Sermon by Bro. Dan Beer, Milford, IN

I Chronicles 28:1-13 and I Timothy 6

We read through here, I had to notice that David realized it wasn't always going to be things as good as this if they didn't follow after the Lord. If they didn't follow after Him, God would take away His blessing from them. He was giving them a warning. (I Chronicles 28:9)

We find this so often. We find Moses did the same thing. Joshua did the same thing. David did it. It is something that people have passed on for generations to those that are following after them: that if you are faithful, God will be with you. If you aren't, it is not going to go well for you.

We sing that song, It Is Well With My Soul (#55 Hymns of Zion). It is easy to sing when things are going good and when things are well. Our soul can sometimes, when our heart is troubled, is it really well with our soul? It is if we are standing in favor with God.

As we think about these children of Israel, God tried to be so good to them. He brought Abraham and He brought his family. He put him there in the land of Israel. Then He had a plan, if He took them down to Egypt, that He allowed them to establish a large group of people, He could bring them back then, into this land and they could conquer it and it could be uniquely theirs. They could have this one spot where they could worship God and it would be this whole place where they could have this desire to serve Him. He did that. He brought them back there.

But there were two things that He didn't do for those people. He brought them back, and we know what happened. They had their ups and their downs. Two things He didn't do. One is He didn't change their hearts. He didn't change the makeup of man. He brought them back and established this land, but He didn't change their hearts. The

second thing, He didn't cast out the devil out of there. So we see their struggles and we see that it wasn't very successful, completely successful

So then God had this second plan. That is what the New Testament is all about. He sent Jesus, and with Jesus came a conversion. He changed the hearts of men. Instead of trying to establish all in one spot, He just changed the hearts of man. He didn't cast out the devil again, but what did He do? He gave us grace to overcome the devil.

Those two things we have that are different than the Old Testament people. What a blessing it is when God gives us those two things within the heart. Yet the world looks at those things and rejects them. The world rejects conversion. The world rejects grace. But it is something each one of us should really treasure.

Paul started out here (I Timothy 6) with instructions as far as servants and masters. Something we don't relate real well to today. Yet we can relate to it as far as those that would be in charge of other people.

It talks about that we want to remember that we are brothers (I Timothy 6:2). In life, when we are a brother or a sister of someone in the faith, it means we have the same goals. It means we have the same striving. We have the same desire to walk circumspectly before our Lord. We have that goal of being there with Jesus Christ.

He talked about them. "...These things teach and exhort." I Timothy 6:2. That man would have these ideas, that they would follow Him. "If any man teach otherwise, and consent not to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ..." I Timothy 6:3. We can read about Jesus and we can think of the

things that Jesus did for us, the life that He lived. The perfect example that He was.

There are things that we can read about His life that make us feel like we need to start over, like we're beginners. When we see the instructions that He has. Every day we need to remember that we have a new day and we can strive to walk

An Independent Spirit II

In the previous article of "Light from the Word", an independent spirit was defined as an attitude of not feeling much need for others and looking at things our own way. Several scriptural examples were cited. The seriousness of the problem was briefly outlined. Some ways were given by which we can recognize if we have a problem of an independent spirit and what is at stake if we allow this condition in our lives.

This article will continue to focus on what is at stake if we have an independent spirit and will offer some solutions that will help us avoid or eliminate the attitude of an independent spirit.

The love, unity and peace in our brotherhood are at stake. The deep and abiding commitment that we have to the Apostolic Christian body of believers will be weakened if we allow an independent spirit to prevail. What is ultimately at stake is our way of worshipping, our lifestyle and the very nature and character of the Apostolic Christian Church.

In addition to causing problems within the brotherhood, an independent spirit can cause us much grief in our family. Our marriage can be severely disrupted if we insist on fulfilling our selfish desires rather than meeting the needs of our spouse and children. Relationships with others can be damaged by a selfish attitude. An independent spirit will increase the chances of looking for a way out of a problem rather than seeking God's help to find solutions.

There are solutions to the dangers that we face as a result of an independent spirit. The solution begins with an examination of ourselves. It will require a change of attitude.

If we begin by recognizing what others need to improve upon, we have missed the first point. We need to be renewed in the spirit of our minds with godly attitudes (Eph. 4:23-24). Each day we need to put on the mind of Christ with its special virtues - lowliness of mind, meekness, a submissive spirit and putting the welfare of others above our own.

Are we nurturing the carnal mind or

the spiritual mind? The carnal mind craves the entertainment of the world. Predominant topics in the media today are immorality, violence and sensationalism. Paul reminded us of this when he itemized many evil things and then wrote that there would be those "Who, knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them" (Ro. 1:32). Paul recognized that there would be people who loved to engage in sin as well as those who were entertained by watching it.

Nurturing the camal man unsettles the spiritual man. Avoiding the evils of movies, television, ungodly internet sites, etc. helps us clear our mind of evil and allows us to focus on the spiritual man. Again the Word of God is clear on these issues: "Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners" (I Cor. 15:33). The Bible doesn't say it might corrupt, it says it does. Do we think we can escape? If we abstain from these things, we will not miss anything we need.

An essential part of the solution is to heed warnings that are given by the Word of God. "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip" (Heb. 2:1). Do we appreciate the cautions or do we get a bit weary of the "negative" messages?

We also must avoid the trap of self-righteousness whereby we require a much stricter way than the scripture requires and what is taught by our church. A self-righteous outlook causes us to become so critical of others, and so sure of ourselves that we are blinded to our own faults. We must become more discerning in recognizing the independent spirit in ourselves.

We can also help ourselves by spending quiet time with God. We must get away from the loud, fast-paced environment and in a very quiet manner focus on God in prayer and reading His Word. "Be still and know that I am God..." (Ps. 46:10). When Elijah was looking for God, he did not find him in the strong wind, nor in the earthquake, nor in the fire. He found him in "...a still small

voice" (I Kings 19:12).

If we spend quiet time in serious reading of the Bible and studying it to find ways that we can apply it to our lives, we will grow spiritually and weaken the independent spirit that wants to occupy so much of our lives. Serious study of the Word will also help us mature in our faith so we can partake of the meat of the Word. "But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil" (Heb. 5:14).

Additionally, we can use opportunities to keep busy with the Lord's work to keep our minds off of self and dwelling on things of eternal value. There are many opportunities to serve others and to fill our lives with the Fruit of the Spirit, thereby reducing the opportunity for the works of the flesh to occupy our time and thoughts.

Jesus gave a good summary of how we can keep the independent spirit under control. "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength and with all thy mind and thy neighbor as thyself" (Luke 10:27).

An independent spirit goes hand in hand with pride and casualness. It is incompatible with obedience and submission. An attitude of this nature makes it easier to make bad decisions and to justify doing things we should not be doing. An independent spirit will lead us away from the moderate, reasonable, Bible-based positions of our church and lead us off to the right or to the left. It doesn't respond well to warnings. An independent spirit can lead us into such deception that we are convinced the Lord is telling us to do something when it is actually our own self will that is leading us.

If we can recognize the independent spirit and seek God's help in removing it from our lives, this will make a significant difference in our service to God. It will also go a long way toward preserving and strengthening our beloved church.

Eastern Europe

The Mission Committee is continuing to send assistance to our brethren in Eastern Europe.

Ukraine

The latest effort undertaken by the Mission Committee in Ukraine was the construction of the church in Ostrita that is currently serving the needs of nearly 500 persons. Recently we granted their request for the sum of \$5,000 to deepen the well on the church property.

Romania

The property of the Antioch Corporation formed last year by our Romanian, German, and American brethren is being updated on a regular basis. We have a room that contains Bibles and Hymnbooks in all European languages. In October we are planning to send a team of German brethren to work on this facility so that it will provide accommodations for up to 10 persons. This is vitally needed here, at the crossroads of Eastern Europe, and the Mission Committee has approved the sum of \$10,000 to assist in this effort. A team of American and German brethren plan to be in this country during the time the work is done. At this time it seems that this project has been a success, and we intend to continue to use it to further our efforts for all brethren in the area

Hungary

For a couple of years the brethren in Budapest have been trying to purchase a parcel of land adjacent to the church so that they can have some measure of control on their neighborhood as well as room for future expansion. The Mission Committee has approved a sum of money to be loaned to this congregation with the intent that it will be returned sometime in the future. This action was approved by both the European Board and the Mission Committee.

Money has been sent to the Baja congregation for the purpose of building a new church. The Hungarians are working their way through permits and other local regulations. It is hoped that construction can soon be underway here, because it is vitally needed by this congregation. They have far outgrown their present facility.

Serbia and Croatia

We maintain close contact and a good relationship with our brethren in the states that were a former part of the Yugoslav federation. Funds are sent as approved by both the Mission and World Relief Committees on a regular basis.

The brethren in these lands are very good at keeping records and furnishing reports of their needs as well as how funds are disbursed. It is easy to communicate with them either by phone, fax, or e-mail, which we greatly appreciate. Virtually everywhere in Eastern Europe our methods of communication have vastly improved in the last few years. We thank God for this, because it does make our working realtionship much easier.

In recent years we have assisted in the purchase of 15 vans in Serbia. These are used to transport passengers to baptisms or funerals as well as assisting in daily needs. There are requests for a couple more, which are being duly considered.

For some years it has also been our practice to furnish funds for heating homes and churches in the winter. The money is sent in the summer time when wood is cheaper, and it is bought and stored before winter sets in.

Brethren report that wages average about \$200/month, but many people are unemployed. The actual cost of consumer goods is not a whole lot less than here in the US, which makes assistance from outside the country of great necessity. We continue to monitor the situation as events unfold. It is very hard for working people to make ends meet, as is typical throughout the former communist lands.

We have supported several selfhelp projects, and they seem to be working well. Brethren have repaid loans, and these funds are then loaned to others to continue the cycle of assistance. We have also furnished a number of garden tillers and other tools to help the believers make their living.

At this time one new church is nearly completed, and permits are being obtained to remodel another one. We are making steady progress in renovating or building churches, and this seems to be helping the believers.

Slovakia

Bibles in the Slovakian language have been purchased for the small group of believers remaining in this former communist land. There are not very many persons here, but each soul is precious to God. Our current system of assigning various brethren to specific lands seems to be working, and we have good hopes for the future.

The European Board and the Mission Committee wish to thank God first of all, and then each of our brethren who support this work.

Food Distribution For the Hungry

The World Relief Distribution Centers serve as a hub for our efforts to help those in need. The centers each specialize in specific projects that allow the brethren to operate efficiently. Two of these projects will be discussed in this article. We are thankful for many brethren, being moved with compassion, who have provided countless labors at our distribution centers.

Corn and wheat packaging and distribution

There is great need for these two basic grains to provide food for people. In the past year contributions from our brethren to this project have allowed us to ship over sixty sea containers of grain. The shipping of these containers was funded by a secondary organization. This arrangement provides opportunity for brethren to give grain or money to this project.

Currently the centers participating in grain packaging are Bluffton, Ohio and Fairbury. The shipments were sent to Haiti, Nicaragua, Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Armenia, Jamaica, Costa Rica, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, St. Lucia, Israel, Jordan, Iraq, Afghanistan, Grenada, and Dominica. The recipients of these shipments were nongovernment organizations including orphanages, hospitals, and group homes for the elderly and homeless. Often the recipients are not receiving the social and government assistance that we are accustomed to in America. The grain is usually ground for flour or made into a porridge cereal. It is not hard to recognize that the needs of these people are much greater than what

we see in our daily lives. A state of emergency was declared in an area of Honduras due to adverse weather and economic shocks in July of 2004 just as three to four containers of our grain was reaching them. Thanks be to God for those who have been moved to help these needy souls.

Packaged Meals Program

In 1999 a variety of dry goods was donated to a World Relief warehouse. Recipes were used to blend the ingredients into ready to make meals. Brethren then began developing a project to produce low cost nutritious meals using dry ingredients. The program of packaging and shipping dry mix meals was approved by the National World Relief Board as the "Meals in a Bucket" program in 1999. The research and development of this program included sending meals to Haiti and Jamaica to test their reception. It was discovered that a one pot meal is essential, with the chicken flavored rice dishes being received the best across all cultures.



A Chicken Rice Pilaf dish was developed using soy protein, chicken flavor and rice. This dish provides valuable protein to people who are nutritionally deficit in this area. A chicken or beef flavored barley soup was also developed using barley, rice, soy protein, flavoring, and dried vegetables.

The current national Packaged

Meals Program has two aspects. The first consists of meal kits which are available from the Ohio and Fairbury Distribution Centers for churches who would like to have a project packaging meals. The kits provide a nice evening project for a group of about thirty people. In an evening they can make 5,700 meals at a cost of about 5.2 cents a serving.

The second part is a Chicken Rice Pilaf packaging system in the Fairbury Distribution Center. The system produces about 9,000 meals an hour in a sealed bag printed with the World Relief logo. The cooking directions are printed in English, Spanish, Creole, and Romanian. The current cost of production including packaging material is 5.3 cents each serving. World Relief has shipped packaged meals to Jamaica, Haiti, Mexico, Honduras, Costa Rica and Guatemala as well as within the United States.



The needs are great and the recipients, like this family in Honduras, are appreciative. Thanks be to God for the many brethren who through the generations have been moved of heart to help those in need. The example of our forefathers quietly laboring, not knowing what the left hand is doing, reaped the blessings of God. Often unknowingly your efforts and/or financial contributions have filled a hungry stomach from a bucket sitting in the mud of Hurricane Isabel, an orphanage in Mexico, or the deaf in Jamaica.

closer and more Godly as He would have us.

We talked about these things that man has and he is proud (I Timothy 6:4). We know pride is one of the things that everyone struggles with. There needs to be a little - I don't know if pride is the right word - but a little self-worth in us or we become discouraged and downcast. But when we become proud, when we start to think we are proud - I mentioned about grace. God tells us He doesn't give grace to the proud (James 4:6). That grace, without it, we are not going to do very well. If we don't have grace in us, we are just not going to do very well in our service to the Lord.

So if we are proud, we are going to have all these problems. He talked about envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings, perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth (I Timothy 6:4,5). Think of that. Destitute of the truth. Totally without truth.

"...supposing that gain..." I Timothy 6:5. I don't know what kind of gain he is talking about, if he is talking about financial gain or position gains, or what he is talking about. But "...supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself." I Timothy 6:5.

We find so many things that we have in life - Satan puts desires within us to have these things. Satan wants us to be more and more like the world. He wants us to walk the way they do. He wants us to have these desires. Everyone around us has the desire to have more money. It is just the thing that people do in America. It is something that every one of us took at. It is a problem wherever you go.

We were in Haiti. They told us now, you pay these men three dollars a day. Oh, it just seemed awful to us to pay them three dollars a day. They said, don't you do anything else. You pay three dollars a day. Well, the group that followed us in, they weren't instructed that way. They paid more wages. Pretty soon they had all kinds of fights among the people because some were getting paid too much.

So it doesn't make a lot of difference if you have three dollars a day or if you have three hundred dollars a day. If it is more or less than someone else has, it can cause problems. So it is not the amount that we have. It is the desire that we have. We even read about that later on, "For the love of money is the root of all evil..." I Timothy 6:10. That love of money. It even talked about those that would be rich would fall into temptation and snares, and many foolish and hurtful lusts (I Timothy 6:9).

We don't like it when someone calls us foolish, when someone says the things we are doing is foolish. Yet here he describes some of the things that we do every day as being foolish if we would have a desire to be rich. We would have hurtful lusts. Something that we see every day. We are worried about tomorrows. We are worried about our children and their tomorrows. We are worried about our grandchildren and their tomorrows. Are they going to have enough money? Are they going to have enough this? What is going to happen to them? Yet we read back here in the sixth verse, "But godliness with contentment is great gain." I Timothy 6:6.

We read in another place, he tells us, there are things in this world that we think are important. Even in the eighth verse he says, "And having food and raiment let us be therewith content." I Timothy 6:8. How many of us would be content with food and raiment? If all you had was the food you are eating right now and the clothes on your back, would we be content? I wouldn't be. I confess to you I wouldn't be. And yet, that is what it tells us here.

Is this wrong or are we wrong? Did Paul have the wrong idea? Or are we in our society wrong today?

We have so many things that we desire. If those things don't pull us away from God, there is nothing wrong. But if they are in between us and serving our Lord, we need to look at them and ask why they are there. We need to look at them and say, is this being a detriment to my life?

It is easy in our life to use work as an excuse to not do things of the Lord. We are working on a home here in town. It was easy to say, I was too busy, than to go. That is just the way that we are. But is it really the way God wants us to be?

It tells us, "For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out." I Timothy 6:7. We all know that. We all agree with it. So do we think that this stuff that we have is going to make our life easier here? How easy is it for God to take that away from us? We sing that song, #178 in the Zion's Harp (Life And Full Abundance In Jesus), again it is a song that is a lot easier to sing than it is to do "...Though fortune should bereave me Of all that I possess, If Christ His love still leave me, I freely give the rest" (verse 2). Would we do that? If Christ His love still leave me?

We need to get our eyes focused on what is important in this world. So many times we get caught up in the affairs of the world. We get caught up in taking vacations. We get caught up in having a newer car. We get caught up in having a newer car. We get caught up in doing this and caught up in that. Instead of being caught up in serving the Lord and caught up in doing good deeds for others. We read about that even.

It talks here about, "Charge them that are rich in this world..." I Timothy 6:17. Now there are none of you out here that don't qualify as being rich in this world. It says, "...that

they be not highminded, nor trust in uncertain riches, but in the living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy;" I Timothy 6:17. So it tells us here that God gave us these things to enjoy! So there is nothing wrong with enjoyment as long as they are not keeping us from the Lord.

But then it tells us what we should do. "That they do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate; Laying up in store for themselves..." a big bank account? No, it says, "...a good foundation against the time to come..." I Timothy 6:18,19. Now that could be interpreted as a bank account. But that is not what Paul was talking about. Paul was talking about that foundation that lasts. That one that is going to take over when we come to the end.

We sang a song there, "Nearer My God to Thee" (#92 Hymns of Zion). It says, even when I am flying away, I will be nearer to my God (verse 5). All of us will come to that point when we are going to lay in that grave. When we are going to be cold and they will lay us in the face of the earth. Lay us in the hole in the earth. Are we going to have that foundation that we can rely upon? Or are we going to have a foundation that is built here on earth? A foundation that crumbles.

You see trees. When a storm comes through, trees that have lasted for years and years, when a storm comes through and they are just knocked over. You wonder what caused it. How they have stood storms through all these years and suddenly there they lay. They are built on this earthly foundation. They didn't have anything to last.

This morning we sang about Palms along the brooklet flourish (Communion With God, #239 Zion's Harp). This last week, as it got dry, you could see things like that. You could see those that had a supply of water. They would grow.

I was working along a ditch. I was sucking water out of a ditch. You could see the corn that got right down along the ditch, where the ground was heavy. Where the water was close to the surface. It was doing real good. The corn that got up just a little farther on the hill, just maybe twenty feet away, but the ground would raise five feet and they just looked like they were ready to die.

Where are we getting our nourishment? Are we getting our nourishment from the Lord? Are we going to be out - it only took twenty feet to be away from the creek. And they would look like they were going to die. Are we twenty feet away from God? If we are, it is time to move and get closer. It is time to be there.

Along that creek where I worked, there is a cottonwood tree. I think it would take three men to put your arms around that tree, maybe four. One of the biggest trees I have ever seen in this area. Roots lay right out there in the water. Never one time has that creek ever been dry. Never one time has that water ever gone dry. That tree has always grown. There it grows. It gets bigger than all the other trees because it is right along that water.

The same thing applies to our life. If we are drawing right off that living tree of Jesus Christ, we can grow. These things of this world, these riches and these things that we read about, they are not going to seem important. They are not going to bother us because we won't need it. Because we have our faith and we are anchored in Jesus Christ.

But when we start to get away from the faith that we have and we start to become a little like we read about there in the Old Testament. They were going to build this temple for the Lord (I Chronicles 28:10). It was a great thing they were going to do. But all those years before, they had not needed it. It didn't affect

their worship. We need to remember that. Those things of that temple, they built this beautiful temple and it was such a great thing. But they were able to worship just as good when they had that tabernacle. When they had that thing that was just canvas that God had instructed them. It is in the heart of man that we worship. It is not about facilities. It is not about buildings. Those things — they were able to worship there just as good before. It didn't change it.

That is the same thing with our lives. As long as we have Jesus and we are grounded on Him and we are close to Him, we are like one of those palms along the brooklet. We've got our roots out there where there is living water. We are going to grow.

But if we are grounded on the sand - we sang that song as children (The Wise Man and The Foolish Man). Children love to sing it because they can make a lot of noise when it crashes. Does it really mean anything to them? I don't think it does until they grow up and they start to realize about how you build a foundation.

We have men in our congregation, brothers who are builders. They know about how deep you have to go and how solid you have to make that foundation and how you make it here when we are going to build it on this ground. So it doesn't move and so it doesn't break apart. But it is nothing compared to that foundation we can build with Jesus Christ. That foundation that lasted from years and years.

You can go back to Europe and you can find buildings. You can see the coliseum there. Maybe it is a couple of thousand years old. It is about washed away. Age has worked on it

Jesus Christ died two thousand years ago. Is there anything washed away about that? Is there anything missing that was established two thousand years ago when Jesus died? It is still there just as good as it was. That foundation is still there and we are just as strong as they were if we want to be. We can draw close to the Lord. That foundation is still there.

Then it talks about those that are rich in this world, that they lay hold on eternal life (I Timothy 6:17-19). That we lay hold on eternal life, that is the most important thing that we can do. We can only do that through Jesus Christ.

Some people think they can do it their own way. Buy their way into heaven. Some people think they can do it - Jesus talked about that - the ones that came in a different way. Those that didn't have a wedding garment. They got thrown out. (St. Matthew 22:11-13)

Jesus knows. He paid that price. He wants you to take advantage of it. He calls to you today. He says, come. Come see what I have done for you. Come see what I will do for you. Come see where I will take you if you follow Me.

When we put our trust in riches - I know I have told you this before - when I was in Mexico, I found a coin and I gave it to a little boy. He took it and flipped it away. Because they had taken that coin and divided it by one hundred. That coin was, it had ten cents on it. It said ten cents right on the back of it. I could read that. That wasn't in Spanish. But he threw it away. Because they had divided their money by one hundred.

If you had a million dollars and they divided it by one hundred, all of a sudden that million gets a little slim if you think you are going to live on it for life. That is what they did down there in Mexico. It doesn't mean they can't do it here. We think we have confidence in our government. Today we do. Who knows what tomorrow holds? But God knows what tomorrow holds.

We sing that song, "I don't know about tomorrow ... who holds tomorrow" (I Know Who Holds Tomorrow, #78 Heavenly Highway Hymns). That's where we want to have our foundation, on the One that is holding tomorrow. That foundation that is still there after years and years.

That temple that we read about there in that first reading, how David was telling Solomon how he was supposed to build it. He told him, you build it this way and you build it that way. There was supposed to be these porches and all this stuff (I Chronicles 28:11,12). I believe God had revealed to him how he was supposed to do it. You can't find it today. Maybe you can find a little bit of the temple that Herod built. But you can't find that temple. They maybe dig down and find a little bit of remains. But that temple that Jesus has built within our hearts, that is the one that is going to last forever. That is the one we want to have.

We read there in that first reading about keeping those commandments. He said, "Now therefore in the sight of all Israel the congregation of the Lord, and in the audience of our God, keep and seek for all the commandments of the Lord your God: that ye may possess this good land, and leave it for an inheritance for your children after you for ever." I Chronicles 28:8. Did that happen? David gave instruction. He told them, if you do this ... Today they are still over there fighting for it. They just, in the last few years, had it. In the last fifty years, fifty five years. They even have been given parts of it. They are still fighting over it. It didn't last because they didn't do what? They didn't hold faithful to the commandments of the Lord your God.

It says keep and seek all the commandments. Two different instructions; keep and seek. Seek first. You have to go out and you have to look for them. You have to see what that Bible has to say for you. Spend time reading it! Know what it says and

then keep it.

Another place it talks about being hearers and doers (James 1:22). Same thing. He said serve God with a perfect heart and a willing mind. Pretty good advice for us today, isn't it? Serve God with a perfect heart and a willing mind (I Chronicles 28:9). "...for the Lord searcheth all hearts, and understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek him, he will be found of thee: but if thou forsake him, he will cast thee off for ever." I Chronicles 28:9. Pretty scary stuff. Casting off forever if we forsake Him. God wants us to build on a foundation that lasts. God wants us to build on a foundation that is eternal. God wants us to be there with Him. To lay hold on that thing of eternal life. To lay hold on eternal life.

Just think what that says. Lay hold. If you have something you can hold on to, if you start to fall, and you grab something, you can hold on to something that is solid, you know as long as your hand holds, you can hold onto that.

There is a story told in our family about a man. They were closing a door on the end of a barn. Just before they got it closed, he said grab a hold of that rail that runs across the barn. The man grabbed a hold of that rail and that door fell. If he hadn't grabbed a hold, he would have fallen.

Grab a hold of Jesus Christ, because the world is going to let you fall. You never know when it is going to happen, but the world is going to let you down. If you put your faith in man, they'll let you down. If you grab a hold, lay hold on eternal life through Jesus Christ; He'll be here forever.

General Conference

On the above date 1100 souls attended the national get-together at the Peoria, Illinois congregation. As usual, it was a day of inspiration and a time to meet loved ones from across the nation, and a few from across the seas. The presence of Almighty God, both in the spoken word and in the gorgeous singing, was an enrichment that all attendees took home with them.

The General Conference serves as a binding agent for our congregations. A nationwide coming together — both among leaders and laypersons — tends to mold and unite hearts into a common understanding of faith and practice. One of the distinguishing characteristics of our beloved church is that we strive for a common application of Scriptures. In an age of diversity and individualism (in the culture), God's Word gives a clear direction to converted souls to be likeminded and to walk by the same rule. "Conferring" on these matters in an annual meeting is a means to this end, by the

grace of God.

And while, year after year, we strive to hold fast to our common understandings and practices — and the General Conference underscores the Spirit's instructions —an additional force is also an important part of the annual meetings. A few of the speakers made reference to the beautiful singing during the day. Surely as approximately 900 to 1,000 men and the attending sisters sing with grace in their hearts to the Lord, it sends a wave of inspiration to each heart.

The hymns found in the Zion's Harp Hymnal were, in a sense, a special "conference" in itself. The exhortations found in this book gave an certain sound to all who were present, and they do each Sunday in all the churches as well. As brothers and sisters sat and sang the lyrics from this hymnal they were fed with wonderful exhortations, that are presented as an ongoing relevance. The Spirit surely speaks from this hymnal.

The grandeur of the sound and volume of the voices ignited an uplifting feeling. Yet, it is the deep meaning of the words that speak to the matters at hand — a life of duty, separation from sin, nonconformity to the world and obedience to the Word, to Christ Jesus, and to His body, the church. The church is referred to as the ground and pillar of truth, and the ideal is

for it to exist without spot or wrinkle or any such thing. Striving for that standard requires discernment and a constant pruning of the worldliness that wants to manifest itself. It is to the credit of the forefathers who, using God's grace and guidance, had striven to uphold high standards of godliness — and we are in a pivotal time in history, is seems, when the enemy wants to undermine both decency (in the culture) and holiness (in the church).

But we can be thankful that along with the God-inspired, sincere exhortations from the Elder brothers, we also received eloquent and meaningful exhortations from the Zion's Harp songs. A few verses are reflective of the hymnal's richness: "Love, since thou hast then commanded. That in love we should be rife, Oh, revive each drooping spirit, Bring the dying back to life! Light the flames of love undying. That each one may plainly see: We, as of one tribe and family, To one Lord devoted be." (P. 33, verse 9) "Call and cry, ye watchmen boldly: Call aloud and spare them not! Jesus wants a faithful witness; Teachers not confessing Jesus Have stern judgment as their lot. Call and cry ye watchmen boldly; Call aloud and spare them not (p. 112, verse 1).

History Project

"Don't Take A Chance, On Eternity"

Most of us are willing to take a chance, in hopes of reaping a benefit. Farmers plant their corn and take a chance with the weather. Business men and women invest capital to start their own company. They may go bankrupt but they are willing to risk it in hopes that they will become a huge success. Being willing to take a chance, to run a risk, seems to be an important part of being a success.

However, it has occurred to me that we should not take a chance on eternity. That's much too long, to take a chance on. Therefore, it goes through my mind over and over again, "I must not take a chance on eternity." That is, I must do all I know to do, to be ready for eternity. and not take any chances by relinquishing my faith in Christ, or by becoming lukewarm in my life of faith. I've heard the statement, "All this and heaven, too," meaning that I can live a rather self-centered life and I will still make it to heaven. Today, his company, Walmart, is the largest corporation in the world. He took a chance and made a decision. Sometimes it is good to take a chance. However, when it comes to eternity, don't take a chance. It is much too long for eternal regrets. Just make sure that you are in Christ and that you stay there.

In regard to time and chance being factors in our success in life, there is also the factor of divine providence, God's blessing on our undertakings. Psalm 37:23 reads, "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord." If we are fully surrendered to God, He will bless us now and forever. Don't take a chance, on eternity.
