

Sermon by Bro. Kevin Knapp, Bloomington, IL

Psalm 105 and John III

This song that they were singing obviously was a recounting of the deeds from when the children of Israel were very few in number and famine came in the land. They were forced to be removed from the land but God had already provided. He had sent a slave, His servant Joseph, ahead of them.

I thought it was interesting, when we think of these stories sometimes, think of these events, we tend to think of them in big, broad pictures. It is easy to lose sight of the detail. But one of the things that caught my eyes with Joseph, they said his feet hurt. (Psalm 105:18) He was in chains. He was taken as a captive. It was not a pleasant experience for him. Yet, in so doing, God had prepared the way for His people. So let's keep that in mind.

Once again, we have New Testament principle lived out by the Scripture recorded in the Old Testament. There are several powerful verses in John. Let's read a couple of them again. "Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth." (v 2) John is the spiritual father. He wants them to do well. He wants every facet of their life to be good. He wants their health to be good. But he also wants their soul to prosper.

"For I rejoiced greatly, when the brethren came and testified of the truth that is in thee, even as thou walkest in truth." (v 3) His delight was that his followers, those that he was discipling, would walk in the spirit of truth.

"I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." (v 4) I would have to say that statement is as powerful as any in the New Testament. Whether it is from a church leadership standpoint, I can tell you there is no greater honor than to hear the children, our church family, walking in truth. As a parent, certainly as a mother, but certainly as a father, is there any

greater joy than to know that your children walk in truth?

I'll brag a little bit because they are not here and I won't even mention names. But a few of us were at a restaurant the other night. Someone came up to us and just said, "Hey, I just had some dealings with one of your kids. I just have to tell you what a delight it is." That does something for a parent, doesn't it? But it does something for a church family.

He goes on to say, "Beloved, thou dost faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers. Which have borne witness of thy charity before the church; whom if thou bring forward on their journey after a godly sort, thou shalt do well:" (v 5,6)

How do we know we are walking in truth? How did John even have a clue that the people that were following him were following the gospel? It was by the testimony of their lives. It was by how they were treating others. It was by the charity they had.

I was touched, as I am sure you were, by the real short article in the 'In Touch' about the Miracle House. I think that may have been in Pas Christian. I am not sure. Or it could have been in Biloxi. One of those areas. But for a number of years, our brethren went down there and built houses and established a wonderful reputation and hearts were changed. Because their truth was their deeds.

I heard from Brother Ron Farney that the pastor who gave the invocation for the blessing of the house, said this among other things, "We thank You for the hurricane because it allowed us to see the miracle that You can do." That was by the coordinated effort of many people to build a house in a week.

The hand of God is all over, isn't it? We tend to see it much deeper in adversity than we do when things

Light From The Word



Submission

Writings based on God's Word

Last month's "Light from the Word" examined the topic of Self-Denial. We are called to crucify our own will (Gal.

5:24) and submit to the will of the Father (Jam. 4:7; 1 Pet. 5:6). He decides what is right and wrong, and true happiness is found in obedience to His Word.

Tightly interwoven with the concept of self-denial is the need for submission. Our sinful nature instinctively bristles at that word. We like to be in control, and the context of history has trained us to equate submission with oppression. However, the light of truth and experience reveal that it is when we take control that we find ourselves oppressed. Freedom is found in submission to God (2 Cor. 3:17). We are "subject to vanity," but in Christ, we "shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God" (Rom. 8:20-21). "Submit yourselves therefore to God" (Jas. 4:7).

Lest we resent God's call to submit to His authority, let's recognize that He is not asking us to do anything that Christ has not already done as our example. God is not merely one, but three in one (1 John. 5:7). In the Trinity, we find perfect unity, authority, and submission. The Father is the ultimate authority; Christ is subject to Him, and the Holy Spirit is subject to both (John 14:26). Any authority possessed by Christ is given to Him of the Father (John 5:19-27). "I can of mine own self do nothing," Christ said, "...because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me" (John 5:30).

So the call to submit is a call to conform to the image of Christ, to be "partakers of His divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:4). The Greek word for submission is hypotasso, which literally means to rank under. It says nothing about value, but everything about authority. The biblical structure of authority and submission is rooted in the very nature of God, who is the source of love (1 John 4:16-19). He provides the code for our interactions with the family, the church, the state, the workplace, and each other.

Ephesians 5:22 - 6:4 paints a beautiful picture of God's design for the family, where man, wife, and children reflect the perfect roles, authority, and submission

of the Trinity. Just as the Holy Spirit is subject to Christ and both are subject to the Father, children are subject to their parents and both are subject to God. Within the family, God gives man the headship (1 Cor. 11:3), and it is by his loving authority that the wife manages the children and the home (Tit. 2:4-5). The father should not exert his own will, but the will of the Father, to whom he is subject. All earthly authority, properly executed, should move its subjects toward a willing submission to God (Eph. 6:4).

In God's design, even authority is submissive, for it is defined by service to its subjects. Christ said, "Ye call me Master and Lord, and ye say well, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet, ye also ought to wash one another's feet" (John 13:13-14). Once again, God is not asking us to do anything that He has not exemplified through Christ. Husbands are commanded to love their wives "as Christ loved the church" (Eph. 5:25). How did Christ love the church? He "gave himself for it." "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren" (1 John 3:16). God gives the man familial authority, but the man should not oppress his wife; he should cleave to, nourish, and cherish her (Eph. 5:29-31).

This same Trinitarian authority structure is stamped on the church. Elders are appointed to oversee the church like shepherds tending to their flocks (Jer. 23:4; Acts 20:28; Tit. 1:5). The flock is therefore instructed to "obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves for they watch for your souls as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief, for that is unprofitable for you" (Heb. 13:17). Christ is the Chief Shepherd (1 Pet. 5:4) to which both the shepherds and the flock are accountable. Practically speaking, this means that we should willingly submit to our elders' instructions while holding them accountable to the Word.

These same principles apply to the state. God expects us to submit to the authority of the state (1 Pet. 2:13-17), and the governmental leaders are likewise expected to submit to God (Rom. 13:1-7). If they fail to do this and our submission to

them conflicts with our submission to God, we are to ultimately submit to God. Like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, "we ought to obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29).

In the workplace, as employees, we submit to our employers, who are commanded to submit to God. Following the same pattern we have already discussed, the employers are also instructed to serve their employees, mindful that their "Master also is in heaven, neither is there respect of persons with him" (Eph. 6:5-9).

Finally, the Bible repeatedly instructs us to submit to each other (Eph. 5:21, Gal. 5:13-14). This goes against our carnal nature and is only possible with the mind of Christ (Phil. 2:3-5). How do we exercise this submission to our fellow man? For one thing, we can assume responsibility for each other's spiritual safety, sacrificing our personal liberties to avoid creating a situation that might entice a weaker brother to fall (Rom. 14:13). We can also choose to trust the motivations of our Christian brethren rather than prejudging their intent and policing their actions. Perhaps one of the best demonstrations of submission involves forbearance and readiness to for-"Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye" (Col. 3:13). Of course, the most visible way to submit is to humbly serve one another's physical

As we have already seen, Christ is the ultimate example of submission. He "made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant...and humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him and given him a name which is above every name" (Phil. 2:7-9).

Biblical submission is key to love, unity and peace. As we conform to Christ's image, let's each think about the roles to which God has called us and faithfully demonstrate the proper submission accorded to those roles. This is "well pleasing" to the Lord (Col. 3:20) and edifying to one another (Rom. 14:19).

Bible Study Development

The Bible Study Development Committee is working under the oversight of the Elder Communications Committee to develop Bible Study outlines which can be used by the Apostolic Christian Brotherhood for approved Bible Study activities. The committee consists of five brothers, a counseling elder and a brother from Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services as an ex officio member.

Once developed and approved, the committee will work with the Publications Committee in making outlines available to the Brotherhood. Activities include collecting Bible Study outlines from local churches which have the approval of the local elder, modifying existing outlines, developing new outlines to meet specific requests, accumulating an inventory of materials to be made available to the Brotherhood and receiving suggestions for topics. All studies will conform to the "Bible Study Outline Guidelines." The activities and accomplishments to date are twofold; process development and materials development.

Process development

The world itself could not contain all that could be written about the works of Jesus Christ (John 21:25). Similarly, the potential number of Bible Studies that could be developed is daunting. A process has been developed to support many simultaneous development activities. Key provisions of the process include:

• A project charter that clearly defines the intended audience, specific content, scope, purpose and intent of the study. The charter

helps assure the study addresses a specific need and is not merely a duplication of a similar study that already exists.

- Various resources that aid both the development and evaluation process such as "Qualities of Effective Bible Study Questions."
- A formal review process including a spiritual review, teaching review and composition review. In addition some studies might merit a pilot group to complete the study and provide feedback prior to final publication.
- A review coordinator who works with study champions, developers, reviewer pool, pilot groups, and others to assure studies progress in a relatively steady manner. Apostolic Christian Counseling and Family Services is providing an individual to serve this role for the Brotherhood.

Materials development

An inventory of more than one hundred studies or individual lesson segments has been accumulated to date. From this, the committee has focused on development of three studies as examples or proof of concept to test and develop portions of the development process. These include a study of John 15, the Proverbs and the book of Galatians. The John 15 study has been evaluated by several pilot groups. The other two studies are yet in development.

It is envisioned that the activities of the Bible Study Development Committee will form the nucleus that spawns numerous related activities that are coordinated to the benefit of the entire brotherhood. Materials under development will be suitable for a variety of purposes, and no single model or format of

study is intended. For example the Psalmist wrote that God's word was a lamp unto his feet and a light unto his path (Psalm 119: 105). And it was his meditation all the day (Psalm 119: 97). An outline that encourages meditation might be thought of as a devotional or personal study. By contrast the men of Berea searched the scriptures to determine whether some things were so (Acts 17:11). Outlines resulting in this type of study are more in depth and allow for proving or discovering what the scriptures teach. Other outlines may be more analogous to that which Nehemiah wrote, where Ezra read from the word, then the people broke into small groups where they were caused to understand the reading (Nehemiah 8:1-8).

Your help needed

Please be prayerful that the effort to develop Bible Study outlines will be blessed with God's promise of grace to those who approach His Word with a humble, reverent spirit (Isaiah 66:2; James 4:6). The purpose of Bible Study is to help us walk the narrow way which leads to life (Matthew 7:14), to inspire us to godly living and to be less carnally minded and less conformed to the things of this world which will soon pass away (Romans 8:6; 12:2). Assisting Believers of Serbia and Croatia in Eastern Europe

In the mid-1800's the doctrine and teachings of Bro. Samuel Froehlich were carried eastward by faithful believers establishing the Nazarene faith throughout Eastern Europe. By WWI, estimates of up to 65,000 of these believers existed in the northern Balkan areas in the present day countries of Serbia and Croatia. These believers established hundreds of vibrant, growing churches in villages across the fertile plains and wooded mountains.

Troubled history

Unfortunately, the Nazarene faith in this area has diminished greatly over the years. Today approximately 2,300 believers still worship in about 80 churches. Many locations will become nonexistent over the next decade. Overall, 80-90% of the church population in this area is over 50 years of age. How and why did this dramatic decline in church population occur? What happened to all the young people?

The ravaging effects of WWI and especially WWII decimated the general population and economy with the loss of over 1 million civilians in this area alone. The church population was hard hit, never to recover, families torn apart, homes and businesses destroyed, fathers and brothers never to be seen again, church buildings and worship materials seized, confiscated, and destroyed. Following WWII, the Socialist Republic of Yugoslavia was established and led by Josef Tito, ushering in an era of strong economic prosperity and growth,

but unfortunately, also an era of severe religious persecution for the remaining Nazarene believers. During this time, thousands of Nazarene men were imprisoned for refusing to bear arms or renounce their faith. In the words of a survivor, "We were treated worse than slaves!"

Thousands of Nazarene families chose to flee the country during the 1950's & 60's, primarily to W.Germany, Canada, Ohio, and California congregations. The generation who fled are those who would have produced the missing generation of young people in Serbia and Croatia today.

With the collapse of the Yugo-slav Republic in 1992 and subsequent ethnic wars, believers were once again subjected to hardships, turmoil and uncertainty. As the independent countries of Serbia, Croatia, and others rose from the ashes, religious discrimination and persecution against fundamental Christians were relaxed. Thankfully, today Nazarene believers may worship as they choose.

These countries are extremely weak economically, fraught with mismanagement and corrupt to the core. Resulting high unemployment (over 30%) and Mafia-controlled markets make everyday life difficult for average citizens for whom a typical monthly wage is only \$250, all going toward cost of living.

Providing basic needs

Against this daunting backdrop of past hardship and present challenges, Apostolic Christian World Relief provides basic monetary assistance to increasing numbers of elderly Nazarene believers and large families who can no longer make ends meet under the current economic conditions. Assistance with the cost of winter heat (usually firewood), medical needs and school supplies is of great value as most rely on subsistence farming and other self-employment for basic income.

Thirty self-help loan projects enable brethren to establish or enhance small family businesses creating employment opportunities for grown children and other believers. In addition, small monetary grants are given for special needs of newborn children, newlywed couples and small loans for home improvement needs. All assistance and aid programs are administered effectively by a relief committee led by brethren in church leadership.

Because of an unforeseen situation, the Detroit home, which has the capacity for five residents, was only beingused for housing four men. The unexpected opening allowed for us to fill it as a new CILA spot. By swapping homes, we will be able to use the opening for a female, and thus fulfill our rightsizing commitment. God has truly been faithful in providing for us in so many ways throughout this process.

One highlight this summer for some of our Timber Ridge residents has been going to a day camp. They take a picnic lunch, spend time fishing, go on a boat ride, and enjoy just being outside.

ACHH employees appreciated hearing from some special people that came for our staff meeting in June. Our first administrator, his wife and his daughter came and shared with us some of their life experiences. We heard how it was to start working for the Home before there was a building, how many (or few!) staff were employed as the first residents moved in, and of overnight camping trips and other excursions that are no longer feasible. We heard what is was like to be the mother of a boy who just didn't seem to be progressing like he should as he got a little older, and the doubts and fears that initially were there. We heard from

the perspective of a younger sibling to a handicapped brother, and the joys of growing up with someone that would always put a unique spin on any experience.

We each have the privilege of our own unique position in God's family and the Lord's specific expectations of us. Sometimes we find ourselves in circumstances in life that can be very difficult. Let God be your circumstance—recognize that He wants to be a part of every aspect of your life. May we be encouraged in whatever situations we find ourselves this day, to use....exercise....our gifts from the Lord. Psalm 118:24 "This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it."

GATEWAY WOODS APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN CHILDREN'S HOME Roger Gasser

As I was driving to do some errands on a recent Saturday morning, I was thinking about some of the young people I deal with, and the great problems they and their families have with anger. I drove past a sign of a local business called "Dead End Cycles", and although I wasn't looking for any motorcycles that morning, I had to think how many dead end cycles there are in which fallen man can find themselves.

Sin is the root cause, of course, but many of its manifestations just repeat themselves generation after generation, and anger is one of its forms. It is natural and only to be expected that this cycle will go on and on unless divine intervention takes place, and the light of the Lord illuminates a soul, reversing this downward spiral.

As counselors at Gateway Woods, we deal with many young people who are angry. When a child is angry, it is common he or she will either talk it out or act it out. The reason many of our young people are on campus in the first place is because they have acted out their frustrations because of fear, loneliness, insecurity, and pain they have felt. Just this week a young lady shared with me the anger and hurt she felt because her

dad had promised to come see her, and once again he had broken his word.

As best we can, we try to fill in the breach, but we know we can never take the place of a parent. Hopefully we can point to a better way, and one young man told me he wanted to be a different person than his dad, "because anyone can father a kid but it takes a great man to be a dad."

Sometimes the message of spiritual truth finds fertile soil and does make an impact, before our eyes. I have many materials I use in providing "anger management," and one of those sources includes a story about an elderly Native American telling his grandchildren about life. As the story goes, the old Indian was telling the young people there were two wolves at war in their heads, a good one and an evil one. The youngster asked the old man which one would win, and he replied, "The one you feed."

I was reading this story to a young boy to make a point, and he immediately said, "That's just like God and Satan working in us!"

Deeply grateful, I knew the message faithfully taught by Houseparents and Sunday School teachers had found fertile soil. It made me glad to know other members of the Gateway team have been serving in the mission, because I knew that boy did not learn this truth at his home. At the same time I was humbled and admonished by a young boy one-fifth my age. Although scripture would indicate one of the wolves was a "roaring lion", it really is God and Satan, not two wolves.

Surely anger is a trait we are to put off (Eph. 4:31, Col. 3:8), but should it briefly become part of our lives, we must not sin in it. As best I understand scripture, the longest we have any kind of "permission" to hold it, if we dare use that word, is perhaps 14 hours, until the sun goes down (Eph. 4:26). However, experience teaches us if we keep it that long, we most likely will have a very bad day. We have young people who have held their anger nearly 14 years, and some of their parents have kept theirs two and three times that long.

If we find ourselves getting too worked up about something, we probably should keep a close eye on the position of the sun, because we can nurse and feed that anger, but soon we must give it up to God and let go. Forgiveness, after all, is a gift we give ourselves. The alternative is a "dead end cycle" that can last for generations. Far worse, though, is the frightening thought that we actually might stand before Christ in Judgment, realizing full well we knew the words He had said in Matt. 6:15, "If ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your father forgive your trespasses," and just never took them seriously.

How are you doing with your anger? We all know people who seem to be under the total control of the Spirit, but maybe we also know some who are still harboring something from yesterday, or last year, or even 40 years ago. God help us to "number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Ps. 90:12). The sun is going down!

Thank you for your part in this ministry, whether we ever find out about it or not.

What do you say to a disconsolate mother whose son was brutally stabbed to death? She describes how he left the house with a friend, and a half-hour later someone shows up at her house to give her the grim news that her son is dead. She can't fathom that fact that he's really gone...he's never coming home again. And justice? No known motive for the killing. The assassins fled the scene, to kill again as they've done in the past. The family is poor, so forget about a police investigation. Besides, the mother fears if the police did catch the killers, they'll eventually bribe their way out of prison, and come back with a vengeance. She doesn't want to lose another son. She wonders where God is in all of this, and why He allowed this to happen. She guestions if there really is a heaven and a hell out there, or if heaven and hell are just what we experience here on this earth—the life of the poor is hell, the life of the rich is glory. She wishfully hopes her son is in heaven, because he was a good kid for the most part...read the Bible, talked to people about God, was generous with money. He suffered a lot in this life, so she thinks he's been through his "Calvary" and wants to believe he won't have to go to purgatory. She's uncertain if his spirit will come back from the dead and show up at the house...people told her to leave the lights on so he won't find the house dark when he returns. What would you say?

This is a true story. Things like this happen every day. Not always this dramatic—usually they're so mundane we hardly pay attention. The details are different, the characters change, the questions aren't expressed quite this way. But all of us live in a broken world, a world where evil is rampant, suffering is hard, and sometimes it seems like God is nowhere to be seen. And people have

questions. They're looking for answers, trying to make sense out of life when their plans and dreams go up in smoke. And if you get close and listen, they might ask you. What do you say?

Many of us are filled with fear that maybe they will ask us, and we won't know what to say, or we'll say the wrong thing. They don't need pat answers, quick fixes, a "Don't worry, things will get better soon, just watch." They don't need a random Bible verse, although they do need the Bible. They need the Word of Life, the One who is the Word incarnate, the One who indwells you. In a word, they need Christ. And we need the Holy Spirit as we answer. As they talk with us, they need to see a reflection of Jesus. They need to see His compassion, pouring out tears over the brokenness in this world. His righteous anger, eyes flashing at the injustices that hard-hearted men perpetrate against the weak and defenseless, and assuring us that He will come back one day to make all wrongs right. They need to hear of His sovereignty and power, that nothing escapes His knowledge, control, and care. are going well. So I guess I would challenge each of us as we think about this, think about it in your own lives. Think about it in your children's lives. Think about it in the church family's lives. There is no greater joy than to hear that our children, our church family, walks in truth. That our reputation in the community is strong because we rush in to help where we're needed. That when the issues of supporting life are there, we as a church family. stand soundly behind it and let our voice be heard and we act in it and many of you do that.

This Psalm makes this comment. "Give thanks unto the Lord; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people." (v 1) Particularly as we are raising children, that can be a very humbling experience. Some things go very well. Some things don't go well at all. Some things we can control. Others, we have no control over. Yet, when you are in the parenting process, you feel a responsibility for how things turn out. Do we take the time to testify of the great things that the Lord hath done?

If you go through and you recount this story, the story of the Israelite people, you will find miraculous deeds along the way! Incredible things that happened! But as you are going through them, they aren't so miraculous, are they?

It starts out by saying, "Let's testify of the Lord." Okay, so let's go back and let's recount what happened. Wait a minute. God made a promise with His people. Has He made a promise with us? He has made an incredible promise with the human family. Whosoever will may come. Whosoever will may come and live in truth. That encapsulated verse is the source of many sermons, to be sure. But the source of life giving, what that amounts to. He made a promise to Abraham. He fulfilled it. He made a promise. Promises went right on down through Jacob. He was renamed Israel.

Then famine came to the land. Concern came to the people. How are we going to feed our people? How am I going to feed my family? There is no water. We must do something else or we will starve. Often in our lives, that is where we are in the story. Put yourself right in the middle of that. Maybe in your mind or in your heart or in your life you are going through that famine right now. Things are not lush and green. They are barren and cold.

What the Israelites could not have comprehended, because it was a completely separate piece, that the God who had promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, had already gone on before them and prepared the way. He had taken Joseph, who was sold in slavery. He was already preparing the way for years! Yet, in that time, so often I think, as Brother Mark was sharing this morning, the challenges, I think with a mother, there is both the ecstasy and the absolute pit of child raising. I was thinking about that. Just kind of picture this if you will. In Luke's Gospel, the first chapter, the angel comes to Mary and says you are highly favored. Now if you were a potential mother and the angel of the Lord came to you and said, you are highly favored of all men. wouldn't that almost be the ecstasy, the anticipation of that? And yet, a few days after the birth, as Simeon is revealing all these great things that the Lord is going to do, there is a sub note put in the text and it says, as he looks at Mary, yea, a sword will pierce your heart also. I trust she carried those words with her as she did the others.

"Give thanks unto the Lord; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people. Sing unto him, sing psalms unto him: talk ye of all his wonderous works." (Psalm 105:1,2) That should be a challenge to us. How has the Lord gone before you and prepared the way for you? I can't tell you the number of just little side testimonies I hear and I am sure you hear them too. Of how the Lord has gone ahead. When we are

trying to trek through this life seemingly stubbing our toe at every turn and all of a sudden, it is as if we turn a corner and there is this scan that we see and we say, how did that happen? You see, He did that for a nation. They could sing of His wondrous deeds, because they could now from the tail end, recount everything He had done. But I assure you, when they were in the midst of that, they did not always feel like singing and praising.

Isn't it refreshing to take a big step back and to say, Look what He has done! I think it is just incredibly powerful, as you look back over your life, to recount those things. And as we are parenting and grand parenting, where we are around youth, testify of that! Testify of the salvation that was brought to your name. But don't stop there. Testify of the works of God, how He placed that person in a certain place at a certain time. Be cognizant of it. Recount it one to another!

Let's go back now to John for a moment. He makes this statement, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." (v 4) What had this man seen? What had John seen in the few short years that he walked with Christ and now in the events since Christ was gone from the scene and the Spirit had taken His place? Let's recount a couple of them.

One of the things that I think would have been as powerful of a testimony as anything was the evidence of the Holy Spirit at work in the life of a man by the name of Saul. How he had gone out and persecuted the church and how the Spirit of God had touched him and completely changed who he was. How in that short amount of time, an enemy of God became an advocate for Him. That is one thing that he saw.

How is it that he also would have seen his fellow apostles, in a moment of time, running for their lives for fear, yet in a few short weeks, being empowered by the Spirit of God, standing up and speaking boldly. Do Sermon continued from page 39

you suppose that John had the insight in Scripture as it is recorded in Luke, as Luke would recall the words of Christ, that His teachings must start in Jerusalem and be spread to the known world. Only to have, in the day of Pentecost, Jews from around the world gathered in that very place and to see the start of the spread of the Gospel as those people went back to their homes and that truth revealed. Do you suppose John wondered then, as Herod came and took John, a man that he had walked with for three years, and in a moment of time he took his life! Do you suppose it gave him pause for a moment to say, Lord what are you doing? Or had he learned the lesson by then that what is in God's realm is in God's realm? If God chooses to take a servant home. He takes him home.

Do you suppose there was any confusion when Peter was then miraculously freed from prison? Or was it understood that the Lord had intent for him? And how about when persecution came on the church so strongly that virtually every one of the believers were forced to leave Jerusalem? Only the church leadership stayed back to maintain that church. But in so doing, just as God had prepared the way for the Israelite people, He had prepared the spreading of His Word as they went out and guess where they started? In Jerusalem and in Judaea. Then they went to Samaria. Then this enemy of God turned friend of God and carried the Word beyond. Which of these works would John have been apt to speak of? Or are there things that are in his heart that are only going to be revealed when we hear his story in heaven?

How about us? How about you? What are the wonderful things the Lord has done? I think if we got started on that, we could have a little praise session. We might interrupt a few Mother's Day plans. Let's postpone that. But recount them! Articulate them! Write them down. It is amazing what you can learn if

you write something down. The faithfulness of God. Go back and recount them.

On my computer at work, I keep things. Try to get rid of all the unwanted emails, and they come in by the bunches. There are a few that I keep, some from Dix, some from the kids. Every once in a while, I flip back. I have them from several years ago, just a few. Every time I go back, it reminds me of where we were and where we are today. Without pause, I remember the work of the Lord. I remember it's power. I remember that He is the one who has the ability to change who we are. I love to testify of Him. Do you? Things aren't nearly as dramatic as parting the Red Sea. But loved ones, when it happens in your life and you know it, testify of it! Those are the things that shape who we are. They don't stop.

I won't recount the specific events, but a few months ago, Mom and Dad had one of those events. In their heart, they knew that God had prepared the way. Testify of it. We serve a God who oversees the world. Who had gone before the children of Israel. Who had sent Joseph in fetters and chains so that he would be in the proper place at the proper time so that a whole bunch of people could come. That people would grow in number so great that they were blessed beyond the Egyptians! There would come a time when he would show himself so powerfully that no one could miss it unless we had the sin of unbelief.

I will leave you with just one thought of walking in truth. Perhaps, perhaps the greatest restraint of our willingness to testify who He is and see His work in our life, is unbelief. When we walk in truth, we believe God for who He says He is. That is, He is not constrained by who we are. He is not constrained by who we are. I think of a man that in one facet I would like to emulate. This man, as I recall, was a Roman centurion. This man approached Christ and he said, I have a servant who is dying! Would you heal him?

First of all, he is not Jewish, he is Gentile. So you have all of those strange things going on. You have that man who should have been in power humbling himself before the power, which is a lesson in itself. right? Sometimes we think we are masters of our universe. This man ruled people and he ruled with the sword. But he understood he didn't rule sickness. So he bowed before the living Christ. The Lord said, Yes. I will go heal your servant. Take me to him. This centurion, this man who could not have been schooled in the ways of God, but had an understanding of who he was, replied this. He said, Lord you don't need to do that. He said, I am a soldier. I have men that report to me. I tell them, you go out and you do this. I don't go check on them. They do it. All you have to do is say the word and I believe it will happen.

Now between you and me, I don't know if I would have had that faith. I think I would have wanted to see that little process all the way through to the end, like, okay now get out of bed. Okay Lord, now you can go. Not this man! He believed Christ for the word that He spoke. He had seen enough evidence.

Have you seen enough evidence in your life to believe Christ? That what He says is true? We have! So dear ones, just as he encouraged us here, that there is no greater joy than to know that our children walk in truth, let's be quick to testify of his deeds. Let's be quick to say, if our Lord said it, He will do it.





Workplace Relationships Part II

This article is a continuation from last month, where we covered the first three of seven key ideas to handling difficult workplace situations.

4.Understanding levels of communication: Facts versus feelings.

Proverbs 15:1 "A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger."

Hebrews 13:16 "But to do good and to communicate forget not..."

Escalations in workplace conflict often are the result of feelings getting in the way of facts. We are advised to be very careful how we communicate both verbally and non-verbally. So often we may be saying something with our mouths but may be relaying something quite different by our tone of voice, our body language, or our eye contact. When we feel we've been wronged or our feelings have been hurt, we need to be very careful to keep our words few and our tone of voice soft. For example, the facts may indicate that we were not the best candidate for a promotion even though we may have worked towards it for a long time. Facts, effectively communicated, are necessary for workplace function and productive operation. Our human feelings can obscure or confuse the facts and consequently can cause us difficulty. Proverbs 20:6 contrasts feelings and facts, "Most men will proclaim every one his own goodness: but a faithful [truthful] man who can find?"

5. Understanding filters and barriers to effective communication.

John 7:24 "Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment."

Colossians 3:13 "Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."

Barriers to effective communication and filters through which we hear exist in all of our lives throughout each day no matter where we are. Some barriers are physical, like being too far away to hear correctly. Others are environmental, such as too much noise or other distractions. However, one of the most difficult filters or barriers to deal with is prejudice and personal opinion formed by experience and/or information from others. In John 8:43, Jesus told the Jews they couldn't hear Him because of their prejudice, "Why do ye not understand my speech? even because ye cannot hear my word." We can so easily make wrong judgments about others and when we allow those to influence communication negatively, our relationships suffer. How often have we said something about someone only to later find out that we had poorly judged them? But by then, how easy is it to correct what we may have said? The negative fallout from misspoken opinions can be a formidable barrier to effective communication.

6. Being an assertive communicator.

Proverbs 23:23 "Buy the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding."

Romans 12:17 "Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men."

Being an assertive communicator is an obtainable goal. We should express and assert our legitimate rights, needs, and desires in a godly way that does not violate the rights of others. However, this requires us to be emotionally honest, direct, and expressive. Once our needs and desires are expressed in a proper fashion, we can feel good about our interactions with others during our times together and afterwards. Sometimes the word "assertive" can have a negative undertone and may imply striving to get our own way or force our own agenda. We are cautioned to remember that our self-worth should be in Christ and therefore a tendency to be too aggressive is tempered by grace. In Galatians 2:11, we find an example of assertive behavior, "But when Peter was come to Antioch, I withstood him to the face, because he was to be blamed." The Apostle Paul did not go behind Peter's back but spoke to him face-to-face in love.

7. Having empathy, humility, and self-examination.

Ecclesiastes 5:2 "Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few."

Galatians 6:10 "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

The fundamental building blocks of relationships are empathy, humility, and self-examination. Establishing and maintaining them are core elements of successful workplace relationships.

Empathy is the capability to identify with and share another's situation, feelings and emotions. We are advised to "walk a mile in his/her shoes" before making a judgment. The promotion we thought we needed may have gone to someone else who needs it far more than we do. The responsibilities we have may seem heavy and unfairly distrib-

uted until we understand a little more about the life of our coworker and we realize that we don't have it so rough after all. Romans 12:15-16 instructs us to, "Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another..."

Being empathetic towards others means that we care about them and would not wish them anything that we ourselves wouldn't want. We do not all share the same desires for working. Some live to work and others work to live.

When we are humble we are courteously respectful of others. True humility can be an elusive virtue in a workplace environment that is productivity driven. Competition between employees may be the norm and some companies encourage that behavior. God's Word reminds us to do good unto <u>all</u> men and there is no exception given. False humility, on the other hand, is hypocrisy and deceit and should not be named among God's children. Proverbs 11:9 "An hypocrite with his mouth destroyeth his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered."

Perhaps the most effective advice for achieving and maintaining good workplace relationships is to examine ourselves regularly and look into the mirror of God's Word. Just exactly how do our motives line up with the biblical principles of contriteness, submission, purity, humility, peace, faith, love, longsuffering, temperance, etc.? In 2 Corinthians 13:5 we are reminded to look into our own selves and to prove our own selves, "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves..." In Psalm 139:23-24 we are further advised to pray that God would search our hearts. "Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

We may not be able to change the behavior of those around us but we can change <u>our</u> behavior, which is all we are really responsible for anyway. We are expected to model ourselves after Christ and His example of trust, integrity, and faith. Our workplace motto should be to have a proper attitude toward authority, be committed to excellence in our work, and be committed to excellence in the treatment of others

- 1 Peter 1:15 "But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation;"
- 1 Peter 2:18 "Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear; not only to the good and gentle, but also to the froward."





The funeral service of Elder David Mangold, Roanoke, Illinois, continues. It was held at the Eureka Apostolic Christian Church on December 8, 1964. The remarks below were spoken by Elder John Bahler, Rockville, Connecticut.

We believe, beloved, that even though the voice of our beloved brother will be heard no more, his face will not be seen, we believe that even this Spirit that was upon him, and we dare, I believe, utter the prayer that Elisha did when he realized that now this assignment has fallen upon him, that he prayed that a double portion of the Spirit of Elias might fall upon him; and it is our sincere prayer and our wish, beloved, that even the Spirit that was upon our Brother Dave, may even a double portion lay upon us — and upon the entire congregation, upon the people of God, that we may remain a holy people.

And beloved, the successors — those that must assume the responsibilities, that they may have the grace, and that the Spirit of God may rest upon them, that continuity may be here, and, beloved, that souls may be garnered. I know we have many friends, beloved, that looked in esteem and admiration to our Brother Dave; this I am sure of, beloved, and may this work now continue.

Beloved, along with this, I cannot help but express it, I believe that not only here among your congregation, but elsewhere, there were many that would come and find their way to Brother Dave to unburden their hearts. Now today these burdens that were confidential are locked in

his bosom, that no one shall know.

Beloved, I believe, that almost without exception, as we are gathered today, yet sometime or other, Brother Dave was of comfort to us. He had words of comfort in our sorrow; souls that were burdened, brought into the judgment of God could find words of encouragement by him, and by the Spirit of God, he was able to do this.

These are memories that we cherish, and so may God bless us, that we have been permitted to live in this time, that we have been permitted to become acquainted, and to work with and to walk with, and to be with, even our dear brother that now lies lifeless among us. We realize, beloved, that it is going to be different.

These people wept sorely because they were not going to see the face of the apostle any more, and we are saddened here today, but beloved we have the pleasant memories, as already mentioned. And how well it was — how nice it was to be in the company of Brother Dave; seemed to be complete. And now these days are gone — never to return.

But, beloved, the faith of our fathers shall remain; so let us dedicate ourselves anew to the service of God and to follow those, even the good example of our dear brother, and lay aside every weight — the things that so easily beset us upon the way.

Beloved, when we are confronted with the realities of life, when death itself is in our midst, it is a wonderful time to take inventory and to go within our hearts. Beloved, and if there are things that yet hinder us in our service to God, that we resolve now we will set them aside; we will put these things in their proper place, that when God will summon us, even as it has been Brother Dave's turn now, beloved, that we then can lift up our heads and rejoice when our redemption shall draw nigh.

Second speaker - Elder Bro. Sam Aeschliman, Bluffton, Indiana

I surely agree with every word that has been spoken by Bro. Bahler.

Dear ones, in the Bluffton congregation, I can assure you it was in deep sorrow. One might think perhaps of those that were of the age of Bro. Mangold, but it was not so. I met a young man the other day. He learned to know Bro. Mangold in the Army, and he was only a friend, and his wife was not even of our people. He spoke of the joy in learning to know Brother Mangold; and so, it is at home, whomever I spoke to, it seemed every one felt they had suffered a great loss, and we agree.

We certainly agree — I remember for myself, how many times I directed letters to Brother Dave, asking for advice and counsel. It was never turned down. Why should there then not be sorrow, but Brother Bahler reminded us, "not without hope." We trust that some day we may be able to be with him.

The Light Of Hope

"Our Testimony"

Retired Elder Bro. Willis Ehnle, formerly of Shioda, Japan

Our testimony is what we say and do in our spiritual lives. Our reputation is what people think of us because of what we say and do.

The Apostle Paul is an example of someone in the Bible who gave his testimony of seeing a bright light while traveling on the road to Damascus and of hearing Christ speak to him. He went on to say what he said in response to Christ calling him, and what he did in response to that call. Acts 22:8 reads, "And I answered, Who art thou, Lord?" Acts 22:11 reads, "Being led by the hand of them that were with me, I came into Damascus."

At the time of provings in our church, converts are asked to explain how they were led by God to repentance and through the process of conversion, when we die to self and become alive in the resurrected life, for Jesus Christ. This is similar to what Paul was saying. This was Paul's proving but it wasn't before the church, it was before those who accused him of causing trouble in the Jewish faith and synagogues by preaching Christ, His death and resurrection. For this, he eventually lost his life. II Timothy 4:6 reads, "I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand."

My prime concern today is what

our testimony is before the people, society at large, as well as within the church. In I Peter 3:15 we read, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear."

We should know and understand that what happens in our lives and in our churches may be on the internet in the future, especially if it is something which seems to justify those who do not repent. Some of them are looking for material which justifies themselves, which shows that they are better than those of us who name the name of Christ, and claim to be His disciples.

The Bible sets standards for the conduct of God's children that is very, very high and strict. Have we always done to others as we would that they do unto us? Also, I Peter 2:19 informs us, "For this is thankworthy, if a man for conscience toward God endureth grief, suffering wrongfully."

I Peter 2:20 continues, "When ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God." This indicates that to not take it patiently, is not acceptable with God. That is a pretty high

standard.

Ephesians 4:32 tells us, "And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you." Have we always been kind, tenderhearted, and forgiving, or have we wondered why other brothers and sisters can't be more faithful like we are. It is good to set an example of obedience but we must be careful that we aren't tricked by the devil into an attitude of superiority. We must remember that without Christ, we are nothing.

There are two aspects of our testimony: our testimony within the church and our testimony outside the church. In Paul's instructions to Timothy regarding the qualifications for a Bishop, Paul writes in I Timothy 3:7, "Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without."

People are watching us more than we think. I wish I could be a better example and have a better testimony for the Lord, by being the kind of person the Bible teaches us to be. If we could all be that way, our reputation and Christ's reputation, would be improved.
