

Sermon by Bro. Jeff Neihouser, Francesville, IN

Numbers 1; St. Luke 22:24-38

Numbers Chapter 1 - the census of Israel. It goes on and it numbers the children of Israel at that time. I believe they numbered them so they knew how many were there of the age twenty years old and upward. And there was a reason, I'm sure, that God wanted that done.

We go back to the time of David. David counted the men that would go to battle and God punished him. Men were killed because of that punishment. (II Samuel 24:2,15) We see a change in how God handles different situations. The reason they were punished in David's time, is because they needed to trust in Almighty God, and not trust in their numbers. Here God was saying: Moses, I want you to know how many that you have.

Realize that God has a plan. He has a plan for your life and for mine. It says here, "Take ye the sum of all the congregation of the children of Israel..." Numbers 1:2. Take notice! Take the number. And we know that God has a plan. I don't know how it is for you, but you look at how something is going in someone's life, and you think, well, I'm just going to follow that pattern. Well, God may have a different plan. Maybe like it was for Moses and it was for David, a very different application of counting. But you and I, are we following after someone else or are we following after the Lord Jesus Christ and trusting in His plan? It may be different than someone else's.

I don't know about you, but I get security in seeing what is going on in someone else's life. I can watch that pattern, and say, Ah, if I just follow that pattern, then it will lead to the same outcome. The Lord says: I want you to trust in Me.

"Even all they that were numbered were six hundred thousand and three thousand and five hundred and fifty." Numbers 1:46. Six hundred three thousand, five hundred fifty were over twenty years of age. So there was a reason they were numbered. That's a lot of men that are ready to go to war for the children of Israel.

I want to go back here in this Bible.

There's a little introduction. It gives a little bit of background or overview/summary of the book of Numbers. I'm just going to read this, so this will help. This is not the Scripture; this is a summary of what this is about: 'The title Numbers was evidently given to this book because it describes the way in which an elaborate census of Israel was taken. The narrative core of this book is an account of the Israelites thirty eight years of wandering in the journey from the Sinai Peninsula to the plains of Moab. The opening chapters (which is what we just read) relate in detail to the organization and preparation of Israel's advance toward Canaan. And then the concluding chapters tell the Israelite encounters with the Moabites and some of their other conquests.'

But the beginning part was about good order. They had to be numbered so that they knew what they had.

Then it goes on into chapter two and it talks about their arrangement. As we think about the center of this tribe of, I believe it was several million people, as they left Egypt they came and they are now in the wilderness. "And the LORD spoke unto Moses in the wilderness of Sinai..." He said, we need to take a count "...in the tabernacle of the congregation, on the first day of the second month, in the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt..." Numbers 1:1. So now they've been traveling for two years on a journey that would have taken a few weeks. A journey that did not have to be a long journey. If you look at a map, you see where they're at in Egypt and they want to go the Promised Land. If they got on the shortcut and they got on that road (there was a road that went right around the Mediterranean), it was maybe a two week journey. But they needed a longer journey to get from, not the location that they were, but the heart that they had. They needed to take a longer journey. They had to go down across the Red Sea.

They needed to trust, and what happened? A few days into their jour-

ney they see the water in front of them and the army behind them. They had

Doctrinal Integrity

Writings based on God's Word

The terms "success," "prosperous" and "profitable" usually evoke thoughts of material gain. They are used in the Word of God to describe the spiritual gain to be obtained from understanding and applying doctrinal truth (Josh. 1:8; 2 Tim. 3:16-17). Doctrine refers to that which is taught directly in the Bible. The first article of our Statement of Faith presents the core belief that "the New Testament serves as the foundation of the doctrine of the Apostolic Christian Church."

Integrity means "uncorrupted, sound and complete." This article focuses on "doctrinal integrity," something we should all aspire to in establishing the basis for our beliefs. Doctrinal integrity is essential so that the mission of the church to spread the Gospel, nurture the believer, preserve sound doctrine and serve others may be fulfilled. The Word itself confirms the significance of doctrinal integrity and gives directions for how it can bless the heart and life of every sincere child of God.

We are instructed to teach sound doctrine by our words and our walk of life. Regarding our "words," Titus 2:1 says, "But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine." Regarding our "walk," we are taught that believers should live in such a way that "they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things" (Tit. 2:10). Sound doctrine is truth revealed through Jesus Christ: "grace and truth came by Jesus Christ: "grace and truth came by Jesus Christ: "thy word is truth" (John 17:17) and brought to our minds by the Holy Spirit, who "will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13).

Embracing sound doctrine is essential to avoid deception, so that we are not "carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men" (Eph. 4:14). Further, it is important that sound doctrine be taught and practiced so that the believer is prepared for the time of which we are warned when men "shall turn their ears from the truth, and shall be turned to fables" (2 Tim. 4:4).

In order to maintain integrity (be complete in our understanding), we must apply "all the counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). We have the assurance that "all scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is prof-

itable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (2 Tim. 3:16). Availing ourselves of the whole counsel of God will help avoid either over-emphasizing or under-emphasizing teachings, whereby we might allow our individual preferences or feelings to affect our thinking.

It is commanded in the Word that those who have teaching and ministry responsibilities be diligent in promoting sound, complete doctrine (1 Tim. 4:16; 1 Tim. 5:17; Tit. 2:1). Already in the Old Testament God stated clearly the kind of shepherds and spiritual teachers he wished to give to his people: "And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding" (Jer. 3:15). The Apostle Paul specifically instructed Timothy to be diligent in learning the Scriptures and interpreting them accurately: "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). All believers are directed to diligently search the Scriptures to confirm that what they are being taught represents doctrinal integrity. Paul and Silas were diligent in teaching the Word to the Bereans. These hearers were then commended because they sought to confirm the soundness of the teachings by "These were searching the Scriptures. more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11).

Shortly before Jesus ascended to the Father, he charged Peter to nurture the believers in sound doctrine. After asking Peter three times if he loved Him, He responded to Peter's assurance of his love with the statements: "Feed my lambs, feed my sheep (and) feed my sheep" (John 21:15-17). It is instructive to consider the Greek roots of the word "feed" as used in this teaching. In the first and third instances the root word bosko refers to "direct feeding." This same approach is reflected in Peter's teachings: "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (1 Pet. 2:2). In the second instance, the root word poimaino refers to "tending" or helping the sheep learn to find good pasture upon which they can feed themselves and be nourished. This describes the very critical ability of more mature believers to "discern the Scriptures," which is further explained in Hebrews as follows: "For every one that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil" (Heb. 5:13-14). The Holy Spirit guides us into all truth (John 16:13), and it is this doctrinal truth as revealed in God's Word that we are called upon to obey from the heart (Rom. 6:17).

Assuring the maintenance of doctrinal integrity by "rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15) requires that we approach all biblical teaching and learning with humility, recognizing we do not have all of the answers (2 Pet. 1:20). Whenever we open the Word, we should first pray, trusting that our Heavenly Father hears us and that the Holy Spirit will lead us. This will give us an opportunity to examine ourselves and, by God's grace, remove anything from our lives that might hinder the Spirit's leading. We must be careful to consider all passages of Scripture relevant to the topic being considered, as well as the historical context of each passage. We should have esteem for the thoughts of others who have also sought the guidance of the Spirit to give them understanding, for "in a multitude of counselors there is safety" (Prov. 24:6). Thus, we can learn from the experiences of early church leaders and Apostolic Christian forefathers. We can also benefit by careful discernment of reference materials such as Bible dictionaries, concordances and other appropriate, sound resources to aid in understanding of words and phrases. Finally, we must have confidence in God's Word as our final authority; adding or taking nothing away from the Word (Rev. 22:18-19). We must not be wise above what is written.

Sound doctrine, taught and practiced with integrity, will bring the blessings of unity in the Brotherhood and edification of the church, and will give glory and honor to God.

Small Church Study Committee Update

It is a joy to share the continuing work of the Lord within our brotherhood and throughout our congregations. We want to thank each one who has taken time to lift up these efforts in prayer and deed. It is encouraging to hear about the many congregations that have followed up on the recommendations and have been blessed or seek further information.

In this article some of the work and resources that are being developed to help guide our congregations in the efforts of supporting one another will be discussed. It is important to review the main recommendations that were initially given, and their scriptural basis. This motivates us to make renewed efforts in these areas.

Formal outreach programs

Developing formal outreach programs at a congregational and local level continues to be one of the more difficult areas for forward movement in many of our congregations. It is a responsibility and desire of each of us to present the gospel message of salvation based on faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ and a true repentance and conversion. This needs to be done at a personal level, as a local congregation and as a national brotherhood. There have been some encouraging approaches tried at the local level, but there is a need for increased efforts in this area.

We request to each of you to forward the names of friends that move to a location of a current congregation so that the brotherhood can reach out and offer encouragement and support to them.

Encouraging local activities and fellowship

Efforts in increasing fellowship frequency and depth have confirmed these as vital functions that enhance small church strength. "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Heb. 10:24-25)

Each of us has an opportunity to assist in this area by being hospitable to brethren, making the extra effort to attend, and encouraging these good works among our brotherhood.

Church adoption programs and sending opportunities

In the last few years, church adoptions and sending opportunities have developed and have been encouraging as well as instructive to future endeavors. Consideration is being given to having someone serve as a coordinator of the church adoption efforts.

This would provide assistance for smaller congregations to determine if they would benefit from adoption or if larger congregations have the resources available to adopt. This would also provide a point of contact to facilitate matching congregations and begin coordinating the efforts of these adoptions.

Minister rotations

Our brotherhood has been blessed to be served by our minister rotations throughout the years. We extend appreciation for the time, effort, and resources our ministering brothers share for this work and request your prayers that it may continue to be a blessing to our brotherhood. Several recommendations for improvement in the process have arisen from the brotherhood, and some of these are being addressed. One of these efforts is to centrally coordinate the minister rotation schedules that are generated by each of the small congregations requesting assistance.

A Minister Rotation Administrator has been appointed to help even the load within the brotherhood and take into consideration responsibilities and special needs that larger congregations may have in regard to rotations. The 2009 schedule will continue as it has been done in the past. The plan is to seek input this fall from both the large and small congregations, and from that input develop a process to centrally create and distribute schedules for the year 2010.

Another area that is being addressed at this time is the use of a job and/or volunteer posting board so that the brotherhood can be informed of the opportunities that are available in the location of our churches. It is hoped with better communication in this area, additional brethren will consider supporting a small congregation if so directed. More information about this site will be available at a later date.

Each of us has an opportunity to pray for the Lord's work to continue within our congregation, throughout our brotherhood and the world. We encourage those congregations with an interest to be of further service in these areas to contact the committee for more in depth information and assistance. The SCSC currently consists of Elder Bro. Ken Indermuhle, and Bros. Justin Moser, Matthew Rassi, Frank Sauder, and Loren Schrenk.

Answered Prayer in Ixtlan, Mexico

uring February and March, Bro. Bryan Stoller and Bro. Loren Schrenk conducted eye clinics, fitting people with glasses and operating on those needing correction of eye problems. They were accompanied by their spouses and others who came to assist in the work.

Bros. Matt Gerber, Spencer Lewis, Mario Cabrera, and Marshall spent time in Barra Vieja conducting Bible studies and fellowshipping with the believers and other interested persons. It is encouraging to see the spiritual growth and desire for obedience to the Word.



The construction of the school is nearing completion and work has begun on putting together the team to administer the school with the hope that classes can begin in late August. Ruth Cervantes (from Tecati, MX) has agreed to come as the administrator for the school. An additional prayer request is for a director with a primary teaching certificate who is a Mexican and also a Christian.

"Then Nebuchadnezzar spake, and said, blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who hath sent his angel, and delivered his servants that trusted in him, and have changed the king's word, and

yielded their bodies, that they might not serve nor worship any God, except their own God." (Dan 3:28) Do we demonstrate this type of trust?

Medical team

In January 2008, the fifth medical team traveled to Ixtlan to do medical training with the Red Cross (Cruz Roja) ambulance crew and the Ixtlan community. During the week, they provided twenty-five hours of training.

The Ixtlan police were trained in scene safety, traffic control, triage and first-aid skills. The Cruz Roja crew was taught CPR, defibrillator, airway management, intubation, ventilator, and mass casualty triage skills. First Aid training was given to the Ixtlan church family. At the end of the week, the Cruz Roja and police worked well together with a simulated school building collapse from an earthquake. Twenty students also participated in the drill.

Little baby Maria... in His hands

At the end of the week Sisters Rita Knobloch and Rosie Hoerr experienced an ambulance transport with the Cruz Roja. They knew that a patient on a ventilator needed to be transported to Guadalajara. When they arrived at the Zamora hospital they found out there were two premature infants to transport.

They started out with baby Maria who weighed 1kg (2.2 pounds) and was eight days old. They prayed for the Lord's help as they did not have experience taking care of babies on ventilators. They were very thankful for the donated ambulance equipment, which needed to be used at that time and were encouraged that the equipment had been maintained.

Because the ventilator stopped working twenty minutes into the transport, it was necessary to manually ventilate the baby. Her head fit in between a thumb and first finger, her arm is the size of a finger. No monitor was on the baby so they placed the donated oxygen saturation monitor on her. Maria's oxygen level should have been 95 - 100%. It went down to 74% at one point. The oxygen was turned up and they continued to manually ventilate baby Maria. Her oxygen level came up to the 90's and her pulse came up nicely also.

They prayed... "Lord you have this baby in your hands," and then needed to return to the Zamora hospital to get the ventilator fixed. They arrived back at the Zamora hospital after 45 minutes of manually ventilating the baby. After the ventilator was fixed, they left Zamora a second time with a second ambulance traveling with the second vented premature baby. As they were transporting to Guadalajara a second time they looked at each other and one said, "I have not prayed for a ventilator before but I sure am now!"

Several hours later they successfully transported both premature babies to a pediatric hospital in Guadalajara. How thankful they were for God's strength and the ambulance equipment donated by World Relief. God knew they would need it one day. They learned a lot about continual, unceasing prayer and that God is in control. He can give us the strength we need when things are out of our hands. What a relief that we can lean on him and know that "He's got the whole world in His hands!"



Update On ACCFS Services

We are thankful for the opportunities that God has given us to serve. We feel privileged to be able to encourage the spiritual, emotional, and relational growth of those we come into contact with. While some of our services are directed toward those who are struggling, over time, more and more of our services are geared toward spiritual and personal growth, enrichment, and prevention. This month this column will be devoted to informing you about the current status of our services. But, first, we would like to share several updates:

New Administrator coming in September: The Board of Directors of Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services (ACCFS) and the Elders of the Apostolic Christian Church of America have confirmed the nomination of Bro. Dennis Virkler (Congerville) to take over as the ACCFS Administrator. He has worked in Information Technology at Caterpillar since 1978, lately as an Enterprise Architect, working with over 300 people worldwide. He is taking early retirement from that position. His duties at ACCFS will begin on September 30, 2008. He will be replacing Bro. Howard Getz, who is going into retirement. Please pray for Bro. Dennis as he prepares for the new tasks ahead.

New Staff Member: ACCFS would like to welcome Bro. Curt Meiss (Morton) to our staff. He started at ACCFS as a full time clinical counselor on June 9th. His areas of focus will primarily be in marriage and family counseling, parenting, and depression and anxiety. Welcome Curt!

ACCFS Building Project: A new ACCFS office building is currently being built in Morton, Illinois. We are very thankful the Apostolic Christian World Relief is organizing volunteers to help with building process. Those interested in volunteering should contact Bro. Jerome Witzig. We are also thankful for the many people who have donated to our building fund. Without God's blessing in these ways, this building project would not be possible.

Overview of ACCFS Services: It is common for us to hear people say, "I didn't know that ACCFS offered that!" Therefore, we would like to remind you about the types of services that ACCFS offers.

Website: Our website (www. accounseling.org) is intended to make helpful information available whenever it is needed. The site provides information on mental health, relationships, and personal growth. Under each topic you can find helpful information to read, download, or print. Individuals can learn about how to find help for themselves or for loved ones. Online ordering of brochures and books is available. Information is being added to the site regularly.

Professional Counseling: ACCFS provides individual, marital, and family counseling for those who can travel to the office at 73 East Queenwood Road in Morton, IL. Hours are by appointment only. The counselors are trained mental health professionals who provide counseling from within a Christian framework that supports the doctrine and traditions of the Apostolic Christian Church of America. Many people choose to come to ACCFS because they have the assurance that their faith background will be respected and protected. Fees for counseling are based on a sliding fee scale based on family size and annual family income. No one will be denied services because of inability to pay.

Consultations with a Professional Counselor: People calling ACCFS can receive a consultation with one of the clinical counselors. Calls are received from people needing assistance for themselves, family members of those struggling, and from elders/ ministers who are assisting people. Counselors can help callers understand mental health issues and relationship problems and develop a plan of action to deal with these issues. This service is available to all of our churches by calling the ACCFS toll free number 877-370-9988.

Counseling Referral Information: People calling ACCFS can request information regarding counseling resources in their area. ACCFS maintains a database of mental health professionals located near Apostolic Christian Churches throughout the United States. Our goal in providing this service is to help struggling people find mental health professionals who are located near the caller's home area, have strong clinical skills and good credentials, and will be respectful of their client's religious beliefs and faith backgrounds. The ACCFS referral database includes counselors, psychologists, psychiatrists, specialty clinics, and support groups. In the event we do not have any referral sources in the caller's area, we will help the caller to find

Education: ACCFS counselors can provide presentations to churches or to smaller groups (such as the ministers of a church or Young Groups). Presentations may cover mental health, relationships, personal growth, or more specific issues for the ministers. ACCFS has books, brochures, and handouts available (screened or created by staff) covering a mental, relationship, and personal growth. These can be obtained by calling ACCFS or by going to our website. Some of the print materials are specifically intended for support of elders and ministers as they work with indi-

Financial Stewardship (Crown Program): ACCFS has been given the responsibility of overseeing the ongoing development of the financial stewardship program (Crown Program) in the Apostolic Christian Church of America. Print materials that have been specifically modified for our church and are available through the Apostolic Christian Publications website (www.acpublications. org). ACCFS is available to help Apostolic churches implement the Crown program in their local churches.

Apostolic Christian Way of Purity: ACWP is a 60-lesson biblically-based accountability program for individuals struggling with sexual temptation, pornography, etc. Each participant is assigned to a mentor who provides support, feedback, and guidance. The participant completes daily Bible study lessons which are then emailed or faxed to a mentor. Anyone wanting to enroll in the ACWP program needs to get the approval of their home elder. If you have questions about the program, call ACCFS or send an email to acwp@accounseling.org.

Mentor Training Program: ACCFS developed a Mentor Training Program for members of the Apostolic Christian Church of America. The mentoring program focuses on teaching individuals and couples the skills of effective mentoring. Elders identify brothers and/or sisters in their local congregation to send to the mentor training available through ACCFS. The mentors then work under the direction of the local elder.

Mental Health Forum: The counselors at ACCFS provide information, guidance, and mentoring to members and friends of the Apostolic Christian Church of America who work in or are interested in going into a mental health related field. Our goal is to offer encouragement while promoting spiritual integrity and accountability. We maintain a directory of the individuals on the Forum to encourage networking and support. If you know of someone in or going into a mental health related field, please encourage them to contact us!

Funding: A sliding fee scale based on family size and annual income is used for counseling and consultations. No one is refused services based on inability to pay. There is no fee charged for using the website. The remainder of the funding is from churches and individuals who want to support the work of ACCFS and from churches that have received services and choose to make donations to cover the cost. Once again we thank you for your prayers and support.

We appreciate the prayers of the church on our behalf. This is the Lord's work, and we desire to glorify Him in everything we do.

just come from a feast of the Passover. They had just put the blood on the door. They had just seen the power of Almighty God release them, and suddenly they were faced with another obstacle. How'd they respond? (Exodus 14:10-12)

And so how it is for you and I? What do we see in the power of God? What is our vision? I don't know how it is for you, but I don't have that good of vision. I don't have twenty-twenty. I have contacts or glasses. Vision is so important. I know there's some people here that have great vision.

I remember there was a test pilot, I believe it was a Yeager. He had like twenty-ten. He could see things that no one else could see. They said when he was flying in the military he could see the enemy coming before anyone else could see them on the horizon. He had great vision for what he was doing. What about the vision that you have for what you do? God has a plan! He wants us to see with different eyes.

They were seeing the miracles. What miracles do you and I see? Are we looking around to see the power of God at work, and do we have not only the vision to see, but do we have the memory that goes with it? As the children of Israel, can you imagine leaving Egypt after being there for hundreds of years in bondage, praying for salvation? Day after day. Do we sometimes get into a habit of despair? A habit of, well, this is how it's going to be.

We stay in the same mind thinking the Lord is going to deliver. The Lord will answer my prayer! I have the confidence and the boldness to believe that God will answer this prayer when He's ready, in His way!

Year after year after year – slavery, making bricks, building Egypt... Then along comes Moses. But it wasn't the right time. Moses came. He was coming from the palace. His heart wasn't ready either.

We had a topical study a few years ago about the heart. God is in the business of working on the heart. The hands, no. Hands are an outreach of the heart. What we do with our hands, what we do with our eyes, and our

minds, with our feet – a song comes to my mind 'Just As I Am.' Hymns of Zion #105.

The Lord wants to use us but He starts with the heart. Moses came to help his people. He came down and saw the Egyptian fighting I believe it was and he said, this is not right! He wanted to come in and he wanted to make things right for his people and he slew the Egyptian. He came back the next day thinking, they're really going to appreciate what I've done for them! And they looked at him and said, who are you? Two Israelites were fighting, and they said, who are you and what are you here to break up our fight for? What are you going to do? Kill us like you did the Egyptian? Suddenly, his heart was found out! Suddenly he was now exposed, and he fled and he went, left the palace, and forty years he spent in the school of the wilderness - raising sheep. (Exodus 2:11-15)

What a change! What would the newspaper say? What would they say about his life's change, and his reasons? But God had a plan. God was working on his heart. He was getting him ready to be the leader, the salvation of the children. He [God] was going to bring him [Moses] back, but it wasn't the right time. He was the right person.

So here's Moses. He comes back and he leads the people out. Many of you have been through the stories of the plagues. The blood on the corner posts. Three days later – they had escaped the bondage, they are free, - and they are faced with the Red Sea. How do we cross it?

What do you see in front of you? Let's remember the faithfulness of God. He's there. He's here! He's with you and I. He wants us to draw on Him. They opened the sea and they walked through. They went on. They went into the wilderness. They needed to take the path, they needed to learn to completely trust in God. As they made that journey they came up to the Promised Land. They looked in...Let's send our spies in. Let's send in the spies and let's see what this is about. Let's get ready. They were ready to take the promise, to claim the victory, to be relieved from the bondage and taken through the wilderness and now they are ready to go into the Promised Land. He's led them through, the cities are there, the houses are there, all of it is ready take the promise!

But there was a rejection. What really happened at that border of the Promised Land that day, when those spies came back and they gave their report? And what did the people say? We're like grasshoppers. They're too big for us! The obstacles are too many! We'll never take it. And then there were two that said, With the help of the Lord! (Numbers 13:30-33)

They had the memory, they had the vision, they had the heart, they were ready! They had the hope of seeing the power of God go before them and they didn't know how. That's what you and I, we get to live with the power of God within us and before us, and we have the heart to trust. Do we have the heart to trust? What happened that day when all the people said, we're afraid? Was that the problem? No! Because many of us will live through a time of uncertainty and maybe a little fear, or a lot of fear.

We cannot overcome – was that the problem? – No! Because there's many times even when they finally went into the Promised Land and went to face Jericho, that they were not going to be able to overcome that city. Six hundred thousand men – however many it was.

What was the problem that day? What did they say? And what are you and I saying today? Oh yes, we believe in God, yes we trust in Almighty God for today. What they did that day was they rejected Almighty God as the God of their future. Yes, He had led them out of Egypt. Yes, He had parted the sea. Yes, He had fed them with manna every day. Yes, He had provided quail when they needed it and they were sick of the manna. Yes, He provided for them in their past. Yes, He provided for their today. WHAT ABOUT THEIR FUTURE? They did not believe in God as the God of their future. And they said. I don't believe He will take care of us in the Promised Land. They rejected Almighty God! And God said, You're not going in you're going back to the wilderness

for forty years.

Then they said, Now we've changed our mind! We want to try it ourselves. Isn't that how it is? That's how it is for me! The lack of faith. They thought, let's just take control, let's go do it now. And they went in, thinking, well, maybe He'll let us. He said, no you've already rejected Me. And they were defeated.

So they went to the wilderness for forty years. Here they are in the second year, and they have lessons to learn: hearts that need changed. hearts that need to grow and understand that God IS there for today. He was there yesterday. And where will He be? He will be here for us for tomorrow! "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever." Heb 13:8. He is the God of the Israelites past, present and future. And He is that way for you and I. Look what He has brought us to. He has provided us the Word. He's provided us a place to come and sit and be fed - spiritually.

So they put them into order, counted them, and they go into the place of order. They want to know all the different tribes. We can see the children of Israel, as we get into the time of Jesus Christ, that their lineage was so important to them. What family are you from of these twelve? Of the descendants of Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob. And they would begin to set up. They had the tabernacle in the center of their camp and then on the east side there would be three. and on the south there would be three, and on the west and on the north. They would be all around the tabernacle and they would have the standard of their family. It would be like the Gutwein family, and the Wuethrich family, and the Huber family...whatever it would be, their family, their standard represented. This is our family here. This is where we are the head of that family, as it says here (Numbers 1:4). They would be the one that would go to the tabernacle, and they would have communication that was passed down, messages and information, and how they were to live out the law. He wanted good order so there was no misunderstanding. It wasn't just random - everyone just pitch your tent somewhere in the woods. No, it was good order. And there were families in their places.

Then there was one family, the Levites; they were not numbered and they were to come and take care of the tabernacle. This was in the wilderness. There was good order - even in the place of the wilderness. God is a God of order. He wants us to be in a place where we can absorb and learn and see the lessons and the teachings that He has for you and I.

We live in a world that's full of chaos. It's running fast. Where's it going? How about your life and mine? Are we a place of stability in the storm? Where do you and I go when things start to vibrate? Let's go to the Word. What was in the center of their camp? It was the tabernacle. What was in the tabernacle? Almighty God. How about your life and mine? Where are we camped? Let's be around the Word.

I just appreciate how the Lord provided good order. There was so much more there as you go on to read in Numbers. The first five books of the Bible there that was given to Moses, as he wrote all of that information down, the experiences in the traveling of the children of Israel, this is our Bible today. The children of Israel that was their Bible. It was what they read. They would follow, they would read that. It was their training and their teaching. Those experiences of how God led them through. We can go back and read it today and see tremendous teachings, experiences in Genesis, and the laws of Leviticus. Experiences there in Deuteronomy. But what about living them? It was a struggle.

So where did the hope come? It came in the Lord Jesus Christ. I just appreciate the power of the Spirit. I look down here (St. Luke 22) and it says fulfillment of Scripture – that is the Lord Jesus Christ. Yes, there was the beginning; there was the Garden of Eden; there was God's plan for mankind; there was the fall; there was the need for the hope through the children of Israel; the restoration of Abraham the man of faith. There were all those experiences. And while the children of Israel were on the

other side of Jordan, camping, it was year after year of funerals. Of those that were dying that did not believe. That had rejected Almighty God. There was funeral after funeral. There was lesson after lesson being learned.

But there was also fear in the hearts of those that were in the Promised Land (Joshua 5:1). Think about when they sent two more spies in. when now the transition's been made from Moses to Joshua, and Joshua was now leading the people. Moses has died and they're ready to take the Promised Land. It's a whole new generation. It's a whole new heart. And that's how it is for you and I. It's a regenerated heart. And they are there at the poise of the Promised Land. And they say, send in two more spies (Joshua 2:1). Do you think Joshua was nervous? What kind of report will the spies bring back? How will the people respond? Will they reject God again? Or will this be when they say, 'let's go'!

They went in and they saw Rahab, the harlot. They went in to her and what was her comment? I just love this comment. They don't have one battle yet inside the Promised Land. They've been traveling; they've been learning; they've been dealing with the consequences of rejecting God; and now they're getting ready to come in. The spies show up at Rahab's and she says, We know about you – and your God! And we are in FEAR! (Joshua 2:9)

Do we have that kind of fear for Almighty God? He is in control of hearts and lives! Let's yield to Him. Let's give up our lives to Him. Let's let Him be the one, the Master, the Healer, the Provider. And then as that Scripture goes through the Kings, the Judges, and all those experiences, up to the New Testament, mankind struggling. Mankind is struggling to understand and live out the law and the Lord God says, Here's my Son!

He will provide you and I the day of grace. The day of hope because of Jesus Christ. Let's take that in. The fulfillment of the Scripture. How was it fulfilled? Not in our ability to understand all of the law, and then live it.

No, it's fulfilled in one Man. The Lord Jesus Christ. Then you and I – how do we fulfill the Scripture? That is to yield and to follow His teachings.

"And there was also a strife among them, which of them should be accounted the greatest." St. Luke 22:24. Now isn't that just the world we live in today! You can put that on a headline. Who's the greatest? Whether it's in raising children, whether it's in running a business, whether it's in politics, in sports, in music - whatever it may be. Isn't that what everyone's striving for? I love those two words: strife and greatest. And that's where it usually is. There is competition. There is that - I want to be better than you! We don't even have to see it in people. We can see it in animals. Go out to a herd of horses. Go out to a herd of cattle. One is in charge. One is the greatest. One is going to get their way every time. You put some new animals out there together, they work through the pecking order. Somebody's at the bottom, and somebody's at the top. It's kind of interesting to watch. They work it out, and they work it out fairly quickly.

At our home, we've got a couple horses. We've got a mare and she's so calm, very pretty, and she gets whatever she wants. She wants that horse's feed? She just walks over and gets it. There has already been strife because there's one that's the greatest in that pasture. What about you and I? Are we striving? The greatest has already been declared. That's the Lord Jesus Christ. But mankind, it tells us right here, "...who should be the greatest." Isn't that a natural instinct? And that's what we want to die to and let it be, that we submit and serve.

"And he said unto them, The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors. But ye shall not be so: but he that is greatest among you, let him be as the younger; and he that is chief, as he that doth serve." St. Luke 22:25-26. Ah...there's the answer! Do you want to be the greatest? What did the Lord Jesus Christ do to become the great-

est? He served His Heavenly Father. Why should He leave heaven and go to earth where there's sin and there's all this striving? Why did He leave the perfect beauty of heaven? Because His Father asked Him to. Because the need was there for you and I. He served His Father, and He served you and I. How do we become a great leader? By serving. "...he that doth serve. For whether is greater, he that sitteth at meat, or he that serveth? is not he that sitteth at meat? but I am among you as he that serveth." St. Luke 22:26-27 The Lord says, I am here to serve. I am here to heal. I am here to help. I am here to serve. What are the needs? That was his eyes. That's what He was looking for. He was looking around and seeing, How can I serve? How can I be of help?

When you show up to work, you show up here to the church cleaning, people walk in. What can I do to help? What can I do to help? People changing light fixtures, cleaning walls, scrubbing floors and just cleaning. Everybody working! Everybody serving! Now, I didn't see anybody saying, well, this is my area and this is my position. No. They were serving. It was people just asking, what can I do to help? And the work got done.

Serving like the Lord serves. I don't have these kind of eyes naturally. I have to often be reminded. But being around those that serve and that see the needs, see people that are hungry, see people that are hurting, some of you have just tremendous vision. You have twenty-twenty or better spiritual vision. Whether you're walking through an airport, you can see someone that's hurting. In a grocery store. In a home. In a family. In a meeting. Can you tell when you greet your brother and sister if they're really fine or if they're really hurting. Isn't that what a family is all about? Seeing when someone needs served. That's what Jesus wants us to do.

"Ye are they which have continued with me in my temptations. And I appoint unto you a kingdom, as my Father hath appointed unto me; That ye may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel." St. Luke

22:28-30. I don't understand all that. But what that says to me, is there's hope! There's a kingdom. There's a place where we're going to go with responsibility, and He wants us to be there.

"And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat:" St. Luke 22:31. And we have an adversary. We have an adversary here that wants to get ahold of us. Wants to get inside your life some way, somehow, and begin to sift you. Probably in your kitchen you may have a sifter. We don't want to be sifted. Not by Satan!

"But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren." St. Luke 22:32. What a verse! That's the heart! Think about your heart today. Where is your heart? How is your heart? Is it being converted? Is it part of that transformation we read about in Romans 12:1,2 about being not conformed to this world, but being transformed? About being converted. About being new!

He talks about all this, the strife that was going on...who could be the greatest. He says, No, it's not about what your trying to be. They had a misunderstanding about what the Lord Jesus was going to do for them. They had a desire that they could get rid of the authority of the government. They wanted to have liberty. They wanted to have freedom. They wanted to exercise their own responsibility. They thought the Lord Jesus Christ was going to take them and He was going to free them from the current bondage of the government.

Judas, why was he holding the bag? He wanted to be a part of that political movement. Sometimes people get hooked onto a candidate they see is going to make change. They want to be a part of that. He wanted to be a part of the movement that was going to set things in order as he liked them to be. And so he was using the money.

But where was the heart? Here they were having strife – who's going to be the greatest in this new kingdom. You don't understand. It's about serving. And they were confused, and we would be too! There was confusion. What's He mean, serve?

We need to get some more swords (St. Luke 22:38), and we need to be ready to take on the government here.

That's our individual natures trying to take control. How do I overcome this obstacle ahead of me? Now we trust in the Lord. Lord, where are You taking us? And He says, "Simon, Simon..." Simon, pay attention! You and I, pay attention! Satan had desired to have you. But when we have our hand in the hand of the Lord Jesus Christ, when we have our knees knelt before our Almighty God, Satan's power is gone! Let's stay connected to the Lord. Let's stay on our knees before Almighty God. He says, "But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not:..." St. Luke 22:32. Let's keep our faith exercised. Let's keep it strong for those that today have not yet yielded, have not yet brought their knees before Almighty God. He says two things: repent, and be converted.

Here He says, "...when thou art converted..." St. Luke 22:32. First there has to be a coming to the Lord Jesus Christ. Many times we're sorry if we got caught doing something wrong. We get caught, we say, oh-I'm sorry! Are we sorry we were doing wrong, or are we sorry we got caught? The Lord says, Repent! Repent with a sorrow that leads to conversion. Not just a sorry that we did the wrong thing. We teach our children to say, I'm sorry! But there needs to be a new behavior. Repentance is sorrow and change. And then with that change comes conversion. And that's what the Lord says. Repentance is a sorrow that yields fruit. A sorrow that just doesn't say, that was wrong. Yes, that's nice, and in relationships, that's good. That doesn't bring conversion. Repentance is the repentance that brings sorrow and a turning away and to.

What brings us TO God? That's the conversion. That changes. And so He says here, Simon, I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not. That the belief, and the understanding, that the faith is strong through the trials ahead. Think about his faith as he was believing in the Lord, and then he faces an unexpected event. The Lord is crucified?! And they're asking me?! And he denies Him once, he denies

Him twice, He denies him three times! Where is his faith at this point? After the third denial, where was his faith?

Where is your faith when there's a struggle? When Satan has his hands on you and he's got a hold on your ankle, and he won't let go. Where is our faith? Lord, I'm going on my knees because I know that when I'm on my knees he [Satan] must go. Let's keep our faith! Let's stay strong, and keep our eyes focused on the Lord, because Satan is an evil adversary. And he [Jesus] says, when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren.

And, what hope! When he got to that third betrayal, and he went out and he wept, my mind would think he was trying to replay all those messages from the Lord. In his own mind, it wasn't adding up! But when he yielded his heart, he began to see, thy faith fail not, the Lord has prayed for me. When the Lord looked and his eyes fell on him after that third betrayal (St. Luke 22:61), I can imagine what was going through his mind as he went out alone, and he began to put things back in order, just like it was in the Old Testament.

There's an order. Help me connect the dots. He says, that thy faith fail not. Well now we're converted, there's hope. There's strength in thy brethren. We go over to the book of Acts and we see Peter later standing up, not only preaching repentance and conversion, but we see him being bold for the Lord Jesus Christ. And we see him 'strengthen thy brethren'. He strengthens you and I. Back in this book, right here, are his writings. We see his life in the book of the Acts. We see his writing here, that we should bring these things to our remembrance, so that we don't forget in our memory and in our vision we understand what it means to serve.

And he says, "...when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren. And he said unto him, Lord, I am ready to go with thee, both into prison, and to death. And he said, I tell thee, Peter, the cock shall not crow this day, before that thou shalt thrice deny that thou knowest me." St. Luke 22:32-34. The Lord knows what's coming! Peter didn't know what was coming. He

didn't believe it! But let's be ready. Let's keep our faith strong. Let's keep our hearts in tune. Let's keep on our knees before our Almighty God. Our God of order, the Scripture has been fulfilled.

We go back into Revelations, we just had this at a young group a few nights ago, talking about the mark of the beast. Hell is real, and so is heaven. Satan is real, and so is the Lord Jesus Christ. The world is in despair and the believers live in hope. Where are you and I today? We stand on our feet, but we first fall on our knees. It's about repentance. It's about being converted. And it's about strengthening the brethren. Let's be strengthened.

For those here today that do not yet know the Lord Jesus Christ, today is the day. Today is a day of hope! Today is a day when you and I can live with joy, with hope, with peace, because we know the Master! We know the Scripture has been fulfilled. Who fulfilled it? The Lord Jesus, and He is our brother, and He wants to take you and I to the throne, and reveal all things.

Yes, in eternity, but He wants them to be reveled to you and I today. Not through a scattered camp ground, but through a way of order, and love, and tenderness that changes the heart. A sinful corrupt heart that has been broken, and restored by the blood of the lamb.



"Decency"

Early this year I read a book bout government and democacy. The author was well eduated and I was very interested a what he had to say except I was very disappointed in the anguage he used. I thought ome of the words he used were rude and somewhat indecent. That made me ask the question, What is happening to the pure, ecent, English language?"

The word "decency" or its deivative is used only once in the King James version of the Bible. n the last verse of chapter 14 in Corinthians, the Apostle Paul vrites, "Let all things be done ecently and in order." I have leard that a former Elder Brother in one of our churches ften said, "We've got to have rder," or "We must keep orler." That exhortation is well aken and includes decency in onduct, speech, and attire. The Apostle Paul was conerned in the above quotation bout disorder resulting from he practice of speaking in tongues in the Corinthian Church. He was very inclusive when he wrote, "Let ALL THINGS be done decently and in order."

The biggest problem in all of this is deciding what is decent and what is indecent. It would appear that what was indecent English in my youth has now become the norm. Decency is very important in our Christian walk of life. In many things it will be up to you to decide what is decent or indecent, but let's all try to be improve in our decency.
