Sermon by Bro. Paul Eisenmann, Burlington, IA

#### Job 2:13, Job 3 and II Corinthians 12

We find Job, a time in his life, perhaps at the lowest point that he had ever reached and would ever reach. And yet we know the end of Job. Even the beginning of Job and the end of Job show forth his faith in God.

We know at the beginning when his wife said, Why don't you just curse God and die? He said thou speakest as a foolish woman. (Job 2:9,10). He had faith in the One who had provided for him until that time and hour. In the end we know how that he realized that man is but flesh and man is nothing and God is all. He is our faithful shepherd.

Can any of us relate to a time in our life, and I believe many probably cannot, when all was so contrary to our own wishes that we felt there was nothing but a black tunnel into which we were traveling? There was no hope. There was no light at the end of the tunnel.

I think Job had come to this point. He was ready to give it all up. He wished he had never been born. Perhaps we carelessly sometimes speak somewhat to this fashion. Wish I was never born. But I believe Job truly had a very great trial here, a test that was difficult to understand. But as he had known that God had been with him and there was a God and he trusted in Him, we likewise, when we get to that point in our life when we think all is surely lost, there is no turning back, there is no hope, but someone will say, it will not always be like this. It will improve. Trust. This is what Job had to do. He had to trust in the One who knew the end from the beginning.

I feel that at one time I had a similar - nothing as great as Job - but something wherein I felt it was only going to get worse and worse. It wouldn't improve. I would never feel as I felt before. I was reminded, you will not always feel this way. Things will change. Though we

ourselves thought it could not be worse, there was a higher power and a greater source of knowledge than we had ourselves. Our experience was small compared to the experience of others. So by remaining faithful to God, relying on the help of knowledgeable doctors, we were able indeed to come beyond that point, as Job came beyond that point. How the end was so much better even than the beginning.

God understands. He understands how each of us feel through the low points of our life and through the blessed times of our life. I would have to testify as I know Job did, when it was all passed and he had been through the valley, through the darkness, that the light is more wonderful than we have ever known. Likewise, our Lord and Savior, if we trust in Him fully and totally, that light in our life is more than we will ever find anywhere else.

Paul, the Apostle of the Lord, had done many things. He had suffered many tests and trials. Also he had had some experiences that perhaps none of the other apostles had. In that we read here, "I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago..." II Corinthians 12:2. Many believe it was Paul himself that, "...(whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body...)" II Corinthians 12:2, whether he was transferred or transported in the body or as a spirit, he does not know. "... such an one caught up to the third heaven." II Corinthians 12:2. Paul had some of these experiences that are very, very infrequent in the Bible. So great an experience and opportunity to rise from this life to the third heaven.

Why was he chosen? Perhaps because of his diligence in going forth from nation to nation, country to country to teach the Word of God. What it was that was revealed to him when he was there, it says, "How that he was caught up into

paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter." II Corinthians 12:4. Things that we would only be privileged to hear if we get to heaven. If we pass from this life being a child of God. Being a brother or sister of the Lord Jesus. That is what, when

### **Light From The Word**



on God's Word

Spiritual Riches II

July 2005

In the previous "Light From the Word", the confusion of the world concerning the values of material and spiritual riches was introduced. Scriptural foundations concerning the value of spiritual riches, the deceit of material riches and a definition of spiritual riches were discussed. This article will focus on examples of spiritual blessings, some means of acquiring them and some assurances we have to help us retain our spiritual blessings.

Paul reminded us that God provides us with many blessings. "I thank my God always on your behalf, for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ; That in everything ye are enriched by him,..." (I Cor. 1:4-5). As he was explaining some of his sufferings in the ministry, Paul reminded us that even in these distresses he found blessings: "As sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things" (II Cor. 6:10).

By giving a little thought no doubt each of us could list many spiritual blessings we have received. The following list is not intended to be exhaustive but rather to spark a few thoughts.

\* We have a powerful, loving God who created all things with an orderliness about them. In this creation we have provisions for all we need (Gen. 1).

\* We most certainly appreciate having a loving Savior who paid the price for our sins and provides us a way whereby Satan can be defeated and we can have peace with God and man through all eternity (Jn. 14:27-31).

\* The Holy Spirit is a very present help in our battle with Satan. His presence enables us to remain faithful (Acts 1:8).

\* The Word of God is available to each of us in a manner that we can be fed as often as we have the desire (Lk. 8:11-15).

\* The grace of God gives us hope and assurance that He will help us (Ro. 5:15-19).

\* We have a church where the truth of God's Word is preached (Acts 10:28).

\* Most of us have families who love us and help us to stay on the right path (II Cor. 12:24).

\* We have access to God through prayer and His Word (Ro. 12:12).

\* We have beautiful hymns whereby we can praise God and be encouraged (Eph. 5:19).

\* We have access to the history of those who sacrificed on our behalf so the truth would be preserved (Heb. 11).

\* We have the opportunity to worship God, to learn the truth and to live in a manner that will help preserve the truth for those who come after us (Jn. 4:23-24).

\* We have pillars of faith who went before us and who live among us (Ro. 8:17).

\* We live in a land of freedom where we have the privilege of worshipping God as we believe we are instructed to do in His Word (Act. 24:14-16).

\* We have multiple opportunities to help those who may have a need and we have those who will help in our times of need (II Cor. 8:1-5).

\* God will not allow greater temptations to come upon us that the grace will enable us to bear it (I Cor. 10:13).

\* We have the promise that ultimately Satan will be defeated (Rev. 20:10).

No doubt the reader could add many other blessings that we have.

How do we acquire spiritual gifts? We need to make spiritual investments, to have our priorities in godly order and we need to be willing to live for God. The Bible gives us ample instruction on making spiritual investments. Jesus said "But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal" (Mt. 6:20). He also said "...If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and

come and follow me" (Mt. 19:21).

Paul wrote "Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not high-minded, nor trust in uncertain riches, but in the living God,... that they be rich in good works, ...Laying up in store for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life" (I Tim. 6:17-19).

How can we retain the spiritual blessings God gives us? We hardly can exhaust the means God has provided for us to retain our blessing. We must live our life according to His instruction by working out our soul's salvation in fear and trembling (Ph. 2:12). This, of course, includes remaining faithful (Jn. 15:1-11), loving the Lord and our neighbor (Mk. 12:29-31), and not placing the spiritual treasures that God gives us in an unwholesome atmosphere (Mt. 7:6).

God gives us many tools to help us serve Him. Prayer, reading God's Word, singing hymns, fasting and sharing with others what God has given us. He also has provided us with talents to use the gifts He has given us.

We understand from Christ's teaching that we will be asked to give account of what God provided for us. Those who waste their blessings will surely regret it (Mt. 25:14-30).

Our opportunities for spiritual riches are limited only by our willingness to serve God. We can be blessed in so many ways if we follow the Word of God (Mt. 5:1-11; I Cor. 13). When we truly understand the temporal nature of material blessings and the eternal nature of spiritual blessings, we can understand that Satan's goal to deceive will be enhanced if we dwell on material blessings. We will also better understand the words of Jesus when He said "...provide yourselves bags which wax not old, a treasure in the heavens that faileth not,... For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Lk. 12:33-34).

### **Building Advisory Committee**

The Building Advisory Committee (BAC) was formed in 1996 for the purpose of assisting new and/or small congregations in obtaining an adequate place of worship. In the ensuing years, the group has worked in an advisory capacity with many churches including purchase and renovation of an existing building in Atlanta, GA and new construction in Kitchener, ON; Prescott, AZ; Belvidere, IL; Elgin, IA and Bloomfield/Pulaski, IA.

The BAC is advisory in nature and works with local brethren and church leadership with various aspects of facility planning such as:

• Assessment: review of growth patterns and demographics.

 Needs Determination: help with determining appropriate next steps such as renting or purchasing existing facilities, new construction, etc.

• Funding: determining local capacity and eligibility for national funding. This includes administration of grants and loans from the North American Church Building Fund (NACBF) which was formed in 1998 to provide funds for these projects

Project Development: site selection, architecture and permitting

 Construction: coordination efforts with volunteers and contractors

#### A Place to Call Home

Something most of us take for granted is the blessing of driving to a building owned and maintained by our church. We come expecting the doors to be open, the facility clean and well-maintained, and a private place to worship. And with the exception of the blessed sound of a child crying, we have quiet sanctuaries suitable for worship, prayer and quiet contemplation. Next time we sit on a nice padded pew perhaps we could whisper a prayer for brethren whose experience is a little different.

Our loved ones who meet in motel rooms consistently deal with questions of whether the room will be ready when they arrive or whether they'll find another group accidentally scheduled for the room they usually use. Or maybe an adjacent room contains a noisy gathering or even another church service. Sometimes bringing food is difficult or even prohibited, making the enjoyment of our traditional noon lunch harder or even impossible.

The expense of renting multiple rooms can make Sunday School a very difficult or impossible option. Perhaps that becomes a limiting factor when brethren with young children are considering a job transfer to a small congregation?

Another challenge associated with worshipping in a rented facility is that of feeling like one has a "real" church to attend. This may not seem important until you start thinking of children who don't know how to answer their friends when asked where they go to church. And what about inviting friends and neighbors? It's evident that a modest facility owned by the local congregation is a blessing and something we should work to provide where possible.

As you can see, there really is an evangelical mission in the work of supporting facility development of small congregations – both in teaching our children in Sunday School and for inviting others to attend church with us.

#### **Current Projects**

The BAC is currently working with Central Texas; Denver, CO; Philadelphia, PA; and Washington DC in various capacities.

The Central Texas congregation has been worshipping in a motel for several years and has begun exploring ways to find a more permanent facility in a central location.

Our Denver congregation has begun to outgrow their facility in Aurora, CO, especially in the busy summer travel months. Efforts have been made to find a site where a new building could be constructed.

The congregation in Philadelphia has also been blessed with numerical growth and is planning a building addition to address several areas where space is simply insufficient. A special blessing there is the need for additional Sunday School rooms!

Our church in Washington DC has also met in a motel for many years. Planning has begun to determine next steps and whether a more permanent facility can be provided.

#### How Can I Help?

Your financial support of the NACBF provides needed funds to help small congregations obtain a suitable worship facility. Also, through World Relief there are opportunities to provide labor as we remodel or build facilities.

## Food Packages Assembled for First Time In Romania

For over 20 years, a full sea container of food packages has been sent monthly from the Bluffton Distribution Center (BDC) to our needy brethren in Romania. This effort has brought vitally needed assistance to hundreds of our brethren in that troubled land. However, as time has gone on, circumstances have changed. Given these changing circumstances the European Board has been evaluating the most effective method of continuing to deliver this relief.

#### **The Antioch Corporation**

We have assisted in establishing a not-for-profit corporation in Romania that is administrated by the Romanian, German, and American brethren. This includes a building complex in the village of Vladimirescu, just on the outskirts of Arad, Romania. We have kept our brethren informed of our efforts, and currently the property is under renovation to adapt to future needs. Bro. Filip Augustinov of the local congregation is president of this corporation, with members from all countries involved. There is currently an adequate place to receive goods and assemble food packages.

#### A trial effort

After much prayer, effort, and research, the European Board agreed to make a trial run to assemble the food packages in Romania. The container that would normally have been shipped in March 2005 was not shipped. This meant that there were no American food packages that would arrive in Romania in May.

Bro. Filip was given many months notification of this trial effort, and he purchased local Romanian products in sufficient quantity to make up the same amount of parcels normally shipped from BDC.

#### American team at the site

Under the direction and approval of the European Board, Bro. Gene and Sis. Verna Lehman and Bro. Kurt Munsel traveled to Romania to be present when these parcels were assembled. On Friday, May 20, 2005, a group of Romanians from the Arad congregation came to the Antioch center. In four hours of working together, they assembled the food parcels, numbering over 900. The first time something is tried is often the most difficult, but all were greatly encouraged by the smooth way in which this effort proceeded.



The packages are stored and distributed in the same manner as the food packages received from the USA. All present agreed that the effort was quite successful, and worthy of further investigation.

Not only are the contents of the food packages in keeping with the diet to which the Romanian people are accustomed, the savings amounted to well over \$9,000 for this one shipment. This has given us the needed encouragement to further pursue this project.

#### Involvement of ICM

Iron Curtain Ministries, a group of Amish people, has shared in the cost of these food packages since the beginning. We have an excellent ongoing relationship with ICM. They are supportive, and agree to remain with us as the future unfolds. Five members of their group traveled to Romania and Ukraine in June of this year, and visited the Antioch facility.

#### The livestock programs

Another effort of Antioch is furnishing animals to the Romanian brethren as small livestock projects. The brethren receive 3 baby pigs or 100 baby chicks plus all the feed necessary to finish them to slaughter weight. At the end the local people receive two animals and Antioch receives one, or an equal percentage of poultry.

Last year we had 279 such projects that were highly successful, and this year hope to have a similar amount. The purpose is to teach and help the Romanians to help themselves in lieu of continuing to send them food. The team visiting Romania was pleased with the way this effort has gone and is supportive of continuing.

#### Financing of Antioch

The European Board has the support and encouragement of the World Relief Committee in helping to develop the Antioch project. So far there have been sufficient designated funds to support the work and it has not been necessary to request funds from the World Relief general donations. This support is greatly appreciated.

Many interesting things she told me, but she did not want me to tell her age. Early the next morning she called and asked that I not write-she didn't do anything. I disagree and feel like she has been an inspiration to us - we need to know how our ancestors lived - and what spoiled or privileged people we have become!

Family: Oldest in a family of five brothers and three sisters. What did you do for entertainment as a child? Worked. Where did you go to school? We walked to Gridley or traded with our neighbors in horse and buggies. When it was cold or rainv their father took them to school as he had the time then because he couldn't farm. One day she stayed after school to watch a demonstration of a Victrola and ran home so she wouldn't be late. In high school she didn't want to wait for her brother practicing football, so she took off with the car - she had never driven and drove in

second gear all the way home!

The fall of 1921 was a very hot dry windy day. The air was filled with dust. A piece of hedge wood (osage orange known to produce hot heat along with sparks) was put in the woodburning range in the kitchen for the noon meal. The fire started on the roof by the chimney. A neighbor riding his horse by noticed the fire as soon as they did. The young girl hired to help the family went to get some of her belongings upstairs and the chimney fell knocking her and the trunk down the stairway. Later they found postal cards, etc. a half mile away in the field. Her mother had washed that morning and most of the clothes were still on the line that was all the clothing they had other than what they were wearing.

After graduation from high school, she moved 40 miles away to Emporia to work as a maid, cook and childcare for a family. (There were no other jobs for single girls at that time.) Wages were \$1.00 per day, one afternoon off a week and a weekend once a month ... and no paid vacations.

She repented when she was thirty. One evening she walked over to the church sisters who were also working in Emporia and she talked so long it was too late to walk back (none of them had cars) so she had her first and only taxi ride! Bro. Mangold from Illinois proved her and was baptized before her mother died.

When her mother was dying from cancer, she came home. The doctor told her how to give the shots for pain and said "You are going to do it." Her youngest brother was five years old when their

mother died and she has been mothering her family and us since then. She lovingly taught the primary Sunday School class for years as well as Bible School and World Relief chairman

After her youngest brother moved to the home place, she and her father purchased a home in Gridley. She could not find a job in Gridley, so she enrolled in a two week school for nurse aid training and began working at the county hospital in Burlington.

When her father became ill (he lived to be 101), she gave up her job to care for him. She made and passed out the most delicious peanut brittle when we Christmas caroled at their home. When her sister died, she mothered her niece and babysat her children. She still bakes cinnamon rolls for herself and her niece's family along with tending a small garden, washing her windows, scrubbing her kitchen floor down on her knees (she gave up mowing her lawn!). Takes no medications except for an occasional pain pill for arthritis. The container is always empty when she brings deviled eggs to potluck.

It is a privilege to take her to church. She has such a sense of humor. Proverbs 31:29-31 "Many daughters have done virtuously, but thou excellest them all. Favour is deceitful, and beauty is vain: but a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her of the fruit of her hands; and let her own works praise her in the gates."

Paul went forth, he spoke this word to the people. What they must do that they would have eternal life.

Having had this experience then, and many other experiences that he had, many difficulties as well as many good opportunities, blessings while he traveled upon the way and spoke to the different peoples, he said, "It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory..." II Corinthians 12:1. He could not even glory in the fact, he didn't feel it was expedient for him to glory about his own doing.

That kind of humility, that kind of love for others is what we need to have among our own always. That we would be willing to do whatever we can do and yet not expect to have glory heaped upon us. Especially not to heap glory upon ourselves. If other people thank us in appreciation for what we have done, this is not what this speaks of. This speaks of self glory. We want not to praise ourselves but we want to praise others. We want to serve others and not serve ourselves.

Jesus, when He came into this world, He came to serve us, to serve all mankind. We have been recipients of His love and of the gift of His life and His shed blood for which we praise Him. We don't praise ourselves because we accomplished salvation. That was only following His will and doing as He asked. He gave us the grace and the power, the strength and the desire.

Says, "Of such an one will I glory: yet of myself I will not glory..." II Corinthians 12:5. Now he speaks of this in essence as it were two people. But the idea, the person that was caught up because of whatever he did, for whatever reason he was chosen to be called up, those things that he accomplished was worthy of glory. Glory in the name of the Lord. Not glory in self. It says, such an one will I glory. One that accomplishes God's will - we praise and glory and are thankful and want to

uplift those that serve the Lord. Yet of myself will I not glory.

"...but in mine infirmities." II Corinthians 12:5. That is what he is going to glory in. Seems strange. If none of us ever had infirmities, we would not have anything to glory about, according to this Word.

He reminds us then of the different things that had come to pass in his life. "For though I would desire to glory, I shall not be a fool; for I will say the truth..." II Corinthians 12:6. When we say the truth, it is not us, it is not we who are able to accomplish these things, to overcome sin and Satan. To become converted, to become a child of God. Those are the things that are accomplished in us but not because of our own knowledge, strength and ability. But because of the Lord providing this for us.

"...but now I forbear..." II Corinthians 12:6. Now that is where we started in Job. He had so much that he had to forbear. And he almost, he got to the point where he wanted to cast it all off. I know the feeling. Now there is a great love in being with the brethren. When there is a time ever in your life when you have no desire to gather in the house of the Lord to sing hymns, it is a miserable, low and dark time.

"...lest any man should think of me above that which he seeth me to be... " II Corinthians 12:6. We can look at one another and we know we are just men. We are flesh and blood. When I say men, I mean people, men and women. We are only people. We should not boast about ourselves. But glory in God and the Lord. Because we can see what each of us are. We make mistakes. We can try our utmost. Even when we try our utmost we fail. There are some even that do not put forth all the effort that they could. They are not attentive of what God asks of them. We are not to, as we will come to it later, to be those that talk of one another, uncleanness, fornication; lasciviousness. (II Corinthians 12:20,21). Those kinds of things should never be named among us. But there are many other things that are less, probably gross in sin, but yet distract from our life and the opportunity to ever receive the glory that God has intended for us.

"And lest I should be exalted above measure..." II Corinthians 12:7. Sometimes foolishly we might speak about how great we are and so much that we can accomplish. Paul had done many, many, many things that, perhaps beyond what we have ever thought about doing, in serving people, going forth and enduring hardship. Yet in spite of this he said, "...lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh..." II Corinthians 12:7. To keep him humble. To keep him serving God diligently and with all his might, Paul was given a thorn in the flesh.

Sometimes we hear it said, oh if anybody deserves to have glory or praise or honor or increase in wages or whatever, it would be that person. So it wouldn't puff up that person, here Paul says he was given a thorn in the flesh. No doubt, he would have liked to have escaped this thorn, whatever it was. Some say maybe it was his poor eyesight and others perhaps other thoughts. Whatever it was, it must have hindered him considerably. He besought the Lord thrice that it might depart from him. He asked that the Lord would remove this obstacle. No doubt he prayed earnestly. We know he was a man who did much in the way for the Lord, on the way. Yet the Lord said, the Lord knew the end from the beginning. That is what He knows with each of us. He knows our end from the beginning. Therefore He gives unto us and allows to happen those things which will keep us, His children, if it is so our desire to be true and faithful.

"And he said unto me, My grace

is sufficient for thee..." II Corinthians 12:9. So we, certainly if we have difficulties and trials and tests. let's pray for God's grace. What is God's grace? It is the things He does for us that we do not even deserve. He gave us peace in our heart. Except for the fact that we came in repentance upon our knees in humility, which is pleasing to Him, there was no reason why He needed to give us that great joy that we had, and the peace after He forgave us of our past life. Everything we need to do, for everything we need to go to Him and be strengthened. To be encouraged. To be lifted up when we are down.

My grace is sufficient for thee. The grace of God is sufficient for each and every one of us, dear ones. We must ask for it and believe that the Lord will provide.

"...for my strength is made perfect in weakness..." II Corinthians 12:9. We see our great weakness many times, do we not, when we come short of doing what we had hoped we would be able to do. By acknowledging our weakness and allowing the Lord to work in us, we can be strengthened. His strength, God's strength. Remember, when we can overcome, it is God's strength made perfect in weakness.

smote upon his breast and said, God be merciful to me a sinner, he was the one who was justified, not the rich man. Not the Pharisee who spoke and bragged about the things that he did every week. Like he was the one who was doing these good things. That did not please God. He was not giving God credit. The poor sinner, he smote upon his breast and he said, forgive me. A sinner. He went home to his house justified rather than the other. He felt his weakness and he was glorified.

"...Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities..." II Corinthians 12:9. So that's the reason. In realizing our infirmity, realizing the help we need and calling on the Lord and Savior Jesus. Then can He find glory in us and be satisfied.

"...that the power of Christ may rest upon me." II Corinthians 12:9. When we acknowledge our nothingness, our weakness, our inabilities, our infirmities, then the power of Christ may rest on us. That is our strength, dear ones.

"Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong." II Corinthians 12:10. Some people would say, that are of the world, oh look at that weak brother. Look at that weak person. Anybody can run over him, so to speak. He doesn't fight back. But that is when we are strong. Not when we fight for ourselves but when we allow the Lord be our shield and our defender and trust in Him.

### Deaths of the Marturs

"For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." -II Corinthians 4:17

Ever wonder what happened to many of those in the early church? Here is a list of several of the martyrs from the early church. All of the following people are mentioned at least once in the Bible. Many of them were mentioned in Paul's letters.

- Andrew\*: Crucified in Patras and hung on the cross for three days (around the year A.D. 70)
- Andronicus: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- Antipus: Roasted alive in a copper steer at Pergamos (A.D. 95)
- Aprila: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- Aristarchus: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- Purnibus: Dragged (with a rope) out Salamina and burned (A.D. 64)
- Intholomer\*: Beaten with rods, crucified head downwards, flayed, and beheaded in Armenia (A.D. 70)
- Epaphras: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- James the son of Alphens\*: Thrown off a temple, stoned, and beaten with a club in Jerusalem (A.D. 63)
- James the son of Zebeder\*: Beheaded in Jerusalem (A.D. 45)

- John the Apostle\*: Abandoned on the isle of Patmos from A.D. 97-99, died in peace at Ephesus~
- John the Baytist: Beheaded in the castle of Machaerus (A.D. 32)
- Index: Beaten to death with sticks in Persia (around A.D. 70)
- Junia: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- Tuke: Hung from an olive tree in Greece (A.D. 93)
- (with hooks and ropes) out of Alexandria to be burned (A.D. 64)
- and beheaded in Ethiopia (around A.D. 70)
- on the cross), and beheaded
  (A.D. 70)
- Insipheres: Tied to wild horses and torn or dragged to death at Hellespontus (around A.D. 70)
- Haul: Beheaded in Rome (around A.D. 69)

- #### Head tied to a pillar and stoned in Phrygia (A.D. 54)
- Trisca: Martyred in Rome (around A.D. 70)
- Silas: Martyred (around A.D. 70)
- Simon Heter\*: Crucified head downwards in Rome (A.D. 69)
- Simon Zelotes\*: Crucified in Syria (A.D. about 70)
- Stephen: Stoned outside of Jerusalem (A.D. 34)
- Thomas\*: Tortured with red-hot plates, cast in a furnace+, and speared at Calamina (around A.D. 70)
- Limsty: Stoned in Ephesus (around A.D. 98)
- \* Indicates one of the original twelve disciples
- ~ When Emperor Domitian, who banished John to Patmos, died, John was delivered back to Ephesus
- + Thomas was not harmed by the fire

### The Ties That Bind

This continues a series on "The Ties That Bind," a look — historical and otherwise — at the special characteristics of our faith and practice that have bound us together as believers over the generations.

It goes without saying that the central tie (that binds) is faith in Christ Jesus and His redemptive work at Calvary. And from this a Holy Spirit-empowered life of obedience and following the teachings of Christ and the Apostles results. More "ties that bind" are listed:

#### A True Conversion

"Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, Make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is well-pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen."

Hebrews 13:20-21

Our doctrine, based on the Word, emphasizes a soul becoming converted (from a past sinful life). In this, one comes to the Lord in a state of total and unconditional surrender. He/she repents and is sorry for sin. The soul turns from sin and seeks the Lord with all devotion. Confession and restitution are made, along with coming out from the world and seeking, through God's power, to live an overcoming life. As a soul becomes truly humble, the grace of God gives strength to overcome sin and evil. God molds a seeking soul into a new

creature in Christ Jesus.

A true conversion, and ongoing spiritual devotion, will see a soul in a state of submission to the will of God; and willing to take his or her place in the household of faith. The converted soul, via God's power, finds a willingness to submit to God-given authority in the church as the new man in Christ replaces the old man of the flesh.

A thorough conversion with common expectations of holiness across the church builds close ties among the brethren. Historically, a sense of common holiness has been a vivid foundational tie that has bound us.

There is hardly a greater joy among the brethren than to see a lost soul turn from sin, and to seek God's help to walk on the narrow way; and to thence find, through humility, the grace to overcome his old nature.

#### A Bible Hatterned Brotherhood

The ongoing stability of our church structure has been a wonderful tie that has bound us together. The church is organized according to the Bible's pattern. Elders serve as watchmen and under-shepherds, and lead by example. The sheep (members) are taught to obey/follow the shepherds (the Elders, i.e., church leaders, Hebrews 13:7, 17).

The believers in church are also members of Christ's body — and they are closely linked together by the Bible's definitions:

- (1) Members one of another (Ephesians 4:25).
- (2) Perfectly joined together (I Corinthians 1:10).
- (3) Subject one to another in the fear of God (*Ephesians 5:21*).

Are to help one another through encouragement and helpful cautions (*Hebrews 10:25*).

Share mutual joys and sorrows. When one suffers they all suffer; when one rejoices, they all rejoice (*I Corinthians* 12:26).

A national administrative and teaching authority that directs the spiritual welfare of the local churches has been a wonderful tie since the Froehlich days. The Elder Body has served as a unifying, cohesive force. By meeting annual and semi-annually and by holding a General Brotherhood Conference each year they help to unite brothers and sisters together in a common yoke. And it insures the perpetuation and cohesion of doctrinal truth (and practice) over the years.

Historically, the emphasis on a church walking according to God's Word and Spirit has been an ongoing pursuit. Church leaders, from the time of Samuel Froehlich - who traveled extensively on behalf of the newly-established congregations - have worked diligently to keep the churches cohesive and likeminded, both in doctrine and order. In America, Elder Joseph Bella (in the early days) along with Bro. Johannes Krienbuhl traveled widely to help nurture the early believers. This pattern has continued on as many leadership labors yet today are expended to bolster and maintain the structure/foundation of the church, of which Christ is the Head.

#### "Counting The Cost"

Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

We learn from Ephesians 2:8 that salvation is free. It reads, "It is the gift of God." I notice that the wording is "the gift," not "a gift," which indicates that salvation is not one of many similar gifts but that all other gifts pale into insignificance by comparison.

However, our Lord Jesus Christ, when speaking about being His disciple, added the following statement: "For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it," indicating that if we want to be His disciples we should first consider the cost and decide for sure whether or not we are willing to go all the way with Him.

It can be argued that there is a difference between receiving salvation and being a disciple of Christ, but Matthew 7:21 reads, "Not everyone that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." We will let the judgment with God. The


thief on the cross was saved but he didn't have time to do the will of the Father, other than to ask to be remembered. Nevertheless, this verse in Matthew indicates that obedience is quite important as proof of having faith, and I don't think such obedience can be properly called "legalism." "Legalism" appears to have been a problem in the Galatian Church where the keeping of the Mosaic Law was emphasized, including circumcision, in order to be saved. The Apostle Paul wrote, "I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain." Galatians 2:21.

Returning to the problem of counting the cost, the Lord Jesus may have been speaking to Himself, too, when he made that statement. In the Garden of Gethsemane, He counted the cost of providing salvation for us and prayed, "O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt." The big cost was paid by Christ, "For ye

are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." I Cor. 6:20.

The cost to us is that we be willing to glorify God in our bodies and in our spirits. We no longer have jurisdiction over ourselves; we relinquish that jurisdiction to God. We follow the teaching of Romans 12:1, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." We may think it is costing us something to avoid "The lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life," (I John 2:16), but we can get along very well without those things and, in the long run, we reap huge benefits from striving to live a more holy life. If you count the cost, salvation is very inexpensive for us but it was very expensive for Christ. Christ just wanted us to know if we receive His gift of salvation, there are some obligations; we are not our own.
