

Sermon by Bro. Fred Eberhardt, Burlington, IA

### Acts 27:14-44

Today, we pray that the Lord will come into our midst and speak to our hearts. He will be there to encourage us because this is why we come to church. It's to be encouraged by the Lord. We live in a time in which we need to be encouraged. We need God in our lives because God can offer that encouragement. One of the ways we can find that encouragement is through His Word. We have beautiful words contained within the Holy Scriptures of the Bible. Psalms describes them as wonderful words of life. Life! Life is beautiful in itself. But we think of the life that the Lord has given to us beautiful life. The Lord has been good to us. He has blessed us. We have every reason to believe that this day the Lord will continue to encourage us and be in our lives.

We have before us a rather lengthy chapter in Acts...it kind of goes through my mind where to begin here. We have Acts Chapter 27 which has fallen open. Here we read the story of Paul. He was taken as prisoner from in the area of the Middle East to Rome where he was going to appeal to Caesar. He ran into a ship wreck. We do not know why things happen to us. Storms of life come into our lives. But I believe that there is a great connection between this chapter which we are about to read and our spiritual lives and how even chapters such as this which seem to be history can be compared to our lives today. How we can read in chapters such as this and how we could rededicate our lives for the Lord.

Quite a storm...to break a ship like what happened in that island long ago. We know that when storms come there is fear. Fear in peoples lives. Fear, lest they should perish. And then we think of the safety of the ship, and I'm sure the last thing that these people wanted to do was to jump that ship when the seas were so high and the waves, caused by the wind, would make it so difficult for them to reach the shore. But a miracle happened. This is truly a story of a miracle. A miracle of God so many survived and the way they did.

Then we think of our situation today and we think of our church. We call our church here the ship of faith. This ship of faith of ours sails on and on and on. We have beautiful days in which our ship sails and which there is joy in our lives, there is happiness. But then there comes those times in our lives that the storms come and fear comes into our lives. The safety of the ship...we think of the safety of our ship of faith and we are comforted.

We think of those storms out there. How many times do we, well, we might call these storms sickness, in which people fear for their loved one's life? How many other times, there are times in which we fear for our own safety? There are times then, that Satan is out there to try to deceive us. We can call these storms. But in our church of faith and our ship of faith there are certain things that we can do to strengthen our ship. What are those things that we can do? Well, let's just read here what they tried to do to this ship right here.

One of the first things they tried to do was, they used helps, undergirding the ship. (Acts 27:17) We need help today and undergirding our ship of faith. We need to strengthen the undergirding of

our ship of faith. How do we strengthen the undergirding of our ship of faith? It is called love. Love for one another. There is nothing more strengthening than the love of the brotherhood. The love for each other. It strengthens us, it encourages us. It undergirds our faith.

save me" (Mt. 14:30).

"But Peter followed him afar off unto the high priest's palace, and went in, and sat with the servants, to see the end" (Mt. 26:58). "But when he (Peter) saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord,

"But Peter said unto him (Simon the Sorcerer), Thy money perish with thee, because thou hast thought that the gift of God may be purchased with money. Thou hast neither part nor lot in this matter; for thy heart is not right in the sight of God. Repent therefore of this thy wickedness, and pray God, if perhaps the thought of thine heart may be forgiven thee. For I perceive that thou art in the gall of bitterness, and in the bond of iniquity" (Acts 8:20-23).

If we did not know the situation, we could hardly believe that the first two paragraphs give insight to the same man. Peter was very bold and quite willing to speak without giving careful thought to the likely results of what he said or did.

How is it possible for one man to respond so differently when in each case he really was trying to work for the Lord? After all, in the two incidents described in the first paragraph. Peter was following Jesus or following Jesus' instructions. Peter did follow Jesus from the garden of Gethsemane to the high priest's palace. Peter did step out of the boat at Jesus' command. Peter's intentions were very good. He wanted to serve his Master. He had promised to follow Christ where ever He went, even to the extreme of promising to "...lay down my life for thy sake" (Jn. 13:37). By offering to fight for Jesus, Peter again showed his desire to serve his Master. He "...drew his sword, and struck a servant of the high priest, and smote off his ear" (Mt. 26:51).

However, something happened to Peter from the time he put up his sword until Jesus was led away. He allowed himself to be separated from Jesus. Satan was given an opportunity to get between Peter and Jesus and the results were disastrous, leading to Peter's denial of Jesus

only hours after promising to die for Him.

In the second incident, Peter actually began to walk on the water. However, Peter took his eyes off Jesus and looked at the dangers around him. The fear that came to Peter when he focused his attention on the world rather than on Jesus caused him to lose faith

What application does Peter's experience have for us? The experiences of Peter can be applied to the struggles of both the converted and the unconverted. Peter's experiences show us the danger of not walking closely enough to Jesus.

Those of us who have been able, by the grace of God, to respond to the call of God have undoubtedly noticed that there are times when it is easier to resist temptations than at other times. Why is this true?

The power and persistence of Satan's attacks vary significantly. The stronger temptations, of course, are much more difficult to resist. There may be times when temptations seem stronger because our desire or ability to resist are weaker. These are occasions when it is necessary for us to examine our lives more carefully. Have we grown careless in our prayer life and scripture reading? Have we allowed things to enter our life that may give Satan an opportunity to bring distress? Have we simply become too busy in our work or other activities that there is just not enough time to focus on the Word and on the message of Jesus? Have we become a bit too self confident, as Peter did when he took matters (the sword) into his own hands?

Have we allowed the fears that can come from focusing too much attention on what is happening around us that we become distracted and lose sight of the fact that God is still in control? Peter initially had the faith to follow Jesus, but the cares of the world (soldiers in the one case and the forces of nature in the other) caused him to lose his focus on what really mattered. No doubt numerous examples could be cited, each of which could cause us to get farther from Jesus and give Satan greater opportunity to tempt us.

The need to focus on Christ does not

mean that we ignore what is happening around us. If the forces of nature are putting us in danger, we need to take reasonable steps to protect ourselves. When Satan tried to convince Jesus to jump off the pinnacle of the temple to see if God would protect Him, Jesus said to Satan "...It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God" (Mt. 4:7). If the evils of the world are pressing heavily upon us, we must become aware of it so we can follow the instructions Paul wrote to Timothy: "...flee these things: and follow after righteousness...: (I Tim. 6:11). Ignoring danger around us is really abusing the grace of God.

If we have not yet been converted, we can also apply Peter's experiences to our lives. Peter was not converted at the time of the incidents cited earlier. He thought he was serving God, but he was not in total submission to Him. It was not until after Peter denied Christ ["And the Lord turned, and looked upon Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord...And Peter went out, and wept bitterly" (Lk. 22:61-62) when he truly repented and was converted. Only then did he truly serve God.

Perhaps we, converted or unconverted, believe we are trying to do God's will. We may love the Lord and want to do what is right. We may even call ourselves "Christians", but have we really made Him the focus of our lives? Have we become willing to forsake all, take up the cross daily, and walk with Jesus? Do we walk closely enough with Christ that there is not room for Satan to get between us and our Lord? Are we really walking beside Jesus rather than following Him "afar off"?

If we can truly answer the above questions with a sincere and thankful "yes", we will find ourselves drawing near to Jesus Christ and to God. We can ultimately walk next to Him, knowing that by His grace we will have eternal life in heaven with God.

## The Lord's Work in Ixtlan

We are encouraged to see God's continuing faithfulness in the Ixtlan church. He is able to reach hearts in many different ways. Sometimes this is through loving deeds of service. For example, an eye clinic in June allowed a number of people to be able to see clearly. Some shed tears of joy as the words in the Bible became clear to them with their glasses. May God continue to open the spiritual eyes of those in Mexico who are blinded by Satan.

In June, a teenage girl started repenting, and soon began meeting with her friends on a regular basis to have Bible studies with them. What an example to us of the desire we should have to share with others about the change Christ is working in our lives! Our faith is strengthened by the example of a sister who is battling cancer, yet rejoices in her pain because she knows it brings her closer to Christ. She sings and laughs rather than complains (see 2 Cor. 12:9-10). The doctors were astounded by her recent clean test results, and said she must have "influence in heaven." She replied, "Yes, I have Christ!"

**New territory** 

Sometimes the Lord provides unexpected opportunities for hearts to be touched by the truths of His Word. Recently God turned a mountain hike into an opportunity to share the Gospel with a family in a town near Ixtlan. Three of the brothers serving in Ixtlan decided to tackle one of the nearby mountains, and had invited some young men from the community to go along. They hoped it would be an opportunity

to spend time in God's creation and witness to the young men. That morning none of them showed up. Disappointed, the brothers decided to climb the mountain anyway.

In the village at the foot of the mountain they met three teen boys who agreed to take them to the top. Afterwards they invited them to meet their grandmother, a very devout woman. She told them to sit down, brought her Bible, and asked them to teach. The brothers explained the simple Gospel plan to her family. A relationship was established and this family is now an entry point in this new village, where we trust that God will continue to spread His Word. When our human plans fail, God is able to turn our disappointments into divine opportunities!

God has begun a new gathering of believers with four converts in Barra Vieja (near Acapulco), Mexico. The scene is reminiscent of the early church in Acts, when the believers eagerly gathered in their homes daily to hear the Word taught (Acts 2:41-47). Since Barra Vieja is far from Ixtlan, couples or two brothers who speak Spanish are sent monthly to have Bible studies with the new believers. It's refreshing to see their hunger and thirst for the Word of God, and their willingness to humbly obey the teachings which are new to them. The first out-loud prayer of the father, simple and sincere, brought tears to his wife. This display of humility before God was a rare and powerful sight.

The Holy Spirit demonstrated the living truth, "Ye are the salt of the earth," when one of the guests went next door to borrow salt from the neighbors. A new friendship was started, resulting in Bible studies every evening with the family. Ev-

ery evening the mother called her children together and instructed them to pay attention to the message from the Bible. Even if God calls you to go a great distance to share the Gospel, it still begins with your neighbor!

### Victory Ahead in Haiti

The name conjures up visions of 1 the poorest nation in the western hemisphere. It invokes overtones of political unrest, kidnappings and voodoo. The fear of the unknown looms large in our minds, but thankfully we felt no fear as plans were made for six Elder Brothers to travel to Haiti in order to better understand the scope of the ongoing Apostolic Christian World Relief projects. We knew that God would be faithful. Dedicated Brothers and Sisters have labored over many years on projects that have had lasting impact on the Haitian people. We had opportunity to view many of these projects firsthand.

### The never ending struggle

We were astonished at the magnitude of the need in Haiti. Many homes have no plumbing. Work is scarce. The average income is about a dollar a day. Because of years of political corruption, there is little trade or opportunity. The Haitians have a word that is loosely translated as "making do."

One of our group observed how a Haitian had repaired a flat bicycle tire. He took out the tube, pulled the part of the tube with the hole out a bit, and tied a very small piece of string around the base of the protruding part in order to seal off the leak. That might seem like an inventive way to "make do." Now, multiply it by dozens of similar repairs on the same tube! To our little group, this exemplified the nature of daily life in Haiti, a never ending struggle to live on few resources.

### Faith in action

We were joyful because everywhere we went we met believing people with smiles on their faces in spite of their difficult circumstances. Worship services were conducted with a small congregation in Torbeck. We joined them for several hours in singing many familiar hymns (we in English, they in Creole). Then we were invited to a home where the wife was nearing her "due date." We learned that she and several other ladies had labored for hours to prepare us a feast. To understand the principle of the widow's mite is one thing, but to be the recipients of the widow's mite brought tears to our eyes.

### Answered prayer

While we were there, one of them shared the details of his son's kidnapping. When this man received a phone call advising him that his son had been kidnapped, right there on the phone he began to sing a well-known hymn, *Victory Ahead*, that we know from the "Melodies of Praise." It begins, "When the hosts of Israel, led by God..." and ends, "By faith I see the victory ahead!" Then he prayed aloud asking for God's help and thanking God for hearing his prayer.

We rejoiced to hear that he received a phone call from his son the next day. He had been rescued by mysterious commandos in an unmarked helicopter. We rejoiced even more to know that whether his son was rescued or not, this man had reacted with hope instead of despair, with faith instead of fear.

### Opportunities to help

We felt heaviness of heart as it became clearer every day that our efforts to help were the equivalent of bailing a sinking ship with thimbles. We met two women running an orphanage caring for dozens of children with no fixed source of funding; a school principal working for months without pay because the students needed him; houses of mud constructed on steep hillsides where there is no water; children carrying water in buckets on their head up slopes that would make a mountain goat feel at home and roadsides clogged with people walking because so few can afford any other means of transportation. Rice and beans one day leads to beans and rice the next.

### Gratitude

In spite of the overwhelming enormity of the need, a deep gratitude became the reigning mood in our little group. Gratitude for the opportunity to help - however small our help may be; for the joyful spirit of the Haitian believers; for all the dedicated efforts of our Apostolic Christian Brothers and Sisters: for the faithfulness of the World Relief Board in their commitment to do as much as possible; for the faithful givers who donate the fruits of their labor to what may seem a faceless and unknown recipient; that the Lord provided work team coordinators who have managed our teams so faithfully for many years; for all the others who have faithfully served in Haiti; for the careful and appreciative attitude with which the recipients receive the help and for the evidence of the hand of God at work in so many different ways. Most of all, gratitude for a Savior who by His death teaches us submission to the will of the Father without reservation, and by His life teaches us that there is "Victory Ahead."

Thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

As Christians we have such a great responsibility to follow God's commandments and through His grace we can be used for His work. It should be easy to serve a God who has given us so much and yet we often become so distracted by those things that are not really that important. This awareness often causes us to come humbly before our God to seek His forgiveness and ask Him to mold us to be more faithful.

We may find loving our neighbors even more challenging than loving our Father as we should. At Gateway we have the opportunity to meet people from many different walks of life. We come in contact with children whose behavior problems challenge even the most patient. We read files that tell us stories of abuse and neglect that bring tears, shock, and anger. These facts help us to understand why these same children are the way they are and help to give us a greater level of compassion. Then we come face to face with adults who are in many cases the ones who caused the emotional and physical harm that we see each day in the lives of their children. We sometimes ask "Father, is this my neighbor?" And our loving Father says, "Yes, I created them just as I have created you." Then we say a prayer and ask for grace to smile, to be respectful, and to show God's love. When our hearts are open, God answers our prayer giving us an extra measure of patience, the ability to see strengths in others, and the ability to have compassion. Most importantly, our Father gives us a desire that they

would accept the gift of salvation. Please continue to pray for the staff at Gateway Woods as we strive to look at our neighbors though God's eyes of love.

To bring glory to God, we plan to send brethren to serve with the Caribbean Christian Center for the Deaf (CCCD) in Jamaica. While working with CCCD, our brethren will have opportunities to observe other physical and spiritual needs while assisting with other World Relief activities. It is our belief that Jamaica is an appropriate next step for Apostolic Christian missions based upon the national English language, ease of travel, friendly government, physical and spiritual needs, and the historical interest and involvement of our brethren.

Our goal is to seek understanding and favor from God as we attempt:

- \* To bring glory to God by demonstrating His love to the Jamaican people in word, deed, and lifestyle. (I Jn. 3:16-18, Jn. 13:34-35) We are called to be examples of holy living in a culture that knows little of practical holiness. (Matt. 5:13-16, I Pet. 1:15-16)
- \* To expand upon current opportunities for brethren in the Apostolic Christian Church of America to serve in Jamaica in humility and love, (Matt. 9:35-38, 25:40; Lu. 10:2) and do good to all men as we have opportunity. (Gal. 6:10)
- \* To testify of the Gospel message of salvation through the shed blood of Jesus Christ (Acts 4:12), including repentance and conversion as lead by the Holy Spirit. (Acts 3:19, Eph. 2:8)
- \* To send individuals to serve the Jamaican people by:
  - Supporting CCCD activities
  - Supporting World Relief work teams or individuals spiritually and logistically.
  - Assisting with logistics associated with WR humanitarian aid shipments.

- Conducting Bible studies in homes for interested individuals.
- Conducting VBS programs in schools, orphanages, and infirmaries as opportunities might arise.

Background

This is being prayerfully pursued in response to interest and involvement with the Jamaican deaf ministries and the perceived need for more structured and approved missionary opportunities for Apostolic Christian members around the world. Work team opportunities have given our members a taste of missions and created an interest in long term possibilities. We believe this direction submits a prayerful and unified vision for expanded Apostolic Christian World Relief opportunities in Jamaica.

The Jamaican people are poor financially and especially spiritually. While we acknowledge there are many other countries with greater physical and spiritual needs than Jamaica, we believe that Jamaica may be an appropriate next step for full time Apostolic Christian service

Missionary Personnel & Support

As the Lord provides, we will send an initial team of four brethren (consisting of one lead couple and either a second couple or two other singles of the same gender) to serve in this original capacity. Further assignments will be considered if and when more opportunities become known.

Our brethren will be spiritually accountable to their local home church, and will benefit from ongoing spiritual support via church tapes, periodic visits by ACWR work and aid distribution teams (Avg. 6-8 / year), and attendance at Apostolic Christian church services when teams are present.

Willing and able to become proficient in sign language is required for all team members planning to serve at CCCD.

Financial Support

The Caribbean Committee of Apostolic Christian World Relief will assume direct responsibility for the team's financial requirements.

Apostolic Christian Church Involvement

This proposal would require no change in the current involvement of our brethren in Jamaica work teams and material aid shipments.

Job Description – Authority and Daily Responsibilities

The missionaries would be under the authority of the Apostolic Christian World Relief board and directly report to CCCD. The Caribbean committee would assume responsibility for primary oversight and counsel, and would cooperate significantly with the brethren's local churches to provide all the necessary support during service.

Possible assignments are: Campus Manager, Woodwork Production and Construction Manager, Catering Supervisor, Farm Manager, Nurse, Teacher, Accounting Clerk, Assistant Principal, Secretary, Special Administrator at Knockpatrick, and Guidance Counselor.



It is so important that we would not bite and devour one another. That would destroy us, that will fracture us. It will make us more susceptible to damage. And our ship, we want to strengthen the undergirding of it. That's the most important part of a ship, except for the sails. Because there are dangers out there, there are rocks out. there's quicksand out there. And what are these rocks called that we have to guard against, that we have to watch? It is called sin. It's called adultery. It is called many things, many areas of sins that we could spend a whole hour on. We all know what they are. Those little rocks out there, and we have to guide our ship in and out of these rocks. How do we do it? We need a lighthouse out there, don't we? Who is that lighthouse? It is our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. He is that lighthouse. He sends those beams across the wave...for us to watch the dangers out there.

We think of many times of the gulfs and the lakes and the fog. We cannot see good. The light from a lighthouse can be seen far away as 40 or 50 miles. But think of the power of the lighthouse of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ our God. How far can we see? It shines from Heaven above down to this earth. It shines in our lives. It is there for us, to guide us, to direct us. We have to look at that Lighthouse from time to time because it shows us the way. It shows us the way to Heaven. It shows us the way to that yonder shore.

In times of a storm, though, how good is a lighthouse? When there is driving winds, driving rain, clouds...many times we cannot see that lighthouse. Then what do we do in our lives? It is called faith. We have to live in faith. Believe

that the Lord is there to help us. Believe that the Lord is there to encourage us. The faith that we have, it's necessary in our lives because those storms will come up.

Old times, the method of traveling by ship, so antiquated. They had up there in the northern skies, they have the North Star up there. They used that North Star there directly above the North Pole. That star does not move. It is there - all the other stars revolve around that North Star. They could guide their ships by looking at that North Star. What about the north star in our lives, in our spiritual lives? What is unmovable? What doesn't move? Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He is steadfast. He is unmovable. He is always there. You know, everybody's lives revolve around Jesus Christ. All our lives revolve around Him! We have to put our faith and we have to put our trust in Him.

There are other stars out there today. We might call them movie stars. You might call them star athletes. They arise, they have their peak in their lives in their 20s and the 30s. A lot of people look up at those stars. Try to follow them, try to emulate them. But everyone shall die. Everyone shall pass away. Everyone gets old. Those stars, they slowly start to fade in their lives, they fade beyond the sunset mountains...no more to be seen. So what comfort can we really have in those type of stars? The only bright and the only shining star that we have that we can put our trust in is our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He is always out there. He is like that north star. It won't arise, it won't set. But it was always there, and can always be seen in the night skies.

You know, nature is very interesting because, I wonder what

about the southern hemisphere. What about the southern hemisphere? They can't see the north star in the southern hemisphere. They have another constellation out there. Maybe many of you know what that is. It's called the Southern Cross. It's the shape of a cross. In the southern hemisphere they look upon that cross, the Southern Cross, to guide them. And in that cross, in that constellation of that cross there's a sagging star that remains very close to above the southern pole. We think of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as He died upon that cross. He sagged there - His lifeless body. He gave His body for us. His life for us and they follow that Southern Cross, and we follow the cross of Jesus also. The cross of Jesus is there for us. Jesus is there for each and every one of us. He will guide us and show us the way. He is that gentle Shepherd. He is the Shepherd of our lives. And sometimes we have to live by faith, when these storms come. We put our faith in Jesus. He is there for vou and me.

We read here how they had to lighten that ship. (Acts 27:38) Weight on a ship in a storm does not equate to safety. They had to throw all their goods overboard to lighten the ship to make that ship more nimble, so it could navigate easier so the weight would not cause it to be a burden in a storm. Oh, there's weights in our lives that we have to get rid of also. Those weights are called sin. We have to remove sin in our lives especially in those times in which there is darkness, there are storms. But Jesus is there. He'll help us get rid of those weights. He'll lighten the load, He'll level the road for us. He'll be there for you and for me. He is there for us.

Put our trust in Him. Empty ourselves of this world and what it has to offer. Put our trust in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Follow Him. He'll be there for us.

We'll read about Paul. He had a dream, there, and he came up and he said "...be of good cheer..." Acts 27:25. I think it is so important to be of good cheer. Because there are so many out there that are faced with storms in their lives. That are faced with troubles. We do not understand many times what souls go through. We cannot understand their tears. We cannot understand of the things that they have to face in life. For us to go up there and be of good cheer to those people is so important in our lives. To cheer up those despondent souls that are going through so much. Well I believe that we have Jesus in our hearts. We can be of good cheer. We have a lot of reasons to be of good cheer. We don't have to be sad. We do not have to be despondent. Jesus is there for us and we can be of good cheer.

We read here of this ship that was nearing land. (Acts 27:27) You know it seems like high above these ships, way above the sails there, they have a watchman up there...and they watch for land. Many times they have this telescope out there, and they are constantly moving that telescope, looking for the enemy, looking for dangers. There were pirates in those days. There were those that came, they stole from these ships...and so they had to be on guard. I believe far above us we have Jesus that is looking out for us. He has eyes that can see afar. He has eves that can see us. And then we have our elders looking out for us also. Eyes, watchmen, looking out for our faith!

And then we read something

else this ship had. It's amazing to me even those many years ago they had this sonar system. As they knew that they were approaching land, they had this instrument there that they would echo off the bedrock of the ocean there, and would come back up to the ship and they could tell in fathoms how deep the sea was. What about the bedrock of our lives? Who is the bedrock of our lives? Jesus Christ! Jesus Christ the solid rock. We sing that hymn, 'On Christ the solid rock, I stand; All other ground is sinking sand.' (The Solid Rock, Hymns of Zion #99) How often do we sound our sonar - our spiritual sonar? To see how far we are from the heart of God. To see how far we are from Jesus Christ. We have to sound that sonar in our lives. We find the sea getting too deep. And us getting too far from Jesus Christ. We need to sound that sonar, and find ways drawing our hearts closer to God. Coming to church. Reading His Word. Pray. These are all ways that we can shorten that sonar sound wave. We can be brought closer to the heart of God.

To think of our spiritual ship – think of our church today. Think of the church of God. Think of all churches and what is happening out there. Then think of this ship, and where it was heading in the time of Apostle Paul. It was heading to a place where two seas met. (Acts 27:41) It's usually in a bay. The water and the waves, they would come in and they would form together right there where they met. It was kind of a violent place. And then in the midst of the storm it was even more violent. It could really shake a ship. That's where that ship was heading. It was heading for certain destruction. It was heading to where two seas met. You know, I've only been to one place where two seas met. I was out in California - Beautiful city called Carmel, on the ocean there. There was a bay there, and I saw those two seas as they come in, as they met there. I saw tree limbs, I saw debris, where those two seas met there. I could see the churning there and I could not imagine a violent storm, what that would be like.

But one thing I remember, going back up the coast where those two seas met. I saw a sign there. It was kind of like a danger sign and it says, "The point of no return". So if you sailed past that point of no return, you were heading directly toward that place where two seas met. And I believe that this is where our church is today. We are past the point of no return. We're heading to this place where two huge forces are meeting; the force of sin - the force of Satan, and the force of God. We might call that the tribulation times. But we're past that point of no return. I don't think we can go back, we as a nation, we cannot go back to the times that we once enjoyed. Many people call it the good ol' days in which, in every community there was a church. That church was the center point of everybody's lives. We go across the prairies, and many times we see that old church out there - abandoned! Well, now we only see, probably less than 25% of our nation going to church. We're past that point. I believe we can't return back without intervention from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I believe that our faith, I believe our ship is heading directly to that point where those two seas meet, where there is going to be a lot of violence some day. We have to have our faith in

Jesus. One nice thing about this story that we read, not a soul lost their life.

This ship called Christianity may break up. We know that the government, out there, we know how much they are trying to do to try to break up Christianity. We see Hollywood. We see a lot of things out there that are trying to break up our ship of faith. It's only going to get worse. We've seen it over the last 10, 15, 20, 30 years. We've seen how much the ship of faith called Christianity has broken up. Probably, us that are older, could see things start to take shape back in the 1970s. Late '60s, early '70s - Vietnam war - we think of the time that drug use became prominent. People started questioning. I believe that was probably the point we crossed that point of no return.

There are still a lot of Christians today. There is going to be a great war raged. Our ship will probably break up more and more as time

goes on. But let's grab a hold of that bark. Let's grab a hold of that piece of wood. What is that piece of wood? We think of the piece of wood that Jesus Christ died on. That old tree. The cross. Let's grab a hold of that cross. It will take us to that yonder shore. It will take us to heaven above. It will take us there where we can live in joy and happiness, where Satan will not be forever and ever.

Just closing here... you know if we would read in the next scripture, next chapter in the scripture here, we'd read about how Paul and all those people came to the island. (Acts 28:1) They were cold. They were dripping wet. The wind was probably still blowing. They were shivering. They built a fire. (Acts 28:2) Paul reached in there, probably with a piece of wood, into that fire. There was a venomous snake there, a serpent, that jumped out and bit Paul on the hand there. (Acts 28:3) Everybody thought that Paul was going to drop over dead there. They thought his life is over with. There's no way he can live. But that snake did not have any harm. (Acts 28:5) Paul lived. The venom of that snake had no power.

When we reach that shore some day, when we reach yonder shore called heaven, where will that venomous snake called Satan, called the devil be? He will be cast into that hole there, and the bottomless pit. His venom will not have any more power. He will have no more power over us. His bite, his venom will be useless. He cannot cause any more harm.

What greater reason would there be than to cling to the cross? To look at Jesus Christ, the center of our lives, today, so that we can be in such a glorious place someday in which Satan will not be there to harm us, to take from us our lives. Heaven above. What a beautiful place that shall be. A place that we should all strive for. We all look forward, each and every one of us, to being there someday!

In 1878 our brethren sent a statement of their beliefs to the German government. The following continues from the last issue.

Concerning the suffering, dying and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ: We believe and teach according to the all wise council and will of God. It was God's will that Jesus Christ should suffer and die, and through His death should bring eternal redemption for all nations on earth if they believe on Him

In that same night before He was betrayed and sat at the table with His disciples, He had the last supper, the Holy Communion with bread and wine, and did institute the New Testament. Then afterward through shedding His blood on the cross and through His victorious resurrection, He sealed the Eternal Truth.

We read in the Holy Scriptures that Jesus was accused by the high priests and scribes as a deceiver and evil worker, and they condemned him to death. He had to suffer on the cross under Pontius Pilate (Luke 23:10, John 18:30).

And after He died, Joseph of Arimathaea, who was a counselor and a good man, did not take part with them in their wicked deeds; he begged for the body of Jesus. Also, Nicodemus was there to help place the holy body of Jesus in a new sepulchre (John 19:38-39).

On the third day Jesus rose from the dead, for death could not hold Him. He who had conquered death and the devil, and as the prince of

life, will give life to all who believe on Him. Then, as conqueror over hell, death and the devil, He declared unto His disciples, "To me is given all power in heaven and on earth. Go ye, therefore, and preach the gospel to all nations (Matthew 28:18-20), baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." After the Lord had spoken these words unto them, He was received up into heaven and sat on the right hand of God (Mark 16:19).

Regarding the holy baptism: We believe and teach that baptism is an outer and visible order from Christ Himself to incorporate into the congregation all those who hear and believe and obey the Gospel of Christ. And through faith on the Word of God repent and feel sorry for their sins and then receive forgiveness for their sins through Christ, who came for this purpose to forgive sins and transgressions to all who obey His Word.

Everyone who wishes to be baptized must have a clear conscience so that his former sins do not burden him any more before he is baptized in order to be a believing Christian. Otherwise, baptism would not only be in vain for him, but such a one who does not have a clear conscience would be found guilty before God and would be punished as a hypocrite. Because baptism is not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the

answer of a good conscience toward God (I Peter 3:21). According to the Scripture it is necessary before man is baptized to put off the old man, which is corrupt according to deceitful lust (Ephesians 4:22-24), before he can put on the new man which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.

As Christ said, "Verily, I say unto you, except a man be born again he cannot see the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh and that which is born of the spirit is spirit." And furthermore, Jesus said unto those who were around Him, "Unless ye turn and become like children ye cannot enter the kingdom of heaven."

When man seeks to become innocent as a child he will find that in his past life there are many things which trouble his conscience, and he will find great reasons to repent and mourn and to pray and seek forgiveness for his sins. Then, when he receives peace with God he can make a covenant of a clear conscience in baptism with God. And then, as one who has been redeemed can follow the Lord as a true Christian.

## "The Temple of the Holy Spirit"

The tabernacle was spoken of as a temple. I Samuel 1:9 "Now Eli the priest sat upon a seat by a post of the temple of the Lord." I Kings 6:17 refers to "And the Solomon's temple. house, that is, the temple before it, was forty cubits long." King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon destroyed that temple at the beginning of the 70 year Babylonian captivity, but Ezra was permitted by King Cyrus to rebuild the temple, and was given vessels from Solomon's temple to be placed in the new temple. Ezra 5:15 "And said unto him, Take these vessels, go, carry them into the temple that is in Jerusalem, and let the house of God be builded in his place." There was a temple in Jerusalem when Jesus was on earth, reportedly built by King Herod of the Roman Empire, to get better cooperation from the Jews, who were under the occupation of the Roman army. Jesus was standing near that temple in John 2:19, which reads, "Jesus answered and

said unto them, Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." Jesus considered His body to be a temple. In I Corinthians 3:16 we read, "Know ve not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" This verse teaches us that our bodies are temples of God where the Holy Spirit dwells, hence the human body is sometimes referred to as the Temple of the Holy Spirit. Temples, as mentioned in the Bible, are important and will be until there is a new heaven and a new earth. Revelation 21:22 reads, "And I saw no temple therein, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it."

The Lord Jesus Christ called the temple a house of prayer and He was strict about it. "And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called a house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves." Matthew 21:13.

We presently use our church buildings as temples in which to worship God. We dedicate them to the honor and glory of God. At the very least, it seems to me, we should do the same with our bodies.

It is important that we remember the bodies of believers are temples of God where the Holy Spirit dwells. We may forget and think our bodies belong to us. The Bible teaches otherwise. "What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?" I Corinthians 6:19.

Would it not be good for us to at least try, not to overextend our bodies? Surely it is good to work hard but not to overdo it.

As to what we put into our bodies, spiritually it is all right to eat and drink anything, in moderation, although we do draw the line when it comes to using tobacco. However, I believe God would like for us to be kind to our bodies, in every way. They are temples.
