Sermon by Bro. Paul Eisenmann, Burlington, IA

Job 2:13, Job 3 and II Corinthians 12

Want to greet all of you in the name of the Lord. Especially our young people that are here. Just really welcome all of you.

Some of you maybe have already started college or high school or whatever school you might be going to. Just encourage you to remember to rest in the Lord as you face the challenges of education and the things that they throw your way. You definitely have our prayers. I know your parents will be praying and have been praying. Having had three boys go through college, as a parent, we know what it is like to pray for our children as they go to school.

Trust our hearts are open to the truth. We don't know for sure what God has in store as we open the Word. We trust that our hearts are open. He'll do His part. We need to do our part and that being a willing listener. A discerning listener. Someone who is open to the Spirit and allows the Spirit to speak to their heart what truth that we need. And each of us needs something a little different.

Judges 6 goes on to talk about the altar being cast down. It goes on to talk about, in chapter 7, it talks about how Gideon was used by God in a mighty way. Gideon had a sense of weakness, didn't he? He was the weakest in his family. He had the weakest family in the tribe. (Judges 6:15) He really was of no account to those around him. Yet God called him to deliver the land from the Midianites and the Amalekites and others.

Gideon is one of my special Old Testament individuals or characters, if you will. I can remember my first sermon years ago. It was back in 1988 on a Wednesday night. Remember sitting down there and Brother Bob Meyer Sr. encouraged me to go ahead. It was

one of those situations where the longer you wait the bigger it is. So I remember acquiescing and saying yes I will, not having a clue what would happen or how it would open up. It ended up, it wasn't this chapter, but it was about Gideon. It really gave me some encouragement because Gideon was the type of man that needed a lot of assurance.

If you look, it is interesting what the angel called him. Verse 12, "...The Lord is with thee, thou mighty man of valour." Judges 6:12. Mighty man of valor. Where was Gideon at? He was in a winepress threshing his wheat. He was hiding, threshing his wheat because the Midianites would come and they would take the wheat. They would take the crop that they had and just desecrate the land. So these people, the Israelites, were hiding in caves. They were oppressed. They were scared to death. They were fearful. (Judges 6:2-6) The angel of the Lord is coming and telling Gideon that he is a mighty man of valor.

That is what I like about our Lord. Because He saw right past the fear that Gideon was at right then and the oppression he was under. He saw right through that and saw the potential that could be there if Gideon would just let go and trust in God and just rest in Him. And He will do the same to us.

Now Gideon was the type that needed a lot of assurance. I can relate to that. The Lord says, I am going to do this for you. And I ask, when? How? How are you going to take care of this? What about this right here? When are you going to do this? A lot of questions. He is patient.

Gideon had his fleece, remember? He laid his fleece out. (Judges

6:37-40) That was probably a sign of weakness. They said, mighty man of valor, we are going to take care of these things. He gave him the illustration of the fire burning up the food that he got. (Judges 6:20,21) He knew that there was the angel of the Lord and maybe the Lord Himself that had come

Light From The Word

Here Am I



Writings based on God's Word

August 2005

"...Here am I; send me" (Is. 6:8). This answer was given by Isaiah in response to a question the Lord had asked: "...Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" (Is. 6:8). Isaiah did not feel worthy to take the Lord's message to the people because he believed he was of unclean lips. A seraphim took a live coal from the alter and touched Isaiah's lips to take away his iniquity and purge his sin

Isaiah was willing to go in spite of the fact that he knew his assignment could be very difficult. He knew many would not listen to God's message, but he also trusted God's promise that there would be a remnant of Israel who would be faithful. The truth of God will be preserved and there will be those who remain faithful.

When Elijah was discouraged and thought that all of Israel had forsaken God, he was reminded by God that "...I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him" (I Ki. 19:18).

There are many examples in the Bible where God's servants have responded to difficult assignments from God with "Here am I."

At the very last moment of time when Abraham was called upon to slay his son "...the Angel of the Lord called... Abraham, Abraham: and he said, Here am I" (Gen. 22:11). It was then that the Lord spared Abraham from offering his son. What would have happened if Abraham would not have recognized the voice of God or if he would not have obeyed God's voice immediately? Very likely there would have been a tragedy that would have taken Isaac's life.

At the time of Saul's conversion, both Saul and Ananias heard the Lord's call. Saul, who thought he had been serving God faithfully, said, "...Who art thou, Lord?..." (Acts 9:5). Ananias said "...I am here, Lord" (Acts 9:10). What was the difference? Both men thought they were serving God. Both men wanted to do what was right. Both men had a zeal for what they were doing. The difference was that Ananias knew and recognized the voice of Jesus. Saul, on the

other hand, was so set in his own wisdom and was so confident in his own thinking that he was unable to recognize the voice

of the Lord.

Fortunately for us, Saul (Paul) learned to recognize and submit to the voice of God very quickly. He said "...Lord, what wilt thou have me to do? And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do" (Acts 9:6). From that time on, Paul was willing to do the Lord's bidding. He didn't insist on knowing the full assignment. He simply took it a step at a time.

How do we respond to the call of God? Do we recognize His voice and are we willing to do as He says? How can we know it is God's voice or the prompting of another spirit? How does He speak to us?

Many of us needed more than one call from God to do the most fundamental requirement to be a Christian. For many of us, we did not submit the first time we were called to repentance. We may not have understood His call or perhaps we just weren't willing to submit to His call and come out from the world.

Sometimes it may be difficult to know for sure what the Lord would have us to do. Sometimes we allow our selfish desires to get in the way of God's will and the message may get blurred.

Perhaps the first thing we must do is to become completely submissive to God's will and allow Him to completely convert us. If we have been completely converted, we will no longer have a desire to partake of the evil of the world. "...the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life,..." (I Jn. 2:16). We must truly desire to give up these things because the Psalmist reminds us that when the children of Israel "...lusted exceedingly... and tempted God ...he gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul" (Ps. 106:14-15).

To help us better understand the voice of God and the prompting of His Spirit, we need to become familiar with His Word. His Word "...endureth for ever..." (I Peter 1:25), is milk that "...ye may grow thereby" (I Peter 2:2), "...is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction..." (II Ti. 3:16), "...is the power of God unto salvation" (Ro. 1:16), will "Sanctify them

through thy truth: thy word is truth" (Jn. 17:17) and is absolutely trustworthy: "Heaven and earth shall pass away; but my words shall not pass away" (Lu. 21:33). Since we know the Word and the Spirit of God agree, we can be sure that the Spirit of God will not direct us to do anything that is contrary to His Word

We may not always understand immediately what God is asking us to do. Many times it takes fervent prayer, diligent searching of God's Word and perhaps counsel from sincere and faithful brethren before we understand His mission clearly. It may be necessary for us to say "Here am I" before we get the full assignment. We may simply need to take a step of faith, trusting that the grace of God will be sufficient to help us do His will.

God speaks to us in a variety of ways. He speaks to us as we read His Word. He speaks to us through sermons, conversations with fellow believers, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit and in other ways to help us follow His instructions.

With the turmoil and confusion in society, it is necessary for us to separate ourselves so we are in an environment to receive His instruction. "Be still and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth" (Ps. 46:10). Space does not permit all that could be written that would encourage us to serve.

It is very easy to sing "Ready to go, ready to stay, Ready my place to fill; Reedy for service, lowly or great, Ready to do His will". However, it is not always easy to be "Ready to suffer grief or pain, Ready to stand the test; Ready to stay at home and send others if He sees best. Ready to go, ready to bear, Ready to watch and pray; Ready to stand aside and give, Till He shall clear the way. Ready to speak, ready to think, Ready with heart and brain; Ready to stand where He sees fit, Ready to stand the strain. Ready to speak, ready to warn, Ready o'er souls to yearn; Ready in life, ready in death, Ready for His return.

Eastern Europe: Past And Present

Following WWI there were about 50,000 Nazarean believers residing in what is now known as Eastern Europe. Most of the believers lived in an area governed by the Austro-Hungarian Empire, whose capital city was Vienna. The church fellowships grew as many souls repented and found their souls' salvation. There was economic prosperity during this time and many new Nazarean churches were erected, even though the believers were persecuted for their faith.

During WWII many of these believers suffered much material loss, physical torture, and were ridiculed. Many were separated from their families because of their faith in Christ, and even for loving their enemies. Since the believers were not willing to take a human life during the war, they were imprisoned. Many church buildings were confiscated by the government and used for military storage buildings.

After the war, most of the church buildings were returned to the believers, but they needed to be cleaned, repaired, and repainted. Soon the Communist era began and the Nazareans were again severely persecuted in Eastern Europe. Farms were confiscated and some of the brethren served ten years and more in prison for refusing to bear arms. This lasted until 1989, when Communism fell.

During the 50's and 60's, there was an exodus of Nazarean believers who left Eastern Europe for foreign lands, seeking religious freedom. Thousands fled, most of them younger, while the elderly remained. Most of the believers who remained in Eastern Europe were plunged into

poverty. They were unable to repair and maintain the hundreds of church buildings.

The Apostolic Christian Church of America became aware of the poverty and great need in the Eastern European countries. The war in former Yugoslavia in the 90's caused an economic catastrophe in the entire region, bringing about an even greater hardship for the believers. Former Yugoslavia, once one of the most prosperous countries in the Balkans, continues even now to struggle economically and politically. Because unemployment is widespread, many of the believers are having a difficult time providing for their families.

Assistance programs

The Mission Committee, in conjunction with the European Board, was moved by the Holy Spirit to respond to the great need in Eastern Europe by helping the Nazareans in many ways. One way was to provide funds for the repair and rebuilding of church buildings. Thus, during the past few years, many new church buildings were erected. In addition, vans were purchased so that the elderly could be brought to church.

Currently there are a number of projects underway. In Hungary, a new church building is under construction in the city of Baja. In Romania and the Ukraine we have built numerous church buildings and currently are evaluating the need for more new churches as well as additional repairs.

In former Yugoslavia (Serbia) there are over ten church renovation projects in progress. Financial aid is provided on a monthly basis for the elderly and others in need of assistance. A Self-Help program has been established where eligible

believers are loaned a few thousand dollars in order to start a small business that can provide income to cover their basic needs. These types of loans are paid off as the believers are able. To date in former Yugoslavia, 82 loans have been paid back.

As many families use wood burning stoves to cook, bake, and heat their homes, a large amount of funds are donated for providing fuel. Our Brotherhood's main objective is to see that no one is begging for bread or fuel, and to provide adequate shelter and clothing.

The brethren in Romania, Slovakia, Hungary, Yugoslavia, and the Ukraine thank the Heavenly Father and our Brotherhood for the generosity and love which brought hope for their children and light into their neighborhoods. They rejoice when they have an adequate place to assemble and to hear the Word of Life. As those of us from America travel to Eastern Europe, the local brethren are quick to tell us through their tears of joy, how thankful they are for the assistance.

Future opportunities

The continued prayers and financial contributions from our Brotherhood are greatly appreciated by the believers in Eastern Europe. Without your generosity, many of them would not have adequate church buildings in which to worship, and they would be unable to invite their neighbors and friends to hear the Gospel of Salvation.

We thank all of you who attended this meeting and the one hosted by the West Lafayette congregation in November 2004. What an opportunity to learn of the many ways that World Relief is helping people all over the world and benefit from fellowshipping with old friends and new acquaintances.

The first World Relief Project Presentation meeting was held in Fairbury/Forrest in 1977. It was decided that there would be an Eastern and Western annual meeting, with the Indiana/Illinois border being the dividing line. The meetings at that time were focused on the sewing projects of the local churches. Since then, the scope of World Relief projects has broadened significantly.

Opportunities for everyone

Today's meetings communicate a wide array of information, presented by speakers and multimedia presentations. The recent meetings included topics like the orphanage in Magdalena, Mexico, the Galilean Home in Kentucky, house parenting and adoption through Gateway Woods, alternative building techniques in third world countries, work team experiences, local World Relief projects, the Tsunami disaster, work in Europe, medical work teams, meat canning, child sponsorship, the World Relief Administrative Office, distribution

centers and summer work projects. Because the speakers were personally involved, they were effective in sharing God's blessings and opportunities with all that were present. Tapes from these sessions are available by contacting your local World Relief Representative.

Also, at these meetings, many displays were set up. These included sewing projects of surrounding churches, Haitian linens, pictures of children available to be sponsored, Gateway Woods information, ideas for family nights, local project samples, work team opportunities and new information for the World Relief Representatives and Sewing Sisters.

The Eastern Meeting is always the 2nd weekend in November. In the year 2005, this meeting will be held in Rittman, OH, on November 12. The Western Meeting is always the 2nd weekend in March. In the year 2006, this meeting will be held in Bern, KS on March 11. Some of the topics of these meetings will be our work in India, work projects in Haiti, opportunities in Mexico, a comprehensive report on where World Relief donations are used, plus much more. An invitation to host upcoming meetings is always appreciated. We also welcome any requests or suggestions on topics that would be of interest to you.

Upholding World Relief

These meetings are interesting, inspiring and informational. Everyone who has any interest in helping others is invited to witness first hand experiences of those who are involved in a variety of projects. We encourage you to prayerfully consider coming to a World Relief Project Presentation meeting and bring someone with you. You will

learn new ways to serve the needy involving your single group or Sunday school children. You will also see examples for local summer construction projects and other projects close to home. These meetings are for everyone, both young and old.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

A pamphlet for Apostolic Christian services states:

Our Vision
Serving According to God's Purpose

- Believing God's promises are true
- Directed by Christian values
- Believing we are called to serve
- Believing all people have dignity and potential
- Giving our best to help others achieve their best

The Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped, an Illinois General Not-for-Profit Corporation, believes all people should have the privilege to experience Christ as a Saviour and Redeemer, as a Teacher and Guide, and as a Friend and Comforter.

ACHH believes that all people have the right and privilege to learn, to accomplish, to experience relationships, to have meaningful experiences and activities, and to receive quality and Godly care to meet the needs they have not yet learned to meet independently.

ACHH believes that people should have the privilege of a Christian home, to feel secure but not limited, and to live in a setting structured to meet their needs and maximize their potential.

It is the philosophy of ACHH that disabled people have the same rights as all people to know Christ, to achieve success, to receive care, and to be safe and secure. It is the mission of ACHH to assist disabled people to exercise these rights.

To actualize this philosophy, Apostolic Christian Timber Ridge has a variety of options for residents. One option is monthly Bible studies for several groups of interested residents.

One of these Bible Study groups is led by a resident. A staff member sits in to facilitate the group. All eight residents that attend, including the leader, are physically challenged and use a wheelchair to ambulate. These participants require a variety of adaptive equipment. Most have somewhat unintelligible speech, but understand what others are communicating. One lady even uses a slight movement of her head to activate her talker. This computer is an augmentative communication device mounted on her wheelchair that speaks for her. When she sees something on the screen that she wants to say, she moves her head slightly to activate the switch. The device talks for her. This is her only way to tell us things. Other residents have a range of unique needs, but all come to the Bible study enthusiastically.

The following are excerpts from two of these Bible studies, drafted by the staff who facilitates the Bible study:

"Last night at the resident Bible Study, the resident who leads the group told me he wanted to do the study on "the blood and grace" ... and I was not sure what he meant, but proceeded assisting the group to the Bible study area. He said he needed a CD player, too ... but he managed to get one from the staff on his own.

The leader did the usual prayer requests, asking each of us what

should be included in the prayer tonight. We had the opening prayer and then he asked me to read something in the Bible about grace. I wanted to read, "His strength is made perfect in weakness, His grace is sufficient for me", but we veered to: "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" ... and some other scriptures, too.

He then asked what grace is ... but no one knew how to say it. The question came up, what is the hardest thing you have had to deal with ... and that is when God helped you ... and that is grace. The residents all had examples of the hardest time in their lives. These examples were normal things that people struggle with. They talked about getting through those times.

Then our Bible Study leader said, "I want you to listen to this ... and wheeled himself to the CD player that had been strategically set up. He found the exact spot on the CD for the song "Amazing Grace". He made us listen twice to Amazing Grace. He sang along with the CD. As he sang with his semi-unintelligible speech, I saw Jesus and grace ... in the flesh ... as he sang.

I realized, His grace IS sufficient for me; His strength IS made perfect in weakness. Whew!"

Here is an account of another one of the Bible studies written by the same staff member:

"Our leader rolled into Bible study and announced that he wanted to do the lesson on the suffering of Jesus. I gently reminded him that we had just covered the

Easter message, had reviewed those passages. He insisted that we talk about Jesus' suffering ... so we did.

We reviewed many little points of the last moments on earth for Jesus. We talked about the horror of Gethsemane ... the sweating drops of blood ... the arrest ... the chains ... the spitting ... the thorns ... the beatings ... the whippings ... the cuts ... the contusions ... the abrasions ... the nails ... the spear ... and His death.

The leader stopped ... I indicated there might be more ... hoping he would cover the resurrection, too. Chip slowly said in his semi-unintelligible speech, "If He could do that, we can do this" ... and did not say anything else.

I looked around the room at the silent physically challenged Bible Study participants. That is when I realized what Chip meant. He was saying, if Jesus could do that ... come as God, yet in the flesh for us ... and be beaten and killed like that ... just for us ... so we could live forever with Him ... maybe we could do THIS ... and the THIS of life is whatever we face ... it might even be profound physical challenges and disabilities. I knew right then and there that Jesus gave me the profound privilege and blessing to sit in that Bible Study that night.

The Gateway Woods Adoption program is in the process of completing another domestic adoption, wherein women who are pregnant choose to place their babies up for adoption through Gateway Woods. This is a very difficult choice for them. It is our prayer that we can minister to the birth mother at the same time we're arranging a stable home for her child. Please be prayerful for Adoption Services. The poem above reveals some of the unique challenges.

Our home for pregnant teens and teen moms is up and running! This program is for troubled young women in need of our services who happen to be pregnant or have young children. We currently have 5 young women in the house; one who has a 7 month old. Bro. Bruce and Sis. Heather Drayer (Bluffton N, IN) have special heart for these girls and are doing a great job of developing the program.

This new service is part of a larger expansion project that includes building a 4th group home on campus. (See article in the July issue of The Gate Post.) We will introduce the floor plan and cost information at our annual Auction. During the next several months, brochures will be distributed and churches will be taking special collections toward this project. We are waiting in faith and anticipation to see how the Lord works to launch us into this project and the future.

While many schools are empty most of the summer, Gateway Woods School is a hub of activity! Bro. Ryan Donaghy (Bluffton, IN) is working with residents, Pete F. Lavonte W, and Chris B on our landscaping crew called Top Quality. This program teaches important work and life skills. Bro. Tim Wiegand (Goodfield, IL) is busy conducting a volunteer program for our residents and Sis. Margo Waibel (Leo, IN) is helping some of our female residents with a craft and vocational program. There is a lot going on around here in the summer!

We have been wonderfully blessed to have a number of

down to speak to him. Yet Gideon needed some more assurance.

Another thing that is so special about our God is He was willing to work with him. He didn't admonish him or chastise him when he asked to do the fleece. He gave him the answers he needed. He gave him the answers he needed. He will do the same for us.

Now I am not advocating that we go about with fleeces and signs. He wants us to move from immaturity to maturity. The only way we do that that I can understand when I read in the Word, is to move from immaturity to maturity is in Hebrews 5:14. You can look it up. Not now but later. Hebrews 5:14. Talks about those who know the Word and apply the Word will grow up. I paraphrased but basically that is how we grow. That is how we grow in maturity. Application of the truth that we know. So He doesn't want us to stay in the state that Gideon was in. The state of doubt, mistrust. But He will work with us where we are at and bring us to a higher level.

It is interesting, the first task that Gideon did was not to gather the army and go out to fight. The first task that God - and the reason they were oppressed in the first place, look at the beginning, it says "And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord..." Judges 6:1. When we disobey God, when we go against His Word, what can we expect?

Hebrews 12 talks about discipline. We can expect to get His discipline because He loves us. We will struggle. I am not saying every struggle that we have in life - there are people that are sick. They are facing a lot of sickness. It is not because they have sinned. But there are times trouble comes because of our disobedience. We need to rec-

ognize when that is the case and allow God to work with us and do what Gideon did. He asked him to tear down an altar. An altar that his father had to Baal. (Judges 6:25)

These are Israelites! These are God's chosen people! And they have got an altar of Baal in their back yard? Correction - their front yard! What kind of an example was this to the people around them? No wonder they were oppressed. No wonder the Midianites thought that they had everything and they could take care of them. No wonder they were so confident.

The first thing He wanted him to do is tear down the altar and build a new altar. An altar to the living God. Sometimes it happens to us. As God gives us truth, as He opens our eyes to His will in our life, sometimes there is an altar that has got to come down. Sometimes there is something that we are hanging on to that we have got to let Him have. That we just have to open our hands and let Him take it.

What is that altar? What is that Baal? Maybe you are clean. Maybe you don't have anything. That is great. That is great. Move on to that higher level of maturity.

Maybe you do have a little bit of a Baal. Or maybe it's a big piece of Baal. Whatever it might be, as God opens your eyes to that - and He will and He has His ways to do that - do what Gideon did. Take it down. He did it at night. He was afraid. He took ten others with him. But he did it. He did it. Then he went on to gather his army. You know the story. I would encourage you to read six. Read chapter seven. I am not sure where it endsit has been a while since I read it. But you know the story where he started out with thousands and God said you've got too many. You've got too many. And he whittled it down finally to three hundred. Three hundred.

Now remember the Midianites, they were ones that Moses had pretty well defeated them earlier as they were coming through the wilderness. They had a grudge. The Midianites did not like the Israelite people. They had a vendetta against them. They were pretty powerful. It wasn't an easy army to defeat.

You can see how oppressed the Israelites were. They were hiding in caves. They didn't have any weapons. They didn't have any food. They didn't have animals. And the Midianites had camels. You couldn't even count them all. They had all the equipment. They had the resources. They had the momentum. They had everything. (Judges 6:2-6)

Poor old Gideon didn't have much of anything. But he had the Lord God. Let us never forget that with the Lord we are the majority. He whittled him down to three hundred men. Not only that, He took his weapons away and says all you need is a torch with a pot over the top of it and a trumpet. (Judges 7:16) That's all you need. Can you imagine being one of the three hundred fighting men and you are going to face an innumerable army, a lot of people. A big army. You are facing this army and all you have is a torch with a pot on the top of it to hide it and a trumpet. Would you be afraid? I wonder if they were afraid.

Again, I can relate to Gideon so well. What did he do? Just before and God knows him and knew him - just before the battle, He said, go on down to the camp, to the enemy camp in the secrecy of the night. If you are afraid to do that, take somebody with you. (Judges 7:9,10) I can't remember the individual's name. But take somebody

with you. Look at our God. He knew Gideon. He knew that he needed an additional encouragement. He knew that Gideon was probably even afraid to go down by himself. He said, take a friend with you.

How often does He do that for us? Gives us a friend. Gives us someone to go with us. He went down and sure enough. Someone had a dream and they shared their dream about how Gideon was going to, the army was going to get wiped out because of Gideon. What kind of assurance! That's just such a blessing that God does that for us!

Gideon was faithful. His three hundred men were faithful. I'm sure he shared that illustration to them and gave them that encouragement to trust in the Lord and they defeated the army. It is just amazing how God works. And how He can work and will work with us. But we have to take these examples and we have to figure out what the application is. We pointed out some of the application. I don't know all the application. I know how it applies to me. I kind of do. But I don't know exactly how it applies to you.

That is where the Holy Spirit comes in and He will give us that understanding and insight on how these examples apply to us. I think the bottom line for all of us will be. trust in God. He is faithful. He is faithful.

"In whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of him." Ephesians 3:12. I think those two really need to go together; boldness with access. Gideon had boldness because he had access to the One that could provide for him. To the One that could deliver. Without that access, he wouldn't have had the boldness. We have the boldness because we have the access to the throne. We have the access to God at any time, at any point.

You can be in school, you can be at wherever and the professors can be totally off base but you have access, even in the middle of a class, even in the middle of a test, you have access to God to give you what you need at that point. Or at work or wherever it might be.

Why did God take him down to three hundred men? Because God wanted the glory for the victory over the Midianites. It is not that God expects glory and wants to be lifted up and elevated. He deserves to be lifted. He deserves to be elevated. It is not that, but He wanted the people to recognize that their only source of strength, their only source of confidence, their only source of their boldness is Jesus Christ or God or both.

It says in verse 13, Paul had been going through some tribulations. People at Ephesus, others, tribulations. Probably tribulations that we don't even understand and are probably beyond us, being in nice, cozy America with the freedoms that we have and the comforts that we have. We have so much, don't we! It says, "Wherefore I desire that ye faint not at my tribulations for you..." Ephesians 3:13. Faint not. Fainting is giving up. Fainting is something that Gideon could have done. God gave him plenty of assurances to prevent him from fainting. Fainting is something that many of us have been tempted with.

I am fifty three. I have been tempted with fainting quite often. You know what is interesting? My temptations to faint - not in the faith, not in serving God, but by standing in the gap that I need to stand in, to be strong in the places I need to be strong in - those temptations have been more in the later years than they were in the earlier

years when I had a lot of maybe idealism and maybe a lot of energy as a youth. As I get older, that enthusiasm, it wanes. It shouldn't but it does. Satan has his ways to get at us. So I don't care what age you are, what level you are. We have that temptation to faint. And he is encouraging us not to faint.

It goes on to talk about in verse fourteen and one of the key ingredients to keep us from fainting, because God wants us to be faithful in the position that He has put us, one of the key ingredients to keep us from fainting is in verse fourteen. It says, "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ," Ephesians 3:14. Time in prayer. You want to be effective? You want to grow? You want to be strong in face of the challenges that Satan puts at us? You better be doing this. You better be doing this consistently and effectively. You better be making time to bow your knees to pray.

I am not saying a particular position. I am talking about spending time, spending energy, putting your heart into seeking God and to praying to Him. Communicating with Him. Are we healthy in that aspect? Are we doing it? Are we effective there? If we are not, we can change. He'll help us to change. We need to change. People are counting on us.

Paul had a lot of concerns, a lot of challenges facing him. I wonder how many hours he actually did spend on his knees. "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;" Ephesians 3:14-16. That's strength, that you may be rooted and grounded in love. (Ephesians 3:17)

Recently we were in Chicago in downtown. I remember looking out of the window and seeing these big skyscrapers and wondering how can they stand? How can they stay there year after year after year without leaning or falling over or slumping? They have a foundation. You can go by and you can see and you probably have seen it in cities, where they have construction. They have a fence around and they usually have maybe a building they have torn down and they are building another building. It just seems to take a long time for them to work and to build that foundation. They go deep and they go down to the bedrock and they set the foundation so that when they build up, that it is solid, that it is strong, that it will hold. It takes time and effort.

For us, for us to be strong, for us to be rooted and to be grounded in love, it is going to take time and it is going to take commitment. Are we up to it? Do we have the time for it? You are going to have, those of you in school, you are going to have projects, you are going to have term papers, you are going to have all kinds of things you have to do that take time.

Now prayer is not one thing and this rooting up and building this foundation is not something you want to do where you wait til the last minute and just before you need it you start working on it. You might get by with a term paper. You might be able to do that and get a decent grade. By waiting to the last minute and quick doing that. It doesn't work at all in the Lord's work. He wants us about His work at all times.

If you listen to the conference tapes, you hear Brother Willis Ehnle. It is twenty four hours a day. Pretty high standard. Are we up to it? Are we willing to pay the price that it is going to take of reading the Word, of spending time in the Word, of memorizing the Word. Memorizing verses that mean something to us. A good verse for you in college is Psalm 71:1. "In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust: let me never be put to confusion." It is a good memory verse before you go to class, before you go to Philosophy class or some of these other classes, or in Biology or something. Pray a simple prayer like that. It is worth it.

"...to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;" Ephesians 3:16. That is where our strength is at. Let's never forget it. "That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love," Ephesians 3:17. Rooted and grounded in love. One of the songs we sang was ninety nine. The Solid Rock. (Hymns of Zion). Solid rock. Everything else is sinking sand. Just look at that word picture. Something solid like a rock versus something that is like quicksand.

Big difference isn't there?

It goes on to talk about being able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth and length and depth and height. That's big, isn't it? Knowing what God is all about and what Christ is all about and trying to understand Him. We'll never understand Him totally. (Ephesians 3:18)

It all comes down to this. All comes down to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly - that is a pretty big word - above all that we ask or think. (Ephesians 3:20) Look at that promise. Look at the promise to Gideon. Gideon, you follow me and I am going to show you I am going to take care of the Midianites. I am going to take care of this oppression for you. I am going to take these enemies and they are going to be dispersed. You are not even going to have to fire a shot. I am going to do that for you. I am going to do exceedingly above what you can ask or think. Exceedingly above what you even deserve, Gideon.

He will do the same for us. If we are willing, like Gideon, to yield to Him, to yield to His power, we have a promise. It says, now unto Him that is able to do exceedingly above all that we ask or even think, according to the power that worketh in us (Ephesians 3:20) - and we heard about what that power was. That is the Holy Spirit. May God help us to do that as we do His work.

The Ties That Bind

Our series entitled, "The Ties That Bind" continues. A very special aspect of our church denomination is the closeness we feel among the brethren, and among the 86 or so congregations in our faith. The close ties are for a reason. As stated previously, our foremost tie is our faith in Christ Jesus and His redemptive work at Calvary. Also.our common. church-wide pursuit in "following" Christ results in a very important tie as well. More ties follow.

Applicational Huitp

We as a people try to walk in unity. A common application of the Word reflects that God's ways are clear, and that He is not divided; neither are His truths pluralistic. The Word is unmistakable that truly converted believers are to keep the same spiritual judgments (I Corinthians 1:10). An equal yoke in belief and practice offers a blessed consistency that gives strong encouragement and high personal incentive toward godliness (and oneness).

As the Word is read, studied and thence interpreted under the auspices of the church, it is applied in a practical, everyday way and the form in which it is applied results in a visible tradition.

Applicational unity has built a deeply-appreciated closeness among the brethren. Applicational variance can give the enemy an avenue to disturb closeness and unity. A common practice of holiness and good will wherein individual liberties are almost completely diminished results in a strong bond among the membership. It is a high ideal worth striving for, yet Satan wants to pull it down. No individual member, from a fleshly standpoint, likes the concept of self-denial - and if he/she sees other brethren in a state of common self-denial, it gives encouragement and inner stamina to continue on in obedience.

A Common Separation Irom The World

Living apart from sin and worldliness strengthens the church. Avoiding ungodly, fleshly patterns "which war against the soul" (I Peter 2:11) provides a collective strength for the brethren. As each believer willingly flees those areas defined in the Bible (and by the church) as worldly and detrimental to the soul's welfare, it accrues to the unity of the church.

From an individual perspective, it is a lot easier to come out from life's worldly pleasures if one knows his fellow brothers and sisters in Christ

are doing so as well.

A Common Order

In a historical sense, our forefathers stood by a literal interpretation of the Scriptures. They grasped the Bible's teachings on a common order, and that consistency in applying God's Word results in unity.

Walking by the same rule and minding the same thing (Philippians 3:16) are Biblical ideals that foster keeping the same judgments. Such ideals are God's commandments.

"Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (I Corinthians 1:10). "Can two walk together except they be agreed?" (Amos 3:3)

Both our lifestyle order (a common holiness) and our liturgical order (worship form) have sought to be uniform over the generations — although Satan wants both to fall prey to diversity. As our common order in lifestyle and worship thrives, our unity and close ties are strongly enhanced. When our order wavers it threatens our unity.

There is a correlation between doctrine and order (application). If the latter is strong and uniform among the brethren it bolsters the doctrine because our order is a reflection of the doctrine. Conversely, if the order falters, it can affect doctrine.


