

Sermon by Bro. Elder Bro. Curt Frank, LaCrosse, IN

Isaiah 53 and St. Matthew 2

Greetings, brothers and sisters and friends of the truth. I don't know that any of us can really deny the feeling of happiness, of joy, as we sang those Christmas carols together. I think the reason that we come together today is such a deep and abiding truth and abiding faith that we have in our heavenly Father and in this Word and in what God has done for all of us. It is a joy to come together on Christmas morning, and to praise and honor His high and His holy name for the most precious gift that mankind has ever, ever known. And ever will know. There isn't anything greater. I don't know if we fully comprehend that - if we can. In part we feel it, when we sit and we sing those carols together. We feel our souls lifted up.

In that last hymn, there, as we sang, There were shepherds abiding..., it says Oh bridegroom of my soul! (There Were Shepherds, Hymns of Zion #300) God has given to each of us a living soul. That soul has a desire to be reunited with its Creator. I think much more than the human mind has the desire to serve Him. It is when we have understanding and knowledge of God's Word and have a desire to understand God that that soul can be satisfied and we can feel a peace when our minds and our bodies and our souls can be in one accord in serving God.

As Isaiah spoke those words [Isaiah 53], I wonder what the people thought as he spoke of this servant. As he spoke of this lamb that grew up as a tender plant out of dry ground (Isaiah

53:2). I wonder if they began at all to sense where Isaiah was coming from. Or if these were as idle words.

What is the meaning, what is the value of a gift? We think of that as we gather together for Christmas a lot. We spend a lot of time thinking of the value of a gift. That's really a pleasant thing that we have, that we get to do; that we get to go out and we get to purchase something for somebody. We spend some time, we put some care and some effort into it. We want so badly for that to be right. We want so badly for that to be felt and appreciated. The Lord was speaking to Isaiah and speaking of this gift that He was going to give to mankind.

Loved ones, as we gather together and we sing these Christmas carols together and it speaks of the bridegroom of our soul, and our souls are lifted up. We just simply can't help but have a feeling of happiness, of joy about us, as we consider. That's because, loved ones, our soul has a, maybe a greater understanding of the gift that God has given unto us than perhaps what we in our minds really stop and think about and ponder about.

But aren't we thankful that we have an opportunity to stop and to come together and to read the Word and to try to connect the feeling in our heart and in our soul, the joy that we feel in our soul, so that our minds can understand it. When we do, loved ones, there is even a greater and a deeper appreciation. There is an understanding. That is really the reason we gather together; so that we can fully comprehend

and know the breadth and the width and the height and the depth of His love. So may we have that thought in mind as we gather together and we again

Parents, Children and Technology III

The two previous articles on this topic gave a brief historical background on the development of technology and pointed out some of the devices that parents need to be aware of and some of the issues of concern.

In this article the focus of attention will be on encouragement for parents and some sources of help for parents who may be facing these issues with their children.

So much of this topic - teens and technology - goes back to good parenting. If we use good parenting principles, we do not need to know everything that is happening in the world of technology. We do need to know what our children are doing. We need to know where they are. We need to know who (or what) they spend their time with. Just as we would not allow our children to spend time with total strangers in a completely unsupervised manner, neither should we release our children to strange devices in an unsupervised setting.

It is very important that if we have computers in our home, that they be located in an area that makes regular supervision possible. We should have consistent, strict rules about its use with reasonable time limitations and uncompromising prohibition of involvement with strangers on the internet for other than legitimate business or education use.

If we allow our children to have cell phones, we should limit the features that the phone has. We should be aware of how much time is spent on the phone and who they talk to. We also need to be aware of the time of day our children are using these devices. Frequent, lengthy use of computers, cell phones, etc. late at night are often a signal that parents need to find out what is going on and who they are involved with.

There are numerous resources for parents as they try to provide responsible guidance for their children. Some references are:

* "Guidance on Internet Use" - made available through the church in March, 2006. This article can be obtained from your elder, one of the ministers or on the Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services website. It provides more information on technology, additional reasons for

concern and additional help for parents as they work with their children in this sometimes very trying area of our lives.

* Two previous articles in "The Light from the Word" - Technology and the Internet I & II. Although these were originally published in the Silver Lining in July and August 1998, the cautions are still relevant.

* Deuteronomy 6:7-8 instructs us that we "...shalt teach them (God's commandments) diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest in the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes."

To a world that is used to instant results or gratification, this may seem like a very difficult task. However, when we consider the persistent, eye-catching appeal to the baser instincts of the human mind, persistent teaching of the Word of God in a loving clear manner is vital to combat the evil that is confronting our children.

In a world of rapid changes, instability and unwholesome fantasy, our children need more than ever the stability of the Truth of the Word from an unchanging God. Although it may be difficult to establish a close relationship with a child who has withdrawn from family and values contained in the Bible, as parents, we must reach out to our children and try to draw them close. We must live our lives in a way that demonstrates love, joy, peace with God, and with a contentment that will help our children see what God has for us.

* Proverbs 4 reminds us that God has given us good doctrine. We are encouraged to retain His words in our hearts, keep His commandments, and live. We are to get wisdom and understanding. "Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding" (vs. 7).

High speed technology will certainly help us get knowledge, but it will hardly give us wisdom. It will provide us with vast resources, but it may not do much to help us get understanding. Much of ch. 4 in Proverbs warns us to stay away from evil. We are instructed to "Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established. Turn not to the right hand nor to the left: remove thy foot from

evil" (v. 26-27).

* St. Luke 11:11-13 instructs us to give our children good food (bread, fish, eggs) rather than evil gifts (stone, serpent, scorpion). Technology has much to offer that can be good and much to offer that is very evil. We try to teach our children to avoid harmful food and physical danger. We must also teach them to learn the difference between good and evil knowledge.

* Another valuable resource for parents as they try to help their children learn responsible use of modern technology is brothers, sisters, or friends who work frequently with technology. Just as we cannot know everything possible about nutrition, health or other topics of importance as they relate to our children, we likely will not understand everything we need to know to help our children learn to use technology in a responsible manner. We should not be afraid to ask for help from those who are well informed in this area.

* There have been Conference topics, Memorandum topics and other presentations that can provide help in dealing with the vast array of challenges we face as we deal with the ever expanding opportunities that are presented by advances in technology.

* Our children's school teachers may also be a valuable resource. We could visit with them about the involvement of our children in technology in their classes. If we know our children's teacher better, we will likely be in a better position to fulfill our parental responsibilities.

Children are most likely more advanced in the use of technology, and far more comfortable in using it than their parents are. This can be a source of concern for parents, or it can be an opportunity to get to know our children better and to help them. Satan's goal has not changed. He still wants to destroy God's people. If he can separate parents from their children, he will have gained a great advantage.

God has not changed. He still wants His people to serve Him and to be eternally saved. Technology does not have to allow Satan to win this battle. "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might" (Eph. 6:10).

Mission Committee

...The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:37-38

Mission Committee Planning

Planning efforts provide clarity, focus and accountability to help us continually refine and implement our purpose. Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit will enable this planning to be purposeful and inspired (Prov. 29:18; John 16:13).

A clear statement of the MC Purpose contributes to the completeness of our Church Mission and provides direction for fulfilling the biblical directive to present the Gospel message to the lost. Implementing this pillar of the Church Mission within the counsel of our Guiding Principles improves the alignment of our priorities and decisions with the vision of the Word.

“If ye love me, keep my commandments. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world” (John 14:15; Matt. 28:19-20).

MC Purpose

The purpose of missions in the Apostolic Christian Church is to present the Gospel message of salvation to the lost in harmony with guiding, training and preparing the Church Body to serve all men, to nurture one another in the true faith and to preserve sound biblical doctrine.

Guiding Principles

1. Biblical Truth (2 Tim. 3:16-17; Matt. 28:20; 1 Cor. 9:19-23)
2. Repentance and Sanctification (Eph. 2:8-10; Acts 3:19; Matt. 3:6; Tit. 2:11-14)
3. Church development (Eph. 2:19-22;

- 1 Tim. 3:15)
4. Preparation (1 Pet. 3:15; 2 Tim. 2:21)
5. Doctrinal Integrity (2 Pet. 2:1-2; Rev. 2:14; Tit. 1:9)
6. Biblical Accountability (Heb. 13:17; 1 Pet. 5:1-2)
7. Love (John 15:12; Phil. 2:3)

Our mission efforts will have the Lord's continued blessings, if they are carried out in harmony with the four pillar Mission of our Church. Current Elder Body efforts to strengthen the unity of our church include emphasis on a balanced implementation of all four of these pillars in each congregation and throughout the Brotherhood.

Mission of our Church

1. To Present to the lost the Gospel message of salvation based on faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ and a true repentance and conversion. (Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 3:19; Eph. 2:8)
2. To teach and nurture believers toward a sanctified life and to faithfulness by God's grace and through His Word. (Col. 1:28; Eph. 4:12; Eph. 5:26-27)
3. To preserve sound doctrine and “earnestly contend for the faith.” (Jude 3; Acts 20:27; 1 Tim. 4:16)
4. To offer loving, humble deeds of service to fellow believers and all mankind in the name of Christ. (Gal. 5:13; Gal. 6:10; Phil. 2:7)

Mission Committee planning has included provision for needed support for brethren sent for long term service by either the MC or World Relief in the form of the Servant Fund, which is functioning quite well. Additional effort has focused on expansion of communication throughout the Brotherhood to include the establishment of a

national church web site and current development of a web site for mission activities to augment the communication with Silver Lining articles, pulpit announcements and Conference exhortations.

Perhaps the most critical message to be sent throughout the Brotherhood is the reminder to be prayerful for this work. Jesus said, “... pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth laborers into his harvest” (Luke 10:2). Jonah learned that “Salvation is of the Lord” (Jon. 2:9), and we must all remember that He is the one who draws the hearts of man and can bless our feeble efforts.

An important step in the MC's planning and implementation is the establishment of an Outreach Committee. The charge of this committee is to develop more complete and biblically based procedures for selecting, equipping, sending and nurturing brethren for cross-cultural mission work at home and abroad. This effort to share responsibilities and delegate various duties is being done in the spirit of Acts 6, when the early church found the need to enlist the help of more brethren to carry out the Lord's work.

It is expected that there will be increased efforts to provide opportunities for brethren to utilize their gifts by answering God's call and being sent by the church to spread the Gospel message to the lost. All of these mission outreach activities will be developed and implemented within the Mission Purpose, Guiding Principles and Church Mission, as outlined above. The Outreach Committee has begun its work and we plan to provide a progress report in the next issue of the Silver Lining (January 2008) on this Mission Committee page.

Goodfield Distribution Center

The National Distribution Center Committee coordinates six distribution centers. These locations are Goodfield and Fairbury, Illinois; Wolcott and Bluffton, Indiana; Bay City, Michigan; and Sterling, Ohio. This committee also supports the distribution efforts in Athens, Alabama.

The centers receive material donations from individuals and corporations, including food products, medical supplies, clothing, and household items. These donations are distributed locally, shared with other centers for their local distribution or packaged and shipped internationally. Each facility has specialized activities unique to their center.



This article focuses on the work at the Goodfield Distribution Center, which serves 5 areas: clothes packing, kit supplies, local furniture collection and distribution, Mexico and Jamaica shipments. There are 11 central Illinois churches represented in the work at the Goodfield Center. Each church has its representative which forms the committee that determines the work actions.

Clothes packing

The Goodfield Distribution Center collects clothes in any and all conditions. They sort them, and those that are not useable are sold for rags. Clean used clothing in good condi-

tion is packed in bulk and shipped to those in need across the world. Groups from local congregations pack clothes on average 3 times per week. They ship 3 to 4 containers of clothes each year, usually to Eastern Europe or the Ukraine. Summer



clothing is shipped to Jamaica and Mexico. They are open to utilizing additional shipping sites as they usually collect and pack clothes faster than they can organize and pay for shipments.

Health & school kits

The distribution center acts as a source of kit supplies to local congregations and a holding point for completed health and school kits waiting to be shipped through World Relief. The mission is to buy the supplies in bulk, thereby saving money for those who would desire to put kits together. This also allows them to keep the kits uniform. They maintain a separate fund for this aspect of the center. There is a constant need for health kits being distributed through World Relief and other organizations that World Relief works with.

Furniture distribution

The distribution center serves as a collection point for area residents that want to donate used furniture

and household items that are in good condition. These items are then passed out to local residents in need that are referred by local aid agencies. The center is open on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month from 9AM - 11AM specifically for this activity. They ask that those with needs bring a referral sheet from a local agency such as Heart House in Eureka or South Side Mission in Peoria. You can also contact your local committee member and make arrangements directly.

Mexico & Jamaica

The center serves as a collection point for goods being shipped to various agencies in Mexico and Jamaica. They have ongoing relationships with contacts in those places to keep an up to date needs list. Money for the items that are shipped is provided by national World Relief funds and individual donations. Usually they ship twice a year to each location. Committee members in charge of those shipments appreciate extra help preparing for shipments and especially on load-out days.

There are many other activities that are too numerous to mention. The Goodfield Distribution Center appreciates the donations of time and funding by many that make these activities possible. Maintaining Balance and Focus during the Holidays

The winter months have arrived; and for many of us that means less daylight, colder weather, and an abundance of activities and responsibilities associated with the holidays. Interestingly, up to 50% of the population experience a change in mood (such as depression) during the wintertime. Many people find the holiday season to be a stress instead of a joy. Instead of feeling grateful for their many blessings and celebrating the birth of Christ, their focus may be on feeling stretched between the many family obligations, complicated family relationships, or not having family to celebrate with. In addition, they may be "burdened" by the need to find appropriate and ample Christmas gifts for family and friends, attend various get-togethers, dinners, and programs, all while trying to continue our typical busy routine.

Can we keep a balanced lifestyle during the holidays and stay focused on what truly matters? With some extra work and purposeful determination, we can. Following are some helpful tips that can help keep us balanced and focused.

Focusing on the true meaning:

Psalm 29:2, "Give unto the Lord the glory due unto his name; worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness."

Colossians 3:1-2, "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth."

The true meaning of many sacred holy-days, such as Christmas, has been diluted due to the influence of our culture and also our own tendency to get wrapped up in various activities, expectations, etc. What better way to deal with the lack of balance during the holidays than to remember their true meaning. The birth of Jesus Christ the Son of God, coming to earth as a baby, fully human and fully divine, is indeed something to celebrate. We have many ways to celebrate and remember the significance of this event, and we must keep the focus on the reason why we celebrate.

Maintaining our personal and inti-

mate relationship with Christ is of utmost importance during busy seasons. Our relationship with Christ should be the core from which all other areas of our life radiate. Sometimes when we most need to be connected with Christ and with a body of believers, we have the most difficulty doing it. We need to make efforts to immerse ourselves in a Christ-centered environment, to look for opportunities that will allow us to encourage others and be encouraged by others. We can post encouraging Bible verses on our refrigerator, car dashboard, bathroom mirror, or other places we pass by often during the hustle-and-bustle of the holiday season. We need to take time to memorize Scripture verses that can help us during times we feel blue or are facing temptation.

Maintaining relationships:

God created us in His image as relational beings. His desire to have a personal relationship with us underscores how important relationships are to God. We may be surrounded by people all the time and yet still feel lonely or isolated. Overcoming isolation is a key factor in dealing with wintertime stress. Overcoming isolation involves being around people with whom we can reveal our true self, open up, relate, and share. These relationships are characterized by authenticity, accountability, and genuineness.

Giving gifts is common practice in relationships during the holidays. This process in itself can be a joy for some and a burden for others. Joy can be felt in showing gratitude and love to family and friends. At the same time, giving gifts may be a financial burden or a time burden. We may accidentally get our focus off track by being so focused on wanting to find (or receive) the "perfect" gift. Having a proper attitude is the key to both giving and receiving gifts.

Also, we may want to consider additional ways to maintain the gift-giving tradition while also remembering the less-fortunate. For instance, we can start a tradition of buying gifts for needy families or choosing a ministry to donate to instead of (or, in addition to) one of our gift-exchanges between

friends or family. Let's remember the following Scriptures as we both give and receive gifts *this season*.

Acts 20:35, "Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Romans 12:8, "He that giveth, [let him give] with simplicity."

James 1:17, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning."

Managing the stress:

Chronic stress is a problem that eventually causes physical and emotional problems for many, many people. People can become burned out (and eventually depressed) due to having difficulty setting boundaries during busy seasons. In addition, a tendency to want to please everyone exacerbates the problem. The problem occurs when good coping skills are not utilized such as when someone attempts to "stuff" emotions rather than express them in a healthy way. "Stuffed" emotions will reemerge by leading to physical symptoms or emotional eating, by causing problems in relationships, or by leading to an "explosion" of the emotion that has been kept under a tight lid for too long.

To minimize the possibility of becoming burned out this holiday season, we need to decide early-on how many activities and how much traveling we and our families can participate in at once. We should not automatically say "yes" or "no" to invitations or requests. We need to take time to pray about them and consult with those close to us.

We can take guidance from the early disciples of Jesus who, when meeting together, were characterized by joy, sincerity, and praise for God.

Acts 2:46-47, "And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart, Praising God, and having favour with all the people."





consider the Christmas story.

Matthew gives an account here, a little bit different than Luke. That Luke spoke of the journey that Mary and Joseph took as they traveled to Bethlehem and there they encountered a city that was full of people. People that had gathered together because of the decree of the king to come and to pay their taxes or to be counted. Everyone went from their own country into their land of their birth to be taxed.

It was a time of distress, I believe, for those people. It was a time of really having to endure things that they didn't want to have to endure. But they were in a land and they were under the rule of a king and of a ruler that said, this is the way it is going to be and this is what you are going to do. So they did it. Because the consequences would have been terrible. They probably would have been taken and sold as slaves. They would have lost their land, their possessions. They would have lost their children and they would have been separated from their loved ones. So they went. They went to pay their dues, so to speak.

But during this time, God was speaking to other people on the face of the world. There were wise men that came from the east. God had spoken to them. These were people, these were men that perhaps weren't at all acquainted with the children of Israel. I don't really know. But in some way, because God had given unto them a living soul as well, God used them in a powerful way. He said unto them and He gave them understanding and knowledge that there is go-

ing to be a star that is going to appear. I want you to follow that star because you are going to find something in life that you have been looking for if you follow that star.

It says, "...there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem," St. Matthew 2:1. When they got to Jerusalem, they inquired, where is He that is born King of the Jews (v. 2)? Where is He? What was the word that was going around Jerusalem, here in the midst of God's chosen people? If it hadn't been for the wise men that had come, the birth of Christ would have happened, they wouldn't even have recognized that anything at all was taking place there. That there was anything special happening at all because life was just going on on a day to day basis. They were existing. They were just existing on a day to day basis. Much like Satan would love for us to just exist on a day to day basis.

But you see, God had something so much higher in mind for man than just to exist on the face of this earth on a day to day basis. Because He had given unto each of those of us and He gives unto each of us that are existing on a day to day basis, he has given unto us a living soul. It was that soul, loved ones, that I think was pricked in the hearts and the minds and the bodies of those wise men. God spoke to their heart and to their soul and said, go and seek for something that is better. Look for it. It is worth searching for. It's worth traveling for. It is worth taking gifts of great value and finding Him and bestowing those gifts of great value on Him.

They came and they inquired. The king says, what king? I'm

the king. There's nobody more important than I. He was threatened. He was threatened by these wise men that came and said, where is He that is said that He would be born king of the Jews? Herod, not being a Jew, I would imagine was threatened. Threatened by the birth of Christ.

We think, well, what a silly thing to be. But can we really say that, what a silly thing to be threatened by the birth of Christ? When we ourselves know that there was a point in our life where we were somewhat threatened by Christ. We find it very, very intimidating to think of Christ and of His righteousness and of His glory and the fact that we are removed from Him. So they're really no different, loved ones. We really are no different that Herod himself.

But the wise men were on a mission. So Herod called the scribes and everyone together. The priests and the scribes of the people together and he demanded of them where Christ should be born (v.4). They looked and they kind of dug into their probably dusty scrolls. Well it says here, that He's to be born in Bethlehem. "... for thus it is written by the prophet," St. Matthew 2:5.

When Herod had heard that, he sent them. He "...called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared." St. Matthew 2:7. He wanted to know, is this thing really happening? "And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also." St. Matthew 2:8. I would

imagine they felt, they probably felt pretty important. We not only have been directed by God. We not only have felt the moving of something deep inside of us to go and search for something, but here is somebody of great importance saying, go and look for him and bring me word again, that I can worship him as well.

They continued on their way, following that star. That star came and stood over where the young child was. They saw that and they rejoiced. They rejoiced because their souls were lifted up with a joy that they couldn't explain. Why would they travel the many miles, loved ones, in search of a child, of a little baby? It's because, they couldn't explain it, but they were following their heart. They were following their spirit. They were following their soul as God directed them! They came, and the things that they followed; the star and the things that were told of the prophets, everything was revealed, just as it said that it would be.

They came and they found the child. It says that they fell down and they worshipped Him (v.11.). They worshipped Him because, when they came into His presence, they knew without a doubt, they knew that they had found what they had been looking for. It was so easy then for them to lay down at His feet those precious gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Because there wasn't any doubt. There wasn't any question in their mind that they had found what they were looking for. So they left everything of value that they had.

It says, that when they turned to leave, God spoke to them again and said, don't go back to Herod

(v.12). They didn't know. They couldn't see into the heart of Herod. They couldn't know that he was a wicked and selfish and proud man. They couldn't determine that. But God did. God said, don't go back there. These men were so in tune to what God was telling them that they made great effort in going around Jerusalem. They didn't even come close to it. They didn't want to disappoint God in any way. They said, let's make a wide berth around Jerusalem. Let's return some other way.

We can believe those men went on their way rejoicing, grateful and thankful, their hearts, their souls lifted up. They went with a joy because they had found something that God had sent them on a mission to find.

Has God sent us on a mission to find something? Has our heart and our soul looked for something of value? Have we found it? Have we come to the point where we recognize, yes this is it? I know this is exactly what I have been looking for. Here, I can leave all that is of value to me, because I have found that which is of great price. Of a greater price than anything that the world has to offer. Have we taken that wise man's journey yet?

It says that, at the same time, God appeared unto Joseph and said, Joseph, take the young child and His mother and go into Egypt. Because Herod would like to destroy this child. (v.13) Joseph left, it says, by night. He took the young child and His mother and went into the land of Egypt (v.14). He just remained there. Why? Because he was in tune to what God had spoken to him. He was in tune and there wasn't any Bible to turn to.

There wasn't any prophet coming to him. They had seen the angels. But I don't know that there was an angel, maybe there was an angel that appeared to him in a dream. God spoke to him. He listened. He stayed there until the time.

We go back to Herod. Herod, after some time, began to recognize, you know, I am an important man. I told those men to do something. They didn't do it. I'm upset. I'm downright angry because they mocked me. They have mocked my position as king. They have mocked my position, my political clout, my political stature. They have mocked me. So Herod, in his rage, sent his armies, sent his soldiers to Bethlehem and he says, go and slay all the children from two years old and down (v.16).

Yesterday we sat around God's Word. I'm not sure if it was Brother Jim or Brother Ted that said, man is so capable of such horrific crimes. Of cruelties. Think of those poor soldiers who had to go and to carry out that decree.

But that's the mind of Satan, loved ones. Satan is cruel. Satan will stop at nothing. It's true for you and I today as well. He'll stop at nothing. Oh, he comes as a wolf in sheep's clothing, seeking to draw away, to deceive and to misdirect us off the pathway. If that doesn't work, he'll be glad to come as a roaring lion and just rip us to shreds! Such is the heart and the mind of Satan. Because Satan understands. He has a full comprehension of what it means of this Savior Jesus. Satan understands the value of that gift that God gave. Because Satan

understands how far he is removed from God. He understands that better than anyone. I don't think we come close to understanding how sinful sin is before God.

Stop and consider, loved ones - I think it was alluded to yesterday a little bit - how it's hard to imagine when we stop and we read in the Old Testament there. We talk about David and about how here was a man of God who would say, you know, this man did me wrong. I promised him that I would not kill him. But he didn't promise that his son wouldn't do it. So he told Solomon, make sure you bring his hoar head down to the ground with blood. (I Kings 2:8,9) In other words, make sure you go out and you slay him and you kill him. This was a man of God! Sometimes it is difficult for us to reconcile how God was. How God could tell His children of Israel, go and kill everybody. Slay the whole mess of them. I think it boils down a lot, loved ones, to the fact that God is a very, very righteous God. That which is sin before God deserves punishment. No sin will ever come be-

fore God.

You can go back to the children of Israel when Moses was leading them out of the land of Egypt. There was a point where they began to rebel and they began to complain and murmur. God told Moses, stand back. Let me just destroy them. Moses interceded for the children of Israel. (Exodus 32:7-14) God doesn't put up, and will not and cannot put up with a lot of sin. But He loves His creation. He loves His Son. He loved His creation enough to send His Son to this earth, to provide a way that we could be reconciled. That a price could be paid. So that the mercy of God could extend to all of mankind.

If we ever come to a point, loved ones, where we lose sight of the fullness of the meaning of Christmas and of the value of the gift, loved ones, we're going to have to go back to the point and ask our self, how could I stand before God if Jesus Christ hadn't come to this earth? Not a one of us could. Not a single one. If the truth really be known, probably not even a child, because of the inherited sin. But He sent His Son.

Jesus came and He brought a righteousness that He is willing to impart to you and I. Our souls understand that because they were given from God. They desire to go back to their Creator. Let's make sure that our minds understand that as well. That we're glad and that we understand that through Jesus Christ, through this gift, this priceless gift that God has shared unto us, we can have joy. We can have peace. In the midst of a dark and sinful world, there is hope and there is life. Because God loved His creation. The only way He could purchase that creation back, was that His Son would spill His blood there upon Calvary's cross as a price for you and for me.

So let's be thankful. Let's be appreciative. Let's understand that this is a time of great joy. But the joy is for our hearts and for our souls. The joy is that we are here and He has provided a way that we can get over there, to that land we call - and we look forward to - referred as heaven. Life everlasting and joy and beauty indescribable.

REMEMBERING

Our Spiritual Heritage

Prosperity

Compared to yesteryear — and the days of the early forefathers — we have a comfortable mode as we attend worship each Sunday at our various congregations. Across the states in our denomination there are a host of newer church buildings; and the “older” ones are very nice and comfortable. We have nice, paved parking lots, easily accessible carparks, and congregational layouts that largely are on one floor. Plentiful fellowship area(s), along with spacious dining rooms and Sunday school classrooms make our venues very comfortable and efficient — and reflective of prosperous times. It is truly a blessed time in which we live.

Such was not always so, especially in the early days. Both travel to and from church, along with the primitive church facilities that formerly existed in America, paint a contrast that is nearly unbelievable. While today we can travel hundreds of miles on fast-paced Interstate highways, and then worship in spacious and convenient assemblies, it was not always so, as the following accounts show.

Partridge Township (Illinois)

Worship services were sometimes held in the Engle barn on Partridge Prairie, Illinois, near Metamora. It was here that early ministers, Benedict Weyeneth and John Krienbill, conducted services. Both of these men were untiring in their efforts as they traveled widely to conduct worship services and preach the doc-

trines of repentance, conversion and sanctification.

Marching To Zion describes that “the barns were thoroughly swept and cleaned including walls and rafters. Benches consisted of planks that were laid across logs. Chickens would sometimes wander in, but if they became too noisy, someone would ‘shoo’ them out.” The idea of planks for benches is indeed a contrast with today.

Souls who lived in Peoria crossed the Illinois River on a ferry and walked the remaining ten miles to church at Partridge Prairie. And some came from Morton and Dillon (near Tremont). This was a 25-mile distance. Horse-drawn wagons were used.

For those who walked, it required they leave home at 2 a.m. on a Sunday morning in order to arrive in time for services. After worship and fellowship, they then walked back to their homes. Indeed, they “hungered” and “thirsted” for righteousness.

Congerville, Illinois

Worship in barns was not all that uncommon in the very early days. Meetings began at Congerville in 1857. The people met in barns, homes and outdoors. A “Klopfenstein barn” was the site of early meetings, owned by Peter A. Klopfenstein, grandfather of Joseph M. Klopfenstein, who served for many years as Elder at Gridley, Illinois. It is believed that Elder Benedict Weyeneth conducted meetings

at this barn.

Diligent Servants

Michael Mangold of Roanoke served as an Elder from 1902 until his death on April 19, 1930. He preached for nearly 50 years, and was remembered at his death in a local newspaper:

“Rev. Mangold had been pastor, preacher and minister unto his congregation for nearly a half century. His salary for this was nothing more than to serve his calling. He had attended to sick beds of hundreds. He had united scores in the holy bonds of wedlock. His services had been spoken o’er and o’er again for years and years.”

Another minister with decided longevity was John W. Schmidt, who preached both at Partridge Prairie and Roanoke. A tailor, he was born on June 5, 1844, in Germany. He was a “Mideldister” which in the German language means “with the Elder.” In America, he was called an Assistant Elder. He died on October 7, 1939, at age ninety-five, after having served in the ministry for seventy-two years.


