

Sermon by Brother Tom Schrenk, Athens, AL Psalm 17 and Titus 2

The Psalm that we read together was a cry for God's protection. As the Psalm of David started out, he said, "Hear the right, O Lord, attend unto my cry..." Psalm 17:1. How often do we, dear ones, cry out to the Lord to hear our prayer. Sometimes we don't even know maybe what to pray or what to say. Aren't we glad and thankful that God knows our needs and whatever it is even before we would bring a petition unto Him.

I had to think as we went down through these verses, there were so many thoughts. I look here and I see in verse 8, it says as David was praying and asking for protection, he said, "Keep me as the apple of the eye, hide me under the shadow of thy wings," Psalm 17:8. David wanted to feel that protection. He wanted to feel that God was there and that he was secure in that encircling of the arms of God.

Have you ever thought and wondered, does God really maybe even like we read and I am often reminded in Job - when Satan came there and when God asked him, "Where have you been and what have you been doing?" He said he was walking up and down throughout the earth. God asked him if he had observed His servant Job. What did he say? Yes he had. When God asked him if he had seen how Job, of all the things that Job had, if he noticed that and how Job loved God and how Job worshipped God. Satan said, "Yes and why shouldn't he because thou has put a hedge around him." He circled him and He protected him (Job 1:6-10).

God does that for us today. He puts that hedge around us. Here even as David could ask, to be kept even in that special place. He could be hid under the shadow of the wing of the Almighty power of God. We have that same opportunity. We have that same God who loved then who loves us now. He wants us to use, doesn't He and take advantage of all the things that He has to offer us.

Then as we went down here a little bit further, in the last verse David said this, "As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness." Psalm 17:15. He said he would be satisfied. That certainly goes against our nature, doesn't it? Our nature is to always be maybe wanting more and wanting more. Satan would tell us in his own way and remember Satan comes in many forms. Satan comes even as an angel of light. So he wants to deceive us and he will try any way that he can. Just any way that he can. Deception.

Deception in the world today is probably one of the greatest things that he uses. One of the greatest avenues of approach that he has to you and to me is deception. Coming as an angel of light. Coming with things that look good and would be maybe in our mind, if we don't really stop and think about it and read and pray, we could be deceived.

So we have to be so very, very careful dear ones. Even as David could say that he would behold the face of God in righteousness and that he would be satisfied. So may we just take those thoughts and just hide them here in our heart. Just remember, just remember that we serve a God who is true and is faithful. Where there is no wrong, there is no sin. We need to always remember that, do we not dear ones?

As the Apostle Paul here to Titus wrote words here and we could have read the first chapter and the last chapter and it would have been a message that agreed even with the message that we read.

We find here that he began this chapter by saying, "But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine:" Titus 2:1. Evidently even in the time of Paul - Paul was the apostle to the Gentiles. Paul was a man who was very zealous. We know his life history because the Word goes

In the previous article in "Light From the Word" a number of reasons for us to give thanks unto the Lord were reviewed. This article is a continuation of that theme.

Our lives would be so very confusing if God would not have created orderliness in the world. We know that spring will follow winter, day will follow night, and harvest will follow seedtime. "While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease" (Ge. 8:22). The physical laws that He has set in order make many things in our lives very predictable. Without this predictability (gravity, freezing, boiling, etc.), many of the things we take for granted would not be possible and would, therefore, remove many of the conveniences we enjoy. We can count on the orderliness of God's creation knowing that it is good.

How can we possibly show enough appreciation for the goodness of God? Jesus reminded us of the specialness of God's goodness when He said "...there is none good but one, that is God:" (Mt. 19:17). Perhaps we can come close to appreciating God's goodness by meditating on some of the evidence of His goodness that is contained in His Word. "O taste and see that the Lord is good ... " (Ps. 34:8). "The Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble ... " (Na. 1:7) and "...knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance" (Ro. 11:22). These three passages, which are only a few of the many that could be cited, instruct us that the goodness of God can be a blessing to us physically (by what we taste and see), emotionally (by being a stable force to us in time of trouble) and spiritually (by allowing us the privilege of repentance).

One of the results of God having sent His Son is that it gives us many additional reasons to be thankful. Because Jesus Christ was faithful, withstood all of Satan's temptations, died for our sins, and conquered death, we have the opportunity to be delivered from sin. Jesus came


Give Thanks Unto the Lord - II

to "...preach the gospel to the poor; ... heal the broken-hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives,..." (Lk. 4:18). Not only can we be delivered from past sins, we can find the grace to overcome future sins and to triumph over Satan if we will follow His teachings. "...Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. ... Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Ro. 6:1-4). Just as Christ conquered death, we by the grace of God, can conquer sin. If we are faithful and conquer sin, we can also have victory over death and sin. "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? ...But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (I Cor. 15:55-57).

Among the blessings we have is the opportunity to obtain and give forgiveness. Perhaps there is no reason to be thankful that is of greater importance than knowing through faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ, we can be redeemed and find forgiveness for our sins. We do not need to carry the burden of sin to the grave nor do we need to hold on to the disappointments that others may have caused for us. Numerous times in the scripture we are reminded of the opportunity to "...forgive, and ye shall be forgiven" (Lk. 6:37).

In many situations in life, if we share something with others we have less of that item for ourselves. Our relationship with God is different. We can share the bounty of God's mercy, the gift of conversion, the power of His Spirit, our faith, love and zeal with others and not diminish what we have for ourselves. In all these cases when we share we have more than we had when we started.

Therefore we can readily see that one of the powerful blessings we can appreciate is the privilege of being with God's people. We can feel an increase in our blessings by sharing what we have with those who are in need. We can also feel



ings.

In addition to the blessings we have previously mentioned, we can be thankful for the gift of the Holy Spirit and the power that accompanies this gift. "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you:..." (Ac. 1:8). The Holy Ghost will serve as a constant source of comfort and as a guide to keep us from evil. "But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the Father, he shall testify of me:" (Jn 15:26). "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth:..." (Jn. 16:13).

The very fact that we are alive is a gift from God. If we would have never lived and had not become a "...living soul", (Gen. 2:7) we would not have the opportunity to spend eternity with God. Jesus came that we "...might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly" (Jn. 10:10). God gave us life and He will sustain us. "And the Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will preserve me unto his heavenly kingdom: to whom be glory for ever and ever..." (II Tim 4:18).

Although we realize we cannot list nor even bring to mind all of the reasons we have that should make us thankful, we would do well to pause from time to time and think upon the many gifts we have from God and the many reasons we have to be thankful. We know that "...God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:19). Therefore, "Being enriched in every thing to all bountifulness, which causeth through us thanksgiving to God" (II Cor. 9:11). Our thanksgiving to God should know no bounds "... for his mercy endureth forever". Psalm 136 reminds us of this 26 times.

Mission Committee Meetings in 2003

eetings were held in Chicago in January, May and July. As is customary, one elder brother from the World Relief Committee is present at each meeting. Bro. Mark Bahr is currently serving as the Chairman and Bro. Phil Stettner as Secretary/Treasurer. There is a full agenda for each meeting, with numerous project reports, disbursement of funds and review of new proposals. The Committee is also increasing its efforts to communicate with brethren who have been sent to the Mission field by inviting them to meet for special briefing sessions. This report will combine various topics covered at the three meetings.

Mission policies

A new brochure on Mission Policy and Guidelines for the Apostolic Christian Church has been completed and will be distributed to all the churches. This document should be consulted by all who are seeking to become involved in serving the Lord in the many different mission opportunities.

The Committee is developing an Evaluation Program to gather information for ongoing mission assignments and an interview process after individuals have completed their tour of duty.

A Position Paper was approved at the July meeting which provides guidelines for major mission projects proposed by local churches. The objective is to cooperate with local churches to determine if projects should be appropriately brought under the national umbrella and to provide direction for this process. Each elder will receive a copy of this document.

Financial accountability

Detailed financial reports of contributions and expenditures are reviewed at each meeting. During the current year disbursements have been made to a variety of projects including: Ixtlan, Imuris, RGMMI, Loving Shepherd International, Bible Distribution, Berean Prison Ministry, Braile Bible Foundation, Christian Aid Ministries and the Athens Preschool.

We continue to be blessed with contributions from charitable brethren, but the needs far outweigh our ability to meet them. Unfortunately the needs do not diminish in times when the world economy has slowed. Even though many of us are affected by this as well, we will be blessed if we do not neglect giving the first fruits to the Lord.

Interviews and reports

At the November 2002 meeting, Bro. Bob and Sis. Joy Huber (Francesville) were interviewed and approved for duty to provide spiritual support for the Casa de Elisabeth orphanage at Imuris, Mexico. Bro. Marshall Heinold attended that same meeting and presented an extensive report on his many experiences with the mission effort in Ixtlan, Mexico. The Committee was pleased to see the good fruits of this effort and assured Bro. Marshall of their continued support and prayers.

Sister Sandy Leman met with the Committee at its meeting in May. She is serving as a physician's assistant in a clinic near Ixtlan. Her interaction with patients affords an opportunity to develop a relationship and to give spiritual input when appropriate.

Sis. Penny Stahl gave a report at the July meeting. She teaches

English classes and assists at Ixtlan in numerous other ways. Sis. Penny shared many insights based on her experiences during the past 1 ¹/₂ years in Ixtlan. Both of these sisters serve under the authority of the Ixtlan church as well as the Mission Committee. The Committee assured them of ongoing support and prayers. It is very helpful to the Committee to receive first hand reports of experiences and special needs.

Church building projects

There has been a good response to the ongoing collection for the European Church Building Fund. There are great needs remaining in a number of Eastern European countries for providing places of worship for needy believers and friends. There are also several ongoing domestic projects being supported by the North American Building Fund.

Bro. Peter Petrovic reported on behalf of a group of brothers who returned recently from attending the dedication of a new church in Padina, located in former Yugoslavia. This growing congregation had very poor facilities which have now been replaced by a modest but commodious edifice. Bro. Gene Lehman was invited to the July meeting to report on a recent trip by several brothers to Romania and the Ukraine. A large new church has been completed in Ostritia, Ukraine which comfortably accommodates the 450 souls who make up this congregation.

The Mission Committee is very dependent upon and appreciative of the prayers and financial support of our entire Brotherhood as it seeks to identify appropriate opportunities to present to the lost the Gospel message of salvation.

Let Us Do Good Unto All Men

The verse in Galatians 6:10, "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith", is only a collection of letters and words, unless their combined meaning is absorbed by heart and mind, and acted upon as the opportunities become available.



The promoting of opportunities, for this purpose, is one of the basic purposes for which the U.S.A. Board was established. Our Father in Heaven has always provided the opportunities. Often these opportunities are overlooked and go unrecognized, until His children are prompted to be observant of and empathic to the needs of others. These opportunities may be as near as needs of family, Brethren, friends, and neighbors. They may be shown in dramatic ways by damage, destruction, earthquake, storm, flood, or fire. They may be due to less dramatic conditions that have existed for a long time.

The vision is developed

While the work team projects in Haiti and the rebuilding project in Mexico City after an earthquake seems to be the awakening of our World Relief spirit to be directly involved, the effort in the U.S. began with the Hurricane Hugo project in Andrew, SC. Since then the Hurricane Andrew project in Homestead, FL and the disaster work projects in Camilla, GA (2000) and Pontotoc, MS (2001) have been major work team opportunities.

During year 2001, the Gateway Illinois Family Services recognized the need for work assignments to assist their needy clients. Projects were selected and work teams from many of the central Illinois congregations provided skills and labor.

These blessings continued during year 2002 when World Relief and Gateway Illinois Family Services shared in the effort of promoting local projects in most of the Illinois congregations. In the year 2003, Gateway Illinois Family Service turned all the work project efforts over to the U.S.A. Board of World Relief. This is being directed by the Disaster Work Projects Sub-Committee, which is chaired by Bro. Jerome Witzig.

Opportunities in 2003

This year, thirteen of the Illinois churches have scheduled a summer work project. These vary from roofing to remodeling and new additions. Some of the projects may help individuals, while others are maintenance projects for some of our church home facilities. Volunteers from our Ohio and Eastern Indiana congregations are helping with the Van Wert, Ohio Tornado Work Project.

Local work projects

An effort is being made in Kansas, Iowa, Indiana, and Ohio to promote local work projects, with the selection of a representative from each state to the Disaster Work Projects Committee. The representatives and their phone numbers are:

World Relief has equipped a donated box van truck for the First Response Projects. It is equipped with tools, including air compressors, pumps, saws, and hand tools for use in tree and debris removal, and general cleanup after storm and flood. For the disaster and non-disaster work teams, three tool trailers have been purchased and supplied with equipment for building, remodeling or repair projects. One of the trailers is being used in Indiana and Ohio, one in Illinois, and the other in areas where there are needs.

Just as you enjoy summer and all that accompanies it, so do the residents of Apostolic Christian Services. At the Timber Ridge facility, our residents spend time in the two courtyard areas relaxing on the wheelchair swing, bench swing or outdoor chairs. In one courtyard our south-end residents enjoy working with plants in horticulture therapy. Many walks are taken with wheelchairs around the lovely grounds by our staff and residents that are non-mobile. Once a week a group is transported to the Easter Seals warm water pool in Peoria, IL, for swimming. Also, a group of residents called "Free Spirit" participate in summer Special Olympics activities. Another highlight for some Timber Ridge residents is going to Central Illinois Riding Therapy (CIRT). Horseback riding is an excellent way to cheer up someone and loosen tight muscles all at the same time. Small groups are taken on picnics, to the Dairy Queen, and to the A&W for quick get aways. Other warm weather activities Timber Ridge residents have gone to are the hot air balloon festival and a variety of fairs.

The residents that live in our other facilities: Oakwood Estate, Linden Estate, Community Integrated Living Arrangements (CILA) and Community Residential Services (CRS) also plan special summer activities. Many summer evenings are spent by taking walks around the village of Morton and many include a stop at the at the Dairy Queen or the A&W. They, too, take one-day trips that are within short diving distances of our facilities. This year day-trips have been taken to: Chicago for sightseeing at the Brookfield Zoo, etc.; Rockhome Gardens in Arcola, IL; a shopping trip to Bloomington, IL; and two separate trips on the Spirit of Peoria river boat to Starved Rock state park. Occasionally residents have special invitations for weekend trips to Apostolic Christian churches. Forrest, IL, church annually hosts such a weekend and this year Oakville, IA, church will be the site of a weekend trip for several CRS residents. Additionally, this group will travel to Nauvoo and Dixon Mounds for sightseeing.

June 19 was our bi-annual Volunteer Dinner at the Morton church fellowship hall. In an effort to thank individuals who had volunteered their time and services to our agency during the 2001 and 2002 calendar years, we invited a large number of people to a volunteer dinner. The approximately 100 people who attended were only a small portion of the many volunteers who have helped us. The guests were treated to a delicious meal of American cut pork chops, Texas potatoes, rolls and a beautiful array of fruit. For dessert three flavors of layer cakes were served. The tables were decorated in patriotic red, white and blue colors and featured large red roses in the centerpieces. Ron Messner, our executive director, spoke for a few minutes to the volunteers. He not only thanked them for past efforts, but also explained how very necessary prayers, volunteer services and donations are to the ongoing mission of our agency, serving adults with developmental disabilities. While in graduate school, he was a teaching assistant in the Learning Resource Center. That opened the door for him to have a permanent teaching position until that department closed in the spring of 2000. But God opened the door for another position as Academic Advisor and Study Skills Coordinator for the TRIO Disability Support Services program. TRIO programs are federally funded programs that identify promising students, prepare them to do college-level work. and once these students enter college, offer tutoring and support services to retain and eventually get them to graduate with a BA degree. This program at Wichita is one of fourteen federally funded disability support services in the USA and the only one in the Midwest!

Phil's list of responsibilities is mindboggling. Headvises and monitors forty students and is also responsible for planning and

scheduling all the study skills and life skills workshops for the 115 students in the program. It is his responsibility to have the necessary technical materials available as students need them.

Phil is required to attend two training workshop/conferences each academic year. This year he attended a conference in Maui, HI. Six family members went with him and provided the assistance that he needed. They had four days of sightseeing and three days spent in training. Phil's most lasting memories of the trip include the colors of all the flowers and the ocean waters.

In conclusion, not only did God provide family support, but He placed Phil in a location with opportunities for service. The path has not been easy and was often beset with health problems. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

through and explicitly points out that Paul was a sinner. Paul was a man who persecuted the church of Jesus Christ. He was a man who had authority. He had the ability and the authority to go into wherever he wanted to go in that part of the world at that time. Wherever he found someone that was preaching Jesus Christ or who followed Jesus Christ, he had the authority to either lock them up in prison or even to have them killed. He persecuted the way of the cross of Jesus Christ. He was zealous. (The Acts 9:1.2)

But he had an experience. We read about his conversion. He had an experience. He met Jesus Christ face to face. When the Lord spoke to him, he realized the error of his way. Isn't it wonderful how that is recorded that he did not argue. He did not find excuses. He did not ask to wait a little while longer. When he was confronted there by Jesus Christ as he lay there on the ground, he asked what he needed to do. (The Acts 9:3-6)

Isn't it wonderful how God can work in the hearts of men and women? As He worked in the life of Paul, He also works in our lives, does He not? In your life and in mine. He continues to call and to reach out to the lost in many different ways. None of us had a conversion probably that was as dramatic as what Paul's was. But yet in our lives it was dramatic, was it not? When we finally could come to the knowledge of the truth.

We had a measure of knowledge, did we not, for a long, long time. Most of us probably in this assembly grew up in church and went to Sunday School. And had a Mom and Dad at home who loved and cared for us and who taught us from this Bible. We were so blessed and yet we did not know it. We didn't realize it. Or we didn't care about it or whatever. We went our own separate ways.

Finally, thanks to the goodness of God and through His mercy and His grace we were able to come to the knowledge of the truth that we were lost. We came to realize that we were separated from God. If we didn't let God change our life, then we were doomed for a terrible, a terrible eternity. We were doomed for hell, weren't we? No question. We were doomed. We were forever separated from God.

An example of that is Lazarus and the rich man. When you read that account, how can there be any doubt that there is a separation? The rich man begged the angels to give his family a chance. It was not granted. (St. Luke 16:19-31) We won't have another chance, will we dear ones?

So he starts out, "...speak thou the things which become sound doctrine:" Titus 2:1. Sound doctrine is very simple, dear ones. It is Jesus Christ and Him crucified. That's it! It is not a mystery. It is not something that we need to spend hours and hours and hours studying. It is Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

He goes on to remind all of us. First he talks to the aged men. I, years back, didn't think that time would ever come for me. But it has arrived. We all grow older, don't we, one day at a time. The years slip by. If the Lord, if it is His will, we become older. Here he has some advice for us who are older.

"That the aged men be sober, grave, temperate, sound in faith, in charity, in patience." Titus 2:2. So we have something to do, don't we brothers? We have something to do. Something that will occupy our time through the rest of our days.

Why is it important? Why is it important to be sober and to be grave and to be temperate? To be sound in the faith and charity - that's love - and in patience?

Patience - we tend to learn that through tribulation the Word tells us. Tribulations are not always pleasant. Sometimes they are pretty hard. But they serve a purpose.

As we look around about and we see the younger generations coming along, we know, we know that if God permits time to go on and the generation which are children now, to get to the point and age in time that many of us are now, they are going to see a lot of changes. Because when we look back over our lives, we have seen a lot of changes too. They have not all been for the good.

But in our most holy faith, which we love and cherish so much. as I look back over my life and I remember some of those old brothers and those old sisters who were pillars in the church when I was in Sunday School, that generation is gone. But I remember their steadfastness as we read here of all of these things that are mentioned. Sober, grave, temperate, sound in faith, in love and in patience. And I draw from that a great strength today. Because I know now those dear souls went through trials and tribulations too. And they endured and they went on to their reward. A blessed reward.

Likewise for us, only our battle is not over, because we are still here. We are still facing that adversary, Satan. We are facing him every day. But probably most of you, as I have, have kind of followed a little bit of what is going on over in the middle east, in the battles that rage. That is a physical battle and there are people dying and there is great turmoil and distress in that area of the country and of the world right now. They are facing trials and tribulations that we don't know anything about, for the most part.

But, dear ones, our battle, in addition to the things that go on in our

physical lives, is our spiritual battle. Our spiritual battle. That is where being sound in the faith, that we can portray that, not only to our children but to our grandchildren and then to those even outside of our family. To our church family. It is so important. If we don't portray Jesus Christ and His love and what He does in our life, if we can't portray that and get that message across, then the message they are going to get is the one that the world wants them to have. And the one that the world wants them to have will lead them down a road that they really don't want to go. But they don't know that. So we have a lot of work to do.

The next verse talks to the sisters, to the older, "...aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine. teachers of good things; That they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children," Titus 2:3,4. There is no more important thing. I believe, as I have viewed the situation where, in my surroundings, where we see men and women running here and there, doing things, having families, children scattered here and there, single parents or whatever. And why? Oh, we could think of a lot of reasons. Compatibility possibly. But a lot of it comes down to the point, they were never taught. They were never taught. Dear ones, we are so blessed because we have not only the knowledge, but we have the ability even as the Word tells us. For the older to teach the younger.

We don't want to leave the teaching of the most precious thing that we have, our children, to somebody who doesn't believe in Jesus Christ and our God. But our children are going to learn something. They are going to learn whatever they learn from somebody. From somebody. That somebody needs to be those who care.

Verse 5 tells us, "To be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God be not blasphemed." Titus 2:5. So it is a teaching process, isn't it? I remember when I was younger, and I am sure you all do too. We wanted to learn but we didn't always want somebody telling us what to do. Remember those days? Maybe you were not as stubborn as I was. But I didn't always like to be told what to do. But I learned over the years, some of the things, some of the lessons that I learned that you might say the hard way were probably some of the best lessons I ever learned. But it is an ongoing process. We are still learning today. None of us in this assembly can say I have learned all I need to know. Because we haven't. There are things we will learn as we continue down life's way.

It talks to young men. We have a lot of young men in our assembly. "...likewise exhort to be sober minded. In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you." Titus 2:6-8. There are a lot of words that were said there that have a lot of meaning. A lot of meaning. It was addressed to the young men but I think we can all take parts of this and apply it to our life. For example, sound speech that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed.

As we go about our lives, wherever that may be, in whatever area of whatever we do, some of us probably stay pretty close to home. Some of us may travel quite a bit and get into lots and lots of different places throughout the week. But wherever it is, it does not make any difference. God has given each one of us a place, a spot where we need to be. Because that is where we are right now. In due time, God may change that. But right now, wherever you are or wherever I am, that is where we need to be, because that is where God has put us.

So taking that into account, what do we need to do? We read a lot of things, but I think this verse eight, sound speech - that means that we are on track. We are not saying something else just because our brother or our sister or somebody that knows us because we claim to be this or that, is not there so we might veer off into something else. Dear ones, that is not sound speech. Sound speech is what the Apostle Paul was warning Titus, and he is warning us today, that we need to stay on track. We don't need to go off on a side track. We need to stay on the track. We need to head towards the goal. That goal is heaven. We want to get there. The Word tells us how to get there. But we have a deceiver.

Then he says, "Sound speech, that cannot be condemned..." Titus 2:8. So nobody can say, well you know, this guy or this woman, they say two different things. One time it is talking this way and that is not sound speech. We want to be very, very careful because there are those who are watching us. There are those who are watching us.

In my workplace and no doubt in yours, people view us, if they know us, because they see us every day. They know for my part that I am a minister. They expect, because they know me, they expect certain things of me. If they see me do something else, they are going to think, what is going on? Believe me, they do. So we need to be careful. Because we are a minister. You are a minister and I am a minister of God, not because we are on a pulpit, but because we are in the world and we live here and we are God's children. We don't want to forget that and that is what he is saying. That he that doesn't believe, or she, won't be able to stand up and say, I don't want to be like them because look how wishy-washy they are! Sound speech.

Likewise, if they can't find something wrong, then they are not going to speak evil of us, are they? And thoughts can be placed in their hearts and in their minds. That they would question: what are they doing? What have they got? I would like some of that. It is an opportunity to share the gospel. But if we are wishy-washy, it will never happen.

There are so many in this world that need Jesus Christ. And you and I, you and I dear ones, God has placed where we are to be a minister for Him.

It goes on and he tells here to, "Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters..." Titus 2:9. Back in the time when Paul wrote this there were many who were slaves. To be a slave, it is hard for us to relate to what that would be like. We read about things that happened, even in this country years and years ago where there were slaves. But that was common practice. And here there is an exhortation to them.

In verse 11 we read, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men," Titus 2:11. We know that because God has revealed that to us through His Word. He sent Jesus Christ. We know the story. We know how He came and how He was born and how He lived a perfect example. And He died on the cross.

Elder Brother Andy Stoller was just with us Wednesday night. He shared the Memorandum with us. I am sure you have had that done here. But as he shared that with us and went through some of the statistics that were in there of how many people that claim to be Christians don't believe that Christ ever rose from the grave. And how many people that claim to be Christians don't believe in the Holy Spirit. Amazing, isn't it?!

And we think Satan hasn't been successful with his message of deception? Sounds like he has been very successful. But you know what? He is not satisfied with maybe 48%. Because he doesn't have you and he doesn't have me. So he wants us. He wants us to be part of that group that believe parts of this Bible but don't believe it all. He wants to destroy you and he wants to destroy me.

How does he want that destruction to come about? For us to be separated from God. He wants to take us all to hell. That is what he wants. It will only be by the grace of God and our diligence to remain true and faithful that will prevent him from being successful.

Dear ones, we have a lot to do, don't we? Not just to be the light and an example in the world that we live in, but to keep ourselves the example of a true child of God.



"My Father's Conversion" continues. It tells of the religious experience of J. Andrew Braun in 1844 in Switzerland. He had his own ideas, but then God directed him according to His will. In last month's issue reference was made to the Jungling Verein, which was (in some ways) the Swiss equivilant of the YMCA. He continues his conversation with a man at that place.

My Father's Conversion – Part II

Searching

"I want to go to the Missionary House in Basel to become a Missionary." This desire became stronger and stronger in my father's heart; for from that time on when the voice above mentioned told him that he was a sinner, he wanted to begin a better life.

In reply to this the assistant asked, "Have you inclinations for things of this kind?" to which my father answered in the affirmative. In answer to this, the assistant further said, "You have come in the right house, for here you can become a Missionary without studying."

This claim so surprised my father that he said to himself he had better not stay here because these people must be religious fanatics, which at best would mislead him; for he contended in his heart that it was unheard of that a man could become a Missionary without studying in a school. But before he could tear himself loose, the proprietor arrived, and this assistant told him of the religious inclinations of this young man and that he had also applied for work.

The Word of God

The proprietor at once promised to give him work and also entered into a conversation with him opening to him the Bible where the Lord said to His disciples in Matthew 28:18-20: "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." These verses my father read quickly, and closing the Bible handed it to this proprietor saying, "I find nothing very striking in this"; then this Brother said, "Let me read it to you."

When this Brother read it to him my father said, "Now I do see something in it, for according to the word of the Lord, men should first be taught and through such teaching should be convinced of their lost condition and of the necessity of being baptized that they should ask for baptism after having been thoroughly convinced of the necessity of the same, and that it should come of their own free will and that after souls had been baptized they were then to be taught to observe all things whatsoever He had commanded His disciples."

Witness of Truth

To this the Brother replied, "That is the entire message of reconciliation to God and unto future living in newness of life." My father meditated over this a little while, and then said, "According to this message of scripture the Lutheran Church of which I am a member does not stand on the ground of the Word of God, for they baptize infants that cannot renounce the world nor yearn for newness of life."

To this the Brother said, "The Lutheran Church does not stand on the ground of the Word of God." This was so repulsive to my father that he resolved not to accept work here, but to go further because it was inconceivable to him that a church so numerous as the Lutheran Church could be wrong, but this Brother easily convinced him by the life of many of the Lutherans and the conviction that my father had in his heart that he was a sinner helped very much to this convincement so that he admitted in his heart and to this Brother that the Lutheran Church must not be founded and grounded upon the Word of God. But alas, at the same moment he looked across the Rhine and saw the monument of Martin Luther, which caused him to say, "If the Lutheran Church is not founded upon the Word of God, then it must be that Luther himself was not what he should have been." To this, this Brother said, "Luther was not what he should have been." This was another severe trial for my father because he loved Martin Luther to such an extent that he would have gone to war for him, and again he resolved in his heart not to accept work here but to go further.

Making a Change

At this last resolution however, he was reminded of the fact how on his way he prayed twice without premeditation that the Lord should lead him into a house where he would hear the truth. So he accepted work. This Brother then gave him literature written by Bro. S.H. Froehlich. When he had read this he was through with the Lutheran Church, and Martin Luther whom he loved so dearly he commended to the Lord. Shortly after this he said to this Brother, "I would like to become converted also, but I do not know how to go about it." To this, this Brother replied, "That is not so inconceivable; do just the same as I did. Namely, ask the Lord to show you all of your sins and to give you a penitent heart that you can repent for your sins and that the Lord forgive you your sins so you can have peace with God in your heart, but above all things ask the Lord to give you grace that you can become liberated from the power of Satan, for I know out of my own experience and also from the Word of God that you as well as every natural man is bound in one way or another to sin against his better judgment and will."

Proving and Baptism

This my father did and in the course of about six months he was proved and baptized by Bro. S.H. Froehlich in the congregation at Strassburg where he gave a good testimony of his firm belief in Christ Jesus as his Saviour.

After this he remained in Strassburg for several years enjoying the spiritual care of Bro. Froehlich together with the blessing which the Lord gave in the church at Strassburg; all of which had its good results.

"Out of the East" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

Several years ago I was visiting my Aunt Martha Heubach in Morton's Restmor Nursing Home when I noticed that she talked repeatedly about watching the eastern sky for the Lord's return. I neglected to ask her what makes her think our Lord is coming from the east, but I've done a lot of thinking about it. I've never been able to find the words, "eastern sky" in the King James Bible, so I assumed there was no scriptural basis for the statement. However, recently I've been thinking that Matthew 24:27 may be the basis for it. "For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of Man be." This scripture indicates that Christ will indeed appear much as lightning which comes out of the east and is visible all across the sky, even all the way to the western horizon.

Other references in the Bible to "the east" include this scripture which was spoken by the wise men who came looking for the Christ child. Matthew 2:2, "Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him." Also, the previous verse reads, "There came wise men from the east to Jerusalem." The wise men came from the east and they saw Christ's star in the east.

In Revelation 21:13, the heavenly city Jerusalem is described as follows: "On the east three gates; on the north three gates; on the south three gates; and on the west three gates." The eastern gates are mentioned first, as if they are the most important.

To add to the mystery I sometimes find myself singing spontaneously the song, "The Eastern Gate" written by I.G. Martin, copyright 1933. The song begins with the statement, "I will meet you in the morning, just inside the eastern gate." The second verse begins with the words, "If you hasten off to glory, linger near the eastern gate." Where did I.G. Martin get the idea that the eastern gate is such a good place to meet? It must have something to do with the concept of morning, and of heaven being a new beginning. In the morning, the sun comes up in the east, not in the west. When we speak of sunset, it may mean the end of life here on earth, but that sunset is closely followed by a gorgeous sunrise, if we belong to the Lord. The words of songs are not scripture but the authors of hymns usually get their inspiration from scripture.

In European and American cultures, historically, it is western civilization which has been emphasized. However, I would classify Israel as more eastern than western.

The conclusion of the whole matter is that the east is emphasized in the Bible and in spiritual thinking in general. Indeed, it may be well for us to face the east when looking for the return of the Lord Jesus Christ and it may be a good idea for us to meet just inside the eastern gate when we reach Heaven.
