

Sermon by Bro. Akihiro Ito, Shioda, Japan

#### Proverb 14:1-5 and I Corinthians 14:13-25

Greetings dear brothers, sisters and friends. Today is the Lord's day. In the past week, so many things happened in our family. Also, so many of Brother Chuck's words and his advice came into my mind. Before I open the Old Testament. I would like to share, one time I asked him his advice to me, after he was diagnosed with lung cancer. I wanted to know any advice, his word, speech or perspective. Brother Chuck mentioned, I don't have much advice because, if you want to know, please listen to my previous sermons on compact discs or tapes. He has been preaching for many years and all his advice is in this church and in his preaching God's Word. All his wisdom and advice are in there. So as today is our worship day, let's pray for and seek His Word. It always tells us the truth through the Bible.

Proverbs 14:5 says, "A faithful witness will not lie: but a false witness will utter lies." Who is a faithful witness? We are always thinking we want to be a good witness and a faithful and true witness. For what? For Jesus Christ as good Christians, to our neighbors, our friends and our family. As faithful Christians, we want to be good witnesses.

Also, probably myself, I always am more focused on the presence of my friends, my co-workers or just our neighbors who are not Christians. Because most of the time in Japan, we just talk to those who are not Christians. Less than one percent are Christians. So most of the time they are just watching me. There, they don't know I am Christian. So I try to be a good witness to them.

But in church, also we have a lot of brothers, sisters and friends. They have the same faith, so we can share our faith much easier. Also we can watch each other and love each other. Those are also witnesses.

Also, other witness - I thought for the past week, I have known Brother Chuck only five or six years after we were announced to be engaged and get married. Each time when I visited or he visited Japan, in that five or six years, it was a short time for me. But through all these five years, I just found, he was a very faithful Brother and witness for Christ. Also, all of you are witnesses for him, that he was a faithful brother. I am so thankful that so many of you knew him for years and years. You can tell me, and perhaps in the near future, tell my son, about him. How he was a strong man, faithful man. Those are witnesses.

In the Old Testament and New Testament, there are a number of prophets or the kings. Lots of Israelite names in there. Each of them are witnesses for God and Christ. We know a lot of disciples and apostles, they were facing dangers because of their faith. But they showed their faith and they died. And many brothers and sisters are witness for them. That is why we know those true stories from the Bible.

Each of us, we are witnesses for this world. Not only for our current generation. But for the future generations; your family, from your great-great grandfathers handing out the Word or their faith or perhaps the Bible. When we see the Bibles which were handed out from past generations, sometimes those Bibles have special meaning for us, because we know that those people had faith and had a Bible. We are reading the same Scripture. The same Word and the same hope that we go to heaven and perhaps meet them.

This verse encourages me and perhaps you, that we want to always be a good witness and we don't want to lie. To everybody; those that are living here but also those who will perhaps be born in the future or those who may not see us.

I Corinthians 14:13 speaks of an unknown tongue. I believe we say, speaking in tongues. They say, pray that he may interpret. We don't believe in speaking in tongues. This re-

## **Light From The Word**



Identity In Christ

Writings based on God's Word

Who are you? This question is often asked and answered in our daily interactions with others. How do you answer?

We are complex creatures, shaped by myriad factors – both internal and external. We may identify ourselves by our name, by our occupation, family relationships, ethnicity, nationality, locality, school, political party, church membership, social group, citizenship, or possibly some other affiliation or accomplishment. However, the Bible teaches us that our hope is in Christ alone and therefore, our identity should be in Christ alone.

The Apostle Paul could have identified himself by ethnicity (stock of Israel), family name (tribe of Benjamin), nationality (Hebrew of the Hebrews), membership in a religious sect (Pharisee), school (taught at the feet of Gamaliel), locality (born in Tarsus), citizenship (Roman), or even by his zeal for God (persecuting the church of Christ). (Phil. 3:4-6)

Many of these identifying factors would have conferred status and position on Paul among his peers. However, contrary to human nature, Paul counted all these accomplishments and qualifications as if they were dung so that he could win Christ. "But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ. Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ" (Phil. 3:7-8).

How is this relevant to you and me? Few of us are Pharisees, citizens of Rome, or can claim lineage of the tribe of Benjamin. Not many can claim to be blameless according to the Law of Moses, and few can say we were schooled at the feet of a widely respected teacher of the Bible.

On the other hand, we may sincerely be able to say that we are free from breaking the laws of our land – which may give us the tendency to justify looking down on others who bend or break the law. Some of us may proudly claim American citizenship – inadvertently elevating ourselves over others who are citizens of another country. We may have graduated from a particular university,

taking pride in our degree, and subtly despising those who have less education. We may identify ourselves by our ethnic heritage, separating ourselves from others of a different background and giving the impression that we think we are better. Without realizing what we are thinking, we may elevate such identifying factors to a place of undue importance in our mind – thinking ourselves to be something special when we are really no different than anyone else in God's eyes. In his letter to the Galatians, Paul writes that we should not be desirous of vainglory and reminds us that if we think ourselves to be something when we are nothing, we deceive ourselves. (Gal. 6:3)

Our Lord Jesus Christ calls us to see ourselves as He sees us, and to see others as He sees them. The only way to do this is to count all our earthly qualifications, accomplishments, and identifications as insignificant, and to put on the nature of Christ. Indeed, if the Spirit of Christ lives in us, we will already have done this. If our identity is in Christ, our accomplishments, titles, and heritage fade to nothing. Although Jesus was one with God, He willingly submitted Himself to mistreatment at the hands of His own creation, and ultimately submitted Himself to the death of the cross. "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross" (Phil. 2:5-8).

Jesus Himself said, "I can of mine own self do nothing..." (John 5:30). And again, "I am come in my Father's name..." (John 5:43). He encourages us to be so thoroughly identified with Him that we are like the branches of a vine—empty of life without Him. "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:5).

If, by His grace we count all things as His: our reputation, accomplishments, family heritage, citizenship, even our very

identity; then it will not be difficult to fulfill James' admonition that we not be respecters of persons. We will rather esteem one another higher than ourselves. "Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves" (Phil. 2:3).

What does it really mean to have our identity in Christ? Can we ignore the poor if our identity is in Christ? Can we expect any different treatment than He received at the hands of the world? Can we honestly elevate ourselves above our brother if we count all our titles, heritage, nationality, and accomplishments as nothing? Can we do anything less than sacrifice our life in service to others—even for those who don't appreciate it, if our identity is in Christ?

Perhaps a few of Paul's words could be adapted to today's realities. There is neither American nor Mexican, German nor Hungarian (or any other ethnic group), there is neither weak or strong, for ye are all one in Christ Jesus. "For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek. there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ve are all one in Christ Jesus. And if ye be Christ's, then are ve Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise" (Gal. 3:26-29).

If our first and foremost self-identification is to gratefully declare and demonstrate that we are Christ's, we can then flourish as a viable part of His sacred Body, the church. Then the church will prosper spiritually and our love for each other will truly "cover the multitude of sins" (1 Pet. 4:8). This does not mean that we should approve of behavior that is not in accord with God's Word. It does mean that we should accept and love everyone in the likeness of Christ, which can soften all of our hearts and make us more receptive to God's loving chastisement. (Heb. 12:6)

Who am I? I am a believer and follower of Jesus Christ – nothing more, and nothing less! This is the identity which governs my life.



...The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few, Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:37-38

#### Vision and Mission

The Apostolic Christian Mission Committee (MC) activities can best be described by our vision and Mission statements.

#### **Vision Statement**

The Mission efforts of the Apostolic Christian Church exist to embrace and respond to Jesus' vision: "Behold! Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest... pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers..." to make disciples of Christ wherever God opens doors, so that Jesus may receive His harvest of sanctified believers.

#### **Mission Statement**

To present to the lost the Gospel message of salvation based on faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ and a true repentance and conversion. This is to be done in harmony with the nurturing and instructing of the believers in the truths of God's Word and the preserving of sound doctrine by "earnestly contending for the faith," and serving others in humility and love.

#### **Activities and resources**

The Mission Committee manages activities and resources in the following areas:

Bible and Material Distribution The MC provides funding for and manages the distribution of Bibles locally and throughout the world. Bibles are sent to churches, schools, prisons, hospitals, nursing homes, college campuses, restaurants, gas stations, motels and businesses. Our hymn books are translated and dispersed where there is an interest in worshipping God through song.

Additionally the MC is involved in printing and distribution of sermons and other spiritual materials.

## **Internal Apostolic Christian mission activities**

The MC distributes funding for Apostolic Christian activities within the brotherhood such as foreign and domestic church building construction, assisting with elder and minister expenses and communicating to the brotherhood through the Silver lining and the MC website.

Establish and nurture churches The MC selects, prepares, sends, and nurtures faithful believers to establish and nurture churches in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, and Japan.

#### **Sending Brethren**

The MC also selects, prepares, sends, and nurtures faithful believers for short and long term mission-oriented outreach in Mexico, Japan, Haiti and Jamaica.

Other Mission Organizations
The MC distributes partial funding to external agencies to support
mission work that is in alignment
with our purpose and doctrine such
as Rural Gospel and Medical Missions of India (RGMMI), Berean
Prison Ministries, and Athens, AL
preschool.

#### What you can do

Prayer – The Mission Committee recognizes the need for God's blessing and the presence of His Holy Spirit in all we attempt to do. Therefore, the need for fervent prayer to God is essential. James 5:16 says: The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. We humbly ask for prayer support for all mission activities as God leads.

Volunteer – Volunteers are needed for many local churches to accomplish Bible and Material distribution. Service begins at home. Attitude, prayerfulness, carefulness, and willingness begin with a faithful witness right where you are now. With prayer and time God may open the door individually for expanded MC opportunities.

**Financial Support** – Individuals and local churches have opportunity to support the MC directly as well as the Servant Fund.

Servant Fund – The Mission Committee established the Servant Fund in 2006. Increased interest and willingness to serve have provided a need and opportunity to support modest living expenses for brethren sent by the MC and World Relief. This arrangement allows our brethren to devote their time and attention to their calling, rather than being required to raise their own funds. It is hoped that brethren will support the Servant Fund on a regular basis. Contributions can be designated for an individual, a project area, or the general Servant Fund.

The Servant Fund would benefit greatly from brethren and friends who would help sponsor those desiring to serve by having funds transferred automatically each month much like Child Sponsorship currently operates. #### Attend the Next Informational Meeting

Significant changes have transpired in World Relief in the last 10 years. God is moving many to deny themselves and reach out to the helpless and destitute. To see where God has used the church is remarkable.

Each day we thank God for another night of rest and good health that He has blessed us with. It's going to be another busy day at the office or taking care of the needs of an active growing family. Dad is worrying about that morning meeting with the boss. Mom needs to hurry to get the kids to appointments and to get groceries. Does this sound familiar? We live in a fast paced world and often miss the blessings God provides for us.

After being given the opportunity to go to a third world country, we were given the chance to see first hand what it is like for a family who does not know what meal they will have that day, if any. We met souls who only have a grade school education and others with none at all, people who make a dollar or two a day if they are fortunate enough to have a job and mothers who can't take their children to the doctor or provide the basic needs we take for granted.

Through Apostolic Christian World Relief, we are given the opportunity to help these hurting souls by providing the support and assistance they need. Those that are suffering are not only in third world countries; they could be in Florida, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas or anywhere in the U.S. Our brethren from all over the globe have been an inspiration as they reach out to

the needy with their personal time and their heartfelt giving.

How can we learn more about these needs and opportunities? One way is by attending an Informational Meeting. Here we learn what World Relief is doing to help alleviate human suffering around the world. We are inspired as we hear the experiences of others first hand.

#### Recent meeting

This year we learned about the persecution in India and the need to keep them in our prayers daily as they carry the torch for Christ in a country where the Gospel is often repressed.

In the presentation about Haiti, we were made aware of the need to continue to pray for the Haitian people after the massive earthquake this winter. The recovery and rehabilitation will take years. Many have been blessed with the participation in medical and construction work teams that provided immediate relief after the disaster. There will be many more opportunities in the future.

We were informed of the AWA well drilling in Haiti, bringing clean drinking water to thousands and the challenge to give the true water of life so that we will thirst no more.

We were told about the various needs in Mexico and encouraged to consider helping children in Haiti, Jamaica, Mexico and Guatemala through the Child Sponsorship program. There is always a child in need.

We also heard about the need to disciple believers with Bible study programs through prison ministry. Many of these souls have been awakened by the Gospel while in prison and need encouragement and understanding of the Scriptures to allow them to live in victory over sin.

Here in the U.S. we were reminded that our Oakville brethren are still assisting those who lost their homes from the flood, the work going on at His Ranch in Taylor, MO and their request for prayers to be able to help those in their own backyard through local church outreach.

#### Meeting content

Brethren will give 15-30 minute presentations, often with the aid of PowerPoint, to share the prayers answered in providing humanitarian aid and volunteer labor to alleviate human misery and suffering throughout the world, done in a way that is a Christian witness and brings glory to God. Expect to hear about six hours worth. The presentation will include a cross section of World Relief projects, from local to international.

I heard it said once at a conference that the most effective therapeutic tool is the use of self. You open your home, your heart, extend a hand, all in an attempt to understand, connect, and foster change. This is often a part of being a Houseparent. You do life together. There are good days, right along with the rough days. You see a glimpse into their past, their hurts, fears and dreams or at times the lack of. You see things that are irritating and endearing, and time passes, day in and day out. Some children's stays are short, some end on an unexpected note, and others stay longer. But then there is a day when there is a sudden transition and they leave. I know that is the objective of a treatment facility and the eventual goal. But they leave and there is no longer that day in and day out connection. Yes, there are the occasional letters, phone calls, and visits.

As time has passed, I have found this hard to process - the continual loss of relationships with kids coming and going. It seems to leave me feeling at times emotionally dry and a bit raw. I am not sure I really like good-byes, and I'm not sure that they are always so good. You might be thinking, "Well, that is a part of life",

and I would agree; that is the reality of living in a fallen world. There are good-byes, loss, and death; yet, it seems to me that maybe we weren't quite created to know how to process this because we weren't designed to. However, sin entered the world and there are now separations in relationships, and there is loss.

When I'm not sure how to process these changes, it leads me straight to hope. I would love to see each kid leave on a healthy and happy note and I would like to see the kids graduate high school, be productive citizens, and have healthy relationships and lifestyles. But more than all of that, my greatest desire for them would be to have a relationship with their Heavenly Father, the gift of salvation and the promise and hope of eternal life. Please take time with us to pray that past, current, and future residents would truly understand the hope that lies in a loving relationship with their God. Love never fails.

minds me, recently of my experience in the Japanese church, when a friend called me. I didn't know him but he called and asked about my church. He mentioned that he is a Christian and he was looking for some different denomination. He used to go to a church that did speak in unknown tongues, speaking in tongues. He just didn't believe that. He wanted to come to another church that he could trust.

The verse clearly says, if we use an unknown tongue, which we don't understand, also my understanding is unfruitful (v.14). So we are still learning the Scriptures. I just don't trust how much fruit there is in speaking in tongues. We know that also, as I preach, the Holy Spirit inspires me to speak to you. The Holy Spirit helps to speak anything. I can just feel a different feeling, rather than when I speak to other friends. Through my job experience, I have the chance to talk to many students. So I just feel this pulpit here, always I feel a difference. I trust that is because of the Holy Spirit helping me to tell God's Word to you.

Verse 15 says, "...I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also." We have our customs. We sing before the service. Also, in Japan, we have a blessing because others who are friends, who are Christians and have been attending other churches, come to our church and tell us what the difference is. It is almost hard for me to explain what the other denominations and churches are doing. These friends tell me, why do you sing the hymns without the music or why do you sing hymns before the service? That is a simple question. But I just didn't think much, because when I started to come to our church, you are always singing before the service. It seems to be natural for me. We just sing and praise His name and prepare our heart to listen to the Word. That is the reason we sing.

But other churches don't sing. Or they are using instruments. But clearly this verse says, I will sing with the Spirit. So when we sing, especially before the service, we are preparing to listen to God's Word and also the hymns calm down our heart. Each tone is so beautiful. If we use some instrument, it might disturb us. As you know, when we sing without any instrument, just from our heart, it is most beautiful. Probably most spiritual singing. Because we just concentrate for our tunes in our minds and from your brother and sister's voice. Otherwise we cannot sing well. Think about that. If we just listen carefully for our brother and sister's voice and we try to help each other, the praise and the whole purpose is just to praise God's name. And to prepare for the service. Cleanse our heart. Be ready to listen to the gospel. So we sing with the Spirit. That is how the verse mentions that.

"Else when thou shalt bless with the spirit, how shall he that occupieth the room of the unlearned say Amen at thy giving of thanks, seeing he understandeth not what thou sayest?" I Corinthians 14:16. I believe this meaning is, if they don't know God's Word, why would they say Amen? That really makes sense to me. Probably many of you are not much experienced because since you were a child, you always hear 'Amen'. But in Japan, think about it, many people never say Amen. Because they know the name Jesus Christ and Bible but Amen - I just remember when I was nineteen years old and I came to Shioda church for the first time, my first prayer, which Brother Akito prayed during the service, when they kneeled in prayer and then they say Amen. Everyone said Amen. Those Amens were my first time I said, Amen. So this Scripture mentions, if we just don't know simply Amen, people just need to explain why we say Amen or why we need to pray and worship God.

This Scripture mentions those who don't know any Bibles or Jesus Christ. Of course we need to be very careful and also be patient to just explain everything. Why we need to pray, why we kneel, why we sit down or kneel in prayer or why we sing be-

fore church service. Why we just sit separate from couples, separated brothers from sisters and all those things.

Also, just a few weeks ago it happened. The new friend came to our church. He was so surprised because I just opened the Bible and read and started to preach. Those experiences so attracted him. He just didn't understand. Even he understands the Bible and that Jesus died for us because we are sinners. He understood that. But still, he just didn't understand so many things. So I had good opportunity to explain this is the reason why we do what we do. While I explained to him, it reminded me how nice our churches' customs or traditions were doing. Because everything makes sense. It refers to our Bible Scriptures. I explained to him, the Scripture mentions like that. That is why we are doing so. He has been a Christian five or six years already. He just listened to me and "hmm...I see, I see. You are right. The Scripture mentions it like that." But his previous church just didn't do that. That just helped and encouraged me that our church is doing right things and God is helping our church.

So verse 16 isn't simply Amen. If they don't know Amen, we need to explain the Amen. Also, Amen is not Japanese either. In Japanese, we say Amen. So many Japanese don't know the meaning.

The languages or words that we don't know are almost meaningless. Because we know in the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit came to them and there were many disciples. They spoke many languages to them. Each Jew or Greek or Gentile understood what happened. (Acts 2:6-8) So probably another reason I am preaching in English. Because if I preach in Japanese, maybe none of you understand that. It is not productive and not good. I twist my broken English but you can pick up and know some message from God. I am so thankful that God has given me a chance to learn English and your language and as we are communicating together, we can talk and we

can share the gospels.

"Yet in the church I had rather speak five words with my understanding, that by my voice I might teach others also, than ten thousand words in an unknown tongue." v.19. So today, I speak your language and I probably mentioned more than five words, but also some words, I hope you learn something that inspires you and think about God's Word rather than I speak Japanese and you have no idea. Actually, my parents are visiting here so they only understand that. We have brothers and sisters in Hungary and Mexico. In Mexico, they are Spanish, so we need to preach in Spanish. Also, God gives us a good brain that we can learn different languages. So if we just try and learn and study, we can get to know more people. Also it can help you to bring the Gospel to more of the world.

I was working with the Philippian committee here. Their own language is different from English. We communicate in English but in their area, they speak their own language so everything needs to be translated. But also we know that their churches are more growing, growing, growing. Because they are hungry and want to know God's true Word. In the Philippines, the majority is Catholic. But there are areas where much more people are coming to their church and they are thrilled to build their church. Because they are hungry for God's Word and Jesus Christ.

So I pray, this morning, through several verses, I pray you can get some message from me and from God. Thank you.

#### Meditation Continued by Brother Curt Rassi, Tremont, IL

Indeed the Spirit did speak to our hearts, did He not, this morning. As Brother Akihiro trusts and prays that that would be the case. We read those few verses in Proverbs 14. What a concept, beloved.

What is 'witness'? I am not knowledgeable enough to say the definition of witness is this or that. But it would seem as though witness, a witness, like you or I, would be one

who has experienced and one who has observed. So the faithful witness will not lie and the false witness lies. We had good instruction, beloved, about being a witness.

So what have we witnessed, beloved? What have we been witness too? For we have. We have experienced, we have observed. There are those of us who no longer have parents with us and grandparents and fore fathers. We have witnessed and we have observed God's Spirit working in their lives. So therefore we are a witness. We have experienced and we have observed.

What is our witness to that that was important in their life? If we would be a faithful witness, then we would say, the Spirit of God is mighty. Jesus Christ died for sin. Therefore one must believe in Him as those who I have experienced and observed believed. Therefore I would as well, wouldn't we? That would be being a faithful witness.

What if we would reject that faithful life of one who did believe in Jesus Christ and let it be known, reflected Christ's love to us, to me, to you perhaps? If we rejected that living a life, believing in Jesus Christ, would that not be a false witness? In effect, telling a lie, because we knew of what they believed and it was truthful. So, what kind of a witness am I, dear ones and what kind of a witness are you?


Was it not precious to have Brother Akihiro touch our hearts as we were reminded about Brother Chuck this morning? Wasn't it precious to have that thought upon our hearts? The advice, as Brother Akihiro had asked him, and he said, it has been documented. It is the Word. It is that which he has preached. It is how he has loved us. It is how he has been a father to us. It is true, isn't it? It is apparent. It has been laid out.

In the service on Wednesday, Brother Steve made this request by the Spirit. Have there been those of us who wished we would have gone to see Brother Chuck, perhaps a dear friend? Is it in your heart, has it been part of something pulling on you, that you wanted to go speak to him, confess your sins? Repent? Now it is not able. But the way is here! That that he reflected, expressed, was a witness. That way of salvation is here. We have a way that that can be done. Don't put that off. The call comes forth and Brother Steve is there waiting to hear your expression of your witness of the power of Christ in hearts.

In the chapter in I Corinthians, how that correlated with that. The unknown tongue and the unlearned and being able to speak clearly. How about that singing? The beauty of singing we enjoy. How it works in our hearts. The word 'Amen'. The first time Bro. Akihiro heard it, as he heard Brother Akito so Amen, not knowing what it meant. Beloved, we have been beneficiaries of God's goodness, of His marvelous way, of His precious Word and of our Savior Jesus.

The Apostle Paul said he would rather speak five words that someone could understand. Five words with my understanding than ten thousand in an unknown tongue (v.19). Brother Dan reminds us from time to time, Jesus Christ and Him Crucified. Five words. Speaks clearly, doesn't it? Beloved, we, as we have been here this day, and throughout our lives, we are witness. We are witness to the power of Christ.

But what kind of witness will we be? Will we be the faithful witness that will pass that on? That will let it be known, let others know? Let it not be that one of us be a false witness. that we would hide the light of Christ. That we would not reflect His love to others. Let it be that we would be encouraged, beloved brothers and sisters and converts. Let it be that you be encouraged, dear precious friend! Please come! Don't be a false witness. You have seen Christ's working in hearts and lives. Come and become faithful witness with others as they walked on before. Might the Word be blessed into our hearts for indeed we have been privileged to have it here spoken among us this morning.



#### Needs of Adopted/Foster Children Article One of Three: God's Care for the Fatherless

James 1:27, "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world."

Throughout the Bible, God is clear that He loves and cares for the orphaned, oppressed, and needy. As members of the body of Christ, we are called to be God's "hands and feet" in this world by doing His work. In this cruel world, He calls us to oppose evil and be a force for good. In Isaiah 1:17. God calls us to "Learn to do well; seek judgment [justice], relieve the oppressed, judge [defend] the fatherless, plead for the widow." There are many opportunities in the Church and the community to carry out the calling of Isaiah 1:17. Some may feel led by God to open their homes to foster children (often temporary placements) and others may feel led to adopt a child. Our desire in this series of articles is to highlight some of the needs of foster and adopted children. This first article is intended to understand God's heart for the fatherless. It is also intended to encourage the body of Christ to consider how God would call them to serve the fatherless.

Children were designed to thrive under the care of Godly parents who provide an environment of love, safety, security, and truth. Consider the description Psalm 68:5-6 gives us of God, "A father of the fatherless, and a judge of the widows, is God in his holy habitation. God setteth the solitary in families: he bringeth out those which are bound with chains: but the rebellious dwell in a dry land." It is clear that God's heart is toward those in need and in particular the fatherless. Who better to step in and serve the fatherless than those who are to be "conformed to the image of his Son." While many may never be called to become foster or adoptive parents, it is important to acknowledge God's heart toward children in need. It is also important to consider what the body of Christ's role is in serving foster children and children awaiting adoption. To help put this need into perspective, 424,000 children were in the United States foster care system in 2009 and 115,000 of those children were waiting for adoptive families. Worldwide there are estimated to be 16 million orphaned (not having a mother or a father) children.

The need for Godly men and women to stand in the gap for the fatherless is evident. It is very important that every believer prayerfully consider what the Lord desires of them. Becoming a foster or adoptive parent is not what God has called all of us to be and those who have been called to such a task should prayerfully entreat the Lord for direction. Luke 14:28 says, "For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have [sufficient] to finish [it]?" The principle in this verse can be applied to considering foster care or adoption. Those who are called into this ministry will experience challenges and in many cases these challenges will be beyond what were expected. To deny such a fact is not helpful or beneficial for parents or children alike. This reality is also why it is essential to consider the truth expressed in Psalm 127:1, "Except the LORD build the house, they labour in vain that build it: except the LORD keep the city, the watchman waketh [but] in vain." God blesses those who do the work God calls them to. This does not mean it will be easy or that it will result in the outcome envisioned by parents. Instead, it means that God is faithful and good regardless of outcomes. He desires obedience from His people rather than an "I will do this for you God if it goes well or turns out like I want" attitude.

So what is the "Body's" role in serving foster and adoptive children? We

can clearly see that God loves the fatherless and desires to provide for their needs. It should likewise be the heart of all Christians to love and care for the fatherless (Exodus 22:22-23; "Ye shall not afflict any widow, or fatherless child. If thou afflict them in any wise, and they cry at all unto me, I will surely hear their cry;"). Likewise every believer ought to be taking an active role in serving those in need. The Word of God clearly expressed God's desire for His people to serve and provide for the needs of others. I Corinthians 12 tells us that God has given different gifts within the body and that every gift in the body is important. Your God-given gifts will shape how you should serve foster children and adoptive children. This does not elevate or diminish the role God desires to have you step into. Instead it shows the importance of knowing your gifts and using them in a way that is pleasing to God. May God move your heart to become more in-line with His heart toward the fatherless. This may mean that you will pray, open your home, express kindness, extend a smile, become involved in a ministry that serves children, or step into another role the Lord would have for you in serving the fatherless.

As the Church becomes more actively involved in foster care and adoption, may God's heart be pleased as He sees His children serve the fatherless. Being a parent is a wonderful blessing and gift from the Lord. Yet, being a parent is not the ultimate goal. Ultimately, the goal of all parenting, with biological, foster, or adopted children, is to help them to know Jesus Christ. Through Christ we are able to experience the ultimate adoption into the family of God (Romans 8:14-15, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father.").

Next month, the second article in this series of 3 articles will focus on the specific needs of foster children.



#### **General Conference**

As usual the Annual General Conference of the Apostolic Christian Church was a blessed event. Held on Friday, August 13, more than 1500 believers convened at Rittman, Ohio for an all-day session with 12 speakers delivering messages pertinent to the doctrine and lifestyle of the brotherhood.

Early on conference days, as multitudes approach and drive into the parking lot, there is a pervasive spiritual feeling of blessed anticipation that our faith and beliefs can find an undergirding as the Holy Spirit provides inspiration to the large throng of listeners

As the Elder brothers walked into the assembly and took their seats to the music of more than 1,000 voices it was indeed a special time. The *Zion's Harp* song, "The Best Refuge" (page 46) was sung when the Elders were seated.

As in any era, or in any year, when a host of brethren from far and near comes together to coalesce their thoughts around God's Word and Spirit, there is likely no more appropriate song to sing — because the Lord Jesus is, indeed, our best refuge. Amid the vexations, temptations, problems, and the sometimes "fiery-darts of the enemy," the hymnwriter put it well: "He'll lighten the load, and level the road, and bear thee on hands of compassion."

Also, in verse 7: "In patience then bear, all trial and care. Above streams of bliss will refresh thee." How true, and how comforting (it was).

It could be said that the General

Conference is a dual-conference; that is, along with exhortations from the Elder brothers, the hymns we sang out of the *Zion's Harp* during the day spoke clearly and provided exhortation in a highly effective way.

To sing "Unity" (page 237) at the end of the day was a very uplifting moment, and each year that song is a worthy tradition, as brothers and sisters lift their voice in unison around the principles of unity and likemindedness — in doctrine and practice. Verse four reads, "With the love of God inspired, there is joy for us on earth. May the Spirit we've acquired, grant us blessing, peace and mirth."
