Sermon by Bro. Paul Schmidgall, Morris, MN St. Luke 1:26-38 and St. Luke 2:1-21

The portion of scripture that we read (St. Luke 1:26-38), had we read the preceding verses in that chapter, we'd have read the account there of Zacharias and Elizabeth and how there was a foretelling of the birth of John the Baptist (v.11-20), the forerunner, the prophet. The one that would set in place the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ. Then as we discontinued our reading, we would have read the account of Mary going to visit Elizabeth (v. 39,40) and how that they could find a common experience where both had had a visitation of an angel. Both had had a foretelling of something that was to happen, something that was to come.

Then the end of that first chapter in St. Luke is the account of the birth of John the Baptist and Zacharias being restored to be able to speak again (v.57-64). We can see, dear ones, as we lead up here, the many great things that God was working and establishing in the hearts of a few chosen people in that day. How He was preparing the way for what we are going to read of here in the second chapter in the Gospel of St. Luke.

As we read together, dear ones, in the fore reading, we read there of an angel Gabriel, who it says, "...was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, To a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary." St. Luke 1:26,27. I often think about Mary as being the one chosen there by God. We can often consider, what was it that God saw in Mary that would give her such a calling, such a service to her God? We can see, dear ones, the character of Mary. It was made known here as the angel greeted her. He said, "...Hail, thou that art highly

favored, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women." St. Luke 1:28.

Then we can read of Mary's response at each point in this thing that was unfolding before her. It had to be fearful. Can any one of us imagine that suddenly, and maybe in a time of quietness in our home, we are all alone and there would be an angel of the Lord standing there and speaking to us? Then the angel would describe to us a purpose and a duty that would seem strange to us and would seem maybe even impossible to us. This angel described to Mary that she was chosen of God, that she was going to have a child. It wouldn't be a normal child but it would be a child that would be conceived of the Holy Ghost. (St. Luke 1:31-35)

In that time, dear ones, the understanding of that Holy Ghost would have been different than our understanding today. Those that can experience that comforter that was sent to those first Apostles after the departure of our Lord and Savior, we know He promised it, that He would send a comforter in the form of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8). Then we can read of the working of that Spirit in that early church, those Apostles in the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1-5). We can read of the many times when that Spirit worked in God's people. We today, dear ones, we can still experience the moving and the working, the guiding of the Spirit of God. We can understand that there is that Spirit. That it is alive and it works in the hearts of men.

But here would be Mary and He would tell her that this child would be conceived of the Holy Ghost and she would no doubt be very tempted to doubt. No doubt very tempted to tell the angel that maybe you have chosen the wrong person. I can't accomplish this work that you put before me. But Sermon continued on page 44

From the earliest times, mankind has recognized a need for a god. Even in societies that do not believe in the one true God, there often is a need to worship some form of a higher power. Throughout the scripture, the importance of seeking God, the Creator of the universe, has been emphasized. God warned His people of the dangers of serving other gods and of the blessing of seeking the one true God. "But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul" (Deut. 4:29).

King David recognized the need to seek God: "O God, thou art my God; early will I seek thee: my soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh longeth for thee in a dry and thirsty land, where his water is" (Ps. 63:1). Isaiah also realized the importance of not losing the opportunity to seek God. "Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near" (Is. 55:6). Many more passages in the Old Testament could be cited that encourage seeking the Lord.

To seek means to go in search of, to look for by going from place to place. To seek implies that there needs to be diligence, not simply a casual effort. Searching for, and finding God, needs to be a priority in our lives.

In addition to seeking God the Father, and recognizing God's promise of a Savior, many men have understood the need to find this promised Messias. The Wise Men we read about in the Gospel of Matthew were given enough understanding about the events surrounding the birth of Christ that they wanted to find him.

"Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him ...Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men,...sent them to

Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also... and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, ...stood over where the young child was ...And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child... and fell down, and worshipped him ..."(Mt. 2:1-11).

The story of the search for the child Jesus by the wise men is very familiar to those who know the account of the birth of the Savior. Perhaps the significant part of the story of the wise men is that they were willing to go to great lengths to find Jesus. While we do not know for sure how long they were looking for Jesus, we do know they spent a considerable amount of time and effort to find Him.

Most likely, about two years passed from the time the wise men first saw the star in the east until Herod knew they had no intention of coming back to tell him they had found Jesus. The interval of time was no doubt the basis for Herod's decision to kill all from two years old and under (Mt. 2:16). It also appears that most of those two years ware spent by the wise men searching for Jesus. There was very little time between Herod's request that they tell him when they found Jesus and when he realized they were not coming back. Joseph was told to "...Arise, and take the young child and his mother and flee into Egypt ... " (Mt. 2:13) to save Jesus' life. Joseph knew he did not have much time to go.

What message is in this account that we can use? The wise men saw His star because they were searching for Someone. Are we looking for the light of Jesus Christ? Are we willing to search diligently for Him?


Apparently, the wise men put aside all of their earthly pursuits to focus on this important task. We also need to be willing to make the most important task in our lives that of finding Jesus Christ. If finding and serving God and our Savior is not our most important goal in life, we place ourselves in great danger. The promise of salvation for all of eternity and the help we have with the problems in this life if we seek and find the Savior, are precious almost beyond description. The blessings of finding the Savior are worth all the efforts that we could expend in finding Him. There is no greater goal and no greater joy than to seek and find our Lord.

When men lose sight of God and the importance of serving Him, they not only refuse to seek God but they hide from him. After falling into sin, "...Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God amongst the trees of the garden". When found, Adam said "...I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself" (Gen. 3:8,10).

The time will come when the wrath of God will be visited upon the earth and the wicked will try to hide from God. They will say "...to the mountains and rocks, Fall on us, and hide us from the face of him that sitteth on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb:" (Rev. 6:16).

Trying to hide from God is futile. No man will be successful in doing so. David wrote "O God, thou knowest my foolishness; and my sins are not hid from thee" (Ps. 69:6). Jesus said "...for there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; and hid, that shall not be known" (Mt. 10:26). Moses warned the children of Israel "...be sure your sin will find you out" (Nu. 32:23).

We have many choices to make. We can choose to try to serve self and to hide from God. If we make that choice we will suffer through all eternity. However, if we seek the Lord, and do His will, our sins can be forgiven. If we allow ourselves to be cleansed by the blood of Jesus Christ, we "...shall be whiter than snow" (Ps. 51:7). Wise men still seek the Lord.

Prison Ministry

Atthew 25:36 says, "I was in prison and you came unto me." There are many dear ones from Apostolic Christian congregations in several different states serving in prison ministry. Prison ministry provides an opportunity for those in prisons and jails to hear the pure Word of God spoken in truth. Those souls that get out of prison then have the opportunity to use the Word of God effectively in their lives and the lives of their families. The ministry provides an opportunity for our church brethren to share Jesus Christ with those who have great needs and whose only hope is God.

Berean Prison Ministry is located in Peoria, Illinois and is supported almost entirely by the Apostolic Christian Church. The Ministry is involved in five different programs to help those in need:

- 1) Bible Distribution &
- Bible Study
- 2) Chaplaincy Program
- 3) Romanian Program
- 4) Russian Program
- 5) Material Aid

Bible distribution

More than two thousand Bibles are requested monthly and shipped to jails and prisons in 45 different states. The inmate's name and prison identification is entered into a computer. A prisoner is shipped only one Bible. The Bible can be the biggest treasure in a prison inmate's "stash." In every Bible there is a letter to that inmate. The letter explains the opportunity to complete and return Bible study lesson #1 to Berean Prison Ministry. When Bible study #1 is returned by the inmate, the study is graded by our brethren and friends. Some volunteers who do the grading are in our retirement homes, young groups, and sewing groups. The graded Bible study is then sent back to the inmate along with three additional Bible studies. Berean Prison Ministry grades approximately 70,000 Bible studies every year. Thanks for your prayers for the volunteers who give of their time to grade Bible Studies and for the financial support of our church for the Bibles and postage.

Chaplaincy program

By God's grace the Berean Prison Ministry holds the Chaplaincy for the Peoria County Jail, Juvenile Detention Center, Youth Farm, Stark County Jail, Tazewell County Jail, State of Illinois Sheridan Prison (Sheridan, Illinois) and will be starting at the Statesville Prison the end of this year.

Berean Prison Ministry holds regular Bible studies at the State of Illinois Dwight prison and Logan women's prison in Lincoln, IL. Berean Prison Ministry also helps in the State of Indiana prisons, Porter County Jail (Valparaiso, Indiana) and the Hendry County Jail (Labelle, Florida). Your prayers are appreciated for the Lords blessings on the servants who go into the prisons and jails, and that the Holy Spirit is in charge of every part of the ministry.

Romanian program

The Romanian Program was blessed this year with the General Director of all the prisons in the country agreeing to let Berean Prison Ministry have access to the entire country's prisons. Brother Ken Hoerr and Brother Fedi Davidovic traveled to Romania and met with several officials. At the very end of the trip they met the General Director who then agreed to let Berean Prison Ministry in their prisons. With increased opportunity and activity in this country, the associated costs are rising. We recently shipped 600 bed sheets for the prisoners. We supply Bibles, postage and supplies for those going into the prisons. We thank God for your support to our Mission Fund and your prayers.

Russian program

Brothers Hod Getz and Tim Reinhart traveled to Russia and met with the Russians involved in the Bible and Bible Study Course program in Russia. The country of Russia has gotten more rigid with who is able to have access to their prisons. The Russians now require that the persons going into their prisons be of Russian citizenship. Brothers Hod and Tim met with some Russian Christians with citizenship and they have agreed to go into the prisons to deliver Bibles. The Russians have visited our churches in Sarasota, Athens, Fort Myers, and Peoria. The Russians are good friends. We give all praise to God.

Material aid

Berean Prison Ministry provides food, clothes, medicine and bicycles to those in need. The Berean Prison Ministry ships clothes to Mexico and Africa and coats to Russia.

The Berean Prison Ministry has Sunday evening services at the Peoria Southside Mission for women eight times per year. The Peoria Rescue Mission for men has Sunday morning services the 1st, 2nd, 5th Sunday of every month, and evening service for the men's Rescue Mission six times per year. May God's blessings continue to rest upon this important work.

Medical Ministry in Juarez, Mexico

Prayer, flexibility, smiles, 6000 health kits, 3000 school kits, 2500 Bible story kits, 400 layettes, 200 comforters, 1500 Bibles, 7 pallets of rice pilaf, 20 boxes of medicine, 20 barrels of misc items, 4600 Mexicans, 46 Americans.

What do all these have in common? These are the resources necessary to complete a Medical Dental Team in Juarez, Mexico. Let's take a closer look at a day on a medical/dental team.

Our morning begins with devotions and singing Spanish hymns. Then we load up our vans to head to the worksite. We quickly realize that we are no longer in the USA when we drive on the bumpy dirt roads, and pass stucco and cardboard homes, many without indoor plumbing or running water. Our vans stop in the middle of a street where we see our trailer loaded with supplies. The blocked off street will be our clinic for the day.

Our busy day begins as we put steel poles and tarps together to make tents for doctors' offices, a pharmacy, dental area, and health maintenance. The truck is unloaded by forming a chain to get the kits & food to the right area. Approximately 30 - 45 minutes later, our clinic is ready to go.

Registration begins as the waiting patients are given a medical card for documentation of vital signs, prescriptions, and most important to be able to get the health kits and food. Next stop is for vital signs (blood pressure, pulse check) and then on to see the physician. Once the patient has a diagnosis and prescription, he heads to the pharmacy to get his medicine. The last stop is the health maintenance tent. This is a favorite stop for everyone as the goods made back home are distributed.

Many smiles and "mucho gracias" are shared as the Mexican receives a health kit, lotion, farm cap, comforters, toys, and food. Seeing all those supplies in the hands of the Mexicans made each of us on the team think about our brothers and sisters back in the US who did the sewing, filled bags, worked in the warehouse, and contributed financially.

In another area of the street, the dental clinic is very busy. There is a long line of children waiting patiently for their turn. Our young team members hand them a toothbrush with toothpaste and then show them how to brush their teeth. It doesn't take long for the Americans to learn a few Spanish phrases: "Limpian todos tus dientes muy bien" (Brush all of your teeth very well) and "Laven tu boca con agua y escupes la aquí" (Rinse your mouth with water and spit it out).

Many times after using the toothbrush, the Mexican children hand it back as they don't realize they get to keep it. All children are sent home with a health and school kit. In a typical day, 500 Mexican children will learn how to brush their teeth. In addition, thirty adults receive dental cleaning.

Music fills another corner of the street as we hear, "Si, Cristo me ama" (Yes, Jesus loves me) being sung by the children. Minerva, one of the helpers, joyfully and diligently all day long uses flannel graph to teach the children Bible stories and sing with them. The children enjoy receiving their own Bible Story book, coloring book, and crayons. More excitement is seen when the children receive a new t-shirt with "Cristo me ama" on it.

By late afternoon approximately 1,000 Mexicans have visited the clinic and we have exhausted our daily supply of medicine, health kits, and food. It is time to take the tents down and head back to the hotel to get a meal and good night rest so we can start over the next day at another site. During the course of the week, we usually see 5,000 adults and children for medical and dental care. More importantly, each individual receives a Bible and has the opportunity to learn about salvation through Jesus Christ.

The medical/dental team trip to Juarez, Mexico was a blessing to all of us in so many ways. The opportunity to serve our Mexican neighbors brought joy to our hearts. The body of Christ was evident. Although we could only help the Mexican people materially in a very small way, the love of Christ and Gospel were truly shared.

Each team member played an important role, whether it be dispensing medications, taking vital signs, cleaning teeth, teaching Bible school, distributing health maintenance items, delivering much needed water to the workers, teaching tooth brushing or examining and treating patients. We all reaped the blessings of serving others!

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN COUNSELING AND FAMILY SERVICES

In 2005, the Elder Body established a committee to review the counseling needs within the church. This committee brought a proposal to the Elder Body on how to design a counseling service "from the ground up" that would better utilize the available resources and merge Apostolic Christian Counseling Services and Gateway Woods Family Services into one organization. After much prayer, preparation, and consultation, the Elder Body approved that proposal at the August, 2005 Conference and the new Board of Directors began their official terms of service. On October 20, 2006 the new board officially assumed operational oversight of the new organization and began to operate under the new name: Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services (ACCFS).

The new ACCFS Directors are Elder Brothers Tom Hoffman (Roanoke), Bruce Hohulin (Goodfield), Charles Sauder (Tremont), and Jon Schmidgall (Oakville); and Brothers Irvin Furrer (Wolcott), Neil Gerber (Washington, serves as the President), Bob Pflederer (Morton), Jeff Schumacher (Leo), and Dennis Virkler (Congerville, serves as the Secretary-Treasurer).

The clinical staff consists of Elder Bro. Ron Messner (Washington), Bro. Craig Stickling (Peoria), Sis. Erica Stoller (Morton), and Bro. Ted Witzig, Jr. (Morton). Sis. Mickey Schumm (Washington) serves as the Office Manager. Bro. Ron Heiniger (Bloomington) was recently added to the staff as Program Director, focused on developing a curriculum to train lay counselors. Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services currently provides the following:

- Christ-centered counseling for depression, anxiety, relationship problems, etc.
- Telephone consultations with a counselor
- Information about mental health issues and relationship problems
- Referrals to qualified counseling and family services in your area
- Referrals to specialized services
- Apostolic Christian Way of Purity
- Information and presentations on Biblical financial stewardship
- Materials and presentations on other specific topics
- Mentoring for students in mental health-related fields



yet we can read, in the thirty-fourth verse, Mary had a moment of doubt there. She said to the angel, "...How shall this be, seeing I know not a man?" Then the angel described it. "...The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God." St. Luke 1:35.

It went on and spoke there of Elizabeth and then the angel concluded. He said, "For with God nothing shall be impossible." St. Luke 1:37. Here is where Mary reveals the character and the depth of her faith and the willingness that she has to be of service to God. She says, "...Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word..." St. Luke 1:38. She committed herself to whatever it would be that God had in store for her.

As we read further on, we can read that when these great things, these miracles happened, the meeting there with Elizabeth (St. Luke 1:41,42), the visitation of shepherds (St. Luke 2:15,16) and of men from a far country (St. Matthew 2:1), it says that when Mary beheld these things, that she kept these things and that she pondered them in her heart (St. Luke 2:19).

So let's consider, dear ones, how this could apply to us today. How is it when we have the Word of God presented to us? For many of us, it probably won't be an angel appearing, giving us instruction. For we have so many ways, dear ones, that God can speak to us. We have this Bible. Mary was not given the benefit of a book bound, easily to place in her hands. We are also able to come to church. We could say that we are certainly afforded a privilege that at any time the doors of the church are open, there would be nothing other than our own priorities and our own desires other than church to be gathered there and to be taught and to learn of God's will.

And we have that Holy Spirit. That still small voice that, if we are humble, if we're vielded, if we are praying for God's will, it will speak to us. If we haven't experienced it, it is hard to describe, it's hard to explain. Sometimes that Spirit will speak to us and just the thought of our mind, if we're maybe considering something that we are going to get involved in, maybe we just consider, dear ones, the involvement and the Spirit that it will be done in and we can feel that this isn't what God would want us to do. We can know that He has spoken to us. We've heard the Spirit described as a conscience that speaks before we fall or fail. It really is that. It can lead us.

So we have many ways, dear ones. Mary had the angel Gabriel. We have many ways today that God speaks to us. Are we giving God the opportunity? Are we taking the Word of God and in quietness reading and considering, pondering what it might be that the scripture would teach? Are we praying that God would reveal Himself to us and that we would know if we are doing the will of God? Just those two things, dear ones, give God the opportunity.

But we know that in society, in the world and in the lives of so many today that those things would not be a priority. In fact, the world about us would be so filled with noise and confusion, with things that are against God and against the Spirit, that would be so able to fill the mind of one that allowed those things to just continue to be in their mind throughout the day every day. Isn't it true that no matter where we go in and out, whether it be places of business, places of work, probably in and out of homes, isn't it true that the music of the world today, which would take a very short time of studying the message and the words in the music, to recognize that it is very contrary to this Word of God, to the will of God. But yet we can recognize that it surrounds people and it fills their mind. So might it be, dear ones, as we consider the season, as we consider the Lord and Savior that came here to earth, we also need to consider our heart, our life and ask ourselves, are we allowing the Lord to speak to us. to instruct us? If we are and we can acknowledge that maybe our actions, our thoughts, our attitudes are contrary to what it is that God has spoken, to what God has told us, we can consider the example of Mary. Who so willing was able to say, "...be it unto me according to thy word ... " St. Luke 1:38. And to cast herself with faith into whatever it was that God had for her.

Would the plan of salvation been able to fulfill itself if Marv would have looked at that and said, no it is not for me? I might be looked upon as a little strange if I go through with this. And we know that was the case because we can read in St. Matthew that her espoused husband, she was engaged to Joseph, when he found and discovered that she was with child, he wanted to put her aside. It said he "...was minded to put her away privily." St. Matthew 1:19. He wanted to quietly break off the engagement. So we know that she, in accepting the will of God, was going to be looked upon as different and strange in the eyes of the people in that day.

And probably throughout the life of Christ - and the Word doesn't elaborate on this but we know -

that those, even the Lord Himself said that a prophet, Him being the prophet, was not accepted in His own country and among His own brethren (St. Luke 4:24). So we know that He was afflicted throughout His entire life by those that said He had some strange thing. It probably, dear ones, continued from the very time that it was viewed by those around as an illegitimate birth. But yet Mary had faith to believe that it was of God. She was told that it would be of the Holy Ghost. She could say, be it unto me according to Thy Word.

Then we read, and we know the story so well, of the going there to the city of Bethlehem. How it was a time of travel, a time of a government dictating that many should go back to the place of their fathers. (St. Luke 2:1-5) The significance, dear ones, of our Lord and our Savior, the one that was called and chosen of God - and we know that the Lord was there. The Word tells us that He always was. He was from the beginning. So He was there with God the Father. He was in heaven. He was in glory. He was called of God. He was asked to be the Savior of mankind. But in order to do that, there was a humbling and a humiliation and a lowliness that was required.

Sound familiar today dear ones, to the life of a true believer? One that has their eyes fixed upon an eternal glory? There's a humbling, isn't there? There's a time of taking our place in a lowly estate and a waiting for the Lord to lift us up. But the Savior was born in a most humble place. He was born in a stable in a manger. But yet, we dear ones, we can recognize that the faith of Mary and Joseph and for all that wanted to believe, really, in that day, was lifted up by the announcing and the confirmation. We had shepherds that heard of the great birth and that message that came to them from the angels. (St. Luke 2:7-14).

We can see another example of a simple faith there even in those shepherds. When they beheld a thing that would be very strange to them and they went off. It says they didn't doubt and they didn't hesitate for a second - but they left their flocks and they went (St. Luke 2:15,16). Just like we, dear ones, when we are called of God, just like we need to go without a moment's hesitation. If we are convicted in our heart that we are separated from God by the sin of life, we should not hesitate any longer than these shepherds in going to our God. Falling upon our knees and asking that God forgive us. That we be restored. That we can in humility and in repentance seek that peace of God. That peace that was wished by those angels to mankind. When they announced to the shepherds, they said, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." St. Luke 2:14.

That's not the peace, dear oneswe can read that and we can say well, the angels were announcing that once Christ came that everybody was going to get along. Yet Christ, in His ministry, He spoke a little more on that and elaborated and made it more clear when He said, I come not to bring peace but rather division (St. Luke 12:51). He was speaking of the division of right from wrong, of good from evil. He even foretold that there would be separations within families.

So what is the peace here that these angels are proclaiming? They are giving glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, good will toward men. Isn't that the peace that comes from being restored? Born again and given a new heart? One that is free of guilt and sin and condemnation. That is the peace that the angels foretold of. And this small child that was born, that those proclaimed to be the Savior of the world, was coming to establish a kingdom on earth. That really confused those that studied the old law. They were looking for one that would come with earthly power and cast off the rule of the day, the Romans and those put in power by the Roman rulers. They were looking for one to ease the burden, physically, of an oppressive government.

For many of them, dear ones, for many of them that seemed to be the most in tune, the most well read of the old law - and the word that Moses penned down, and that was inspired by God to Moses - the Lord told us, He said that He came not to condemn the law but to fulfill it. That law, dear ones, those Pharisees, the scribes, the Sadducees, they were so much believing that that law gave them authority and power and self elevation in society that they completely missed the coming of the one who was really the King. The one who was really the Savior. They were looking for that kingdom to establish them in power.

But today dear ones, we know the nature of that kingdom. We know that that kingdom is established and reigns in the heart. That it would be, dear ones, that that kingdom, being established in the heart, that it would be established over all other kingdoms. That it would take priority over any citizenship that we would have to an earthly king, to an earthly ruler or government. That it would be our alliance that our even a word that comes to mind is our servitude our serving of that kingdom. Because it is not a kingdom maybe that we would understand in the land of America where

we proclaim a lot of freedom and democracy. While we have a liberty in Christ, we are free from sin, we dear ones, have a king. We proclaim obedience and submission. In that, Christ can reign. In that, Christ can lead. We are prepared, beloved, for the fulfillment of that kingdom.

Christ spoke, if we read in His parables and His teachings, He spoke over and over and time after time of the kingdom of heaven. He taught us of the nature of that kingdom. He taught us that the kingdom of heaven is like unto a treasure hid in a field (St. Matthew 13:44). Do we think of it as that today, dear ones? Is the Word of God and that we have salvation, is that as a treasure to us? That's what Christ told us. He taught us that when we would discover that treasure, that we would go and sell all and buy the field that contains that treasure. That's the priority. That's the elevation of that kingdom in our lives and in our hearts. That's the kingdom that was established by the babe in the manger in that lowly birth.

We can think, dear ones, we can contrast this kingdom of the Lord Jesus to any other kingdom that has ever existed on the face of this earth. We can say that those kingdoms have risen and those kingdoms have fallen. Any ruler that has been in those kingdoms has established their power and have been taken out of power. But our Lord Jesus, dear ones, and the kingdom that He came and that He established in the heart of man has reigned throughout all times, since the beginning of His kingdom. It will remain so. It will remain so from our generation until the Lord returns and He gathers together those that have established His kingdom in their heart. He will gather them in that new heaven, that place that we are promised and foretold. There will be a place of eternal happiness and joy. Where all of the cares and the heartaches and the pains that we know in this life will not afflict those servants of the kingdom.

So we can ask ourselves, dear ones, we can consider the day. We can consider the season. We can ask ourselves, the kingdom that was established that we remember on this day, is it influencing my life? Is it working on my heart? Am I a servant, am I a follower, am I a citizen of that kingdom? Am I looking forward to being a partaker of it throughout all eternity?



This series on a booklet, "To The King's Administration of Justice" continues. It is a 1878 statement by our brethren to state officials in Germany. This was later published by Bro. William Stettner, Elgin, Illinois.

We believe and confess to have order, discipline and chastisement in the church, according to the teachings of the Gospel (Matthew 18:15-18). Which purpose is not to destroy or harm, but for edification, so that the impure may be separated from the pure.

Should someone who was once enlightened and had accepted the knowledge of the truth and had been incorporated into the fellowship of the saints, and afterwards either willfully or presumptuously sins toward God, or commits any other sin which leads him unto unfruitful works of darkness which would again separate him from God, after such evil deeds have been revealed and proven and made known to the congregation, such a person cannot be tolerated in the church (Psalm 1:5; I Corinthians 5:13).

Such a one must be excommunicated (Hebrews 6:6) from the church in the presence of all the members, as an example to all — and such an act should create fear for all evil. And, if possible, the one who sinned might be brought to the knowledge of his guilt for his own benefit.

If such a person can humble himself before God and find grace to sorrow and repent for his wrong doing and finds forgiveness, he can again be reinstated into the church, providing his sin was not a sin unto death which would again require the blood of Christ who shed His blood and died only once for the sins of man and cannot die and shed His blood a second time. However, should such a person show no improvements and not find grace to mend his ways, he cannot be taken back into the church.

Concerning the service of the church: We believe the church cannot exist without order and service which Christ ordained among his disciples. Jesus told them that no one should exalt himself over the other (Mark 10:42-42). He who wishes to be the greatest should be servant to all. The Apostles followed this teaching and served faithfully until their death (I Peter 5:2). As we find recorded in I Peter 5:2, "Feed the flock which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly, not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind. Neither as being lords over God's heritage. but being ensamples to the flock. And when the chief shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive the crown of glory that fadeth not away."

Jesus taught His disciples, "Freely ye have received, freely give." (Matthew 10:8). The gift of the Holy Spirit cannot be bought with money, through which the church is taught, instructed and led. Following the words of Jesus and the Apostles, such is being done in our church to this very day. Our ministers do not receive pay for their services.

Our ministers and elders are chosen by the church and should be ensamples to the members in their walk of life, according to the words of the Apostles (I Timothy 3:1-13). They should rule their own house well and have an honest vocation so as not to be an offense to anyone. The elders have the oversight of the church to lead the flock and keep watch with faithful and true hearts with prayer and supplication to God that peace and order may prevail among the members of the church.

They should serve the Lord's Supper, the Holy Communion, as ordained by our Lord and Saviour. And they should perform the holy act of baptism according to Christ's teachings. They must take notice of true and faithful servants who labor with the Word of God when they are to be found; true brothers who are capable to teach others, to be ordained as elders with prayer and the laying on of hands in the Name of the Lord.

We also have the order of deacons who are ordained according to the Word of the Apostles (Acts 6:3), to look after the poor and needy members so that no want shall exist among the members — there should be no beggar in our church. Christ said, "For ye have the poor with you always, and whensoever ye will ye may do them good."

Regarding marriage: We confess and believe that in the church of God there should be an honorable marriage between two free persons. As God in the beginning instituted this in Paradise with Adam and Eve. Christ disapproved of all the misuse of the married state, which in the course of time took place as separation, divorce and turning to another one before the one had died. Christ corrected these evils and taught to bring back as it was at the first beginning.

The Light Of Hope

"God Consciousness" Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, Shioda, Japan

I have come to believe that I do not have enough God consciousness. If I were always aware of the presence of God, that He is by my side and living in my heart, at all times, I would be more careful what I do or say. The problem is, I sometimes think I'm on my own and do not feel so much accountability to God. This is a trick of the devil. "And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light." II Corinthians 11:14.

One of the purposes of prayer is to give us God consciousness. The more we pray the more we realize that we are accountable to God. I Thessalonians 5:17 tells us, "Pray without ceasing." This is not so much that we should be asking God to give us something, or to help us with something, but to praise Him, and to be aware of His presence. In a sense, if we are aware of His presence we are communicating with Him and this is prayer. No wonder we are exhorted to pray without ceasing.

In the Old Testament, much is written about what God said to certain people, especially to those who were in a leadership position. For instance, "Now the Lord said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country." Genesis 12:1. Also, concerning Moses, "God called unto him out of the bush." Exodus 3:4. If we would hear God's voice speaking to us like they did in the Old Testament, we would be very conscious of God's presence. But the New Testament does not have so many instances where the voice of God was heard by His people. The Apostle Paul heard Christ's voice on the way to Damascus and the Apostle John heard Christ's voice telling him to write the book of Revelation, but I have the impression that God is quoted much more in the Old Testament than in the New Testament. That may be because Christ has come to reveal God to us, as well as to die for our sins. Now we are told to walk by faith in Christ, who has fulfilled the Old Testament. Christ helps us to have God consciousness.

The birth of Christ in Bethlehem did not atone for our sins. It was His death on the cross and His resurrection that did that. However, His birth and His ministry gives us God consciousness. Jesus Christ said, "He that hath seen me hath seen the Father." John 14:9. Certainly the Lord Jesus Christ helps us to be aware of God the Father, and He shows us that God's true nature is not for violence, but for love, and joy and peace. All of the violence in the Old Testament must have been to punish ungodly people because Christ has shown us a better way.

In any case, we need to have God consciousness. He is the Creator, He is our Saviour, and He is our Lord. As we celebrate the birth of Christ, may we be aware of God's presence and of our accountability to Him.
