

Sermon by Bro. Mark Schmidgall, Eureka, IL

II Chronicles 29:1-24 and I John 2

The Apostle ended there with, "If ye know that he is righteous, ye know that every one that doeth righteousness is born of him." I John 2:29. In the world today, there would seem to be a lot of confusion and argument perhaps, what righteousness is. But we know there is only one way to be made righteous. That's through the shed blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. That we come to Him in a humble repentance and we seek forgiveness. That we make our rights wrong. That we be at peace with God and with man, as much as lieth within us. That He would convert our hearts and minds and then that we'd walk in the way, the way of salvation, the way of truth and righteousness, as the Word of God does explain unto us very clearly. Even as we have read together of the world and the lust of the world and all those things, those things are of sin and they are of unrighteousness. We need to be in the righteous path, even on that highway that leads to heaven. So there is a vast difference sometimes, what the Word of God calls righteous and righteous living and what the world would want to proclaim even as a Christian walk of life.

So dear ones, even as we consider the Word of God, may it be a prayer upon our heart that He would give us the understanding of this Scripture. That we'd understand a little bit more what God does expect of us as we walk here below.

He said, "My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not..." I John 2:1. It doesn't get much simpler and more plain than that. We are to be the overcomers and we can read that as we read down through there. We are to be the overcomers of sin. Even we could read in the Old Testament time there, that there was a sacrifice given for sin. God did not even want to dwell with sin and He wanted the sacrifices given. We know, dear ones, it is the same today and even much more so. God does not want to share our heart with sin. So here the Apostle said, that ye sin not.

"...And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." I John 2:1.

Even as we would come to Him in repentance, we know that we are born into sin, that we reach that age of accountability where we know right from wrong. We know that we are committing sin and almighty God then gives us a conviction upon our heart and mind and we have that advocate. We have Jesus Christ the righteous one, that we can turn to.

Then we know and realize, dear ones, even as we know that life is real, as we go through this life, there are sometimes where there are those who would slip and make error in their life. It has to be brought to light. Then we know that there is an advocate. There is a way that is spelled out in the Word of God. That they could even take the discipline of the church. That they could take that which is meted out from the Word of God, that they could even suffer here. There could be that way that would be open for them, that they would perhaps suffer here upon this earth that someday they could still reign with Jesus Christ in all eter-

A lot of times we don't want to speak about those things or think about them. But it is real. We are thankful for the love and the mercy of God. May it be, dear ones, that when those things would happen or we know they have happened in the past, oh that we would not cast judgment and we would not throw stones. But that we'd be of a loving nature and merciful and kind and reach out to those dear souls. Try to include them in the precious fellowship, dear ones. Because it is a long, hard road if we would try to make this road here upon this earth by ourselves. So may it be, dear ones, that we would love one another enough to care one for another, that we could make it to that good and blessed end.

"And he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for our's only, but also for the sins of the whole world. And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments. He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him." I John 2:2-4. Dear ones, it is said often that the

Biblical Stewardship

Writings based on God's Word

A steward is one who protects, defends, or watches over something. Biblical stewardship can be defined as the duty to share the messages of the gospel, to preach its doctrine, and to administer its ordinances in a way that will reflect the truth of God's Word. In this article we will consider biblical stewardship in the light of four aspects: that of a shepherd, a watchman, a leader and a servant. In each of these areas, the example of Jesus Christ is profoundly instructive.

Jesus said "I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep" and I "know my sheep and am known of mine" (John 10:11-14). Any account of the Good Shepherd would be incomplete without reference to Psalm This beautiful description of the Good Shepherd offers instruction to all who are given the responsibility to shepherd a flock. Jesus Christ is our Chief Shepherd and He has placed men in the role of elders with responsibilities clearly explained in the Bible. This involves caring for, guarding, feeding and leading the flock with a shepherd's heart. It also includes strengthening the diseased, binding up the broken, bringing again that which was driven away and seeking the lost (Ezek. 34). It requires awareness of the condition of the church: "Be thou diligent to know the state of thy flocks, and look well to thy herds" (Prov. 27:23), which underscores the importance of good, open, constructive communication between the church and the elder (Gal. 6:6).

Peter described beautifully the heart of a true shepherd. "Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples of the flock" (1Pet. 5:2-3). It is God's desire that His flock receive sound nurturing and protection. "And I will set up shepherds over them which shall feed them: and they shall fear no more, nor be dismayed, neither shall they be lacking, saith the Lord" (Jer. 23:4). The consequences of not caring for the sheep are grave, as the Lord has said to unfaithful shepherds, "I will require my flock at their hand..." (Ezek. 34:10).

Biblical stewardship also requires us to be watchmen. "I have set watchmen upon the wall, O Jerusalem, which shall never hold their peace day nor night. Ye that make mention of the Lord, keep not silence" (Isa. 62:6). An important part of being a watchman is to teach and to warn. Jesus, the master teacher, "...opened his mouth and taught them..." (Matt. 5:2). Paul exhorted that representing Christ involves "warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom" (Col. 1:28), and he spoke of doing this untiringly with tears (Acts 20:31).

Part of teaching is sounding a warning which instructs and prepares people to deal with various dangers. Ezekiel wrote that the watchman must sound the alarm (Ezek. 33:2-6). If the watchman sees the sword come and he sounds the alarm, it is the duty of the people to listen. If they choose not to listen and the sword comes, they bear the responsibility for their loss. However, if the watchman does not sound the alarm clearly, the watchman will bear a measure of responsibility for those who are lost. In order to be effective watchmen, we must have "understanding of the times" as those in Israel's time who were able to help give proper direction to the people (1 Chron. 12:32). Understanding the impact which cultural change is having on us will help us discern the spirits and remain firmly grounded on the truths of God's Word.

Paul emphasized the need for clarity of the warning. He reminded us that there are many voices of significance. Therefore, "...except (the watchman) give a distinction in the sounds, how shall it be known what is piped or harped? For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to the battle?" (1 Cor. 14:7-8).

Jesus emphasized that all believers are to watch and pray. As He taught the people about the confusion of the world and the uncertainty of the times, He told them that they should not be found sleeping. "And what I say unto you, I say unto all, Watch" (Mark 13:37).

Leadership is part of biblical stewardship. True leadership requires being a good example (1 Tim. 4:12). The Good Shepherd exemplified a high standard and He led his sheep by still waters and in the paths of righteousness (Psa. 23:2-3). Jesus chastised the scribes and Pharisees be-

cause of their hypocritical example. "For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers" (Matt. 23:4).

It is understandable that we are deeply disappointed when leaders set poor examples and seem to lack personal integrity and responsibility. The Bible teaches us that "...unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required; and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more" (Luke 12:48).

Biblical stewardship also requires being a humble servant, one who willingly does for others. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Jesus clearly taught that serving others is more important than being served, even though the one who is served is often regarded as being greater than the one who serves. "For whither is greater, he that sitteth at meat or he that serveth? Is not he that sitteth at meat? but I am among you as one that serveth" (Luke 22:27). The humble servant nature of Jesus was further demonstrated when He "...took a towel, and girded himself...and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith He was girded" (John 13:4-5).

We have many opportunities to serve our families, our churches, and our communities. We also have numerous ways to serve others throughout our nation and in many parts of the world by supporting various World Relief projects. We need to willingly perform even small deeds of service (such as the widow's two mites, or a cup of cold water), not just those efforts that appear to be more glorious. If we wait for an "important" occasion to arise before we serve, we may find that we will have missed many opportunities.

Biblical stewardship is both a responsibility and a privilege. We are motivated by love for Christ to fulfill "...all the counsel of God" (Acts 20:27), which includes being a good steward. This will be reflected in faithful shepherding, diligent watching, humble leading and charitable serving.



...The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:37-38

A Prayer for Outreach

In Matthew 6:9-10, Jesus teaches us to pray that God would cause His name to be worshiped, His kingdom to advance, and His will to be done joyfully in our lives and in the lives of people throughout all the earth. This is a prayer for both local outreach and world missions, because there are many places in the world where God's name isn't being hallowed, Christ's kingdom hasn't arrived in power, and people are living for themselves, captive to Satan's will.

Mexico is one of these places that has sat for a long time in the shadow of religious darkness and spiritual blindness. But the harvest is plenteous, the Lord is sending laborers, and God's kingdom is breaking into hearts in small, unlikely places like Ixtlan. It is both an urgent and promising time for the gospel in Mexico.

School developments

Why start a Christian school in Ixtlan, Mexico? It is not simply to offer children a quality alternative to the public education system. It is to rescue them from a godless curriculum and harmful peer pressure... to teach them the fear and knowledge of Christ... to see all of learning and life through the lens of the Creator and His Word... to reach them with truth while their hearts and minds are impressionable... to overcome the barriers that distance their families from the Truth.

Currently, legal work is in process towards incorporating the school to be able to start classes in fall 2009. In the meantime, English classes will be offered for children, teens, and adults. This outreach could be a medium God uses to build relationships and introduce students to the

gospel. After several weeks of registration for classes in August, there were still no men signed up. This was a great disappointment because men are usually the ones who are interested in learning English, and the ones who so need to be reached with the gospel. After praying and asking God to remove the obstacles keeping these men from signing up, the last day for registration arrived. Three male college students came that day and registered. Praise God for answered prayer!

New children's outreach

Fistfights and bloody noses might cause many of us to shy away from a group of roudy youngsters. Some Ixtlan sisters were willing to tackle this challenge. They started to reach out to children from a poorer area of town by organizing them to play games on Tuesday nights. Since then, a number of these children have been coming to church activities. They are rough around the edges, but hungry for love.

It's encouraging to see this ministry spring up from local sisters. This wasn't a missionary's idea. Isn't that what God wants for the local church, that all believers would be filled with a passion for hallowing God's name and testifying to the gospel through their unique outreach ministries?

Barra Vieja

A group of Ixtlan sisters went to Barra Vieja to do Vacation Bible School in August. They came back encouraged by the interest the children have in the Word of God, as well as the simplicity and generosity of the believers' lives there. But their hearts were torn as they left. Why? There wasn't anyone to stay and teach the children, or anyone

permanent to disciple the adult believers. One of the adult converts said, "You sent teachers for the children, but when are you going to send a teacher for us?" There are now three converts close to baptism, but there still isn't a missionary couple there for long-term ministry. Until now couples have been going every month to encourage and teach the converts, but this seems to be a patchwork system until the Lord provides someone permanent.

Prayers are appreciated...

- for timely completion of the school incorporation process, that Satan wouldn't be successful in hindering this work of God's kingdom.
- for the Holy Spirit to use the English classes to hallow God's name, further His kingdom, and to see His will done in Ixtlan; to provide wisdom and encouragement to the teachers; and to build bridges with students in order to share the gospel with them.
- that the missionaries and the Ixtlan believers would be filled daily with the joy of God's salvation and emboldened to share the gospel.
- for continued open doors for effective ministry of the gospel to old and young, rich and poor, educated and uneducated, etc. without respect of persons.
- to raise up a married couple for long-term ministry in Barra Vieja.

We want to express thanks to all who have supported the ministry in Mexico this year through prayers, contributions, visits, or teaching and discipling the children and converts in Barra Vieja.

Building a Better Haiti

It takes only 90 minutes to travel by air from Miami to Port-au-Prince, Haiti. A mere 90 minutes to travel from one of the most prosperous nations in the world to the poorest country in the western hemisphere. This extreme poverty is especially evident in Haiti's system of education. With no available public education, the burden of teaching Haiti's children falls to private schools and to the Church.

In Haiti, the Mission of Evangelical Baptists of Southern Haiti (MEBSH) churches play a vital role in building and operating schools. Typically, MEBSH schools are located in close proximity to a MEBSH church, and the local pastor will have the oversight of the school.

World Relief has worked together with the MEBSH organization on various projects for decades. Under the World Relief Literary Aid Program, schools are constructed in cooperation with the local MEBSH church and pastor. Each local church is responsible for initiating the project by building the cement block walls. After the walls are constructed, work teams are utilized to build the roofs with lumber and tin. The roof materials and all labor for installation are provided and shipped to Haiti by World Relief.

Before 2006, the role of World Relief in Haiti was as a support to the MEBSH construction department. Then in 2006, when Ron and Linnea Shick returned to the US in completion of their time as missionaries in Haiti, World Relief assumed primary responsibility for the construction department.

Five work teams, comprised of approximately 60 volunteers, travel to Haiti each year to build and install school roofs. In addition, the full-time World Relief coordinators in Haiti host several non-Apostolic construction teams.

The typical World Relief construction team spends one week in Haiti. The coordinators set up a work schedule, and often transport some of the building materials to the work sites ahead of time. It is usually possible to complete 2-3 roof projects in the week the team is there, depending on travel time, the extent of each project, and the experience of the brothers on the team. Sisters are welcome at the work site as well: they are usually assigned the task of assembling and painting pre-cut/drilled school benches.



It is a highlight to be able to spend several days at remote locations. Traveling to and from these locations can be grueling. Haitian roadways are usually rough, with flat tires occurring frequently. Flexibility and patience are essential – a 30 mile trip can take all day. However, despite the difficulties, the often scenic trips are regularly cited as the favorite part of at least one team member's trip.

To round off the typical work trip, there is usually one day budgeted for visiting various World Reliefsponsored locations in the Cayes area, relaxing with our brothers and sisters in Cayes, and tasting a small sample of the Haitian existence.

Currently, there are two families and one sister living near Cayes, Haiti who manage the construction department. They also coordinate several other World Relief sponsored projects. Bro. Tim and Sis. Joan Reinhard of Peoria live with their five children in Haiti, Sis. Sarah (15), Sis. Bethany (13), Hannah (8), Gabriel (4), and Faith (1). Bro. Jan and Sis. Val Gutwein also serve full-time in Haiti. Their six children are Sis. Tess (18), Alisha (13), Mark (11), Derek (4), Brett (2), and Joel (1). Sis. Sheila Moser from Sabetha is the newest addition in Haiti. Sis. Sheila moved to Haiti this August and will assist both with the construction department and hosting work teams. Sis. Abby Gerber is also serving in Haiti in the MEBSH Child Care office.

We are thankful for the many opportunities to serve in Haiti. In addition to sharing the Gospel, the work of the construction department provides direct assistance to Haitians in need and gives hope for a better future. Please keep the construction department in your prayers for...

- wisdom and guidance for the work being accomplished.
- protection from health and travel hazards.
- ability to learn a different language and culture.
- help to cope with the daily stresses of living surrounded by great poverty and need.

We certainly feel at ACHH that the Lord has been gracious to us. Much continues to happen in the process of our Right Sizing project. Three of the six houses we need to carry out this plan have been purchased. Timber Ridge is filled to our licensed capacity with 98 residents. This allows us to submit our plan to the state of Illinois of decreasing the number of residents at Timber Ridge by 25%. Remodeling and other maintenance work in the recently acquired houses is underway. This includes fire alarm systems, proper locks and door closures, and other work necessary so that the new CILA homes meet the standards under which they are licensed. The move of four men into the first of these homes is anticipated to take place in October. Some new employees have been hired and are currently training to be ready to help in the staffing of the new homes. One of our previous CILA directors has returned to work for us in a temporary position as project manager. We have been blessed by individuals who have been called to support the financial needs just when we needed it. God has provided in so many ways and we realize how dependent we are on His grace and blessing. We trust He will continue to open doors and move people to support this work as He opens those doors.





Love Languages in Marriage -Loving Well

I recently heard the statement, "He loved so much ...he just didn't love so well." What's the difference between loving much and loving well? Loving well implies loving in a way that truly communicates love to the receiver of the affection. Imagine traveling to a foreign country and speaking in your native tongue while the listeners wear confused looks on their faces. The traveler may be guite confident that he is communicating effectively, but the message is missing the mark if it is not in the language of the recipient. When God chose to communicate His love, He spoke our language by sending His own son clothed in flesh and blood, a language we could understand. This article is the first of a two-part series on five ways love is communicated, called "love languages": Words of Affirmation, Quality Time, Acts of Service, Gifts, and Physical Touch. We hope to offer some practical ways for you to express love to your spouse in a language that he or she will understand. In part one; we explore the first two love languages.

Understanding love languages as ways to give and receive affection.

One way to think about affection is that there are basically five ways that people give and receive love. These are commonly termed "love languages." Everyone is born with a core need to be loved. As a couple, you can help meet that need by learning, and then speaking, each other's love language. While most people enjoy receiving love in all of the following ways, generally speaking, one or two will communicate love and affection most powerfully to your spouse.

1. Words of Affirmation.²

Someone who has a primary love language of Words of Affirmation receives love through encouraging words and compliments. This person can resonate with the truth in the verses in Proverbs 18:21, "Death and life are in

the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof" and Proverbs 12:25, "Heaviness in the heart of man maketh it stoop: but a good word maketh it glad." For these individuals, kind words that build up, show appreciation, and communicate loving feelings are an essential part of feeling loved. He or she needs to hear the words that affirm his or her worth and abilities in order to believe that you truly love and honor him or her. Loving words, expressed regularly and on an ongoing basis, will provide long-lasting positive effects in your marriage.

Examples of giving Words of Affirmation to your spouse include:

* Verbalizing your appreciation: "Thanks for helping me out today; it really meant a lot to me that you were there."

* Giving compliments: "You did a really nice job painting."

* Noticing: Thanking your spouse for something routinely done but rarely recognized: "Thanks for being a great father/mother to our children." "I really appreciate your doing my laundry."

* Writing: A positive note of encouragement can be kept and reread.

* NOTE: People with a primary Words of Affirmation love language may be very sensitive to how requests are phrased. Asking him or her to do something in the form of a request will be accepted much more quickly than if it sounds like a demand.

2. Quality Time.3

Jesus, amidst all the demands placed on him, made sure He set aside sufficient quality time to spend with his disciples. For example, Mark 6:30-31 recorded that, ". . . the apostles gathered themselves together unto Jesus, and told him all things, both what they had done, and what they had taught. And he said unto them, Come ye yourselves apart into a desert place, and rest a while." God loves it when we spend time with Him in prayer and in our meditation on the Word.

Likewise, an individual whose love language is Quality Time will feel most loved when his or her spouse spends time being with or doing an activity with him or her. You can speak this love language by giving undivided, focused attention to your spouse. People with this love language often like to spend time together, having meaningful conversations. When engaging in quality conversation, the focus should be on hearing one another's thoughts, feelings, and desires rather than problem-solving or giving advice. When Quality Time includes doing activities together, be sure the activity allows time for connection. Going to a high school reunion doesn't qualify for Quality Time, while walking together in a park does.

Examples of spending Quality Time with your spouse include:

* Finding time daily to connect with your spouse and share thoughts, concerns, and highlights of the day.

* Planning a special outing with just the two of you or doing an activity that your spouse enjoys. For example, you could prepare a picnic and take it to a local park. Or you could go for a walk together before or after work.

* Going for a long drive together, with or without a specific destination.

* Making household tasks more meaningful by doing them together.

* NOTE: Be careful not to let work, family responsibilities, and even church activities (e.g., being on too many committees at once) lead you to neglect spending time with your spouse. Occasionally, say "no" to an invitation and instead spend that time with your spouse.

Hopefully the descriptions of the first two love languages have stirred some thoughts. As Christ proactively expressed His love to us, let's be proactive in sharing love with our spouse through words of affirmation and quality time. In the next issue of the Silver Lining we will look at the final three love languages: Gifts, Acts of Service, and Physical Touch.

whatsoever He commands us. Here he says that, hereby do we know that we know him if we keep his commandments. The Word of God is so clear. It is so black and white. That we are to keep the commandments of God. We are to walk in His love.

There really is no excuse, dear ones, even as we walk here below and there is so much confusion, even in the religious circles today. I believe we heard something about that this morning hour. Where in business there are all these options. There are so many options in this life. We go to buy a car or a house or do different things. There are all these different things, dear ones, that we can do and they are okay in the world. But it is not okay in our spiritual walk of life. The Word of God is quite clear. The Word of God is what is going to see us to the very end. Then when we get to the very end, the Word of God is going to judge us. It is not going to be something different.

We've talked about that before. There will not be a deception at the end. There will not be a surprise at the end. The Word of God will be there. The Word of God will be opened up and our life will be judged according to the Word. According to that which God has given unto us and the understanding that He has meted out unto us.

"But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him." I John 2:5. Dear ones, we are to strive for that perfection. We are to strive for a holy walk of life. Even as we talked about righteousness. He says here that whosoever keepeth His Word, in him verily is the love of God perfected. When we have brethren in distress and we have opportunities of these things that are happening today, with all the weather situations - it is just another way that God grants many of us opportunities to help in one manner or another. Whether it is physical or whether it is monetary. Whether it is through prayer. There is going to be much to do in the weeks and months to come. God grants opportunities. We don't have to look very far. God grants us opportunities to help one another. May it be that God's love would be perfected in our lives as we would look around about. That we would even prefer others before ourselves.

I think a battle that a lot of us have, perhaps we wouldn't want to admit it, but we become selfish at times and we start thinking of our own selves. We like to hoard time to our self. Perhaps we like to have some down time. We like to have those things that we enjoy. We know that we need to steal away and there needs to be that time of rest. We have been reminded of that lately. But yet there is that time that we need to make sure that we are thinking of others.

Oftentimes, dear ones, when we think of others and we try to do for others, then we feel better about our own life. Because if we just sit around and dwell upon our own woes, we can get discouraged and we become depressed here upon this earth. But there is so much that we can be thinking of. So many other people we can be praying for. As long as we are on this earth, we need to be of a prayerful people.

We sang in that hymn about faith

and hope and love. I believe at the end of the hymn when it comes to eternity, those things, we won't have them anymore. We won't need faith. We won't need hope. We will be filled with love but we won't need faith and hope anymore. (Zion's Harp #78, v.8) There is another one of our beautiful hymns that we sing that it talks about praying. When we get to the end of the way and we enter into those heavenly portals, we won't need to pray anymore. But while we are here upon this earth, we need to busy our self with praying and we need to exercise our faith and our hope and our love, even as that hymn did describe for us.

He says, "He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked." I John 2:6. I believe when he says, even as he walked, he is talking about our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. There is no greater example. For our young people, there's no better way to spend our time than reading the Word of God and reading about Jesus as He walked here upon this earth. Seeing how He lived. That is what we are all to have, dear ones. We are to be armed with the Word of God. We are to have the mind of Christ. If we have the mind of Christ, dear ones, even as we sang in this song, Unity in Love (Zion's Harp #181), we are going to be in unity, dear ones. But that is the key, to be filled with the Holy Spirit. To walk with Christ and to walk in His Word. To have His Word abounding in our lives through the Spirit of God.

He says, "Brethren, I write no new commandment unto you, but an old commandment which ye had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which ye have heard from the beginning. Again, a new commandment I write unto you, which thing is true in him and in you: because the darkness is past, and the true light now shineth. He that saith he is in the light, and hateth his brother, is in darkness even until now." v.7-9. The Apostle is switching gears just a little bit here. But still, the theme of this chapter would be the true love of God, I believe. But here he is talking about walking in darkness and walking in the light. He that saith he is in the light and hateth his brother is in darkness even until now. Dear ones, it is not an option to love one another. It is not an option to forgive one another if we would trespass one against another or we'd have hurt feelings.

Sometimes, dear ones, I think when my feelings are hurt, it is probably just pride a lot of the time. I remember hearing our Brother talk about that before. It is really the truth, dear ones. Sometimes our feelings are hurt, maybe it just wounds our pride a little bit. Then we have to humble our self and pray to God and we can see, perhaps we were wrong in whatever it was.

There are times, though, when someone perhaps hurts our feelings unintentionally and maybe it has nothing to do with pride. There, we forgive. There are times perhaps, our feelings are hurt and maybe it was rather intentional. Someone said something a little course, whatever it may be. Something happens and maybe our feelings are hurt. They truly are. Perhaps we need to visit with them about it. But either way, dear ones, we need to forgive. Because we cannot hate our brother. We cannot hate our brother or sister. We cannot hate our neighbor, whether they are of the faith or not of the faith.

God looks down upon this sin sick world. What does the Word say? The Word says that He loves the sinner but hates the sin. That's God. That's hard for us to do sometimes, dear ones. When there are people that commit such gross sins or whatever it is, perhaps they do things that maybe they affect us at work or at school. We think of God, how He loves them but He hates the sin. We are to strive to be

like God. That's easier said than done. But dear ones, the main thing is that we just forgive and try to forget. Because if we continue to remember something, we allow Satan to bring it up, it is going to be hard to forgive. It is going to be hard to get over that.

Satan is just so crafty. He is so good at that. Sometimes he starts bringing something back to our memory and whatever it is, all of a sudden he is taking us down this road that brings back a memory of something that happened and it is an ill thought. He is really good at that. We need to recognize that. We need to be on guard. We need to have that discerning Spirit of Jesus Christ and His Holy Spirit within us to see when he is taking us down that pathway. So that those thoughts don't come in the first place. But it is so important, dear ones, that we forgive and forget.

"He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him." v.10. It is really a tremendous verse. He that loveth his brother abideth in the light and there is none occasion of stumbling in him. Dear ones, when we are around a brother whose love is just abounding, or a sister, it is quite obvious. We just laid to rest a brother, today, who loved people. He loved the brotherhood. He loved us all. It was obvious, dear ones. It abounded and it says there was no occasion of stumbling in him.

When we walk in the way and we love one another, first of all dear ones, we are not going to take on liberties that would make our brother or sister stumble and have an occasion to fall or stumble. So we have to think about that, even as we read down through here a little further on about the lusts of the flesh and those things that pertain to this world, pertain to Satan and sin. That we would not partake of those things, number one, because we want to go to heaven. Number one, we don't want to be deceived by Satan. We don't want to be wounded and we don't want to be killed by him spiritually. Because we want to serve almighty God and Jesus Christ because we love Him because He first loved us. That our goal is heaven.

But then when we think about some occasions, we think, this isn't

that big of a liberty. Then we have to think about the love and the light we are to be to our brother and sister. That he that loveth his brother abideth in the light and there is no darkness there. If we abide in the light, then there is no occasion of stumbling. So that we wouldn't take occasions and take those liberties, even as the Word of God says. We are to not take liberties of the occasion of flesh. May it be, dear ones, that we would watch ourselves. That we would ask ourselves, how much do we love one another, when there are those things that we could perhaps partake in. Even the church has warned us over the years, through the Spirit of God and through the power of the Spirit and we know better. Yet the flesh is weak and the flesh wants to be entertained.

There are all kinds of things that this flesh would love to do. We know sometimes people say that they can handle this or they can handle that. Yet how about our brother? How about our weaker brother or weaker sister? I even hesitate to say it that way because if we think we can handle it, we are perhaps the weaker one to begin with. Because we have allowed Satan to put those thoughts in our minds, that we can handle something that we have been warned not to do.

It is just like the Word of God warns us about money and the love of money. The riches of this world are a spiritual snare, oftentimes. Yet we have heard over and over that the world would want to convince us that we should try it anyway. That we should try to get all we can. Even though the Word warns us against it. So that is the way it is, even when we are warned against staying away from the things of the world. The lusts of the eye, the lusts of the flesh and the pride of life. We are warned to stay away from those things. So who is telling us then that we should try those things and we can handle it? Perhaps we are the weaker one and we don't realize it.

"But he that hateth his brother is in darkness, and walketh in darkness, and knoweth not whither he goeth, because that darkness hath blinded his eyes. I write unto you, little children, Sermon continued from page 43

because your sins are forgiven you for his name's sake. I write unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I write unto you, young men, because ye have overcome the wicked one..." v. 11-13. There is that word, overcome. That is what God expects of us when we start repenting. When we start on this pathway, that we are to be the overcomers. We are to overcome the wicked one.

"...I write unto you, little children, because ye have known the Father. I have written unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I have written unto you, young men, because ye are strong, and the word of God abideth in you, and ye have overcome the wicked one." v. 13,14. It says here, I have written unto you, young men, because ye are strong. There is no question that when we are young brothers and sisters in the Lord, that we actually have a strength that the older brothers and sisters don't have. There is a zeal and a strength there. Dear ones, we just need to make sure that we allow the Holy Spirit to channel that strength. That we would abound in the Lord. There are many things we can do for the Lord. We get older. Those that are older brothers and sisters sitting here, there is no thought, when the call goes out to go work on the levee, that they can go, and so forth. That's just an example. But when we are younger and healthy, there are things we can do. The Lord expects us to only do that which we can do.

But he talks about those that are young and strong. May it be though, dear ones and young people, that we would make sure the Holy Spirit is leading, guiding and directing us when we would try to help. That we would not become over zealous and thinking that we are something of ourselves. Because we are really nothing. Almighty God doesn't really need any of us. He doesn't need any of us to accomplish His will here upon this earth. But He chooses to use us. Even it goes that way with money and so forth. He doesn't need our money. But He chooses, through His Word of God, to instruct us to tithe and to help out

here and there. So that is the way it is to be. We are to humble our self before Him. Realize it is all from Him to begin with. He gives us talents to go work here and there. We've got to thank God for that. He is the one that gives the talents. He is the one that gives the energy. May it be that we always keep that in mind. That it all goes back to Him and that we thank Him and praise Him for His goodness.

"Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him." v.15. There again, it is very straight forward, that we are not to love the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. So as we sit here tonight, we have to ask ourselves, how does God look down upon each one of us? Does He see us loving the world, the things that are in the world? It's really not that complicated to figure out what is in the world and what is of the world.

We have to make a living. But we need to be careful that it doesn't become our god. That we don't set a god before our almighty God in heaven. So we need to be careful how much we even love to work and all that sort of thing. But then we get outside of the monetary things and those sort of idolizations, that we need to be very careful with. Then we get into the love of the world. What is of the world? It's just really not that difficult to see that all the sporting complexes and all that stuff, it is not of God. All the music, the country, the rock and roll and all that stuff, it is not of God. All the stuff that entertains the flesh.

Dear ones, for many of us that are in my age bracket on up, we can remember so well and vividly, it was so cut and dried when we were younger. I can remember - for some reason these thoughts come to me - sitting in this church when we didn't have air condition. We had the windows open. As a young boy in grade school - I think it is a boy thing - but the older kids, perhaps they were seniors or got out of high school, they had these hot rod cars. We'd go out in the parking lot to look at them and then we'd come in and sit in church and maybe they

drove out of the church yard and they rumbled out. It left an impression upon me. We thought that was really neat. But dear ones, something that made more of an impression was when those young men repented. The next Sunday we went out in the parking lot and their car wasn't there. They rode with Mom and Dad to church. Those are the things of the world, dear ones. The pride and the vanity. All that that pertains to the flesh. It was so cut and dried back then. Dear ones, it really should be today. This Word that we have in front of us tonight is so clear. It is so plain. Yet there are so many gray areas wanting to creep in. We just need to go back to the Word of God.

"For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world." v.16. We talked about a few of those things and we could spend a lot of time here on the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the pride of life. We need to remember those things are all of the world. He said here, if any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. Where will we be, dear ones, if the love of the Father is not in our hearts and minds? If we don't have the love of the Father, we have nothing. We have lost it all. We can get to the end of the way and we could have accomplished a lot of things. We could have had a really good time here upon this earth. But if we don't have the love of the Father, we've lost it all forever. This Scripture is just such a reminder, dear ones, that we are to walk close to the Lord. That we are to deny ourselves the things of this life. We are to pick up our cross, that cross of self denial.

"And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." v.17. That is what we want, dear ones, we want to abide forever. First of all, we want to abide forever in the vine, Jesus Christ. That someday we could abide forever with Him in the heavens above.

"Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time." v.18. Dear ones, the antichrist could be just something that is anti Jesus Christ. It is anti the Word of God. I believe, dear ones, it is in the Christian circles big time in this country. That there is so much that is not true to the Word of God. It is being spoken of in this country all the time. We need to be on guard, dear ones, that we are not sucked up into this deception. It is anti-Lt is anti-Christ. It is anti-word of God.

Sometimes we think of an antichrist. We think of one that just opposes Jesus Christ. It is that also. Maybe in the end times there will be one that rises up and he will have so much power the people will look to him. He is not of Christ. He is of the world. He is of Satan.

But another definition of antichrist is a rivaling spirit. We live in a day and age, dear ones, where there is this rivaling spirit. There is this spirit that is wanting to rival with the true Word of God that we have before us tonight. The Jesus Christ that we know and Him crucified and the love of the God that we are to have in our life. That we are not to be a part of the world. But what is this rivaling spirit that we are surrounded by in the world today, dear ones? The rivaling spirit is, we can do our own thing. We can take part of these things that the Word does talk about right here, that we have read together. That we can still call ourselves a Christian.

Dear ones, we can call ourselves anything we want to. In the book of Revelation it says, there will be those that come and they will have a name that liveth but they are dead (Rev.3:1). So dear ones, it doesn't matter what we call ourselves. It's, what does Jesus Christ call us and almighty God as He looks down from the heavens above? What does He look down and call us? Does He call us a brother and sister? Or does He call us a son and a daughter? Does He call us someone who is trying to surrender our life and our heart to Him and live the life of an overcomer? That is what we are up against, dear ones, in the day and age we find ourselves living in. We find ourselves against the antichrist of this time. This rivaling spirit, dear ones, and it surrounds us.

So may it be that we would take

courage, dear ones. We look into the Word of God. The Word of God never changes. Those things that we talked about that are of the world, they are still of the world. They were of the world when we were younger. They were of the world fifty years ago and eighty years ago. They are still of the world today. Not only that, but many of them are just plain sinful. So may it be, dear ones, that we would want to strive to walk in that perfection, even as it read here, "He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him." I John 2:10. That we would not be a stumbling block, dear ones, to our brother or our sister or our converts or the friends of the truth. And even to those that are not that familiar with our church or our faith, dear ones. We could be a stumbling block to someone if we allow them to think that we are a believer and we take part of things that we shouldn't be partaking in. They would see that and think that everything is okay. So may it be that by our love for God, they would see someone denying themselves.

There is a lot of Scripture here, dear ones, that we are going to have a hard time covering. Perhaps we will just close with, "Let that therefore abide in you, which ye have heard from the beginning. If that which ye have heard from the beginning shall remain in you, ye also shall continue in the Son, and in the Father. And this is the promise that he hath promised us, even eternal life." I John 24,25. Dear ones, the promises of God are true. We have said it often. He loves us. He wants to see us be spiritually successful. He will grant us His undeserved grace to the very end and we will have plenty of grace if we humble our self before Him. We will live the life of the overcomer even as we have read here, for the fathers and the young people who will live the life of the overcomer. The promise of eternal life, dear ones, is for each one of us that are true and faithful unto our high and heavenly calling.

But there is always a flip side. The flip side is that the wrath of God will abide upon those that turn their face. Even as we read back there in the Old Testament time, that there are those that did not serve God. Then a king would come along that would serve God and he would clean the house and clean the temple. Clean out the filthiness. Dear ones, as we read down through there, my thought went to our own hearts. How are our hearts. dear ones? Do they need a little cleaning, even as they cleaned the temple of God then? We know that really is the instruction when we repent, that we clean the filthiness out of our heart. That we clean it with the shed blood of Jesus Christ. That we do our part to numble ourselves to allow God to have His perfect work in our heart.

But then, from time to time, dear ones, as we are on this pathway of life, that we would also make sure that we would cleanse our heart with the washing of the water of the Word of God on a daily basis. Then on Wednesdays and Sundays we'd gather around the Word and we furthermore have that cleansing of the Word of God. So may it be, dear ones, that we'd take courage again in this evening hour. Almighty God wants to have each one of us in heaven with Him. It is altogether possible that each and every one of us can be there but we have to deny our self and we have to love Him with our whole heart and our whole mind and strive after that perfection that He would desire of us.





Church History

The second edition of Marching To Zion is currently at the printer, after several years of preparation. There is an old adage that says, "Never rush a history." Whether true or not, it is applicable in this case. Various factors have held up a quick completion of the work. First, the new book is 810-pages, complete with footnotes and indexes, etc. The sheer volume of work in editing and proofing such a lengthy volume has resulted in months and years of time. Getting a reading from the local congregations on the number of books for each church has consumed more time than anticipated. Nonetheless, by early October the project has had good movement, although no set time has been indicated when the books will be ready.

The second edition of Marching To Zion provides additional information on our church's American history. It brings each church up to date, from the 1984 edition, and covers the twelve new churches that have been established. Also, almost three decades of growth in World Relief, Mission Committee Work, Apostolic Christian Publications and the church's numerous nursing homes are chronicled, along with Gateway Woods in Leo, Indiana, and the Morton, Illinois Home for the Handicapped. The new 810-page book is a bargain for \$20. After this printing, the price will increase substantially.

There still remains interest in our church history. In 1984, a total of 10,000 Marching To Zion history books were printed and distributed. Since that time, orders of 1,000 books have been printed five or six times — and sold through Apostolic Christian Publications in Eureka, Illinois, through the author, and at a few area bookstores. Regarding the second edition, more than 7,700 books had been ordered by early October, with about 20 or so congregations expected to send in

orders. It is heartening that interest in our heritage is at a good level, and we as a church are wise to present the zeal and diligence of the past to this and coming generations (should God tarry His coming).

Although unrelated to Marching To Zion (in terms of producing historical data), another history of the church exists entitled, Apostolic Christian Church History, Volume I by Herman Ruegger of Switzerland. This book chronicles the early days of how the church was established by Samuel H. Froehlich and his contemporaries. It provided a good basic foundation for our understanding of Froehlich's work, and the trials associated with forming a new church, based solely on Scriptures. Incidentally, Reugger's title includes "Volume I" as if to suggest there is a "Volume II". There is not a second book. Marching To Zion includes many of the phases of the work mentioned by Reugger, but is a totally separate book.

Compiling the church history has benefited by an Elder History Committee. Overseeing the first edition were the following Elders, chosen regionally, to give guidance and advice to the author when needed: Bros. Edwin Ringger (Gridley, Illinois), Robert Beyer (Naumburg, New York), Ben C. Maibach, Jr. (Detroit, Michigan)), Roy Sauder (Peoria, Illinois), Richard Schubert (Phoenix, Arizona) and Rudolph Graf (Akron, Ohio). Of these six brothers, four have gone onto their reward. Only Bros. Edwin Ringger and Ben C. Maibach, Jr. are still with us.

The current Elder History Committee consists of Bro. Mark Masters (Mansfield, Ohio), chairman, and Bros. Jay Luthi (Lamont-Gridley, Kansas), Duane Farney (Croghan-Naumburg, New York), Dave Wiegand (Champaign, Illinois) and Gene Marti (Kansas City, Missouri).

Lambert Brothers

Unusual occurrences are what feed the interests of history enthusiasts. On June 14, 1924, a very unusual episode took place near Burlington, Oklahoma. A meeting of believers took place at the home of John Schrock, with about twenty persons in attendance. Although they had never attended one of these meetings before, the three sons of Bro. Alfred Lambert — Frank, Ernest and George — were present that evening. After an evening of singing, Alfred Lambert took the Bible and began reading from St. Matthew, Chapter 24. When he reached verse 15, he slumped and could not continue.

As he fell out of his chair, his three sons caught him and placed him on a bed, and he soon died. The three boys quickly realized that if they ever wished to see him again, they must turn to God in repentance. Indeed they did, yet that night. George Lambert, a long time minister at Wichita, Kansas, remembered that evening and wrote, "It was then that the dear Lord entered into our hearts, and by faith we believed."

These young men were "taken up" at the church at Burlington, Oklahoma, in December, 1924. With the consent of the congregation, Elder Gottlieb Kurz proved all three brothers at the same time. (Source: Marching To Zion, First Edition, pages 363-364).

"Dead To Self"

The Apostle Paul wrote in Galatians 2:20, "I am crucified with Christ." In Romans 6:8 we read, "Now if we be dead with Christ." In Matthew 10:39 the Lord Jesus said, "He that loseth his life for my sake shall find it." What's all this talk about losing our life, about being dead with Christ, or about being crucified with Christ?

There are other ways of speaking about being dead with Christ. Phrases which may be used are, "Full surrender," or "Taking the path which brings Christ the most glory, regardless of personal will or desire in the matter." These phrases are not from the Bible but Romans 12:1 reads, "I beseech you therefore, bretheren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice," which certainly means full surrender.

Before we are baptized we are instructed that we must be dead to sin or the old man or person cannot be buried in the waters of baptism. Evidently, the Lord Jesus and the Apostles thought that the old person should remain dead. This concept I describe as being dead to self.

My experience and observation tells me that it is the big "I" that interferes in our spiritual lives. I want to live here, I want to do this, I want to do that. I like this kind of food, I don't like that kind of food, and on and on it goes. If I'm not mistaken, according to the Bible, we should ask, "Where does God want me to live?", "What does God want me to do?", "What kind of food does God want me to eat or drink?" and "How does God want me to treat my brothers and sisters in Christ?" Too often we set ourselves up as someone called of God to set everyone else straight. It may be necessary to straighten others out so they comply more closely with the teachings of the Bible, but if we put ourselves above others in the attempt, we lose our credibility and are ineffective. Dead people do not put themselves above others.

Recently I have had the conviction that God is calling the Apostolic Christian Church to be an example to all other denominations. We have some things going for us. True conversion is emphasized, every member of our church is taught to read the Bible every day and to pray every day, we are hospitable, and we are accountable to each other, elders included. The Catholic Church has 1.3 billion members in the world and I can believe it is difficult for them to keep track of how each member is living. We have a great deal of outreach to spread God's Word and to help the needy and unfortunate in this world. In these areas we are following what the Bible teaches.

It is my conviction that if every member of the Apostolic Christian Church lives a life that is dead to self, we will indeed be an example to all other denominations.
