

Sermon by Bro. Bro. Ben Walder, Congerville, IL

Proverbs 31, Galatians 6

Before we read here, one more thought from hymn #203 (Zion's Harp) that we sang here this morning. In verse 6, about part-way through it says, "Help to store in careful keeping What this day we may receive..." Meaning, it seems that the prayer upon our heart would be that somehow we would be able to store up something that we hear today. It seems in our human ways that our mind goes a lot of different directions sometimes. And as we're here looking to the Word of God for encouragement to take us upon our way, take us on the way to heaven as Bro. Rick spoke there, that sometimes it's difficult to store up some of the things that we hear and to remember and to recall. So perhaps each one of us can make an extra effort today to think, "that's a good thing to remember..." that it might come back to us later in the week to help us along the path to heaven that we're all striving for.

Let's just go back to the beginning of this chapter here. There are several different teachings in here as the Apostle Paul finished up this letter which he wrote to the church in Galatia, which perhaps was somewhat troubled, struggling with various issues that Satan brought upon the church.

In the beginning there of Galatians in verse 6, of chapter 1, he says, "I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel." Galatians 1:6. So it seems the brethren there at the church of Galatians started out very well. Perhaps they had a good faith and much willingness within their hearts. But the Apostle Paul marveled at how quickly they could be turned away from that which he had taught them.

So it is today. Satan, he's after us today no different than he was after them back then. Thus, when we read these letters, we have to remember that we in no way are differ-

ent than the people back then, but we need reminded of some of these things also. As you get into the various letters the Apostle Paul wrote, he focused both on doctrine; making sure that they understood the basics of the faith which was so very different than the law that they had been brought up to follow. It was just a different way of life here, and it was touched on in this particular chapter there towards the end. But then also some of the practical ways of life, the attitudes that they should have within their heart. It really was the heart of the law and the way that they should interact together. That's where this chapter starts out here, in the way that there should be some interactions between the brethren there at the church, as he says, "Brethren, if any man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." Galatians 6:1.

So here he is specifically talking to the brethren, and he says, "...If any man..." and perhaps we could substitute man or woman or brother or sister, "be overtaken in a fault" which tells us there that, it's probably going to happen. It's just realistic in real life that as we walk in this flesh and we have a battle between the flesh and the Spirit, that unfortunately sometimes the flesh is going to win. It's unfortunate when it happens, and it's difficult. But every one of us needs to be mindful that it can happen to ourselves. It just seems that sometimes the flesh just has a way of overtaking the Spirit. Perhaps a little further on in this chapter it explains a bit why there when he says, "For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting." Galatians 6:8.

So where we have our focus is what's going to help control our thoughts and help control our bod-

ies and therefore our focus is important. But let's go back to the first verse here. So it's going to happen that from time to time there may be someone that is overtaken in a fault. In this case as he uses the term 'fault' and there are various verses

Prosperity II

In the previous article of "The Light From the Word", a brief review of material wealth was discussed from numerous Old and New Testament scriptures. In this article additional references are cited that encourage a child of God to be careful we are not deceived by material goods. This article will also briefly address true riches - the spiritual riches from God.

First of all, we must keep the desire for material goods in proper perspective. Many references in the Old and New Testament help us to understand the deceitfulness of riches. Solomon warned of the danger that over-emphasis on materialism (greed) could have on the stability of family life. "He that is greedy of gain troubleth his own house; but he that hateth gifts shall live" (Proverbs 15:27). Often we see parents who are so desirous to provide material blessings to their family that they neglect to provide stability and family structure children so desperately need.

He also wrote of the disappointment of too much emphasis on wealth. "He that loveth silver shall not be satisfied with silver; nor he that loveth abundance with increase: this is also vanity" (Ecc. 5:10). If we come to love the things of this world, we will find there is never quite enough material goods to really satisfy us. The foolishness of this was clearly pointed out when Jesus said, "For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?" (Mt. 16:26)

Jesus told of the rich man whose ground was so productive that he couldn't store it all. He pulled down his barns and built barns large enough to hold all of his fruits. He believed he was secure for years. However, God said "...Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee:..." (Lk. 12:20). His trust in material goods caused him much grief.

Paul warned of the spiritual danger of improper emphasis on wealth. "For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows" (I Tim. 6:10). James reinforced this thought: "Your gold and silver is can-

kered; and the rust of them shall be a witness against you, and shall eat your flesh as it were fire. Ye have heaped treasure together for the last days" (Ja. 5:3). Finally, Jesus put it all in perspective for us when He said, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Mt. 6:19-21).

We are instructed to work. "In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread,..." (Gen. 3:19). Paul made it clear that we are to be willing to work, "...if any would not work, neither should he eat" (II Th. 3:11). He was even more emphatic about the need to work to provide for our material needs as he instructed Timothy that "...if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel" (I Tim. 5:8).

From these examples we can see, while some material goods are necessary, if we trust in them we will miss the mark. We, therefore, need to understand what prosperity really means. Jesus explained clearly that materialism was less important than spiritual riches. "if therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?" (Lk. 16:11)

As unconverted people, there were many things about wealth we simply didn't understand. Solomon's statement "There is that maketh himself rich, yet hath nothing" (Pr. 13:7) just didn't make sense. How could anyone who was very poor think of himself as rich, or how could anyone who is wealthy have nothing?

Additional evidence that we did not understand the meaning of true riches was our thoughts about repentance. Perhaps we realize the need to repent and perhaps we had a desire to repent; however, many of us in our unconverted state did not regard repentance as evidence of spiritual riches nor of God's goodness. Paul made it abundantly clear how valuable repentance really is: "Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffer-

ing; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?" (Ro. 2:4)

Not only did we misunderstand the blessings of spiritual riches in our unconverted life, we did not understand the deceitfulness of worldly riches. "But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition" (I Tim. 6:9).

Serving God faithfully and humbly will bring us these true riches. "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Ph. 4:19). By trusting God to supply all our needs, we can grow in grace and favor with God. "And the grace of our Lord was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus" (I Tim. 1:14).

Spiritual riches are more durable than the riches of this life. Solomon, with all his wealth, understood this as he wrote "Riches and honor are with me, yea, durable riches and righteousness" (Prov. 8:18). Sometimes it is hard for mankind to really grasp the value of spiritual riches relative to material good. We can see, feel and use material goods but we can't always understand the value of intangible spiritual riches. Moses understood it well for he esteemed "...the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt:..." (Heb. 11:26).

No doubt for many of us, the older we get, the more clearly we see the value of spiritual riches. David wrote "I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread" (Ps. 37:25). There is no promise that we will always have abundance, but we do know "...God shall supply all your need..." (Phil. 4:19).

As we think of prosperity and the emphasis of accumulating the wealth of this world, let us remember the encouragement we received when Paul put it in perspective for us: "Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ" (Ph. 3:8).

India Missions Report

In 1938, the Rural Gospel and Medical Missions of India was founded by Mr. B.B. Bhagwat and his wife. For over 30 years they shared the gospel with the people of the tribal areas of rural India. They approached the Apostolic Christian Church of America in 1970 about taking the oversight after their demise.

Several trips were made by brothers with an interest in mission work. A seven member board was appointed by the Elder body in 1980 to manage the assets of the Bhagwats after their death and provide spiritual counseling and guidance in the various operations of the mission in India.

The mission consists of several churches, many village prayer halls, two boarding homes, a small hospital and numerous medical clinics. RGMMI also sponsors over 50 girls at an orphanage in the city of Monmad, located about 50 miles from the mission headquarters at Nashik, India.

New school

In 2006 a large English Medium school was constructed. Several members of the board were present for the dedication of this building in November, 2006. A local politician had been a hindrance to the opening of the school since the building's completion. However, classes will begin in June for seven grades of students.

A temporary English school has been conducted in presently outdated facilities for younger children. All classes are taught in English. Each year an additional standard will be added. Eventually over 200 students can be accommodated at the school.

Dr. Parkhe, the mission director, is grateful for the many prayers during this delay. The parents of the local community greatly support this project, as the facility will provide their children with an enhanced educational background and help them become more qualified for further education and jobs upon their graduation.

Special assignment visit

The U.S. Board of Directors sent three young brothers from the Bluffton, Indiana churches to India in November for special assignments. They spent time teaching the vocational students at the mission's two campuses and assessed the possible role of members of our church serving in India in the future.

Possible assistance might be provided in transportation at the new school, outsourcing jobs and installing water purifiers in various locations of outreach projects of RGMMI.

One of the brothers installed a temporary water purification system which produced positive results. Plans are for another trip to India, possibly this fall, to assist in installing additional water purifiers. The brother would also spend time training young people to construct and install purifiers in the future as the need arises. He would also do some instructing for computer students at the vocational training site.

To further inform the brotherhood of the work in India, a DVD is being produced by the young brothers that will include general information of the history of India, the current economic and political situations, and the work of the RGMMI ministry. The goal is to have the DVD completed this fall and made available to the churches.

An additional assignment for two of the brothers was to interact with two young believers of the mission who are in medical school and plan to assist in the work of RGMMI. The medical arm of RGMMI has provided an effective means for making initial entrances into the tribal villages.

The USA Board feels that replacements need to be in place as the present medical team is aging and will soon be retiring. The USA Board is very appreciative of the efforts of these brothers and their willingness to continue to assist in the mission's work.

Small group home for orphans

The concept of developing a small group home for orphans is also being considered by the USA board. An outline of the project has been developed by Loving Shepherd Ministries of Bluffton and will soon be reviewed by the RGMMI administrator. House parents would be employed to supervise the care of six to eight orphans. The location would be near one of the RGMMI campuses and be under the administration of the RGMMI. The project would be an extension of services currently provided by RGMMI.

Future visit

Lord willing, four USA board of directors plan to visit India this fall and assess the ongoing needs of RGMMI. They will also conduct convocations for the RGMMI staff and cover many spiritual topics.

The USA Board appreciates the many prayers and support for the work of RGMMI. Please continue to pray that more opportunities will open for our brethren to assist in this mission.

World Relief

Eastern Europe

The European Committee functions under both the World Relief Board and the Mission Committee. Our purpose is to serve our brethren in Eastern Europe, whose roots of faith are the same as ours.

Material assistance is done through the World Relief Board, and spiritual assistance through the Mission Committee. In some cases, such as vans for transportation of elders and brethren, costs are shared equally.

At the present time our greatest problem is the ongoing weakness of the dollar, which is causing us to lose purchasing power. We have lost over 40% of this in the last six years or so, and it is beginning to hurt. It means we need more dollars to accomplish the same goals, and there is nothing we can do about this world-wide problem. But we work in faith, and so far, God always provides for us.

Conditions in general

With the exception of Hungary, living standards continue to decline in the lands where our brethren live. Governments are still allowing religious freedom, but the economic situation is very hard for the poor to cope with. Our brethren for the most part are very poor, and without our assistance, life would be extremely difficult. Very few have enough income to survive on their own.

Our response to needs

At this time we have many programs in place that are helping the brethren become more self-sufficient. Many of these run through our Antioch Corporation in Romania.

As this is being written, we have purchased 20 chain saws for brethren in Romania, whereby they can

furnish their own fuel for heating as well as earn some income. The cost of these machines will be paid for in firewood by the recipients, thus reducing our costs for heating in Romania. Sufficient wood is available for this.

However, in the former Yugoslavian countries, this is not the case, because the cutting and selling of firewood is largely controlled by the government and the Mafia, whose presence is felt everywhere in Eastern Europe. The brethren cope as best they can, but life continues to be a hard struggle for these dear souls.

Regular visits provide information

Representatives of the European Committee have been making frequent visits into these countries to assess needs. Going from village to village, one is appalled by the poverty in which they live. In Romania and Ukraine, less than 20% have indoor plumbing, and many keep livestock for subsistence.

This year we have nearly 300 projects furnishing baby pigs and chickens. These projects are financed through Antioch, who pays all costs, and in return receives one-third of the animals at slaughter time. These projects are working very well due to the strong support of our loyal donors in this country. It has made a big difference in their lives.

Transportation needs

Over the years, we have furnished dozens of vans and a few cars for the purpose stated in the first

paragraph. For the individual poor families, however, transportation is a big problem, especially in remote areas.

Working closely with the local leadership, we have reached the conclusion that bicycles for the poor would be a welcome improvement to help them get to church, buy groceries, and generally furnish them a means of transportation far better than walking. One sees a great many bicycles in Europe, from England to Ukraine. Fuel costs are over \$6.00 per gallon, and cars are expensive.

Project Bicycle

As we discussed this situation, the European Committee has approved a program to purchase bicycles for the needy throughout Eastern Europe.



Using Antioch as a means of coordinating this effort, we intend to offer new bicycles to as many poor families or individuals as funds will allow. Estimated cost is \$150 per unit, which is very high due to the weak dollar.

The project will be purchasing and distributing a women's model bike which anyone can ride, equipped with a basket on the handlebars plus saddle baskets over the rear wheel to carry goods.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

The long awaited summer months have finally arrived and with them many enjoyable outings for the residents of our agency. They, too, enjoy being less encumbered with jackets and coats, etc. during this season. The summer breezes and smells also bring back memories of summers past and the expectation of a good time today. It is important for our readers to understand the normalcy of people with developmental disabilities (DD). They have basic needs and wants, just like anyone else. Their senses act in response to the same stimuli as anyone else. The warmth of the sun, a mild breeze, a gentle touch, a kind word or conversation, and a smile of hello all are very important to them. They may not be able to respond as you or I but they still have these same needs and will respond in some way. The response may be a vocal response, a smile, a movement or the twinkle in their eyes.

The residents from our Timber Ridge (TR) facility have been enjoying many indoor and outdoor summer activities. We are grateful for the very nice Easter Seals swimming pool to which we have access. Small groups go swimming once a week at the beautiful facility. Our people may be at the very same places in the community that you would choose to attend. Be sure to interact with them! Recently groups attended the Washington, IL Cherry Fest and the Tremont, IL Turkey Festival. We make visits to area parks where bands perform and we have picnics. A new activity for us this year is an overnight camping experience at Camp Why Not Now. Even those with limited mobility are able to enjoy fishing on a dock built specifically for wheelchairs and walkers. A fish on the end of a pole brings smiles and pleasant memories. Other residents enjoy horseback riding at Central Illinois Riding Therapy. Horseback riding is not only pleasant but helps loosen tight muscles for a physical benefit. Timber Ridge residents are also looking forward to the Morton fireworks, which they will be able to watch from our facility.

The residents at Oakwood Estate (OE) and Linden Estate (LE), our 16-bed

facilities have also been having summer fun. Their activities range from bike riding, walking, Bible study, game night, Mens' and Womens' Club that are in or on the facilities' grounds to Morton community outings such as shopping, eating out, trips to the library and the Dairy Queen. The OE and LE vans also take groups to Pekin, IL for paddle boating and to Peoria, IL for summer band concerts and other outings at the Peoria Civic Center and in the Peoria area.

The Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA) residents are having a busy summer! These residents live in homes within the community of Morton with three to five residents. There are staff members with them 24-hours a day. Their day trips are all through Peoria Charter Bus Company with destinations to the quad cities for riverboat cruises, Indianapolis for a dinner theater, and to Chicago's Brookfield Zoo and Shedd's Aquarium. Several residents are taking trips with "Mainstreamers" to the Smokey Mountains (Gatlinburg), Branson, MO, Graceland (Memphis, TN), and Nashville, TN. A CILA softball team will be playing on Saturday evenings. Residents meet to walk with their "walking teams" twice a week throughout the summer. Along with all of these activities are the usual summer fun events; picnics, miniature golf, and ice cream socials.

As you enjoy the summer weather and events and thank God for this time of year, remember the DD population and keep the home and our residents in your prayers. Pray God's blessing will be upon this home and that He will send people with a heart for service to our facility to seek employment.



Almost everyone agrees that prevention is a great idea, but for most people it is an idea that often doesn't turn into reality. Whether trying to prevent vehicle break-downs by having your car serviced regularly or trying to exercise and eat right to prevent a heart attack, prevention is certainly an important concept. However, for those who are engaged or married, marriage maintenance is one of the most important, and sometimes overlooked, area of prevention. At ACCFS, we desire to help engaged and married couples grow together and live out the fullness of God's design for their marriages.

Unquestionably, Satan desires to destroy marriages and families. The good news is that, "we are not ignorant of his devices (2 Corinthians 2:11)." Looking ahead and taking action to avoid harm is a type of prevention that is mentioned in Proverbs 22:3, "A prudent man foreseeth the evil, and hideth himself: but the simple pass on, and are punished." One application of this is for couples to be intentional about finding specific ways to encourage each other and to enrich their marriages. In fact, we encourage couples to make marriage enrichment an item in their family budget. Indeed, some couples plan more for maintaining their home, equipment, car, and retirement than they do on sustaining their relationship. Make no mistake about it: Satan is very aware of this trend and seeks to exploit it!

One of our guiding principles at ACCFS is stated the following way: "In order to promote Godly, healthy living and to minimize needless suffering, our services will emphasize prevention, early intervention, education, and enrichment." A number of our services are designed to help people deal with issues when they are minor or to try to prevent problems from occurring altogether. One such service is available through the ACCFS website at www.accounseling.org. We have worked

closely with our Administrator, Spiritual Director, elders on the ACCFS Board of Directors and, in a number of cases, with the Elder Body on developing these materials to help couples develop strong relationships that honor God. We will review several of the items below. All of the following information and more can be found on the ACCFS website under the topics of "Premarital" and/or "Marital Relationships."

Downloadable Information: On our website you can find free, downloadable information designed to help you keep your marriage strong. Many of these handouts have the following format: First, scriptural direction and biblical principles are reviewed. This helps couples learn what God has said about a particular topic, and they can examine His plan for marriage. Since God created and instituted marriage, we are wise to start by consulting His word. Second, couples learn about practical ways to apply the scriptural principles. For example, this may include teaching on various relationship skills or the sharing of practical knowledge. Finally, there is a section of questions and exercises for couples. This section helps couples to personalize and apply the material. By going through the questions and learning about each other, the couple can grow together as they apply the biblical truths in the lessons. The following is a listing of some of the studies that are currently available.

- Developing the Spiritual Union in Marriage
- Communication in Marriage
- Conflict Resolution in Marriage
- Money Matters in Marriage
- Affection, Love Languages, and Gender Differences in Marriage
- Personality and Spiritual Gifts in Marriage

Other topical handouts on items

such as forgiveness, etc. are available as well. More topical studies like this are in the process of being created and will be made available online as they are ready.

Presentations: The PowerPoint presentations from the ACCFS Marriage Seminar are available online and can be downloaded for your use. They are written in a way that a couple can gain from reading the handout even if they are not present at the seminar. If you are a minister or a teacher, feel free to adapt this material for your own use in your home churches. Finally, churches that are interested in hosting a seminar should contact ACCFS.

Printed Material: ACCFS has reviewed numerous books and pamphlets to find ones that are sound and helpful. Many couples have found books on topics such as communication, personality, gender differences, finances, and intimacy to be helpful to them in learning how to apply the biblical principles taught in Scripture. For example, in 1 Peter 3:7 husbands are instructed in the following manner, "Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered." Reading a practical book written for husbands on how to understand and love their wives can be instrumental in helping the husbands to "dwell with them according to knowledge" and to be "doers of the word."






in the New Testament here where perhaps it describes different levels of difficulties that can come across to the brethren. In this case it's 'fault'. In other places it uses the word, I think it uses 'the infirmities of the flesh' (Romans 6:19). Then there are other places where it speaks and strictly calls it sin. Then, of course, there is the sin that cannot be forgiven, and that is the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit (Matthew 12:31). So as we read the Word, we understand that there seems to be for those who are converted, different levels of sin in which we may be overtaken with as a believer.

Now let's make a clarification here. We are born unto the sin of Adam, and that sin there that is within us that all men carry can only be forgiven in one way, and that is through the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. That sin which we are born with is forgiven through that faith. The works of the true faith are going to be repentance, and confession and restitution and the baptism which represents a cleansing. To represent that that sin that we are born with is gone and we are forgiven. Now we are viewed as robed with righteousness the same as our Lord Jesus Christ was. But then there's an expectation beyond that dear ones, that the Word is clear in. It says, "...Be ye holy; for I am holy." I Peter 1:16. So there's a continual striving to be an overcomer. It's this continual striving of being overcoming that this is speaking of here that occasionally may be overtaken.

But there's a difference here, that the natural sin which we were born with has been forgiven through the true repentance. So there is a distinction here between the believer and the non-believer, the one who is converted and been regenerated and reborn, and the one who is not. So there seems to be a difference between the sinner and a saint, dear ones. Various of the Apostles who wrote unto the churches, to the

saints at such and such a church, and so [it's referring to] those who are saints are those who have been cleansed through the faith of the blood of Jesus Christ. That doesn't mean that we're perfect. It also refers to the saints as those who have already gone on and have hopefully gone to their reward. Or we have a hope they have gone to their reward. But it's used both ways. So there seems sometimes to be some misunderstanding between the saint and the sinner. Are we sinners or are we not sinners? Let's understand that there is that sin that is cleansed only through faith which is followed by a true repentance and conversion.

So dear one, if we have not come through that repentance and that true cleansing through the blood of Jesus Christ, that's all necessary first. Then, this chapter here, that's why he addresses it to the brethren, can apply unto us. So from time to time, as we said, there will be some overtaken in a fault. Do we lose our soul's salvation in that? Well, the Apostolic Christian church has church discipline and the Word bears out here that if these faults are dealt with in this life, then we still have the hope of our salvation. Here it simply speaks of the faults, and so let's focus on that. Other chapters would address the more serious things. But in this case it says, "...ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness;..." Galatians 6:1.

So 'ye that are spiritual', that would be hopefully the brethren. So we have a responsibility one to another that when we see someone overtaken in a fault, that we make an effort to restore such an one, that we make an effort to work with them, make an effort to help them understand their fault. How is that done? Through the spirit of meekness. If we go to one another in the spirit of meekness, well think about it - if someone comes to you in the Spirit of meekness, is that easy to accept? Yes it is. Much easier than when somebody comes with a de-

manding heart, or a demanding way, or a proud or a way of looking down upon you. Much easier to accept when they come with humility of heart and in meekness.

So loved ones, when we that are spiritual, and again, let's clarify, that we all take turns, perhaps, from time to time being the one who is spiritual versus the one that is overtaken in a fault. Sometimes we're deceived with that. Sometimes we think we're being spiritual when perhaps we're being overtaken in a fault. But, in this responsibility, we must go in the Spirit of meekness.

Brethren, there's a proverb, I think, that says something like, "Iron sharpeneth iron;..." Proverbs 27:17. And another one that I can't quite quote, that says sometimes a friend is the one who gives us the most grievous wound (Proverbs 27:6). But at the time when we're wounded, that's sometimes the most difficult time to accept the one who is giving it to us, is telling us the truth. Sometimes the truth can hurt so much.

So loved ones, it goes back. We brethren who have sat on the front bench and said 'Yes' we would certainly accept someone coming to us and explaining to us that perhaps we've gone from the way, it seems so easy when we're sitting there. But twenty, thirty, forty or two years later, whatever it happens to be, sometimes it's not so easy. So if we are in the state of perhaps being overtaken with a fault and someone comes to us, how do we react? It's not really covered much here in this chapter, but let's remember we should listen. We should give it serious thought and we should try to understand.

We might say, well, they're just being picky. Or perhaps we don't understand our fault. We don't see it and we're a bit offended and our reaction is to defend. To defend ourselves. To lash back because we're feeling like we're being lashed at.

That's our flesh coming out. What did Christ do? Christ was being lashed at in all kinds of ways, wasn't He? He had no fault, and He knew that. What did He do? He laid there and He said, "...Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do..." Luke 23:34. Sometimes when we feel like perhaps we're being wrongly reproved, that's when we should first say, 'Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.' But then we need to take that a little bit further. We need to try to understand, oh, was our initial action really the right reaction, or was it the wrong reaction?

Then he gives more instructions to the one who is spiritual and striving to help restore another. He says, "...considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." Galatians 6:1. So there is a self examination. As it is followed there as Christ's own words, or in the gospels where we need to make sure that we have the beam out of our own eye (Luke 6:41-42). But also, perhaps, this gives us a clue of what the approach should be. If we feel like someone is engaging in activities that perhaps aren't quite right, or maybe will take them in a direction that they shouldn't, we don't engage ourselves with them. What's that going to lead to? We just have to look forward a bit and say, are we going to be tempted also? Or if we feel someone has misunderstood the doctrine, and they've gone off on another way, and have picked up a different set of beliefs, are we going to be convinced of ourselves that their doctrine is really the right way, and we of ourselves cannot hold fast to the doctrine which we are trying to encourage them to be a part of? We have to consider our self, continually praying, continually taking a checkpoint saying, where am I at? Am I being confused also? "...considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." Galatians 6:1. We know not a one of us are above being tempted, here.

Then he goes on in verse two, and it says, "Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ." So what's the law of Christ? Love your neighbor as yourself. One of the greatest commandments there. So helping restore such an one in the spirit of meekness, is following the law of Christ. When someone is overcome with a fault, they certainly have a burden. They certainly have a struggle that they're dealing with. Do we deal with it as Christ would have dealt with it? Because all He had in His heart was love and concern and a desire that they could come back to the right way. When we approach a problem in life in that way, with a true love and a true concern, then we can fulfil the law of Christ.

Not too long ago, I was reading there, where Christ was speaking to the (I wish I could remember where it was, we could just go read it), but Christ was speaking to the Pharisees, and it said He was angered because of their hardness of their heart, that they just didn't get it (Mark 3:5). He had told them how many times of the way, of the truth, and they just didn't understand. They couldn't put the old law behind and realize that the promises of the prophesy were being fulfilled here. They just couldn't get it, and it said He was angered.

Yes, sometimes we're the same when we're dealing with someone who we feel like has been overcome with a fault, we get frustrated. But we go on in that scripture and we look at Christ's example. Did that anger come out? There's no clue that it did, but instead He told them a parable. He tried to help them understand from their point of view, in a way that they would understand.

Fulfilling the law of Christ - doing it the way that Christ would do it. Loved ones, we must continually examine our hearts and say, is our own self getting in the way? Is our own frustration with a certain situation making us so that we are not fulfilling the law of Christ ourselves while

we're trying to restore another one? Dear ones, when we go about in a frustrated manner, the ways of Christ just don't come out. Let's be careful.

And then here's another aspect of it. "For if any man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself." Galatians 6:3. So, it seems almost, that, well, this entire first few verses here are really directed toward the one who is working to restore someone else. Be careful that you don't be tempted. Help bear the other one's burdens, but make sure you're fulfilling the law of Christ. Make sure you're doing it Christ-like. And this last one here is, make sure you're not being proud. For if you think of yourself to be something, when we are really nothing, then we're deceiving ourselves.

So you see, there's a lot of work here. That we who are spiritual, if we're going to be of a help to our brethren, help bear another one's burdens, what a close examination of our heart we must continually have that we're not being tempted, that we're doing it Christ-like, and that a bit of pride isn't coming out. That we're not thinking that, boy, we're really something because we're helping someone else.

Remember the parable of the Pharisee and the publican, and I believe it was the Pharisee, when they came to pray? Maybe it wasn't a Pharisee, but let's assume it is so we can continue on with the thought here. But how did the Pharisee pray? "...God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are,..." Luke 18: 11. I do this and I do that. Perhaps this is what this verse is getting at, that we aren't having an attitude. Oh, we may thank the Lord that He has given us the grace that we can continue to walk in the true way, but the attitude behind it must be that it all comes from the Lord, that we are nothing of ourselves. And then there was the publican who recognized that he was nothing, completely. And we deceive our self.

And dear ones, that's exactly where Satan wants to put us. Oh, we're helping someone else who is spiritual, and we become deceived ourselves. And now he's won twice, not only with the one who's been overtaken with the fault, but those of us who think we're helping, when we're no longer helping. What a responsibility dear ones! The Word is quite clear here that we must guard our hearts and walk truly in the Spirit as we deal with these situations here.

Verse 4, "But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another." Galatians 6:4. Okay, so verse two says, "Bear ye one another's burdens..." and verse 4 says, "...let every man prove his own work..." Is there a conflict between the two? No, not at all. Verse 4 here, it's a responsibility that we take care of ourselves. Every one is going to stand before God. Every one is going to stand there, and our works are going to be weighed in the balance. First, the biggest thing is going to be, have we had faith and have we repented of our sins, or have we not? And that's a clear dividing line, of yes or no.

But then it goes on and this verse here would indicate that our works beyond our repentance and our conversion are important. Remember here he is speaking to the brethren. "...let every man prove his own work," Galatians 6:4. "...faith without works is dead?" James 2:20. We're responsible for our own works.

Dear ones, sometimes a stumblingblock is put in front of us by another, unfortunately. But we are responsible for ourselves. Have we stumbled over the block? Has somebody done something that makes us go astray a bit? Well, they're going to be held accountable for that too, but we're still accountable for ourselves. We need to watch out for our self.

Sometimes that stumblingblock may be that we were offended.

Sometimes it may be that somebody said something that offended us and we're having difficulty forgiving. What does Christ say? We must forgive. This is fulfilling the law of Christ. We need to forgive! Sometimes it may be over and over and over. But if we give up on the forgiving, dear ones, we have stumbled and we have fallen, and we're not getting back up again. And that's what Satan wants. He doesn't want us to forgive. Now we are responsible for our own. That's a lack of our own work, dear ones. We must continue to strive in forgiveness.

It says "...and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another." Galatians 6:4. So we can walk with the Lord in the true Spirit. We can have the true joy within us, knowing that we have held on, we have held fast to the faith, to the salvation which we have been given. We have that true rejoicing within ourselves. Yes, we also rejoice when we look at others. And we're so thankful, because it lifts our hearts when we can look about at the brotherhood and we can see that there are others walking in the truth and it makes our heart rejoice. Yet, there is another rejoicing when we our self are walking in the truth also.

It says, "For every man shall bear his own burden." Galatians 6:5. And yes we do. Each one of us, we have burdens within ourselves, sometimes unbeknownst to any others around. And that's okay. In another verse somewhere it says, "Confess your faults one to another,..." James 5:16. Well, sometimes our burdens are faults, sometimes they're not. Sometimes they're temptations that could lead to a fault and perhaps we want to share one with another. It encourages us to do that. But yet in the end, we alone bear that temptation. We alone are responsible for overcoming that. And we alone are going to stand before our God someday.

"Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that

teacheth in all good things." Galatians 6:6. So this would lead us to think here that him that is taught in the Word, (which are many of us) it says, let him communicate. As so brethren as we fellowship together, and we have some understanding of the Word, or perhaps we're striving to have some understanding in the Word, it's good if we share that one with another. That we all can be continually taught further in the Word, that we can have a better understanding. So the communication between us is very important.

Brethren, we think of the word fellowship. What is fellowship? Sharing our burdens one with another? Yes. Sometimes talking about our earthly responsibilities? Yes, but also this communication of what we're taught in the Word. Encouraging one another. It's also, (the right word doesn't come to me here) but it's, admonishment isn't the right word, that's not the word that's there in the scripture...exhorting! Exhorting one another. Perhaps asking one another, 'are we walking in the Spirit?' 'I read this scripture today. That's a good scripture for us to remember. Have you read that lately?' So often, brethren, these things are not there in our communication. They can be. Sometimes we feel like, well, we don't have anything to add or offer. At least that's the way I feel. What I read, or what I think, it's not important. But if we all think that, will we ever really communicate one with another on the things we understand in the Word?

Sometimes in a way we have to humble ourselves to get past our humility, or what we think is humility. That we are nothing. So let him that is taught in the Word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things. So perhaps there are some who currently don't have a responsibility of teaching the Word in Sunday School or over the pulpit, and yet they're taught in the Word well. Brethren, those of us who

stand, those who teach in Sunday School, we know nothing more than anyone else. Come and share your thoughts. Come and share the understanding that you've gained. Especially the older brethren, please, to those of us who are younger, help open our understanding. We welcome it, and we appreciate it!

"Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting." Galatians 6:7-8. Where are we sowing? Where are we sowing? First, what is sowing? Perhaps, sowing starts in our mind. It's the things we think about that we want to do, and eventually it turns into actions. The seed is sown, and then it grows. The thoughts turn into actions.

Dear friends, maybe we should start with you on this thought. Where are you sowing? If you're sowing, seeking after the things of the world, you're going to reap corruption. That's just the way it is. Oh, you know as well as the rest of us, there is a heaven, and there is a hell. And if we're seeking after the things of this life, well, we know what the end is going to be. Sometimes it's a little difficult to think - well, what could I do without those things? But there is such a fulfillment. There is such a wonderful fulfillment of walking in the Spirit that goes beyond, sometimes, our very own understanding. Come, hear the Word of God. Come and begin to sow the seeds that will lead to life everlasting.

Now brothers and sisters, for us, what are we doing? Are we sowing unto the way of the flesh? We shall reap corruption from that. It shall begin to corrupt the presence of the Spirit within our hearts. We all know the parable of the good ground, and the thorny ground, and the stony ground (Mark 4:3-9). The good ground begins to turn into

some of that less desirable ground, when we begin to sow the wrong seeds. And, of course, we know the wrong seeds sown in the good ground are going to grow really well. Somehow it seems like those weeds grow quicker than the good things do sometimes.

Every thought that we have, the places that we go, the things we see with our eyes, they're all sowing seeds. What are we looking at? If we're looking at things of the world continually, if we've brought those things into our home through magazines, through television, through whatever medium it happens to be; our computer, the internet. Is that sowing seeds of corruption within our hearts? Or is it sowing things of the Spirit? Most likely it's seeds of corruption. Let's evaluate what seeds that we're sowing.

"...but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting." Galatians 6:8. Let's go back to fulfilling the law of Christ, doing things for others. Bearing burdens of others. Loving our neighbor as our self. That's sowing the seeds of life everlasting. Somehow our flesh doesn't want to do that. Somehow, it seems to want to gravitate towards the things that fulfill self, instead of help others. But that's not the law of Christ. May His Spirit be mighty within us. And the only way it gets mighty is when we begin to sow the seeds that lead unto life everlasting.

We have to sow to the Spirit. Do things that are spiritual. That's why we're all here today. Aren't we so thankful we can come? We have God's Word before us, and it's here to give us these reminders, to give us encouragement that there is a good way, this can be done. We have these songs that we sing, melodies that lift our heart. God has given us tools, dear ones, to help us sow these seeds to the Spirit. Let's do it. Let's do it often.

Sometimes, dear ones, when we sow seeds of corruption, they have long lasting effects. Perhaps we

have a business that we run and it starts out small and its grown bigger and bigger. What does that do? It makes us busier and busier. Well, the seeds were sown at the beginning.

No different than my work. We plan what we're going to do for the next year. And we think, or I often think, okay, this planning, is this good, or is this bad? Are we planning too much? Is this going to lead to corrupting the ways of the Spirit? Is it going to cause me to have too much work? I'm well reminded of that now, as things are pretty busy now because of the things that I planned last December.

So we have to be careful and we have to look forward and we have to say, what is this going to do to me in a year? What is this going to do to me in six months? Is this going to lead to corruption, or is this going to sow seeds to the Spirit? Of course, we all want to sow seeds to the Spirit, but let's not be deceived. Let's not be deceived. We must be careful in the choices that we make, because our choices have consequences. How often we hear that in Sunday School when we speak to the kids, especially those who are young adults now, that their choices are having serious consequences in what's going to happen for the rest of their life. That applies to us too.

"And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not." Galatians 6:9. Don't be weary in well doing. Sometimes it seems we get weary in going and visiting the sick. We get weary in doing some of those small things that help bear burdens for others. Or perhaps we have a situation where we're visiting with someone over and over again and it seems not to help. Be not weary in that well doing, it says. Sometimes we're helping someone to be restored. Sometimes perhaps, we seem to become weary in that, and we want to give up. Sometimes that weariness is simply replaced with nothing, not much at all. It's replaced with sit-

ting at home and doing nothing, and there's times we certainly need to focus just on our own hearts and sit and read the Word. Sometimes it's replaced with the pleasures of life. Or we'd rather go out to eat with our friends, or we'd rather do our hobbies. Is that bad? No. Is that sowing seeds to the Spirit? Well, there's a balance here, loved ones. Let's examine the balance that we have. Maybe it's not sowing much seeds at all.

There is a time, sometimes we do need to be restored. We need to be able to step back and relax our mind, because in our human ways we get worked up and we have to step back and try to look at the big picture again. God has given us a beautiful world to live in. He has given us, many of us, many conveniences, so it's very easy to step back. But the purpose is to be restored. Have restoration, re-creation of our mind. So often it quickly goes to recreation, turns into the fun of the world. Let's keep the balance, dear ones. Let's keep the proper balance, but make sure it's leading towards sowing seeds to the Spirit. Let's faint not. When we become weary and we just want to give up, dear ones let's be encouraged that we should go on. Don't give up! The Spirit is there. The Spirit is willing but the flesh is weak (Matthew 26:41). God's power is always there. It's unending.

Let's look upward to that bright light, because He can help us do all these things. He is there to help. He wants a willing heart. He wants to see humility. He wants to see meekness. We can be that, dear ones! We CAN be that way, dear ones. But Satan, he just seems to want to snatch that away. Let's try again. Let's work on it again. Maybe we need to pray a little harder today, tomorrow, asking God for a little more help. Confessing our weaknesses to Him saying, Dear Lord, I'm weak. I know I've failed. It seems like I'm getting tired of this. Lift me up again, please!

Of course, Christ is always there

by our side. He's probably carried us through the hard time when we hardly knew He was there. But He's always there. That's faith's confidence. Let's have our faith uplifted!

"As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith." Galatians 6:10. So there's a balance again. Let us strive to do good unto all men, but especially those of the household of faith. So that's where it starts. That's the blessing we have loved ones, of being in the household of faith. We are helped so often through so many burdens.

I look around at those that I work with. Perhaps they've come from India, many have, far away from their families. They have struggles too, but they have no one there to help them, to uplift them. They are lonely. Then there are those who perhaps, move from one community to another and again they really have no one to help them. Then there are those who think they have friends. But yet the friend is there, and the friend is gone. We in the household of faith, dear ones, we have such an opportunity to share our burdens one with another, and then to uplift one another. When we're struggling to be restored by one who is strong in the Spirit, what a blessing dear ones. Do we realize what we have been given? Then we have to ask our self, are we just taking the blessing or are we doing our part to help others also?

And this letter ends up, I know time is going on, but he reminds them again, don't be taken back unto the old law. Let's stick with the faith. Stay with it. Dear ones, from time to time, especially at the time of reading of the memorandum we're re-reminded of some of the basics of our faith at the conference. It's good we are reminded. We need to ask ourselves, well, let's be thankful that we're following the pattern that's here in these letters. He reminds them in every letter to hold fast to the faith. Hold fast to what

you've learned. Let's do the same.

Verse 16, let's finish up with that: "And as many as walk according to this rule, peace be on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God." Galatians 6:16. Dear friends again, are you seeking for peace? Do you want true peace? Have you thought about having true peace? Well, it says, "As many as walk according to this rule..." What rule? Well, the law of Christ. The ways of Christ, what Christ has given us. That peace is there, and it can be there.

One more thought that ties to the Old Testament, going back, it says "...let us not be weary in well doing..." Galatians 6:9, mothers, grandmothers, we read there in the Old Testament of the virtuous woman, and we don't have time to go back and talk about that and how it balances with the New Testament, but I know sometimes you grow weary. Sometimes it's a bit difficult to take care of all the things that need to be taken care, but the Lord is with you and you will be blessed, if you can strive to fulfill the scriptures there, the main principle being, being keeper of the home. We read there of the virtuous woman, she was definitely the keeper of the home. Sometimes we misinterpret that scripture, and we think that that gives opportunity for the wife to do this and to do that, that perhaps in this day and time is somewhat frowned upon by the church. We don't have time to go into all that, but let's just focus on being encouraged dear wives, dear mothers, that the Lord is with you. And the blessings are there if you strive to fulfill the scripture and be a blessed woman to those who are around you.



REMEMBERING

Our Spiritual Heritage

The letter from Bro. Joseph Bella to Bro. Samuel H. Froehlich, dated September 8, 1859, continues. It was translated into English by Bro. Peter Weber, Peoria, Illinois.

(In the previous section, Bro. Bella was speaking to authorities who were representatives of the Emperor)

Then the commissioner said I should put in writing how I came to this faith. I promised to do so and kept my commitment. He gave me the document, which read:

From the Commissioner of the Emperor at Lipptauer District to the Royal Overseer: Whereas the blacksmith journeyman Joseph Bella has agreed to remain silent and that the basics of his imagined testimony of faith are mainly attributable to his mixed-up imagination, the Overseer of the Emperor is herewith at liberty to issue him a passport to Pest. Signed, St. Nickolas, the 14th of the month.

I was greatly comforted when I heard of this document. I considered it an honor such as when a soldier receives a medal decoration or star on his uniform. The person who read this document to me began to laugh and mock in a loud voice. I took my small testament out of my pocket and it came to my

mind to read to them from I Corinthians 1:19-21. He took the Bible from me and began to read (from these verses) with a loud voice so that everyone could hear him. "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent. Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this world? Hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe."

That man stopped laughing and mocking. The Word of our Lord Jesus Christ has always been a comfort to me.

A few days later, a report from the Chief of Police arrived stating that I could not remain one more hour in the city of Pest, unless I submitted a petition to the magistrate, and the reason why I want to remain in Pest. The Chief expressed that I was crazy or foolhardy. A clerk in the factory had considerable trouble with my travel book, but had testified that I was a trustworthy man according to the standards of the world and was competent in my work.

This clerk confided that he knew a man who could assure that I could stay in Pest for the rest of my life and be considered a citizen.

This man required five guilders for his efforts, and if I could not save it from my pay, I would not be obligated to pay it.

But I was not able to accept this deal and told him I needed a day to think it over, which was granted. It was revealed to me by God and I received the testimony that I would not go wrong because it was offered to me without me seeking it. Also, the brethren were of the same mind and said I should leave it up to the man to secure the permission to remain in Pest. As of now, I do not know what God will permit to come over me.

And now you are informed what happened to me, my faithful brother and all the precious brethren in Strasbourg! Oh, beloved Brother Froehlich, pray for me and for all of us, because there is much persecution in Hungary — but at the same time there is much joy in our hearts!
