Sermon by the late Bro. Roy Luginbuhl, Rockville, CT (December 25th, 1983)

Isaiah 7:10-18 and St. Luke 1:26-38, 2:1-21

Six hundred years, approximately, before the coming of Christ, the Prophet Isaiah told that He would come to a virgin of the house of David. We are the benefactors. We that are gathered here in this morning hour, as well as those that have gathered all over the world, are the benefactors of Christ's coming. The invitation is still going forth.

I am sure that this story, that this account of the angel coming to Mary, that the account of the early prophecy from Isaiah, from this reading about this child's birth in Bethlehem is not new. Let each of us pray that this same account will be read, can be read, will be listened to for many, many years to come. Until our heavenly Father decides that He can no longer accept the conditions of the world.

In this day, although the day is nearly ended in Israel and in Bethlehem and in Jerusalem, in this day, many, many people have had thoughts about the birth of our Saviour. About this individual who brought joy to the world.

What is this joy? Let's think a moment about joy. What is joy? Joy is something that is different in the hearts of each of us. I can remember so well when we moved into the cellar of what was to be our future home from an apartment that had no bathroom. That was joy. There was joy in that move. Helen and I felt as if we were moving into a palace. We were going to have our own bathroom and not have to share it with someone else in the same building.

In this day there are people that are standing in line waiting for food. Getting a cup of hot soup is going to be joy for those people.

Recently in a national media, I think it was Time magazine, it was pointed out that in the United States there are two million homeless people. Two million. Now when Helen and I and our family went to India in 1963, we saw lots of people living on the streets. Born, living and dying on

the streets of Bombay and Calcutta. There was poverty there. But to think that in the United States that there are two million people that do not have homes! Either by choice or by circumstance. What do you imagine would be joy for them?

Joy is a relative situation. Joy for us in this morning hour was an opportunity to come and to hear in this congregation and meet with you beloved souls. To feel the warmth and the love flow from heart to heart. That was joy for us in this morning. Joy for us on Thursday was to greet our grandchildren at the airport, even though we were two hours late. There they were. Their cheerful faces were beaming. I think what I am trying to point out is that joy is very relative. A glass of water when we are very thirsty is a joyful event.

But now let us think about this joy that we should be thinking about in this morning hour. The joy that God offered the world when He offered His only begotten Son. That event that Isaiah prophesied and that event that occurred about two thousand years ago. That birth that occurred in Bethlehem and what joy that could bring to mankind. That joy is peace and contentment within one's mind and within one's heart. That joy is believing that Jesus was born there in Bethlehem and that He was the Son of God. That joy is believing that He then went to Calvary's cross and allowed Himself to be crucified. He allowed His side to be pierced so that His blood would flow for our sins. That joy that He brought was offered to all of mankind.

We live in a time of Christianity when we have to be very, very careful. There are lots and lots of people that call themselves Christians. But let's not worry about them. Let's just worry about ourselves. Let's just worry about our congregation, our loved ones. Most of all, we have a self-ish streak. So we should be concerned about that joy that Christ brought here upon earth for me. For you. For

the individual. Because God sent Him here to suffer and to die so that you and I and anyone that wanted, could have the joy of spending eternity with Him. That joy is a joy that defies de-

Stumbling Blocks

Satan has many devices to cause confusion and heartache for God's people. One of the tools he uses so successfully is to cause stumbling blocks to be placed in our paths.

A stumbling block is something which causes us to err or to stray from the truth. Casting a stumbling block in one's way is the opposite of being our brother's keeper.

The seriousness of casting a stumbling block in one's way was made very clear by Jesus when He said "But woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against men: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in" (Mt. 23:13). The very ones who should have been helpful were guilty of making it more difficult for God's people to do what was right.

The problem of causing others to err has been evident since long before Christ. Isaiah wrote "...Cast ye up, cast ye up, prepare the way, take up the stumbling block out of the way of my people" (Is. 57:14). Malachi also wrote of the problem when he chastised the messengers of the Lord who "...are departed out of the way; ye have caused many to stumble at the law; ye have corrupted the covenant of Levi, saith the Lord of hosts" (Mal. 2:7).

Ezekiel wrote at length about the shepherds who were more concerned about their selfish interests than they were about feeding the flocks. In Ez. Chap. 34 he wrote of those who neither cared for the diseased nor sought those who were scattered. The sheep wandered upon the face of the earth and no one searched for them. The stumbling block was acts of selfishness and neglect.

From this example and other scriptures, we can understand that there are many ways we can cast a stumbling

block in the way of God's people. Perhaps the most serious stumbling block of all was committed when the Savior was put to death. This was done to discourage others from following Him. The Jewish leaders at that time were willing to go to any extreme to silence the message of salvation and to prevent anyone from following Jesus.

Persecution against Christians has been a tool that Satan has used ever since Christ arose from the dead. "...And at that time there was great persecution against the church..." (Acts 8:1). Throughout history and continuing to our time, persecution has made it difficult for those who want to worship God.

The preceding examples have been quite blatant and easy to recognize. We must also understand that there are more subtle, but very effective, stumbling blocks that cause men to fail. We must be careful that we do not allow ourselves to be guilty of them.

"Christian liberty" has often been used as justification to engage in activities that, at best, are borderline sin. It is true that Christ came to earth to liberate us from Satan. It is also true that we "...shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption unto the glorious liberty of the children of God" (Ro. 8:21) and "...where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty" (II. Cor. 3:17).

The Apostle Paul wrote much about liberty. In Romans 14 he encourages us to have forbearance with a weak brother who may not have faith to do as we do. However, he also wrote of the need to "...take heed lest by any means this liberty of your's become a stumbling block to them that are weak" (I Cor. 8:9) and to "...use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another" (Ga. 5:13). Peter wrote that we must not use "...your liberty as a cloak of maliciousness, but as the servants of God" (I Pe. 2:16).

How, then, can we be sure we do not put a stumbling block in our brother's way? God is faithful. In His Word He provides instruction that helps us in this matter. "He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him" (I Jn. 2:10).

Jesus said "This is my commandment, that ye love one another, as I have loved you" (Jn. 15:12). If we love our brother as Christ loved us, there will be no sacrifice which is too great. If Christ was willing to die for us, we ought to be willing to go to great lengths to see that we do not cause another to fall.

Paul helps us understand that we should be willing not only to avoid sin to help our brother, but that we should be willing to go much further. If there is something that we see as harmless that might offend one with a weak conscience "...for whom Christ died" (I Cor. 8:11) we really must be willing to do what we can to be helpful to others.

Clearly, Paul saw no harm in eating meat, even if it was sacrificed to idols because he knew "...an idol was nothing in the world, and there is none other God but one" (I Cor. 8:4). Even though he knew idols were nothing and eating meat was harmless "...if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend" (I Cor. 8:13).

Jesus Christ came into the world that we all could have the opportunity to be saved. He came to save us from eternal separation from God. He makes it clear that we are to love and help one another. He also made it clear that there are two destinations for the souls of man. One is eternal bliss with God. The other is "Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched" (Mt. 5:12). If we follow the teachings of Jesus we will help one another reach our goal of eternal rest. If we do not follow His instructions we could cast a stumbling block in the path of our brother.

Prison Ministry

Jesus said: "I was in prison and you came unto me" Matthew 25:36 There are a number of brethren and friends of the Apostolic Christian Church serving in prison ministry in several states. One such organization is called the Berean Prison Ministry, and is located in Peoria, IL.

The Berean Prison Ministry is supported almost entirely by the Apostolic Christian Church. It has six programs to help those that are in need both spiritually and physically. The programs are: Bible Distribution, Bible Study Course, Russian and Romanian programs, Ministry program and Food Distribution program.

Bible distribution

Berean Prison Ministry is sending out 2000 plus Bibles per month to inmates in prisons in 44 of our states at the present time. Their name and identification gets recorded on a computer so that each inmate receives only one Bible. Even though Berean sends out a large number of Bibles, they have never advertised free Bibles.

Two letters have recently been received from Hawaii requesting Bibles and another came from an inmate in Oregon with a \$300 check attached thanking Berean for their help. One of the nicest letters ever received simply said: "I would like a Bible with giant print, color black. When people tell me about drugs, I'm going to tell them about Jesus. Thank you."

Bible study course

A letter is enclosed with each Bible sent to an inmate stating that if he or she would like to participate in our Bible Study to please fill out lesson #1 and send it back to us. We then grade the lesson and send three additional lessons. Berean is presently receiving about five thousand lessons per month to grade. There are 50 lessons in the complete course and the Bible must be read to complete each lesson. Many of our young group members and residents of our retirement home along with other brethren help grade the lessons.

Russian program

The Berean Ministry also has a Bible and Bible Study Course program in the Republic of Karelia, Russia. This program was started by Bro. Howard Getz. Col. Alexander Safonov is the Director for the Department of Corrections. He is a very good friend of the Apostolic Christian Church and has visited our churches in Sarasota, Athens and Peoria. Several years ago he had a heart operation which was paid for by our church. Col. Alexander and General Mikhaylov, who is the Minister of the Interior, visited Peoria in October.

Romanian program

Bro. Fedi and Sis. Ruth Davidovics began their efforts by holding Bible Studies at their home in the mountains. It is difficult for people to travel to each other's homes because few have cars and gasoline is very expensive. They were given a small building in the town of Carta to use, but the priest of the town put up a lot of resistance, so the owner decided they couldn't use the building.

They now hold Bible classes in the bedroom of one of the former students. There are currently about ten people attending the classes. They are looking into renting a building or perhaps buying one in the cost range of \$10 – 20,000. Bro. Fedi has also been going into the federal prison in the town of Cfikszereda to hold Bible classes, which have been well attended. The warden has been very cooperative. Berean is committed to supporting this program at an estimated annual cost of \$2,000 for Bibles, Bible Studies, postage, supplies, gas, etc.

Jail & prison ministries

The Berean Prison Ministry has the chaplaincy at the Peoria County Jail, the Stark County Jail, the Juvenile Detention Center, the Youth Farm and the Sheridan, IL State Prison. Having the chaplaincy means that we are able to conduct services each Sunday at the facility with weekly Bible Studies and weekly counseling.

Berean also holds weekly Bible Study classes at the Tazewell County Jail and the State of Illinois Women's Prison located in Dwight, IL. These studies are being conducted by our Bloomington brethren. There are 190 women attending these classes.

Many individuals have benefited from these programs. We know that this is only because of the Lord adding His increase to our small efforts. We appreciate the prayers of the Brotherhood. As in the early church, prayer is essential.

"Peter therefore was kept in prison: but prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him." Acts 12:5

The continued financial contributions of brethren throughout the land to our Mission Fund makes it possible to support these programs and share the truths of God's Word with many unfortunate souls.

Opportunities in Agua Prieta Mexico

We have worked through the Concern International organization to construct buildings to support the Brazos de Amor orphanage for needy children. The love for the children is very evident with the work going on at Brazos de Amor, located on the outskirts of Auga Prieta, Mexico. Brazos de Amor stands for Arms of Love.

Many work teams have been going to Agua Prieta. It is about a 2-hour drive from Tucson and just across the border from Douglas, AZ. Teams often fly into Tucson on Saturday and spend the night in a motel near the airport and then attend Tucson church on Sunday. After church they are driven in large vans to Douglas, AZ to a motel where they stay from Sunday night through Thursday night. Breakfast is at a local restaurant; lunch is prepared by someone in the group and by someone from the orphanage where we work. The evening meal is usually eaten at a local restaurant. The group ends the week on Friday and travels back to Tucson for Friday night and stays at a motel near the airport where they fly home on Saturday.

The Ralph Venema family, with several adopted children, make the trek from Fruitport, Michigan to Auga Prieta multiple times each year to provide supervision of work at the orphanage for this organization.

The Venema family has a real devotion for the poor and needy children of Auga Prieta.

Currently the orphanage has two large dormitories, one for the boys and the other for the girls. The campus also consists of a kitchen and dining hall, a small school and outdoor recreation area. The dream is to have multiple group homes with house parents similar to Gateway Woods environment. Last spring this dream became reality when the construction of the first group home started. This construction consists of excavation, block laying, cement, plumbing, electrical and septic work. There is much work to be done there as the dream of having several group homes is fulfilled.

There is therefore opportunity for our brotherhood to organize a work team or to volunteer to go on a work team being organized by a team leader. There is also an ongoing need for funds directed to World Relief that can be utilized to help alleviate the suffering around the world including projects such as this one. We are grateful for the many brethren that give generously of time, talents, and resources to make such projects possible.



New Group Home

Work is not the only goal on these trips. Spending time with the children is blessing for the children and the team members. The children enjoy playing basketball, soccer and doing crafts. Though language is a barrier, there is no way to mistake

the look of love and thanks from a child that has hope because someone cares.



School Children

Work teams also have the opportunity to share the Word of God in daily devotions that help us all reflect on the abundant blessings we have as citizens of the United States of America and members or friends of our blessed brotherhood. Such experiences also help us reflect on our daily priorities and what is really important as life journeys on.

Work was also being done at a school located in Agua Prieta. The work there included laying tile floors in the school and putting up a fence. Food, clothing and shelter are important to sustain life. However, for the children to rise above poverty, a good education is necessary. A modest facility in which classes can be offered is an important step toward fulfilling these educational goals.

The orphanage and the school are both located in the poorest area of the town. The housing is similar to that of Juarez, Mexico with houses made of pallets and other materials that they can find to make them livable. scription. That joy is a joy that is very hard to describe.

We know what makes us joyful in our walk of life. Some of us have joy in succeeding. Some of us get a joy out of accomplishing things. Some people get joy in amassing great wealth. Some people get a lot of joy out of doing something good for someone else. Well Christ did something for each of us so that we could have joy in our heart. That was that He died.

Yes, today is traditional Christmas day. The day in which all of Christianity remembers His birth there in Bethlehem. But the Jews are still fighting with the Syrians. Just as they were in the Old Testament. You can go back into the Old Testament and find when the children of Israel were warring with the Syrians. And today they are warring with the Syrians.

I would venture to say that if we could have been present in Bethlehem in the last twenty four hours, that we would have found soldiers standing at every corner of every street armed to the teeth. Looking for some terrorist attack coming in from Syria. Times haven't changed that much between the Israelis and the Syrians. They are repeating history over and over and over again and no one knows if it will ever end.

But the thing that we do know, dearly beloved, was that Christ was born there in Bethlehem and that He died about thirty years later outside of Jerusalem on Calvary. That while He was here on earth, He brought this beautiful plan of redemption, beautiful plan of salvation. And that we are living in this beautiful day of grace. That no matter what our sins are like and what they were or what they have been, it doesn't matter. He has heard them all. There isn't a single thing that any of us here in this assembly could possibly have done that the Lord hasn't heard over time and time again. So there is no reason to be embarrassed in bringing out our sins. There need be no fear of unburdening one's heart, to think that they might have done something that would embarrass the Lord. Impossible. He has heard them all and He has forgiven them all! So you won't even be the first one to be forgiven for whatever sin might have been committed. And He is still willing to offer that joy and that peace and that contentment to know that you can spend eternity with Him.

You might ask the question, dear friends, as to what proof do we have that this is so? The proof is here. The proof is contained within these holy words. The proof is in the fulfillment of the Holy Scriptures. If you need something more materialistic to satisfy yourself, look at the archeological findings that have been uncovered in the recent years, If you go through and look at them, you will have to be convinced that the Word of God is being fulfilled and is occurring very, very rapidly.

If you sit in the congregation of God and look at the converts that are occurring, those individuals who have decided and made the decision and have finally committed to the beautiful doctrine of Jesus Christ. You have to admit that miracles are still occurring. That these miracles that are occurring today are like those miracles that occurred at the time when Christ was here upon earth. The joy in the heart of an individual when they feel the peace of God is a miracle that cannot be denied. And to think that He is still offering this to every single soul that wants it!

Our society has chosen to be extremely materialistic during this time -- gifts, gifts, gifts. We give our children and we give our grandchildren material gifts. Everyone enjoys giving.

Something that happened one evening in Florida not too long ago. As you well know, the Jews celebrate a period, a few days, seven days I believe, called Hanukah, in which they have a menorah. In some instances the menorah has nine candles and other times there are seven candles. The traditional one is seven candles. The one that they normally used for the holiday season is nine candles. The center candle is used to light one

of each of the other candles a day for eight days, to remember the accomplishments of their ancestors. In Florida there are a lot of Jews. So in many instances, during the period of Hanukah, you will see these menorahs come forth where they are in public, to think about the Jews.

After Hanukah, the Christians put in its place a Christmas tree. How many of them think about the birth of Christ? I had to think, when I saw that change from the menorah to the Christmas tree, what are the Christians really thinking about? Are they thinking about the glitter and the lights that we associate with Christmas or are they really thinking about the birth of Christ in Bethlehem and about His suffering? About His doctrine of love and joy to mankind. Are they really thinking about His death there on Calvary? Or are they thinking about the tinsel and the lights that that particular group chose to put up as an indicator of Christmas in the place of the menorah? Would it have been better for them to have some display of Christ being born in a manger?

I am not going to judge them. I have no intention of making any judgment. But it struck me very forcefully as to what Christian-dom appears to have come to think about Christmas. Shouldn't we all be thinking about what God actually did for us by bringing His Son here upon earth? Shouldn't we be thinking about the joy that He brought here upon earth and the joy that He brought through His suffering?

Yes, our God loved us so much that He wanted all of us to have in our heart that joy. He did it by bringing His Son through the birth of a virgin about two thousand years ago. Let us rejoice and have joy in our hearts for all the blessings that He has provided for us throughout our lifetime.

Anyone who has difficulty paying the bills, would like very much to have some silver and gold, some money, to be able to feed himself and his family. Therefore, silver and gold are very important in life, up to a point. In Proverbs 30:8 we find the words, "Give me neither poverty nor riches." The next verse reads, "Lest I be full and deny thee," and "Lest I be poor and steal."

Although silver and gold can be used to print God's Word and to build church buildings, it doesn't meet all of our needs. Several years ago a retired politician who lived in our prefecture, Yamanashi, was said to be so wealthy that he had bars or ingots of gold or silver in his home, but I didn't hear anything about him being especially happy. He did have a serious disease for which he often visited the Chuo Hospital in the city of Kofu. After he died I heard that he had a very large funeral with many dignitaries from Tokyo in attendance. That offers little comfort.

I am concerned that many rich people are very lonely.

I often think that silver and gold, are cold. It is cold to the touch and it is cold because there is no personal relationship. We need things to live, but things don't make our lives. Our relationship with God and our relationship with other people must be given high priority in our lives, if we are to know the meaning of true success.

Our families and our friends, our brothers and sisters in Christ, are priceless. No commodity can ever take the place of love and understanding from God and others. Silver and gold, are cold, and so are many of the things that silver and gold buy. Food, clothing and shelter are necessities, but once we get beyond that, we must be careful. It is good to use any excess amount to help others and thus bring glory to God, either in our lifetime or after we are gone.

May God teach us how to have a warm relationship with Him

and with others. It is in these warm relationships that our needs are met and we may have the courage to get up every morning in good cheer. It is important that we be good listeners and take note of what others have to say. It has been said that people are not willing to listen until they themselves have been heard. In Philippians 2:3 we find the words, "In lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves." This attitude comes from God, not from silver and gold.
