Sermon by Bro. Mark Steiner, Smithville, OH

#### Genesis 37 and St. Luke 24

This begins the account here in Genesis of Joseph. We can read through this account and see how we can say very plainly that God's hand was in this, in his life. Guiding him into a special position. We can read how that eventually, his brethren did come and bow down to him when he was made second ruler in the land of Egypt there. They came and made obeisance to him. (Genesis 42:6)

As these things were transpiring here, it says, "And his brethren envied him; but his father observed the saying." (Genesis 37:11). His father observed this dream that he had. He wondered about it.

Just reminds us of Mary, the mother of Jesus, how that when she observed things in the young child's life she first off observed the angel coming to her and telling her of this child that she was to have. How He was supposed to be a special child. (Luke 1:30-33). Then she observed things in His life as a young boy. The Bible says she kept these things and pondered them in her heart. Wondered about this child Jesus. (Luke 2:19,51).

We are the benefactors of God's hand in these lives that we read about. We can read these accounts and see, now do we fall in this place or that place? Do we carry envy with us? These, the brethren of Joseph, carried this lie, they carried this deceit for many years. Until they finally went before Joseph there in Egypt and he made himself known to them and was reconciled to them. Then they had to go back and admit to their father. (Genesis 45:1-15,25,26)

In this day of grace, we have the opportunity to go ahead and confess those things that are in our life that are similar to that, if any of us bear something like that, before it comes back to us. And it always will come back to us, whether in this life or after this life when we are faced with it. Only those transgressions that are confessed and covered by the blood of Jesus Christ will be forgiven and will be taken from us. Thankful that we have this opportunity in this day. We can say that this is the day of grace and the generation of Jesus Christ when we can make things right. We can make a preparing to meet our Lord.

We will have nothing to say at that time. He will know us and He will be able to separate us as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. A shepherd has no trouble. There is no question in his mind when he is separating the sheep from the goats. This is the way it will be when we stand before the Lord.

He told the disciples there that they were witnesses to these things (Luke 24:48). They were there at that time. They observed His life. They were recipients of His teachings as they walked with Him. They saw Him do the miracles. They saw Him heal the blind man (Mark 8:22-26). They saw Him heal the man that could not walk (Luke 5:18-25). They saw Him heal the lepers (Luke 17:11-19). They had this advantage that they saw that.

There was one disciple that is not spoken of in this account. This one Thomas, that saw those things. And the disciples then at this time told him that they had seen the Lord, that He had risen. You remember the account. He said, unless I see the nail scarred hands, be able to put my finger in His side, I will not believe. We also

know the Lord's response to that when He was in the presence of Thomas. He told him, come see the holes. He said, you have the advantage. Blessed are you that can see these things and believe them. But more blessed are those that do not have this advantage of sight or

Joy in the Midst of Turmoil

"What joy I feel, what peace is mine, As I my all to Thee resign! ..."

"Trust and Confidence" Hymns of Zion - #259

It would be easy in a time of war, turmoil and uncertainty for a child of God to become distressed and allow Satan to impact our thinking. When beset by distress, we could become so overwhelmed that it could eventually cause us to lose courage.

How can a child of God escape the mindset of distress, discouragement and fear? How can we be joyful when there seem to be so many problems around us?

Spiritual joy is a glorious and triumphant state of mind. It is a pattern of thinking and a way of looking at life. It is keeping our eyes upon the goal as we deal with day to day concerns. Obviously, this is not always easy to do, but neither is it impossible.

The scripture contains many examples in which extreme hardship was faced, but with an eye upon the goal, joy was achieved. At the most trying time of His life, "...Jesus ...who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Heb. 12:2). What an example that is for us! In spite of all of the physical and mental anguish that Jesus was enduring. He looked at the jov that was set before Him! The jou was victory over Satan and knowing He had paid the supreme price so you and I have an opportunity for salvation. We might say, and with a bit of justification, that we hardly can be that strong and have that much foresight as Jesus.

There are additional examples in the scripture of men who, by the grace of God, endured much hardship. Joseph, from the human perspective, had every right to be bitter because of his circumstances. Sold into slavery by his brothers, sent to prison as a result of unjust accusations by his master's wife, forgotten in prison after interpreting the dreams of

Pharaoh's butler and baker - all of this, and yet he remained faithful.

Stephen, facing death, was so confident in God's grace that "...all that sat in the council, looking steadfastly on him saw his face as it had been the face of an angel" (Acts 6:15). He preached his final sermon to his murderers "And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. And when he had said this, he fell asleep" (Acts 7:60).

In Revelation the 144,000 which "...were redeemed from among men, being the first fruits unto God and to the Lamb" (Rev. 14:3-4), had successfully overcome evil could now sing "...a new song before the throne..." (Rev. 14:3) in the heavenly choir. Hebrews 11 contains a list of faithful servants of God "Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong..." (Heb. 11:33-34). They were given the grace and strength to look beyond the present cross and see the joy that awaited them.

What can God's people do today to find the grace to be filled with joy in the midst of trial? It is probably a little too easy for us to focus our attention on the things we would like to have rather than on the things we have. If we were to lose everything we have by fire, flood, or some other disaster and then by the goodness of God, have it all restored we would consider ourselves most fortunate. We are reminded to "Count your many blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you what the Lord hath done". "Count Your Blessings" - Hymns of Zion +#116

As we count our blessings, what do we include? If we could list all of our blessings, putting them in order of priority, what would be in our top ten? We actually "list" our top priorities every day - based on how we spend our time and how we al-

locate our resources.

Without a doubt those of us who have been fortunate enough to taste the goodness of the plan of salvation would put that at the top of our list. Perhaps following that would be our family (biological and church family), our friends, etc. Does our life validate this list?

How can we keep our priorities in the proper order? The Apostle Paul gave us good advice in this matter: "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, ...honest, ...just, ...pure, ...lovely, ... good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things" (Phil. 4:8).

If we fill our minds with hymns of faith, if we spend ample time reading God's Word and in prayer, if we focus on the many privileges we have as children of God and if we ask God to "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer" (Ps. 19:14), then we invite joy into our lives.

If we consider it a privilege to go to the house of God on Sundays, midweek and at other appropriate times, it will help us receive a blessing. We can help ourselves to look forward to worship by spending time, before we get to church, thinking about God's Word.

Most of us have a significant amount of time during the week that our minds are free to roam. By filling our "free" mind time with godly thoughts, it will have a positive impact on our attitude. If we have a good attitude the future is bright.

God has given us a mind to use as we wish. He has placed us in circumstances that require us to make many choices every day. He has provided a way that we can choose to be joyful. He allows us to choose otherwise. Certainly there are times when the events of our life bring grief that is beyond our control. However for most of us, joy is a choice we can make. "...choose you this day whom ye will serve... but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Josh. 24:15).

### Mission Committee Meetings Report

This article provides a summary of Mission Committee meetings held in November, 2003 and February, 2004. One elder brother from the World Relief Committee was present at each meeting as many projects are jointly supported by World Relief and Mission funds. The Committee expresses gratitude for the generous contributions which have come forth from the Brotherhood in support of our various mission projects. It is good to be reminded that "he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully" and "God loveth a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:6-7).

### Communication

A new Spanish language version of the "Welcome" booklet has been completed and is being used by our brethren in Mexico. The process of interviewing candidates for mission work has been streamlined by developing suggested "Interview Questions" as well as a "Preplacement Questionnaire." These documents are available for individuals responsible for conducting interviews of candidates for mission assignments.

It was recommended that a fourth component to the mission of our church be added which reads: "To offer loving, humble deeds of service to fellow believers and all mankind in the name of Christ" (Gal. 5:13, 6:10). The Elder Body approved this change at the recent Winter Conference.

It was agreed that an official listing for our national church should be placed on the internet. This listing will provide a description of our basic doctrine and history and will enable inquirers to obtain the locations of our churches as well as other relevant information. The purpose is to communicate the Gospel message to mankind and to extend a welcome to all seeking souls to worship in our assemblies. This proposal received the support of the Elder Body and will be implemented by our Technology Committee.

Several members of the Mission Committee met with a group of representatives from Illinois and Indiana college campus groups in December, 2003. There was a very useful exchange which helped all who were present to learn more about opportunities as well as aspirations in the area of mission work. There was a good discussion of the process by which individuals can be assigned to various projects and the need for a sense of "being called" by the Holy Spirit as well as ultimately "being sent" by the church in accord with the biblical pattern. The Committee recommended that there be ongoing efforts such as this to improve communication with our young people and others.

### **Financial Report**

Detailed financial reports of contributions and expenditures were reviewed. Allocations were approved for a variety of projects including: Ixtlan, Imuris, RGMMI, Bible Distribution, Berean Prison Ministry, Braille Bible Foundation and two other distributors of Braille Bibles, Christian Aid Ministries and the Athens Preschool. In addition, the European Board has recommended support of a new church building project in Baja, Hungary, upgrading of several church buildings in the Ukraine and remodeling of a house in Romania to be used by brethren

visiting this country. These projects received the support of the Mission Committee. There was discussion of the ongoing self-help projects being supported for our needy brethren in Eastern Europe. The needs are very great and there is much thanksgiving offered to God by the recipients for these deeds of kindness.

### Reports from Mexico

Sis. Penny Stahl has completed a two-year tour of duty in Ixtlan. Her service to the church and community was greatly appreciated. May the Lord richly bless these efforts.

Sis. Sandy Leman has shifted her services from a clinic near Ixtlan to one located in Zapata, Texas. Although a serious effort had been made for nearly a year, the arrangement in the rural Michoacan clinic did not allow her to meet the objectives which had been set forth. The medical clinic in Zapata serves needy individuals and affords Sis. Sandy the opportunity to apply her physician assistant training as well as to offer spiritual support, as appropriate, to patients in the clinic. Her work continues to be under the oversight of the Mission Committee.

A proposal to develop our own orphanage in Magdalena, Senora, Mexico is moving forward with approval of the Elder Body. If the Lord so directs, this project, which would be under the auspices of our church, will provide a wide variety of opportunities for service by brethren willing to make major commitments to the Lord's service.

The Mission Committee continues to solicit the prayers and support of the Brotherhood as it humbly seeks to handle the many different aspects of spreading the Gospel message of salvation in accord with the commandments of the Lord Jesus.

### The International Grants Board

To respond to humanitarian needs in parts of the world that are not covered by the existing regional boards, the World Relief Committee has, for several years, worked with a number of international Christian organizations. These organizations have been carefully investigated for their Christian background, their effectiveness in providing humanitarian aid, and their commitment to low administrative overhead.

The International Grants Board was established in early 2003 for the following purposes:

- To review proposals from our brotherhood for assistance to humanitarian organizations in areas not under the supervision of the other four boards.
- To administer requests for assistance from the organizations with which we have a working relationship. These requests are reviewed to assure they meet the goals of the World Relief committee.
- To communicate with these organizations when there is a need in the world, particularly in disaster situations. Often one or more of the organizations has already identified the need and has initiated the process to provide emergency aid.
- To make recommendations to the national World Relief Committee for funding.
- To follow up on the grants to assure the donations are being used as designated.

World Relief is working with four organizations that are similar in nature. They collect, store, and redistribute donated goods. They also have teams providing aid

throughout the world. These teams often consist of volunteer medical personnel and support staff. The organizations use donations to support these teams as well as the expense of storing and shipping the donated materials. These organizations are International Aid, MAP International, Northwest Medical Teams and Global Operations and Development.

Several other organizations are smaller in size and their focus is on a narrower geographic area. These organizations vary from time to time based on disasters around the world. Funds from the International Grants Board are specifically targeted to humanitarian needs such as safe drinking water, medical supplies and meager food supplements to starving people.

We also work with Concern International, an organization with many small projects around the world. World Relief has provided supplemental funding to other organizations in the past that have great needs and meet our criteria and will continue to explore needs and opportunities as they arise in the future.

#### Africa

The most extensive work has been in famine relief in the countries of Ethiopia, Sudan and Kenya. Other projects included funding for transportation for a medical team to perform cataract surgeries in Eritrea, the funding of school lunches and the construction of a medical center in Yetebon, Ethiopia and flood relief in Mozambique.

### Southeast Asia, Asia and the Middle East

Recent focus has been on war relief in Iraq and Afghanistan. Other projects have included, food, family survival packs to a leper colony in Kazakhstan, and assistance to an orphanage in Tajikistan.

In North Korea we provided famine relief, farm animals for self help programs, and training for nurses. In Cambodia assistance was given to an orphanage, and in India funds were allocated to provide training for medical equipment technicians. In 1998 a tidal wave swept ashore in New Guinea. Working with one of our partners, we were able to send much needed medical supplies.

### **Eastern Europe**

In Eastern Europe we were able to provide war relief in Macedonia, water wells in Romania, and humanitarian aid in Albania.

### **Central and South America**

Assistance was provided for hurricane relief in Honduras and Belize. The earthquakes in El Salvador, Colombia, and Peru provided additional opportunities for relief help. We sent medications, vitamins and personal care kits to Cuba and a portable medical laboratory to a doctor who serves the Indians in the remote Copper Canyon area of Mexico. Over ten cargo containers of grain were sent for flood relief in Venezuela and Honduras.

Contaminated water creates many health hazards. In Brazil, we have funded the construction and installation of over 100 water filters to families in the Amazon river basin.

"Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine."

II Tim. 4:2

experience and yet believe. (John 20:25-29).

That is our part. We were not there in the flesh. But we go there in the Spirit as we read the accounts that God has inspired men to put down and has been preserved for us until this day. We go there in the Spirit. In the mind's eye we see the sepulchre. We see our Lord laid there in those linen wrappings and the handkerchief about His head. In faith we understand that. We see the rock that was put across the mouth of the sepulchre so it would be sealed. For His enemies feared that His disciples would come and steal away His body and say that He has risen. (Matthew 27:59-66)

Also in one of the gospels we read that they went so far that they gave the soldiers money that they would not tell the truth about what they saw at the sepulchre, about those angels (Matthew 28:11-15). We want to hear the truth, don't we, as we assemble. We need that. We need this that is sure and not changing. Something that we can count on in our life. We seek that out.

We read here about those that went to the sepulchre. It says, "...very early in the morning" the first day of the week. (Luke 24:1). The Lord's day. This day that we assemble. The day after the Sabbath. After the Sabbath was observed, then they had freedom under the law to go back to the sepulchre. And they found there the stone rolled away and no body therein (Luke 24:2-3). They found the linen clothes and the napkin folded up (John 20:6-7). It was there but the Lord's body was gone.

Then we read about Him speaking to Mary there. It must have

been near the sepulchre. He called her by name. She recognized Him. Called Him Master, Rabboni. (John 20:11-16)

When the Lord calls us by name, do we recognize that voice? This may happen a number of times during our life. When we come to an age where we recognize right from wrong, we recognize our responsibility before the Lord, He calls us. He calls us by name. That calling can be different. All of us that have responded to that can go back to a time and a place when we recognized His call. Recognized His voice when He called us by name. We are thankful for that.

In this day, many of us assemble here in this place because there are two souls that were converted, heard the Lord call them by name, with the instructions that they should become man and wife. We are here to observe that. We are here to support that.

So how do we react when He calls us by name? None of us really know what is ahead of us. We don't know what sort of callings we will have. Let's be assured that as He talked to Mary by name, called her by name (John 20:16), He can and He will call us by name to His service. That service will be completed whether we are faithful to the calling or not. The Bible tells us if we don't speak out, if we don't tell, if we don't speak the gospel and express the gospel in word and in our life, the Lord can raise up stones to do that (Luke 19:39-40).

We read here the account of those two that walked to Emmaus. They communed together and were talking about the things that had happened. How that their Lord was crucified and laid in that sepulchre. Now there are some that say He is not there anymore. We read how the Lord came and walked with them, communed

with them, as it says here. And He told them and instructed them more perfectly out of the prophets, of this, how it was foretold how He should be hung on a tree. How He should be lifted up between heaven and earth. How He should be the sacrifice (Luke 24:13-27).

We are so thankful that God eternal saw our need. Saw that we of ourselves could not please Him. He saw this need that we had for a Saviour. He supplied that. He made it free to us, this way of salvation.

Eventually, the men there that walked to Emmaus came to the knowledge of who this was that was walking with them. "And it came to pass, as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed it, and brake, and gave to them. And their eyes were opened, and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight." (Luke 24:30-31). The Lord uses sometimes unusual circumstances to open our eyes. We need that from time to time. That our eyes would be opened. That we would be refreshed again and again of our duties. We would be reminded again and again of the narrow way that the Lord has put us on. We would be reminded again and again. Our eyes would be open to see how we are walking on that way. To see what our direction is. To see if our direction is correct. Or if we need some correction. Here it tells about their eyes being opened. It said he vanished out of their sight.

Again we read about Him coming back into their presence. He said, "...Peace be unto you... Why are ye troubled? And why do thoughts arise in your hearts? Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself: handle me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have." (Luke 24:36-39). We are reminded there

that even though He was Jesus Christ the Son of God, yet He went through that crucifixion and suffered as a man would, any man would. The pains of death were real. In fact, they were intensified because He carried our sins there on the cross.

Those of us that have carried a burden of sin understand that in a small way, a very small way. We came to the cross. We didn't bear our sins there on the cross. But we came to the cross and left them there. We unburdened ourself there. Our Lord carried all that burden with Him on the cross. So we have this reminder that He indeed suffered there just as a man.

"And when he had thus spoken, he shewed them his hands and his feet. And while they yet believed not for joy, and wondered, he said unto them, Have ye here any meat?" (Luke 24:40-41). He as a man took and ate before them to show them He was actually, in the flesh, risen.

We look forward to that. We look forward to that resurrection. The Bible tells us about having a new body. One that is not corrupted by age as we experience here in this life (Philippians 3:21). We don't understand it completely. But we certainly look forward to that resurrection. That it will be real. It will be something that we can, as these disciples did, something that we can observe and find that it is real.

Sometimes in our life we don't quite know what is real and what is not. There are many things thrown at us in this time that are not real, that are not true. We sometimes have a difficult time sorting that out. But that resurrection will be real. We will be eternal.

Hopefully each one that assem-

bles here in this morning and all those in the Sunday School will experience the resurrection to life and not a resurrection to death. A resurrection to life. That resurrection will be with our Lord and our Saviour. Our eternal home will be heaven and not a place of eternal destruction. This is what we look forward to. We have this resurrection of Jesus Christ, this bodily resurrection that we read about here, as an encouragement to us. That it is indeed real. Through that, we can have faith that our resurrection will be real.

"... These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me. Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures. And said unto them, Thus it is written, and thus it behooved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day: And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem." (Luke 24:44-47). Indeed, in this day, we have this opportunity to preach repentance, remission of sins, to the end that redemption is observed, redemption is experienced in our life.

If we would go back into the Acts of the Apostles, we can read there where Peter says it very plainly. That there is no other way that we can find salvation except through Jesus Christ. Here we have the words of Jesus, that we should go out and express this. That through Him is the redemption and salvation possible. As He expresses here, through repentance, that remission of sins is available.

We have that opportunity in this day. Those of us that stand have that opportunity to say it in words. All of us have the opportunity. And it is an opportunity to say it in our deeds, in our actions, in our life day by day.

"And ye are witnesses of these things." (Luke 24:48). We are witnesses through faith. "And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high. (Luke 24:49). This power from on high we read about in the Acts of the Apostles when God's Holy Spirit came upon the people (Acts 2:2-4). We can have that power from on high. We need that. Those of us that have walked in the way some time understand that. We've leaned on the Lord and His guidance. It is a need that we have as real as food and drink and the air that we breathe. We need to experience that. We need to have that in our life in a place where we can rely upon the Lord.

That pathway is open and free to us. It is not something that's new, only when we have a great need, but day by day we rely upon the Lord's guidance. So it is something we can understand very well in our life. May the Lord grant us grace to that end.



This is the second in an eight-part series of church practices. These are excerpts from booklets distributed to Sunday School teachers from Apostolic Christian Publications, Eureka, Illinois.

#### **SINGINGS**

50

Singing is a particularly viable means of expression for a child of God — for those who have been transformed from darkness to light, and whose cleansed hearts have been filled with the goodness of God. They truly have something worthy of expression — namely, the joy of the Lord, and the kingdom of God within their hearts.

There exists (in the brother-hood) a very distinct form of song worship. It is a wonderful tradition almost solely unique to the Apostolic Christian Church. It is aptly and appropriately termed a "singing."

A "singing" is the gathering together of believers for the express purpose of collectively blending voices of praise to God in song. Over the years it has served as a blessed way to bring adulation to God, and at the same time bring spiritual edification to each individual singer.

The "singing" has played an important role in the spiritual

development of the church. In fact, its presence among the brethren has been so constant and so universal that perhaps at times this wonderful form of worship is almost taken for granted.

Young people most frequently hold these song services. Although they range to encompass all age groups, singings for the most part are organized by young, converted, unmarried members of the church.

#### A Reason To Sing

Why is a singing considered a celebration in song? Because those who are doing the singing — converted and sanctified children of God — have something within which is worthy of joyful expression. Their hearts and minds contain the peace of God. The atoning work of Christ, on Calvary's hill centuries ago, gives occasion for this inner joy, which so appropriately finds an outlet in singing.

## Characteristics of a Singing

Singings are usually held in the homes of believers, with the young believer(s) of the home acting as host or hostess. All young, single people are invited. Often, some married adults are present as well. The singing usually begins around 7.30 p.m. when a brother announces the first song. By this time, most everyone is seated and ready to begin singing. Brothers and sisters are usually seated apart, as space and conditions allow.

The singing continues for nearly an hour or more. Sometimes glasses of water are handed out. Candy is sometime passed around during the singing.

After an hour or more the pace slackens and a "farewell" song is given. The Scriptures are read and a prayer follows. Lunch and fellowship are next. The lunch is always well- prepared, and enjoyed by those who attend.

Singings are not held exclusively for young single people, but for other adults and all brethren as well. In these cases, the format is just about the same, save for the fact that the participants are mostly married.

#### Summary

A great blessing has been realized over the years in these singings. The church indeed is fortunate to hold onto this wonderful and Biblically-prescribed tradition of singing praises to



"Accountability"

It is very important that human beings are accountable to someone. We are all accountable to God in the end but if a person can take over a country as a king or a dictator, and he isn't accountable to any other person or persons, he can wreck havoc before he meets God. Also, that must be why companies have, not only a president, but a board of directors to which the president is accountable. A board of directors is never one person but a group of persons. "In the multitude of counselors, there is safety." (Proverbs 11:14)


The framers of our constitution knew that the ideal government must have what is called "Checks and Balances". The Greek philosopher. Plato, felt that no one man should be trusted to run a country, but that there should be a group of men called Governors, who should run a country. The framers of our constitution decided that we will have a president but that he is responsible to the congress. The congress can not only reprimand him but they can put him out of office. The president is accountable to the congress, which is composed of hundreds of senators and congressmen.

In our government, there is the Executive Branch, the President; the Legislative Branch, the Congress; and the Judicial Branch, the Supreme Court. If the congress passes a law and the Supreme

Court says it is not according to our constitution, the only way the congress can get around it is to amend the constitution. If the Supreme Court makes a decision which the President feels is bad for the country, all he can do is try to appoint judges to the Supreme Court who feel like he does about the issue. Then the next time that issue is brought to the Supreme Court they may reverse their former decision.

In our church we have an elder over each church, we have the congregations, and we have the elder body. In Genesis 4:9, God asked Cain, "Where is Abel, thy brother?" Cain replied, "I know not. Am I my brother's keeper?" We believe we are our brother's keeper and are accountable to each other. Many people may not like that but it is good for us.

Each elder in our church is responsible to the elder body. All committees, including the Elder Committee, is responsible to the elder body. The Word of God is our Judicial Branch. If any decision is clearly against the Word of God, every effort should be made to change that decision. The congregations in our church have great power, but only so long as it is in accordance with the Word of God. The Elder Body is accountable to the Word of God, to each other, and ultimately, to God Himself. Accountability is important in the spiritual life as well as in the secular life.
