#### Psalm 19:1-14 and Acts 7:20-43

What a beautiful message that David was inspired to write down so many years ago (Psalm 19). We can hardly imagine how different life was back then as far as technology and what they had and didn't have compared to what we have today. But yet when it comes down to the Word of God and what we need for the salvation of our souls, it's the same, isn't it?

He started by declaring the greatness of God, and showing how God displays Himself in His creation all around. "Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night sheweth knowledge." Psalm 19:2. We can just see all the things that are happening and taking place as we sometimes take a minute. Just last night I stepped outside, and it's not completely dark sometimes in the city, but just to take a minute and look up at the stars. Just to see the sky, to see these heavens that declare the glory of God. I'm sure you do it, in some way or another too, whether it's looking at some other portion of God's creation, whatever it is. God is just faithful. This cycle just continues to happen day in and day out and we know some day God is going to bring it to an end. But for now, it's for here. It's here for us to enjoy, and to really remind us as the Psalmist was reminded that our God is perfect, when it says, "The law of the LORD is perfect. converting the soul..." Psalm 19:7. It's beautiful to think that we can have complete confidence in the Creator that we worship, that when we, as we heard this morning, yield unto God - I think Bro. Chuck's closing words were: Yield unto God and He'll take care of the rest.

Right here, to anyone who's in this room who is unconverted, verse 7 and 8, it just lays it right out. "The law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple." Psalm 19:7. He will provide for us in a perfect way. It's been evident. Over time, each one of us who are His children can attest to that. That God is Good. If you see any imperfection in our life, it's not because of God. It's because of ourselves and our lack of faith or failure to obey God's commandment or we might have these errors that it talks about here in the Scripture. But we're thankful that we can go to the God and the Creator of heaven and earth, and He gives us the perfect way - the gospel message. The message of salvation through His Son Jesus Christ.

There's so many other things we can turn to in this life that, before we purchase it, we want to prove it out, we want to understand what it is, we want to get a testimony from someone else, and we find that there's flaws and there's bad reports on something. Nothing's perfect. But the Word of God is perfect. There's no revision column in this Book. It's perfect just the way it was written and you and I better take heed to it. We better take it seriously and allow it to work in our lives and allow the Word of God to wash us and to cleanse us each day.

Again to our friends, there's no more beautiful way. Every day you delay is one more day that you're going to have to repent for. It's one more day that you're going to regret. Just go interview. Talk to somebody who started repenting when they were 60, 70, 80 years old, or on their death bed. They would tell you: I wished I would have turned to the Lord earlier in my life. There's a lot of scars. The Lord can heal and He can forgive, even at that age - don't get me wrong. But the joy of not only being forgiven of our sins, but then being able to worship the Lord, live for the Lord as we walk through our life and enjoy the blessings that He wants to bestow upon us, that He does bestow on us.

There's no greater way than to follow the Lord and the Psalmist just laid out these beautiful thoughts. "The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring for ever: the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether." Psalm 19:9.

This man Moses (Acts 7), how do we relate him to our lives? The first verse tells us that he was learned in the wisdom of the Egyptians (Acts 7:22). How about you? How about me? Would it be said of us: He or she is learned in the schooling of the United States of America? Are you and I so filled with the knowledge of this world, that it can become a detriment to us? I'm thankful that I look at my brothers and sisters, and I see the wisdom and the ability that God gives each of you to carry out your task and your talent in life, and I'm thankful for that.

I think of the time of Daniel. God blessed them with knowledge and cunning in the wisdom of this world to be able to make a difference, too (Daniel 1:17). But in that case it was so that Daniel and his friends could be promoted. So that they could, in turn be

able to show to that king and to those people, their God - the God of Israel. The God of the Jewish people and to be able to exalt His name before them. It had an effect, didn't it? So when we think of ourselves, we want to make sure that whatever we're doing is for the glory of God, not trying to make a difference just in the physical aspect of life, but spiritually. That's where the blessings are going to come as we worship our Lord.

### **Light From The Word**



Loving As God Loves Us

Writings based on God's Word

We often speak of love, but many of us might struggle to define it. God's Word both defines and demonstrates

love, but before considering how, let's consider the nature of the word itself. I Corinthians 13:4-8 lists thirteen attributes of love, and each of these is an

action. People often treat love primarily as a feeling and then question its virtue when the feeling is gone. The Bible, however, describes love as an action – a commitment – enduring forever regardless of circumstances. To understand this contrast, consider the marriage relationship. If a man and woman marry based only on having "fallen in love," they have no foundation in those inevitable moments when they don't feel love for each other. However, if they enter marriage with faith that God has led them together, they choose to love with total commitment. When in stressful moments they don't feel love toward each other, they remember God's will for their union, and based on that understanding, they recommit themselves to loving each other. From this commitment and by God's grace, flows the true feeling of love in all its beauty and wonder. In any relationship, Christ-like love is an action before it is a feeling. (Luke 12:34).

By definition, "God is love" (1 Jn. 4:16). His Word is the story of His enduring love for mankind. In creating the universe, He expressed His love. In creating our immortal souls. He expressed His love. Even the existence of evil is evidence of God's love, for He chose to give us free will, without which love could not be expressed. His plan of salvation embodies His love, for having rejected Him, we don't deserve the redemption He mercifully offers us. Even secular society recognizes love by the "golden rule" - Christ's commandment to "love thy neighbor as thyself" (Matt. 22:37-40).

The Bible is full of instruction and wisdom, but Paul summarizes it all in one word: love. "...he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law... and if there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.

Love worketh no ill to his neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law" (Rom. 13:8-10). Since God is love, we must first love Him, submitting unconditionally to His will, which is to love and serve our fellow man. In doing so, we fulfill the law of

Our best earthly example of love is Jesus Christ, who said, "As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you. Continue ve in my love...This is my commandment, that we love one another, as I have loved you" (Jn. 15:9, 12). We are to love all men, and the Word teaches us how to love both our brothers and our enemies.

To understand how to love our brother, consider the following verses sequentially: "...love one another with a pure heart fervently" (1 Pet. 1:22). "But take heed lest by any means this liberty of your's become a stumblingblock to them that are weak...but when ve sin so against the brethren, and wound their weak conscience, ye sin against Christ" (1 Cor. 8:9, 12). "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another" (Rom. 14:19). "Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word or our epistle" (2 Thes. 2:15).

Love "doth not behave itself unseemly and seeketh not her own" (I Cor. 13:5) and desires the best for the beloved. Within the church, we share practical applications of the Word designed to remove potential "stumbling blocks" from our Christian walk. While these applications are not means of salvation, when done in the right spirit, they are very important and intended to help us apply Titus 2:11-14. They also are in keeping with the higher calling of love. The Apostle Paul entreats us to consider the needs and spiritual well-being of others before our own (Rom. 12:3, Phil. 2:3). Sometimes, this willing submission requires actions we might otherwise deem unnecessary. Other times, it provides the discipline to examine our own shortfalls before accusing a brother (Math. 7:3-5). Again, love is God's law, and "Great peace have they which love thy law, and nothing shall offend them" (Ps. 119:165).

To love our enemies, we must rely on

God's grace to rise above the carnal nature. "But I say unto you, love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you" (Matt. 5:44). Even when we don't feel love toward someone, we are called to love him anyway, remembering that love is an action before a feeling. We often find that choosing to love an enemy and praying for him is followed by the good feelings of

We have no more powerful example of love than God sending His only Son to die for our sins on the cross. "Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (I Jn. 4:7-10).

Reviewing the various facets of love in 1 Corinthians 13, one finds that Christ's supreme sacrifice reflects each of these attributes. Our charge, therefore, is given in 1 John 3:16: "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because He laid down His life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.'

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man" (Ecc. 12:13). Jesus and Paul taught that love fulfills all of God's commandments, so we can conclude that love itself is the "whole duty of man." (Matt. 22:36-39) Are you fulfilling your duty to love God and one another as Christ has loved us? This kind of love calls us to obedience: "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous" (1 John 5:3). In loving God and one another, and in keeping His commandments, you will fulfill His purpose for your life.



...The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:37-38

#### Lifeline in Haiti

Lifeline is an organization in Croix-des-Bouquets, near Portau-Prince, Haiti. Its mission is to care for children and provide aid to the people in the surrounding community. The Lifeline compound consists of an orphanage (currently home to about seventy children) and a school, which is attended by the children of the orphanage as well as children from the village.

As a result of a long-standing relationship with brethren from Fairbury, work teams have been going to Lifeline for eight to ten years. Also, shipments of food, clothing, and other humanitarian aid have been sent to provide for the orphanage as well as for distribution to the community. The work teams have erected needed buildings, such as a warehouse which is especially useful for storage and distribution of shipments that have been sent, and renovated existing buildings, such as the dormitories for the children and the guesthouse/clinic/office building.

Work teams, along with hired local Haitian workers, built a cement block wall around the field area so that crops could be grown and harvested for use at the orphanage and to be sold at the market. In addition, work teams installed an irrigation system, both aboveground for the production of crops and underground for pasture for the goats. The agricultural program has also been a good opportunity for the children to work and to learn. Medical teams have gone to help with clinics both at Lifeline and in surrounding villages. New sewing machines have been provided and sewing classes started to help children learn skills that can be used life-long. There is a good well on the property, providing clean fresh water for the orphanage and the irrigation system, as well as a good water source for the community.

There is always a need to help the older children obtain trade-school training, or higher education, or productive employment opportunities. Also, there is a concern to provide for the young people when they reach an age to be more on their own but in a continued spiritually-nurturing environment. There have been some adoptions from Lifeline to the United States, but these can be very time-consuming due to obstacles of the Haitian government.



This relationship with Lifeline has also included the Bethel Church of Haiti, whose leadership has always provided spiritual guidance and direction to Lifeline; and the children of the orphanage attend the Bethel Church on Sundays. The wife of one of the pastors is the director of the orphanage. Bethel Church of Haiti began in the early 1960s with a small group of believers in Croix-des-Bouquets and has spread to include approximately 125 congregations across Haiti as well as a few in the Dominican Republic. Many of these congregations are small and their people are quite poor. Therefore, they have many needs, particularly food, clothing, schools and other buildings, and medical care. Some projects have already been completed for these congregations, with the opportunity for many more as God opens the way.

Recently, the Bethel church leadership made a request to the Apostolic Christian Church of America for some in-depth spiritual guidance in specific areas of the Christian life. This request was approved by the Mission Committee. In February 2008, an elder and three ministering brothers went to the Dominican Republic to speak on the requested topics during a two-day conference. Approximately twenty-five pastors from Haiti and several from the Dominican Republic attended. They showed genuine interest and had many questions and comments for discussion. They expressed extreme gratitude for the teachings they received as well as the Christian love and concern shared with them. The unity of the Holy Spirit was evident, even across language and cultural differences.

We pray that God will bless evervone who has been involved in any way with the work at Lifeline. Please continue to pray for Lifeline. for Haiti and the Dominican Republic, and for all oppressed people world-wide. Other ways you can help are financial aid, donations of specific needed items, participation on work teams and help at local World Relief centers to sort and prepare items for shipment. Our prayer is that God will continue to provide opportunities and bless the efforts to provide spiritual and humanitarian help to those in need.

#### APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped began providing services in October of 1971. At that time there were very few services for people with developmental disabilities aside from state hospitals. It was very innovative to provide a home in the community and there were few existing services to model after. Our services started with a large home. Initially there were 52 beds and then it was expanded to 104.

Like all services and businesses, change is a constant thing. Over time it became clear that some people could do better in smaller settings. It also became clear that there were people with higher needs who were not being served. Our services began to change to adjust to these needs. Over time smaller homes were developed and the population at Timber Ridge evolved to individuals with intense medical needs and individuals who required much higher levels of personal care. At one time there were 12 wheelchairs at Timber Ridge and now there are about 65 wheelchairs.

These changes have gradually occurred over a period of time. During this time several things have become clear. One is that because of the high needs of people living at Timber Ridge and the equipment associated with these needs, Timber Ridge is over crowded and needs to serve a smaller number of people. The other thing which has become clear is there are additional people who can be served in smaller settings than the ones they are currently living in.

Because of these factors, we are once again making some changes in how we deliver services. Over the next couple of years we plan to decrease the number of people served at Timber Ridge by 24. This will leave 72 people. This will help with the overcrowding. We plan to offer these 24 people the opportunity to live at one of our 16 bed homes. As a part of this plan we will offer 24 people currently living at Oakwood and Linden an opportunity to live in a house in the community.

We will need to develop a plan and

have it approved by the state of Illinois. They are very supportive of these types of changes. This project will require a great deal of planning, including how to staff the new arrangement of services, how to provide supplies most efficiently, how to provide transportation from scattered sites and how to deliver and supervise professional services.

We are pleased that we have Elder support and that the Board of Directors has not only supported this plan but was instrumental in initiating the plan. There will be a significant cost to obtaining the six additional houses that are needed to make the moves. There will also be costs associated with furnishing and supplying the homes and staff costs involved in the transition.

We are thankful for the generous donations we receive each year. We continue to need these donations to cover our normal operating costs.

We hope to be able to raise most and maybe all of the \$1.3 million in capital funds needed for this project so that we do not need to use existing funds which are needed for operations. We want to make people aware of this project and trust God will work in the hearts of those He chooses to support the project. If you feel moved to help provide assistance, we would welcome your participation by contacting administration or sending donations to the home and noting that they are for the "Right Sizing Project". Most of all, we covet your prayers at this time as always. We feel very strongly that "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it." (Psalm 127:1)

Do we thank God for all things? It seems we often have questions for God about different situations in our lives that don't seem to make sense to us. Sometimes we even convince ourselves that God owes us an explanation. But when situations confront us, either a

temptation or trial, do we take time to thank God for it? Do we trust God to bring about good from seemingly terrible situations? Do we look for ways to honor God through our actions when everything in our life seems to be going crazy? Romans 8:28 & 29 records the promise that we often forget at these times, or it can get so overused that we bristle at the words when we are struggling.

In verse 28 we read, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose". The beautiful thing in this verse is that the scripture says ALL things, not just those that make sense to us or the good things, but even the difficult things (if we allow God the opportunity) can bring about good. God's ability is not limited by our humanness, only we are.

God is gracious to provide the purpose found in the first half of verse 29 where it says, "For whom he did foreknow, he also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of his Son..." The goal of all the situations in our life (good or bad) is to teach us how to be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ God's Son. Jesus certainly gave us examples of honoring God in both good and bad situations.

As difficult of an issue as this is for Christians to understand and even harder to practice, imagine trying to teach this to a group of children who do not know the Lord. This is the constant battle being fought by the Houseparents and Foster Parents in each of their homes. They daily have an opportunity to witness to the greatness of our Father in heaven. Please pray that as they face each situation with a child in their homes that they are able to look to the Father for their strength through the Holy Spirit.

#### **Communication As A Tool For Parents**

Parenting has often been limited to three elements: Rules, Correction and Discipline. We provide the children with the rules. When they break the rules, we implement the correction. When discipline is needed, we announce the price the child will pay for breaking the rules. These elements are needed in every family, but for many children, this is the extent of most parents' communication.

The art and act of communicating isn't always so straightforward. The Old Testament example from Esther of King Ahasuerus asking Haman "what can be done unto the man whom the king delighteth to honor?" was certainly a question with a greater message. Unfortunately for Haman, his interpretation of that message was definitely not as he had expected. He thought the king wanted to honor him rather than Mordecai (Esther 6).

To better appreciate the depth of what communication can be, establishing a working definition of the word is always helpful. Such a definition is needed because communication can appear to be a simple task, yet be more complex than just two or more people engaged in conversation. Communication also takes many forms other than just the spoken word. Communication occurs when a message is sent by a sender and received by a receiver. Complications occur when the message sent does not equal the message received. These complications can become magnified when various styles of communication are overlooked. Successful communication requires the appropriate balance of these 4 styles: verbal (what you say); paraverbal (how you say it, or voice tone and volume); body language (the way you use your body to communicate); and personal space (what your use of space, or closeness to that person, communicates).\*

A dictionary search states that communication can be a verb meaning to give or interchange thoughts, feelings, and information by writing, speaking, etc. The Word reflects in Gal. 6:6 "Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things." The Greek definition of this use of "communicate" encourages us to enter into fellowship and make one's self a sharer or partner. This verse emphasizes giving and certainly heightens the need for Moms and Dads to give of their time, perspectives, and patience in order to know their children in the deepest and broadest sense. The tenderness of children's hearts and their emerging ability to comprehend are significant factors in the effectiveness of a parent's way of sending, or trying to communicate, a message. It is often helpful to remember the child's developmental stages of growth and that the skill of listening matures with time and consistent practice.

A richer dimension of communication must lie beneath and support all we say in providing rules, holding our children accountable, and administering discipline. Communication is most effective when parents are able to discern the setting and scenario that the child is in and then utilize an appropriate method of presenting the intended message. The following eight elements of communication, when applied in love, can establish a deeper and more effective bond between parent and child.\*

Encouragement: Children need communication designed to inspire and fill them with hope and courage.

Correction: When a child needs to be brought into conformity with a standard, correction remedies something that is wrong by showing what is wrong and what needs to be done to make it right. Rebuke: A rebuke censures a behavior. Sometimes a child must experience a parent's alarm and dismay in regard to their behavior.

Entreaty: This is an earnest and intense plea from a parent to their child to make a wise decision. It is a special kind of communication that is reserved for use in special cases.

Instruction: Instruction is the process of providing a lesson, precept or information that will help a child understand his world and his place in it in relation to both other people and to God.

Warning: A warning is a powerful way to alert a child to a probable danger while the child still has time to escape unharmed.

Teaching: This is a process of imparting knowledge. It is useful as a follow up to an event or as part of preparing for what might lie ahead.

Prayer: This essential element allows opportunity to build the relationship between the parent and God, between the parent and child, and between the child and God. It is also a consistent way of providing instruction and insight for the child.

Factor in the temperament, personality and upbringing of the parent; some of these forms of communication may be easier to implement than others. Most parents definitely have strengths that allow them to utilize a couple of the eight elements more readily than the others. Conversely, a parent that is easily frustrated or angry may also tend to focus primarily on one element type. As with the Fruits of the Spirit, the goal of a parent should be to plant, prune and pick a complete harvest of the eight elements of communication with their child.

es' life here that are real interesting to is as we read it. It says, "...when he was ull forty years old, it came into his heart o visit his brethren the children of Isael." Acts 7:23. But it already said he vas mighty in the works of the Egypians (v. 22). Yet at forty years old it ame into his heart to look back to Isael, and look back to his childhood, his ipbringing. We know the story that Moes was this baby born to a Jewish nother, and there was a time there vhen all the babies were going to be detroyed. So he was protected by being ut in this little boat out in the bulushes. The kids know the story better han I do. He was protected and he was ound by Pharaoh's daughter. Then he vas given back to a maiden to nurse lim, which was his own mother, I beieve. Then in due time, was given back Ind was raised in Pharaoh's house. (Exdus 2:1-10)

So Moses was too young, at that oint, to understand his family heritage. But apparently it was told him over ime, and there was a time when he deired to go back. But he went back on his wn conditions, and from his own interst, it sounds like. Because he went back nd he thought he was going to start deending one of his own, and we know hat he ended up committing a murder y smiting an Egyptian. Then we know hat he had to run and hide for forty ears. (Acts 7:23-29) I guess what I'm etting at here, and what the Scripture s saying to me right now, and maybe to ou too, is that God has a time table. That first time that Moses thought he vas going to step in suddenly as this forign person to all his people, this Egypian man to them, and to step in and be heir leader – it just wasn't God's time, and it wasn't God's place yet. It was another full forty years before that hapbened.

I do feel moved that maybe we could alk a little bit about the ending of this chapter, because it might have application to some of us here who won't be here so long today. We fast forward a little bit to Moses going up to the mountain, Mount Sinai, and receiving the ten commandments from God. And being up there – was it forty days, forty nights? Something like that – and the people down in the camp lost their faith. They lost their patience. They turned away from the God that they were worshiping, the God that had helped them through thus far, and the God that had

blessed them in so many ways. What did they do? They turned to the gods of this world. (Exodus 31:18, 32:1-6)

Loved ones, there are a lot of gods in this world. We could probably debate which generation, throughout the history of time has had more temptations, and more false gods to worship or to be tempted with. Which generation Satan might have worked at the hardest, and the longest or whatever. But I believe we can say this; I believe we can say that Satan today knows that his time is shorter than ever before. And I believe because of that, he's maybe using the same bag of tools, but I think he's working harder.

We heard this morning, he's working very hard on the younger generation. He wants to deceive and to keep them in deceit. These people here turned to the gods that were around them, the gods that they were exposed to, whether it was in Egypt or along their way out in the wilderness. These other countries around about them that God told them to have nothing to do with them: keep your paths straight, look to Me and don't have any dealings with these gods.

What did they do? Shortly after Moses, their leader, walked away, they went and they worshiped these calves. They had Aaron build this calf for them. We look back at that story and we almost chuckle to ourselves. How ridiculous it was that they would take their gold and melt it and have him form this calf and they would worship it. I don't think any of us would do that. But there must have been some deception there in their minds that would allow them to do that, to erect something (whatever it was) and to put it in front of them, and to worship it.

I have to ask myself as a parent: What are we allowing, what am I allowing my children to have in front of them to worship it? Maybe you want to ask yourself the same question. No, none of them would say they are worshiping it. That might be a stretch. But what is it that our younger people are putting between themselves and God and salvation? What are they putting between them, why aren't they grasping and understanding that the way of the Lord is perfect and it can convert their soul? It can give them joy and peace and happiness and contentment forever! It's because the god of this world is giving them so much. He is blinding them with so much entertainment, with so much to be put in front of them. Unfortunately, they can look around society as a whole and they can see that those same things are prevalent in society, and it makes it more difficult.

There was a time in society where, at least going back in my day and time and beyond, in the history of the United States, where even people that weren't maybe completely converted, they still lived upstanding lives. They dressed appropriately. They lived appropriately. The sin and the vice that was going on was in a small part of society and that was at the outer fringes, so to speak. It was frowned upon by even the unconverted. And most people went to church.

Now we have a changing landscape. We have Satan that came in from a different angle in the last generations, and he's deceiving from a whole different perspective. He's deceiving the entire society to fall into sin, to accept sin, to accept that black is no longer black, white is no longer white and that all the lines of discernment are blurred, changed, and are different. We even struggle with it as brothers and sisters, as a church. We wonder, where is the fine line between worshiping God and the world? We know even the book of James and other places tell us: love not the world or the love of God cannot be in you. (I John 2:15) We all believe that and we follow that, but yet where is that line? Where do we draw the line? I might say that depending on where you and I as fathers and mothers or grandparents draw the line, is going to make a difference to our children and to our young people. I don't know, am I confusing them by where I draw the line in my life? Or am I helping to define for them right and wrong according to the Scriptures? How about you? We just have to ask ourselves, we have to really look in our hearts and into our lives and see where we're at with this.

None of us would build a calf, but what about these other gods? It says, Moloch and the star of Remphan, (Acts 7:43) and these figures that they made to worship them, and all these things that were gathered up by the heathen nations around them. What is it that is so attractive to the ungodly world around us that attracts us? What is it that tempts us and draws us to these things? Because when it draws us to these things, as those who represent God and Jesus Christ (we're His disciples, we're His children, all those various terms that the Bible talks about), if we're drawn to these things, how can we expect that our youth and the next generation won't be? So our only prayer is

that somehow, some way God would.

As we heard this morning, God is all powerful. God is more powerful, and He has storehouses of power and ability that He can tap into that's always been there. God has always been as good and as great as He ever can be, but God is able to be Almighty. He is able to give more grace and more wisdom - whatever it is - to our friends, to our children, that they could see through and beyond the deceitfulness of this world that we live in. That they can repent by God's grace, and they can come unto the Lord. They could feel His nearness and that they can live for Him and they can give this whole life. Deny themselves, take up the cross and follow Him. Feel the blessings that we can feel, too.

So we want to have that faith and that confidence that that can happen, that will happen. But we just want to keep praying, and keep praying more and more. It would be good to get lists. Pray with a list if we need to. If you're like me and you forget names, it wouldn't hurt. It would be good for us to keep praying and to understand the power of prayer and the power that we can have. The power that we can tap into because we have the source, we have the God of heaven and earth that loves everyone and cares for everyone and wants every soul to live in heaven for ever and ever with Him.

So we want to encourage each other to continue steadfast and to not be discouraged, but to allow God to keep working in our lives. He might work in a strange or a mysterious way. His time table might be a different time table than yours and mine, and as I think of that, we go back to Moses.

Forty more years expired it says, as he was hiding out in the wilderness until a time and a day that he didn't understand it. Dear friends, be listening for the call of God. Because it could be at a time and a day you don't understand it either. I can remember the very day I repented. It was January 20, 1981. But I didn't have any idea when I woke up from my bed that morning, that that would be the day that God would call me. And I'm sure He called me many times before that, but for some reason I had the grace and the ability to answer that call that day. And I can assure you as Bro. Chuck said this morning, that the hardest part was to go tell someone that I need to repent. I was broken in heart and disturbed deeply. When I spit

those words out, I didn't even realize it right away, but within minutes and hours I could understand and feel that there was another power that had stepped in and started taking over in my life. I'm speaking for each brother and sister here. It was the Spirit of God that started taking over and working in my life. All those worries, all those fears about those mountains, that were in front of me and: what are my friends going to think, and: how am I going to go to school... Back then the guys wore their hair longer and I was going to have to get a haircut. That was a big deal! These types of things became nothing. God just wiped those worries away, and He took me into the palm of His hand and He carried me right along. He carried me right across the sand like in that poem where there was only one set of footprints. God carried me when I needed it. Your moms and your dads can express the same thing. Those who are converted can say that God did the same thing to them.

So we want to be ready when God calls us. We want to answer the call. Because He may not come by again. It's just like waiting for a bus, or a plane to take a trip somewhere. We don't want to miss that bus, we don't want to miss that train, because there may not be another chance.

Moses was the same way. He was there wandering around in the wilderness, and he saw something that caught his eye from a distance. It was the bush that was on fire. Curiosity got the best of him, and he went over there, and behold, it was a bush. (Acts 7:30) This doesn't describe it in as much detail as the Old Testament, but I think it was the bush that was burning but wasn't being consumed (Exodus 3:2). Really that's the way our God is too. He's a God that, I think it says, consumes with a burning fire (Hebrews 12:29). But in this case, God was trying to attract Moses to what He was trying to show him. Moses went over there, and it says he trembled. He trembled at the sight of God, or at the power of God (Acts 7:32). That's certainly the way it should be in our own lives. That we can tremble when we see the power of God working.

It says Moses durst not even behold it (Acts 7:32). I take that to mean he almost covered up his eyes. He couldn't look at it. Just like other times and other Scriptures where men could not even look at God or the power of God when He was working. Because our God is so holy and so great.

But there was a voice that came from that tree. We know the story so good But that voice called to Moses and first told him to be appropriate. It says "...Put off thy shoes from thy feet: for the place where thou standest is holy ground." Acts 7:33. I sometimes wonder...do I grasp, do you grasp (you might ask yourself), do we grasp that the God we worship is holy? Do we grasp that when we drop on our knees to pray, that in a sense that's holy ground? We're talking to the God of heaven and earth. don't know if I often think of that enough, but to think that God gives us this avenue to be able to talk with Him to be able to commune with Him.

Then I find myself feeling bad be cause maybe I drift off in my thoughts when I'm praying, or maybe at night fall asleep or something while I'm on my knees, and those types of things. So maybe in our prayer life we want to remember, maybe it's not the length of the prayer, but it's a sincerity of the prayer It's the pattern Jesus gave in that prayer, that He told us: "...Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name." Matthew 6:9. We know that by heart, I'm sure. We can keep that simple pattern of honoring the Father first, and then the asking for those simple things of life, the daily bread and maybe it's not bread - we don't necessarily think of just bread, but do we stop and ask the Lord for wisdom for each day? Just for today one day at a time? We also heard that this morning – one day at a time. "Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself..." Matthew 6:34. Tomorrow has a whole new set of worries and cares. Just let's take today.

Do we ask the Lord in our prayer: Dear Lord give me grace, give me wisdom for this day, how I can get through this day, how I can affectively be a light and example to those round me, how I can (for those of us who are parents or grandparents) teach by example to my children. Say the right thing. Make the right decision. As parents, we often get. we might say, blindsided by one of our kids asking: Can I go here? Can I go there? Can I do this or that?, unexpectedly - kind of like Moses came across this flaming fire from God unexpectedly there out in the wilderness. Sometimes we have to really be thinking and praying on our toes. Spiritually we have to know and think about for a minute what the best advice to give our children would be. Sometimes we're too busy in life and we just don't think about it and

ve just make a quick decision and let hem do maybe what we regret having hem do later. So, we want to be on our pes spiritually. We want to read, we rant to pray, we want to let God direct s. In that simple prayer, it says also, he Lord teaches us how to ask forgiveess of others and ask God to forgive us.

And then to think about, I think the nd of the prayer, it talks about the kingom and the glory forever and ever, men. Then we think about heaven, raybe that would be one of our noughts in the morning, too, to think bout heaven. Maybe each of us think bout heaven in a different way. Maybe can really strike your heart or mine ist to think of a loved one that was close us that has gone on to their reward. Ve think about their faithful life, or we nink about that they're resting in eaven right now. Maybe that's what ne trigger would be to help us think bout that each morning as we move ito our day, because it helps put everyning in perspective. It helps us realize hat the life that we're dealing with. nese day-to-day issues, and raising our hildren, and the decisions we make at ork and school seem so real and imporant and overwhelming to us. But when e can think about heaven each mornng to start the day, it can kind of put nings in perspective that someday all nose worries and cares are going to be riped right away, and what's only going b count is what we've done for Christ. When the Lord does come to take us. nose day-to-day cares of life probably rill not be a concern anymore. But gain, if we can take life one day at a lme and put our trust in God.

So Moses was eighty years old and the ord told him to take off his shoes, and there he stood was holy ground because tod was there. Everywhere God is is oly ground. Not that we really worship he ground. We worship God as a Spirit, ut we reverence His sanctuary here; or example, the old church, things like hat.

God had a plan for Moses at the age of ighty. Most of us are retired and thinking about enjoying the last few years of ife that we might have. But God had a plan for Moses at the age of eighty and He told him that: You're going to go back and talk to Pharaoh, and you're going to go back in there are you're going o let me use you, and work through you, o work through Pharaoh to let my people leave Egypt. You're going to take hose, at least over a million people was t? Or was it 6 million? Whatever it was,

I don't want to say a number not knowing for sure, but it was a lot of the children of Israel that for 400 years had grown and multiplied in Egypt. God told Moses: You're going to go in there and you're going to take them out, by My hand and by My might, you're going to make that happen. (Acts 7:34,35)

It's an amazing thing. I wonder for you and for me, do we sometimes hesitate to take on what God wants of us in our life, in our little corner? You know, for Moses to go in there and to face Pharaoh like he did took a lot of grace. I've often thought to myself - I haven't been in the presence of too many important political people, leaders of our land, but I think all of us might have our own little political thoughts on different articles we might read in the paper or something and we might say: Well, I'd set them straight! I'd tell it like this. But I think if we really got in front of somebody such as our president or whatever, we would be in awe and we would have some fear and trembling. For Moses and Aaron to be able to go in there and do what the Lord did, and to continue to be steadfast even when Pharaoh tried to cut the corners and say: Ok, You and the men can go, but you have to keep the animals here. Or: You and the soldiers can go. but the women and the children have to stay behind - I don't remember all the details, but Pharaoh remained hardened and continued to resist God's word and God's will. But Moses and Aaron, by God's grace, remained steadfast along the initial instructions that God gave them.

That's what you and I want to do. We don't want to have any compromise with what God's plan is. And when we put it in our hearts not to compromise, God will bless us and He'll provide those miracles that He did before Pharaoh and the children of Egypt there to be able to make them finally see and to understand. Even though Pharaoh was probably the last one to really understand. His heart was so hardened that he wasn't willing to give in for the longest time. But in the end, God prevailed and after 400 years of suffering and slavery, really, they were able to come out. I've often thought of. I'm not sure I could even grasp 400 years. I think of our country being just over 200 years, and the long rich history we've had. But to think of a people that were for twice that amount of time, were in bondage and in slavery, and so evilly treated, and yet God said...we know it touched His heart, we knew it hurt Him.

Brothers and sisters, if we're going through a suffering time, if something's hurting us, in our heart, our mind, if there's a physical or an emotional or a separation or whatever it might be that we're questioning or Satan's coming in and causing us to question in our hearts: Why would God do this to me? Or: Why would God do this to my brother? How could a God of love do that? Let's go back and remind ourselves of these 400 years that God allowed His people to do that. But He says here, and He said it twice (and I think when God repeats something twice, He really means what He said, that it really affected Him), in verse 34:, "I have seen, I have seen the affliction of my people which is in Egypt, and I have heard their groaning..." Acts 7:34. So God does hear our groanings. God does feel and hear our hurts, and our groanings, and our prayers. And just like He didn't call Moses until He was eighty, we don't understand His time table for us, but know and believe that as you pray to Him, and as you continue to suffer whatever it is that you're suffering, or whatever it is that's an affliction for you, for us as a church - whatever it might be - that God is hearing! And in due time He's going to answer that prayer according to His will.

We know the story of Moses and the children of Israel did escape over the Red Sea. They were brought into this land flowing with milk and honey and they were blessed in many, many ways, even thought at times they really failed God and they were punished. But God meant to bless them in a perfect and wonderful way and He means to bless you and me in a perfect and a wonderful way as well. That time may not come until we get to heaven. God promises us; He gives us today, and He gives us that daily bread, and He gives us the basics of life, but He doesn't promise us more than we really need. He doesn't promise us all of our wants in life. But whatever it is, whatever our burden, whatever our trial, whatever our situation is in life if we can willingly endure and keep praying to Him, if it's His will, He'll remove it in His time and according to His time table. In the meantime, we could be a blessing to Him as we endure and as we suffer for His name's sake.

"...My grace is sufficient for thee:" He says, "for my strength is made perfect in weakness..." II Corinthians 12:9.

#### Joseph Bella

Brother Joseph Bella, of Hungarian extraction, was an early church pioneer of our faith here in the United States. Having been instrumental as well in the early formation of the church in Hungary, he eventually immigrated to America. He is known for his many travels in developing churches in several states. His early home was at Sardis, Ohio, where he labored with Elder Bro. Isaac Gehring. Joseph Bella was know as a "roving Elder" because he traveled so much giving assistance to newlyconverted souls, and helping the new congregations thrive.

He was a single man who never married. It has been known for quite some time that he made a promise in his youth that he would never marry. For years I was unaware of the reason for this covenant he made with God to never marry. Recently, I learned about the reason. He had an illness of some kind, and he promised God, if he was healed, he would never marry.

As the years transpired, he did indeed intend to marry a sister in the faith (in Hungary). Some of the brethren, however, reminded him of the previous promise he had made. He then relented from marrying, and remained single, although it is thought he sent financial assistance (alms) to that sister for many years. Integrity then, as now, was a strong princi-

ple among our brethren.

As a single man in America, Bro. Bella lived in a woodshed next to the old Gehring homestead near Sardis. An excerpt from Marching To Zion states, "The small Bella dwelling consisted of a woodshed 'lean-to' on one side and a two-room, two story section on the other. Bella repaired watches for his livelihood in one room and slept in the other. A large portion of his time was devoted to the Lord's work, in shepherding the small flock at Sardis as well as traveling to other churches." His travels included much walking from place to place, as he had done in Hungary.

#### Fire At Sardis

The early congregation at Sardis (1848) built their first church building in approximately 1850. Prior to that they assembled in homes. Soon, however their little log church caught fire and was completely destroyed. A rail fence near their church caught fire and flames eventually spread to the church. This occurred at night or at a time when no one was in the area. The next time the believers assembled for worship, they arrived to find their church in ashes. Indeed this was a blow to those first brethren at Sardis, having only been in America two or so years, and still acclimating themselves to all the challenges they faced, both financially and socially.

Elder Gehring added a room to

his home and services were hel there for several years. By 1875, new one-story building without basement was built. Over time more improvements were made and the second church (of ou faith) in America continued t prosper.

#### "Are You Able To Repent"

Scriptures indicate that me people, some times, cantind grace to repent. In Herews 12:17 it is written incerning Esau, "For he und no place of repentance, ough he sought it carefully ith tears." Therefore, I have en thinking how wonderful it if we are able to repent. In e case of Esau, he could sorw for his mistake but he uld find no place of repennce, that is, he could not find e solution to his problem.

In our church, in our usage of e word "repentance," it usuly means not only sorrow for r sins or mistakes, but also, it eans to surrender to God and put our faith in the Lord Jeschrist for forgiveness and lvation. According to Engh orthography, the letters e" mean "back" and "pent" eans "turn," or repent means o turn back to God," which is e way the word is usually sed in our church.

In the case of Judas, who beayed Christ, we read, "Then

Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself." Matthew 27:3. He even tried to make restitution by taking the thirty pieces of silver back to the chief priests and elders. His problem was that he couldn't find the grace to surrender himself to God and to believe on Jesus Christ, for forgiveness. Satan probably told him, "You are finished," and he believed Satan. We should never believe Satan.

Repentance is an experience that no one should miss out on. It empties us of ourselves and makes room for Christ to enter in and take over. The term is usually associated with becoming a follower of Jesus Christ, of being baptized, and becoming a member of our church. However, the term is used in chapters 2 and 3 of the book of Revelation, which is addressed to the seven churches in Asia. and to the believers in those churches. Revelation 2:16 reads, "Repent; or else I will come quickly," and Revelation 3:19 reads, "Be zealous therefore, and repent." Repentance is for believers, too. If we are in a state of repentance, we never put ourselves above others. In Philippians 2:3 we are instructed, "In lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves." We should have self worth and self esteem but it should be based on Christ in us, and not in ourselves, for we are nothing without God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

It is not only wonderful but we should be very thankful if we have grace to repent, and to forgive others. If it is difficult for us to apologize for our errors, or to really forgive someone who trespasses against us, and to show that forgiveness by our attitude and conduct, not by words only, we are to be pitied. To be frequently apologizing may seem like a weakness but from God's viewpoint, that may be a strength.
