Sermon by Bro. Chris Kuenzi, Silverton, OR

II Samuel 3:17-38 and St. John 11:17-57

Just a couple of thoughts that came to mind as we read here in the Old Testament of the death of Abner. I believe we remember that Abner was the chief captain, the general for Saul. As David even said here, "...a great man fallen this day in Israel?" II Samuel 3:38. David even called him a great one of renown there in the land of Israel. He had led the people to many victories in battle.

But then there was Joab as well, who was David's captain. I believe if we would have read earlier on in the book of Samuel, we know that there was a time when there was a battle between David and his men and Abner and those that followed him. Abner slew Joab's brother. (v. 8-23)

So now we see here where Abner came back to David to offer his services. To offer his allegiance, it would appear, as David was about to become king. Yet Joab carried in his heart a desire for revenge, didn't he? I know that at that time, things were so much different. There was a lot more blood shed. But it just came to my mind, the thought of revenge. How are we in our time, in our day? We hope we don't hold a blood revenge against someone in our life. But just in general, if we feel that someone has done something to us in our life that is a grievance or personal, that is what it was for Joab in a great way, wasn't it? In a very personal and drastic way. Abner had taken the life of his brother.

But how is it for us when maybe we feel like someone has done something that is unfair or grievous to us? And maybe it was. Maybe it was. But how often are we somewhat like Joab here and into our heart comes that desire for vengeance. That desire to see that other person pay a price or recompense that wrong. Though it might not be that we would go and require their life of them, but if we would actually go though, and fulfill that desire in our heart, though it might not reach the

level of murdering them or killing somebody, I wonder how close it is to the same sin in our heart. That desire for vengeance and that desire of wanting to see them pay. That's really what a lot of it was here, wasn't it? That darkness that came into Joab's heart. So may we just be warned.

Sometimes we read the Old Testament and we read the blood and the violence and we think it is so far removed from anything that we understand and know. In a lot of ways it is, thankfully. We can be thankful for that. But I believe, even in stories like this, there are a lot of things that we can take example from.

David is another example we can think of here. I believe if we went back and read, Abner probably caused David a lot of grief in his life up to this point. Chasing him around, as part of Saul's army, trying to catch him. Yet, what did we see in David's heart when Abner came to him to offer his help? It would appear David forgave him (v. 20,21), didn't he? He went out of his way here at the end to be sure that the people knew that it was not his will that Abner was slain. (v. 28-29)

That's really how we should strive to be. We think about all the things that David probably suffered that were partially a result of Abner's actions. That's longsuffering, isn't it? Isn't that what we are called to do as God's children? One of the fruit of the Spirit, that we would be a longsuffering people. That we would be a forgiving people, bear with one another. Even though there's perhaps been someone in our life wouldn't even have to be a brother or sister, could be someone at work or someone we come in contact with - maybe we just feel like they have really been a thorn to us. But let's be like David. Let's take the high road that he took and be forgiving to them. Be loving to them.

We could think of our perfect example, Jesus Christ. We think of all

the wrongs that Christ suffered at the hands of men. That He so easily could have felt that desire to see

Principles of Bible Study

"Bible Study" in our Church is for purposeful spiritual growth through teaching, learning, understanding and application of God's Word. Personal devotions, topical Bible exhortations, focused meetings with specific groups by elders and ministers, small group interactive discussions, and conference exhortations all describe some of the ways that we practice Bible study in our churches.

Before attempting to study the Bible, we need to know what it is and where it comes from. We believe the Bible, God's Word, has been one with Him from the very beginning. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1). The Word was given by inspiration of His Holy Spirit. The doctrine and practices of our beloved Church rest upon its fundamental precepts. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works" (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

Any form of Bible study should begin

by offering sincere prayer, beseeching God to reveal His truth as a "plain path" (Psa. 27:11), and then following in humble obedience. Jesus instructs us to "Search the scriptures" (John 5:39). This should be done daily in our personal devotions (Acts 17:11) so that we can be mature, godly men and women of understanding (1 Cor. 14:20). Spiritual maturity requires exercising our senses (constant training of our minds and practice) which involves diligent study and application of God's Word, so that we are able to "discern both good and evil" (Heb. 5:14) by "rightly dividing" (accurately interpreting) the Bible (2 Tim. 2:15). True spiritual knowledge is a desirable trait that comes from reading and studying the inspired Word of God: "Whereby, when ye read, ye may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ" (Eph. 3:4). God has promised to give grace to those who approach His Word with a humble, reverent spirit (Is. 66:2; Jam. 4:6). It is the Holy

Spirit who "guides us into all truth" (John

16:13). Biblical knowledge is an impor-

tant step in the sequence that leads from

faith to fruitfulness: "...add to your faith

virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to

knowledge temperance ... if these things

be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful..." (2 Pet. 1:5-8). When we know and understand God's Word we are able, by God's grace, to "observe to do according to all that is written therein" (Joshua 1:8) and consequently avoid sinning against God (Psa. 119:9, 11).

God also gives us guidance and warning on the application and study of His divine Word. We have no right to add to or to take anything away from it (Rev. 22:18-19). We are not to wrest (distort the true meaning of) any of its sacred writings "...they that are unlearned and unstable wrest, as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own destruction" (2 Pet. 3:16). Gaining knowledge as an end in itself leads to pride (1 Cor. 8:1). Combining love with increased spiritual knowledge leads to a deeper obedience to Christ. "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). Wisdom and humility give us the ability to apply knowledge properly. James writes, "Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom" (Jam. 3:13). We exhort our brethren to avoid interdenominational Bible studies with those of differing doctrines (Heb. 13:9). For the same reason, there is a need to be careful and discerning when consulting Bible commentaries and other outside resources. The believer should place utmost reliance on the Scriptures themselves.

The purpose of Bible study is to help us walk on the narrow way which leads to life (Matt. 7:14). It should serve to inspire us to godly living, and to be less carnally minded and less conformed to the things of this world (Rom. 8:6; 12:2). It should not be solely to obtain biblical knowledge, but to gather spiritual resources, putting on the whole armor of God" (Eph. 6:13-17) to combat our Enemy. An essential test for all forms of Bible study is to determine if it is strengthening to the overall spiritual welfare of the church. The Corinthian church was zealous and had many ideas on how to praise God and interpret His teachings. Paul cautioned them that all must be done in order (1 Cor. 14:40), and he shared the critically important exhortation: "Let all things be done unto edifying" (1 Cor. 14:26). Finally, we must always examine our hearts and determine that we are constrained (driven) by the "love of Christ" (2 Cor. 5:14); for unless there is "charity out of a pure heart" (1 Tim. 1:5) in all of these endeavors, no matter how much we may know and speak and do, "without charity it profiteth me nothing" (1 Cor. 13:1-3).

The Elder Body has developed the following statement of position regarding group Bible studies: "The Apostolic Christian Church supports Bible Studies which are structured in accord with biblical principles, for the purpose of increased understanding and application of God's Word, the edification of participants and the church and are to the glory of God".

The following general guidelines support and amplify this statement of position:

Bible study activity should be under the general oversight of the church (1 Pet. 5:2). Oversight includes responsibility (directly or by delegation) for adherence to relevant biblical principles, provision for faithful leadership, selection of acceptable, sound materials, coordination of scheduling with church functions and maintenance of overall accountability for each activity (1 Tim. 4:6; 2 Tim. 2:2).

An atmosphere should be maintained which edifies the church, and does not condone self-exaltation or strife, introduction of false doctrine, undermining of the church or diminishing of participation in or support for other church functions (Eph. 4:12-15; Phil. 2:3).

Approaches may be used to meet the special needs within the church (friends, singles, married, men, women, etc.) (Jer. 3:15; 1 Pet. 5:2).

The King James Version should be used for English speaking Bible studies, and sound versions for other languages i.e. Japanese, Spanish, etc. (1 Cor. 14:26; 2 Tim. 1:13).

Specific guidelines in accord with this position and the above broad guidelines may be established by each church.

It is the sincere desire and intent of the church leadership to promote sound, edifying Bible study in the Apostolic Christian Church, so that these biblical principles are supported for the strengthening of the Brotherhood and the glory of God.

Our church leadership is committed to utilizing the guidelines to establish good order in our Bible study activities and to responding to sincere requests for Bible study by providing appropriate opportunities

Small Church Study Committee Update

It is a blessing to share thoughts I pertaining to assistance for smaller congregations. There is room for interested brethren in congregations of all sizes to participate in this soul encouraging work. Scriptural-based reasoning as well as historical evidence suggests that when a congregation reaches a critical mass there is often continued, stable growth among the group. Recognizing it is the Lord's work, it appears this provides substantial fellowship and encouraging activities that draw our families and others to a saving faith in Christ and to become members of the body.

To help with fellowship and support, a larger congregation can adopt a small one. Bro. Loren Schrenk of our St. Louis church should be contacted for assistance in this regard. This article is intended to offer thoughts on a mechanism for growing congregations to a sustainable number. May the work be according to the will of our great God and blessed Savior, Jesus Christ.

Special blessings

Usefulness in the Lord's work provides a sense of fulfillment. Exercising one's faith builds strength and godliness (I Ti 4:7). Brethren who are a part of small congregations feel special blessings in the Lord's work. Frequent public prayers by brothers, numerous opportunities to host gatherings such as singings, and weekly care and maintenance duties are just a sample of things that provide fulfillment and help with spiritual growth. The following is a quote reflective of many thoughts expressed in the Small Church surveys. "We need every

person to make our church function. I think this is a strength of a small church, as it is evident that we need everyone." Others have verified the truth of Psalms 133:1, "Behold how good and how pleasant it is to dwell together in unity."

Living in neighborhoods where our church is relatively unknown gives opportunity to spread the gospel and share the truth of God's word in unique ways. Laboring and worshipping close beside fewer brethren necessitates the nurturing and feeding of one another. For unity to prevail in tight quarters, a church must preserve sound doctrine, and each individual must learn to appreciate God given gifts and talents (1 Co 12) while truly esteeming the other (Ph 2:3). "And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectnesss" (Col 3:14). Loving deeds for each other fosters a wonderful spiritual closeness (Ga 6:10). A balanced scriptural based mission is encouraged for all congregations.

Career opportunities

The Lord enabled many of our congregations to be established and grow because of brethren seeking occupational pursuits in common areas. The greater diversity of occupations has permitted brethren to live in new and less common "Apostolic Christian communities." This has also been the impetus for the establishment of new congregations.

With prayer and counsel from many, the SCSC is continuing to develop an internet-based method of making our brethren aware of job opportunities in church communities. For the present time this will be used to advertise positions available in our smaller congregations. The site, a part of the Mission Committee website, will not be used to provide a listing of available commercial jobs in the church area as there are other sites already available for this purpose. Rather the web site listing would be limited to positions available in brethren owned or controlled businesses. The postings will be reviewed and kept current.

To enable this work to proceed as planned, an "Opportunity Coordinator" for each congregation will be appointed. The committee believes this coordinator can be used of the Lord to facilitate many other valuable activities within the small congregation. Those working with this endeavor sincerely solicit the prayers and cooperation of the brotherhood as details are developed and decisions made.

Suggestions for support

Brethren, well established in their occupations, may consider mentoring younger brothers and sisters. Within smaller congregations this is sometimes very helpful since parents and family are located a distance away. Some businesses have been established within congregations with specific goals of providing employment for young members and friends.

Because of this, many of our smaller congregations have grown because young people could find work at home. In other instances these mission minded companies have drawn brethren from larger congregations as well as provided an opportunity to reach out into the small church community.

In all undertakings it is our duty to be diligent; realizing that as God adds his blessing, our labor will not be in vain (Ps 127:1).



As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:10

Assistance in Eastern Europe

The European Committee functions under both the World Relief Board and the Mission Committee. Our purpose is to serve our suffering brethren in Eastern Europe, whose roots of faith are the same as ours.

Some years ago, the European Committee, in conjunction with the World Relief Board, Mission Committee, our European brethren, and other interested persons was able to create an independent corporation under Romanian law that has proven to be a Godsend in the world in which all of us find ourselves at this present time. At the same time we all maintain the obligation of good stewardship and accountability to God and to the brotherhood.

This corporation, known as Antioch Association, allows everyone to work together in a joint international effort whose purpose is to serve the needy brethren in Europe. At the same time we are able to comply with the legal aspects of not only the laws of the nations in which we work, but also the European Union, which has become a very positive factor in our endeavors. The world has changed a lot since we first began helping in Europe, and God has guided us in keeping pace.

Antioch has many programs in place, and tries to keep our US brethren informed of what goes on. The effort that seems to have reached and helped the most people is our small livestock program.

This idea was suggested by our Romanian brethren, and has been in operation for about five years or so. Antioch furnishes any family who requests participation either three baby pigs or 100 chicks. All feed is furnished, and all costs are paid by Antioch, and at the time these animals are ready for slaughter, the grower receives two-thirds and Antioch one-third of the results.

As one glances backward in time, not only in Europe, but also in our own country, he finds that this type of subsistence farming has been the basis of survival for centuries.

The student of history finds that those who can live off the land do not starve. Our US brethren went through this same thing during the war and depression years, and those who did have never forgotten. The Eastern European brethren have never fully emerged from this sort of situation, thus are fully receptive to this type of program. They rejoice to have this means to hold their lives and families together in a changing world.

For several years Antioch has had somewhere around 300 projects such as this running annually, just in Romania. Having said that, World Relief knows that the same concept can be repeated virtually anywhere people are willing to work in exchange for an opportunity to help themselves. The experiment performed by this program has resulted in the hope that many

brethren, regardless of where they find themselves can benefit from something like this.

At this time, the European Committee feels we have a proven record of credibility in this form of project, and is making an appeal for the support of interested brethren. As with every Antioch endeavor, the goal is to help these dear struggling souls to find a way in which they can help themselves to build for the future of themselves, their families, and the Nazarean faith that has come through so much tribulation.

The small livestock projects, along with all other self-help Antioch programs, are financed by contributions given specifically for these purposes. The small livestock projects in Romania alone require \$45,000 to function each year. For this we depend on contributions specifically designated to meet this need.

Anyone so moved to help would earn the gratitude of many brethren. Our brethren in Eastern Europe, especially in the countries of Romania, Ukraine, Serbia, Croatia, and Slovakia wish to have their appreciation and gratitude conveyed to brethren in the West who support them faithfully and prayerfully. While normal World Relief contributions are vital, we make known this specific need to those so moved and able to help. them pay for what they had done. Even as He hung there on the cross, we think of Him hanging there on the cross looking down at those soldiers who had the swords and the spears in their hand. Those who had pounded the nails into His hands and His feet. Caused Him physical anguish. Yet He overcame any desire that may have been there to see their revenge. He said, Father forgive them for they know not what they do (St. Luke 23:34).

So truly we have that calling, don't we beloved ones, that we wouldn't seek or hold in our heart a grudge like Joab did. He held that there for a while. I don't know how long it was between the time that his wrongs had occurred and the time that he sought his vengeance. But it was a while. He held that in his heart. What kind of a life is that to have when we carry in our heart those kinds of things? It is a miserable life, isn't it? Maybe many of us have experienced that. Aren't we thankful that we can be given a life, really that is what it is like, we are given a life that is different than that when we come to the Lord. We are given an opportunity to get rid of that kind of a life that is filled with the dark things of our heart. That's filled with the troublesome things of our heart and is replaced with peace and love and appreciation. So much better a life that is, isn't it? Life more abundant Christ brought us.

It's a beautiful chapter that we read here in John. It is always a touching chapter that we can read together. I guess it is just so human, isn't it, to read here of loved ones of Jesus that experienced a death in their midst; their beloved brother. Mary, Martha and Lazarus. Many of you could probably stand here today and do a much better job of explaining and talking about what that is like to go through this very common activity or thing that happens to us here upon this earth. Many of you have experienced this far greater than I have in your life. Where we suddenly come face to face with the reality and the realness that life is not permanent here upon this earth. Life is finite. There is an end to it. That's where these loved ones here found themselves as we intercepted this chapter at verse seventeen. They found themselves there around one of their loved ones whose body was dead. The life was gone.

We've been there, haven't we? We have seen. It is that way for us. Still two thousand years later things haven't changed. But men come to a point in life. The physical earthly body has an end and it is done.

But I guess that is what is so encouraging and so touching with this chapter. It is such a comfort to those of us that have faith, that have been given grace to have faith in Christ and God. That we don't have to end there at the grave. Our hope doesn't end at the entrance of the tomb. It goes beyond that, doesn't it? We read about that here. "Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?" St. John 11:25.26.

I guess that is a question that can come to each of our hearts this afternoon. He asked Martha there, believest thou this? But let's ask ourselves this afternoon, do we believe that? Do we believe that we can have a hope and a promise that, though this body won't live forever, this body won't go on into eternity, but yet, we can have a hope and a promise, through the shed blood of Christ, that when this body is done, our soul and our spirit will go on forever and ever in eternity? Do we believe that?

I'm sure many of us would say that we do. If we do, beloved ones this afternoon in faith say that we believe that, aren't we thankful? Doesn't it make the difference in our life, the difference in our day to have that faith and belief, though there are fears in our life and though there are so many things about us that are just miserable when we really, in our humanness are honest with ourselves? This world isn't our home, is it? This world is good sometimes. We have times of joy. We have times of blessing. But we don't have to look very far. We don't have to look very hard and we realize that it is pretty limited. The joy that we experience here in this life just pales in comparison to the joy that's promised to us. The joy that God lays out for us, that's to come. We can't even compare it.

Sometimes we need to measure something. We need to figure out what unit of measure we are going to measure something in. We need to have it in the right scale to come close. We can't measure the joys of heaven, we can't measure what's promised for us if we are faithful, with the scale of this earth, can we? Sometimes we try to do that. We try to measure eternity, we try to measure what's to come by using what we are familiar with. We know how much joy we have experienced on this earth. We know how much sorrow we have experienced on this earth. We know our range of emotions we have experienced here below. We try to look ahead and use that same scale to imagine what it is going to be like. The Bible tells us we can't do that. It doesn't even compare.

That should be an encouragement to us. Though our days here upon this earth sometimes feel like they are tough and they are a heavy road, and they are, let's not lose our hope and our faith in Christ.

Sometimes I think about those of old that maybe lived a thousand years ago, whenever it might have been. They had a hard life regardless. Things just weren't very easy for anybody in those times. You died young. There was no relief from many afflictions. It was hard to find food. Life was just pretty hard scrabble all the way to the end. But even then there were faithful and true believers that were still faithful to God, all the days of their life. Even in

spite of the hardness already in their lives naturally, were called to face persecution. Were called to face even the bitterness of death, even maybe at a young age.

It just humbles me when I think about that. Of how relatively good we have things in this life and time that we live in. Yet, how much faith do we have, how much zeal do we have, do I have, for the Lord? That's humbling to think about. To think about a life of just eking out your days and then giving it up at twenty five or thirty because the government says you have to bow down and worship some other idol or else they will put you to death. What kind of life would that be? So we really, in a lot of ways, have things pretty good in this life, don't we?

But then again, I think also, we look at everything through relative eyes. We've never known those types of things that took place years ago. All we have is what we've known in this life.

"Then said Martha unto Jesus, Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died." v. 21. It is kind of an interesting statement that Martha made. I guess we could say it was a statement of faith. Martha had faith that if Jesus had been with them, their brother wouldn't have died. I'm sure at that point they had been with the Lord long enough. They had seen the Lord heal and raise the sick. So they had faith in their hearts, even as Martha could profess here, that if Jesus had been there, her brother had not died.

But I so appreciate what she said next. It ties in with what we heard this morning about faith and prayer and believing in God. She said, "But I know, that even now, whatsoever thou wilt ask of God, God will give *it* thee." v. 22. That's the faith we are called to have, beloved brothers and sisters. The faith we are called to have is that we serve one who can intercede for us with the Father. We serve one who, even as Martha said here, whatsoever thou will ask of God, God will give it thee.

We heard that so richly this morning, that we ought to be fervent in our faith, fervent in our prayer. I guess it just seems so important again this afternoon to re-emphasize that. We talk about life having it's difficulties. We have needs in our life and things are difficult sometimes. Maybe it is our work life. Our ability to make a living. Maybe it's difficult. Maybe it is raising a family. Not knowing just what to do with our children, how to teach them, what way to go with them. Maybe it is our church. Maybe it is uncertainty about what is happening, what is going on. How important it is that when we have needs in our life, do we get down on our knees and take it to the Lord and ask Him? Or do we forget to do that sometimes and the first thing we do is go to somebody else and we maybe complain about our life? We almost give up and we get frustrated. Frustration leads to complacency or bitterness that things aren't going well for

But if we have that true faith that I think this chapter talks about as well as it did this morning, that true faith that God is with us and God hasn't left us, God still hears our prayer, believing that, knowing that, why would we go anywhere else with our problems and with our cares than upon our knees? Why would we go anywhere else with our problems, with our worries, with our uncertainties, with our doubts, than to the Lord? I'm humbled and convicted when I say that because I don't do a very good job sometimes about that in my life.

We can read in other places, of the apostles, of the trials and tribulations they went through and endured. The prayers that they offered that went on through the night and the fervency they had as they sought God in prayer. Loved ones, we read that in the Bible. Why don't we do it today? Why don't we have that same zeal and that same courage? I guess I should clarify that. Why don't I have that? I don't know your life. Maybe you do. Maybe you spend long hours

in prayer. Our times haven't gotten any easier, have they? Satan hasn't gotten any less focused on destroying us than he was then with the apostles. If they needed that kind of a life, that kind of zeal and that kind of faith and that kind of fervency, how much more do we weak and fallible men that we are, just like they were, need that too?

I think it is good for us to acknowledge our weakness. It is good for us to acknowledge our frailty and our limits. But that shouldn't be a discouragement to us. I think that is always important to remind ourselves that, yes we are weak. Yes we have limits. We should know them. Nothing worse than somebody not knowing what their limits are, is there? That's when we get in trouble, isn't it, when we don't know what our limits are. We have to know what our limits are in anything that we do. Whether it is in our profession. Whatever it might be, we need to know our limits. If we know our limits, then we know when we need help.

So it is as we serve God, if we know our limits and we acknowledge them - it takes humility - we are going to be that much quicker to go to the Lord in prayer. That much quicker to ask Him for help. That much quicker to perhaps go to our brother, go to our sister for help, when we know our limits. That we are not self sufficient. But it should be an encouragement to us that, knowing our limits, we can go to one that can meet our needs. His supply of grace, His supply of strength is limitless.

That is quite a thought, when we really stop and think about it. Do we believe it? Do I believe it? Do I really believe that the God that I serve is able to do all things? I think we do, beloved ones. But let's strive to have even a fuller faith in that. That doesn't always mean that we are going to get our way. We always need to clarify that. It doesn't always mean that we can just ask for the world and expect to get it. That is not the point.

But if we examine what our spiritual needs are in life and put them first-and I wouldn't really want to stand here and say what those are for you or what they should be for us - but I think a few of them might be; that we can have grace to overcome our enemy. That we could be faithful all the days of our life, as long as God gives us that. There are probably many others. But just using those as a reference, aren't those the most important things?

None of us wants to get sick. None of us wants to have heartache in life. None of us wants to lose a loved one like they did here. We don't want those things. We can pray for health. We can pray for protection. Nothing wrong with that. When it comes right down to it, sometimes those things aren't given, are they? You've experienced that in your lives. Sometimes those things happen. We need to have the faith to accept what has happened. Knowing and believing that this world and this life is not what the Lord has promised us. He hasn't promised us a permanent place here.

So if we keep our longing and our desire and our hope not here below, but in that place that He's created, as He promised here, where we'll go to never die, then when these things come upon us in our life, it is still going to be hard, it is still going to be sad, but it won't shake that inner core faith and belief that we have.

I often think this for myself, cause I think about life and sometimes things seem pretty good. I often have a concern that things are so good, how strong am I really growing? It is good for us to think about that. Because I know that in my life, if and when, because I think it is more of a when than an if, a trial comes or a bad time comes. I want to be ready to face it. I want to be close to the Savior. I want to be strong in faith. So that when that comes. I am found ready to face that. I think there is a tendency and a danger that when things are so good, life is pretty easy really, it is not too hard

to make a living, our needs are met and then some and things are pretty good, there is a danger there, isn't there? That our spiritual muscles are going to get weak and soft. We want to be exercised in the Spirit. We want to be strong in the Spirit so that when those things come upon us, just as they did here in this chapter that we read together, that we are ready. That we can have that faith that is right there for us. And that grace to meet that.

There is a lot more in this chapter that we read. I noticed when we read it together, Mary said the same thing that Martha said. "...Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died." v. 32. I guess just again, that faith that with Christ with us, things would be okay. Things could be okay.

"...he groaned in the spirit, and was troubled, And said, Where have ye laid him? They said unto him, Lord, come and see. Jesus wept." v.33-35. We see there the heart of our Lord. We see there the understanding of our Lord, the compassion of our Lord. Beloved ones, we sing in that hymn, Jesus knows our sorrows. He understands our griefs and He understands our troubles (Jesus Knows Thy Sorrow, Hymns of Zion, #74). As it says here, He wept. We don't come to one that is unconcerned or hardened to our hearts and our emotions. He understands and by living a life here on this earth, He has experienced the things that we bear in life. He has compassion on us.

Jesus said, "...Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me. And I knew that thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said *it*, that they may believe that thou hast sent me." v. 41,42. That should be an encouragement for us. He was saying that at that time, to thank God for providing this opportunity for Him to be used so that the people there could believe. Beloved ones, you and I yet today, are partakers of that blessing. You and I today, we just did this afternoon, opened the Bible and we

partook of that same miracle, that same blessing that those there at that time partook of. It should be, it's meant to be and it should be, a strengthening for us. That is what it was meant to be to them at that time, as the Lord said here. That they may believe that thou hast sent me. That's, I believe this afternoon, what it is intended for us too. That our faith in Christ, that our belief can be strengthened. That we can be reminded that the one that we serve. Jesus Christ, was sent from God. As He said here, "...I am the resurrection, and the life..." v.25.

That's all we need, isn't it beloved ones, in our life? We go back and we think again about what we put at the forefront of our life. We talked about putting our spiritual needs first and making those the most important things. Can you think of anything that is more precious to you in your life than being one with Jesus, being one with Christ, being His child and knowing that, as He is the resurrection and the life, He is willing also to share that same resurrection and that same life with each and every one of us if we will but humble ourselves and receive it and then hold on to it. We can't make a one time experience, a one time profession. Beloved ones, we need to go on from that time, when by the grace of God, we believed. We sang that this afternoon, about the amazing grace (Amazing Grace, Hymns of Zion # 97). That time when we first believed.

We don't stop there. We don't stop there. We go forward from that point, believing and having faith. There is nothing, nothing in this life that's worth giving up the hope and the promise that we have to be with the Lord in heaven someday. This life, even if we lived eighty years, ninety years, that's a short time. We can't measure our life span. We cannot measure the pleasures that we think we are going to get in this life with the scale that God has created in eternity.

25 Ways to Provoke Anger in Children

This Silver Lining article addresses some ways that parents can unintentionally provoke their children to anger. This is part four of a four part series.

Parents have the calling (Prov. 22:6) to be proactive in training their children in the wisdom of how to experience the emotion (be ye angry), and yet make good choices (sin not). The context of this article will encourage parents to examine themselves first in how they can avoid "provoking their children to anger" (Col. 3:21). The author, Lou Priolo, outlines in his book on this topic, "The Heart of Anger1", 25 ways that parents can unknowingly create anger and frustration in their children.

The first 3 articles included the first 18 ways of provoking anger. The remainder of this article will look at examples 19-25 as behaviors parents should try to avoid.

19: Allowing Too Much Freedom:

The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame. (Prov. 29:15)

When children are allowed to: (1) practice sinful behavior, (2) indulge in non-sinful activities that are in excess of what their maturity and responsibility levels can process, or (3) live an undisciplined life that allows them to receive what they demand, other problems often develop.² Children that grow up in homes that allow too much freedom and not enough discipline often perceive that they are not loved by their parents.

20: Mocking Your Child:

Are there not mockers with me? and doth not mine eye continue in their provocation? (Job 17:2)

The many silly actions and awkward behaviors of children will often produce moments that a parent could acknowledge them with a teasing, jesting, or mimicking response. A lighthearted and spontaneous moment is one of the joys of parenting, but for the child's sake, parents should never respond consistently with a ridiculing or mocking attitude. Parents should especially be sensitive to the areas of their child's inadequacies about which the child can do very little. Some general examples

include intelligence, athletic abilities, physical features, and motor coordination.

21: Abusing Them Physically:

And when the ass saw the angel of the Lord, she fell down under Balaam: and Balaam's anger was kindled, and he smote the ass with a staff. (Num. 22:27)

As parents model being the "bishops" of their home (I Tim. 3:2), there are great benefits in exercising patience and avoiding the "striker" (brawling or bullying) mode of responding. There is also wisdom in not repeating Balaam's reactionary approach to disciplining: (1) he had not collected all the relevant information, (2) he responded out of being embarrassed or unfulfilled expectations, (3) he was consumed with anger and out of control.

22: Ridiculing or Name Calling:

Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. (Eph. 4:29)

Utilizing earthly insults such as idiot, stupid, moron, lazy, etc. don't provide a biblical corrective direction. The repetitive use of the insult only embarrasses, shames, or antagonizes the child. God calls out sin directly but does so in a way that emphasizes His love for the person while abhoring the sin.

23. Unrealistic Expectations:

When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things. (1 Cor. 13:11)

Parents should try to remember that the Bible acknowledges that children speak, think and reason differently from adults. This process takes time and occurs at varying rates depending on the child. Frustration for both child and parent is probable when parents impose standards that their children are developmentally incapable of performing.

24. Practicing Favoritism:

And he (elder son) answering said to his father, Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends: (Luke 15:29)

The prodigal's father rightly rejoiced, but the brother wrongly perceived that his father was showing

favoritism. The human nature can be a powerful "score keeper". Since siblings are rarely carbon-copies of each other, they should be treated as individuals. In contrast, the standards by which each child is evaluated and by which parents respond to each child should be identical (a point that the older son failed to understand). Some children experience hurt and bitterness in homes where parents fail to communicate this standard and neglect to reassure their children through the ongoing evaluation process.

25. Child Training with World Methodologies Inconsistent with God's Word:

And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. (Eph. 6:4)

There are two ways being contrasted for fathers (parents) to "bring up" their children. Raising a child properly in the discipline and instruction of the Lord will not provoke them to anger, but jumping to each new quick-fix parenting technique probably will. Parents without a biblically-built framework for creating structure and order in their home will find additional challenges and struggles with raising their children. This challenge will be especially magnified in the high-need, strong willed child.

Conclusion:

Since our children are the heritage of the Lord (Ps. 127:3), it is vital that they learn how to discern and appropriately respond to anger. While this article does not address specific skills for children to use in learning how to manage anger and frustration, it does provide an outline for strengthening parent's awareness of possible trigger points in children. Some children's personalities and temperaments are going to require additional help from mom and dad in learning these skills. Those efforts on behalf of children needing to learn the balance of emotions and actions are going to be well pleasing to God.





- We are taught the importance of works as a demonstration of our thankfulness to God and Jesus Christ for our salvation.

The Light Of Hope

"Speak Evil Of No Man"

Over my lifetime, I have had the idea that if you can't say something good about a person, don't say anything. After one of our trips to the States from Japan, during the early years of our stay there, I was asked, "What do you think is the biggest problem in our American church? Is it materialism?"

I replied, "No. I think it is criticism of each other within the church." If someone asked me today, I would probably reply, "No. I believe we all need to be more dead to self." However, it is of interest to me that I had that impression, which prompted my former answer, "Too much criticism."

Constructive criticism is good. Professors in college are paid to give constructive criticism to students who are prospective teachers. Student teachers are asked to teach elementary or junior high students and the critic teacher is busy writing down everything that the student teacher did wrong, in his or her opinion. That will keep you on your toes.

It seems to me that the important thing about criticism is that you never put yourself above the person you are criticizing. You are not the final authority on anything. God is. However, you may say what you think and believe, or what you

understand the Bible to teach.

The scripture verse which pertains to this topic is found in Titus 2:3, "To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle, shewing all meekness unto all men." A brawler is someone who quarrels noisily. We are to be gentle and show all meekness unto all men.

In regard to my personal commitment that if you can't say something good about another person, don't say anything, I have run into some difficulties during my lifetime. The problem is that people ask you questions as to what you think or feel about what someone else has said or done. Then if you think and feel that what the other person has done is not the best, and you say so, you sound like you are saying something about them which is not good. You have broken your commitment. If you say that you think what they have done or said is fine and you support them in it, you are not speaking the truth. Some people call it lying. Revelation 21:8 it is written, "All liars shall have their part in the lake of fire which burneth with fire and brimstone." It is assumed that all children of God do not lie. Of course we must let God decide what are lies in His sight and what kind of statements are permissible,

but it is something to consider in regard to what we should say and not say.

A helpful verse in this matter is probably Philippians 2:3, "Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves." It is important that we look up to others and not down on them.

As a general rule, I believe it is good to have as one of our mottos that if we can't say something good about another person, don't say anything. In politics, if someone is running for office, that may be a bit difficult. Opposing candidates generally lambaste each other in an effort to get the votes of the electorate. However, if there were ever a candidate who said, "My opponent's thinking is this and my thinking is this," without personally attacking him or her. I would be attracted to that candidate. I don't like conflict Jesus, also, encourages us to shy away from conflict when He said, "Agree with thine adversary quickly," Matthew 5:25.

Let's try to say nice things about others and in so far as possible, "Speak evil of no man." It helps us to feel better.
