earthly kingdom. If our nation is divided against itself, it cannot stand. It is simple.

It was evident during the Civil War. The nation was torn asunder. There wasn't a unity there. It was not a nation any longer. It was two separate factions warring against each other. It was still in one land, but it was divided. It did not stand until unity came back in again. Until there was one government, until there was one thought

and process.

Satan cannot cast out Satan. Only God can cast out Satan. And they blasphemed and said to Jesus that thou art casting out Satan by the prince of the devils. That is a fearful thing, loved ones, to blaspheme against the Holy Spirit.

"...All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme: But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost bath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation:" St. Mark 3:28,29.

I don't understand completely the blasphemy of the Holy Ghost. But how close do we come when we deny the power of God in our lives? How close do we come, brothers and sisters, when we say to God that this is not going to work? The way you are leading me on is not the right way. I don't want to go there because I can see ahead what is going to happen. I don't want to follow. We don't know how close we come, do we? Are we denying the power of the Spirit within us?

Let's walk humbly before our God, that we don't have to worry how close we are. Let's walk submissively to God and to the Word and to the church. Let's give ourselves wholly to Him that He might dwell in us and reign in our hearts. And not fear what is ahead of us. Especially we don't have to have it in our mind, wondering, do we blaspheme against the Holy Ghost? Do we deny the power of God?

When we overcome sin, let's not

take credit to ourselves. That is of God. Let's not lift ourselves up. That is blasphemy when we make ourselves equal to God. Satan did that and was cast out into eternal darkness without a hope, because he lifted himself up to God. Let's never be caught in that. Satan would like to have us do that. Let's humble ourselves every day.

"There came then his brethren and his mother, and, standing without, sent unto him, calling him. And the multitude sat about him, and they said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren without seek for thee." St. Mark 3:31,32. Isn't this precious, loved ones, and haven't we found it so? Those of the household of faith, our brothers and our sisters, those are our family. That is what the Lord said here. He said, "...Behold my mother and my brethren! For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother." St. Mark 3: 34,35.

Let's do the will of God, loved ones, willingly. With a desire even in our hearts to do the will of God. Obediently, submissively. Let's do the will of God. So when that judgment day does come, when Christ leaves that mercy seat and goes to the judgment seat, and we appear there before Him, that He says to God, "That is my sister, that is my brother. They are part of my family." God is the Father and heaven is the home.



The following is an account of J. Andrew Braun's spiritual experiences in 1844 as told by his son, S.J. Braun, who later served as a church official in America. It reflects the religious scenario in Switzerland as our faith was being established in the 1830's and 1840's. J. Andrew Braun's pathway reflects how souls were thirsty for the truth, and after hearing a true doctrine, repented for their sins and became converted. A deep loyalty to their new faith (and godly order) is a strong message for us today.

My Father's Conversion

The following is an account of the conversion of my father, J. Andrew Braun, which occurred about 1844, and by his having told it so often in my presence, it is still fresh in my memory.

He was born in Schweinfurt, Bavaria, about 1825 where he preached the Gospel for a number of years under much persecution from the Catholic and the Lutheran Clergy, which jointly ruled the government of Bavaria. He emigrated to the United Sates about 1854; living a number of years in the vicinities of Eureka and Morton, Illinois, from where he moved to Wauseon, Fulton County, Ohio, about 1863; about 25 years later to Toledo, Ohio, where he died in 1907. He preached the Gospel both in Europe and America in many of our meeting places and in private houses, for approximately 60 years. He often told about his conversion, and that it took place in the following manner:

A Shoemaker

He had learned the shoemaker's trade, and as was customary and even compulsory in those years became a journeyman shoemaker. Those acquainted with the conditions at that time know that such who had learned a trade had to go from place to place for a number of years for the purpose of be-

coming better acquainted with their trade by knowing from experience how things were done in various parts of Europe; thereby becoming masters of their trade. From this may have originated the word "Journeyman".

"Thou Art A Sinner"

At the age of nearly 19, he worked in Switzerland, where from his bedroom window one still night he could notice the little lake, near the house, making great waves even though there was no wind to set the little lake into such commotion.

After debating in his mind these observations, he concluded that this little lake must be connected with a body of water in the depth of the earth, and compared the little lake to a funnel filled with water which would also make miniature waves if one blew in the stem of the funnel, and while he made these conclusions a voice came to him in his heart "and thou art a sinner".

He knew this to be true, because he was not only a lively young man, but also proud. His condition caused by the fall of Adam became more sinful as he grew older. This together with the revelation in his heart "and thou art a sinner" prevented him from enjoying much sleep that night, and in only a few days afterward his time for seeking work in another town or city came about when he had to take up his journeyman staff.

The mode of travel with most of the journeymen was on foot. While on his way, without any premeditation, he had to pray that the Lord would lead him into a house where he might hear the truth. This caused in him a certain aggravation because he considered himself so well acquainted with the Bible from his childhood that he did not need being lead into such a house where he would hear the truth, believing that he

already knew the truth.

However, he went only a little way when he had to pray a second time; without any forethought or premeditation that the Lord should lead him into a house where he would hear the truth. This time what had aggravated him before now caused in him much concern knowing that he prayed that both times without having had any forethought for any such a prayer.

Meets a Brother in Faith

It was by providence that at the first house at which he asked for work both the proprietor and his assistant where Brothers in our faith. When he asked for work, the assistant told him that he believed he could get work there, but that the proprietor had gone out for a while.

After my father had waited long enough as he thought, he began to be impatient saying to this assistant that he thought he would not wait for the proprietor to return because he wanted to go to Basel, and might as well go there now as later.

In reply to this, the assistant said, "No doubt you want to go there to join the Young Men's Association" (Jungling's Verein). This remark caused embarrassment to my father which the assistant noticed. Both looked at each other without saying anything, and the more that my father showed embarrassment, the more this assistant looked at him. Finally the embarrassment became so great to my father that he said, "I do not have to be ashamed of the name of Christ."

"The Other Person's Feelings"

Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

As I look back over my life, I realize that I have sometimes said things, or done things, or written things, without thinking about the negative effect it might have on the person or persons being addressed. This is in spite of the fact that as a young believer, I promised God that I would always take the path that would bring Christ the most glory, regardless of personal will or desire in the matter. This makes me think that I must be more careful what I say, or do, or write, to others, including those of my own family, especially my spouse. What seems like something humorous to me, may not seem very humorous to the person being spoken to, or being spoken of. I wonder if you have ever experienced anything like what I'm speaking about.

If we are going to say, do, and write what brings Christ the most glory, we must be careful. The same applies if we are going to follow the golden rule as recorded in Luke 6:31, "And as ye would that

men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise."


It is important that we avoid putting ourselves above others. "In lowliness of mind, let each esteem others better than themselves." Even with the best of intentions to follow that teaching, we may inadvertently put ourselves above others by what we say, do or write.

How can we rebuke or admonish others without putting ourselves above them? "These things speak, and exhort, and rebuke with all authority." (Titus 2:15). Our authority is in the Word of God. We can say, "The Word of God teaches this, and this, and this. Therefore, we encourage you, and exhort you, to discontinue your present conduct and activity." I know from experience that to say, "According to the by-laws of our church you need my permission to use our church for this purpose," does not carry much weight. I should have said, "According to the Word of God, you should not use our church for this purpose," and then quoted the appropriate scripture.

Even after having learned some lessons about how to treat others, in a light-hearted manner when we are feeling good, we may hurt another person's feelings. For some reason this has come to my mind recently and I simply wanted to share it with you, just in case it might be helpful. Let's hope and pray that you don't make as many mistakes as I do, or have done in the past.

If the other person is very secure and successful, he or she may be able to laugh it off, even if we are negligent in showing proper respect. However, if the other person is suffering from insecurity and lack of self-worth, he or she may feel we hold ourselves too high. Or if we write or say something that is not clear in what we mean, the other person may lie awake at night wondering what we meant. Brothers and sisters, these things ought not to be. Let's consider the other person's feelings.
