

Sermon by Elder Bro. Tom Klotzle, Altadena, CA

Isaiah 6 and St. Luke 4

We have here an individual who is crying out to the Lord day and night. Recognizing that God is his God or her God. The God of salvation. With a desire of, let my prayer come before Thee. (Psalm 88:1,2)

It is so interesting, as we study about prayer and how God receives prayer. So often we hear today when there's a tragedy or difficulty or some calamity, people are moved to pray. People respond with; I will pray for you and your family; may our prayers be with you. That is a wonderful thing. Yet, the question is, to whom do we pray and what is our prayer about and for? Who will hear our prayer? Is this prayer of faith?

As you read through the scriptures about prayer and about God's response to people crying out to Him, it is interesting the loving, merciful, long-suffering God says, I will turn my face away from those that call upon me but don't believe in me. That don't trust in me. That don't seek me with their hearts. So it is our part to turn towards Him. That is our part. It is not very glamorous or exciting. But it is a turning of our hearts towards Him. (Proverbs 1:23-32)

Then He says, this is His promise. As we turn towards Him, as there is may be just a first beginning of a sidelong glance, a heart's turning, He says, I will pour out my blessing upon that soul that turns to me and who looks to me in faith. (Proverbs 1:33) And then all the promises and the blessings and the grace of God that are poured out upon people that turn to Him, believing, knowing, seeking. Even though our knowing may not be - may be just like a

mustard seed. So very small. It is the beginning.

So this is the cry of the Psalmist, Let my prayer come before Thee and Thee alone. No one else. I don't pray to any other but to Thee alone. Lord, hear my prayer. May my prayer come before Thee. "...incline thine ear unto my cry;" Psalm 88:2. Isn't that a wonderful picture? Incline Thine ear unto my cry. Hear. Hear me, Lord.

Then the outpouring of life and all that the Psalmist was involved with and filled up with. "...my soul is full of troubles..." Psalm 88:3. Verse nine, "Mine eye mourneth by reason of affliction: Lord, I have called daily upon thee, I have stretched out my hands unto thee." Psalm 88:9.

And then questions. We all have questions as we turn to the Lord and wonder, what is this all about? We can relate to Job. We often turn to the Lord when we have questions. But why question? And but what to question? And how? It is okay to ask questions if we ask in anticipation. If we ask in faith. We ask in love. We ask, seeking.

Then the turning back, but unto thee have I cried, O Lord; and in the morning shall my prayer prevail upon Thee. Shall my prayer come before Thee. My prayer shall be in Thy presence in the morning. (Psalm 88:13) It is as though prayer will open the flood gates of God and allow His blessings to flow in.

James says, you ask and you don't receive (James 4:3). It's so typical and we say, why? Well, often we ask amiss. We ask so that we can consume it on our own lust. We ask for ungodly desires. Un-Christ centered desires. He says, anything you ask in my

name, that such, all inclusive name of Christ, what all is included in the name of Christ, for God's will, for His glory, for His purpose. Not for our well-being. But for His glory.

That prayer of a righteous man is effective and powerful (James 5:16). Then our prayer is in the

We Have Found the Messias

Writings based on God's Word

"...We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ" (Jn. 1:41). Andrew realized that Jesus was more than just a prophet. When he heard John the Baptist speaking to Jesus, he knew this was no ordinary man and he was anxious to share the news with those he loved.

Andrew went to tell his brother Simon Peter he had found the Messias. It does not appear that Andrew and Peter spent much time in deciding what to do. Even though it was the tenth hour of the day when Andrew realized that Jesus was the Christ, he took Peter to Jesus. Jesus, when he saw Peter, called him to be an Apostle.

The next day Jesus called Philip to be an Apostle. Philip then found Nathaniel and gave him the same message Andrew gave Peter: "...We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" (Jn. 1:45). We can feel the joy in their hearts as they shared this wonderful news with others.

The good news spread rapidly. And why shouldn't it? A promise made by God about four thousand years earlier had been fulfilled! The apostles, of course, at this point did not really understand Jesus' true mission, but they knew their lives would never be the same. They rejoiced that a long standing promise of God had been fulfilled.

Not all of the Apostles were as easily convinced as Andrew, Peter and Philip. Nathaniel didn't think anything good could come out of Nazareth, but he soon learned that Jesus was "...the Son of God; ...the King of Israel" (Jn. 1:49).

Jesus saw James and John, the sons of Zebedee, while they were in their ships mending their nets. "...He called them: and they left their father Zebedee in the ship with the hired servants, and went after him" (Mk. 1:20).

Levi (Matthew) was going about his daily routine collecting taxes for the Roman government. Jesus said "...Follow me. And he arose and followed him" (Mk. 2:14). Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Simon called Zelotes, Judas the brother of James and Judas Iscariat were also called.

Scripture does not record all of the details of the calling of each of the twelve apostles but we have enough information to believe that they willingly followed Jesus. In a discussion with His disciples concerning the difficulties they would face, Peter, in apparent reference to himself and the other apostles said "...Lo, we have left all, and have followed Thee" (Mk. 10:28). It provides us with evidence that each of the twelve apostles were very willing to leave all they had to follow Jesus.

Not all who were called by Jesus willingly left all to follow Him. One man asked Jesus what he needed to do to inherit eternal life. After a brief discussion Jesus told him "...One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me. And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions" (Mk. 10:21-22). It was not simply the possession of material goods that Jesus was concerned about. Anything that we regard as more important then serving God (father, mother, wife, child, etc.) would make so we cannot be Jesus' disciple (Lk. 14:26).

On another occasion, after He had told His followers that they must eat His flesh and drink His blood, "...many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him. Then Jesus said unto the twelve, Will ye also go away? Then Simon Peter answered Him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life" (John 6:66-68).

So what does all of this have to do with us in the twenty-first century after Jesus' birth? The message of the gospel of Jesus is still available to mankind. Each of us must make a decision about Jesus' message. Some will receive it and some will not.

The joy of finding the Messias has not diminished with the passage of time. When a soul comes under conviction of sin and is, by the grace of God, able to repent, be converted and ultimately find peace, the joy they experience is similar to what was expressed by the Apostles nearly 2000 years ago.

As Elders work with converts and see their struggles as they battle temptation, Elders often encourage them to continue the battle, and assure them they will find peace at the appropriate time. The joy in their expression "I have found peace" is usually mirrored by their countenance. The joy of finding the Messias cannot be hidden if one is truly converted and finally freed from the bondage of sin. Many times those who have found peace can hardly wait to tell others of their experience.

Unfortunately, just as it was in the days of Jesus' time on earth, not all who are called are willing to follow. Just as the rich young man was unwilling to give up his wealth, so are there those who have an idol that they cannot (or will not) give up.

God, in His mercy, often calls sinners many times but each time He is rejected by a sinner, there is a risk that there will be no more opportunity to yield to the Lord. We all know of individuals who have good intentions of repenting but they keep putting it off until, ultimately, it is too late. The hoped for "one more chance" didn't come, and they were called out of this life in a sad state of condemnation.

No doubt there are those who expect God to continue to call them until they finally heed the call. God will not force us to serve Him. Again, consider the case of the rich young man: although Jesus loved him, when the young man walked away, Jesus did not follow him and try to force him to change his mind. We have a free will. We can find the Messias or we can reject Him. There is hardly a more heart rending verse in any hymn than the one that says "Almost persuaded, harvest is past! Almost persuaded, doom comes at last! Almost cannot avail; Almost is but to fail! Sad, sad that bitter wail, Almost but lost!" (Hymns of Zion #212 "Almost Persuaded")

Our lives do not need to end in bitter disappointment. If we will heed the Master's call, "He'll lighten the load, And level the road And bear thee on hands of compassion" (Zion's Harp #46 "The Best Refuge"). We can still find the Messias, and the reward for finding Him is eternal life in heaven!



...The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:37-38

Long Range Planning

The Mission Committee has focused its efforts in recent meetings on more purposeful and inspired long range planning for development and implementation of the mission efforts of our church. This requires establishment of a clearly stated Mission and Guiding Principles, as well as structured processes for implementation.

Recommendations resulting from this intensive effort will be critical in future Elder Body deliberations and in communications throughout the Brotherhood as plans are further refined and steps are initiated, by God's grace.

The Committee firmly believes that mission efforts will be blessed and will serve to strengthen the Church if they are carried out as part of a balanced application of the four pillars of the Mission of our Church. These four pillars represent the comprehensive, ever-faithful counsel of God to His holy church.

Mission of the Church

It is strongly encouraged that all brethren become familiar with these four pillars and their scriptural basis. The mission (purpose) of the church is fourfold:

- 1. To present to the lost the Gospel message of salvation based on faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ and a true repentance and conversion.
- a) Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. (Matthew 28:19-20)

- b) Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord. (Acts 3:19)
- c) For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God. (Eph 2:8)
- 2. To teach and nurture the believers toward a sanctified life and to faithfulness by God's grace and through His Word.
- a) Whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus. (Colossians 1:28)
- b) For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ. (Ephesians 4:12)
- c) That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish. (Ephesians 5:26-27)
- 3. To preserve sound doctrine by "contending for the faith."
- a) Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints. (Jude 1:3)
- b) For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God. (Acts 20:27)
- c) Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee. (1 Timothy 4:16)

4. To offer loving, humble deeds of service to fellow believers and all mankind in the name of Christ.

- a) For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. (Galatians 5:13)
- b) As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. (Gal 6:10)
- c) But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men. (Philippians 2:7)

Mission Statement for Presenting the Gospel

This is our purpose, and it reflects what we do in mission efforts.

To present the Gospel message of salvation to the lost in concert with guiding, training and preparing the Church Body to serve all men, to nurture one another in the true faith and to preserve sound biblical doctrine.

Guiding Principles for Presenting the Gospel

These biblically based principles provide a framework within which all efforts to present the Gospel are to be developed and implemented.

1. Biblical Truth

Teach and practice the whole counsel of God (the perfect and universally applicable Word) under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable....."
(2 Tim. 3:16-17)

"Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you..." (Matt. 28:20)

2. Repentance and Sanctification Teach that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ (Eph. 2: 8-10), calling mankind to a Holy Spirit led repentance, born again experience (Matt. 3:6; Acts

3:19) and walk of sanctification

(Tit. 2:11-14). **3. Church**

Establish and support viable Apostolic Christian Churches as the nucleus of our mission work. "..the church of the living God (is the) pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15); "...ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit" (Ephesians. 2:19-22). This will occur in concert with the four pillars of the established mission of our church.

4. Preparation

Prepare brethren who are called of the Lord and are being sent by the Church to share the Gospel message of salvation. "...be ready always to give an answer to every man..." (1 Pet. 3:15); "...sanctified and meet for the master's use and prepared unto every good work" (2 Tim. 2:21).

5. Doctrinal Integrity

Avoid ecumenical intermingling (2 Pet. 2:1-2) and other forms of spiritual deception (Rev. 2:14) in our efforts to preserve sound doctrine. "Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught..." (Tit. 1:9).

6. Biblical Accountability

Provide mission environments that enable effective support and oversight, fulfilling our accountability to God for the welfare of those being sent and those being served. "...for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account..." (Heb. 13:17); "Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof..." (1 Pet. 5:1-2).

7. Love of Christ

Let the love of Christ be the prime motivation for all mission endeavors and the inspiration for loving and respectful relationships among all who serve. "This is my commandment, That ye love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12); "....in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves" (Phil. 2:3).

It is hoped that brothers and sisters throughout the land will prayerfully and sincerely consider each one's personal responsibility to become equipped to be more actively engaged in fulfilling the mission of our church.

It is essential that we first come to a unity of spirit in the belief that a balanced approach is in accord with God's plan for the church, without over-emphasis or neglect of any of the four pillars. The Mission Committee entreats your continued prayer in its efforts to discern and follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in these endeavors.

Go Ye Therefore...

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature.

(Mark 16:15)

And this Gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations. (Matthew 24:14)

And the Gospel must first be published among all nations. (Mark 13:10)

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the Gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, to preach the acceptable year of the Lord. (Luke 4:18-19)

And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His Name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. (Luke 24:47)

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me. (Acts 26:18)

How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?

And how shall they preach, except they be sent? As it is written, how beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things! (Romans 10:15-16)

I have fully preached the Gospel of Christ. Yea, so have I strived to preach the Gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's foundation: But as it written, To whom He was spoken of, they shall see: and they that have not heard shall understand. (Romans 15:19-21)

The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to usward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. (II Peter 3:9)

And I saw another angel fly in the midst of the Heaven, having the everlasting Gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people. (Revelations 14:6)

For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost. How think ye? if a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray? (Matthew 18:11-12)

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN COUNSELING SERVICES

"Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ."

Philippians 1:6

In 1988, the Elder Body formed the Mental Health Committee with the purpose of addressing mental health and relationship issues of people in the church. Through the work of this committee, the Mental Health Hotline was developed. The hotline allowed members and friends of the Apostolic Christian church to call 365 days a year and talk to a registered nurse. The nurse on call would talk with the caller and assess the situation. Then, depending on the caller's needs, the nurses would make a referral to a professional counselor from the caller's area and/or send the person print information about the problem. Over the 16 years the hotline has been in existence, eight sisters in the church (Martha Moser, Beverly Knapp, Jane Stoller, Judy Witzig, Karen Martin, Kathleen Klopfenstein, Karen Stoller, and Jeanette Lavalier) have been a part of this valuable service. Each of them was employed as a nurse in settings ranging from nursing homes to hospitals to hospice. Their work on the Hotline was voluntary and they gave of themselves willingly. The nurses were trained by Bro. Richard Kilgus who was part of the Mental Health Committee. He and Bro. Ron Messner provided ongoing training and supervision for the nurses over time.

Over the years, these sisters have faithfully ministered to hundreds of

individuals faced with emotional struggles, depression, marital problems, stress, anxiety, parenting questions, and a variety of other issues. The sisters have used their God-given gifts and abilities to provide support, encouragement, and information to members and friends across the country. They were truly pioneers in providing care for the mental health needs of people within the church.

In 2000, the Mental Health Hotline became a part of Apostolic Christian Counseling Services. Since then, ACCS has continued to grow and develop and now employs full time clinical counselors and support staff. In the last six years, the ACCS counselors and the nurses who currently staff the hotline (Martha, Jane, Judy, Karen, and Kathleen) have met quarterly for in-service trainings and to coordinate services.

Over time, a natural progression has occurred and the majority of the calls that the Mental Health Hotline once responded to have been shifted to the full-time clinical and support staff at ACCS. Within the last year, the nurses who faithfully staffed the hotline suggested that it may be time for the hotline to be phased out. Through discussions with the nurses and the ACCS staff and Board of Directors, it has been decided that as of September 1, 2006, the hotline will no longer be staffed by the nurses. We feel a twinge of sadness at the coming of this change because we have enjoyed working together so much. However, this change also fills us with gratitude as we think of God's blessing and provision over time as ACCS has grown.

It is important for readers to un-

derstand that anyone in need can continue to call the ACCS toll free number 877-370-9988 with questions or concerns related to mental health and relationship issues. The ACCS clinical and support staff members will continue to respond to calls for assistance. Again, we would like to thank the sisters for their years of dedicated service to the Lord and the church in helping those in need. May God richly bless each one.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

What can you do as an individual for the residents of the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped (ACHH) agency? Do you feel only distantly involved in this mission of serving developmentally disabled adults? What can be done to help you feel a closer relationship to individuals that may be hundreds of miles from where you live? The paragraphs following will attempt to help you develop that involvement.

The first step would be to pray for the whole mission of the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped. Pray for the board of directors and administrators that decisions that glorify God will be made for the agency and our residents. Also pray for the direct care staff members that they will be able to be kind, compassionate and competent caregivers. Direct care employees are those who work in our Nursing, Activities, Occupational Therapy/Physical Therapy, Social Services and Day Program departments. Pray for strength of mind and body and a serving attitude for the support staff members. These

people are office, dietary, house-keeping, laundry, and maintenance employees. Pray in general that God would send those people to work at ACHH facilities who want to serve Jesus Christ and to serve those individuals that need constant support in this life. Our residents need your prayerful attention, too. Pray they will be content, healthy and safe in our environment.

Secondly, if you live within a reasonable distance you may want to volunteer at one of our buildings. Often young groups from our Apostolic Christian churches and individuals from the area help with projects such as window washing, landscaping, bush trimming, also car and bus cleaning. There are times when skilled, certified workers have given their time freely or at a lower cost when working with computers, painting, plumbing, electrical, etc. The winter hours can become long for our residents so you may want to plan a game or song evening at one of the group homes or come to a Friday night sing at Timber Ridge. Many of our residents have outlived their parents; could you come and visit just one person and build a relationship over time? Are you a professional or amateur photographer that can use a digital camera? Come take some pictures for us. Do you have sewing skills? We always need someone who is willing to mend for us. Be imaginative, think of your God-given talents and see if you can use them in volunteer hours here at the Home. Call us for more information for volunteering opportunities.

Third, are you being led to answer direction from the Lord to serve instead of being served? Think of applying at ACHH as an

employee. This fall is a time that we are in need of registered nurses, licensed practical nurses and resident aides. It is more costly for us to call upon a nursing agency than to have enough qualified nurses and aides on staff.

Also, any non-profit charity such as ACHH always needs your financial support. Financial support can be donated by giving of your time, in giving products or in actual monetary gifts. We would encourage those of you who are able, to donate to our endowment fund. This fund is being maintained for the future financial security of the Home.

Finally tell others about our Home as you witness about Jesus Christ and His love. Tell others that Christ loves and gives purpose to each and every living individual. Christ cares for the poor and needy. He instructs his servants to give a glass of water to the thirsty, food to the hungry and kindness for the disabled.



morning that God will just open the flood gates of His blessing and His purpose and His provision and His power for us.

I know we've all asked for something only to receive something else that was unexpected. It might be a gift; a birthday gift, a Christmas gift. Or something that we need and we ask for it. Or it may be at work. Sometimes I am struggling with a problem and I need some help. I go to the boss and say, this is what I need. I need this. He says, no, you don't need that. It looks like you need that. But I know. I have been there. I have experience. This is what you need and it is something quite different but it is so right. It is perfect. It is applicable. And God knows and He desires for us to ask.

Then the end of this Psalm just seems like it leaves us - "I am afflicted and ready to die...I suffer thy terrors I am distracted. Thy fierce wrath goeth over me; thy terrors have cut me off. They came round about me daily like water; they compassed me about together. Lover and friend hast thou put far from me, and mine acquaintance into darkness." Psalm 88:15-18. We see here a soul that is just alone and frightened and despairing.

You know what I think? That is right where God wants him to be. That's right where He wants me to be. That is right where He wants you to be. Didn't Christ teach, if you want to be my disciples, leave all the comforts and the security and the relationships of this temporal life and follow me (Matthew 19:29)? May your desire be me and me alone. It is just where He wants us to be. It seems like such a dark place.

But then He says, I will fill it

with my light. The Psalmist said, when surely the darkness, when I say the darkness shall cover me, even the night shall be light about me. (Psalm 139:11) Christ is the light of the world. The answer is the Lord Jesus Christ.

We have in the beginning of the next Psalm, the answer to this place of lowness and dejection and heartache and disappointment and doubts and fears. "I will sing of the mercies of the Lord for ever; with my mouth will I make known thy faithfulness to all generations." Psalm 89:1. That is what the Lord wants for us. Not necessarily to be filled up with the things of this life, with the comforts and security and homes and clothing and cars and money and all these things. He wants us to be filled up with Him. Our heart's desire to be towards Him.

When we find our place in this loneliness and darkness, we have the answer right here. Seeing this is my condition, my response is, I will sing. I know you know me well enough to know that I ride the roller coaster of emotions of life's circumstances, so when I get to feeling like verses fourteen through eighteen, please remind me of the solution. Sing unto the Lord. Sing of His mercies. Sing of His love. Sing of His faithfulness. That is the light. The light of the Lord.

Were you with me in that last Psalm? I have a feeling that there is a holding back. Let's be honest. The treasures of this life are so fickle and so temporary. Here today and gone tomorrow. Christ is not physical and he doesn't show up in our bank account. But let's pray to be like the Apostles and act like the Apostles. Like Paul, who said all those things that were gain to me I now count as loss for the excellency of the

knowledge of Jesus Christ my Lord (Philippians 3:7,8). Then we see what happens in a man's life who lives like that and acts like that. Maybe the holding back I sense is my own heart.

The Acts of the Apostles....these are how the Apostles acted. They are now gone. They have come to the end of their life. They, living in faith, have gone to be in the presence of the Lord. As Paul told Timothy, now you are to be a minister of the gospel (II Timothy 4:1,2). He handed off the baton, so to speak, in the relay race through life. One lays it down. The other picks it up. Timothy picked up the mantle that Paul was laying down. And continued to run the race. To walk the walk. To talk the talk. To act out the acts of the Apostles.

So generation follows generation. I wonder how that affects us and how we see ourselves, having been saved by grace through faith. The Apostles are gone. The Lord Jesus Christ still sits at the right hand of the Father. The Holy Spirit is as present today as He was back then when Paul healed the lame man. How does that affect our acts? What were your acts yesterday and last week and the week before? What have our acts been? Where is our treasure? What is our desire? Let's see ourselves - let's see ourselves as we are. The witnesses, those who testified of the same things that Paul testified of, let's see ourselves with purpose. Let's see ourselves with a mission, with a desire, with a purpose, as Paul did.

Remember it said that they turned the world upside down (Acts 17:6). We see here the confusion that was going on. Some following the Apostles and some following the Jews. (Acts 14:4)

There is a verse here that really jumped out at me. Verse twenty two. "Confirming the souls of the disciples, and exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God." So what is the message? What is the message of the Apostles? What are their acts? What is the focus of their message and what is the focus of our message? When we share Jesus Christ, when someone asks of the hope that lies within us, what is our response?

I know so often I am tempted to lay down a path of wonderful ease, of prosperity, of joy and peace. But here we see the truth of it. This really is no way to build a church, as church builders think today. To speak this truth that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God.

But let's take heart and know, since this is true, that when tribulation comes we are not disappointed. I am defeated. There is nothing that defeats me faster than tribulation. Because, for some reason, my desire is for a lack of tribulation. I work so hard and desire so much no tribulation. Yet when tribulation comes, I am faced with discouragement - my first reaction. Hopefully it is not like that with you. I know others and some of you that in the face of tribulation are not discouraged. Because you are like the runner who falls down and gets back up again and carries on. Knowing that there will be another fall, but getting back up again and taking the opportunity.

So there is going to be tribulation. What is the message and what do we speak? We go back to chapter thirteen. It says, there was, in the church that was in Antioch, verse one, chapter thirteen, certain prophets and teachers and it names these men, two of which are Barnabas and Saul. It says, "As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away." Acts 13:2,3.

That is where Paul and Barnabas got their start. Fasting, ministering unto the Lord in prayer. They were chosen out by the Holy Spirit. So they knew that when tribulation came, it was okay. It is going to be okay because you are chosen for this work. For these acts. It is the same with you and me.

What do you look forward to tomorrow and the next day? We have many plans in life. We are given responsibilities and stewardships and all these things are good. Yet they cannot take the place of the main purpose, the message and that is the furtherance of the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. That even in the face of tribulation, we still speak the truth.

Paul and Barnabas left and they came to Iconium and there was this stirring up (Acts 14:1,2). So they fled. There is a time to stand. There is a time to fight. There is a time to flee. They were filled with the Holy Spirit. They knew what to do and when and where. They fled to Lystra.

Now we see this from a different perspective but there is a man in Lystra and he is crippled. He's never walked. He did not know, neither did the Apostles know. But let's consider this in our lives. We don't know the future. We don't know what - why do we worry about tomorrow? Why aren't we filled with hope for tomorrow?

Think about this man in Lystra that had never walked. The moment the Holy Spirit spoke and said, separate Paul and Barnabas for the work of the ministry, that man was on the road to healing and to victory and to walking. But he didn't know it. He was sitting there in Lystra. He did not have all that our handicapped people have today. He was likely in very, very difficult circumstances. But the Apostles walked and they acted and they were led by the Holy Spirit. This man in Lystra had no idea, the day before, what was going to happen. He had no warning, even moments before Paul and Barnabas came there. They didn't know. He didn't know. But it was going to be the most glorious day of his life. Because he was going to receive healing. Because Paul and Barnabas were following the Lord Jesus Christ through much tribulation. This man benefited by their willingness to continue on in faith, teaching the truth.

Paul, steadfastly beholding him, perceived that he had the faith to be healed (Acts 14:9). Isn't that great? This man had faith to be healed. "Said with a loud voice, Stand upright on thy feet. And he leaped and walked." Acts 14:10. Then there was this huge outpouring and outcry. Something wonderful has happened! Something great has happened! Something marvelous has happened! Something that is miraculous! This man who has never walked, leaped up and walked!

What is the natural inclination of people when something like that happens? We see it right here. It is so typical. To worship. We have to worship something. We are created as beings that worship. We need to worship. It is Sermon continued from page 45 part of us.

So the question is, what do we worship? Who do we worship? When do we worship? How do we respond to the great acts of God? They had to worship. It just came out of them. The only thing they knew to do was to call one of them Jupiter and the other Mercury and worship these pagan gods that were impotent and powerless.

We just know the acts of the Apostles. They acted when they were separated for the work by the power of the Holy Spirit. They acted when they went to Iconium. They acted in faith when they fled that place and they acted when they reached out and spoke to heal the man. Aren't we thankful for their example? That when credit wanted to be given to them and when they were made objects of worship - I don't think my heart often enough thinks about this they didn't accept it. They could have thought, we might stay here for a while. That other place was really hostile. But these people, they think we are gods. We can stay here and enjoy all that they have to give here and have reputation. They'll probably take good care of us.

But what was their response? They were men of purpose, of passion. They tore their clothes and they ran and they said, wait! Stop! Stop! We don't want worship. They directed the worship where it belongs. To the Lord Jesus Christ. (Acts 14:14,15) We are men of like passions (Acts 14:15). Isn't that wonderful? The pillars of the church - they are not dressed up in fancy robes and hats and scarlet. Large buildings and gold. They are walking to Iconium and Lystra. They are directing people to the One, the only One who deserves worship. The only One that we are created to worship. They directed them to the almighty God, to the Lord Jesus Christ.

Verse fifteen, "...Sirs, why do ye these things? We also are men of

like passions with you, and preach unto you..." And here is the gospel message for all of us that need preparation to give an answer of the hope that lies within us. This is it. Turn from these vanities this is repentance - unto the living God which made heaven and earth and the sea and all things that are therein. "Who in times past suffered all nations to walk in their own ways. Nevertheless he left not himself without witness, in that he did good, and gave us rain from heaven, and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness." Acts 14:16,17. Filling our hearts with the Lord Jesus Christ and all that comes with the fullness in Christ.

Let's be encouraged to consider ourselves and who we are and what we stand for and how we respond in tribulation and how we respond in the middle of the acts of God. And we continue to walk in faith and faithfulness and truth. Counting all that this world has to offer as loss so that we can gain Christ.

The following includes a message to German state officials concerning the beliefs of our brethren in 1878. Authors were: Brothers Johann Schlipf, Christian Schlipf and Johann Aupperle. This is taken from To The King's Administration of Justice.

September, 18, 1878 Wuttemburg, Germany

The Foundation Of Our Christian Faith As It Is Taught And Practiced In Our Churches

We find recorded in the Holy Scriptures, both in the New and also in the Old Testament, Hebrews 11:16, that without faith it is impossible to please God — for he that wishes to come to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him. Therefore we confess with our mouth, and believe in our hearts, like all true and holy men according to the Holy Scripture on a Holy, True, Eternal, Merciful Perfect Trinity — Father, God and Holy Ghost. To Him alone belong thanks, praise, honor, glory, honor and worship from eternity to eternity. Amen.

We believe that the Almighty God created heaven and earth and sea, and everything that is upon and in it. That He created man after His own image, holy, pure, innocent and perfect. God, the Lord, let man live in Paradise, and ordained that there should be man and woman (Genesis 1:26-27).

But the first parents departed from the commandment of God by being disobedient to their Creator, and reached for that which was forbidden, being influenced by Satan, the subtle serpent, who deceived mankind through craft and hatred. (Genesis 3:13).

In consequence man lost the image of God and on account of man's disobedience against the commandment of God fell under the punishment of God and the curse came upon him (Genesis 3:16,17). On account of sin and transgression the spiritual death came over all mankind. The holy communion which man had with God was lost.

But the gracious and merciful God did not want mankind to be lost forever, therefore gave them a hope and a promise of redemption that man again might be delivered from this spiritual death. For the fulfillment of such the Fathers longed and waited (Psalm 14). Oh, that salvation of Israel were come out of Zion, when the Lord bringeth back the captivity of the people, etc. Until the appointed time from the Father did He give His people of the Old Covenant whom He led out of Egypt through Moses, the law. And Moses himself did testify of the promise of the Messiah and spoke, "A prophet shall the Lord, your God, raise from your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear." (Acts 7:37, Deut. 18:18)

Regarding the redemption of mankind through Jesus Christ we teach and believe: When the time of fulfillment of the promise of God to the Fathers came, then God did send His Son, born of a virgin, Mary, who was espoused to a man named Joseph, from the House of David. Which was begotten not of the blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor the will of man, but of God (Luke 1:35, John 1:3). This promised Messiah, Jesus Christ, came in the form of a servant and proclaimed the

Gospel of Peace to all mankind, so that fallen mankind could through Him again be redeemed and delivered from the fall of Adam and from the spiritual death and the power of darkness.

Jesus Christ placed Himself as the mediator between God and man. He reconciled and redeemed man with His own precious blood which He shed on the cross for the sins of man. For we are not purchased with gold or silver from destruction, but with the precious blood of Christ. For God does not want anyone to perish, but wants man to believe on Jesus Christ and be saved from sin and the power of Satan. We read in the Gospel of John, "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Because we read in the Holy Scriptures to believe on Jesus Christ, or not to believe in Him, determines to eternal life or eternal death. And likewise obedience and disobedience to the Word of God. Because Jesus Christ, while He lived on earth as the son of man, revealed the whole counsel and will of God, and all that is beneficial and needful for salvation. Therefore we should not add anything nor take away anything from the Word of God, which Christ and afterward His chosen disciples declared and taught. Apostles did bear witness of His truth and resurrection.

"That's What We're Living For"

Recently, I said to one of the members of our church, "If there is anything we can do for you, please let us know. That's what we're living for." Now I'm thinking, "Is that really what we're living for?" The answer is yes, that's what we're living for.

In Revelation 4:11 we read, "Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created." According to this verse, we human beings, who are part of God's creation, were created for His pleasure, and to bring Him glory, and honour, and power. Therefore, I have always used this verse to show that the purpose of our lives is to bring God glory. If others see that we are devoted to helping others, and they know that we are followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, God also receives honour, that is, they come to respect God more, and the power of the Holy Spirit working in the lives of others, is increased. That's what we're living for.

Another verse which supports this view is Matthew 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." The Lord Jesus also taught that good works bring glory to God.

Let us be in the business of looking for someone to help. If we give someone a ride home and the person says, "Thank you very much for kindness," we may reply, "That's what we're living for." It should not be unusual for children of God to so conduct themselves.


We must be careful, though, that the devil, working through others, does not start to take advantage of us. For instance, if we ask if there is anything we can do for others and someone says, "Yes, give me a million dollars," we should refuse that request even if we would be so fortunate as to have a million dollars. We humans are basically selfish and to promote

that selfishness is not helping them.

We can help others, not only by what we do but by what we say. Most people need a little encouragement mixed in with all the criticism that is tossed around. Too much criticism may be one of our most serious problems. We naturally tend to criticize more than praise, usually indirectly. That is a difficult problem to overcome but let's try to give a little credit where credit is due. Proverbs 27:2 reads, "Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth." We tend to stay away from praise for fear that the person will become proud, but sometimes we can help others with a little praise for the good points that everyone has. That's what we're living for.

Moving away from the individual we can say that one of the purposes of the church is to help people. For the church and for individuals, "That's What We're Living For."
