Sermon by Bro. Todd Stoller, Latty, OH

I Samuel 15 and Galatians 5:13-26

The account here of King Saul in I Samuel is an account that is very sobering, isn't it loved ones? When we think that God chose Saul, that He set him up as the king over His people (I Samuel 10,11) and then when we see how it went for Saul in his life, it is sobering to us.

It wasn't just in this chapter that Saul's difficulty of submitting unto God began. But we can go back into the time that they were gathered together, also at war. Samuel told Saul that the time was going to come, and several days out ahead, that he would come and he would there offer a sacrifice unto God. The time came and Samuel wasn't there. Saul began to observe his men leave. He began to observe the enemy accumulate more and more soldiers. His heart began to become weak and to fail. So he took and he offered the sacrifice there to God which was not for him to offer. He disobeved what God had laid out for only the priests and the Levites to do. It tells us in that account that the smoke of the sacrifice was still rising up to heaven when Samuel came. He admonished Saul there. (I Samuel 13:5-14)

Then we come to this fifteenth chapter. "Samuel also said unto Saul, The Lord sent me to anoint thee to be king over his people, over Israel..." I Samuel 15:1. He reminded him again that it wasn't of his own strength that he became the king, but God had chosen him. Had set him up to be king. Because he was appointed, anointed by God.

He said, "...I remember that which Amalek did to Israel, how he laid wait for him in the way, when he came up from Egypt." I Samuel 15:2. He remembered what Amalek did to the children of Israel. He said to Saul, go and destroy those people. He was very precise in what He said. Let's read that together. "Now go and smite Amalek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and spare them not; but slay both man and woman, infant and suckling, ox and

sheep, camel and ass." I Samuel 15:3. When we think of that, it is just real clear, wasn't it, what God asked of Saul to do. It was just real clear in detail what was expected of him.

But what happened? As the people gathered together and Saul went out and he smote those people, it tells us, he feared the people (I Samuel 15:24). He feared what those soldiers would say, what they would do. Because it was a custom in that time that as they went out and they conquered and destroyed other nations, that they would take of the spoil for themselves. But God had instructed them to utterly destroy all of the Amalekites. Not to return with any of them. Saul kept their king. It says he kept the best of the sheep and of the cattle. Those things that weren't good he destroyed. (I Samuel 15:9) He chose out what he wanted to keep. But it was because of the fear of the people that he did that.

What does that say unto us today, loved ones? What is God trying to tell us from this fifteenth chapter? There are many messages that could be sent here. First of all, God expects obedience, doesn't He? He expects, when He tells us to go, that we go. When He tells us to stay, that we stay.

"Then came the word of the Lord unto Samuel, saying, It repenteth me that I have set up Saul to be king: for he is turned back from following me, and hath not performed my commandments. And it grieved Samuel; and he cried unto the Lord all night." I Samuel 15:10,11. But when morning came, he got up and he went and he met Saul and he confronted him and he said, "when you were little in your own eyes, God set you up to be king." When he was humble, God elevated him into that position.

That is how it is today, isn't it loved ones? If we are humble, God can use us. But it is in those times that we want our own way. It is in those times that we become proud

that we fall or have the potential to

"And Saul said, They have brought them from the Amalekites..." I Samuel 15:15. He right away pointed the finger to someone else. That is a lesson for us today also, isn't it? We can go back into the first sin that was committed and that response was the same way.

Why I Appreciate The Apostolic Christian Church

Writings based on God's Word

At the August 11, 2005, Conference, we were encouraged to write a two and a half page expression of why we appreciated our church. Even though there was no intent to collect the "assignment", a significant number of brothers and sisters did submit their thoughts. The following editorial is of somewhat different style. Rather than an essay in standard paragraph form, it is an attempt to incorporate many of the thoughts expressed in the lists that were submitted. It was not possible to include every comment, nor is it intended to be an exhaustive list. It is simply designed to prompt some thought and help each of us develop a deeper appreciation and greater thankfulness for being part of the Apostolic Christian Church.

I am thankful for the Apostolic Christian Church because:

*-We believe there is one true God, the Creator of the universe.

*-Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of God. He came to earth, lived a perfect life, and died to redeem fallen mankind by shedding His perfect blood on Calvary's cross.

*-We are offered salvation by faith in Christ's shed blood, not by our good works. God is in control of our lives. His love for us is unconditional, though we must rid our lives of sin if we want to spend eternity with Him.

*-We believe we can receive guidance from God in decision making through prayer and reading of the scripture.

*-We believe the Bible is the infallible Word of God to man and we are encouraged to follow the whole counsel of God, not simply to pick and choose what may appeal to us.

*-We can rely upon the Holy Spirit to guide us and help us to be overcomers of the various temptations we face. After we repent and find peace, we can leave the old life behind. *-We believe in a sincere repentance and a true conversion, not a shallow acceptance of Christ.

*-We recognize the value of confession of our sins, making restitution for our errors, seeking forgiveness from those we have wronged, finding peace with God and man, baptism of adults by immersion, and sealing of the Holy Spirit into our hearts through a prayer of consecration.

*-The preaching of the Word is by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, rather than the wisdom of man. Our ministers are not paid, thereby reducing the pressure to preach to itching ears.

*-We are working toward a common goal, the salvation of lost souls.

*-Holy Communion is a special time of self-examination, sharing with our brothers and sisters the special blessings of what Christ did for us, and a time of peace within the church.

*-Marriage is by faith in God's direction, rather than by the dating system which exposes us to the lusts of the flesh. It is a life long commitment, based on God's plan for mankind.

*-Our spiritual life is something we take seriously each day of our lives, not simply a Sunday exercise.

*-We are taught the importance of works as a demonstration of our thankfulness to God and Jesus Christ for our salvation

*-We are taught that the grace of God is available to all who will humble themselves before God, answer His call, and seek to do His will.

*-A modest lifestyle is encouraged, rather than materialism and the casualness of the world.

*-We are accountable to God, to Christ, to the church, and to one another. Discipline of erring brethren is carried out to help those who have fallen, to serve as a warning to others, and to preserve the purity of the church.

*-We greet with a Holy kiss as a token of love for one another, sometimes even before we know the name of the brother or sister and where they are from. We also greet each other as Brothers or Sisters of Jesus Christ, not simply a casual greeting.

*-Congregational singing is practiced, rather than just by those who have the most talent or have the most beautiful voices. The Zion's Harp hymns have a deep spiritual meaning that reflect the faith of those who wrote them. The hymns are a source of inspiration that encourages us to greater faithfulness.

*-Our sisters wear a modest head covering, are in subjection to their husbands or fathers and are silent in the church.

*-We recognize the power of Satan and that he is never finished trying to cause us to fall, but we know that God is all powerful and will help us defeat Satan.

*-We have standards by which we live, but we leave the eternal judgment to God.

*-We appreciate the name of our church, Apostle-like, Christ-like.

*-Sermons are for instruction, encouragement and admonition rather than for entertainment.

*-Elders, ministers, Sunday School teachers and others who serve the church are chosen from the congregation

*-Our simple faith has been preserved over the years by faithful brethren who were willing to sacrifice self for the benefit of others who would come after them – including us.

*-We believe our faith is precious and worth preserving.

*-Elders and ministers do not require more of the brethren than they are willing to do themselves.

*-We are taught the standard of godly headship. Brothers are the spiritual leaders of the home and of the church. Humble submission and accountability to church leadership and to the brotherhood helps preserve the faith.

Let the Children Come Unto Me

This past year has been a year of progress and change at Casa Vida y Esperanza (House of Life and Hope), our church run children's home in Magdalena, Mexico. Magdalena is a town of about 40,000 people just one hour south of the Arizona border.

It is amazing what you can accomplish if you do not care who gets the credit. This is true for the 700 or so visitors we hosted, the majority of whom were World Relief work team members who arrived with tools, talents and much energy.

It has been a blessing to see how the Lord has abundantly provided. We have witnessed many needs filled at just the right time. When we needed a plumber, a plumber came. When we needed a mason, masons came. When we needed an electrician, well specialist, architect, landscaper, dentist, or nurse they have come right on time. We sense the church is praying and is thankful.

We have also seen an outpouring of financial support and many other donations such as six vehicles, two tractors, computers, tools, supplies, clothing, food, and much more. We have been overwhelmed. The children and families we are serving here are truly blessed.

While work in 2004 was primarily for preparing the dormitories, kitchen, cafeteria and offices for the arrival of children, work in 2005 was mainly for future expansion of the work here. Projects included the school room, new well and water lines, volunteer dormitory and the kitchen food storage addition. Major projects for 2006 are planned to be the completion of the service

building (which will house a garage, tool and materials storage, and work shop), the completion of the volunteer dormitory and the beautification of the campus.

The 24 acre campus has come alive with activity as the first 7 children arrived here February 21, 2005. As of February 2006, we are caring for 19 children (8 boys, 7 girls, and 4 babies). The CVE staff has also grown and now includes 4 American couples and their children, 7 single members, and 2 cooks.



Bible Study

We are thankful for the children and adults who come from the community to Sunday morning Bible studies and Sunday School. It is a blessing to have a large group join in singing hymns of praise and worship to the Lord. The children have their favorite hymns but also continue to learn new ones. This past year the children have memorized many Bible verses and familiar passages such as the Ten Commandments and the 23rd Psalm.

In addition to the Sunday and Wednesday night Bible studies, in home Bible studies are also held every Saturday night either for married couples or teenagers from the community. On one Saturday we have couples and the next Saturday youth. We have faith that one day these seeds will bring forth fruit to the glory of our Heavenly Father.

The Schoolroom

Thanks to the help of many hands, the schoolroom is up and running. It is hard to believe that just 3 months ago, the schoolroom housed tools, paint and supplies. With a new floor, repairs and paint for the walls, an insulated ceiling, and a good cleaning, it looks like a place of learning.

Each day after school, the children bring their homework to the school-room to be finished and checked. Usually 2 to 3 hours each afternoon are spent on homework. When the work is finished, the room is open for educational activities and play. The old paint closet has been transformed into a carpeted library where children can spend quiet time reading and enjoying the expanding Spanish book selections.

There are many hands on activities to challenge inquisitive minds and even a corner exclusively created for 5 year olds and younger. We are anticipating the arrival of a few computers so that the students will be able to practice typing, writing, math, and reading. We are also setting up donated sewing machines to learn basic sewing techniques.

We are all thankful to have many materials and such a nice facility to assist the children in their learning. We praise God for all of the energy, talent and supplies that have been gifted to our schoolroom.

Future Opportunities

There is a need for two brothers and two sisters to volunteer this summer. We also need additional single brothers to fill the gap if any of our current brothers leave. There will be opportunities for those with teaching experience when we start a full time school program. We will also need single and married house parents in the future.



As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:10

Haiti Material Aid

In 1986 World Relief sent the first Lsea container of material aid to Haiti. This first shipment contained mostly medical supplies for Hospital Albert Schweitzer in northern Haiti, Grace Children's Hospital in Port Au Prince and Hospital Lumiere in southern Haiti. It took approximately five months from the time the container left the Bluffton Distribution Center to clear customs in Haiti and be unloaded. The list of needed supplies was obtained from a World Relief evaluation team that visited the hospitals on a yearly basis.

As World Relief work has grown in Haiti, the material aid has grown and the last five years there were five sea containers each year sent to Haiti. The average time now is four weeks for a container to travel from Bluffton and be unloaded in Haiti. Email is the main mode of communication and needs lists are very specific. Another change is that World Relief is primarily supplying material aid to the projects of the MEBSH organizations. The following is a summary of these projects.

Hospital Lumiere and Cayes Clinic

These two facilities provide most of the medical care for the people in the area in which World Relief is working. For several years the medical supplies sent to these facilities were collected by our brethren and some were purchased from International Aid.

In the last four years World Relief has been working with Lumiere Medical Ministries. This organization is now collecting and buying seventy per cent of the medical supplies and shipping them to the Bluffton Distribution Center. Our brethren are providing the prenatal kits, homemade soap and other medical supplies. Working with LMM, World Relief has been able to better meet the specific need of the hospital and clinic.



Domestic Center

Many young teen and adult women have learned sewing and cooking skills at the Domestic Center. This is a four year school located in Les Cayes.

World Relief ships many of the supplies that are used at the Domestic Center, including materials imported from Europe. World Relief sewing groups also provide sewing machines, sewing kits and other supplies used at the Domestic Center.

Construction Department

Over the years World Relief has shipped a large quantity of tools and supplies to the Construction Department at Cayes. Many of these items are used by the World Relief work teams that go to Haiti. Five years ago we started shipping all the metal roofing material used on the schools, because the quality of Haiti roofing has become very poor.

The sea containers are also a source of shipping supplies to many of the missionaries that live in Cayes. These are items for their own use (such as fans, tools, computers, office supplies, household supplies, etc.) which cannot be purchased or are very expensive in Haiti. We always get a thank you for doing this and it is a blessing to the work in Haiti.

Child Care and MEBSH Office

Office supplies and many school supplies are shipped to these two organizations. These items include the school kits and health kits that are provided by the different Apostolic Christian churches. In addition, Child Care distributes the homemade soap and other personal care items that are collected and sent on the sea containers.

S.E.E.D. and Trade Schools

World Relief also ships supplies in containers to the trade schools and S.E.E.D. The brethren that work closely with these groups purchase the supplies and deliver them to the Bluffton Distribution Center. Since the schools get a steady supply of materials, they are able to depend on these to teach skills to many Haitians. This provides the graduates an opportunity to get jobs, be self sufficient and support their families.

World Relief gets many letters of thank you every year. They come from individuals as well as organizations World Relief is supporting in Haiti. They express how much our support is appreciated and that they are praying for God's blessings on our church.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

Following the recent deaths of dear ones who had lived in our homes, we received some very heart warming words from their families. The support and encouragement received from you, the Apostolic Christian Church family, makes this work possible so we would like to pass on these kind words to each of you.

From a sister of a resident - "As a working mother, wife and now grandmother, I do not know what I would have done if it had not been for your wonderful organization. It brought us such comfort to know that she was in the best possible place she could be with the best care that she could possibly have. Your staff is so incredibly dedicated to each and every one of the patients there." She went on to say that her sister "is home with the Lord. Her mom and dad are there to welcome her and the most beautiful part of all is that she has a perfect body, mind and soul now. But we will always remember with such appreciation her years at Apostolic Christian Timber Ridge and the beauty that you brought to her life here on earth ... Thank you from the bottom of our hearts."

In a letter from parents who had to say Farewell to their son—"Words cannot express our Thanks to all who cared for our son and made it possible for him to live such a wonderful and fulfilled life. He was a joy to have in our life and we know with all the love and care he received at Timber Ridge, his days on earth were so complete and happy. We will always remember his home with love and prayers."

And from a heartbroken Mom -

"This doesn't begin to say what is in our hearts. How do we begin to thank you for everything that you have done for her—the love, the gentle care, the respect, the friendships—the list goes on and on. We hope and pray that you know how much we love and appreciate each and every one of you. God bless you all."

The members of our staff who give of themselves to provide the care also grieve with the families. The people living here are an important part of their everyday life, and the loss is deeply felt. A staff person said, "Seeing her when I came in to work was a part of every day. I miss her so much now!"

God spoke to Eve and she said, "well, it was the serpent." When He spoke to Adam, he said, "it was my wife." (Genesis 3:12,13)

Saul said they, the people did it. But the instruction came to Saul. Right away he accused someone else. It wasn't until the point that he said, I have sinned, it was at that point that there was a turning there. (I Samuel 15:24)

"And Samuel said, What meaneth then this bleating of the sheep..." I Samuel 15:14. What meaneth with these oxen if you have kept the commandment of God? He said the people have brought them back. (I Samuel 15:15) "Then Samuel said unto Saul, Stay, and I will tell thee what the Lord hath said to me this night. And he said unto him, Say on." I Samuel 15:16.

There he explained to Saul what the Lord had said. He was going to take that kingdom away from him and He was going to give it to someone else because of disobedience unto God. (I Samuel 15:28) Saul said, "we've taken the cattle, we've taken the oxen. We've brought them for a good purpose. We've brought them for the purpose of sacrificing to God" (I Samuel 15:21). He tried to compromise there a little bit. He tried to say, well look, we've done this for the purpose of giving them to God.

Samuel told Saul - it's words that we've heard many times isn't it - is God pleased with sacrifice more than obedience (I Samuel 15:22)? He wants us to obey when He asks. He wants us to serve Him with our whole heart.

"And Samuel said, Hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry..." I Samuel 15:22,23. It just seems almost ironic and yet we know it is not that way, because it is

the way of God. Why was it that God took Saul's life? It was because he went and inquired of a witch. The scripture tells us it was because of that that God took his life from Saul. For rebellion is as the sin of witch-craft. Probably on this very day, if Samuel would have said to Saul, the day will come when you will go and inquire of a witch, he would say, that never would happen. I wouldn't think of doing that. But it started out in rebellion. It started out in disobedience. Look where it took him.

That is just how sin is, loved ones, isn't it? It just starts out maybe a little bit like rust. We just see it a little bit under the surface. Pretty soon it is just fully exposed. "...and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, he hath also rejected thee from being king. And Saul said unto Samuel, I have sinned: for I have transgressed the commandment of the Lord, and thy words: because I feared the people, and obeyed their voice." I Samuel 15:23,24.

There was a penalty there also for the people wasn't there? They went through some terrible times there in the time of Saul's last days. They became a divided nation for a short time. Then David became king over both Judah and the rest of Israel. But those were tough times for the children of Israel. (II Samuel 2-5) They caused Saul to disobey God's Word. It was because of their greed. It was because of what they wanted when they went out here to conquer this nation.

He told Saul that he had had the kingdom rent from him. And Saul said, I have sinned. Yet honor me now, I pray thee, before the elders of my people (I Samuel 15:28-30). We can see he wanted yet to be honored. We can say he had pride. There is just no question he had pride in his life still even at that point. Because he wanted to be honored in front of the people.

Samuel went and it says he brought king Agag (I Samuel

15:32,33). We read that account and it almost seems just extremely gruesome. And yet loved ones, that was representative of sin. The Amalekites in the Old Testament was symbolic of sin. We just can't have sin in our lives. We see the separation that it has for us and God when sin is in our life. Here he slew this king and he utterly destroyed him. That's what God wants in our lives. That is what God expects, that as we come unto Him, we just fully remove, we fully let go. That we don't allow any sin to be in our lives.

"Then Samuel went to Ramah; and Saul went up to his house to Gibeah of Saul. And Samuel came no more to see Saul until the day of his death: nevertheless Samuel mourned for Saul..." I Samuel 15:34,35. We can see the love that the prophet had for God's elect, for God's chosen king. "...and the Lord repented that he had made Saul king over Israel." I Samuel 15:35. We can see that even though he was rejected, there was still a love there by Saul. We can see that even though there was sin, that God still loved the sinner. He hates sin but He still loves the sinner.

When we think of the preciseness that God through Samuel gave to Saul, it just seems as though he should have been able to carry that out just without any question because it was so precise. Yet here as we turn to the New Testament, we see the preciseness again of what God asks of us.

We read here of the works of the flesh. At the end of that list it says, "...they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God." Galatians 5:21. It is just extremely clear, isn't it? If we were to go down the pews and we were to ask, is there anyone here who thinks that that is not true, there just probably wouldn't be any of us. Because the Word of God says it. It just says it that clear. But as we look at the works of the flesh, we understand those are works that are to tear us down. Those are works that Satan would

have for us to do that would cause us to sin. It would cause us to eventually destroy ourselves. There would be no question there that we would all agree with those items, that we would not want them in our lives. But perhaps if there would be any disagreement at all, perhaps it would be the disagreement of, what are those things that would have a tendency of leading us back to the works of the flesh?

He says here in verse thirteen, "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty..." Galatians 5:13. When we think of being called unto liberty, when we think of liberty, we think of being free, don't we? We think of our nation, those men came, they came for the freedom of worship, the freedom of speech, the freedom to bear arms. The many freedoms that they wanted to have as they live here. They wanted to have that liberty and justice.

Yet here he is speaking of a liberty that we could just speak of a lot of things. Liberty from sin. Liberty from the consequences of sin. We have been called unto liberty to be free from the guilt of sin. To be free from those things that come - the works of the flesh. We have been called unto liberty. But he is saying, "...use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another." Galatians 5:13. That we not. just because we have been called from sin, just because we have been given a peace in our heart, doesn't mean that we can use that for our own selves. But we use that to serve one another.

He went on here and he said, "...Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself." Galatians 5:14. First of all we have to love ourselves, don't we? Sometimes Satan would come and tell us we just aren't worth anything. Sometimes we find that. Where Satan will come and will try to discourage us and tear us down. We just don't think of ourselves very much at all. But that's not what the Word tells us. The Word tells us that we have been created in God's own

image, after His likeness (Genesis 1:26,27). That He has placed us here upon this earth for His praise and for His honor and for His glory that we might serve Him, that we might be called unto liberty, that we might have a life of abundance. He lays out here just this exact so that we don't become entangled again in those things that would bring sorrow and sin in our lives.

It says, "But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another." Galatians 5:15. Again, we can look at this list and we can sav without a doubt we all agree. We don't want this in our lives. But what are the things that would have a tendency of bringing these back into our life? If we are busy spending time loving one another, serving one another, loving our neighbor as ourselves, we will not be as quick to become engaged in those things that would have a tendency of bringing envy, lasciviousness, fornication, adultery, seditions and heresies and those things back into our lives. Because those are the things we repented of, aren't they, brothers and sisters? Those are the things that we were once entangled in.

Dear friends, if today you find yourself entangled in those things, today is the day of grace. He asks, come and I will give you peace and I will give you rest from these things. I will give you this liberty that He speaks of here.

"This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh." Galatians 5:16. Our mind is set in such a way that we can't think of a lot of things all at the same time. So if we spend our time thinking upon those things that are spiritual, we will not be caught up in thinking of those things that are evil. If we spend our time doing what God asks of us, we'll not be caught up in doing those things that will lead us back into the works of the flesh. But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ve be not consumed one of another.

One of the works of the flesh is hatred. Hatred works a little bit like we spoke there of Saul. It doesn't start just immediately. Maybe it starts with a little bit of biting and devouring. Maybe it starts a little bit with ill feelings. We let them fester. Pretty soon we find we've went to a different level. Now it is just not feeling but now it is pretty forceful. If it is let go, if it is let unchecked, it becomes hatred eventually. But if ye bite and devour, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another. Let's not even let that get started, loved ones. Let's just continue to pray for peace in our own lives and pray for peace as a brotherhood. Because it will consume us eventually if it is let

"For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would." Galatians 5:17. There is a war, isn't there? There is a battle there. Yet it is what we feed is what is going to grow. If something is dead in our lives, we don't want it rejuvenated, do we? If something is dead in our lives, we don't want to continue to feed it. We don't want to continue to give it a life, to bring it back up again. But we want it to remain dead. We want to feed this spiritual man, that the fruit of the Spirit that we read will come forth.

"Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these..." Galatians 5:19. The works of the flesh are manifest meaning they will come forth. "...Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness," Galatians 5:19. Those lusts of the flesh. Those sins of the flesh. We could take all of these and we could break them down into three categories, couldn't we? The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and the pride of life.

"Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations..." Galatians 5:20. As we read those words, they just are words that aren't pleasant,

are they? They are words that bring sorrow and pain. That's just what Satan wants for us to become entangled with.

And it says and such like. It says, "Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like..." Galatians 5:21. If there is anything in our life that is similar to these, he is saying that is included. "...they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God." Galatians 5:21. That is what makes it so important, loved ones, that we don't allow these things to become alive in our lives. That is why it is so important, dear friends, that we come unto Him and we allow Him to convert our lives.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace..." Galatians 5:22. We could just take the very first one, of love, and if we would just truly love, the rest of them would already be a part of our life. If we would truly love as we can read in I Corinthians 13, we read through that and what does it say? Love is longsuffering, beareth all things, believeth all things, endureth all things.

Joy. We think of joy as being something that even in time of sorrow, we can just feel a joy there within our heart, knowing that God is in control. Peace and longsuffering (v.22). I think of longsuffering. There might be some here who have suffered something for many, many years. Loved ones, we can read in God's Word, it will be worth it all. It will be worth it when we make it to heaven by His grace. So if you find yourself as longsuffering today, just continue to press on. It will be worth it.

Gentleness (v.22)...as we go through the fruit of the Spirit, it is important that we remember, it is the fruit of the Spirit. It is not the fruit of us. But it is the fruit of God's Spirit dwelling within us. We think of gentleness. We think of a little child. We think of peace and joy and love. The scripture tells us that we are to be childlike, doesn't it? (St. Luke 18:17)

Goodness (v.22)...morally pure. Pure in our thoughts, in our actions. Faith (v.22). Perhaps here in this faith it means to be reliable. To be trusted. That what we say is really the way it is going to be. That we don't have to wonder, well does it mean something different than what it sounded like? But we can be trusted.

Meekness and temperate (v.23). Temperate that we don't get all shook up when things don't seem to go our way. That we don't lose our cool. But that we continue to be consistent, grounded upon the Word of God. Grounded upon the Lord Jesus Christ and His shed blood.

"...against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit." Galatians 5:23-25. But in our daily walk of life, these fruit of the Spirit will be exhibited in our lives to those that we come in contact with. To those who do not have God's Spirit in their lives. But it will come forth and it will show forth.

"Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another." Galatians 5:26. When we think of vain glory we think of Saul there where he wanted to be honored. He wanted Samuel to go with him to worship the Lord. (I Samuel 15:30) Really at that point, it almost seemed like what difference would it have made? What difference would have it made if he would have been honored in front of the people when he sinned against God? That is vain glory, isn't it loved ones?

Provoking one another. Again we see the contrast in that verse, by love serve one another. That we not provoke each other. That we not do something in our lives that makes someone else angry. Because we go back, if we bite and devour, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.

Then envying one another. It almost seems as though this verse maybe is out of place. He speaks of the works of the flesh. Then he speaks of the fruit of the Spirit. Then after that he again reminds us, let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another. It almost would seem like he has already covered that. Yet it's a reminder, loved ones, that even though we are a child of God, we still need God's mercy, don't we? We still need to be merciful one to another. That we don't allow these things back into our lives. Because it is real, it can happen, just as it happened to Saul. He had the Spirit of God. It was given unto him after he had been anointed to be king (I Samuel 11:6). Yet we see what happened because he was too caught up with what the people thought. He was too caught up on his own pride. We see he disobeyed God and the consequence that came with that.

So we're reminded here, it takes God's grace, doesn't it? We can't do it of ourselves. It needs the grace of God day by day. That grace can only come to us if we are humble and submissive unto Him. If we are submissive one to another. But he encourages us here, with the Spirit of God in our lives, those fruit will come forth and we will be able to be at peace with one another. We will be able to feel the joy, the love He would have for us to feel. We'll be able by His grace to overcome, to serve Him faithfully day by day.

Immigration

With immigration in the news these days, it is interesting to look back one hundred years or more and observe some of the conditions our foreparents endured as they emigrated from many places in Europe to America.

The Jacob and Mary Wittmer family (he 26 and she 21) left Bern, Switzerland with their two small children (Mary - 21 months old, and Jacob - 6 months old) to come to America. They spent 36 days on their boat. These two children, along with another child, were only three of thirteen children who survived to reach the American shore.

In Marching To Zion, Elder Samuel Aeschleman, who served for many years as Elder at Bluffton, Indiana, recalled how his grandparents came to America in 1853 and settled initially in Monroe County, Ohio (the Sardis area). The ocean trip took 49 days on a sailing vessel. During the Atlantic crossing, one of their children died and was buried at sea.

Death and burial at sea were not all that uncommon. Sometimes diseases would spread in the cramped traveling conditions and death would overtake some of the emigrants. Children, especially were vulnerable in such conditions. One can hardly imagine the grief and sorrow that parents felt.

On a brighter note, the John Adam Eisenmann family, while worried their child might die, experienced a happy ending. Their child, during a bad storm on the ocean, became very sick. Her mother thought the baby would die. The unwavering faith of her father caused him to kneel in prayer and ask God to spare the child. Suddenly, someone appeared with some medicine, and the baby survived. The mother was convinced that God sent an angel to save the child because during the remainder of the trip she could never find anyone who resembled the man who gave medicine to her sick child.

Around the year 1900, immigrants had to check in at Ellis Island. 5,000 per day came through that entry point. Officials asked 29 questions and they were given physical examinations, answering 15 questions. Governmental officials were careful in letting persons into this country. Back then "illegal" aliens were rare.

The New Birth

In a 1975 issue of the Silver Lining, Bro. Sam Kilgus, who served in the ministry at Remington, Indiana, from 1932 to 1975, listed a definition of the "new birth". He wrote:

"The first step is to see ourselves as a lost sinner that can be saved by grace. Jesus paid a tremendous price to cleanse our sinful heart. He gave His life and blood. We go through a process of repentance and conversion, a thorough change of mind. That changes a carnal into a

spiritual mind. When this change has taken place, we are baptized and promise to stay true and faithful until death. Then, we belong to a body of believers called 'the church.'"

Historical Booklet

An old 48-page booklet exists entitled To The King's Administration of Justice. In part, it consists of many written appeals to the various governments of Europe by our brethren pertaining to our spiritual convictions. It was put together by Elder Bro. William A. Stettner of Elgin, Illinois, very likely in the 1940s or so. Excerpts from this interesting booklet will be referenced in subsequent Remembering columns. Bro. Stettner was the brother of Elder Bro. Jacob Stettner, also of Elgin, Illinois. A short poem in this booklet follows:

The mills of God grind very slowly, But they grind exceedingly small. Where with patience God is waiting

With exactness grinds He all. (Author not listed)

The Light Of Hope

From Across The Ocean

"Abound In Hope"

Abound means to have plenty of something, enough to share with others. In Romans 15:13 it is written hat ye may abound in hope. In our risen Saviour, we have such an abundance of hope that we can share with others and still have an ample supply ourselves. In fact, the more we share with others, hope, joy. and peace, the more our own is multiplied. It is like the widow oil in I Kings 17:14, or thus saith the Lord, The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail. In Proverbs 28:20 we read. faithful man shall abound with blessings. This puts responsibility on us about being faithful, and I believe it means over a long period of time, a lifetime. To be faithful to God means to do what pleases Him and what is His will, and what brings Him glory. We teach at the time of baptism that this is only possible by His grace, and we must make ourselves recipients of His grace. If we fail, we can hardly excuse ourselves by say-

ing that God did not give us enough grace. But if we are faithful, we shall abound with blessings.


The word bound is used in II Corinthians 8:7, herefore as ye abound in everything, in faith, and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also. Paul had been telling the Corinthians about the generosity of the churches in Macedonia and he wanted them to abound in the race of generosity, also. It takes race from God to be truly generous. which means to share with others not only our money, but also our love, patience, forbearance, and time. Paul terms this as abounding in everything, an endless supply of everything, except money, perhaps.

Paul uses the word again in II Corinthians 9:8, nd God is able to make all grace abound toward you. Here the word bound is used to describe an endless supply of grace, or power, consolation, and hope, from God.

In II Peter 1, verses 5, 6, and 7. many attributes or fruits of the Spirit, are listed, very much like in Galatians 5:22,23. Then he says in verse 8, or if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren or unfruitful in the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Peter insinuates that these fruits of the Spirit should abound in us, be in plentiful supply, so that we can share them with others and our own supply will continuously increase. It is like an artesian well.

We can abound in all these things, including hope and the assurance of salvation, because the Lord Jesus Christ not only died for us but He arose again. Our hope and our abounding in all these spiritual blessings hinges upon what the angel said to Mary, e is not here for He is risen. Matthew 28;6. As we celebrate Easter, may we by God grace, abound in hope, and in everything good.
