Sermon by the late Elder Bro. David Mangold, Roanoke, IL

St. John 3

We have here read some of the immortal words of the Savior - words that are well known in the world. But then yet, it is still true in the world today as it was in the days of the Lord Jesus, as He mentioned here in the beginning, "If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?" St. John 3:12.

It is indeed a great reason why God was willing to do so much for the world. As we were reminded in this text, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." St. John 3:16.

When we consider the great, the devastating destruction which sin and Satan have brought upon humanity, it is without a doubt that in Heaven in the presence of the Creator of all things, there is great sorrow. Even that same sorrow which exists in the heart of God's people here on Earth, it must also to some extent exist in the heavens.

We have testimonies that those thoughts and those feelings which God's people have here on Earth, that similar thoughts exist in the presence of God. We believe in a living God, do we not? And we also know that only then, if we have received the true life of God, when the Spirit of life and of truth dwells in the heart of man, can he be in communion with God. And as we find at another place, from which I take it that those joys which exist in the hearts of true believers are also found in Heaven, the Savior Himself, I believe, said that among the angels in heaven there is more joy over a sinner that repents than over ninety and nine who have no need of repentance (St. Luke 15:7). Is not that also the feeling that exists in the heart of God's people? That same joy.

And we find that the Lord Jesus, when He was on Earth, He was entirely under the guidance of the Spirit of the Father. The conditions here upon Earth by which He was surrounded did not prevent the Lord Jesus from doing the Father's will. And

even so, beloved ones, in this our day and time, we often feel sorry and have sympathy for our loved ones, our brothers, who are separated from their families and homes and from the assemblies of God's people, surrounded by many evils and many trials and temptations to endure. But, dear ones, we have all reason to trust in the Lord, and to believe that if they keep in constant communion with God, if they watch and pray at their post, that they may in their place, wherever they are led, be a light in this world. These times of trials and of sorrow are no doubt also for some good.

And those who have received the true spirit of childhood and of adoption, and who have been redeemed from the power of Satan, they are called upon to also let their light shine. Even as all of us who are God's children, it is our duty that we let our light shine here in this world. For it is the work, it is the power of Satan to influence even the believer to try to go through this life rather unnoticed, to escape the eyes of reproach which we can see in this world: the enmity of evil, of Satan, and of those who serve him. But dear ones, our calling is to be a light and to testify of our Savior and His ways.

And therefore let us one and all put our hope and trust in the Lord. Let us not be too much concerned with what befalls us here in this life, but rather let us be concerned that our hearts and our minds may be full of Godly light, and that the light of Jesus Christ our Lord may show itself and manifest itself in us His followers. That is our duty.

It came to me this morning, listening to the word of God, it seems to me the most important duty and first duty that we have here on Earth as children of God is that we might be wide awake in the Spirit, that we rouse ourselves. We know in this life, in the natural life already, where a certain person in their business, whatever it might be, if they are diligent, if they are wide awake, and they do not spare their labors, we know

that blessing follows diligence.

A diligent worker usually reaps a harvest for his work, and when we consider (if I may speak of it) in our communities where the people of God live, we usually find them plenty diligent as far as their earthly labors are concerned. They are plenty diligent in seeking a profit, in seeking gain. And when we consider it, that really is what makes the country look well,

Blessings From God

In the previous editorial, the folly, disappointment and emptiness of "What will ye give me?" was discussed. The alternative to selfishness and greed is to strive for blessings from God. Several examples of selfishness and the grief it brought were cited. How can we attain the standards of those of Smyrna to whom Christ said, "I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty, (but thou art rich)" (Rev. 2:9)?

Just as we can find examples in the Bible of the results of a life of sin and greed, so also can we find examples in the Bible of the results of a life of self sacrifice and obedience to God that will result in attaining God's blessings.

There is, of course, no better example than that of Jesus Christ. The selfless example He offered will serve us well. We may think that because Jesus was the Son of God, there were no battles against temptation that He needed to fight. The beginning of His ministry and the end of His life tell us that such was not the case. After His baptism and after fasting for forty days and nights, Satan came to tempt Him with an easy way to receive bread, a basic need of life, with an "opportunity" to prove if God would be with Him at all times, and with power and glory. In all three cases He answered Satan with the Word of God (Mt. 4:1-11). Throughout His ministry, He relied upon the Word and power of God.

As Jesus faced severe trial prior to His crucifixion, as He pleaded with God to help Him complete the very mission for which He came to earth, Satan was there, tempting Him to find another way. Three times His "...soul (was) exceeding sorrowful, even unto death..." (Mt. 26:38). He prayed "...if it be possible, let this cup pass from me:..." (Mt. 26:39-42). Each time, however, He added "...nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt" (Mt. 26:39).

If it was necessary for Jesus to be in total submission to God, can anything less than total submission take us to a safe haven? Holding any selfish desire for ourselves will put us in danger of eternal separation from God.

We are promised that if we serve God without reservation we will be blessed beyond our comprehension. In answer to

Peter's question of the value of following Christ, Jesus said "And everyone that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life" (Mt. 19:29). Nothing we could gain for this life is worth more than our salvation. That point was also emphasized when Jesus asked "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul" (Mk. 8:36-37)? There are examples in the scripture of individuals who were willing to give all that they had to serve God. The poor widow put only two mites into the treasury. It was all she had. Jesus said "Verily I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living" (Mk. 12:43-44).

The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of meal in a barrel and a little oil in a cruse. She was gathering sticks so she could make a final meal for herself and her son to eat, knowing there was no more and they would then starve to death. Elijah asked her to make a little cake for him first and then make one for her and her son. She was promised "The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the Lord sendeth rain upon the earth" (I Ki. 17:14). How difficult it must have been to take that little bit of meal and oil and give it to a stranger when she and her son had so little. Because of her willingness to give all, "...she and he and her house did eat many days" (I Ki. 17:15).

In Hebrews 11 we can read of the faith of many who were willing to sacrifice all they had and be obedient to the Lord. Verses 33 through 38 graphically describe what they endured to serve their God. Just a few of the trials were scourging, stoning and being sawn asunder. Through faith they endured these afflictions.

Of the eleven disciples who remained faithful, history would indicate that ten of them died a martyr's death. John was banished to the isle of Patmos where he received the Revelation of Jesus Christ. Paul spent his adult life travelling and spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ, eventually giving his life for the Lord.

What lessons are there for us? We need to be extremely careful we are not so fascinated by material possessions that we allow them to become idols. We have many opportunities to share what we have with those who are less fortunate.

We often hear the term "sacrificial giving" and we appreciate the opportunities we have to share with others. However, for most of us we are really only giving of our abundance. In addition to sacrificial giving we need to pray earnestly that we can follow sacrificial living. We know that "...by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:" (Eph. 2:8) and that "...we have redemption through his (Jesus) blood" (Eph. 1:7).

As we observe the examples of those who went before us, who gave their all, including many who gave their life, we certainly need to spend much time in prayer and self examination so we are not overcome by the world. To each of the seven churches that were addressed in the took of Revelation there was a promise to him that overcometh. The promises included access to the tree of life, to not be hurt by the second death, to receive the hidden manna, power over nations, that Christ will confess our name before God and His angels, to be a pillar in the temple of God, and to sit with him in his throne. (Rev. 2 & 3).

Jesus Christ asked one thing for himself - that we remember His suffering and death. This small request can be distracted by a world that offers so much as we travel through this life. If we are not careful, we will not attain our goal. It is so easy to sing "To win this precious treasure and matchless pearl I would give honor, wealth and pleasure, yea, every earthly good; I gladly would surrender the dearest thing which might obscure my Sun's bright splendor, and rob me of His light." (Life and Full Abundance in Jesus, verse 3 Zion's Harp #178).

Do we lightly sing these words and stubbornly cling to what the world offers us? Surely each of us want to remember His suffering and death and be among the overcomers.

Developing Churches In Japan

The Churches in Japan are deeply grateful for the gift of salvation found through the atonement of the Lord Jesus. The good news of the Gospel was brought to Japan by the Holy Spirit working through caring brethren, some of whom have gone to their reward.

The purpose of this article is to share some aspects of what it is like to start an "Apostolic Christian Church" in places like Japan, where there are many local customs, idols, and enticing worldly elements which created problems from the beginning. In addition, we face Satan's common attempt to confuse the simplicity of being saved by grace through faith (Eph. 2:8-10).

There were times when some of these obstacles became overwhelming and it was very disturbing when some of the brethren left the faith. However, in each time of trial our merciful Father and loving Lord gave enough grace and courage to continue. It can be expected that whenever one tries to bring the Gospel to a new area, there will be a very strong temptation to make some compromises, believing that the salvation message would be better received by omitting teachings such as holy greetings, order of worship, discipline, abstaining from worldly entertainments, etc., along with retaining some questionable local customs. May we always, by God's grace, strive to apply the whole counsel of the Word, which will lead to a true conversion and sanctified life.

"The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple." (Psalms 19:7)

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

After 50 years of experience it has been learned that if one is going to develop a new Apostolic Christian congregation, it is best to encourage early on the adoption of the beliefs and practices of the denomination. There is a debt of gratitude to those early leaders who sincerely believed in and taught these teachings in Japan, where they have become firmly embraced.

In order for this to occur, it was essential to be able to observe believers who were living in accord with the biblical precepts which they were teaching. Once again, there is deep appreciation for all who provided these living examples by visiting us or living for a time in Japan. There is a continued need for such examples and it is hoped that the Lord will send faithful brothers and sisters to fill the need.

As the first generation in our churches is approaching retirement age, we recall that some of our ministering brothers often mentioned that the church would grow when children of the first generation would mature. This has been our hope when we had little hope. When it finally came we could rejoice to see some of them repent. It is the Lord who can lead souls to repentance, and it has been a great blessing to have children of believers in Japan repent and become children of God.

Also, believing parents' living examples, as committed joyful followers of Christ, have been an important influence. May this be

an encouragement for all of us as parents to be steadfast, committed examples. We continue to pray that many more children of the first generation will repent, while we look to those of the second generation with even stronger hope, as they will have an even greater heritage

of godly influence.

It is the sincere desire of the Japanese brethren to grow as Apostolic Christian Churches in harmony with the biblically-based teachings and practices which have proven to be so beneficial. Past experience shows us that now and then old issues come back and the temptation arises to eliminate some of our teachings and practices to "enhance" church growth. The history of Christianity in general, as well as that of the Apostolic Christian Church, has demonstrated that such an approach leads to great spiritual loss and can even lead to apostasy. Many churches that once had sound biblical teachings have lost them over time by employing more broadly appealing approaches and making associations with other groups, which have led to dilution of the Gospel message. Much prayer is needed so that the Lord will give grace and wisdom for all of us to be vigilant in promoting sound doctrine and resisting the onslaughts of the enemy.

Though slow, the churches in Japan are growing and becoming more firmly grounded in the Word of God. There is yet much room to improve and there is strong commitment to do this, by the grace of God. We should all be thankful that our heavenly Father is patient and our Lord is longsuffering, and that He will help us all to grow and mature if we have a sincere desire to follow Him.

Child Sponsorship in Haiti, Guatemala, Jamaica and Mexico

With deep appreciation we sincerely thank everyone who is presently sponsoring a student with Apostolic Christian Child Sponsorship. May God bountifully bless each of you for your giving heart (1Thess 5:18).

In 2003 the number of sponsored students though our program was 600 and today it is over 900 students. We are very thankful that God has blessed many students and has increased the sponsors and students proportionally.

The Child Sponsorship Committee recently traveled to Haiti in 2003, Jamaica in 2005 and Guatemala in 2006. What do we see? What questions do we ask? What are the hearts of the field office personnel? We appreciate the sincerity and like mindedness of those that we work with and through.

First the World Relief National Board approves the sponsorship program to missions in other countries and then the Child Sponsorship Committee's mission is to ensure the funds and correspondence are handled appropriately. The Child Sponsorship Committee is responsible to the World Relief National Board, to the church and ultimately to God for the funds that are collected and distributed to the students.

Guatemala is a new country that has been added to the Child Sponsorship Program. With the National Board's encouragement we started to sponsor twenty-five students and now have a new target of fifty students. The Child Sponsorship Committee just returned from a visit to Guatemala and personally met the administrating organiza-

tion, the staff and students at two schools, one where students are being presently sponsored and a second school where we can start sponsoring students.

As we found in Haiti and Jamaica, the schools are for the very poor and the poorest of the poor. The school in Guatemala City has little or no parental involvement in the students' lives. The students are not allowed to take their textbooks home, because the parents would sell them. The school meets in the afternoon in maintenance sheds after other children have left the regular school property. There are 240 "street children" who regularly attend school in the "sheds." We met the Child Sponsorship students.

After visiting the school, they asked if we would like to see where the students lived. Sad, sad conditions. The only reason we could visit this tough area was that the principal was taking us. Our driver would not take us by himself and said fifteen minutes was long enough. As we walked up the trail between the shacks, the principal met a young man about 17-18 years old who graduated from her school and said "this is one of the success stories." We are thankful that all the students are being taught about Jesus and His love. One of our devotions in Guatemala was on Matthew 10:42 about giving a cup of cold water to one of these little ones, he shall in no wise lose his reward.

The Child Sponsorship Program does not have the answers to the poverty of the world. Many times the questions are way beyond our grasp. We do believe that God sees the acts of kindness of the sponsors who give, volunteers who collect and distribute the funds, field offices who administer the funds in

the field, teachers in the Christian schools and most of all the students who are taught about Jesus Christ.

Where are we going? Where He leads, we will follow. Pray for discernment that where God is leading, we will willingly follow. Maybe God will lead you to sponsor a child who is attending a school and being taught about Jesus Christ and His love. May God bless each of you.





that is, when anyone has a farm, for instance, if they labor, and if they are alert, their farm shows improvement, does it not? But beloved ones, why should that not be true in the household of God?

If the Lord teaches us to be diligent in our earthly calling, and we can see the fruit thereof, should we fall behind in our spiritual calling in our life of faith? The same thing is true in our life of faith. If we in the Church of God are diligent, and if we observe the teachings of the Word of God and exercise ourselves therein, it will bear good fruit. We will have reason to rejoice, and the Lord can thereby be glorified. Perhaps every one of us are in need of it - I feel for my heart. We must once in a while rouse ourselves. We must watch that we do not become sluggish and careless, that we rouse ourselves, awaken the talents and the gifts, which God has entrusted unto

If the Lord sees in us a willingness. if He sees that we appreciate His blessings and His gifts, and that we will first of all seek the Kingdom of Heaven and its righteousness, we have a promise in the Word of God: All these other things shall be added unto us. In other words, our life, our heart and mind shall first be filled with concern and with diligence with our heavenly calling, and our earthly business and occupation shall take second place. If we stand in that condition, dear ones, we can rest assured that the Lord will be merciful, He will bless. He loves those who appreciate His kindness.

We have read here, as already mentioned, "If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?" St. Luke 3:12. Really, the Lord Jesus often used earthly things as an illustration of those thoughts, which He tried to impress upon His hearers, and as already mentioned, just as certain as labor and diligence will bring a return in an earthly occupation, just as certainly, diligence and labor in the service of the Lord will also bring a return. It will bring an eternal reward.

It is truly remarkable. Sometimes we have the privilege to perhaps drive a certain road where perhaps we have never been before, and it oft times strikes me how those people who live on a strange road whom we never have met, the same reward that we have for diligence and for labor they also have. The Lord has given it that way, that he that tills the soil and that labors in the field, if he does his work right he will have a return for it. And so likewise, dear ones, in this life of faith, when the time is here to labor, when the time is here that the Lord has given us the opportunity to labor for Him, will anything be accomplished if we are not diligent? But if we become careless, if we leave it to the other ones, and we ourselves try to go through life and leave it all to the others, then we try to escape the cross of Christ.

"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life." St. John 3:14,15. That illustration, beloved ones, also has a deep meaning for us all. Perhaps most all who have assembled here know of that occasion, when in Israel the anger of the Lord was kindled and the fiery serpent came upon them. And all those who were bitten of those serpents had to die, and a great number of people in Israel died from those poisonous serpents. And we find there how the Lord gave unto Moses a certain way in which they could escape death, a miraculous way indeed. He made a brazen serpent, something, which could of itself certainly not be of any help. But unto those who looked to that brazen serpent which was raised there at the command of the Lord - we can thereby see how much value there is in the commands of the Lord. When the Lord speaks a word, and even though it would seem foolish, it would still have in it Godly power and feeling. And that was true of that brazen serpent: Because Moses lifted up that serpent at the command of the Lord, everyone who looked up to that serpent after they had been bitten, with a prayerful heart, we read that they

did not have to die – that they lived. There was a similitude unto that which God would do in later days, as we have been reminded here. (Numbers 21:5-9)

And beloved ones, it occurs to me: We who have looked up to Jesus Christ hanging on the cross, suffering and dying for our sins, is that the only time when we should look up to Him? We have been redeemed, we have been saved, when we looked up to the crucified Christ and when we there, in the Spirit, saw His blood flowing for our sin. But beloved ones, is it not our duty as long as we live here on this Earth, while we are going through this life, must we not continually look up to the Savior all the way as we go through this world and lifetime? Must we not look to the Lord Jesus as our example and our teacher? Truly in our life here on Earth, if we have through faith in the crucified Christ found remission of sin and escaped that yoke of Satan, we would surely again come under that yoke and would again become victims of death if we would not continue to look up to our Savior.

He who died on the cross, He lived also before He died on the cross. And after His death on the cross we look to the resurrected Christ and to this day we have the blessed privilege of the fellowship of His Spirit. He is not one who died and remained in death, but He arose victor over death and the grave. "He arose," as we sing in a hymn, and now we have that blessed privilege, all who have been redeemed through His precious blood, that we can live in Him and with Him. We have the blessed privilege to be guided and led of Him if it is our heart's willingness. As long as our heart is willing to bear the cross and to follow Him in obedience, He has promised to be the Good Shepherd, to give unto us the wisdom, the words and the thoughts that we need so that we may be in this world a light even as He was. As He was a light in the world, a teacher and a laborer for His Heavenly Father, even so it is His will that those who have been redeemed by His precious blood would also be servants of God.

"For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." St. John 3:17. A most precious Word, is it not? We know there is no other way about it: The ungodly, that must be condemned. When we were guilty of sin, when we were laden and burdened with sin, we were under condemnation. But that condemnation was a righteous one, was it not? We read in the fore reading of what is right, what is equal between man and man, and that which God there gave as a law. There was nothing wrong about it: As man did unto his fellow man, so it should be done to him again. That was the law, but beloved ones, God has found - and it has pleased God to open unto the world a better way. And how precious for us who live in this time of the new covenant that God has led us and brought us unto this wonderful way, and that He has also prepared a way so that those who believe in Jesus Christ need not to be oppressed but that they have this liberty. I am speaking of the conflict between the old law and the new.

We know in this world and time, especially in days of conflict, as it is at the present time, where that law again comes into effect – an eye for an eye, or a life for a life. It cannot be otherwise where there is war: Where a soldier is battling for his country, if he should not be killed, he must kill the other man. That is about the only way that a war can be waged.

But how precious it is, dear ones, that the Lord has prepared the hearts of men, that even those who have power and authority in this latter day and time make allowances for God's peculiar people, for those who have become followers of Christ, who for that reason do not have the liberty any more to demand an eye for an eye, who because that they did not have to pay the debt of their own sin but have received as a free gift the remission of

their sin, because of that truth they do not have the liberty to repay evil for evil. As we were reminded this morning, it is our calling to refrain, to not avenge ourselves, neither repay evil for evil.


Forasmuch as the Kingdom of Christ is not a kingdom of this world, it is a kingdom apart, we are not called to be a kingdom or a nation here on Earth; we belong to God's eternal kingdom, and this life here on Earth is merely a time of preparation. And how should we be thankful, how should we even esteem those who are governing our nation at this time, those who are in authority and power, that they have that tolerance within their heart, even in this day and time of stress, to provide a way where God's true children, the followers of Christ, can follow Him and can serve their country within the limits of the laws of the new covenant where they have the opportunity to repay good for evil instead of evil for evil.

And beloved ones, I can see in that privilege, I can see therein an opportunity. We often speak of it, and we know that even those of our young men who are doing non-combatant duties who are serving, for instance, in the medical corps, we know what their duties are. If a fellow solder is wounded on the battlefield, their duty is without any other weapon but perhaps a first-aid kit to go there and take care of the wounded. They are to care for those who have been wounded and are suffering. And beloved ones, when we consider and also know that God is almighty and that He is everywhere, He also has promised, as the Savior has said in His sermon on the mount: "Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy." St. Matthew 5:7.

Beloved ones, that duty which a young man must perform in the service of his country and in the service of his fellow men, even having the opportunity to give a little first aid to his enemy, I believe for my heart there is a privilege therein. The almighty and all-wise God who sees and knows all things, He knows how to recompense and how to reward. And we heard in the psalm this morning, "The Lord preserveth all them that love him..." Psalm 145:20. Should we be too much concerned for those who are in the service of the Lord, even when they are in the service of their country? Because of the dangers by which they are surrounded, should we be too much concerned for them? I believe faith speaks to us in another way. The faith of the fathers, the faith of those who trusted in God in all ages, did not prevent them from approaching the areas of danger. We know that danger is on every side, and oft times I believe there are young men who are right here at home that are in greater danger than perhaps another one who is serving in his duties in the fear of God and trusting in the Lord. May God grant it unto us all, beloved ones, we who are at home, and those who cannot remain at home, that our faith in God, our trust in Him, may be our staff and our comfort.

It may yet be possible, dear ones, for the Lord to prepare for His name great glory and honor, in that He will fulfill His promises and He will show special favors unto those who trust Him and who love Him. The testimonies which we have in the Word of God - that God will do this and He will do that for those who love Him have you ever heard of it, that God failed in His promises? The promises we have in the Word of God, they can and they will be fulfilled. The main thing is that we trust in Him, that we love Him, and obey His commandments.

The following letter was written by Elder Johann Schlipf, Dauernberg, Germany, to the congregation at Elgin, Illinois, on December 3, 1884. It is from the booklet entitled, "To The King's Administration of Justice" authored by Elder William A. Stettner of Elgin. In 1884, the church at Elgin was only three or four years old.

In our Lord Jesus, my beloved brethren in Elgin, Illinois, U.S.A. Who with us have received the grace of life in Christ Jesus. God grant to you much grace, mercy and peace through the knowledge of Jesus Christ, our Lord, that you may not be in want of any good gift, but rather have life and that more abundantly, so that your lips may overflow with praise to God.

You are all in my heart, and day and night I walk in the spirit among you, only you cannot see me. Just this past night, when I had sleepless hours, I was in the spirit in Elbing with the loved ones there, in Hungary, in Switzerland, in Alsace, in Baden and in America, to and fro among the brothers and sisters. I had to say to myself during the night, "Had I but wings I would fly over the mountains and valleys," so fervently was my feeling for the dear ones whom we know and especially for those who departed from us according to the body, in which you are also included. My wish for all of you is that you live in love, peace and unity to the honor of the name of Jesus Christ, for we all bear His name.

We are all so poor and needy from our own self to serve our God, according to His good will and pleasure, and to keep His commandments. But with His grace and power we can in obedience of His good will walk according to His pleasure, and bring joy to our Father's heart.

He loves us dearly as the Apostle writes, "Behold what manner of love has the Father bestowed upon us that we should be called the children of God." Oh, what treasure it is to be a child of God, redeemed and delivered from the wrath which is to come over all the ungodly and their works. But unto you who fear God shall shine the Sun of Righteousness and Salvation, under the shadow of His wings. What precious promises do the children of God have, those who are true in love and faith until the end.

The true Shepherd, Jesus Christ, give unto you shepherds to pasture you in all teachings and wisdom, that you may live, that you may grow and increase in all knowledge of good and obedience of the truth. I also feel as did John when he wrote, "I have no greater joy than when I hear that my children walk in the truth." But contrariwise, when they do not walk in the truth it causes much grief to our Lord, and to His servants. For then the other sheep have to eat what they have spoiled with their feet.

I beseech you, my beloved ones, be diligent to keep the unity of the

spirit through the bond of peace, that you may obtain peace. For blessed are the peacemakers. Love one another as we have received the commandment from our Dear Lord. The author says, "Make my love real, pure and true, that it may not be deceitful."

Hold fast onto humility, for God resists all who are proud, but to the humble He gives His grace. Beware that you do not fashion yourselves like the world, but prove what is pleasing to the Lord, as the Apostle writes, "Do not walk anymore like the others do in the vanity of their minds." Tobias said to his son, "Vanity let neither in thy heart nor in their words reign or live." For through vanity many have been led astray by the tempter and have become a spoil of Satan.

Therefore, warn one another, and admonish one another, as it is needful for your own protection and safe-keeping in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit and brotherly love, which is the bond of perfection.

My hearty greetings to you all. Remember us in your prayers, that we, with you, may be kept to eternal life and remain by the grace of God the brother who loves you in the Lord.

"Provoke Not Others to Wrath"

"And ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath," is a familiar scripture. It is a very thought provoking statement, that is, it causes me to do some thinking.

The word "provoke" is most often used in connection with something undesirable, such as a child's wrath, but it is also used in connection with something desirable, such as in the scripture, "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works." Hebrews 10:24. It is also desirable that we do some thinking. In the end, we must give an account of ourselves. "So then everv one of us shall give account of himself to God. On that day we cannot pass the responsibility to someone else."

As a father I understand that we should not provoke our children to wrath, that is, we should not make them angry unnecessarily, by not being able to control our own emotions. I believe that we should avoid using our children as an outlet for our own stress or frustrations. That is not always easy as they are younger than we and are an easy target. We are supposed to control ourselves as we try to control our children.


However, I have been thinking that if this is true in our relationship with our children, it is almost certain to be true in regard to our relationship with others, as well. If we like for others to be kind and respectful in reasoning with us, then we should be kind and respectful in reasoning with them. The Lord Jesus Christ said, "And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise." Luke 6:31.

In our relationship with our brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as with other adults, if we fail to show them love and respect, even when we disagree with them, it may not provoke them to wrath so much, as simply discourage them to the extent that they say to themselves, "What's the use? He puts himself above me, as if he

has all the answers. I want out from under." It seems to me that in warning our children, and in warning other adults, we do have to use the scripture in reasoning with them. Perhaps we need to say, "I'm concerned about you because it is written in the Bible like this and it is best to follow the Bible. If you see anything about me that is not in accordance with the Bible in your opinion, please tell me and I will surely consider the matter carefully and prayerfully." It is very difficult, if not impossible, for anyone to correct us, if they feel that we are not open to correction.

As fathers, and as children of God, it is important that we do not provoke others to wrath and discouragement. Most of us need encouragement, and especially our children need encouragement. May God help us to be a good example to them, by what we do and by what we say, and not to provoke them to wrath.
