Sermon by Bro. Gerald Wagenbach, Oakville, IA

St. Luke 8:1-21

Certainly a very familiar scripture that we have heard many times and know it does apply to each and every one of us that is here tonight.

When we consider the parable that the Lord taught here, as we think of the different conditions that applied, we have to even look within our own hearts, whether we are yet standing without or whether we have become God's children. We know it does not give a time frame for each one of these different conditions; of whether it may have occurred early in the life of a believer or late in the life of a believer.

We have an obligation, those of us that have become His children. We have an obligation to stay true unto Him. We have made that vow in the baptismal waters that we would be true and faithful as long as we have life and breath. It shouldn't be something that should be difficult or hard for us to want to accept. But it should be something that we desire to do out of the love, out of the depths of our heart because of what God has done for us.

As we can read here and the Lord explained to us so clearly, that the seed is the Word of God (St. Luke 8:11). The Word of God is a way that we can find direction in life. It is a way that we can find the way to eternal life. Where we can find salvation. It is all there contained within God's Holy Word and it has been preserved for us.

So as the seed is then planted within our hearts, those of us that have had the good fortune of being raised in God fearing homes, brought to church, we have heard the Word from our youth. We have heard it in Sunday School. We have heard it from our parents. We have not only heard the Word but we have seen it lived also. For that we need to be so very thankful. When we have seen the life of those that have even separated themselves from the world, from their sinful ways, the miracle of repentance and conversion that has been experienced by mankind that this is, we are

so fortunate to be able to be a part of that. That we can even know that there are people, have the feeling within our heart, that these are people that serve God. So those of us that have been brought up in the faith, that have had this attitude and thankfulness upon our hearts that God has even given us this good fortune and good heritage, we have had those little seeds planted from the days of our youth.

As time progressed, the seed is never removed from our hearts. But depending on how we react to the Word, whether that seed will sprout and bring forth life. We know that it must bring forth life if we want to entertain the hope of life eternal. So there could be that condition. It does exist and it will exist. We know from God's Word. It tells us that the way to destruction is broad and there will be many that will follow that way (St. Matthew 7:13).

So there will be that soil that is not fertile and that seed that is put within that soil, it never springs forth. When we think about it, if that happens, if that occurs in our lifetime, we won't be able to stand in front of God on judgment day and say, I never received the Word. I didn't know what to do. But if that seed has been planted within our hearts, we will have no excuses. For God will give us everything we need that salvation can be found. But we have to take that step in faith.

So as we consider the different conditions here then, the first is by the way side. "Those by the way side are they that hear; then cometh the devil, and taketh away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved." (St. Luke 8:12). Probably many of us have been out perhaps on a trail or a walk along the road, a path that is well trodden and beaten down. When we compare that to a good, well tilled soil that is prepared for planting, it is pretty easy to understand of how could that seed be planted within that type of a soil and then it sprout and bring forth life?

He tells us here, that even before that seed could sprout, the devil will come and he will take it away. That is a danger that can be faced if we do not allow the Word of God to penetrate our hearts. If we let our hearts become so hard and so calloused that the Word is not able to penetrate.

How could that happen in our life?

Those of us who have been fortunate enough to repent, be converted and become children of God, realize that it was only by the grace and mercy of God that He called us to be His child. The call of God is necessary for us to become His child.

Unfortunately there are those who believe they have never been called of God and therefore have put off their repentance, waiting for His call. What is the call of God? How can we recognize it? Can those of us who have been exposed to the Word of God much of our life really claim that we have never been called of God? If God called us one time and we ignored it, can we expect to be called again?

God calls His people in many ways and for many reasons. Certainly the call to repentance is one of the most important reasons God calls us. Additionally He calls us to do His work, perhaps to lead, and to worship Him.

There are many scripture passages that tell us that God does not want anyone to spend eternity separated from Him. Isaiah wrote "Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else" (Is. 45:22). Jesus said "Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage" (Mt. 22:9). Paul wrote to Timothy that our Savior would "...have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (I Tim. 2:4). Finally, John wrote "...And whosoever will, let him take of the water of life freely" (Rev. 22:17).

Therefore, if we believe that God would have all men to be saved, can we believe He would not call us? How can we recognize His call? There are some who were called of God in ways that could hardly be mistaken. Moses' attraction to the burning bush and his subsequent conversations with God could hardly have been missed. Gideon received two very clear signs with the fleece and the dew as he sought the courage to follow God's direction to lead the children of Israel against the Midianites (Ju.

6). Saul (Paul) also had a calling that was very dramatic and caused him to make a complete turnaround (Acts 9). There are many other examples, both in the scripture and in other sources, in which very clear calls were made to various individuals. However, most of us do not receive calls of this nature. So how do we know when we are called?

God reminds us to remove ourselves from the confusion of the world and seek His will in quietness. The Psalmist reminds us to "Be still, and know that I am God..." (Ps. 46:10). In despair Elijah was seeking God's assurance that he was not alone in serving God. He searched in the strong wind, in an earthquake and in the fire, but it was not until he listened to "...a still small voice" (I Ki. 19:12) that he found God.

We can also hear God's call in the quietness of His creation. The call to repentance may come in the quietness of a sermon when the message of repentance is preached. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me" (Rev. 3:20). Sometimes the call may come in the quietness of the night when there is nothing but the ticking of the clock to break the silence.

The calls to repentance by John the Baptist (Mt. 3:2) and Jesus "Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Mt. 4:17) were neither harsh nor calamitous. They were simply statements of fact. If one wishes to enter the kingdom of God, there are some tasks that must be done.

In the quote from Rev. 3:20, Jesus simply stood and knocked. He gave us two tasks: hear and open. Therefore, from this we can understand that, although the call comes from God, we do have some responsibility. We must be willing to hear and we must be willing to open the door of our heart.

We might prefer a call that is so strong and unmistakable that there are no questions in our mind. However, we need to be careful what we ask for. Jonah was given a clear, but simple message,

"Arise, go to Nineveh" (Jonah 1:2). Jonah knew what he was to do. He understood clearly, but he rose and went a different way. God was merciful to Jonah. After three days and nights of a very frightening experience in the belly of the fish, he was given another chance. He obeyed God's command but he did not do it with submission. He was rebellious toward God.


Other examples of clear, strong, but distressful calls include: Zacharias (Luke 1:5-22), a lord of King Jehoram (II Ki. 7:2), Peter (Mt. 14:22-31) and Thomas (Jn. 20:24-31). Each of these had doubts when called by God for a special task. Each of them had a time of trial because of their doubt.

When we consider what God has done for us, we would do well to answer His call without requiring something special. For many of us He has given the knowledge of what is required for salvation. He has given us a means of acquiring the knowledge and of applying it to our lives. He has placed us in a situation where it is relatively easy to put our knowledge into practice. He has allowed a measure of conviction to come upon us that encourages us to yield to His call.

How often will He call? No one knows for sure. We can be sure He will call one time, but we have no assurance of multiple calls. If we are willing to admit that each time we hear the truth of God's Word spoken we have received a call from God, we must acknowledge that we have been called many times.

Perhaps the call of God is accurately described in the words of a hymn: "Softly and tenderly Jesus is calling, Calling for you and for me. See on the portals He's waiting and watching, Watching for you and for me. Come home ...Come home, Ye who are weary come home. Earnestly, tenderly, Jesus is calling, Calling, O sinner, come home!" (Tabernacle Hymns No. 128). We would do well to answer a tender call rather than demand a stronger one that may bring us deep distress.

Observing God's work in Haiti

Last fall the Caribbean Board was searching for short-term coordinators to serve as project coordinators in Haiti. Bro. Marvin & Sis. Mary Sauder, Tremont, were approved and served the last 3 months of 2003. It was a real joy for them to host and travel with many different work teams.

Brethren from the Caribbean Board go to Haiti each fall to evaluate the many different facilities that are sponsored through World Relief. Evaluation includes checking and monitoring the accountability of past funds and materials, and checking on future needs. Each facility that receives help shows much gratitude and appreciation for all of the efforts of our Apostolic Christian brethren back home. At Grace Children's Hospital, a colored poster on the window welcomed all of the team members by name. Seeing these poor Haitian people reconfirms the need of sending more food, clothing, and medical supplies.

At the King's Garden Orphanage it was a real blessing to see the children's eyes light up and their white tooth smile as health kits with small toys were given to each one. It was very touching as these Haitian children sang "Give Thanks" in English in return. While touring the Asile Dorcus nursing home, we saw the blessing of the masonry wall surrounding the property that was funded by World Relief. Each work team had the privilege of visiting, singing, and praying with the elderly residents of this nursing home. Their favorite song was "When the Roll is called up Yonder." Just thinking and singing about our Heavenly

Home keeps each one motivated no matter how poor or what nationality we are.

The Apostolic Water Aid work team typically comes to Haiti 3 times a year. The brothers find plenty of maintenance work, training, and encouragement for the seven Haitian well drillers to keep the well drilling rigs operable. Also brothers checked on the Trade Schools to encourage staff to continue to educate students with masonry, electrical, welding, carpentry, and sewing skills.

The Child Sponsorship Board came to Haiti to visit not only the different field offices but also many country schools where our brethren back in the States sponsor students. It was quite an experience to see many students crammed into small classrooms seeking an education and learning about Jesus.

The maintenance work team of 5 couples was enjoyable as they worked around the Citi Lumiere mission compound in Les Cayes. The Sisters painted at the Child Care Office while the Brothers worked on electrical wiring.

The S.E.E.D. Ministries work team did veterinary training, seminars, painting, and assembled more chicken cages.

It was a joy to see several small communities have school roofs installed by two different work teams. The local people would watch and help our teams build the roof on a building that they had labored many hours to prepare the foundation, floor, and walls. The Sisters helped assemble and paint school desks along with willing Haitians. As the team mingled together and typically spent the nights in a classroom, there were many opportunities to let the love of Jesus shine forth. The highlight of all work teams was Sunday worship. What a moving experience to hear the Haitians sing and feel the spirit of Christian love and hospitality. Our minister had the service which was translated into Creole. After church, teams were treated with a fabulous meal.

Travel in Haiti remains most treacherous on very poor roads. The National main road is mostly blacktop with many potholes. All other roads were gravel and dirt. The heavy rains create many mudslides and deep potholes that made interesting van rides. The Lord was always faithful in answering prayers offered by our brethren.

Work teams and coordinators had the opportunity to unload sea containers and see all of the goods given from the States in the name of Christ. Thanks to the many donors and volunteers who have labored so fruitfully in this work back home. May God richly bless you as we strive to "do good unto all men."

What a blessed opportunity to have shared this experience and what a joy to be back home safe. Recently, there have been uprisings in Haiti and our work teams have been canceled through March. Bro. Dean and Sis. Connie Pashak, Bay City, are the spring coordinators, but they have now returned safely to the States along with many of the other compound missionaries.

The Church in Ostrita, Ukraine

Many years ago, brethren who follow the tenets of the same faith we embrace, moved into a region called Bukovina, which was then a part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire and is now in Ukraine. They had endured the rigors of the first World War and then faced the Communist revolution which followed it. These people had very little in the way of earthly goods.

Years of darkness under Communism

As the Communist system entered the lands taken under their control, these dear brethren had very little opportunity to practice their faith. They coped with this by meeting in small groups, often in remote areas. In spite of many difficulties, the true faith took hold and endured. Even today there are old sisters and brothers in faith who remember these very difficult times when they had to assemble in secret.

Our brethren discovered that if they assembled in small groups and made no trouble in the community, they could carry on their faith without a lot of attention from the authorities. Late in the decade of the 1980's the great democracies put enough pressure on the communists that they eased the oppression of small groups of true believers, and our brethren in Ukraine began to assemble in houses.

History of the Ostrita Church

In the small village of Ostrita, located a little south and east of the city of Chernovitsy in Ukraine, believers have assembled for many decades. They met for worship in

houses. In 1988, due to a relaxing of the oppression against small, individual projects of commerce, Elder Vasile Paladean planted watermelons in the hope of selling them in the open markets. This was a new concept resulting from a gradual declining of oppression by the central government of the USSR in Moscow. By God's grace and mercy, this harvest was blessed, and the family used the profits to build an addition to their house that could be used as a church. Brethren from America have worshipped with them there a great many times.

However, this primitive facility did not meet the needs of a growing congregation. There are about 185 members, 180 children who are attending Sunday School, plus friends to bring the normal Sunday attendance to about 450 souls.

Approval to Build a New Church

Over the years, groups of elders and other brethren have visited Ukraine at various intervals. They have kept in close contact via fax and e-mail. After much prayer and discussion, the European Board and Mission Committee approved building a new house of worship for this group of struggling souls in their far and distant homeland.

It is almost beyond comprehension that we were allowed to help build a place designed to worship God in a country that had officially denied the very existence of the one and only true God. However, at this time, by the grace of God and the support of our US brethren, such an edifice exists, built by the Ukrainians themselves. Several times groups from outside their land assisted them with some needed skills.

The new church has a seating capacity of 500 persons in the main assembly room. It is the only building in Bukovina that has been erected solely as a place of worship after over 70 years of oppression. The building has a baptismal, dining room and four rooms that are specified for Sunday School use. This is unique in Eastern European church buildings since many of them do not include Sunday School facilities. They have also furnished several guest rooms for visitors.

The rigid control of movement under Communism prevented many young people from leaving Ukraine. As a result, it is the observation of teams of brothers who visit this area, that there is opportunity to teach the many children the truth of the Gospel and to train them with useful skills with which they can then make a living. This will encourage them to stay in their own land and build for the future of their families and the church.

Gratitude for Help

The years of building this new church brought many challenges. We thank all of you who have given your financial support and have placed your trust in the Mission Committee and the European Board so that this church could be built. Only God knows the future, but we believe He has already blessed this effort. The believers in Ostrita are deeply grateful for their house of worship.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

There are posters up to remind staff to attend a mandatory meeting on the topic of Abuse and Neglect. This is something required by law that employees are reminded of what abuse is and what to do if abuse or neglect is suspected. One of the questions on the poster to get our attention is: What is the difference between "kidding" and Abuse? So many of the residents at the group homes and even Timber Ridge have a great sense of humor. They love giving staff "a hard time" and it's often easy to give it right back. It would be good to remember the verses in Ephesians 5 that tell us to not let foolish talking or jesting be a part of us. We know that, though it can seem fun to tease someone, it is far better to boost their spirits with a kind, true word, a compliment or an encouragement. Something else that the poster asks: Do you know what the opposite of Abuse is? Perhaps the answer will be tenderly and compassionately caring for others. We should remember that this includes the things we say to those we care for. Ephesians 4:29, "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers."

Our residents are enjoying celebrating St. Patrick's Day and looking forward to the Easter season. Some Timber Ridge residents have recently been enjoying Enabling Gardening classes, where they are allowed and encouraged to get their hands dirty in the soil. This is also the time of year that staff help residents practice for the upcoming Special Olympic events. Many hope for and even expect a gold medal, so that they can have the privilege of participating at a state level.

We praise God for His goodness towards us in providing a nurse to fill the expected opening of Director of Nursing at Timber Ridge. Our current DON, Maurine Collett, will be retiring after serving in this position for 21 years. Anna Liza Raboza has been an employee of the Home for eight years and now has started the process of training to be the new Director of Nursing. We wish for her God's grace and wisdom in her new responsibilities.

It can happen by neglect. It can happen by pride staying in our life. It could happen by not allowing ourselves to be exposed to God's Word, by ignoring God's Word. There are just so many ways that can cause our hearts to become callous and not penetrable so that seed cannot even sprout and bring forth life.

The next is, "They on the rock are they, which when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away." (St. Luke 8:13). Another danger that can exist within our lives. What would cause that to happen when we consider a condition of rocky soil? Perhaps it could just be little rocks.

I know that I have seen it before where there has been a farmstead that is established. Perhaps within this farmstead there was an old building site. As you would try to till that soil, you run into perhaps the old foundation, oftentimes from years past, that was made out of rocks or stones. It is very difficult, first of all to till that soil. And then secondly, to have it in the right condition that you can have a decent crop or even grow anything.

So what can we do about those rocks that could be in our life? Would they exist there from the beginning? Could rocks enter into the soil of our hearts throughout our converted days? Here, the way the Word describes it, it is obviously someone that did believe. It says, for which for a while believe, but in time of temptation fall away.

I know that God is loving and merciful. We feel perhaps that at times we would fall in this condition and wonder, in time of temptation will we stay true to God? We need to have faith. We need to trust in God and we need to be diligent in what He asks us to do; through the reading of His Word, through our prayer life and many other things. I believe if we are diligent, God will help us. That if there would be some rocks in our life, that He could remove them. I do fully believe that He could take those rocks out of our life. But it is a situation that we just have to be so on guard. As we begin our pilgrim way, as we take that step in faith, that we review the condition of our heart. That we get those rocks out. That that soil is well tilled and cultivated, ready for that seed to sprout and bring forth life.

Then to have continual effort. It is not something that we just take a step and then sit back and relax the rest of our life, believing that we have taken that step and that there is nothing more to do. That is not the way it works. But there has to be diligence. As we, I believe, heard so much about this past weekend, perseverance in our life. It is that perseverance that will help us. We need to go out there and examine our life oftentimes. We need to review our life. Review the condition of the soil of our heart. Is there something that needs to be removed? Am I embarking on things in life that I once wouldn't ever consider in my new life? Are we taking some liberties that perhaps the first time we did it there was the that pricking in our heart? Then after we did it a second time and a third time, it seemed to go away. We need to review our life. Are we in accord with God's Word? Are we pleasing God in our walk of life?

When our life is over, it is too late. But when He gives us life and breath, we have time to consider our pathway. Is it leading to the heavenly kingdom? Or is it a rocky road? Are we veering off the path into dangerous territory? Where we know that the enemy is out there and he is ferocious, he is devouring. He wants to even stamp us out. He wants to remove our name from the Book of Life. He doesn't want us to go to heaven. He wants us to be with him in eternal darkness. So we need to be so careful. dear ones.

Then we read about the thorns. "And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection" (St. Luke 8:14). I am not sure that every soul would have the same trials in life. I know that we all have different trials, we all have different weaknesses. Perhaps what would be a thorn to one individual would not be to another and vice versa. But as it is expressed here, it describes it as choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life.

Cares can be very many things. There are obviously the earthly things that would weight us down. As we try to think of some different examples there of cares, one example I think of is Mary and Martha. As the Lord was there and the one was helping serve and everything, and the other was at the feet of Jesus, just listening and wanting to receive His wonderful Words, the Lord told her that she was busy and worried and cumbered with many things. But Mary had chosen the better part that shall not be taken away (St. Luke 10:40-42).

Cares can just consist of so many things. From our earthly endeavors to perhaps worrying about many things. Fretting about things that really we should not fret about. I know it is easier said than done. Life goes on. Oftentimes, perhaps through different experiences in life, we realize that, why did I get so worked up about this thing? It really wasn't that important. It wasn't that big of an issue. Yet that is our nature coming up. We have to drive it back where it needs to be in that deathly grave. We have to leave it there and we have to trust in God. that He will help us that we would not have to become overburdened with cares of life.

He speaks of riches here. Riches can be such a detriment to a soul. Properly handled, we can view lives of those that seem to deal very well with it. But I believe I would have to say for the majority of all of us, it would be a detriment to have those earthly riches. It doesn't define a level of riches here as far as a value. But really, as we consider our lives and the land and nation that we live, the many wonderful things that we enjoy, so many of us would have to consider ourselves rich with physical things and material blessings.

Again, for one person, maybe this level would be riches. Another, this level would be riches. How we deal with those things, we just have to be careful.

Again, back to that examination of our heart. What do riches mean to us and how do they control our lives? Are we always striving that we can go out and make that next buck when maybe we really wouldn't have to do it? Where are we satisfied? Are we content? Is there contentment in our life? We know what the Word says, that godliness with contentment bringeth forth great gain (I Timothy 6:6). That is the attitude that we need to have. We need it. So many times I believe, we need to sit back and then be satisfied.

Then along with the cares and the riches comes the occupation of our time. Our time is an element that we can never replace. Once the minutes have ticked away, we can't go back and get them back. So what are we doing with our time? How are we spending our time? Are we spending enough time in our service to God? Or is too much of our time being spent for self, for those things that would involve these cares and riches and then the pleasures of this life?

We know that we do have responsibilities and obligations. For those of us that have families, to provide for them. We are living in a day and time where I believe that as a believer, that we need to have discernment, and we need God's help that we can have this discernment of where we draw the line. Because as the world's standards are, that we just fill up our time with these things; whether it be working many, many hours in a week's time six, seven days a week is not uncommon in the world - and if it is not that, perhaps it would be in spending our leisure time in the pleasures of this life. We know that there are just many things, many offerings out there that would fall into the category of pleasures of this life.

I believe it would be up to each and every one of us to identify it within our own lives. I would hate to stand up here and give a listing, saying this would be a pleasure, this would be a pleasure, this would be a pleasure and we should not do it. We know there are things and we have been even exhorted by our Elder brethren, warned about certain things. I don't need to go over all those. We just need to consider our life. We know what they are. How are we spending our time?

Then the beautiful part of this chapter, where we all want to fall, where we want to be. We know we do fall short. We strive for this. May we by God's grace be able to obtain it. "But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience." (St. Luke 8:15). We want our hearts to be properly prepared for the Lord when that seed is planted and when He calls us, that we come. That we hear that call. That we are in tune with God. To be in tune with it, we have to be close to Him. We have to be close to His Word.

For those of us that are parents, we need to consider the importance of how we raise our children. What message are we sending them by our actions, by our life? Do they perceive by our life what is important for them? Is it to seek out their life and their career? Is it to become rich and famous? Or is it to just have them come when they hear God's calling and to answer the call of repentance and become one of God's children?

We can't help our children in living overcoming lives. We can't keep them from sin and Satan. Satan will be able to find his road there. We can't totally prevent that from happening. But what we can do is instill it within their hearts in their youthful days, of what is important and where they can go when they feel this emptiness, when they feel this burden of sin. That they have a place that they can go and find a haven, a place of separation from the world. A place where they can find a refuge, a place where they can find release from their burden of sin. It is through Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

It talks here in the next verse about, "No man, when he hath lighted a candle, covereth it with a vessel, or putteth it under a bed; but setteth it on a candlestick, that they which enter in may see the light. For nothing is secret, that shall not be made manifest; neither any thing hid, that shall not be known and come abroad. Take heed therefore how ye hear: for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have." (St. Luke 8:16-18).

We hear from time to time, the issue of faith and works. I believe that obviously it takes a faith. We have to begin that foundation, that step in faith, to even find our salvation. Then depend upon His grace and His love and His mercy to stay true and faithful to Him. There is no question about it. We need that.

But then He, as He stated here of the candle, that is something that He is trying to impress upon us. If our candle is not lit, if our light is dull, people won't be able to see our life. He wants us to be good lights and examples. I believe it is very clear here. May we even strive, that we continue to keep that light lit in our life. That it be bright and burning. That we keep oil in our lamps. That we trim it oftentimes. That we don't let it go out or let it become dull, into a condition where Satan would find entrance because of our sleepiness in our spiritual life, our lukewarmness, where he would be able to come in.

He is watching for the time. He is watching for the opportunity to come in and just pounce. If we keep our light burning bright, if the important things to us in life are serving God and not serving ourselves, or these things that we read about here, then by God's grace we will be able to stay true and faithful. It is a promise that we can take from God's Word, that He will help us endure to the end if we put our trust in Him and follow His Word.



This is another in an 8-part series of articles on church practices. The following consists of excerpts from a writing on the headcovering distributed by Apostolic Christian Publications, Eureka, Illinois.

The Prayer Veil

For those attending a worship service at an Apostolic Christian Church for the first time, there is something they are likely to notice right away. It is women wearing veils or headcoverings. Since most church denominations no longer stress this practice, it may strike a visitor rather poignantly. It is possible this pattern may appear unusual, but it was not considered so to believers in Bible times and in the centuries that followed.

The Biblical Reason

The Bible is clear in teaching that believing women are to be covered when they pray or prophesy. In his letter to the early church at Corinth, the Apostle Paul referenced this practice. The substance of his teaching is contained in I Corinthians 11:2-16. The King James Version records the applicable Scriptures regarding the veil: Every man praying or prophesying, having his head covered, dishonoreth his head. But every woman that prayeth or prophesieth with her head uncovered dishonoreth her head: for that is even all one as if she were shaven (I Corinthians 11:4-5).

The veiling is also a indicator of

the divine order of God: But I would have you know that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and the head of Christ is God (verse 3). Neither was the man created for the woman, but the woman for the man. For this cause ought women to have power on her head because of the angels (verses 8-9).

This has been a treasured practice of our church since its inception.

Historical Useage

Historical research encouragingly reveals that women in the early church (and in the centuries that followed) observed the Biblical teaching of wearing the veil or headcovering when participating in prayer or prophesying. An early church father who lived from AD 150-220 said, "For this is the wish of the Word since it is becoming for her to pray veiled." His reasoning was grounded on the Word of God.

Likewise, another leader (AD 160-230) reasoned that his parishioners should continue to use the veil because the women at the Corinth church still observed this teaching. He interestingly pointed out that the veil had its origin in tradition, was strengthened by custom, and was finally made authoritative by the Apostle Paul according to the will of God. A fifth century leader indicated it was not becoming for women to uncover their hair when praying, in view of the Apostle's instructions.

In conjunction with the position taken by early church leaders regarding the veil, it is interesting to note that the art of the ancient church, as preserved in the Roman catacombs indicates that in the early centuries the church was obedient to the regulations of I Corinthians 11. Praying women are often depicted wearing the "palla," a veil or scarf on the head which hung down over the shoulders. As late as the tenth century A. D. there is a drawing of a worshipping group of believers. The men's heads are uncovered, and the women's are covered with a veil.

Continuity

Cultures change, both toward the good and bad, yet the divine precepts of God remain the same, even if social customs change. In His Holy Word, God gives a set of absolutes that are eternal and do not change with the times. The teaching of the prayer veil is a case in point.

Summary and Conclusion

It is simple and clear — converted women are to cover their head when they pray or prophesy, even outside of formal worship. Why? Because the Bible says so. Man cannot usurp the Scriptures. A woman wears a covering as a symbol of her place in Godly order. And it must be remembered that the Apostle Paul did not give these instructions regarding


the headcovering on his own volition. This practice in the church at Corinth, and since that time, was instituted in accordance with the will of God. The Lord taught His followers to obey His teachings. In Luke 16:10, He said, "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful in much also: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much."

A songwriter put it very well when he wrote:

"This is the test of true devotion, To keep and hold fast to the Lord; And evermore without omission, In all things to obey His Word. In small and unimportant matters, Yet to be careful and sincere, Not knowingly to faults consenting, However small they appear."

"The Validity of Christianity" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

We believe that Christianity, the Gospel of Jesus Christ, is valid, that it is based on convincing evidence. The former Mr. Ghandi of India, led India to independence from Great Britain by his "non-violence" philosophy. He was a Hindu and greatly revered. It is said that he once attended a Christian meeting with the thought that he might become a Christian. He was disappointed in the reception he received, and in the impression he got of those attending the meeting. He was thinking about the followers of Christ, not about Christ Himself. This can be dangerous as those of us who follow Christ can sometimes be less than we should be.

On the other hand, many who do not believe in, nor follow Christ, surprise us by how kind and loving they can be. Surely we need to be diligent not to lag behind others when it comes to good works. Friends are drawn to our fellowship if we have love one for another. Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16). However, it is the validity of the Gospel, the truth of the Gospel, that should give us comfort.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the only religious teaching that claims the Creator God, through Christ, suffered for our sins so that we can be forgiven, and justice be maintained, by the Judge Himself taking our place in fulfilling the law. We can be criticized by other religions, the followers of whom may say, "You do terrible things and then repent and believe and say it is as if you didn't do all those terrible things. We take responsibility for what we do." The problem is, even if we have lived very moral lives, we cannot save ourselves. In God's sight, "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

The event that makes the Gospel of Jesus Christ valid, is the resurrection. It's true. Christ is divine, He is the Son of God. This makes His death for our sins, valid and all-encompassing, so far as our spiritual needs are concerned.

Some religions teach that we must do certain things and by our own doings, we will surely go to heaven. A man who attends our church regularly told me recently I am always telling people to repent but that I don't always tell people to believe on Christ. I repented on the spot and told him I would be more careful to include faith in Christ. I certainly believe in the importance of faith and obedience, and teach that, too. The thing of it is, we have the idea that all the friends who come to our church do believe on Christ but they haven't surrendered to Him. That may be true in our church in America, but it is not true in our church in Japan.

The good thing about the Gospel of Jesus Christ is that it is valid and trustworthy.
