Nehemiah 8 and St. Matthew 7

Wonderful testament of victory. How that the Israelite people finally got to come back to Jerusalem, rebuild the walls, get ready to rebuild the temple and time to celebrate and look into the law. It is wonderful how God made it so that there were teachers there so that every person could not only hear the law, have a desire to be there, but that they all understood what was said. Let's just pray that we as believers today, when the Word is put in front of us, whether it is in church or whether it is in our own individual homes, in our personal reading or our family reading around the table, that we can seek and have a desire, no matter how long it takes, that we would understand that Word, so we could imbed it, so we can embroider it into our heart.

It is good to be in the Lord's house tonight. I've got a little bit of a burden on my heart. I don't know if you have been watching in the news - and sometimes it would be almost good if we didn't know what's going on out there today. But in the media, in the entertainment industry, there's a movie coming out, it's going to be premier showing tonight while we're sitting here. I think it has been shown in France. It is going to depict terrible things about Jesus Christ. It is going to try to undermine the gospel and the foundation which our faith is built on.

And this is not the first one. I think if we look back into the history of the entertainment industry there, it's been a constant assault on Christianity and on the teachings of God. But now with the power and the leverage of the audio-visual system, the ability to influence a tremendous amount of people at one time, sensitive, young fertile minds that are going to have the potential to see such garbage and such false teachings, it deems our prayers in that we need to be alert. Not that we take an interest in it. But we need to be alert as to what is going on so our prayer would be vigilant. That we could prepare our young people, that they would avoid this type of temptation, this type of evil.

There again, as I reflect back, I think it was back in the eighties, there was different productions come out of,

garbage that came out of Hollywood with different depictions of Jesus Christ and His life and what one person's opinion was. What's really interesting is so many of the productions that are coming out, especially the one right now, is it even admits that this is a fictional account. And yet sometimes innocent minds and people who are unbelievers and those who have never been, had the gospel explained to them, can easily be influenced. So with that in mind, let's look to the Word so we can be strengthened, so our faith can grow. Like it is mentioned earlier in Matthew, where it says, I believe Lord, but help my unbelief (St. Mark 9:24).

We all have little times in our lives where maybe we question things. We've got to be strong. We've got to have our foundation rock solid here today for every believer here so we can grow in the Lord, so we can be prepared for these onslaughts that we are about to face. Yet at the same time we would have passion and love. So this would be an opportunity for us, whether it would be in the work place or you young brothers and sisters in the school system, these topics are going to come up. You've got to be prepared. You've got to purpose in your heart ahead of time and not only be able to talk about these things but that our life would be the real reflection - talk is pretty cheap. But if your life can show that there are changed hearts out there and we as believers are different people, that when someone hates us, we turn the other cheek. When our enemies do those things that are wrong, that we can, in love, pray for that abortionist, we can pray for that person who is dealing drugs, we can pray for that pimp who is out there, who is promoting prostitution. We've got to have that love within that changed heart in Jesus Christ, which I'm confident we do as born again believers.

If we are going to have purpose and we are going to have meaning here in these United States right now, the true church of Jesus Christ, those true people who are converted, now more than ever, our light and our example has to be steadfast. We have to really strive for Christ-like perfection in our life.

Because if we can't show something different, people are going to fall for this false teaching that Jesus is going to talk about in the fifteenth verse here in Matthew seven.

So if there has ever been a time within the work place, brothers and sisters, that we've got to be honest, that we've got to show proper priority, that by our association and by our desires, what we strive for is not the things of

Why Should We Be Thankful

The scripture instructs us "In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (I Th. 5:18). We are also reminded in other passages to be thankful: "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him and bless his name" (Ps. 100:4). Many more passages could be cited.

The world is so full of sin, violence, greed, etc. that it would be easy to become cynical and question whether it is possible to give thanks "in everything". Satan is so ruthless and sly that he could convince a child of God that there are few reasons to be thankful. In the sin sick world where we live, we must keep things in perspective. The world is sinful, but God is good. The world is dark but God is light. Many people are wicked, but the Lord promised us "...Though the number of the children of Israel be as the sand of the sea, a remnant shall be saved: For he will finish the work..." (Rom. 9:27-28). The prophet Elijah became so discouraged when he was fleeing from Jezebel that he thought he alone was serving God. "...I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life to take it away ...but God said... yet I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him" (I Ki. 19:14 & 18).

How can we keep from getting discouraged in such distressful times when the world seems to be wicked and violent? We are reminded in a hymn, "When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, When you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, Count your many blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you what the Lord hath done." ("Count Your Blessings", Hymns of Zion #118).

While it is not possible to list all of the reasons to be thankful in one brief article, we can list a few and encourage each one to count our blessings and think upon the things that are good. Perhaps the first reason for us to be thankful is simply that there is one God who is good and full of mercy. "O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever" (Ps. 107:1). In Psalm 136 we are re-

mindful twenty-seven times that the mercy of God endureth for ever.

We can also be thankful for the love of God. "And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love..." (I Jn. 4:16). In fact, He loved us so much that He gave us His Son as a gift: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (Jn. 3:16). The gift of God's Son to mankind included, of course, the shed blood of Jesus Christ which was shed for many for the remission of sins (Mt. 26:28).

How can we ever be thankful enough for the grace He has given us and for the redeeming power of His blood? This allows us to have victory over death and the grave. We were all under the sentence of death. The Lord God said to Adam that "...in the day that thou eatest thereof (of the tree of knowledge) thou shalt surely die" (Gen. 2:17). We are reminded in the New Testament "...the wages of sin is death..." (Ro. 6:23). We can be saved from sin's death sentence if we follow God's plan for us, knowing that "...the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Ro. 6:23). "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit" (Ro. 8:1).

If we suffer from the same fear that Elijah had—that we are alone in serving God—we can be thankful to know there are others who are saved. "But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you" (Ro. 6:17). As a result of our conversion, we have a faith that is encouraging: "...because that your faith groweth exceedingly, and the charity of every one of you all toward each other aboundeth" (II Th. 1:3).

God put us in a land where we can freely worship as we are instructed by His Word. The Bible teaches us how we should live. Although we are not all "ministers" in the formal sense, God has put us in a place where we can share our faith: "And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that he counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry" (I Tim. 1:12).

When we feel discouraged, alone, or far from God, we have many promises that

God is near. "I have set the Lord always before me: because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved" (Ps. 18:8). "The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit" (Ps. 94:18). "That they should seek the Lord, if haply they might feel after him, and find him, though he be not far from every one of us" (Ac. 17:27). Even in times of distress, these promises give us reason to be thankful.

Undoubtedly none of us expect to be as wise as Daniel. We do, however, have the same God to guide us as Daniel had. When we need answers, we have access to God for direction. It may not be revealed to us as quickly as to Daniel, but we can be thankful that we have the "...God of my fathers, who hast given me wisdom and might, and hast made known unto me now what we desired of thee: ..." (Da. 2:23).

The faithfulness of God is everlasting. It has been recognized for generations. At the time of Moses' death, God showed him the promised land and repeated the promise He had made earlier. "...This is the land which I swore unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, saying, I will give it to thy seed..." (Deut. 34:4). David also recognized God's faithfulness when he wrote "I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread" (Ps. 37:25). The everlasting promises of God should make us thankful.

It is not necessary to think very long for one to realize we are a most blessed people and have much to be thankful for. Our helplessness in expressing it fully is well summarized by the author who wrote "Could we with ink the ocean fill, And were the skies of parchment made; Were ev'ry stalk on earth a quill, and ev'ry man a scribe by trade; To write the love of God above would drain the ocean dry; Nor could the scroll contain the whole, Tho' stretched from sky to sky." ("The Love of God", Hymns of Zion #289, verse 3).

The goal of each of us to be thankful is not completely achieved in this life. Those who remain faithful will understand what it means to be thankful when they enter heaven to spend eternity with God.

Opportunities In Small Churches

Much effort has been made in the past to seek ways to help the brethren located in smaller congregations. In the late 1980's efforts were made to address some individual circumstances. The last several years a number of brethren have approached the Mission Committee with various ideas and programs that could assist the small churches.

In August 2004 the Mission Committee formed a Small Church Study Committee (SCSC) and asked them to study the unique needs of small churches and recommend steps by which our Brotherhood can nurture and be of assistance.

The SCSC began the process by undergoing a detailed scriptural study regarding examples in the Scriptures of this type of work. Questionnaires were sent to each of the elder brothers requesting input regarding their perception of the special needs of small congregations.

In depth questionnaires were then distributed to all those who worship in our small churches. Over four hundred surveys were returned. Appreciation is expressed to each one for their time and effort in this matter. This data was used to determine what the needs truly are.

Analysis was done on the results regarding the differences in the small rural and the small urban churches. From this research many possible solutions were explored. There were many good suggestions and these were reviewed with the Mission Committee and with a gathering of retired elders.

From those suggestions the following three recommendations have

been made for first year implementation steps. The first two programs focus on ways small churches can help themselves grow, and the third includes ways those in large churches can assist those in small congregations.

Engage in formal outreach programs locally

The purpose of this outreach is to reach those with connections to our church (local Apostolic alumni) and those with no Apostolic background (community)... to present the Gospel message of salvation based on faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ and a true repentance and conversion. "God our Savior... will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim. 2:4).

An outline containing steps for carefully moving forward with these outreach programs has been developed and is available.

Encourage increased local activities and fellowship opportunities

The purpose of this focus is to strengthen the faith and encourage the sanctification of the believers through added fellowship and concern for one another's welfare. A list has been developed which includes a number of recommendations, many of which are already being utilized effectively within our Brotherhood.

"And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Hebrews 10:24-25)

Formalize church adoption programs

The purpose of this program is to provide assistance to small churches and opportunities for formally identifying brethren to serve. Current missionary opportunities will also be expanded to help meet some of the unique local needs.

- a) Adopting churches or "sending" brethren to smaller churches.
- b) Church function support, focused ministry support, youth fellowship connections and financial support where applicable.

Each of these recommendations have been implemented in isolated instances in the past within our Brotherhood, but it is felt that with a focus in these areas and by informing the Brotherhood of these initiatives, expanded assistance efforts can be developed.

A presentation was made at the 2006 Brotherhood Conference in Goodfield, IL covering the survey results and the first year implementation steps. Additional assistance can be provided to those congregations interested in implementing these steps in the near future.

Much support and input was also received regarding the current minister rotation program. Several suggestions were collected into a document entitled "Recommendations for Minister Rotations" which was approved by the Elder body and distributed to all ministering brothers.

The SCSC consists of Bros. Andrew Klaus, Loren Schrenk, Matthew Rassi, Justin Moser, Frank Sauder, and Elder Bro. Ken Indermuhle who serves as chairman. If you have input regarding these programs please contact one of these brothers.

ACWR Child Sponsorship

May our Lord richly bless the more than 1,200 members and friends of the Apostolic Christian Churches who sponsor children in economically depressed areas of the world. The Lord has touched many hearts to give generously so that these children may attend a school where the gospel is taught and the love of God is demonstrated.

A Haitian student's story

Rosaline woke up early to begin her school day. She lived in a grass thatched home with hard packed dirt floors. It was clean and neat. The only two books her family owned were on a small table beside her parent's bed. These books were cherished. One was a Bible and the other was a Bible Story Book. She lived with her mother and father and two brothers. Her father farmed a small front yard garden that produced some corn and grapefruit for the family.

Rosaline loved school. She walked 1/2 hour up the mountain-side to reach it every school day morning. It was a beautiful area with lush green hills under a brilliant blue sky. At school she not only learned reading, writing, arithmetic, and history; she also learned about Jesus. She and her classmates memorized many passages from the Bible. Her school consisted of one big classroom with several grades in the same room. Each class faced a wall with a blackboard. There were about 30 students per class with 120 students in the room. It got very noisy, especially when they were all reciting their lessons. But oh could they make the rafters

ring when they sang praises to the Lord. Although Rosaline liked her classes, she also liked lunch time. She had classes from 8:30 to 12:30 and before she started for home, all the children were served a lunch of beans and rice.

Rosaline is a sponsored student. Her parents could not afford the tuition for the school or for her uniform, books and school supplies. Sometimes her sponsor sent her a letter and a gift of money. Her parents used the gift to buy shoes for her and her brothers or some chickens. Sometimes there was money left over from tuition to buy food for the family. Rosaline's friend, Pierre, spent gift money from his sponsor to buy goats. From his birthday and Christmas money he bought four goats. The goats would have babies and Pierre would have a fine herd to help provide for his family. Pierre loved his goats. He said if his sponsor ever visited him he would give him a goat!

Rosaline's cousin, Jeanne, lives in a small village close to the ocean. As she sits in her school room she can hear the ocean waves surging on the beach. During the night she appreciates God's creation as she gazes at the billions of stars that cover the sky. Since she has graduated from primary school, she now attends a sewing class. She hopes she will be able to make a small amount of money with the skill she is acquiring. She is thankful for the opportunity made possible by her sponsor.

Most of the children in Haiti could not afford to attend school if it were not for the faithful giving of their sponsors. They are taught to thank the Lord for touching the hearts of their sponsors.

Please prayerfully consider sponsoring a child. A sponsorship provides tuition to attend a Christian School, school uniforms, books, supplies and in some cases money left to go to the student's family. Sponsors will receive periodic pictures and letters from their student, and sponsors are encouraged to write to their students. Prayer for the children is vital.

We are truly thankful for the blessings God has provided over the years and for the opportunities we have had to give our best to help others achieve their best.

GATEWAY WOODS APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN CHILDREN'S HOME Jan Baumgartner

As we renamed our three residential homes here at Gateway Woods to Maple, Oak, and Hickory, over the last few months it made me reflect on a verse we use in fos-

ter care which is "For there is hope of a tree, if it be cut down, that it will sprout again, and that the tender branch thereof will not cease." Job 14:7. This verse has real meaning to us as we see children's lives cut down to the core when their family is broken up due to the abuse and neglect that often comes from unstable living conditions, alcoholism, drug abuse, sexual abuse or a variety of other problems or combinations of these problems. However, with a stable loving Christian home we have seen children's hope revive, and gradually we have seen them begin to trust and sprout and grow in many areas including physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

I also reflected recently on our adoption program of grafting children into a family with a real example in this illustration from the book, *Loved by Choice*. An adoptive parent grew up in an orchard and knew all about tree grafting. He brought home three tender buds, each from a different kind of apple with each tender slip representing each of his three adopted children. He made the proper cuts into the bark of the trunk and set a tiny branch into each slit. Then he tightly wrapped each branch to the trunk until a union of living cells formed between them. The branches drew water and nutrients from the tree's roots. One spring the family apple tree burst forth with blossoms and each branch had different colored blossoms. His eldest daughter's was dark pink, while his son's branch was creamy white and his baby's branch had dewy pink blossoms. In the fall each branch produced a dif-

ferent variety of apple. The branches were nourished from the same tree's roots, but they each carried within the beauty and flavor from which they came. There's a saying that blood is thicker than water, but this shows what makes up a real family — unconditional love and acceptance make the difference.

NEWS

Residential:

We are thankful for each resident that God brings to Gateway Woods. Please continue to pray that God will use us to plant seeds in each child's heart so that they can come to know Him as their Lord and Savior. The Oak House is completely full now with 4 girls and their 4 babies. Please pray specifically for the girls that each will be a good mother to their children as they attempt to raise them as single parents.

The Maple House was converted into an all girls house on October 24. Please pray for the 2 boys who were moved to the Hickory House. Please also pray for the Houseparents as they adjust to this new setting.

Adoption/Foster Care:

Our adoption program has been quite busy with 10 inquiries in the last month. We also completed five home studies for domestic adoptions, and with families wanting to adopt from Ethiopia, China, and Guatemala. We have several families matched with a child and one with twin infants internationally who are waiting for their travel dates. Two families are in the process of adopting infants domesti-

cally. The Richisons adopted 2 1/2 year old Gavin from China on September 20, and the Blocks adopted 4 year old Mya from Guatemala on September 18.

We are waiting for our application to be accepted in order for Gateway Woods to be licensed in Illinois. This means that we would be able to work with adoptive families in Illinois towards a domestic or international adoption.

Our foster program has two new placements of foster children. McKinsey who is 7 years old was recently placed with the Plattners, and 2 year old Brandon was placed with the Morgans. Michelle went from our foster home to an independent living program. The Bremers are a new foster family now in the licensing process. We are in need of more foster parents especially since we are losing some of our foster parents as they are adopting their own foster children.

4th House Update:

We are making encouraging progress on the new home called the Cypress House. A huge thanks goes to the volunteer roofers led by Bro. Dave Beard (Toledo) and masons coordinated by Bros. Joe Braker, Mel Baum (Morton). In early-mid December we will need the skills of finish carpenters to install cabinets, doors and trim. We know that there are many brothers in our churches with these abilities who can help. Please call Bro. Bruce Schafer 260 433-6799 or Bro. 
(Sis. Nancy), who graciously reassumed the mantle for the day to serve our needs.



this earth. But they are things that are going to be eternal. By the love and care and compassion we have for our fellow man, our light needs to shine.

I'm sure all through history it has been necessary but we see it right now. It's so, so critical. We wonder a little bit if these United States, some of this, we've all had these thoughts before and I don't want to get redundant, but if we are a Christian nation - and again our definition of Christianity and a Christian can change from group to group, but we know what it means to be a true Christian, a real follower of Christ - brothers and sisters, we cannot let lukewarm, false teachings, false prophets, come in and dilute Christianity as we know it. There are people out there who are struggling. There are people who are going to go to hell if our example is not true, if it is not clear.

We can sit here on Sunday and Wednesday night and say yes, we believe and we believe and we do this. As Christians, we turn the other cheek and we live an example. We are not interested in the world. We don't have worldliness and we have no desire for these things. We can say it but, boy, we've got to walk and let's hold each other accountable. Let's show each other that we love each other. If I do something wrong, show me, tell me that you love me by correcting me. I'll do the same to you. We need to do that to each other where we err.

Sometimes in our family there's no one that can correct us better than our mothers or fathers. Sometimes our wives, between husbands and wives. I know we find that in our family. We really love each other. We are not afraid to correct each other. In the body of Christ, we are a body. We are brothers and sisters. We are a family. Let's make sure we do the same thing so that our light can shine for that world that is struggling.

"Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam *is* in thine own eye?" St. Matthew 7:4. Let's get the junk out of our eyes, loved ones.

"For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened." St. Matthew 7:8. Jesus said it.

It is written here. We read it. Let's believe it.

"Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." St. Matthew 7:21. Maybe is this twenty first verse a little bit of a summary of Christianity? Of lukewarm, false Christianity in America? We don't have to judge. We are commanded that in the first couple of verses. But it should be a warning to us. We will leave the judging up to God. But also we've got to look in our own hearts and make sure that we are pure, that we are on the right track.

So many great teachings here, brothers and sisters. Starts out, first of all it says, "Thou hypocrite..." St. Matthew 7:5. Have we ever in our times been hypocrites? Have we said one thing and done something else? We profess to believe something and yet at the same time, do something different? How easy it is, if we are not alert and if we don't have that indwelling of the Holy Spirit all the time, how just in a moment's time we can do something that is exactly wrong.

I shared with the congregation this before, but I distinctly remember a time when my sons were home, it was on a Wednesday night. It was during the fall harvest and I got home from work late. I wanted to get to Wednesday night church. Got cleaned up and I made the kids have a prayer and I am walking out the door and the phone rings: it is probably somebody broke down. I told my sons, if it is for me, tell them I am not here.

I was thinking, after I went to church and I was sitting off to the side, here I just asked my kids to lie for me. Just got done having them pray and read out of the Word and now I am asking them to lie and deceive somebody? It can happen so easy! They are probably thinking, boy what kind of Dad's that? He's off to church being holy on a Wednesday night. At the same time he's telling us to stay home and take the phone call and tell them he wasn't here when he really was. It happened in a moment's time.

Okay. Knowing that, what can we do? We can teach each other. We confess our faults one to another. You've learned from my mistake. Let's make

sure that none of us do that. In the workplace, maybe tomorrow, someone out here is going to be tempted to say something, kind of like the response that I just did. We probably, if we would poll every person here, we probably all can say, yes, I did that one time or I had something similar to that. Knowing that, brothers and sisters, let's move it up to the next level. Let's apply these scriptures. Let's be knowing. Let's be alert so that doesn't happen to us.

What can we do? First thing, it says don't be a hypocrite. Don't be running around looking in your brother's eye. Take care of your own. Before anyone eyes anyone else, let's ask ourselves, do I have that same characteristic?

Now sometimes someone who is really a good carpenter, they can watch another person drive a nail. They can tell, after he pounds about two nails, if that man's a good carpenter. For someone who's really skilled in a craft, he can spot another skilled craftsman just like that. Let's make sure that others can see in us those things that are pure. Those things that are true. That we can see ourselves to know when we err.

Then Christ goes on and gives us a good message on prayer. When He says - and this should be committed to memory - "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you:" St. Matthew 7:7. We've heard that time and time again. But brothers and sisters, I can attest, and I know there are many of you here that can do the same thing. This passage *is true. God's Word is true! He never fails us.* It might take a little while. But we have, in my life I think of the times that I've experienced this.

As ministers, we are not trained people. We've not been to any divinity college. We've not had a whole semester in The Acts. We've not studied for three months the Book of Corinthians. We're just regular, every day, normal people. We are farmers and business people and teachers and nursing home administrators. But we've got a real advantage. We have experienced, as all of you have, the conversion. We've felt that peace of forgiveness. We've felt that inrushing glow and joy when we knew our sins were forgiven. When we understood that Christ died for us and

by His resurrection, defeated death and the grave and that we are saved through Him. We've experienced that.

And we have all experienced times when we've had to ask, dear Lord, come in and help. Provide this. Give us guidance. When those prayers have been answered, it strengthens our faith. It doesn't make any difference of how much knowledge we have of all the books in the Bible and where everything is at. Having experienced the Holy Spirit working in our heart and having had our heavenly Father answer prayer, that trumps all the knowledge that the world would love to challenge us with.

So, brothers and sisters, those times when God has answered your prayers, be thankful for them. Build on that. Know that. Understand it. And as we go on to the future, if we are praying for physical restoration of our health, if we are praying for errant children or if we are praying for the evils that are going on out in the world today, God says, you ask. He's going to listen. We're going to knock. He's going to respond to our prayer. It says it. Let's believe it.

Then it goes on to give the parable of a father. You know how we just had Mother's Day and Father's Day is coming up here in June. We know how much our parents love us. Especially once you become a parent. You know how much you love your child or your grandchild. We've got a Father up in heaven that loved us so much that He gave us His Son. When I think of giving my son for some degenerate sinner in downtown Chicago, if I would have to sacrifice my son for somebody else's sin, I'd really have to have a lot of love for fellow mankind for me to give up one of my sons or my grandson. And yet, that's the love, that's the loving Father of the God that we worship. It just touches our heart.

We know that if we ask Him those things, He's not going to send us any junk. He's not going to send us something that is going to hurt us. Sometime we might think it does. Sometimes we can pray for intelligence, wealth or fame or a life of ease here in our earthly walk, but He knows better that, boy I don't think I could handle it if things got too good. We'd become proud and boastful and want to live in luxury and become lustful in our

lives. He knows what's best for us. Let's ask. Let's ask with confidence that He's going to answer our prayer in His way, with His knowledge. He knows what our future is going to be. He knows what we need five years from now. He knows that today. So He'll answer that prayer because He knows the future and how it fits all together.

Then Christ talks about the wide gate. Boy, isn't this the truth! Where it says, "...for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction..." St. Matthew 7:13. You know, it really is easy to follow the way of sin, isn't it? Our fleshly desires, they're vile and they're horrible. It's just our sinful nature. If we just follow the wide way which by our basic human nature, that's where we want to go, don't we? We don't like boundaries and we don't like to be confined. We like to go wherever we want. We don't like someone to tell us that you can go here and go there.

But Christ says, I've got a way prepared. It's pretty small. It's pretty narrow. But it's strait and I've laid out protection for you. I want you to stay in those confines. (St. Matthew 7:14)

I had an interesting experience last summer. Got to go to Alaska and Mount McKinley for three weeks. We're on glaciers, camped every night the whole time. We had a guide that was really good. I shared some of this with some of my friends. This guide was really smart. He'd been to the top of Mount McKinley nine times. Every time he tried to get there, he made it to the top. He knew so much. We were going across these glaciers. Every time we got to a place where we are going to camp, and the glaciers there are half a mile wide and sometimes they are two miles wide and they are eight hundred foot deep. This is a mass of snow and ice that's over time moving down the side of this big old hill.

So we stopped to camp at night. You've got to remember that there's crevasses out there that are eight hundred feet deep. We'd get into an area. We are going to set up our tents. Everybody would be roped up. Nobody could leave the confines of the other people in the group. He would take a big, long probe and he would go around that whole campsite with a big, telescoping

probe and he'd see if there was any air pockets or if maybe we were on a place that was hollow underneath. After that was probed out, he'd go around and take a little piece of bamboo and he'd stick four corners and he'd say, okay men, *nobody leaves* this square. We set up our tent here. If you want to take a picture, you don't leave this square.

I thought, this is kind of bad. Here we've got this beautiful glacier and we are going to be here. I want to walk around and take pictures. I've got some guy who I just met that's telling me I can't walk out of this square. Kind of confined me a little bit. I didn't really like that. While I was on this mountain, I wanted to go look around. But we were confined by someone who was smarter than I was. He had been there nine times. This was my first time. He had known from experience what could happen. Sometimes in history people had fallen through those cracks and those holes and had lost their lives.

I thought a little bit. After about two or three days of this, of course during the day we are walking and being real quiet. I got to thinking about the whole experience of that. I just had a real spiritual revelation that, you know, our faith is a little bit that way. On a big scale with Jesus Christ, God says, I've got a narrow way for you to come. If it's wide, if you were walking around on that glacier, you are going to fall off, you are going to die. In a spiritual sense, if we go out in the wide world that is easy, we are going to go to hell. We are going to die. It's going to be a lot worse death than falling in a hole on a glacier.

On a narrower sense, we've got an Apostolic faith that over time, we have learned that there are certain boundaries that have been good to protect us. In Hebrews 13 it talks about people who are put in spiritual authority over us. Those who have gone before and understood the dangers that are out there in the glacier or the world. So they've had to put four stakes in. We don't like those boundaries, do we? Right at first, I didn't like that guide that put those boundaries in. On the other hand, I don't want to go out and fall in an eight hundred foot hole. I want to go with a guide that is going to

mark out the boundaries that are going to be safe. I want to be in a church that's not going to let me fall in an eight hundred foot hole. We don't want to lose any brothers or any sisters. We don't want that wide way, that we are going to lose people one way or the other. Probably took me thirty some years of being converted and sitting on that mountain thinking about it to realize the importance of, people don't like to really hear about church this and church that and discipline and traditions and things that hold us together. Yet, when I thought about our physical life, falling in that eight hundred foot hole, I wouldn't like that. And spiritually it is a lot more important.

Later on in the week, the guide would rope us up and there were places where we could get close to these big old crevasses and he would hook us up and extend us on down so we could look into those. I looked in there and as far down as I could see, it was blue and black and I never could see the bottom and I thought about how horrible a death that would be to fall down there and freeze to death and they would never find your corpse. And yet, that was *nothing* compared to a soul being lost. Some person, some brother, some sister, some friend falling into a spiritual void because we weren't loving enough and we didn't have a structure enough or we disregarded the structure that was given to us that had been proven over time to protect us and to guide us. Let us thank God for those teachings that we have, realizing there

are times in my spiritual life I probably jumped outside the four bamboo markers and was a little farther out of that safety of the camp than we probably should be. Let's love each other. Let's follow those boundaries. Let's listen to those who have been put in spiritual positions of authority over us.

"Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." St Matthew 7:14. It is not popular today to belong to a church or to be with a body of believers that's constraining. It's not fun. That's going against our human nature. We want to get out there and we want to decide for ourselves. Just like all of us people, all the guys on that trip. We wanted to go out on our own but that didn't work. There was safety within those confines.

Christ talks about false prophets. He said, "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit." St. Matthew 7:15-17. This is our chance, believers, to follow those teachings that are going to bring good fruits in our lives. Those things that, we are the ones - this talks about people who are prophets. We are not to follow those people that have false teachings or that their fruits are not of value. Remember, for every person we are following, somebody is following us! So our fruits have to be those of value, of spiritual value. Those fruits of love and joy and

peace and long-suffering, gentleness, kindness, meekness. We should look. Are we following those things in our lives that are going to bring forth good fruits? Those things that are going to bless us. Those things that are going to help us to do the work of God's kingdom.

We don't like to talk about, but it says here, "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire." St. Matthew 7:19. God wants trees that, Jesus wants trees that are fruitful. It says right here that if we don't bring the fruit, in this example, if you don't bring good fruit, you get hacked down. The parallel is you will get thrown into hell. Thank goodness for the shed blood of Jesus Christ that gives us the ability to overcome by His grace, by His mercy. Yet we are still called. We are saved by His grace, we're saved by His shed blood. Yet we are called to bring forth good fruit. Don't you just love Jesus so much for what He did for us? It is a small price for us to follow, to parallel Him. To do exactly what He says.

It's interesting to watch a young child interact with their parents. I watch it here in church. If you see a dad do something, it is interesting, the little child will come along right behind and do just like their dad has done. I think you've all probably seen it in your own families. Let's make sure that our fruit is beautiful and bountiful for the Lord. That we are following Christ. That we are giving an example to each other, to an unsaved world.

In 1878, our brethren in Germany wrote a statement of faith to present to state authorities. The following installment is a portion of that lengthy document.

In regard to the Second Coming of Christ: we believe and teach that Christ will come again, but not as the first time in servant form and as a servant when He came as a Saviour and Redeemer for fallen mankind.

For it is written: "He came not to be served but to serve and gave His life for the remission of man's sins." The second time He will appear in great power and glory, as a King of all Kings, and a Lord of all Lords, as a Judge who will judge the whole world and reward everyone according to his works and how man lived, be it good or bad.

Because no one else could be found in heaven or on earth who could redeem fallen mankind and free them from the power of Satan and his dominion except Jesus Christ. Therefore, has God given unto Him all power to pass judgment on the Day of Judgment. When He will come the second time then all men must appear before Him, before His Judgment Seat. He is the righteous judge, and will then lead all His own to everlasting rest which is promised

to the people of God. And the godless He will deliver, with the power of His Word, into everlasting damnation. *Matthew 25:46*

Regarding the resurrection of the dead and eternal judgment we believe: We believe and teach according to the Scriptures, as it is written in Daniel 12:2, many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life and some to shame and everlasting contempt. *John 5:27*

The Church of God and the fellowship of the saints: We believe and confess that there is one Church of God, which Christ purchased with His own blood and did wash and cleanse from sins with His blood.

He did offer Himself for her that He might sanctify and purify her through the washing of water by the word and present to Himself a glorious Church, not having spot or wrinkle, but that it should be holy and without blemish, *Hebrews 5:26-27*. Which Church, we believe, consists of people here on earth who through faith in Jesus Christ and obedience to the Holy Gospel went out from the world and her sins, have denied and humbled themselves, and live in fellowship with God, and His Son, Jesus Christ, their head and Saviour, and all those souls who be-

lieve, even if they are scattered in different parts of the earth.

These are all members of the body of Christ, and He as their head does reign and lead them. He purchased them from the world, led them out of the world, and they are His own people. They have obeyed the Gospel call: *2 Corinthians 6:17-18 and Revelation 18:4*.

Regarding God's people here on earth, no record can be delivered what is the exact number of how many there are because God alone knows how many there are who will stay true and endure until the end — and how many will keep the faith and love their Saviour. But their names are written in the Book of Life in heaven. *Luke 10:20 and Revelations 13:8*. This church on earth is the one of which Christ said, "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you." *John 15:16-17*. "Therefore ye will be hated by the world, for if you were of the world the world would love its own."

“Silver and Gold Are Cold”

The thought has often occurred to me that silver and gold are cold. By that I mean that money alone does not satisfy human beings. The idea that I would be very happy if I had a million dollars probably is not true. We need food, clothing and shelter but beyond that, what we need most of all is peace with God and our fellow human beings, and the love of God and the love of those around us.

Silver and gold is mentioned in I Peter 1:18, “Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold.” Money cannot buy salvation, neither can it buy love. Those things are not for sale.

We human beings are at our best when we are with others who give us a warm greeting and let us know by the way they treat us and talk with us, that they love us and respect us, even when we don’t deserve it.

In Acts 3:6, Peter said, “Silver and gold have I none; but

such as I have give I thee.” The lame man was healed and for the first time, he could walk. That was much better than receiving an offering. Can you walk? If you can then that is much better than if you had much money. Maybe you have both, which is all right, but let’s not put too much emphasis on the money. Let’s be thankful we can walk.

The Apostle Paul was very well educated and I suppose he could have had much silver and gold but in Acts 20:33 we find, “I have coveted no man’s silver, or gold, or apparel.” If we can’t pay our bills, I think we all would wish we had more. However, the word “covet” especially refers to a desire for something that belongs to someone else. Wishing we had enough to pay our normal bills required for a decent living is hardly coveting. I notice that the Apostle Paul added “apparel” to the list of things he did not covet. As a tent maker he probably did not always come

up to the standard of being well dressed, but if he could be clean and neat, he was satisfied.

“And Abram was very rich in cattle, in silver, and in gold.” Genesis 13:2. Abram can be and often is, cited as a man of God who had much wealth, which can be considered a blessing of God for his faithfulness. We need those kind of people to build our churches and provide funds for all the activities in sharing God’s Word and in helping those in need. Nevertheless, in the New Testament, Jesus was not rich, and His disciples were not rich, but they were content, and they were blessed of the heavenly Father in different ways. If you are not rich, don’t feel badly. The best things in life, salvation, peace and love, you can’t buy.

If you and I suddenly had much silver and gold, I doubt that we would be any happier than we are at the present time. Silver and gold are cold. Let’s be thankful for what we have.
