

Sermon by Bro. Bill Masters, Fort Myers, FL

#### II Samuel 7:1-17 and St. Luke 21:29-38

As we stand here before you, especially when we are sitting down there, we walk up and we have a couple of prayers before we approach God's Word. It is a weak feeling to be here. A weak feeling. Weak in the fact that we are to take God's Word, to read and then to meditate thereon. Yet this morning we were reminded through the Word that we are to have faith to trust in God, that He will provide. But then we come back to this age old thing. We are but man. Weak

I always say, as we look into God's Word, it is there to teach us, to instruct us as we walk through life. When we take a journey, especially if it is someplace we have not been before, we are either going to look at a map, we are going to call somebody or find directions, aren't we?

We are just journeying here, aren't we? Pilgrims. We might journey for sixty, seventy, eighty, ninety years. Who knows? We might only journey for twenty or thirty. But we need guidance. We need that help as brothers and sisters in faith. Because we are faced with many obstacles every turn in life.

I say it is so wonderful to be here today, as it is on Wednesdays and any Sunday. This great fellowship, this love one for another that we have. But at the end of the service we have to leave, don't we? We have to go home. Go to your condo, wherever it is. And we have a week then to journey. I always said that is why it is so nice on Wednesday evening to get together again. Because we can be recharged. Refortified in the Word. But here again, Wednesday evening after church we are back out there again, aren't we? That is how life is.

That is the other reason that our fellowship is so great. That's why when we see brothers and sisters in faith as we are journeying Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday before church, and we see someone out it might be at the mall, which seems to be the big gathering place, down here in the south anyhow, or wherever it might be that we are doing something, it could be at the park or wherever but we see a brother or sister in faith and we go over and we visit and we will share, won't we, that kinship that we have. That family that we are a part of. It just strengthens us on our journey.

We have an adversary in our journey. We've talked about it so many times. I think the Bible talks about it, not in a great depth. It is not there in front of us in every page that we go to. But we know that we have an adversary 'Satan. That's

why it is tough through the week. It's because he is there to deceive us. That's why we need this guidance.

I had to think, as Brother Tom was preaching this morning, back in the Old Testament, where Moses laid out what God had told him about offering a sacrifice and all of the sacrifices that they were to offer and the certain times and how they were to do it - that was His plan at that time for the children, those chosen Israelite people to do in obedience to God. It was to be from their heart. It is the same way with us today. Even though we live in the new dispensation of grace - the Messiah has come, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior - we still have to live for Him in our heart. That is why we have this great fellowship.

II Samuel 7 is a very familiar piece of Scripture, isn't it? I think David often marveled at his destiny in life. The Bible records that he was a man after God's heart (Acts 13:22). We can see this here. David had a heart to build a house for God. He says, I have a house to live in yet our great God has no house (II Samuel 7:2).

To me it is interesting, as we were reading this, he was talking to Nathan, a great prophet. Listen to what David was saying. What does he do? David says, I want to build this house for the Lord and Nathan says, do it (II Samuel 7:3). But what happened? That night Nathan went home and God talked to him and told him, no, David shouldn't build this house (v.4,5). Told him that his son would build the house and he needed to go back and tell David this (v.13,17).

So often I come back to that in the Scripture. I think so often, as we walk through life, I don't know how you are, but sometimes someone will ask me something or there is some decision I have to make. I always say I don't like to make a decision on the spur of the moment. I prefer to have some time to think about it. Maybe one of the reasons is - and I have never really put it to this Scripture but - so often it is so easy to say, sure. Go ahead. This is what I am going to do. That is what Nathan did for David. He, in essence, said yes. Go ahead and build our great God a house. But God had to come to him and talk to him and explain to him that, no, I don't want David to build this house because he has been a man of war and he has shed a lot of blood.

We can look at that and we could question it in our own mind and say, wait a

## **Light From The Word**

Who Are We?

God has preserved a living faith and doctrine through His grace and acts of providence over centuries of time. It is our sincere hope that a greater appreciation of God's faithfulness and a better understanding of our particular spiritual heritage will bring increased gratitude for our high calling. This can help shield us against the influence of unsound doctrine.

Three basic, uncompromising teachings of Christ help define the doctrine of His true church. The first defining doctrine is belief in a true spiritual rebirth as Jesus taught Nicodemus, "Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (John 3:5). Our first birth produces the sinful nature of Adam in all our lives. "Behold I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me" (Psa. 51:5). A new spiritual birth is necessary so that the old man is crucified and we no longer serve sin (Rom. 6:6). This new birth is made possible by grace through faith in Christ's shed blood, which results in repentance, conversion, baptism of faith (Acts 2:38) and Christ dwelling in us (Gal. 2:20).

The second defining doctrine is a change in behavior as we become a "new creature" in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17) through the miracle of conversion. We become renewed in the spirit of our mind and put on righteousness and true holiness (Eph. 4:23-24). Good works based on the fruit of the Spirit and Christ-like love exemplify our renewed nature (Gal. 5:22-23; 1 Cor. 13). The early believers demonstrated this love by returning good for evil, even when under heavy persecution. They did not bear arms or go to war because they loved their fellow man. They enjoyed a unique and precious spiritual fellowship based on true Christ-like love.

Christ and the Apostles consistently taught the third defining doctrine of separation from and nonconformity to the world. Jesus said of His followers, "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world" (John 17:16). The Apostle John taught, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (1 John 2:15). The world can be defined as human life and society without God

With the initial rise of Christianity in the first century, Satan tried various tactics in

his battle against the church. First, he brought persecution upon the new church to destroy it outright, but instead the church flourished and increased. As believers scattered, they preached and lived the Word wherever they went (Acts 8:4). About 300 years after the death of Christ, the Roman Emperor Constantine was moved to halt the persecution and promote Christianity as the religion of the empire. While this brought a welcome relief to persecuted believers, the new edict involved the mixing of Christianity with pagan religions. The officially recognized "church" lost its distinction and became corrupted by the world. Separation of church and state was not an option, because a common religious lovalty bound all together. The introduction of child baptism facilitated this homogeneous society, for everyone was to become a member of the state church at birth. For centuries, the Bible was kept unavailable to the common man. As the religion and commandments of men increased in emphasis, the light of truth diminished, and the flame of true love flickered and grew dim as the church entered the Dark Ages.

Even in such difficult times, a remnant of the true faith remained, and Satan changed tactics once again. In a subtle maneuver, he offered the choice of embracing a partially "reformed" church or persecution and possibly death as a heretic. The Reformation did place emphasis on the authority of Scriptures, justification by faith and the value of serving others, and it helped define the priesthood of all believers. However, some believers quickly realized that the Reformation only partially addressed the doctrinal errors of the state church.

One notable example of standing firmly on the counsel of God's Word was the Schleitheim Confession, in which a group of Swiss believers responded to seven major errors of the state church. Baptism of faith was reserved for those who had consciously repented and experienced a true spiritual rebirth; church discipline was applied to erring members; closed communion was practiced; separation from the world was enjoined; sound church leadership was sought from within the congregation; they refused to bear arms against their fellow man; and they abstained from swearing of oaths. Many of the reformers considered these true believers as heretics and persecuted them ruthlessly.

A group of these believers became known as Anabaptists, or New Baptists, mainly because of their strong belief in adult baptism based on faith. Their doctrinal motto was "Sola Scriptura," which meant that the Scriptures alone formed the foundation of doctrine and life. This movement, along with other means used by the Holy Spirit, influenced Samuel Froehlich, a young seminary student in Switzerland. After his conversion, the Lord blessed his ministry and in 35 years a fellowship of believers (church) had grown to about 110 congregations in several European countries. This church spread to America in 1847 where we know it as the Apostolic Christian Church of America. The Apostolic Christian church has continued over the years to seek diligently to follow the whole inerrant counsel of God.

History reveals that many individuals and churches lost their way when they left the defining doctrines of Christ. Some groups became friends with the world in doctrine and life style and became a nominal church. The Word tells us clearly ...the friendship of the world is enmity with God..." (Jam. 4:4). On the other hand, some focused too much on themselves and quenched the Spirit of true love. Christ warned the church of Ephesus that though they were sound in doctrine, they had "left their first love" and were in need of repentance (Rev. 2:2,

God has been faithful in preserving a living faith for all remnants of faithful believers that truly love Him, "...the LORD thy God, He is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love Him and keep His commandments..." (Deut. 7:9). We pray that our children will follow this heritage of faithfulness and experience the wonderful works of God. "That the generation to come might know them, even the children which should be born; who should arise and declare them to their children: That they might set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments" (Psa. 78:6, 7). Through God's grace and mercy, we can answer the question, "Who are we?" with the same identity expressed in last month's article: "I am a believer and follower of Jesus Christ."

#### **Mexico Update**

#### Ixtlan grade school grows

Take 15 first graders and 12 second graders and what do you get? If you add, you come up with a total of 27 students. While this figure is accurate numerically, it falls short experientially. To really understand the effects of increasing from 8 total students last year to 27 students this year, it would be more accurate to multiply 15 and 12! That's what it feels like!

People in the community were hesitant about the school when it started, but their confidence increased after hearing and seeing positive results in the students during the first year. As they say in Mexico, "Gracias a Dios" ("Thanks to God"), and thanks to the generosity of our American brethren, the school is growing. The work is God's, and if anything good is accomplished in the lives of the students, the credit is His.

The work with the school hasn't been without challenges. It has proven difficult to find qualified teachers, a challenge we'll constantly face. Yet the uncertainty has provided an opportunity to trust God, cry out to Him, and watch in gratitude as He provides.

The true mission of the school is twofold. First, to provide quality education for the students. The second part of the mission is to gently, consistently, and patiently expose students and families to Jesus Christ, the living Savior who rescues sinners from bondage and transforms us into who we were meant to be. Because almost none of our children come from Christian families, we need loving wisdom to be sensitive to where they are spiri-

tually. At the same time, we need humble boldness to never compromise the truth of God's Word or water down the Gospel. There is no other hope for the world. We want to see God's will accomplished by the conversion of lost souls.

## Churches deep in Mexico need your prayers

#### ▶ lxtlan

In September, to God's praise three converts were baptized and added to His family. He has been showing our church family just how precious every believer is, how important our relationships are, and how actively Satan is trying to destroy these very things. Please pray for us as Christ prayed for Peter (Luke 22:31-32).

#### ▶ Barra Vieja/Lomas

Can you imagine if the only spiritual instruction you received was, at best, once a month when visitors came? The closest minister twelve hours away? The most mature believer among you baptized only a year ago? This is what life is like for the four believers in Barra Vieja/Las Lomas.

Clearly, the Holy Spirit is present with them to teach and comfort them, and He will not abandon them. But they continue to pray for God to send someone who can live among them and disciple them in the paths of the Lord. The need for a long-term couple to provide spiritual leadership is even more urgent because there are now young people (especially some of the believers' children) showing interest in the Word.

Summer VBS was held both in Barra Vieja and in Las Lomas, with roughly 100 children attending. In Las Lomas, the children were so excited they would show up three hours early. By the time the teachers arrived, the children had already sung all the songs!

The living conditions in Barra Vieja and Las Lomas are very humble. In previous years in Las Lomas, the children and teachers gathered outside under a big Tamarind tree, as pigs and chickens occasionally ran through and added to the drama of the lesson. Some of the children brought boards or bricks to sit on: others were content to sit in the dirt. This year it was raining, but thankfully a neighbor let them use the garage. There were no chairs or tables, so the children packed together on the concrete floor. But they don't seem to mind. They are thrilled to receive anything, even a pencil, as a small prize for attendance or memory verses.

#### ▶ Morelia and Queretaro

In Morelia, several new women and some of their children have been attending services. About 50 children attended VBS. The need exists in both Morelia and Oueretaro for brethren to move there to encourage these small groups of believers. Brothers or couples would seek to establish themselves in their neighborhoods and work places, building relationships with people and looking for opportunities to share the Gospel. By doing this, they would be participating in the Lord's work of adding to the church (Acts 2:47). Please continue to pray for laborers, Mexican and American, to go to the harvest fields.

Jamaica Deaf Village

We are richly blessed by the many opportunities available to us through World Relief to perform acts of service for those in need in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Although these acts of service are one of the four pillars of our precious faith, so often we find that it provides an opportunity to support the other pillars of preaching to the lost, nurturing and developing the believer, and preserving sound doctrine. In June 2010, a team of 45 brothers, sisters, and friends representing 19 of our congregations experienced the blessing of service at the Jamaica Deaf Village.

#### Team center building

For the past several years, the focus of work teams visiting the Jamaica Deaf Village has been the construction of a new team center building. Currently, work teams are able to stay on site, but must take up valuable space in the dormitory areas to do so. Once the new building is completed, work teams will have a place with sleeping, eating, and fellowship areas, and thus make room to accommodate new families and residents of the village. This year, the team was able to focus on laying block on the second floor of the team center as well as more detailed duties of finishing the first floor.

#### Remember the Sabbath

Although the entire week was filled with blessings, many team members found the activities of the Lord's Day to be especially uplifting. After beginning the morning with a service led by the team minister, the team had the special privilege of worshipping with the deaf. What a moving experience it is to see

God's people hearing with hearts rather than ears and praising Him with hands of praise! Although the form of communication is different, the message from the Bible is the same transforming Word needed by hearing and deaf alike.

On Sunday afternoon, the team had another unique opportunity to see a special expression of faith alive in the residents at the local infirmary. Although we might liken the infirmary to our nursing homes, the conditions are far from comparable. For those visiting for the first time, the sight of many beds arranged so closely together is heartbreaking. Teams are inspired by the faith and gratitude the residents express toward God and Jesus Christ for all they have been given. The team is able to sing songs out of the Hymns of Zion, many of which the residents join in singing from memory.

Each team member also has the opportunity to visit, pray, and read Scripture with residents. On Sunday night, the team comes together and shares the moving experiences of the day and to testify of the faith they had witnessed, a faith that might be uncommon to what many of us previously experienced. But that is precisely what we are called to by Jesus Christ.

#### Spiritual growth

The theme for this year's work team was spiritual growth based on 2 Peter 3:18, "But grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever." It is incredible to see how the Lord is able to work in the hearts of His children when we are in a place where we can truly lay aside the weights that

beset us and be removed from the thorns of life that often seem to choke the Word and keep us from truly bearing the fruit the Lord desires. From the time we gather together at the start of the day until the time we conclude the evening activities, we enjoy rich spiritual blessings that we ordinarily do not experience back home. After both breakfast and lunch, we are able to take time to sing hymns together as well as have a Scripture reading. Each evening, a brother shares a devotion from the Word, followed by one or two of the team members who share their testimony of how the Lord has worked in their life.

Throughout the day, prayer is a central focus of the group as each team member remains focused on praying for the team, CCCD, the Jamaica Deaf Village, people back home, and a myriad of prayer requests that come to us throughout the week. At the end of the week, each team member was given an opportunity to share how the Lord had been working in their heart and how they had been called to grow spiritually. Although it was evident that the Spirit was working in each heart, the team rejoiced together over four young men who repented of their sin and began a new walk with the Lord that week in Jamaica.

As the trip came to a close and team members began departing to their home congregations, everyone gathered on the Jamaican hillside to sing "Blest Be the Tie." Even though we shared tearful farewells in parting, each team member returned home with their cups running over with blessings and eager to serve the Lord more faithfully in their daily walk of life.

Looking back on the past year at the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped, the Lord through His church has been found faithful again. When the scripture says "great is Thy faithfulness" in Lamentations, we understand that it was a time of lamenting. While the rest of the State of Illinois laments over it's poor financial management, we have been able to experience Christ's strength being made perfect in man's weakness. In the past 12 months we have experienced the longest period without payments from the State. The State has owed the agency as much as \$3.4 million dollars. With the help of the church we have continued to meet payroll.

The Apostolic Christian Church brotherhood has stood in unity by our side in providing quality care for those who cannot provide for themselves. We believe more than ever before, the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped has been on the minds of the brethren. We can feel through the prayers, phone-calls, volunteerism, and donations. While we are thankful that this has been a record year for donations, we see the need for contributions to cover a larger portion of the budget as a trend and not a single year solution.

Whether large concerns, such as safe quality care of residents and meeting the budget, or the smallest of matters, we ask you to keep the residents, staff, family members, counseling elders, board members, administration, and yes, even the State of Illinois, in your prayers.

minute. David was a very honorable man. I think there is at least twice that he had Saul where he could have taken his life. Those times he said, no, Saul is God's anointed. (I Samuel 24:6, I Samuel 26:9) Even though he knew he was going to become the king, he still would not take Saul's life. So we could look at this and think, why didn't God allow David to build His house, that He could dwell there? It is one of those things that I don't have an answer

So often when we look at God, we can have a question. God, why have you said this in your Word? Why is it this way? We have to understand, we are weak. We are humans. We cannot fully comprehend what God has in mind as to why things happen and why they don't. I am glad that we don't because if we could understand our heavenly Father that well, maybe He would mean less to us. But I am thankful that our heavenly Father has a reason for everything. I am thankful that when Nathan went back, that God talked to him and told him no. And He told him why. He said, because he has been a man of war (I Chronicles 28:3).

We look at David and we say, why was he a man of war? He was a man of war because God asked him to be. To raise up this great nation, God's chosen people. He had allowed him to do that for His chosen people. That is where, as we go from the Old Testament into the New, there is a controversy in our society - not just in our recent society but it has happened for centuries - how does that happen that we go from a time of the believer, of the followers of God, of God Himself saying, destroy this nation, yet today, Jesus Christ tells us just the opposite, doesn't He? He says, love your enemies (St. Matthew 5:44). Be willing to die. People have a hard time understanding. They want to say, well wait a minute. There has got to be something connecting here. We can't have that much difference. And they will look to connect the Old and the New and say, wait a minute. We can justify this during a time of war. We can justify it if this happens. Can we?

I have heard this discussed before. I have been a part of that discussion before. I come back with this thing, we cannot comprehend what God has in mind and why He chose to do this, to make this difference in the new dispensation of grace. But the one thing that I have gleaned from the Scripture is the fact that Jesus came and told us we should love our enemies. We should be willing to die for His cause. Take up our cross and follow Him.

If He really wanted to, He told them He could call legions of angels to come and fight for Him (St. Matthew 26:53). But He willingly gave Himself to die upon the cross. So sometimes when we are entered into that discussion of how do you justify the two differences of David, a man of war, doing God's will and Jesus coming and saying we should lay our life down, we should not hurt someone elsethat is the example I use. Jesus meant what He said. He brought the Word and did the will of the heavenly Father.

It is not for me to sit and try to rationalize or go through the Scripture and look for a glitch, a loophole as we would look for today in so many things. It is mine to look at the Scripture and say, what did Jesus Christ say? And go with that. Because Jesus was the example. We don't have to look at just what He said. But we have to look at His example. He did what He said. He gave His life on the cross for us.

As we go through this time and time again as an example, it is what we read here with Nathan. Nathan, a great prophet, subject to the same problems that we have today. Made a quick decision, didn't he? He told David, that is fine. Go ahead and do it. God had to work with him to correct him. He does the same thing with us today, doesn't He? Have we not all had that happen in our lives? Maybe we say something, we are going to do something. And God talks to us that night and says, I don't want you to do that. Or He might tell us, I do want you to do this though.

Comes back to what we heard this morning, doesn't it? We have to have the faith to believe in our heavenly Father. To believe in His will for the betterment of our lives. But more importantly, for the betterment of the world. Because each one of us affect other people. I believe that is why, as we look at this and why God instructed Nathan, tell David he is not to be the one to build this house. But his son would. Because you have been a man of war.

I think David understood that. I can't remember anything in the Scripture where David questioned what God told Nathan. Instead, he got everything ready for Solomon to build it, didn't he? He set everything in order. Used all of the alliances that he had to get the gold, the silver, the wood, the stone, to prepare for Solomon to build this great temple for God.

As we walk through life, that is why I say, as we look at our own lives, we know that Jesus Christ is supposed to dwell in our heart, isn't He (I John 4:13)? We read

that in the Scripture. We understand that. We no longer have this magnificent physical edifice that we go to that represents where God lives. But it is here, in the heart.

Stop and think about it. Of all the trouble that David went to and then Solomon would go to, to build this great temple, to worship almighty God. It starts to help me understand why we have to be so protective of that Spirit that dwells within our heart. Because you see, we are a temple that houses the Spirit of God. Therefore, if we are that temple, how should we be? How should we be adorned?

It was quite a sight, as we read in the Scripture, this magnificent temple that Solomon was going to build. Known across the land. You see, as we walk through life, when the Spirit is in us, we need to be that kind of an example to the people we are walking around with today. We are not adorned with gold and all kinds of fancy things. But our heart should be adorned with the grace of God. With the love of God. So that as we walk through life, people can see it. They can feel it! The one thing about love - I said people can see it. They see it through our actions. But love is one of those things that you can feel, can't you?

It is always tough standing up front here. I have everybody looking at me with kind of a solemn face. I always look for those who are nodding in the affirmative. Can't you feel love? Yes, I know you can. I said this before, I know you can because that is why we can't get in here early enough. I am not chastising you for that. Wouldn't begin to. Because that is the love that needs to go forth when we are here. Recharge us so when we walk out this door this afternoon and go wherever we are going to go to and we run into somebody that is not our brother and sister in faith, I want them to be able to feel it too. I want them to be able to see your love through your actions. See my love through my actions. Do I live this Word out?

I told somebody just this afternoon as we were visiting out here. I think it is a wonderful time that we are living in right now. It is a very unsure time, isn't it? This time that we just read about in the Old Testament was starting to become a more comfortable time because David had secured a lot of peace. He had conquered a lot of nations and God's chosen people had this comfort coming.

I look at the day and time we are living and there is a lot of un-surety. But to the believer, it shouldn't bother us. Matter of fact, to the believer, it is a golden opportunity. Because people want some assurance that things are going to work out. People are looking for someone who is not worried. That is why it is great for us to share our faith right now. People are willing to listen.

So often as we read in the Scripture, it was the downtrodden. It was the Israelite people, when they were having a tough time, that would come to God. And I think that is the way it is today. I think there are a lot of people out there looking at Christianity saying, is that the answer?

Just read an article in the paper, maybe you read it. It is about Haiti. There is some discussion between this meeting they were going to have because Christianity is sending food and supplies and every type of help that we can think of into Haiti. They are feeling that love and they are seeing the fruits of it. It is very noticeable to them. They have acknowledged it. They were going to have this get together. Those people who represent Voodoo wanted to be a part of it. Amazing isn't it! Doesn't make any difference if they are a part of it. Because really what is coming forth right now is that the believer is moving into there to help. It is our faith in action, isn't it? That is what really makes a difference. Our faith in action.

We heard a lot about faith this morning. But there is an opportunity where we can put our faith in action. We can put our faith in action every day, actually. We don't have to be in Haiti, Jamaica, Ethiopia, wherever it is. Although if we are there, it is a great opportunity also. You see, we can do it today here in America. Because there are people looking.

This chapter in St. Luke is very appropriate for the day and time in which we are living. A parable to them. "...Behold the fig tree, and all the trees; When they now shoot forth, ye see and know of your own selves that summer is now nigh at hand." St. Luke 21:29,30. He wanted them to start thinking about an earthly example. Because He was going to bring this spiritual example into it. If He could get them thinking in the context of recognizing something, He wanted them to understand, what do you think of when you see the trees starting to bud? Pretty simple isn't it? Simple analogy. We think of summer coming, warm weather. Especially when you live in the north. It causes us to think and that is what He wanted. He wanted to get them in a thought process here. He said, this is what you think. When you see this happen, you know that summer is coming.

He wanted to go on then and He wanted to get into the spiritual side of it. He has them thinking about, okay yes, we

can see this happening. We know this is going to happen. This is why it is so important for us, that we are in God's Word all the time. Do not rely on Bill Masters to speak something over the pulpit and say that is good. That will carry me for the week. It is not. You see, because He is using this parable, this example, to get them to think.

What was He wanting them to think about? He was wanting them to think of the prophetic messages of old. To stir up their mind. To think about it. The same way that every year they would think about it when they would see this happen; the trees would bud, summer was nigh. He wanted them to stop and think about this because the end time was coming.

I always say, as we look at time, the end time has come today, right now, for some. I don't know how many people die every second but I do know that there has probably been, in the last little bit, hundreds of people who passed from this life throughout this world. Sometimes we think on such a small scale, don't we? We think of Fort Myers, FL. We think of Florida. We think of Bloomington, IL. We think of wherever our churches are. But you see, God is not that small. When God looks at the world. He looks at the whole world. He says He came to die for everyone. As Brother Tom said this morning, it is His hope that everyone would make it to heaven. He has given everyone that opportunity. But today, this very second, there are more people dying every minute that we sit here. Some are probably going to make it to heaven. Some are not. That is why I believe, as we look at this, it is important for us, as we look at the things of this world as they happen, is to realize that spiritually they happen also. Time is marching on.

That is why it is so important, as we walk through life, to share the Word. As I have gotten older, you probably notice, I am more passionate about it. I don't know why. I guess because God has given it to me. He has laid it on my heart. Because as I get to know more people, I like people. We all have a soul. We can turn and look to our right or our left. Each one of us has a soul. When we go out tonight or tomorrow, and you look around at everybody that you are going to be around, they have a soul! It is not going to die! It is going to go into eternity. It only has two destinations in eternity: heaven or hell.

Some people might want to say there are some other places. But the reality is, there are only two: heaven or hell. You are either prepared or you are not prepared. You have accepted Jesus Christ or

you haven't. It is that simple. I have listened to a lot of people proclaim the Word. The ones I like to listen to are the ones who say there are only two destinations after death and that is heaven or hell. I like it especially when they say there is only one way that you are going to get into heaven and that is if you accept Jesus Christ as your personal Savior. That focuses in. It is not good works. Oh, they are a result of that love, when we accept Jesus Christ and we become a child of our King, our Heavenly Father. It will be evident in our life. We will want to do it. Not because we have to do it.

There are so many examples that He gives to us to be about His work. He is wanting us to understand time is marching on in our lives. He wants us to understand we are drawing close to the end of time for us. For our neighbor. For the world. As we get into the Word and we read this story, this little bit out of chapter 21, He is cautioning us to understand that. As we read in other portions of the Scripture, He is going to express to us the importance of how we live.

I go back to that Old Testament reading. Maybe that is why He didn't want David - well it is obvious because He told Nathan the Prophet - because you have been a man of war. You have shed a lot of blood. He was doing God's will. But He said He wanted Solomon to do it. God has a plan. He has a reason for everything. He is telling us in this Scripture, that time is marching on.

He even told the generation here, "...This generation shall not pass away, till all be fulfilled." St. Luke 21:32. In other words, they were going to see these things. He did not tell them that the end of time was going to come during their generation. But they were going to see these prophecies fulfilled. So it can happen anytime. What has it been? Two thousand years? We are still reading the Scripture. But just stop and think of how many souls, how many people have died in that two thousand years. Did they all go to heaven? Did they all go to hell? We don't know, do we.

The Bible tells us, many will be called, few will be chosen (St. Matthew 22:14). Strait is the way, narrow is the gate that leadeth unto life everlasting. Broad is the way, broad is the gate going into destruction. (St. Matthew 7:13,14)



## Needs of Adopted/Foster Children Article Two of Three: Needs of Adopted Children

This is the second of three articles and will focus on how families can 1) prepare. 2) provide, and 3) persist when it comes to meeting the needs of adoptive children. Preparation is helpful and important when you decide to do anything. Bringing a child into your home is a life-altering decision that needs to begin in prayer. (Psalm 127:1, "Except the LORD build the house, they labour in vain that build it: ...") Adoption, when it is the Lord's work, is a wonderful opportunity to minister to the fatherless. When the Lord provides direction and opportunity to adopt a child into your family know that there are many adjustments ahead. Two factors that will dramatically affect adjustments that occur are: 1) your family situation and 2) the adopted child. Consider the following about your family: Do you already have children? How old are your children? Are you married or single? What do you expect your role as an adoptive parent to be? And what roles will others play in the child's life? The adopted child's age, cultural background, ethnicity, history, and experiences will also greatly influence adjustments that will need to be made within your family unit.

#### Prepare:

To prepare for these adjustments, many family discussions are needed so that everyone knows the plan as well as the expectations for each family member when adoption occurs. Time and energy spent prior to adoption in prayer, discussion, and learning is time well spent. Children already in your home should be aware of how God has directed you, the parent(s), towards adoption and what adoption means for your family. Make an effort to learn and teach what the bible says about adoption as this understanding will help your children understand your purpose in adding another person to the family. You also need to learn about the culture, ethnicity, and background of your prospective adoptive child. If you already have children, become aware of their feelings regarding the planned adoption as well as their perception of how their role in the family may change or be diminished. What you learn in these areas will help you provide a loving, supportive, and comfortable environment for the child you adopt. As an adoptive parent, you will also need to educate yourself about the situation your adopted child is coming from.

#### Provide:

One way to look at stepping into the role of adoptive parents is through the lens of stewardship. Psalm 127:3 tells us, "Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord: and the fruit of the womb is his reward." Children are a precious gift from God which He has entrusted to parents. Being a steward of this gift is an important part of parenting. It is vital that you understand, validate, and embrace the person God has created your child to be which includes, but is not limited to, their ethnicity, culture, talents, weaknesses, and experiences. Your adopted child has been "fearfully and wonderfully made" by God. Embrace the unique identity and personality of the adopted child while you train him to serve the Lord.

Your relationship with your child is extremely important as it is the foundation of your training, instructing and leading. One of the most important ways to provide for your adoptive child is through building a healthy relationship. Love, trust, and safety are three essential ingredients of establishing a strong connection with your child. It may help to think of your relationship with your child as an attachment. Developing a healthy attachment with your adoptive child is done through experiences where you show love and care for him. Specific ways to do this are hugs, kisses, holding, singing, rocking, and other healthy ways to physically and emotionally nurture a child. For more information on attachment you can read "Understanding Attachment: A Fundamental Parenting Principle" which is posted on ACCFS's website under parenting.

Loss and not having a sense of belonging are two things that can make attachment difficult for adoptive children. Think of a time when someone let you down. When this occurs, you are less trusting of that person the next time you interact with

him. Attachment is built on trust, and an adopted child will need time and positive experiences with you to build that trust. Work to build trust by providing consistency founded on biblical principles, honesty (Matthew 5:37), discipline (Hebrews 12:7), and unconditional love (Romans 5:8). Provide your adoptive child with a clear sense and understanding that he is a member of the family. There should be no division between biological and adopted children in your home. In Galatians 3:26-4:7, Paul paints a beautiful picture of God's adoptive love by indicating that those who have faith in Jesus Christ are adopted into God's family, and there is no distinction between members of the body. This passage speaks to a spiritual adoption but the principle can be a powerful one in helping your adopted child become a family member and not just an addition. This will be an ongoing journey which will take a great deal of perseverance on your part and on the part of any previous children.

#### Persist:

Persevering in such a way that will help the child become known and seen by you and himself as one of your children is an important need to meet. An adopted child's perspective of his situation will change as he moves through the developmental stages of childhood. As children develop, they begin to ask questions about whom they are and where they belong. Parents need to be prepared to answer these questions. As a general rule, children who have been adopted should be informed about their adoption around age 3-4. Keep in mind that all children need to know that they are gifts from God (Ps. 127:3), that He loves them (I Jn. 4:16), has a plan for them (Je. 29:11), and that they need Him (Rom. 6:23).

Understand that as an adopted child grows and matures, he will change his views on "adoption." As his view of adoption changes, his questions about adoption and the meaning he gives adoption will change. Your child needs you to persevere with him through the storms he will experience. The more time and energy spent during the early phases of adoption, building a strong relationship, will help you and your family endure through challenges that will occur. May God bless His work.



# The Light Of Flope

## "Truth Is Exclusive"

An American lady was teaching the New Testament to a Japanese lady in Tokyo. The Japanese lady said, "Jesus was very proud." The American lady asked, "Why do you say that?" The Japanese lady retorted, "Because He said, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No man comes to God but by me.' He was very proud."

This actually happened and was told to me by the American lady. The question that arises is, "Was Jesus proud?" or was He simply telling the truth. I conclude that He was telling the truth and that the truth is exclusive. (He was humble enough to go to the cross.)

I think like this. If someone says that it is two miles between two clearly designated lines on the surface of the earth and someone else says that it is two and one-tenth miles, both cannot be right. The truth is exclusive.

Buddhism is a tolerant religion, at least in Japan. It is not exclusive. You may be a Christian, a Hindu, a Muslim, a Shintoist, and a Buddhist, and the Buddhist priests won't mind at all as long as you follow the Buddhist customs regarding funerals and the rituals to be performed by the priests, periodically performed following a death.

The story is told of someone calling at the home of a Buddhist priest to sell a book containing the teachings of Christ. The Buddhist priest's wife was pondering as to whether or not she should buy the book when the priest called from inside the house, "Buy it. There are probably many

good teachings in it."

Christianity is accused of being intolerant. Acts 4:12 reads, "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." We would like to say that everybody will go to heaven but the problem is, it is not the truth. The truth is that Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of God who died for us and arose again. Everyone who goes to heaven will be there on the basis of the atonement He made for us. This is the truth and the truth is exclusive. Two contradictory statements cannot both be true.

Already in the Old Testament God said in the Ten Commandments, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." Exodus 20:3. This is very exclusive. It means that the living, Creator God is the only God. All others which claim to be gods are fakes. This is the truth and it cannot be compromised and remain the truth. On the contrary, in Buddhism and in Shintoism, the more gods the better. That is why most Japanese would claim to be both Buddhists and Shintoists. They give full cooperation with both the Buddhist temples and the Shinto shrines, and with the Buddhist priests and the Shinto priests. A very religious Japanese man to whom I taught English privately told me that the two are now entwined so that it is difficult to separate the two.

Although the truth is exclusive and Christianity is exclusive, it can be said that Christianity as taught in the New Testament is not at all antagonistic toward others outside of Christ. Jesus said, "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you." Matthew 5:44. However, the history of Christianity shows that Christ's teaching in this regard has not been followed. Professing Christians have martyred other Christians ferociously when different convictions on what the Bible teaches threatened the power of the church. Also, the history of the Apostolic Christian Church shows that it has not always been peaceful within the church. This is my understanding of church history. Please correct me if I am wrong.

Although Christianity is correctly labeled as being intolerant, it is not intolerant in a violent way. On the contrary, Christ did not resist those who nailed Him to the cross and we are called upon to follow in His steps. I John 2:6, "He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked."

We who are followers of Christ believe that homosexuality is wrong based on Romans 1:26 and 27. It evidently is a part of the curse of sin on the earth and on the human race. However, we do not hate or mistreat homosexuals. We love them, feel sorry for them, and pray for them, that by the power of God, they may overcome. This is one of the wonderful aspects of Christianity and the teachings of Christ. Truth is exclusive and is also intolerant as to what deviates from the truth but we still love everybody.
