Sermon by Bro. Jerry Meeks, Sabetha, KS Nehemiah 7:70-73, 8:1-6 and Acts 15

Aren't we so thankful to have the Word to turn to when there are questions on the interpretation, maybe, or the reading of the Word, as the dear apostles did not have the Word to fall back to?

As we fall back just briefly on the Old Testament, Nehemiah, a few things were very striking. At that time it talked about the different fathers, what they were able to give unto the church. Each gave according to what they could give. The beauty that there was not a set amount that they had to give. As long as their heart was right in what they did give.

The interesting thing, how the people gathered themselves together in the streets to hear the Word before the water gate. The law of Moses was read. Both men and women gathered, that could hear with understanding, upon the first day of the seventh month. (Nehemiah 8:1,2) "And he read therein before the street that was before the water gate from the morning until midday, before the men and the women ... " Nehemiah 8:3. Back again, aren't we so thankful to have the Word of the Lord in each of our homes, probably many Bibles in many homes where we can gather. These people, the hunger, since they didn't have the Word in front of them, there wasn't copies distributed, when somebody was going to read the Word, they would gather and stand there for hours and listen to the Word of the Lord. Then it also talks about how they listened for the Word of the Lord. All the people were attentive unto the book of the law. (Nehemiah 8:3) They were attentive listeners of the Word. I guess we're daily prayerful that we can be attentive listeners of the Word, attentive readers of the Word in our life. Just little notes from Nehemiah.

As we open the book into Acts chapter 15, again, as we have read this recently - the circumcision. There is such a difference between the Gentiles and the Jewish law. How there was little things that were just tough to get past. I think we understand the circumcision in our lives, the spiritual circumcision that we must go through to follow the Lord. There was a few of the apostles, it was hard to get past the difference between the physical and the spiritual.

"...Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved." Acts 15:1. Brothers and sisters, friends, we know we must be circumcised spiritually. We must cut off that old from our life, the worldly ways. We must be separated. Again we can be circumcised from that separation from the worldly ways and turn our lives over to the Lord in our walk.

"When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question." Acts 15:2. At that time, when we didn't have the Word, you had pieces of the words put together, but you had people going around ministering the Word of Jesus. As we have in our day yet, different questions arise. Paul and Barnabas and others were meeting here to determine, how do we answer this question?

"And being brought on their way by the church, they passed through Phenice and Samaria, declaring the conversion of the Gentiles ... " Acts 15:3. They continued to minister the Word as they walked. The conversion of the Gentiles. There was a dissension at that time whether the Jewish people only could be turned over to Jesus Christ, or can the Gentiles also. Aren't we thankful that the Lord our Savior who died on the cross did not do this just for one sect, one group of people? He did it for all of us. He shed His blood so that we all can have that opportunity, that promise for everlasting life if we follow Him.

"And when they were come to Jerusalem, they were received of the church, and of the apostles and elders, and they declared all things that God had done with them." Acts 15:4. Imagine listening to the apostles if they gathered here. We live such a blessed, simple life in many ways, physically, than how they lived in their time. The walking from village to village, ministering the Word, teaching the Word and the many miracles. As they gathered, think of the great joy they had as they taught them. As they discussed the people that had turned their lives over for the Lord. They declared all things that

"I saw a way worn trav'ler in tatter'd garments clad, And struggling up the mountain, It seem'd that he was sad; His back was laden heavy, His strength was almost gone, Yet he shouted as he journeyed, Deliverance will come." "Deliverance Will Come" (Gospel Hymns, #225, verse 1).

Satan's goal for all of mankind is to deliver souls to destruction. "...your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:" (I Peter 5:8). From the garden of Eden through the end of time, Satan has spread his evil message: "...Ye shall not surely die ...ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil" (Gen. 3:4-5).

Mankind has struggled throughout the ages of time to deal with Satan's deceit. God has promised His help. If we will serve Him, He will help us to overcome all that Satan can bring to us. The Word of God contains many descriptions of Satan's work and many promises of God's willingness to help us be victorious.

Psalm 107 contains a very clear description of Satan's temporary successes and of God's willingness to fulfill His promises to deliver us from evil: The descriptions in this Psalm of God's people when they left serving God are heartrending. "They wandered in the wilderness in a solitary way;...their soul fainted in them" (v. 4-5). "Because they rebelled against the words of God, ... Therefore he brought down their heart with labor; they fell down, and there was none to help" (v. 11-12). "Fools, because of their transgression, and because of their iniquities,...they draw near unto the gates of death" (v. 17-18), "...they go down again to the depths: their soul is melted because of trouble. They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, and are at their wit's end" (v. 26-27). In each of these cases, "Then they cried

In each of these cases, "Then they cried unto the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them out of their distresses" (v. 6, 13, 19, 28). When they were willing to totally surrender to God's will, they found deliverance. The account of their deliverance is as beautiful as the description of their trouble is heartrending. "...he led them forth by the right way, that they might go to a city of habitation" (v. 7). "He brought them out of darkness, and the shadow of death, and brake their bands in sunder" (v. 14). "He

sent his word, and healed them, and delivered them from their destruction" (v. 20). "He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still...he bringeth them unto their desired haven" (v. 29-30). "He blesseth them also, so that they are multiplied greatly; and suffereth not their cattle to decrease" (v. 38). "Yet setteth he the poor on high from affliction...The righteous shall see it, and rejoice: and all iniquity shall stop her mouth. Whoso is wise, and will observe these things, even they shall understand the loving-kindness of the Lord" (v. 41-43).

Many examples of a very specific nature could be cited. Noah and his family were delivered from the flood because he walked with God (Gen. 6:9). In a last moment reprieve, Abraham was not required to offer his son as a sacrifice "...for now I know that thou fearest God..." (Gen. 22:12). Joseph, because of his refusal to yield to temptation, had to suffer for a time was "brought...hastily out of the dungeon:...and (was) made ruler over all the land of Egypt" (Gen. 41:14 & 44). Moses was delivered from the death sentence of Pharaoh so he could deliver the children of Israel out of Egypt.

How does all of this apply to us today? Just as God sent His Word to save the children of Israel (Ps. 107:20), He also sent His Word to save us. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word

was God" (Jn. 1:1). We understand that the "Word" refers to Jesus Christ who was sent to earth to save us from our sins. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world though him might be saved" (Jn. 3:16-17). Jesus not only was willing to come, but He recognized the need of sinful man to be delivered from Satan. In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus prayed that God would "…lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil:..." (Mt. 6:13).

We know that this prayer was not just for those who were on the mountain at that time, but is for us today. As Jesus was praying for His disciples before His crucifixion, He prayed that they could be sanctified and He said "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them which shall believe on me through their word" (Jn. 17:20). This prayer includes Writings based on God's Word

us in the twenty-first century because the Word of God was passed from the disciples through each generation until our time.

Those of us who have lived after the death and resurrection have a special advantage over those who preceded Christ did not have. The sacrifices of animals were only a temporary atonement for sin. Grace to overcome temptation did not seem to be readily available prior to Christ having shed His blood as the complete and perfect atonement for sin. The gift of the Holy Spirit as our guide did not seem as readily available to them either. They would sin and make an atoning sacrifice and sin again. This pattern was repeated over and over.

However, since Christ's blood was shed, since He gave His life on Calvary's cross, and since He rose from the dead, we can be delivered from yielding to Satan's evil work. We are no longer under the law, but under grace. However, living under grace rather than under the law does not allow us to sin. "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?" (Ro. 6:1-2).

Jesus Christ overcame the world (Jn. 16:33). He delivered us from the bondage of the world. "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed" (Jn. 8:36). He sent His comforter and when "...he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth..." (Jn. 16:13).

We need not wait until we are at our wit's end to seek God's deliverance. By humbling ourselves and submitting to His call to repentance and conversion, "...by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God" (Ep. 2:8).

"Oh that men would praise the Lord for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men" (Ps. 107:8)!

"I heard the song of triumph, They sang upon that shore, Saying, Jesus has redeemed us To suffer nevermore: Then casting his eyes backward On the race which he had run. He shouted loud, Hosanna, Deliverance has come!" "Deliverance will Come" (Gospel Hymns, #225, v. 6).

Nashville, TN Church

Church services were first held in Nashville in 1985. From the very beginning, they were held in the home of Don and Faye Sauder. Several years later, Don became the first brother in Nashville, after being baptized in his former home church at Mansfield, Ohio. Then in 2000, Faye became a sister, being the first person baptized in the Nashville church.

From 1985, church services were held periodically until 1990, at which time a visiting minister was scheduled once a month. This continued until 1995, when the schedule was updated to have a visiting minister twice a month. During this time, on weekends when there was not a visiting minister, the brethren would often travel to other congregations (Athens, Alabama is the nearest church at 100 miles), or listen to taped services. Then in 2001, another change was made, and a visiting minister is now scheduled every week, except for some holidays.

Church building

In 1994 an old abandoned one-room church building was purchased. The building was in a scenic, convenient location among the hills on the west side of Nashville, but it was in such poor condition that a visiting elder brother, when he first saw it, just sat down on the steps and wept. Thankfully, the local brethren at the time had the vision to see what a blessing it could be to have their own church building, so a total renovation was undertaken.

Today the congregation enjoys the fruits of that labor. Even while renovations were in progress, the church building was used for Sunday services. The volunteers worked on the remodeling during the week, and cleaned up the building enough to have church on Sunday. Untold hours were spent in the effort, and there is much appreciation for numerous groups and individual brethren who traveled to Nashville to assist with the renovation. The benches and pulpit furniture were purchased from a church in Mansfield, Ohio.

In September of 1997, the remodeling work was essentially complete and the church dedication service was held. Today, the sanctuary can comfortably seat about seventy people and the dining room can seat forty. It is just a small two-room church, but thankfully, it meets the current needs very well.



Like many of our churches in years past, a simple, painted livestock tank is used for a baptismal. The congregation has been blessed to witness three baptisms (2000 and 2002) in their church, and there are continued prayers for many more. The congregation was also privileged to celebrate a wedding (2003), although for convenience and capacity reasons, it was held in the brother's church, rather than Nashville.

Over the years, many brethren and friends have moved in, and some have moved away. There has been rejoicing over births and mourning over deaths. In the past year, two young families have moved to the area, increasing the congregation's size by almost fifty percent. Today, the church has thirteen Brothers and Sisters, and a total local attendance of thirty-one. In addition, there are many visitors, so the average Sunday attendance is almost forty people.


Appreciation and invitation

Because of Nashville's convenient location and the schedule of visiting ministers, the church has been privileged to fellowship with many brethren from most of the other congregations. Almost sixty percent of the current ministers within the brotherhood have ministered in Nashville.

This breadth of fellowship opportunities has caused a great appreciation and love for the Brotherhood and the loving support that is provided. There is rejoicing in these blessings and thanks to God and you all for that loving support. This creates the desire to hold fast to the blessings passed on by faithful forefathers.

The Nashville congregation asks that you would continue to pray for their congregation, that the Lord will move hearts and minds and this small church can continue to grow in the Spirit and in numbers, if it can be His will. Pray that souls can find their salvation and that His name can be glorified.

If anyone feels led by the Holy Spirit to consider relocating to a small church, a leading that many of us here have felt ourselves, please know that you would be welcome in Nashville. WR Informational Meetings

World Relief has grown in the hearts of our brethren and provides many opportunities to share our bountiful blessings. We can help through prayers, donations and labors of love. One way to learn about these various areas and people we have the opportunity to help is to attend one of the annual World Relief Information meetings. The Western Meeting is held every second Saturday of March and is rotated between the Apostolic Christian Churches west of the line between Indiana and Illinois. The Eastern Meeting is held on the second Saturday of November and is rotated between the churches in Indiana and all churches eastward.

History

These meetings started in the 1960's as a sewing group where sisters gathered together to share ideas of sewing projects for the basic needs of the poor. Many brethren responded to the opportunities offered by World Relief. These meetings have evolved into more and more sharing of the many ways our brothers and sisters, young and old, have and can become involved.

The Milford and South Bend churches hosted the November 2006 Eastern Meeting. Everyone there heard about meeting the needs of people throughout the world in Haiti, Mexico, Biloxi, Indonesia, Africa and the Amazon River area. A sister gave her testimony how her heart was changed by someone giving her a Bible through a program started by Purdue Apostolic Christian students. A young couple told how they had the opportunity of adopting a Chinese son.

Fairbury, Illinois had the blessing of hosting the March Western 2007 meeting. Again, attendees heard about opportunities for helping, through prayers, donations or time, in places like Haiti, Mexico, Europe and the USA. We heard about collecting eyeglasses and how they are being distributed in Haiti and other places, about sponsoring a child through the Child Sponsorship Program, and Haitian linens, European linens and Ixtlan veils that are being made and sold in the US to help poor families earn money for their families.

Handbooks are available

Also, at the Fairbury meeting, every church west of the Illinois/Indiana line received two handbooks. One was for the sisters' sewing groups. The other was for the World Relief representative of every church. The same handbooks will be passed out at the Eastern Meeting in November. If a church is not represented, the books will be sent to the World Relief Representative of the church.

The sisters' handbook was compiled as a resource of information for sewing or local projects. Contained in the handbook are kits to make, project ideas for local groups, patterns and information of where goods can be taken for distribution.

The representatives' handbook includes a list of the responsibilities of the representative and contact information to direct any question about World Relief. It lists all the current World Relief Projects, ways for congregations and individuals to get involved, information on the various World Relief distribution centers, brochures available for distribution and much more.

The next meeting

The Eastern Meeting for 2007 will be held at Bay City, Michigan, on Saturday, November 10th where the handbooks will be available. A few of the topics being presented are about Haiti, Jamaica, Mississippi building projects and local work needs.

The next Western Meeting will be held Saturday, March 8, in Elgin, Illinois. Europe, Mexico, and the new World Relief Web site (www.acworldrelief.org) are on this program. All sewing ladies are encouraged to bring samples of items their local church groups have worked on.

Powerpoints have been made of presentations given at the Informational Meetings. They include work being done in Haiti, Jamaica, Mexico, India, Biloxi, Indonesia and an overview of World Relief work throughout the world. These presentations can be obtained and shown at an informational meeting at your local church.

THE CASE AGAINST A WORLD CHURCH

Christian churches are preparing to unite as one great world church. This will include the Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, and Protestants.

Consider what conditions have resulted where there has been a one (world) church monopoly. By the 5th or 6th century, the Church at Rome had gained dominion over all others in western Europe. The dark ages settled, until the Reformation and the break away of those who protested.

In eastern Europe, it was the Greek Orthodox. The end of this rule over the lives of the people in Russia did not come until the Communist revolution. A primary target of this revolution was against the domination and corruption of this church.

We can expect that the will of this world church will not only be suggested, but enforced. Great churches in the past forced even kings to their knees.

Liberty will be threatened the moment a great monopoly is organized. This mammoth may begin to throw its weight around, and thousands, yes millions, may suffer as a result.

The mind and heart of unconverted man is centered in himself. His supreme desire is to satisfy his personal appetites. He is completely separated from God. His thoughts and ambitions are earthly—not godly.

Christ's prayer for the eleven, and indeed all who follow, is oneness of heart with God, the Father, and Christ, that their very lives would prove that Christ lived within them.

"Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word; That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me."

The burden of His prayer is for the salvation of those who believe on him, that they might be with Him forever. God does not depend upon the strength of numbers to accomplish His purposes!

The world is impressed when it sees a person who is genuinely sold out to God, and is truly in oneness with Him. The world seems to sense and know God loves that person.

A tragic mistake is that this great prayer has been misinterpreted by the great majority. The wheels of movement are turning ever faster. The world church is approaching culmination faster than we ever thought possible. Already the Roman church is preparing herself to be more acceptable, so that this can come about.

Warning! Danger Ahead!

This great world church will dictate in every sphere. The anti-christ will arrive and declare that he is God.

Your children brought up in such a church will soon be going right along with the rest. Your influence on others is vital. In speaking of a great church in Revelation, the message says, "Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues."

Now is the time to come out of all lukewarm and apostate churches. It's much later than you may think. Come out now, while you can still bring your children and others with you!

It's time to pray. Don't let your church slip. It's time to fight for that which is right. It's time to join ranks with Peter, Paul and the host of others who contended for the faith, even unto death!

Apostolic Christian Way of Purity

A Volcano of Filth

At nearly 10,000 feet, Mt. St. Helens was a majestic volcanic peak in the Cascade Range of SW Washington state, which lay dormant for over 100 years. But on May 18, 1980, it erupted in one of the largest explosions in North American history. A blast of stone, ash, and poisonous gas carried debris for 17 miles, and a volcanic plume reached 80,000 feet into the air. The disaster took over 60 lives, wiped out large numbers of wildlife, and destroyed 230 square miles of vegetation.

A description of the eruption of Mt. St. Helens is a very accurate parallel to the spewing forth of an ever increasing supply of pornographic movies, television programs, magazines, videos, and books. And just as a volcanic eruption results in devastation to everything around it, so likewise does a pornography addiction result in devastated lives and broken relationships.

Only God Himself has sovereign control over the forces that shape and re-shape our earth and seas. The disciples said of Jesus, "What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him!" (Matthew 8:27). In the same way, we realize that only God has the power to enable a soul to overcome the forces of evil that have enslaved him in pornography and sexual addiction. Our enemy is cruel and deceptive, and he does not care whom his victims are. If Satan tried to deceive the Son of God, he will certainly also try to deceive us. But the same weapon that Jesus used to defeat him will also work for us - the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God.

What is Purity?

The Bible is far from silent on what constitutes sexual purity. One of the major themes in Scripture is the battle between the flesh and the Spirit. "For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would" (Galatians 5:17). The first four items listed in the "works of the flesh" – adultery, fornication, uncleanness, and lasciviousness – are all related to sexual impurity or excesses of lust.

But God has given instructions in His Word that clearly define what is acceptable and not acceptable in His sight: "Marriage is honorable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge" (Hebrews 13:4). Jesus Himself gave the disciples a warning that even lustful looks are contrary to God's will: "But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart" (Matthew 5:27).

These and other passages of Scripture give us a definition of purity – the sexual relationship is reserved for a man and a woman united in the bonds of marriage. Any lustful or sexual act by a single person, or by a married person with other than his or her spouse, is sinful and against the will and commandments of God.

Divine Help

However, God has not left us to fight the battle alone. His desire is that each of us live holy lives, and that everything we do can be to His glory.

One of the tools that God has provided for those who struggle with issues of sexual purity is a program called the Apostolic Christian Way of Purity. Over the years, several brothers from our denomination have used a program called Setting Captives Free. This was found to be beneficial in breaking free from the bonds of impurity and maintaining lives of purity. A committee of brothers was then created by the Elder Body to obtain the program and modify it to better fit our doctrine and practice. This course, the Apostolic Christian Way of Purity (ACWP), is now available from the Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services (ACCFS).

The program is distributed on a CD which the student installs on his or her computer. It is a 60-lesson, biblically-based accountability program for persons struggling with pornography or any other sexual temptation. Each student is assigned a mentor who provides prayerful support, guidance, and feedback. The student completes one lesson each day, and e-mails or faxes the lessons to his mentor.

These lessons contain much practical advice built on sound scriptural principles. There are five major steps that a course participant is led through in order to gain freedom from bondage:

(1) Recognition of the problem and desire to be free

"If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." (John 8:36)

(2) Confession and repentance, commitment to prayer, and studying the lessons and Scripture passages "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9).

(3) Radical amputation – complete removal of all sources of lust; cutting off all access to pornographic programs, movies, books, and magazines

"And if thy hand offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter into life maimed, than having two hands to go into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched." (Mark 9:43)

(4) Daily accountability with a spouse or mentor

"Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend." (Proverbs 27:17).

(5) Walking in the Spirit, being filled with the power of God and the victory of Christ





God had done with them. Again, God had done with them. The beauty of this is they are not saying what they had done. They are not saying, we as apostles went around and did these things. That's how we each have to walk our life.

As we talk about, we had this in all of our jobs, farming. We grew this great crop. We did certain things. How they stated it, brothers and sisters. The things that God had done with them. They are putting the glory back to the Lord. This is how He used them. They were just empty vessels as we are. And the Lord uses us. Again, the glory goes to the Lord. Not in their walk of life. It's how the Lord used them.

"But there rose up certain of the sect of the Pharisees which believed, saving. That it was needful to circumcise them, and to command them to keep the law of Moses. And the apostles and elders came together for to consider of this matter. And when there had been much disputing, Peter rose up, and said unto them, Men and brethren, ye know how that a good while ago God made choice among us, that the Gentiles by my mouth should hear the word of the gospel, and believe." Acts 15:5-7. Are we not all sometimes guilty of how Peter, in all his strengths and his love for the Lord, he was going back to how God made choice among us that the Gentiles by my mouth, by Peter's mouth, should hear the Word of the gospel and believe. Aren't we, we all have that situation where pride comes into our life and Peter wanted to minister the Word to the Gentiles. Then in his love for the Lord and in his diligence, I think the Lord also knew that there were too many people for him. We can't all do this alone. Even though the Lord is working through us, we have to use those brothers and sisters, friends. As Peter had to come to the understanding that the other apostles had to be used also to minister to the Gentiles. One person could not do it all.

"And God, which knoweth the hearts, bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us; And put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith." Acts 15:8,9. Again, there isn't any difference between us or anybody else in this world. Jesus can work in each of our hearts. Again, it is up to us to accept Jesus and let Him work through us, purifying our hearts by faith.

"Now therefore why tempt ye God, to put a yoke upon the neck of the disciples, which neither our fathers nor we were able to bear? But we believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we shall be saved, even as they. Then all the multitude kept silence, and gave audience to Barnabas and Paul, declaring what miracles and wonders God had wrought among the Gentiles by them." Acts 15:10-12. Back to, I think a lot of it goes back to that where Peter was told to go speak to the Gentiles. At that time, Paul and Barnabas were doing the same thing.

"And after they had held their peace, James answered, saying, Men and brethren, hearken unto me: Simeon hath declared how God at the first did visit the Gentiles, to take out of them a people for his name. And to this agree the words of the prophets; as it is written, After this I will return, and will build again the tabernacle of David, which is fallen down; and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up:" Acts 15:13-16. It is just going back to the basic principle of why the apostles were out there ministering the Word, talking about Jesus. How Jesus, through His shed blood, the tabernacle was taken down, but it was through the ruins it was built up, through our sin. Jesus shed His blood for each one of us. But then He will arise again and the tabernacle will be built again as it was. As it was prophesied and it came true.

"That the residue of men might seek after the Lord, and all the Gentiles, upon whom my name is called, saith the Lord, who doeth all these things." Acts 15:17. And He does all these things. "Known unto God are all his works from the beginning of the world. Wherefore my sentence is, that we trouble not them, which from among the Gentiles are turned to God:" Acts 15:18,19. The Gentiles that were spoken to, the ones that turned their life over to the Lord, and then they were told that they needed to be circumcised. They thought they had done what was needed to be saved. Then somebody else comes in and says, no, you need to do this one more thing. And now we are told here not to trouble the Gentiles. They have the shed blood of Jesus Christ. The circumcision is being explained again. That is the separation. Circumcision is the separation from the world.

"But that we write unto them, that they abstain from pollutions of idols, and from fornication, and from things strangled, and from blood." Acts 15:20. So they are talking about some of the law. The law today which we need to keep ourselves from. We must keep ourselves from pollutions of idols, fornication, from things strangled and from blood. I need to study more on the things strangled. There's biblical meaning in that and there's other brothers that can expound on that if need be.

"For Moses of old time hath in every city them that preach him, being read in the synagogues every Sabbath day." Acts 15:21. The Word continues to go out every Sabbath day. It is going to be repeated a couple more times in here how the pollution of idols - I think we need to all examine our lives. We don't have that gold statue potentially, prayerfully not in our house that we worship. Many other activities that we can fall lax in our walk of life and we can idolize. It is probably something that we're not, it's deceptively, Satan is very deceptive in the way he can put an idol into our life. That is where we have to be cognizant and constantly looking for something. What is drawing me away from the Lord? What is drawing me away from my family? How can I better serve the Lord? Is there some little issue which potentially could be an idol in our life? How can we stay away from that?

"Then pleased it the apostles and elders, with the whole church, to send chosen men of their own company to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; namely..." Acts 15:22. So Judas and Silas, they were sent off. First they

wrote letters. It is hard for us to comprehend. At that time they sent letters out as they were sending out Judas and Silas. This is what they are going to talk about. Because at that time, as Judas and Silas were, as they were going out to these specific places, to Antioch and such, they had many stops along the way. So they weren't just going straight there. Because their ministering of the Word at that time, you never knew if you would come to a village and you may stay there two days and you continue to minister the Word. They knew that Antioch had that need, as we sometimes in our life, we have that need for the Word. Straighten us out. Where are we doing something wrong? So they sent ahead. They wrote the letter. It was sent ahead so the Gentiles in Antioch could have that comfort. We know what was in the letter. As they received it, they were pleased of the readings. They were comforted by it.

"So when they were dismissed, they came to Antioch: and when they had gathered the multitude together, they delivered the epistle: Which when they had read, they rejoiced for the consolation." Acts 15:30,31. When you have that, you think you are going down the right path and you get hit with something that kind of pushes you off the path you are going on, it is hard to get righted back to the path. That's why this letter was sent out. So those Gentiles could be comforted by what they were doing. They did not need to be circumcised physically. Again, they rejoiced for the consolation. They rejoiced that they did not have to follow the law also.

"And Judas and Silas, being prophets also themselves, exhorted the brethren with many words, and confirmed them." Acts 15:32. They did not just go out and minister the Word. They had such a knowledge. The Lord was working through them that it's one thing to just minister the Word. They were able to confirm the Word. Isn't that comforting as we hear the Word, as we read the Word? Where is the confirmation of the Word? We have the confirmation by reading the Word our self, falling back to the Word. They had the confirmation through their walk of life, through again, the Holy Spirit working through them. The many miracles that they had performed. The changes that they had seen in people's lives that they could relate back to the people in Antioch.

"And after they had tarried there a space, they were let go in peace from the brethren unto the apostles." Acts 15:33. Isn't that something to be able to go in peace! As they were let go in peace. Because I think when the letter was received and then when they showed up, the letter obviously gave them, the Gentiles, peace, but then as they heard these dear apostles minister to them and confirm them in the Word of the Lord, in Jesus Christ and His saving grace, they could go in peace.

"Notwithstanding it pleased Silas to abide there still." Acts 15:34. Isn't that something, how we are today as, "Paul also and Barnabas continued in Antioch, teaching and preaching the word of the Lord, with many others also." Acts 15:35. I am confusing some of the cities here and such. But Silas stayed with them. Isn't that how we are? We come back to church Wednesday nights, Sundays. We are not going there because it is a social activity. We appreciate the social, the love we have, the fellowship. But we must be coming here to learn more about the Word. Back to, notwithstanding it pleased Silas to abide there still. Silas knew, as we know, when we are going through the week, if the apostles left completely, these people in Antioch continued to need to be confirmed in the Word. Silas was able to stay there. He knew there was still a need there, as we see in our lives. There is still a need to be confirmed, weekly, daily. So Silas, he abode there still. Paul, and also Barnabas continued, teaching and preaching the Word of the Lord, with many others also.

"And some days after Paul said unto Barnabas, Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they do." Acts 15:36. That's back to, it's necessary to continue to be reconfirmed in the Word of the Lord. To continue to study it. To hear it again.

"And Barnabas determined to take with them John, whose surname was Mark. But Paul thought not good to take him with them, who departed from them from Pamphylia, and went not with them to the work." Acts 15:37,38. Paul had, he was sent elsewhere by the Lord, it comes down to plain and simple. Sometimes you have, which we know among us we have personalities which sometimes it's best if we are sent different directions to do the work of the Lord. That's where we have the faith in the Lord that He sends us in those directions. It is a direction by Him.

"And Paul chose Silas, and departed, being recommended by the brethren unto the grace of God. And he went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches." Acts 15:40,41. Again that word confirming, in our walk of life. Confirming the churches as we read in the letter. How they rejoiced and then as Paul and Silas exhorted the brethren with many words and confirming them. Aren't we doing that daily in our life? We need to be continually looking for the confirmation of the Word in our walk of life. We hope that through our walk of life, we are confirming the Word by our actions and our activities. I think that is back to that, where we need to prick our hearts and look for those, as in the prayer we talked about being those examples to those around us. These apostles, the tremendous examples that they were. Who were they being examples of in their walk of life? Is that not Jesus Christ? Does that not come down to the basic foundation of our walk of life? The example Jesus Christ lived for each one of us and we daily strive to confirm in our walk of life, that example for the Lord.

This is the final segment of a letter from Bro. Joseph Bella to Bro. Samuel Froehlich, dated September 8, 1850. It was sent from Budapest, Hungary to Strasbourg, France. Bro. Peter Weber, Peoria, Illinois, translated this letter. Copies are on file at the Heritage Center, located in a basement office at Fairview Haven, Fairbury, Illinois.

I have never been as well as now, and I am elated in the hope that the heavy temptations and persecutions will have passed. You, dearly beloved Brother Froehlich, are fully aware that I often was troubled over the condition of my spiritual heart, but now I am very joyful. So rejoice with me. Yes, I declare to you, rejoice over the sufferings which will come over you.

The beloved Kowatz brethren were hauled before the authorities again according to a recent letter. They asked widowed Sister Kowatz whether she would acknowledge the Pope on earth instead of God. She replied to them, "God remains in His majesty and the Pope shall remain in his domain." This infuriated the Captain, and he ordered his soldiers to cuff her and put her in prison at Kostel. But the Lord did not permit this to take place.

Our dear Brother Kowatz wrote us and requested to send hearty greetings to you and also the others sent their love, and they greet you with the holy love of peace and blessing. Also, dear brothers Knippilt and Pscherer and friend Korb wrote to us; yesterday, we received their letters with much joy.

They are fairly well, only they are not at liberty to come to Pest because the authorities confiscated their travel record and passports. What else could happen to them yet? God knows! Our situation here in Hungary is desperate. I want to inform you that we have no news of Brother Philippi. We have not heard from him for a long time even though we have written him many times.

Now I want to send you yet a sweet savor and blessed message of joy the Lord has provided for us. Dear brothers and sisters were added to the congregation of the Lord at Pest through holy baptism on September, namely two brothers and two sisters. The brothers' names are Johan Hill and Joseph Kassowitsch, and the sisters are Anna Waslowitch and Eva Kaplan. This tells you that we are not only persecuted, but also have exceeding joy that our congregation in Pest has been strengthened by four souls in the body of the Lord Jesus Christ. There are more converts here and in my earthly home town - my biological sister and another woman are looking forward to being taken into the fold.

Dear Brother Froehlich and all beloved brethren, pray for our converts, for those who have already been added to the fold, and for those looking forward to it.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen!

Editor's Note:

Bro. Joseph Bella eventually immigrated to the United States sometime between 1855 and 1861. He escaped devious plans by the Hungarian authorities to kill him en route, but his life was spared. In America, he became an Elder at Sardis, Ohio. He traveled extensively among the early American churches with an untiring zeal, and was know as the "traveling preacher" and a "roving Elder."

This forefather of the Apostolic Christian Church lived to be 89 years old, and never married. His grave can be visited at the South Side cemetery, south of Fairbury, Illinois.

In the household of God, it is good to have members who can be relied upon. If new converts are zealous and devoted for only a short period of time and then become complacent, it is a loss for the individual and a loss for the household of God. Spiritual activities tend to prevent this cooling off, from happening. To all you brothers and sisters in our church, who by example, encourage the rest of us to maintain our zeal and to go about doing good, as Jesus did, we thank you.

II Thessalonians 2:15 teaches us to be spiritually stable; "Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word, or our epistle."

On the other hand, it is thought to be good to be open minded. We can at least listen and prayerfully consider what others say. If what others say is in accordance with God's Word, we may be able to improve. However, we should not be open minded in regard to

Christ's virgin birth, His physical resurrection, forgiveness through His atoning blood, and creation by God. These truths we consider absolutes. A university sociology professor once told his class that he told a woman that he can prove to her that evolution is true. Ι agree with the woman and I believe that she showed stability in what she didn't believe. In short, she was saying, "I believe your proof is faulty.'

An elder in the Mormon church once told me, "We let others convert the people to Christianity. Then we convert them to Mormonism. We are the fastest growing church." We believe that to believe in and live by the Bible, especially the New Testament, is the best life that can be lived both for now and for eternity. We do not need to base our faith on any other books, such as the Book of Mormons.
