
The Silver Lining



Sermon by Bro. Bill Waibel, Bay City, MI

Ecclesiastes 2 and I Corinthians 1

The man that wrote this is considered to be Solomon. He is, in this book, considered to be The Preacher. He is speaking from the wisdom of both man and of God. What I mean, in this chapter here he talks about looking at it from man's view or from the wisdom of man. What is life about? He points out in his book here, he talks about what is considered the chief good. What is the chief good of life? He concludes it and we will get to that in a moment.

We run into a word in this chapter, as you have seen. It is called vanity. The word means, in this setting, it means futility, falsity and there is one more word meaning nothing or void. What does he mean by all this? Well he is looking at life from the natural view. If you follow life in the natural view, what is life all about? I enjoy these things, I heap these things up. He got everything that he wanted. Solomon was considered one of the richest men that ever lived. Still is considered one of the richest men that ever lived, in comparison. Yet he found it all empty, futile and false.

So what does he mean? So we have to go back a little bit in order to pick up what he means by all of this. We have to go back to the creation in order to find out what he means by all of this. At the beginning God created all things. He created all things and brought them into existence by just speaking the word. Then toward the end of His creation He did something very special. He created man, humankind in His own image, in His likeness. (Genesis 1) He gave man, humankind, a living soul (Genesis 2:7). Different from all the other animals and creatures on the earth. With this living soul, now He had union with this creature He made, which is humankind. We can read there in the scriptures, in the beginning, that He walked and talked with them in the garden of paradise (Genesis 3:8, 9). So He had a communication with them, different than all the other creatures. This communication is what God wants with you and I.

If I was to be given the question, what would you say to young people, what would you say, what advice would you give them, I would give them exactly what Solomon is saying here. That life is, from the human view, only looking at it from the human view and what can be pleasant, what can be pleasing to the senses, of the human senses, is vanity. It is empty, falsehood and of no value. Why? Because we are made in the image of God. We have a living soul. That soul, that craving within us desires to be united with the Creator who created us. With a living relationship. Without that living relationship, all life is meaningless.

If we follow it through, particularly as we that are older, we can see the vanity of youth, as he also describes in chapter four or five here. He calls it the vanity of youth. He doesn't mean that youth shouldn't enjoy things. He doesn't mean that youth shouldn't live. But what he is saying is that often youth looks at things on a superficial way. That they don't consider the chief good, as it is referred to.

And what is that chief good? It is to have that relationship with our Creator, the Lord Jesus Christ. Without that, our life is futile. We have no purpose. We go aimlessly through life. Thousands and millions of people are going aimlessly through life. They are trying to fill up that emptiness in their heart with all kinds of pleasures and all kinds of seeking after wealth, power, whatever it is. They are trying to fill that void in their heart.

But I want to tell you the truth this morning. There is only one way you can fill the void in your heart. That is by coming to know the Lord Jesus Christ as your personal Savior, Lord and God. There is no other way. We can seek after things and Solomon wrote it all here. We just read about Solomon amassing everything. He had all the pleasures he could want. He had everything he wanted.

We all, as young people, boy we want this and we want that. Boy if I had this, I would be happy. He had it all and he was not happy. Happiness does not come from external things. Happiness only comes, true happiness, only comes to the soul that is in relationship with the Creator. A good

relationship with the Creator. That is the only way you can come.

The philosophers, if you go back, I don't know how many of us read, I don't read much about philosophy. But I am acquainted with it a little bit. Well, the philosophers had four basic questions about life and here is what they were: Who am I? Where did I come from? What is my purpose here? Where do I go when I leave? Now those are

Satan is Real I

For a true child of God, the existence of Satan is a given. The Bible clearly indicates that Satan is real, that his influence in the world is evident and that God's people must constantly be on guard lest we be overcome.

In spite of what the Bible says, in spite of Satan's influence, in spite of the sadness that his work brings and in spite of what Jesus went through to defeat Satan and give us the opportunity for salvation, there are still many people who do not believe Satan is real. In a 1999 survey, fifty-eight percent of American adults believe that Satan is merely a symbol of evil but not real. In a 2001 survey forty-five percent of American adults who professed to be born again Christians denied the existence of Satan.

Who is Satan? Where did he originate? What are his goals? How does he operate? What will be the ultimate fate of Satan? How can we escape a similar fate? It is probably not possible for the human mind to fully grasp the significance of Satan, his work and his influence in the world. However, if we search the Word of God we can gain a significant understanding of Satan and what we must do to overcome his influence against us. God would not place us in this earthly battle between good and evil without helping us to understand the battle plan of the enemy. Any general going out to war would like to know his enemy's plan. If we understand Satan's plan, our victory will be that much

Satan is described in a number of ways. He is referred to as Abaddon or Apollyon (angel of the bottomless pit), the accuser, the adversary, Belial, Beelzebub, the Devil, the god of this world, a murderer, the prince of devils, the prince of the power of the air, the prince of this world, the ruler of darkness, a serpent, the tempter, an unclean spirit, the wicked one and the great dragon. If one has any understanding of the meaning of these titles we can surely understand that Satan is a force to be dealt with.

From the scriptures we understand

that Satan at one time was in heaven. "How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! how art thou cut down to the ground which didst weaken the nations" (Is. 14:12). Although Satan was defeated in his attempt to prevail against God, he will likely again try to gain power in heaven in the last times, but he will not prevail, "...neither (will) there place be found any more in heaven" (Rev. 12:8). The vanity, pride and self-exaltation of Satan caused him to rebel against God. This resulted in his expulsion from heaven and should help us to understand our ultimate fate if we also rebel against God.

Having been eternally banned from heaven, Satan's goal for each of us is a similar fate. From the very earliest scriptural account of Satan, we find that his goal is to deceive mankind: "...Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil" (Gen. 3:4-5).

Satan would like us to have pride and a fate similar to his. He said in his heart, "...I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God ...I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most High" (Is. 14:13-14). He would like us to become as the king of Tyrus whose "...heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee" (Ez. 28:17).

Jesus reminded Peter of Satan's evil work and his goals for mankind. "...Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not:..." (Lk. 22:31-32).

Numerous passages of scripture tell us of the power of Satan and how he uses his power to deceive mankind. He was given the power to cause great affliction to come upon Job. Job's family was destroyed, his material wealth was taken away, he suffered much physical distress, his wife turned against him and his friends railed upon him.

Satan laid a false claim to authority over

the entire world. He took Jesus to a high mountain to show Him all the kingdoms of the world and said to Jesus "...All this power will I give thee, and the glory of them: for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will I give it. If Thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine" (Lk. 4:5-7). If Satan will lie to Jesus and attempt to deceive Him, do we really believe he will not do so to us also?

Satan will try to blind the minds of unbelievers so they cannot learn the truth. "But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, shall shine unto them" (II Cor. 4:3-4). Jesus reminded his disciples of the blessings and importance of seeing clearly when He said to them "But blessed are your eyes, for they see,..." (M t. 13:16)

Not only does Satan work to keep the unbelievers from learning the truth, he tries to cause confusion among the believers "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" (Eph. 6:12). Satan lies to try to cause the truth to be mixed with deceit. "...When he (the devil) speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it" (Jn. 8:44). There are numerous examples in the Bible where lying caused much grief. Jacob lied to his father when he said he was Esau (Gen. 27). Joseph's brothers lied to their father about his death (Gen. 37). Ananias and Sapphira lied to Peter (actually to God) about the sale of their property (Acts 5). Peter lied when he said he did not know Christ (Mt. 26:69-75). In attempting to avoid the truth and take the "easy" way out, we can get ourselves into serious trou-

Committee Meetings

This article provides a summary of meetings of the Mission Committee held in May and July of 2005. As each meeting begins, the Lord's guidance and blessing is sought through prayer. He has been faithful in moving hearts to provide good financial support for this work as well as brethren who are willing to labor in various capacities. As the work grows, the needs for support increase as well.

Communication

The official web page for the Apostolic Christian Church has been in place since early this year. It is providing a useful resource and has generated inquiries from a number of individuals who wish to learn more about our church. The Mission Committee, along with our Technology Committee, has adopted a policy that any program, which seeks authorization to be accessed from this site, must have approval by the Mission Committee. Only church related programs of a national scope are being considered at this time. For linkage to the national web site from a local site, no committee approval is needed. However, any local church affiliated web site activity should be undertaken with guidance and support from the local elder. It was also decided that our Statement of Faith should be included on the national web site.

Guiding Principles

The Committee has been working to clarify a set of guiding principles that will guide the mission efforts in our church. It is very important for an organization to have a clear purpose and to frequently review its plans and actions in light of its

stated guiding principles. The purpose of our Mission efforts is much the same as the mission of our church. Along with the guiding principles, various procedures are being developed to enable proper planning, implementation and accountability regarding the many efforts for which the Mission Committee is responsible.

Mission Candidate Review

Along with growing opportunities for service in our various mission projects, there has been the added blessing of increased interest on the part of our brethren. An orderly process is being implemented for review and placement of candidates as needed. Most importantly there is the need for much prayer and seeking of the Lord's direction in such an important endeavor. Each individual must have the support of his or her local elder and be sincerely committed to upholding the biblically based beliefs and mission of our church.

When a soul comes to a peace that he or she has been called to serve, contact should be made with our Mission Committee. A preplacement questionnaire is completed and sent to a subcommittee, which conducts candidate interviews. When the Mission Committee review leads to a conclusion that candidates should be sent, additional steps are taken regarding placement. Although effort is made to match needs with abilities, it is very helpful if candidates are flexible with regard to the type of assignment.

Mission Projects

Mission work in Ixtlan and Magdalena, Mexico continue to provide opportunities for assistance as many precious souls come under the influence of caring brethren and have the blessing of hearing the Word of God. Steps are being taken to develop a school in Ixtlan, which will afford a number of opportunities for service. It has been decided that a group home approach will be utilized for the orphanage at Magdalena. This will provide opportunity for service as house parents and other assignments. An application process is in place for volunteers. Those serving six months or less may apply directly to the Magdalena office. Those serving longer terms should follow the Mission Committee procedures described above.

Small Church Study Committee

This committee has completed its gathering of information and is developing recommendations. Representatives have made presentations at the last two Mission Committee meetings. Effort has been made to develop approaches for the small churches to consider as well as for brethren in our larger churches who are willing to help. Communication will be an important part of this effort. When brethren are made aware of needs and of suggestions as to how they can be of help, hearts can be moved to participate in meeting needs. All should be prayerful that when the Lord touches our heart to give of ourselves to others, we will be ready and willing to say as Samuel of old, "Speak, for thy servant heareth" (1 Sam. 3:10). We are taught that our first responsibility is to those of the "household of faith," and then to "all men" (Gal. 6:10). Anyone seeking further information about mission activities should contact Bro. World Relief Distribution Centers

World Relief Centers serve the Brethren of the Apostolic Christian Church by providing means whereby we might help those who are in need of material assistance. We are thankful to have World Relief Centers at six locations in the United States. The Spirit has moved the hearts of the Brethren to acts of love and kindness toward needy souls.

In Matthew we read "Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungered, and fed thee, or thirsty, and gave thee drink? When saw we thee a stranger, and took thee in, or naked and clothed thee? Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee?" (Matt 25:37-39)

May the Lord reward every quiet, and unselfish act of support and generosity manifested by many brethren throughout our churches. World Relief supports the making and distribution of several products which express the love and compassion of the brotherhood. The following are a few of these.

Clothes

Sea containers of clothes have been sent to those in need in Uzbekistan, Tbilisi and Romania as well as shipments within the U.S. Tbilisi, the capital of Georgia, a country in the Transcaucausus, has encountered economic plight by the influx of some 300,000 refugees after the country's civil war between the years of 1991 - 1994.

An additional 200,000 refugees were displaced to other regions of the country. This war resulted in autonomous regions, leaving Georgia with a disrupted and

declining economy. In 2003, United Nations Statistics show the Gross National Income at \$750 per capita in Georgia verses \$37,305 in the U.S. The people of Tbilisi were thankful for our recent shipments of clothing.

Comforters

The comforters made for the needy are an emblem of compassion toward the recipients. In receiving a pallet of comforters, one cannot help but think of the countless hours of love and kindness expressed by such a work. Light, medium and heavy weight comforters are made to accommodate various climates. As the name would depict, many are comforted.

Packaged Meals

Rice Pilaf and Barley Soup are made by numerous churches. Low cost, nutritious meals have been supplied for disasters such as the Tsunami. A few pallets of these meals were combined with loads of grain.

International Services Of Hope, who assisted in shipping the containers, indicated that the Rice Pilaf was well received because the product was easily adapted to the culture and packaged in durable buckets.

Soap

The Wolcott and West Bend areas continue to make soap. Bar soap is molded and packaged with one or three to a bag. Ground soap is also available. The requests for soap are many. One or two pallets of soap have been sent with disaster shipments, many of which were sent to Indonesia. It is not hard to realize how this helps those who are living in flood-devastated areas.

Meat

Canned meat has been distributed from the Ohio center to disasters within the U.S and for disasters or extreme needs internationally. Pallets of beef and turkey were shipped to Mennonite Central Committee sponsored orphanages in North Korea. One of the MCC Material Aid Coordinators grew up in South Korea. He reported to us the great impact the meat had on the children. He gave accounts of expectant mothers who relied on this meat – only several chunks per day – to survive during poor living conditions. Recent shipments went to Sri Lanka, Haiti, Guyana and Columbia. We are thankful God has provided us these resources to help those who are in need.

Beans

Beans are packaged and shipped from the Morris and Bay City areas. Recently, for disaster relief, yellow peas and light red kidney beans have been used due to the higher price of pinto beans. The beans we send are some of the most economical sources of protein available for those who have suffered hardship.

Grain

Grain shipments have recently been sent from the Bloomfield, Bluffton, Fairbury, Ohio and Princeville areas. These are primarily corn shipments. The corn is used to make tortillas and is included in other recipes. We are grateful for the opportunities granted to us that we might send grain to provide this aid.

The needs are great and the recipients are deeply appreciative. Thanks be to God for the many brethren who have been moved to help alleviate human misery and suffering throughout the world.

- New information is being added to the site regularly and we plan to continue to add to the site as we are able.

Part of the site is devoted to elders and ministers. This part of the site requires a password to access. The information in the Elder/Minister area is not necessarily sensitive, but it is material that is specifically for the purpose of assisting them in their roles.

The content of the site has been carefully screened by a committee consisting of the Board of Directors, elders, ministers, and other interested parties. We want the site to be useful to those accessing the site and supportive of the church. We hope and pray that it can be used to the honor and glory of God.

The following letter is being submitted at the request of some brothers in our Altadena congregation, with Sis. Shirley's permission.

It is human and natural to feel anger at God because of a young father of six children and beloved husband being taken cruelly, it would seem, from his family. But I fear this anger will hinder our understanding of God.

The God of the Bible that Jeff and I know is a God of purpose. Early this morning, as I could not sleep, several things were brought with great clarity to my heart and mind.

God prepared us for this by teaching us in Jeff's recent Bible studies that God is eternal. The Bible says of God, that "Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God" (Psalm 90:2). God is not bound by time as we are — He sees all — past present, and future — as we are able to see things presently.

Also, God is purposeful. He says in the Bible that "he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:27-28). He works all things for His greatest good, which is man's relationship with his God. He says that He has

"made known unto us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure which he hath purposed in himself: That in the dispensation of the fullness of times he might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven, and which are on earth; even in him" (Ephesians 1:9-10).

With this in mind, Jeff's death is not untimely. God is not (as Jeff called the misconception) a "fumbling God." He has timed Jeff's earthly death perfectly for His purposes — to know you and cause you to seek Him.

God is a God of love. He says that "he that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us, and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another" (I John 3:8-11). Jeff bowed to His sovereignty when alive and sought deeper relationship with Him. As he grew in relationship with God, so did his love for, adoration of and trust in his God increase.

God in His love for Jeff did not give Jeff a choice as to whether or not to stay or leave. Jeff loved his family, church family, and friends dearly. As you know he was faithful to responsibility at home, church and workplace. He would have felt an obligation to stay. God in His love and omniscience relieved him of choice and simply took him. Jeff would have told us we could trust God's wisdom, which is infinite (Isaiah 46:9-10) over our limited wisdom.

The children ... the wife ... the only son ... the ministry ... the ones he knew and loved ... the work projects...? Jeff taught us God is independent. God is not dependent on Jeff to complete the work Jeff began. He will see that needful work is done and those affected are cared for.

Will we miss Jeff? Will our hearts sorrow? Yes! This world is full of the hurt, confusion, and pain brought about by man's rejection of his Maker. God in His love stretches out his hand through Christ to take us to a safe haven with our eternal God. We need not "sorrow even as others who have no hope" (I Thessalonians 4:13).

I called out to God as I and others attempted to resuscitate Jeff. I pleaded with Jeff to breathe and live. I prayed with such intensity to spare Jeff yet again. This time God in His omnipotence, immutability, omniscience, love and mercy, said no.

Join me and others in rejoicing in Jeff's final homecoming. I believe Jeff is prostrate in love and humble adoration at the feet of God his Savior as he finally sees Him without his earthly hindrances.

I love Jeff and count it a privilege to have been his beloved for 21 years. Because of his love and pursuit of God my heart safely trusted in his leadership of our family. He pointed me to God and in so doing helped prepare me and his children for this day. I see this now.

You were his people, and so in a way you are mine, too. His God is my God. I lift you up in prayer and ask God's comfort and revelation. Seek Him and you will find Him. God will continue to honor and answer the prayers Jeff said for his

family and those he loved.

four very good questions, even if it comes from philosophers. Solomon concludes and we are going to get to that again, I say, in a moment. So let's say that again. Who am I? Where did I come from? What is my purpose here? Where do I go when I leave?

Well the Bible answers all four questions very positively, directly, plainly, clearly and perfectly. The Bible says we are a creation of God. We come from God. As relationship to the creation, we are sons and daughters of God through creation. And our purpose here is to work out our salvation, to get re-acquainted since the fall in the garden, since our separation from God, pulling away from God, is to get re-united with Him. That is our purpose here. And when we leave, we go to two destinations. Heaven being one, referring to the abode of those of the righteous that will live on forever with God and the Lord Jesus Christ. And hell being the other, which is the permanent place of torment, where the soul never dies - in either place, the soul never dies - and a place of torment forever and ever, time without end, and separation from God and His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. That is the destination when we leave this life.

If you go to the account of the rich man and Lazarus, when the rich man found himself in torment, he wanted Lazarus to come and give him a drink of water. (St. Luke 16:20-31) Dip his finger in water and bring it to him so he could put it on his tongue. He was in this heat, this fire. Abraham said to him, Son, this cannot be. Lazarus cannot go from my bosom to you because there is a great gulf fixed. One cannot pass over from you to him or from the rich man back to Lazarus. What he is saying there is when we leave here, it is permanent which direction we go from that point. So what we do here and now determines what direction we go when we leave.

So the philosophers, they worked hard trying to discover and to answer those four questions. Many of those philosophers committed suicide. Can you believe that? They had the right questions but they couldn't come with the right answers. They didn't have the Word. They didn't embrace the

Word of God. You and I today have the Word of God. We can embrace the Word of God. We can accept and receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord. Or we can reject Him. And we just talked about that.

So let us conclude what Solomon concludes. He says another thing in one of these chapters. He says, don't go to the house of mirth to know what life is about but go to the house of mourning (Ecclesiastes 7:2-4). Isn't that a strange statement. What did he mean by that statement? This is what he means by that statement. When we go to the house of mirth or the house where the party is going on and there is a big party going on, we look at things very lightly. We don't consider about life. We don't consider about the end of life. We are enjoying what we are in. We are really living it up.

But when we go to the house where one is laid out and we see the finality that all death comes to all, it is a different picture. It is a different setting. It tells us that we don't live forever here on earth. That there is going to be a separation from this earth. Then it gets us to thinking, what is going to happen? What is going to happen to me when I get here? That is what Solomon is trying to draw one to that attention. What is going to happen when I get to that place when I am laid out in a casket? What is after that?

Well, the Bible is very clear about what is after that and what is before that. I want to quote the message that God wants to embrace every human being in this world with. "For God so loved the world..." St. John 3:16. He doesn't hate His creation. Even His fallen creation, humankind, even though they are running from Him and hating Him and cursing Him, He still loves them enough to send His Son into the world, that whosoever believeth on Him will not perish or wind up in that place called hell, but wind up rather in heaven or eternal life.

So what is the chief good? What is the purpose of life? Chief good and purpose of life is to come to know the Lord Jesus Christ. When we come, when the Holy Spirit awakens our soul to the need of the presence of God and the Lord Jesus Christ in our life, the first thing that comes into our heart is

conviction for sin. Immediately the Holy Spirit brings us to the conviction of our sin. That we have sinned against God. We have transgressed His law and His commands. We need to turn from our sin and embrace what God has offered to save us.

That is Jesus Christ crucified. That He bore our sin to the cross, that whosoever believeth on Him should not perish but have everlasting life. If it wasn't for Jesus bearing our sins at the cross, we would be lost. God's righteous, holy judgment would come falling down upon us. One day it is going to come down on the earth and all men will be brought before God and they will give an account of what they have done in the flesh, whether good or evil.

That is what Solomon concludes here with. Let us go back and just take a look at it. He says here in verse twelve, "And further, by these, my son, be admonished..." or listen up -"...of making many books there is no end; and much study is a weariness of the flesh." Ecclesiastes 12:12. What he means by this statement is, as the philosophers studied and tried to figure out what life is all about and couldn't come to a firm conclusion, Solomon is warning us not to take that same course. But rather to embrace the One who created all things and then we will come to the conclusion of what God desires or what life is all about. The chief good, as it is referred to.

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil." Ecclesiastes 12:13,14. The conclusion is clear. It is clear! God is going to bring every work into judgment. We think we do something in secret. Nobody is going to know about it. Nobody sees it. I go here, I go there. Nobody is going to see me, whatever. God sees us. God knows it and God puts it down on record.

The day of judgment He opens the books and brings all men before Him, if you go to Revelation (Revelation 20:12). He opens the books. What books does He open? He opens the books of your life and my life. That is

what He is opening. What we have done in our lives. He is going to look in the books and say well, well Bill. This is what your life was. It wasn't in the Lord. I am sorry. Turn aside. Turn to my left. Well John. You served me. You come to know me and you served me. You turn to my right. You go into everlasting life. Bill, you go into everlasting destruction. That's the way it is going to be, based upon your action and mine.

We don't want to close on a negative thought. It is not negative. It is all positive. But we might take it and conclude as negative. So let us draw a positive conclusion, if you will. You don't have to be concerned if you have made the choice today. Today is the day of salvation. Receive the Lord Jesus Christ. See yourself as God sees you and I. God sees you and I as sinners. We are all sinners. No one has measured up to the commands of God. None. Except the One, the Lord Jesus Christ, when He walked on earth.

So we all need a Savior. We all need to repent of our sin and turn to the Lord Jesus Christ. What that means is to allow His Spirit to work in our lives and change our lives. First of all, that restores our relationship with Him. Then the change of life. God wants a relationship with Himself. That is what He created us for.

If we go out in nature - we all love nature. We all love to go to the mountains, the sea, wherever. We look into the universe. We see everything in perfect order. We see everything about us perfectly and wonderfully, lovely. Well all creation is glorifying God. How can we glorify God? Turn back to Him and get reunited with Him in our Spirit and our soul. That is how we can glorify God. Then we will be as the other things that He has created, glorifying Him in the ways that He desires us.

It is interesting to me that this chapter here (I Corinthians 1) opened that kind of relates back to what we fore read. About wisdom. That is one of the words we see here again. Wisdom. How there is two types of wisdom. There is worldly wisdom of man and then there is the wisdom of God. We read in scriptures, in Proverbs particularly, the beginning of wisdom in

God is the fear of God (Proverbs 9:10). That is the beginning of wisdom. If we are to be wise in God and to come to know God and to be relate with Him, and then to be obedient to Him and follow through in our live to Him, the beginning is the fear of God. The recognition of God as God.

When we are in sin, the word fear there should be rendered just like we see it normally. Fear. Something that we are afraid of. Because God is a righteous Judge. One day He is going to come and judge the world as we already stated.

But Paul writes here to the church in Corinth. Corinth, you have got to go back with a little history in order to rightly understand what he is writing about. Corinth was a city of Greece. They were sitting right in, you might say, the worldly wisdom. A lot of philosophers were there. So they had a lot of input of knowledge and stuff. So they considered wisdom or knowledge something to be attained. The more wisdom and knowledge you had, the greater you attained. So looking from that view then is what Paul writes on.

But now he talks about a different wisdom. Wisdom of the world, the philosophies and all the things that pertain to life and to the gaining and getting, as we read in our fore reading, and how to get and gain, we see there in the world, some are very wise. They know how to handle things. They know how to handle money. They know how to handle their talents and stuff to gain and to get. There is nothing wrong with that in essence. But that is only of the present things.

God wants to talk about the wisdom of His wisdom. To gain and to get Him. Which is totally different. That is what Paul is writing about here in his first chapter of the Corinthians, particularly the first chapter here. He is pointing out the terrible contrast between the world's view of life and God's view of life. He is showing here in this chapter, he says the world's view of life is wealth, power, prestige, honor and so forth. All these things that pertain to draw attention to oneself and is centered on self. That is the world's view.

But God's view is to take the things that the world rejects. For an example,

the Romans could not understand the early Christians. Meekness to them was weakness. But to have to see the stark reality of the word true meekness, when here these people were thrown into the coliseum there and thrown amongst the lions, and they didn't reject. They didn't curse. They didn't swear. They weren't angry. They weren't mad. They accepted the will of God in their lives. They knew they could not get into that coliseum, in amongst those lions or with a man with a sword or whatever unless God willed it. So they were willing and they were filled with joy to give their lives for Christ. The Romans couldn't understand that. They couldn't grasp it. Because God had chosen the weak things of this world to confound the wise and the prudent of this world.

So therefore, if you go on in this letter to the Corinthians, he makes a very strong statement. He says there, God's things are spiritually discerned. Meaning you can't receive God's Word, God Himself and His Word except you are spiritually alive.

We know if we go to the book of Ephesians, chapter two there, he says, ye that were dead in your trespasses and sins, God brought alive in Christ Jesus. So when we are going our own way in our life without God, we are in essence, dead in our trespasses and sins. We can't discern spiritual things. We are dead. But when we come under the sound of the gospel - here is the point. How do you awaken a dead man from death? Can we waken a dead man from death? Well, we can't. Not humankind. No, that is not possible. God can though. He raised the dead. He raised the dead in the Old Testament. He raised the dead in the New Testament. Jesus Christ said. I am the resurrection and the life (St. John 11:25). It is written of Him that He was the first born of the resurrection. So He is able, God is able to do the impossible to raise dead folks to life.

Well, how do you raise a dead, spiritually dead person to life? How you do that is by the Word of God. When we come under the sound of the gospel, the Word of God working through His Spirit brings it to our heart that we suddenly have a need. Suddenly we understand that our life is going the

wrong direction.

I remember when it happened to me and many of us here this morning know when it happened to them. We are going the wrong way. I put it in this example. I was in a tunnel and all I saw was black. There was no light at the end of the tunnel. You talk about a frightening thing! That is frightening. But God now had brought me to a point where I had to repent. I knew about Him. I come to Sunday School like you young people. I had been raised in the church just like you young people. But I didn't know God. God was not in my life. But when He got me to where He could get me and get my attention, He brought me alive in Christ. From that point on it has been totally different than that point back. You can't be the same once you make contact with Jesus. When you make contact with Jesus Christ you cannot be the same. That is not a possibility if you make true contact with Him in the Spirit. He will change your life. It is not a possibility not to change.

He goes on in verse eighteen, "For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." I Corinthians 1:18. You talk about blasphemy today. We see it on television. We read it in magazines and books. Blasphemy against God and His people. Look at them stupid, foolish people doing this and on and on it goes. Because it is foolishness to the un-discerned spiritual dead man. He can't understand what the Christian is all about.

Why would you deny yourself, he says. Why do you do this? And when you say, well, I have a different purpose in life now. I am looking to the future. I am not looking at the present. They don't seem to get it. They don't understand. That is what Paul is talking about here.

The cross of Christ Jesus was a failure from the human point of view. A total, absolute failure. But to God it was the victory of all victories. Christ had conquered sin. He had conquered Satan and his kingdom and He brought into existence His own kingdom of everlasting life to all those that believe. It was a tremendous victory from God's view. But from the world's

view it was a disaster. It was nothing. And that is what Paul is writing.

"For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent." I Corinthians 1:19. Meaning worldly wise and worldly prudent. He is destroying the wisdom of the wise. He is pointing out and he is showing as we go through life and we get closer to the end of our life, hopefully this will happen. To some it seems to close out and they never come to the realization of things. But to many others, they come alive and they start to see. Now what was I doing here? What did I do with my life? What is this all about? What is going to happen to me now when I die? You see, they finally start to think because they are getting toward the end of their life.

Blessed be, Jesus said, blessed are you that hear the Word in your youth. Solomon writes it too. He said you are blest if you hear the Word in your youth and then accept it in your youth. You are a blessed person.

So they go on. They don't really grasp what it is all about and many souls are that way. Because they have their mind closed, shut on the Word of God. They are not open to the truth. They have shut out the truth. What example are you? It is a willful act, in other words, on our part, to shut out the truth. For God is evident even in creation. We can't look amongst us in creation and in the world and see all these wonderful things and say there is not a Creator behind it all. Then if we just get to that conclusion, that there is a Creator behind it all, then that brings flooding to us another question. What is my relationship with this Creator? Or how am I going to be when I come to meet this Creator one day?

It brings a point and that is why evolution come into being. Because men don't want to hear the truth so they put in a false evolution. Because if they ever come to the fact that there is a Creator behind the creation, then they have to answer these other questions and they don't want to answer them. They don't want anything to do with them. Because it points out their sin and their sinful ways. They don't want to hear it. Many men do not want

to hear the gospel because it exposes their life.

That is what John wrote about the Lord Jesus Christ. The light came into the world and they loved darkness more than they loved the light. That is because their deeds are evil. (St. John 3:19)

"Where is the wise? where is the scribe? where is the disputer of this world? hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that... what? "...believe." I Corinthians 1:20,21.

When I worked on the farm, on Schlatter's farm in high school, they had cattle. One of my functions was to go out and bring the cattle in to get milked and fed. They would be out in the pasture. I would go out there and long before I got to the cattle, I would holler out 'come boss'. That was the term we used, for what, I don't know. And here was the reaction. Some lifted up their heads. They heard me. They went back to feeding. Others didn't seem to hear. Others raised up their heads, heard me and started towards me.

That, I believe, is the way in the spiritual. God is giving the call. He is giving the message out there and some are going to raise up their heads and go back feeding on what they are doing. Go back to their life of sin. Others are not even going to acknowledge they heard. Others are going to come towards the Shepherd. Which way are we going? Which one? What way will we take, is what we need to look at this morning.

"For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom: But we preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumblingblock, and unto the Greeks foolishness; But unto them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God." I Corinthians 1:22-24. To those that believe, He is the power of God and the wisdom of God. Power to reunite us. To bring us alive in Him. Power to bring our relationship to Him a reality. And power to get us to live the life that He wants us to live.



The Ties That Bind

The series on "The Ties That Bind" continues. It is helpful to examine the characteristics that have, historically, allowed for the close ties we have in our national brotherhood. One of the great blessings of God's people is traveling from congregation to congregation and feeling a special Spirit-led warmth. There are reasons for this special privilege. The "ties" continue below:

Esteeming Others Ober Self

Each believer must strive to overcome fleshly weaknesses. And in this vein, the last thing a believer needs to see are needless liberties taken by others, especially in those areas where he or she is weak.

As we covenant together in brotherhood — humbly and willingly — we are agree to follow the Word which tells us to be likeminded (Romans 15:5) and perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. This is Biblical. Our ties have been close over the generations because the forefathers acknowledged this Biblical precept and made efforts to achieve it among the brethren.

We are not to grieve our brother with our lifestyle choices. We are to follow after the things that make for peace; and things in which one may edify another (Romans 14:19). This is unquestionably Biblical.

Indeed, it has been one of the distinguishing characteristics of our faith that we have followed very seriously the Bible's exhortation not to use our liberty (from sin) to live in ways that can be a stumbling block to those who are weak. We as brethren over the years have seriously adhered to the teachings of I Corinthians 8:9-13:

"But take heed lest by any means this liberty of yours become a stumbling block to them that are weak. For if any man see thee which hast knowledge sit at meat in the idol's temple, shall not the conscience of him which is weak be emboldened to eat those things which are offered to idols;

And through thy knowledge shall the weak brother perish, for whom Christ died? But when ye sin so against the brethren, and would their weak conscience, ye sin against Christ. Wherefore, if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend."

We have always had a high consciousness regarding whatever we do to our brother, we do unto Christ (Matthew 25:45). In this, we have an applicational tradition of walking carefully in order not to offend anyone. We have caught the Biblical vision that in lowliness of mind we should esteem others higher than ourself—and we gauge our behaviour with our fellow believers in mind. In following these Biblical perceptions, our common observation of the Bible's expressions has strengthened the deep ties among us.

Annility and Submissibeness Surrendering completely to the Lord, and doing His will without reservation, have been patterns contributing to the ties that bind us. We have preferred lowliness of mind and unity over individualism and diversity. The Bible teaches this.

We, during conversion and then daily, have sought to become crucified with Christ (Galatians 2:20). We seek, as the Apostle Paul, to "die daily" (I Corinthians 15:31).

We have seen humility as a condition for receiving God's grace (James 4:6). In fact, we have sought to serve the Lord with all lowliness and meekness (Ephesians 4:2). The Lord Jesus was a man of sorrows and walked in lowliness of heart. That example has been a big influence among the brethren — and as we shed our selfish inclinations it has enhanced a deep tie among us.

In a lowly state, and full of God's grace, submission to Godly authority follows more readily. Obedience to the carefully-considered guidance of the church (of which Christ is the Head, Ephesians 5:23) has been a deeply-held ideal — and a precious tie among the brethren. It takes a humble heart to achieve a God-empowered state of obedience. The reward of humility is exaltation (Luke 14:11); and a by-product is a closer unity with fellow brothers and sisters in the Lord, and a special nearness to God.

"A Servant's Attitude"

I believe that the most important thing that can be said about a servant's attitude is that it should not give the impression of being superior to the person being served.

Jesus said in Luke 17:10, "So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do."

Elders in our church are servants of God, of the Lord Jesus Christ, and of the Holy Spirit, but they are also servants to the church. They are servants of the church only so long as the church desires conformity to the Word of God. There may be a difference between being a servant of the church and in being a servant to the church.

In regard to being a servant of God, Peter writes in II Peter 1:1, "Simon Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ".

In regard to being a servant to the church, in II Corinthians

4:5, Paul wrote, "For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake."


When it comes to considering the attitude of a servant, I like Paul's statement in I Thessalonians 2:7, "But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children." Thus, when we are serving God. our brethren in the church, or just society in general, it is good to have a gentle attitude. It is not good for us to give the impression that we of ourselves, are superior, or have better knowledge and understanding, than those we are trying to serve. We are just poor mortals, trying together to better understand and know, what God's will is, according to the Bible.

The word "attitude" is not found in the King James version of the Bible but there are many teachings encouraging us to have a servant's attitude. When we observe the words and actions of another person,

we receive an impression of a desire to serve, or a desire to be served. That latter one is what we need to be careful about, according to the Bible. Matthew 20:27, 28, "And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant: Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Evidently, even when talking to another person about where he or she may be failing, or when exhorting the church to a more spiritual walk of life, it is required of us that our demeanor shows the attitude of a servant. In the past, there have been long periods of time when those with power could tell those without power what they must do and what they must not do, but those days are gone for much of the world. Now, more than ever, we become non-effective, if we do not have the attitude, and give the impression, of a servant.
