

The Filver Lining



Sermon by Elder Brother Mark Bahr, Detroit, MI Isaiah 44:21-28 and II Corinthians 13

Beautiful words of life. As we read these two scriptures together, from the beautiful Old Testament book Isaiah, and as we read then from the New Testament, second book of Corinthians, were there particular words that seemed to stand out to you? Undoubtedly, if we were to have the opportunity to go through and just momentarily check each of us, certain verses, certain thoughts touched our hearts. It is the way it is when we read the Word. The Word is quick and it has the ability to quicken the heart and soul of man.

One of the opportunities we have this afternoon hour is to come, just as the scripture exhorted us to come. To come honestly and to come with this awareness so beautifully described in Isaiah 44. This awareness of who we are in the light of our Creator, almighty God.

The scripture says simply, it is given unto man once to die, after that the judgment. (Hebrews 9:27) That is where we are at today, loved ones. It is given unto man once to die, after that the judgment.

We shared together, we prayed together, we acknowledged John 3:16, a verse that perhaps many of us learned as children in Sunday School or upon our mother's or our father's knees. We learned that God so loved the world that He gave Jesus Christ.

So the first verse that we read in Isaiah 44 begins with an exhortation that we want to utilize today. Way back in the Old Testament, in the early books of the Old Testament, Joshua and the men of God were leading the people. They had come through the Jordan River. God in His wisdom inspired some of those Godly leaders at that time and He said, select some people to go back and bring some stones from the river and establish a memorial. So that when future generations come by and they see this memorial of stones, they will ask, what are the stones? And the scripture says, when they ask, tell them. Tell them what is the memorial. Tell them that that is the time when God, almighty God, our God provided for His people. (Joshua 4:1-7) That is exactly

what He wants to do for us today.

The first verse we read says, "Remember these, O Jacob..." (Isaiah 44:21). Remember O Jacob. Jacob and Israel. Just beautiful portions of people or groups of people in an era of time that represented the very heart of God. God loved them. And He loves you and me today. He cares and He knows what every one of us are dealing with today.

We all, I would expect, walked in through the same or similar doors this morning and this afternoon. God knows exactly what is in our heart. So when He says, "Remember these, O Jacob and Israel; for thou art my servant: I have formed thee; thou art my servant: O Israel, thou shalt not be forgotten of me." (Isaiah 44:21). God knows us and He loves us. He wants to share with us the kingdom of heaven. So let's consider some of the instructions given in these later verses.

Verse twenty two says, "I have blotted out, as a thick cloud, thy transgressions, and, as a cloud, thy sins: return unto me; for I have redeemed thee." (Isaiah 44:22). Where are we at in that process of redemption and returning? Have we yet returned unto our Creator?

There is within every one of us a living soul. There is a need. There is an absolute, inherent need within us as God created us, to someday return unto our Creator. To know Him. So the exhortation is, remember I have formed thee, thou art my servant.

But the next verse says remember also that He has the ability to forgive sin. To blot out iniquity and for us to know that we have been redeemed. Jesus Christ Himself, while He was walking upon this earth, He left us an invitation that to this day is both tender and powerful. Jesus Christ said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." (St. Matthew 11:28,29).

How does that balance against the turmoil of the day in which we live? That is the same Jesus Christ, the Redeemer. He wants to redeem us from our sin. So we have an opportunity here to be reminded that, "Thus saith the Lord, thy redeemer, and he that formed thee from the womb, I am the Lord that maketh all things..." Isaiah 44:24.

So one of the questions as we read this Isaiah scripture, that we want to diligently and honestly answer individually, is knowing we have once been formed and created by almighty God, have we been born again? Have we been

Nearly every child of God experiences severe trials at some point in his life. Sometimes the situation lasts long enough and is severe enough that it can test the faith of even the most faithful of God's people.

When the test is strong enough and long enough to cause us to ask questions, it can also make us feel guilty for questioning God. Sometimes we ask what we did to cause the problem? Why do others find relief and we don't? Why are there those who seem to ignore God and live wicked lives and yet prosper? Why does God allow these things to happen? Will it ever end?

Most of these questions have been asked for thousands of years by various individuals who were trying to do God's will and yet suffered significant problems.

When Jesus' disciples saw a man who was blind from his birth, they asked, "...Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind? Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him" (Jn. 9:3-4). Jesus healed the man of his blindness and he promptly faced another problem.

The Pharisees soon found fault because the man was healed on the Sabbath day. The man who had been given sight was then put through a severe trial, including being cast out of the synagogue. Through faith he was able to gain a clearer understanding of who Jesus was. Through the ordeal, Jesus opened his physical and his spiritual eyes so he could see clearly.

The trials that come upon us are not necessarily related to our behavior. There are times when our behavior can be the cause of tribulation, but there are also times when our trials come for no apparent reason, and God can use this as an opportunity to make Himself manifest to others. There are also times when God uses adversity in our lives to help us grow in our faith.

We can read numerous accounts in which requests for healing were granted immediately. When Jairus' daughter died, Jesus went and raised her from the dead (Mt. 9:18-25). The high priest's servant whose ear was cut off was healed with a touch of Jesus' hand (Lk. 22:51). We can read of the multitudes that came to Jesus and were healed (Mt. 14:36; Mt. 15:30). Although we do not know the length of time those in the multitude suffered, we know they were healed at the time that they requested healing from Jesus.

How Long, O Lord, How Long?

There are other situations where healing was requested but not granted. Paul besought the Lord three times that his thorn in the flesh could be removed and he was told "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness" (II Cor. 12:9). Eleven of the twelve original disciples endured hardship for the Lord. Ten of them suffered a martyr's death. John was exiled on the Isle of Patmos. Not all who ask are granted relief. However, all who ask in faith can receive grace to endure.

Earthly blessings do not always come to those who are faithful and are not always denied to the wicked. The poor widow who gave all she had (two mites) was credited with giving more than those who gave much. We do not read that she became wealthy in this life for her faithfulness. The churches in Macedonia "...in great trial of affliction ...and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality ...beyond their power..." (II Cor. 8:2-3) gave - but they remained poor.

Job tells us that sometimes the wicked prosper. They become "mighty in power ...their seed is established ...their houses are safe from fear... their cow calveth...their children dance" (Job 21:7-11). Solomon wrote that "...there is a wicked man that prolongeth his life..." (Ecc. 7:15). The laborers who only worked in the vineyard one hour were made equal to those who bore the burden of the day (Mt. 20:1-16).

Why does God allow these things to happen? Does He not care? God has always allowed mankind to have a choice. God does allow sin although He hates it. "I hate every false way ...vain thoughts ...lying..." (Ps. 119:104; 113; 163). Many other references to God's hatred of sin could be cited. Since God hates sin, why does He allow it, especially when it hurts His people? Perhaps it would be more accurate to say God allows mankind to make choices, to choose to do good or evil, to choose to obey God or to disobey Him.

Since we know God has allowed us to have a free will of serving Him or rejecting Him, it is not beneficial to simply ask why God allows evil. It may be more beneficial to ask why mankind chooses to do evil even if it hurts us or others. That is not an easy question to answer. The Apostle Paul addressed this question in his epistle to the Romans where he wrote of the carnal and the spiritual mind.

Paul recognized that Satan can cause us to even do things we hate as long as we are under the carnal mind. He recognized that there was no good thing that dwells in the flesh. In himself he found the desire to do good, but in himself he found no way to perform the good. When left to the carnal mind, we would not do good but rather do evil.

Paul's struggle of the flesh versus the spirit is a struggle that each of us faces in our life. He found that he could never achieve the spiritual mind through the law. But God, by "...sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh; and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh; that righteousness...might be fulfilled ...not after the flesh, but after the spirit" (Ro. 8:3-4).

The afflictions that we endure may come from our struggle of the carnal versus the spiritual mind. However, they may also come as a result of the wickedness of others. After the Lamb opened the fifth seal, those who had been slain for the Word of God asked, "How long, O Lord, holy and true, dost thou not judge and avenge our blood ...and it was said unto them that they should rest yet for a little season, until their fellow servants also and their brethren should be killed..." (Rev. 6:10-11).

How long will it continue? God knows the limit of our endurance. "He ...will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it" (I Cor. 10:13). Perhaps the affliction will last as long as someone will benefit from it, and then "God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes;..." (Rev. 21:4).

Kitchener Church

The Kitchener, Ontario church is located in the tiny town of Heidleberg, nestled in the rolling hills of central Canada. It is situated on the western edge of Kitchener-Waterloo, an area with a very diverse European immigrant community.

Two miles from church is North America's largest year round farmer's market, where locals go weekly to buy produce and maple syrup, fresh bread and meat and other items while tourists peruse the many crafts and country accents. From church, the spectacular Niagara Falls is a two-hour drive southeast and Toronto, a major international center, is an hour's drive to the east.

History

The Kitchener church first started holding worship services in July 1981 in the home of Wladimir and Margaret Fortenbacher. These brethren, who hail from Europe, came from our sister-church in Kitchener (Nazarean brethren). Visiting ministers would travel many miles from our various American churches to conduct worship services once a month. Brethren met on the other Sundays to listen to previously recorded sermons from among our churches. As more souls began attending, visiting ministers began to hold services twice a month. Many of our ministers continued to lend themselves in conducting worship services for the local brethren and friends. This visiting minister schedule continues to be a blessing to us (Hebrews 6:10).

On Labor Day weekend of 1989, about 30 brethren from Kansas were expected. This spawned a search for a more permanent place to worship and facilitate larger groups. A small stone church was found for that weekend. Rental arrangements were then made for a 2-year period. As there were no facilities available, services were held only in the mornings. Three church weddings were conducted in the old church.

In September of 1995, an old schoolhouse became available and we were able to rent it for morning/ afternoon Sunday services and Saturday evening hymn sings. At this point, attendance continued to grow and mid-week worship services were added. It was at this location that Bro. Mike Ursu was appointed to serve in the ministry on June 13, 1998. Our last worship service in the schoolhouse was held on May 16, 1999.

New edifice

Having reviewed our need, the North American Building Committee of our Mission Committee facilitated site visits, building plans and majority funding for a new permanent place of worship. Groundbreaking for the new church location was in October of 1998. Without the help of the Lord, this project would not have been possible. Many willing brethren and friends spent countless hours volunteering at the church job site. Local brethren, retired brothers from the sisterchurch, and dedicated brethren from our various churches in America traveled many miles to greatly assist in the work (I Chronicles 28:21).

The first worship services were held in the new building on May 19, 1999. The church dedication was held on October 5, 1999. Elder Bros. Dale Eisenmann (Chicago, IL), Aaron Steffen (Alto, MI) and Mark Bahr shared the work of the day. At the new church location, the first wedding was conducted in February of 2000 and the first baptism was held on July 30, 2000.

Description

The 3.5 acre site of the new church is located at the eastern part of the small town of Heidelberg. Spruce trees line the driveway up to the 5,600 sq. ft. red brick church building. The sanctuary seats 120, and along with the fellowship and dining areas, meets our needs quite well.

We have been blessed abundantly with children, and currently have more children than adults. We now conduct three Sunday school classes by using the classrooms in the morning and afternoon, during worship services. Once a month, we hold a Sunday evening church hymn sing or a potluck/hymn sing in a family home. On alternate visiting minister weekends, we have a Saturday evening church hymn sing.

Area opportunities


The area has two major universities, the home offices of several corporations as well as three large insurance companies. Jobs are available for those with skilled trades. You Can Answer a Needy Child's Prayer

The classroom is filled with students singing praises to the Lord. As we listen closely, we recognize many of the melodies that we sing in our own congregations. Next we witness student after student, from the smallest pre-schooler to the older 6th graders, stand to recite passages from the Bible. We see smiles and shy glances and much enthusiasm to show us what they are learning.



This describes one of the schools with which the Apostolic Christian Child Sponsorship Program is affiliated. This particular school is situated near the southern coast of Haiti with the ocean waves heard in the background. Students walk as much as an hour to reach a similar neighboring school that sits on a high hill with a steep grade.

These schools, although crowded with sometimes 6 grades in one room, are bright and cheery with sunlight streaming through the windows. However, some of its sister schools are located in the city with dark classrooms and children packed together on benches. Even in these difficult circumstances the Word of God is being taught to them, and they also sing and recite memory verses. Along with the Bible being taught in all of the schools, the children also learn reading and writing, mathematics, history, and languages.

It is a wonderful opportunity for the children fortunate enough to be able to attend these church affiliated schools. The Apostolic Christian Child Sponsorship Program is under the umbrella of the National World Relief Committee. It is a vehicle for members and friends of the Apostolic Christian Churches to share a small portion of their blessings to pay for tuition for these children to attend school. The Child Sponsorship Program is affiliated with schools in Haiti, Jamaica, and Mexico. These schools all offer the children a Christian education where they learn about Jesus.

We have many children in our files that are in need of sponsors now. For the future, we see no end in sight of the number of students that need support from caring brethren. Although the program has grown to around 600 children and 80 schools, the need remains. The cost to sponsor a child is \$25 per month for a Mexican or Jamaican student and \$21 per month for a Haitian student.

The students participating in the program are some of the poorest of the poor from these economically distressed countries. Sponsorship donations help to pay for school uniforms, books and supplies, teacher salaries and, in some cases, help for the family. The Jamaican children are all deaf students and come from all areas of the island. Your sponsorship would allow them to live on the campus and receive food and housing, as well as a Christian education and the means to learn sign language. They will be able to communicate on a meaningful basis for the first time in their lives.

Harvest Surprise of Empty Pods

reformed? Have we come to that point in our lives?

What we experienced last night with the testimony of our loved one, as it is in each of our lives who have been born again, and as our custom is in our church to witness the testimony of the conversion process - what has God worked in our lives? It is a beautiful opportunity for the church. It takes every one of us back to that moment of beginning. When it was just as in the book of Genesis chapter 1, "In the beginning God created..." (Genesis 1:1). We must all come to that beginning again when we allow God to create in us a new heart and a right spirit.

So the scripture says, "Thus saith the Lord ... that formed thee from the womb..." (Isaiah 44:24). Brother Gene read and as the Lord provided so beautifully in the exhortation, we are reminded of the second coming, of the Lord coming again, in the morning hour service. The tremendous, the tremendous importance, the absolute importance of you and me as individuals being prepared. To know that our name is written in the Lamb's book of life, in so much that if our name is not written in the book, the Lord's book, that we cannot enter into heaven (Revelation 21:27). That is the scripture.

We want to experience and now we have in the New Testament scripture, exhortations to help all of us. Certainly anyone who has yet to know Jesus Christ as Lord and as Savior, come back to Isaiah 44. Actually we could go to many Isaiah scriptures, couldn't we? We could go to the beautiful Isaiah scripture that gives us such a beautiful starting point when we begin to seriously evaluate where we stand with almighty God.

In the last chapter it says simply this is the Lord's words, "...but to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word." (Isaiah 66:2). So if we do not know, if the testimony in our heart is not that my redeemer liveth, as Job was able to testify of old (Job 19:25), then let's humbly entreat God to lead us.

It is little different than it was when

Peter was walking on the water. He was in faith walking toward the Lord upon the water and then he began to sink. In that moment, we don't read a paragraph of what Peter asked for. It is simply, Lord help, "...Lord, save me." (St. Matthew 14:30).

In humility we will touch the heart of God. We will begin that opportunity. We will provide God the opportunity to begin reforming us. To create in us a heart and a mind that loves the Lord Jesus Christ.

Let's now go to this beautiful New Testament second scripture reading. We have exhortation that is good for every one of us. Particularly, we might look at this and say, it seems like there is special preparation there, special exhortation for brethren. Loved ones who have been walking with the Lord. They know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. They know Jesus Christ as the Apostle Paul prayed and expressed he wanted to know the Lord. He wanted to know His resurrection, but he also wanted to know the crucifixion. He wanted to know the crucified Lord.

When we acknowledge that many are the times it takes a lot of grace for us to learn to know the crucified Lord, yet as we look at verses such as this, it says simply the Apostle Paul was coming back, not once, perhaps not twice. It says, "This is the third time I am coming to you..." (II Corinthians 13:1).

Remember in the New Testament when Jesus Christ left that beautiful parable about the fig tree? (St. Luke 13:6-9) They came upon the fig tree, the husbandman, and there was no fruit. The initial thought was "...cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?" (St. Luke 13:7). And the scripture says simply, no, there is additional time needed. But with that time comes a responsibility.

It says "...A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none." (St. Luke 13:6). Are we today, bearing fruit? Brethren, brothers and sisters to the Lord Jesus Christ, are we fruit bearing? So shall ye be my disciples, saith the Lord. (St. John 15:8)

This scripture says, "Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?" (St. Luke 13:7). And he that had the fig tree planted said, "...Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung it.: And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down." (St. Luke 13:8,9). Where are we in that time frame? Has the Lord entreated us once? Twice? Three times? Are we walking but by the mercy of God today?

This scripture says, "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith " (II Corinthians 13:5). Examine yourselves. That is such a probing type of word. We understand quite readily, we understand the concept of examination. We grow up with the examination process: preparation, moment of evaluation, then results. We understand, all of us, we have all gone through it, we understand the predictability associated with preparation. It is exactly the way God means it for us. There is not a moment in the thought process of God, as we learn to know the mind of God in the Word, where He intends to deceive us. Rather He prepares us as a father does his children.

Scripture says the Apostle Paul was exhorting that we as spiritual fathers and mothers, if we could use that context, want to exhort and to charge and to comfort those that are our children, as a father would. That is exactly the way God wants to work with us. He wants us to be prepared.

So this afternoon hour is another day of grace, an afternoon, a moment in our busy lives when we can honestly, just as these words say, we can come honestly before God and say, "Lord please show me what I need to do in my life." Just as every convert at one moment, comes to that moment of truth.

There is another example in scripture. We speak to it as the story of the prodigal son. (St. Luke 15:11-32) A young man that we read, asked for his inheritance and went and spent it with riotous living. In his desperation of vanity and emptiness in his life, there is a little verse in that chapter that says something that is very powerful for us today. It says, "...he came to himself..."

(St. Luke 15:17) and said I must go home. I must return.

The same scripture exhortation that we read in Isaiah 44, return oh Israel. (44:22) Return. And by faith we want to be the Israel of God. By faith we want to be the promised seed of Abraham. There are moments in our lives for us to realize that, that we must return.

So this scripture says, "Examine yourselves..." (II Corinthians 13:5). Exactly what the prodigal son began to do. He came to himself and said I must return. He came back to his father and he said something that to this day, when we say it in truth and humility, touches the heart of the father. "...Father, I have sinned ...and am no more worthy..." (St. Luke 15:21). But please have mercy upon me.

When we feel that in our heart, when that is spoken in truth and humility, the heart of God deals with us as it dealt with people of old when they sought God in repentance. God says I love you and I will show you the way. The way will often be revealed to us when we begin to examine ourselves, whether we be in the faith. Whether we be in the faith.

We know this is important because we go later in scripture, back in the book of Jude and there is an exhortation that is intended to inspire every one of us. It says, "...earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." (Jude 1:3). Earnestly contend for the faith. We are walking, we are living, we are part of a spiritual battle today, brethren. We know that. We experience it every day. And lest we have the spiritual mind, lest we compete, lest we are armed with the armor of God, we are unprepared.

To make spiritual discernments, the scripture says we need the spiritual mind. One of the ways to develop the spiritual mind is to do just what the scripture says. We read it so beautifully in that twelfth chapter of Romans. It says simply, "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." (Romans 12:2). Have we been transformed by the grace of almighty God?

The scripture says simply, we are saved by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8). We certainly began with that faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, His death, the shedding of His blood and His resurrection. We believe in the hope of eternal life.

But there is grace required also. There is the initial grace that enables us to make the beginning and there is grace that enables us to walk victoriously. We are saved by grace through faith.

So when we examine ourselves, whether we be in the faith, that could be a beginning point in us in our lives or for loved ones who have walked perhaps weeks or months or years or decades, it can be a moment when we draw nigh to God again. We have again renewed within our lives a new spirit and a clean heart. Because there is a need for that, lest we be reprobates. It is a word that is used a few different times in scripture.

Remember back in the book of Ecclesiastes, the word vexed is used numerous times? (Ecclesiastes 1:14,17, 2:11,17,22,26, 4:4,6,16, 6:9) The vanities of life can vex our lives. There was the time Lot, we read in the New Testament, was living in the midst of evil and the scripture says living there vexed his life. (II Peter 2:7,8)

Reprobate can work somewhat like that. There are degrees within the Word, apparently, according to scripture. There is the reprobate stage when we are somewhat frustrating the grace of God. We are just walking contrary and we are frustrating the grace of God. That reprobate state, if not corrected, can progress further down that same path of the Word. We can actually get to a point to where we are essentially cast off and no longer accepted by the Lord Himself. We want so much to avoid that.

Thus within the same Word that says examine yourself, where are we today within the eye of faith and the Word? Lest we become reprobate. So let's do that brethren. Let's seriously, honestly, humbly inquire, how is it with our soul today, if it is, as we were reading in the morning hour, if today were to be that day when God calls us home. So whether the Lord returns or whether our time expires here upon earth, after that, the judgment. We examine ourselves today. We judge ourselves today that we be prepared and unashamed when we stand before the Lord.

The seventh verse says, "Now I pray to God that ye do no evil..." (II Corinthians 13:7). Think about the simplicity, the directness of that verse. I pray to God that ye do no evil. When is the last time you have earnestly, on your knees, prayed for a loved one that they do no evil? When is the last time that you entreated almighty God that today, Lord, keep me from evil?

We go through life and we make many, many decisions. Some of them seemingly smaller decisions, some of them great decisions. When we have large decisions to make, often we will slow down and we will take more time. Today is one of those days, too. Here the Apostle said I pray to God that ye do no evil.

When we take time to entreat God for direction in our decision making process, if we are on the wrong track, we will feel a conviction with that. God will give us an opportunity to maybe have a need in our heart to seek counsel. Maybe the opportunity will simply be a few moments of conviction that says, this doesn't seem right. Don't plow through that moment of hesitation. Rather take a moment and ask the Lord to further reveal truth. Because when we walk in truth, when we make decisions that are aligned with the Word, we will have a peace that also is in accordance with the instruction in the Word.

So it says, "Now I pray to God that ye do no evil; not that we should appear approved, but that ye should do that which is honest..." (II Corinthians 13:7). But that ye should do that which is honest. It is hard to differentiate, to separate honesty from integrity. Similar words. We would acknowledge them not exact, but very similar. We have beautiful exhortations in the Word encouraging us to have honesty, have integrity actually operating in our lives.

We read in the Psalms and Proverbs, the psalmist so often was able to express to us living words that today, they impact our lives, if we incorporate them

into our lives..

Notice this little verse in the Psalms. It simply says, "Let integrity and uprightness preserve me; for I wait on thee." (Psalm 25:21). Let integrity and uprightness preserve me; for I wait on thee. Then there is a little verse later in Proverbs that gives us a similar exhortation. That we are to walk in our integrity. (Proverbs 20:7) So we as parents wanting to leave an example, a legacy of truth and faith for those that come after us that we love, let's walk in our integrity.

Here that was a part of the exhortation of the Apostle Paul to people he loved. Walk honestly. So that we can come down to verse eleven that says simply, "Finally, brethren..." (II Corinthians 13:11). Finally brethren. The scripture over and over again does this. We will have an exhortation, a scripture of beautiful words. Then there is a summary. This is somewhat that kind of a verse.

"...Be perfect, be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you." (II Corinthians 13:11). Be of one mind, be of good comfort and live in peace. It comes from a heart of brotherly love. Brother to brother, sister to sister we greet with a holy kiss. Within that greeting is many things. It is an instant leveling. We meet as brother to brother, sister to sister. We esteem one another higher than ourselves. Inherent within that greeting of love is a wish, an acknowledgement for the blessings of the Lord. An acknowledgement that we share a brotherhood, a kinship that is built on the shed blood of Jesus Christ. Let us never forget that. Let us always honor it. That it can be as it is in verse fourteen, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen." (II Corinthians 13:14).

The book inventory is computerized, and the personnel at Bluffton can drop ship to nearly any address.



This concludes the series entitled "My Father's Conversion", the account of how J. Andrew Braun came into the faith in Switzerland.

A Petition

Later on my father, together with Bro. Michael Reuter, one of the converts and a well to do and highly respected citizen of Schweinfurt brought a petition written by Bro. S. H. Froehlich before the King asking to be tolerated in the continuance of this work.

At the Royal Palace they were met by a Chamberlain who after he had ascertained the nature of their mission asked them whether they were of royal birth to which they answered in the negative. This Chamberlain's reply was, "We have strict orders not to allow any person to meet His Majesty the King unless they are of royal descent." However, he directed them through a number of stairways and hallways to where they would find another Chamberlain who was stationed at the King's door. He said this Chamberlain would receive their petition and forward the same to the King.

After having thus delivered their petition they returned home. It was not until a long, long time after this when a reply came from the King, but alas it was a very unkind one. It read as follows:

"Maximilian II, by the Grace of God, King of Bavaria, has the pleasure of commanding that this new sect shall be combated with all the stringency of the law." From that time on, things went from bad to worse in such a degree that it became almost intolerable.

A Harsh Decree

One of the things that happened was that my father was called before the Judge who was instructed to prevail upon him to sign a paper binding himself not to hold any more religious meetings. This Judge tried with all earnestness to have my father sign this paper but my father replied, "If you demand that I shall leave the land of my nativity, that I can do. If you demand that I shall go on the executioner's scaffold, that I can also do. But, I cannot promise not to hold any more religious meetings.

To this the Judge said, "There is nothing which demands your leaving the country nor is there anything which would demand death, but if you hold a religious meeting, you will be fined, and for every succeeding religious meeting that you hold you will be fined, and in this way you will be brought from one arrest and hearing unto another and thereby blight the entire career of your life.

Froehlich's Reply

In this predicament my father wrote all of this to Bro. Froehlich asking him for advice to which Bro. S.H. Froehlich replied, "Because he says there is nothing demanding your leaving the country, there is also nothing demanding your being put to death, but if you hold a religious meeting you will be fined, and if you hold a religious meeting again you will be fined again, and thereby you will blight the entire career of your life, and it is your duty to rescue your life of faith for the Lord; therefore, my advice is that you emigrate to America.

To America

My father very much disliked leaving Bavaria or to emigrating to America, and battling the decree of the King in his heart, he became so heavily depressed that he said it is written (recompense them sevenfold). Now said he, "If the Royal house of Bavaria shall November 2003

suffer sevenfold, the present pains of my heart, it will never bear under it," and in a few days after this the King of Bavaria was reported to have become insane, and as I understand from that time on several of the Bavarian Kings went insane." I heard my father say that he believed if Bavaria would have tolerated the truth of progress, the Bavarian Royal House would have been saved from this terrible judgment.

Nearly the entire Company shortly after this emigrated to America and were on the ocean 48 days. After they arrived in America, they settled in Illinois where after the first year and within ten days my sister (then a little over a year old) and my grandmothers from both sides of the house died from ague and fever, and many of the new arrivals were stricken by this malady, but nearly all survived.

It is with a heartfelt wish that this account of the marvelous ways in which the Lord calls souls from darkness to His wonderful light and from the bondage of sin unto the liberty of the Children of God may be of interest and an assistance unto salvation to such who read it. I commend, therefore, the within lines to his offsprings and others and unto the hand of the Lord. (written by S. J. Braun)

"Our Heart Condition" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

Several weeks ago, I opened the Bible to Mark, chapter 10 and read from verse 17-22. It is the story of the rich young ruler who had kept all the commandments but couldn't quite get himself to sell all that he had and give it to the poor, nor did he take up the cross and follow Christ.

This was certainly a very admirable young man. He had lived a very clean and wholesome life, and since he was rich, he was no doubt in the upper class in society. Those people are usually hard workers and good managers.

My conclusion is that outwardly he was perfect, but inwardly, there was something lacking. There was something lacking in his heart condition. His value system was flawed, he failed to realize what is the most important.

Had the young man told Christ that he would be glad to comply with His instructions, Christ might well have told him to keep his wealth for the time being and use it to create more wealth with which to help others. Certainly this story is in the Bible to teach us not to put too much emphasis on the outward things only. The heart condition is not always easily seen but it is very important.

The Amish people put much emphasis on the outward appearance. I understand that they wear overalls to church and consider it to be too worldly to own an automobile. I greatly admire them for their willingness to be different in a society which tries to compel you to be like everyone else. In our own church, we feel that we should dress up, if possible, to worship the Lord. In our minds, to dress up indicates that we feel the worship service is very important and we should honor God by wearing our better clothes. Neither we nor the Amish should overlook the importance of the heart condition.

The Lord said to Samuel as recorded in I Samuel 16:7, "Man looketh on the outward appearance. but the Lord looketh on the heart." As far as we can control our outward appearance, it is good to do so in accordance with Biblical teachings concerning hair, dress, etc. Our willingness to obey indicates a good and desirable heart condition. But we must not forget the importance of the invisible. How is our heart condition? Do we have our value system in order? Do we live as if we know what is really important in life? Let's try to remember, if Christ tells us to do something, it is to our advantage to do it. We lose, if we don't have the right heart condition.

The word "heart" has two meanings: the organ in your body that pumps the blood, and your "mind", the seat of your thought process. In this article, it is the latter meaning that we are concerned with. What do you think about "people" compared with "things"? Let's love people much more than we love things, and be thankful.

Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.
