

Sermon by Bro. Randy Gudeman, Francesville, IN

Psalm 100 & II Corinthians 5

I greet you all again in the name of God our Father, His Son and the Holy Spirit, asking for your prayers as we open God's good Word. As we heard this morning, it was coined, 'The good stuff'. That is so true.

This is a powerful chapter written to the Corinthians. We pray God will give us the words either through the minister or in our hearts personally. If we refer back just a little bit to the Old Testament, the message this morning seemed so powerful that we recognize God is all in all. There are probably twenty some in this congregation who distinctly recognized the verses that were read this morning. It is part of that financial Bible study that is going on. In week two, there is a memory verse and that memory verse is I Chronicles chapter 29, verses 11 and 12. The point the Bible study and the Spirit this morning, more importantly, is trying to drive into our minds and into our lives - not just our minds, it must connect with our heart - is that God is God and He is in control of everything. There is nothing that God does not control. Think about that. God is God and He is sovereign – sovereign means absolute control.

We hear about the country of Egypt, and there is a man there who's been in control for thirty years. He has been sovereign for thirty years, but he may easily be overthrown and will not be sovereign any more. People, governments, authorities come and go and come and go. Yet God is sovereign for eternity — past, present, and eternity future. If we believe that, it will change our lives. It will change how we behave.

Now there's a head knowledge and then there is the heart knowledge that affects our lives. That is a saving faith through Jesus Christ. David says, as they were building and dedicating the great temple – I believe it needs to be driven into my

heart, and you can see how you accept it in your heart - "Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine; thine is the kingdom..." I Chronicles 29:11. What is the kingdom? A kingdom is for a person who has the sovereignty. He is the alone authority. Thine is the kingdom. God is sovereign. "...thine is the kingdom, O Lord, and thou art exalted as head above all. Both riches and honour come of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand is power and might; and in thine hand it is to make great, and to give strength unto all." v.11-12. Everything that has value and that is going to last is from the Lord. That is what the Bible verses are telling us here.

We are reminded of Zacchaeus. He made a choice. He had a decision point. God made the call, and he followed Him. Is anyone here where God is calling you and you are at that critical decision point? I was listening to someone speak about a company that processes food. They are really sensitive that everything's just right because it creates all kinds of problems when bad food goes out. They have critical decision points all the way through this process. There's a critical decision point where this has to be done and this has to be checked. Zacchaeus came to a critical decision point. We come to that in our lives where God walks through this congregation and stops each one of our hearts, and there's critical decision points. God is saying, 'Come to me'.

God told Adam and Eve, If you eat of this fruit you will surely die. (Genesis 2:17) Probably all of us had little goldfish some time in our life. You put them in these tanks, and every once in a while one will jump out. Now I could say to that goldfish, You jump out of the water

and you are going to surely die. You know that is the truth. I cannot change that fact.' So that goldfish jumps out and sure enough, you get up in the morning and he's laying there as stiff as a board. We all

Respect For Our Heritage

As children of God, we have a tremendous heritage. This is a term often used, maybe even taken for granted, but perhaps we've never asked, "Just what is our heritage? What have we inherited?" On a grand scale, we've become "heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together" (Rom. 8:17). Although God's heritage is the church, "Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock" (1 Pet. 5:3), the overcoming church's heritage is everything. "He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son" (Rev. 21:7). In addition to these "exceeding great and precious promises" (2 Pet. 1:4), we have inherited much from our Apostolic Christian forefathers and many other believers who lived in the centuries before our Brotherhood came into being. "For thou O God...hast given me the heritage of those that fear thy name" (Ps. 61:5).

It can be challenging to discern the real treasures of one's heritage. Many a hard-working man has become wealthy - only to leave his substance to children who've no appreciation for the blood, sweat, and tears that were required to produce the wealth. In the face of great wealth, it is no simple task to look deeper for the real treasures. However, those who do, are rewarded by, and learn to appreciate, an even greater wealth. Monetary wealth is tangible. But there are greater treasures that go deeper than that which is seen. The most valuable earthly inheritances include values, morals, ethics, and other intangible characteristics that far exceed the value of money. Who can place a value on integrity, or contentment, or commitment? Can all the financial freedom in this world be of more value than the freedom of always telling the truth?

The present is inarguably shaped by history, such that we inherit great treasures from our fathers – of which we may be largely unaware. Just as a wealthy child may not understand how difficult it was for his father to earn his substance, and how easily a child may

waste it by not knowing its value, we may be inclined to underestimate much about our heritage. What are the true treasures of our heritage? Clearly the greatest portion of our inheritance is eternal life, which we have not yet fully received, although God has given us a measure of it in advance: "...who also has given unto us the earnest of the Spirit" (2 Cor. 5:5).

Along with the promise of eternal life with God in the time to come, we find ourselves very grateful for the present treasures of fellowship, a good measure of unity in application of the Scripture, and many other facets of our lives as Apostolic Christians. Clearly we are recipients of blessings that are the enduring results of other men's perseverance, dedication, and spiritual labor. "And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth. I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours" (John 4:37-38).

However, have we asked ourselves if there are underlying treasures that are even greater? If we've been raised by parents who taught us the Bible from the time we were little, can we place a value on such a foundation of truth? Along with our faithful predecessors and the Psalmist, we can declare: "Thy testimonies have I taken as an heritage forever: for they are the rejoicing of my heart" (Ps. 119:111). How difficult would your life be if your inclination was to lie rather than tell the truth? In a time in which many religious groups deny the truth of the Bible, do we understand just how much it means to share a nearly universal expectation within our Brotherhood that all things must rest on the truth of God's Word? Can we grasp the value of the sense of commitment that leads to being willing to die for the sake of the gospel and that we are recipients of such a shared commitment even though we've not experienced such persecution for many years here in America? Do we maintain the trust that permits us to "bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ"? (Gal. 6:2). Can we place a value on the blessing of brethren who were willing to follow Jesus, turning the other cheek and not returning evil for

evil? (1 Pet. 3:9).

Above all, we are forever indebted that our church is built firmly upon the solid rock, which is Jesus Christ. As so aptly stated by the Apostle Paul, our faith must be "...built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone" (Eph. 2:20).

As a contrast to your experience, consider the challenge facing a child who grows up in a household of nearly twenty people sharing a tiny shack none of whom are her parents... a child who at the age of ten is expected to go out on the streets and bring back money to support the drug addictions of her housemates. Or consider the heritage of a six-year old boy who is the primary caretaker of his three siblings who faces the tough choice of digging through garbage cans or stealing to find food for his family. What would be the heritage of a young girl who believes her only option to survive is to use her body as a means of earning a living - who has many children before she turns twenty - whose only experience with men is demeaning and degrading. These aren't made up. They are real life examples of souls whom God loves.

Let's be very thankful to our loving and merciful Heavenly Father. It is a priceless treasure to share in the heritage of a fellowship of sanctified, born again believers, (though not unencumbered by the flesh), who speak the truth in love, and love our Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity. "For we are not as many, which corrupt the word of God: but as of sincerity, but as of God, in the sight of God speak we in Christ" (2 Cor. 2:17). The true riches of God are ours if we are faithful! "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?" (Luke 16:10-11).

If we have a genuine appreciation for the rich heritage we enjoy, "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another" (Rom. 14:19). 4 SILVER LINING September 2011

Ambassadors for Christ

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the believers in Corinth, he reminded them that we are ambassadors for Christ. (2 Cor. 5:20) To fully understand this counsel, it may be good to consider the responsibilities and job description of an ambassador.

An ambassador is a representative for somebody else. He is an individual called to a high position and rank, typically employed by his nation to represent the dignity and power of that nation.

Being an official spokesman, his words and actions are chosen carefully to represent his country in the best light possible. He does not author the policies of his nation; he explains them while reflecting the trust and dignity of his leaders who placed him in office.

Our calling

Every believer has the responsibility to be a spokesman and ambassador for Jesus Christ. This high ranking position requires that our conduct and walk of life reflect the dignity and sovereignty of who we are representing.

The Scripture encourages us to live a holy and sanctified life, walking in the fear of the Lord, so that we can be an example and light to a dark and lost world.

But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation. (1 Peter 1:15)

That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world. (Philippians 2:15)

Our responsibility

Our devotion and adherence to these scriptural directives is critical, as people must see the gospel of Jesus Christ before they hear it. Our talk should not contradict our walk.

One of our most important duties as an ambassador is speaking as the Holy Spirit prompts us. An ambassador does not visit another nation and remain silent. He is carrying a message from his homeland. The Apostle Paul, though in prison, refused to be silenced by his bonds:

And for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel, For which I am an ambassador in bonds; that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak. (Ephesians 6:19-20)

Our message

There is no true evangelism without an understanding of what sin is. Our message needs to include the definition and penalty for sin, as well as the salvation offered through Christ. It is impossible for a person to fully realize his need for God's grace until he sees how terribly he has failed the standard's of God's law.

For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (ROMANS 6:23)

Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. (Galatians 3:24)

Our readiness

Unlike the Apostle Paul, we are not all called to be evangelists, but we are all called to share the gospel.

Every Christian must be ready at all times and in all situations to share his or her faith in Christ if directed by the Holy Spirit with those who do not have a relationship with Christ.

But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear. (1 Peter 3:15)

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen. (Matt 28:19)

Our service

Do you feel you are an effective ambassador for Christ? God can, and will use anyone to convey the gospel who is open to serving him.

There is a wonderful story in the book of Jeremiah that illustrates the power of God's Word in the heart of his servants. Jeremiah went through a period in which he was very angry with God, and felt that God had deceived him. In his anger and frustration Jeremiah said:

I will not make mention of him, nor speak any more in his name. But his word was in my heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones, and I was weary with forbearing, and I could not stay. (Jeremiah 20:9)

Does the word burn in your heart as it did in Jeremiah's? If not, pray that the Lord of Glory would place a burden for the lost in your heart and the desire to boldly proclaim and share the precious truth of salvation as directed by the Holy Spirit.



As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:10

Opportunities to Serve One Another

One of our residents recently passed from this life into eternity. He was surrounded by family, staff and residents during his last days here on earth. This gentleman had lived at Timber Ridge for nearly 40 years when the Lord took him Home. He was one of the youngest residents to be admitted to Timber Ridge, and moved here in 1972. When we stopped to ponder these facts, we began to realize that the Lord has certainly blessed us all. We couldn't begin to count the number of family members, care givers, and residents who touched his life over the years. Even though the man experienced communication challenges and couldn't verbally speak to us, he communicated in a variety of creative ways. We reflect on the number of people who have lived in our homes over the past 40 years since our first two residents moved into Timber Ridge on October 1, 1971. God has blessed us beyond measure and has walked with us through joys and sorrows over the years. The following lyrics by Carolina Sandell Berg indicates what we sense because of the Lord's consistent loving care and involvement in our Homes:

Day by day, and with each passing moment,

Strength I find to meet my trials here:

Gives unto each day what He deems best,

Lovingly its part of pain and pleasure.

GATEWAY WOODS APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN CHILDREN'S HOME Jan Beer

Foster Care, Adoption, Home-Based Counseling, these are the "invisible" parts of Gateway Woods. Before becoming a Staff member, my perception of this ministry was a lot like yours may be; it's a beautiful residential campus, with its own school, serving a limited number of children. But I can tell you now it's a whole lot more!

The children who reside on our campus are a very small percentage of the total clients served. There are forty-two Christian foster homes licensed through Gateway Woods eager to provide excellent care to foster children. The Adoption department processes many requests each

month, and Home-Based Counseling reaches out to a large number of families who need direction in their lives. All of these departments point people to the only answer to all of this life's problems: Jesus Christ.

Another misconception I had is that a person decides to work at Gateway Woods in the same way as one decides to work on a World Relief mission to a disaster area. A sort of, do a "good deed for those in need" for a short while, then go back to life as normal approach. The Lord really opened my eyes on this subject when His Holy Spirit brought conviction on my heart to apply for an office position at Gateway Woods. I strongly resisted the conviction. I already had my own "service" plan. My husband and I were going to move into one of the new housing units being built by the Bloomington church, then I would join him in retirement in a couple years and we would work side by side in the many outreach missions of the Bloomington church. After an intense time of resistance, God's grace was sufficient for my husband and me to become obedient to His call. Since then, I have learned that all of the Gateway Woods staff is "called" to serve God in this ministry - it is God's choice!

After being on Staff at Gateway Woods for a little over a year, I cannot begin to tell you all the ways the Lord has enriched our lives. He has helped us grow in faith and trust, taught us how selfish we are, and exposed us to needs we did not even know existed. He has shown us over and over the power of bringing it all to Him in prayer and trusting His Spirit to guide us in the path He chooses for us.

So, if you are feeling the least bit convicted about answering the call for one of the present Staff openings at Gateway Woods, please pray, then respond. God may have a surprising blessing in store for you! News:

- All of our members and friends across the country recently received a very important mailing about the Promise Fund—this generation's promise of love to children who will need the nurture and structure of a Christian home in the future. - We are thrilled to welcome Sis. Maria Steffen (Elgin, IL) to Gateway Woods as a new Assistant Houseparent. We are excited to see how God will use Maria in her new role.
- Our 35th Annual Sale, which took place on August 6, was a huge success again this year. We were blessed with over \$400,000! We thank each of our supporters, volunteers and our great God for providing for us through the Auction once again. Next year's Auction will take place on Saturday, August 4.
- Gateway Woods welcomed one new resident to campus this past month. Please pray with us as she becomes accustomed to her new home. It can be a difficult adjustment for new residents as they discover a very different living situation than they have experienced before.
- We currently have two positions open at Gateway Woods: Alternate

probably had that experience. However, think about this. When we disobey God, we are the goldfish that jumps out of the water. You know the lifespan of that goldfish lying on the table beside the aguarium is very, very short. I believe that is the same intensity that God is talking to us human beings. Because we have inherited the sin nature, we cannot be of God and we are dying. The wages of sin is death. (Romans 6:23) It's very simple. Just as a little kid needs to be right there to grab that goldfish and put him back in the water, Jesus Christ through the Word He is speaking today is as intensely and in such a time constraint saying, Come to me. I am the way, the Truth, and the Life. No man comes unto the Father but by me. (John 14:6) Do we see the intensity of the message that God is telling us that we can have eternal life through Him? Recognize Him as absolute sovereign. There is no other. Then we need to give Him our entire life.

Then in Psalm 100, "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands." v.1. This is global for all people every place. It doesn't matter if we are red, brown, yellow, black, or white like that song we used to sing. It's for all mankind.

Then here is David's advice. "Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing". v.2. Why wouldn't we be glad? He has given us life eternal. "...come before his presence with singing. Know ye..." v.2-3. Know ve. Didn't we read that in the New Testament? "For we know..." is how II Corinthians 5 starts out. Let's see how that ties in a little bit later. Let's go with the first 'know ye' here. Know ye - this is fact -'Know ye that the Lord he is God...' Psalm 100:3. If we don't know that, God in His love will give us some pretty hard lessons so we will know that. He only does that because He loves us. We can get so self-confident when things are going well.

Not 'God is God, but I'm doing just great' but 'God is God, and I am nothing without God'. By the grace of God, He will teach us a lesson that we come to the point where we know He is God.

"Know ye that the Lord he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture." v.3. He has bought us. Know ye that ye are not your own. Jesus Christ has bought us back from the devil, literally - from the power of Satan, from that shackle of Egypt, the slavery that they had put the Israelites in. God freed them. It says that God hardened Pharaoh's heart that He could show the world His power. With a strong arm He brought His chosen people out, and with a strong arm He pulls us out of the captivity of Satan. That is through Jesus Christ. With a strong arm He raised Jesus Christ from death because His righteous did not change. He could by rights do that because He paid the debt of sin for us. Think about the righteousness of God. He actually paid it, and He is just and true to pull us out. So how are we going to respond to God for that? We are His people and the sheep of His pasture. How I need that clarity.

"Enter into his gates with thanksgiving..." v.4. - the gates of His kingdom, the Kingdom of God. That would be a good Bible study, I believe – the Kingdom of God. We hear that theme through all the Bible. The Kingdom of God. The place of His sovereignty. Know ye that the Kingdom of God is within you? So I have to ask the question. Is God sovereign in my life? I kind of like that word sovereignty – total, absolute control. "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name. For the Lord is good..." v.4-5. There is no question. God is good all the time.

"...his mercy is everlasting..." – so thankful for that – "...and his

truth endureth to all generations." v.5. You cannot change truth. That is a characteristic of truth. It does not change. Think about that — endureth to all generations. As parents, let's take the privilege to teach truth to the generations that we are entrusted with. It was just a little slim up here this morning. Didn't we notice that? It feels so much fuller when we hear the chatter as the Sunday school kids and the teachers come up. We miss you. That is the truth that we are telling to the next generation.

Now we come to Chapter 5 of II Corinthians. "For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens." v.1. That rolls us into John 14 – "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you." v.1-2.

This seems like he's really becoming truthful here: "For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven". II Corinthians 5:2. We will rise, and we will have a new immortal body. Just as the seed of corn that is planted and the corn stalk look a little bit different, we are sown mortal people, and we will rise immortal.

It seems like the Zion's Harp really expresses the battles of life. Sometimes I wonder in our particular time zone right here in America how we can really relate to those battles. It worries me because some of these songs were really deep in their thought of Christians who are really being tested for their faith. I cringe at my lukewarmness. I can't think of a better word.

"For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven: if so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked." v.2-3. Naked is in opposition to God. What is the first

thing Adam and Eve realized after they disobeyed God? They hid behind a tree because they knew they were exposed, and they were not in unison with God. (Genesis 3:7-8) That's the first thing. Think about it. It's shameful. It's embarrassing. To this very day it's a shameful position to be in.

"For we that are in this tabernacle..." – this is our physical body. This is, I believe, kind of reminiscent of the physical tabernacle that the Jewish people built – "...do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life." II Corinthians 5:4. We look to our goal, our vision. The Corinthian people were in a very tough environment as we can read of a little bit in history. Maybe it is not much different than what we are in today.

"Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit." v.5. Now what does that verse say? Now he that wrought us for the selfsame thing is God. He has given us a mission. He has put us here on this earth. It is His choice not to translate us into heaven after we become converted. However, as we have these tasks on earth to do, He also hath given us the earnest of the Spirit. He has given the Holy Spirit to reign in His kingdom, which is in our heart, to rule our lives because He is sovereign. The Spirit of God has sovereignty in our life. Think about that. We are traveling through this world, and there's a prince of the power of the air. There is spiritual warfare, but we in God's kingdom, which He says is within our heart, are given the Holy Spirit to be sovereign. Let's not offend the Holy Spirit. Let's not be rebellious against the Holy Spirit. Let's not let an insurgency of Satan come into God's kingdom, which is in our heart, but most importantly, let's give our heart over to God's sovereignty. Let's invite Jesus in. Jesus

said recognize me, then repent for your sins (Mark 1:15), and then be converted. Let God fill our hearts totally and completely.

"Therefore we are always confident, knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord." II Corinthians 5:6. There is coming a day. ("For we walk by faith, not by sight."), v.7. Faith — so critical. If we had our druthers, verse 8 says, we'd rather be absent from the body and be present with the Lord.

"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad." v.10. Where do we want this judgment to take place? Now there's some theology that goes beyond my ability here. But we are in the day of grace, and we can put what we have done before God now in the day of grace. We can take the blood of Christ, that payment, and let our sin debt be paid. This is the intensity of that time zone. We're that fish flopping beside the aquarium, remember, and how long can a fish live outside of water? I don't know but not real long. This is our lifespan outside of the grace, outside of the blood of Jesus Christ. We can't live very long. The average lifespan in America is 70-some years. It seems long, but it's not. Some of us may not walk out of this building. Some may live over 100. But the point is without Jesus Christ we are the fish outside the aquarium flopping on the table. Jesus is saying, 'Come, come quickly' because we will appear before the judgment seat of Christ. Let's voluntarily go before Jesus Christ while we are in the day of grace and not the day of judgment.

"For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead:" v.14. It is kind of interesting. If Jesus Christ died for all of us, then we were all dead, and that dovetails with Romans. "For

all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23. So we know we're there. We've verified that. "And that He died for all..." - you and I - "...that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again." II Corinthians 5:15. can't really do that unless we realize how sovereign God is and that He died for all. Let's not be a respecter of persons because a person's not fun, in a different social class, or in a different place in life. No, God died for every one of us. He looks at all of us as equals.

Henceforth – from here forward – "Wherefore henceforth know we no man after the flesh: yea, though we have known Christ after the flesh, yet now henceforth know we him no more." v.16. He is gone. He is risen.

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold all things are become new." v.17. That has an impact. "And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation" v.18. – spreading forth the Gospel, to witness - "To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation." v.19. So he's telling the Corinthians here, old things are passed away and become new (v.17). I believe he is telling the Corinthians, 'You are converted. You are a child of God, and you have a job to do.' Listen to this job and let's take note of this. All things are of God who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ. We have our salvation. We are reconciled to God through the salvation that is in Jesus Christ. And hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation. Is that a job description? A minister is someone who serves. We have different ministries in governSermon continued from page 41

ments. It's a servant that does good things. So we have the job to serve of getting out the message of reconciliation.

What is the message of reconciliation? To wit – I am going to use the word 'witness' there. This is our message of reconciliation. God was in Christ. Christ was born. He is real. He was the Son of God reconciling the world unto Himself. The world is the fish flopping. All of us are dying, and God sent Jesus Christ that He could put us back in His presence, in the fish tank, so we could live. He's reconciling that to us through Jesus Christ. In real terms, that's so we can have forgiveness of sins – that we can be reconciled back to God because sin is a wall between us and God.

So the witness – we need to tell this, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them. Not imputing our trespasses unto us. I don't want to take too much liberty here. For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). And hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation. That's a responsibility.

God has given us the responsibility. His Spirit is within us, and we are in His kingdom. His Spirit is sovereign within us and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation which we just read in the verse above that.

What is that story of reconciliation? Can we give a testimony in a moment of time? You're in an airport and you are walking by and you have ten seconds by somebody. Can you give a witness to them of reconciliation of God? Brothers and Sisters, we shouldn't be fumbling for words. That should be our life. We should understand it. It should be ingrained in us. Now some of us have different talents. I agree. Some are verbal. Some are not verbal, but we should, in a moment's notice, be able to witness the story of God's reconciliation to us through Jesus Christ. There are some points in life with which we should not fumble or flounder. This is the truth. This is the mandate according to these verses God has given us. Are we taking that seriously? We can get diverted. What are we going to do tomorrow? Any of you have a job list? Some things you have to worry about? Some things you have to take care of? Is it

instantly on our tongue – that message of reconciliation? Knowing it is not of us. It is from Him.

"Now then we are ambassadors for Christ..." – we are His representative – "...as though God did beseech you by us..." – God is sending this message to you, which are the Corinthians, by us, which is Paul and the Apostles – "...we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God." II Corinthians 5:20. Be ye reconciled to God. What's that reconciliation? We know it's through Jesus Christ. Let's have it on our tongue. Let's be able to verbalize it in a moment's notice. Let's be able to live it 100% of the time.

This is the clincher probably — verse 21 "For he..." — God — "...hath made him..." — Jesus Christ — "...to be sin for us..." Jesus — "...who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him" — Jesus. That's the story of reconciliation. We should probably memorize that verse. We could probably rattle it off in about ten seconds. I believe God has given us a mandate to live and to express the story of our reconciliation to God through Jesus Christ. Let's make sure that we are reconciled to God.

Update On ACCFS Services

We are thankful for the opportunities that God has given us to serve. We feel privileged to be able to encourage the spiritual, emotional, and relational growth of those we come in contact. While some of our services are directed toward those who are struggling, over time, more and more of our services are geared toward spiritual and personal growth, enrichment, and prevention. This month this column will be devoted to informing you about the current status of our services. But, first, we would like to share a staff update:

New Staff Member: ACCFS would like to welcome Sis. Whitney Indermuhle (Smithville) to our staff. She, her husband Jason, and their 2 daughters, Aniya and Kezra, plan to move to Central Illinois in October. She plans to start work at ACCFS on October 24th and will be working 3 days / week. Her areas of focus will primarily be depression, body image and eating disorders, marriage counseling, career counseling, and substance abuse. Welcome Whitney!

Overview of ACCFS Services: It is common for us to hear people say, "I didn't know that ACCFS offered that!" Therefore, we would like to remind you about the types of services that ACCFS offers.

Website: Our website (www.accounseling.org) is intended to make helpful information available whenever it is needed. The site provides information on mental health, relationships, and personal growth. Under each topic you can find helpful information to read, download, or print. Individuals can learn about how to find help for themselves or for loved ones. Online ordering of brochures and books is available. Information is being added to the site regularly. You can also subscribe to periodic informational emails.

ing: ACCFS provides individual, marital, and family counseling for those who can travel to the office at 515 E. Highland in Morton, IL. Hours are by appointment only. The clinical counselors are trained mental health professionals who provide counseling from within a Christian framework that supports

the doctrine and traditions of the Apostolic

Clinical and Discipleship Counsel-

Christian Church of America. The discipleship counselors are brothers and sisters with spiritual gifts involved in counseling, such as exhortation, teaching, and mercy. They provide discipleship, mentoring, teaching, and counseling based on biblical principles and in

support of the doctrine and traditions of the

Apostolic Christian Church of America. Many people choose to come to ACCFS because they have the assurance that their faith background will be respected and protected. Fees for counseling are based on a sliding fee scale based on annual family income. No one will be denied services because of inability to pay.

Consultations with a Clinical Counselor: People calling ACCFS can receive a free 30 minute triage consultation with one of the clinical counselors. Calls are received from people needing assistance for themselves, family members of those struggling, and from elders/ ministers who are assisting people. Counselors can help callers understand mental health issues and relationship problems and develop a plan of action to deal with these issues. This service is available to all of our churches by calling ACCFS at 309-263-5536 or our toll free number 877-370-9988.

Counseling Referral Information:

People calling ACCFS can request information regarding counseling resources in their area. ACCFS maintains a database of mental health professionals located near Apostolic Christian Churches throughout the United States. Our goal in providing this service is to help struggling people find mental health professionals who are located near the caller's home area, have strong clinical skills and good credentials, and will be respectful of their client's religious beliefs and faith backgrounds. The ACCFS referral database includes counselors, psychologists, psychiatrists, specialty clinics, and support groups. In the event we do not have any referral sources in the caller's area, we will help the caller to find one.

Education: ACCFS counselors can provide presentations to churches or to smaller groups (such as the ministers of a church or Young Groups). Presentations may cover mental health, relationships, personal growth, or more specific issues for the ministers. ACCFS has books, brochures, and handouts available (screened or created by staff) covering mental, relationship, and personal growth. These can be obtained by calling ACCFS or by going to our website. Some of the print materials are specifically intended for support of elders and ministers as they work with individuals.

Financial Stewardship (Crown Program): ACCFS has been given the responsibility of overseeing the ongoing development of the financial stewardship program (Crown

Program) in the Apostolic Christian Church of America. Print materials that have been specifically modified for our church and are available through the Apostolic Christian Publications website (www.acpublications. org). ACCFS is available to help implement the Crown program in their local churches.

Apostolic Christian Way of Purity:

ACWP is a 60-lesson biblically-based accountability program for individuals struggling with sexual temptation, pornography, etc. Each participant is assigned to a mentor who provides support, feedback, and guidance. The participant completes daily Bible study lessons which are then emailed or faxed to a mentor. Anyone wanting to enroll in the ACWP program needs to get the approval of their home elder. If you have questions about the program, call ACCFS or send an email to acwp@accounseling.org.

Mentor Training Program: ACCFS developed a Mentor Training Program for members of the Apostolic Christian Church of America. The mentoring program focuses on teaching individuals and couples the skills of effective mentoring. Elders identify brothers and/or sisters in their local congregation to send to the mentor training available through ACCFS. The mentors then work under the direction of the local elder.

Mental Health Forum: The counselors at ACCFS provide information, guidance, and mentoring to members and friends of the Apostolic Christian Church of America who work in or are interested in going into a mental health related field. Our goal is to offer encouragement while promoting spiritual integrity and accountability. We maintain a directory of the individuals on the Forum to encourage networking and support. If you know of someone in or going into a mental health related field, please encourage them to contact us!

Funding: A sliding fee scale based on annual income is used for counseling and consultations. No one is refused services based on inability to pay. There is no fee charged for using the website. The remainder of the funding is from churches and individuals who want to support the work of ACCFS and from churches that have received services and choose to make donations to cover the cost. Once again we thank you for your prayers and support.

This issue of Remembering will center on the Minister's Book, a publication that has been published periodically since 1945 — and serves to list ministers, elders, and data reflecting the location of local congregations. Membership totals of the churches along with attendance and the number of students in Sunday school give a glimpse of activity across the Apostolic Christian Church. Excerpts are taken from the second edition of Marching to Zion, published in 2008.

The "Minister's Book"

Bro. Orel Steiner of Oakville, Iowa, had published a booklet entitled *Apostolic Christian Churches and Ministers* (referred to as the *Minister's book*) which listed the various churches in America, Canada, and Japan. This handy book has proven very useful, both as a reference guide and in providing cohesion and familiarity among the churches.

The first issue of this book was published in 1945. Two hundred copies were printed with only the churches and their ministers listed. At that time there were approximately 55 churches, 143 ministers and 17 elders. By 1980, it had been revised and updated eleven times. By 2006, a total of 14,300 books were distributed.

The idea to publish a book of this type was born in 1936 when Bro. Orel Steiner, then of Morton, Illinois, and Bro. Ervin Rokey of Morton, but formerly of Sabetha-Bern, Kansas, used to visit after mid-week services in the apartment of Ira and Carolyn Rokey in Morton. The idea of compiling a list of all the Apostolic Christian

Churches and ministers was suggested to them. They were not married and had the time to devote to this project. In the winter of 1936, they began gathering data. Minister Ben Heiniger of Morton, an uncle to Bro. Orel, helped them.

In 1939, Bro. Orel Steiner married Sis. Rose Thomas and moved to his father's farm near Oakville, Iowa. He took his notes and materials with him. Getting married and moving to a new location likely deterred his attention from his book on the church's statistics. It was not until the fall of 1944 that he began organizing his materials and then sent them to a printer in Burlington, Iowa.

The various editions have been favorably received. Over the years, many brethren have made helpful suggestions to make the book more useful and factual. Elder Joe Klopfenstein, Gridley, Illinois, was remembered by Bro. Steiner as one who was helpful in offering ideas for the book. Too, Elder Emil Schubert, Peoria, Illinois, who baptized him, was appreciative of the book.

The book was printed every three years until 1994 when publication was changed to every other year. As time unfolded, members across the land have eagerly looked forward to the new updates.

The offspring of Bro. Orel Steiner continue to help produce this book. This includes ministering Bro. John Steiner (Oakville, Iowa), Bro. Tom Steiner (Oakville, Iowa), Sis. Elaine Eisenmann (Burlington, Iowa), and Sis. Martha Wiegand and Sis. Patty Steiner (Oakville, Iowa). The widow of Bro. Steiner, Sis. Rose Thomas

Steiner (Oakville, Iowa) also helped with the proofreading. Beginning with the 1992 issue, the book was produced on a computer by Sis. Martha Wiegand.

The *Minister's Book* is used extensively when traveling (on vacations, business, etc.) as travelers can find the nearest church in which to worship. Also, on a local basis, if anyone needs information about a church, a minister, or an elder, they can access this book.

And because each minister and elder is listed, it surely adds a profound sense of familiarity across the brotherhood. From an analytical-historical basis, this book serves as a binding agent among the brethren. If it did not exist, our level of being familiar with our many churches and ministers/elders would be much lower than it is today.

Two improvements were made in the 1990s. In addition to the $5\ 1/2\ x\ 8\ 1/2$ book, a pocket-sized one was also published (4" x 6"). The books were then printed with a spiral binding, and this made the pages much easier to turn.

Essentially, this book serves as a handy informational tool, and those who produce it are to be commended, and God is to be thanked.

The Light Of Hope

"Counting The Cost"

Jesus talked about counting the cost when contemplating becoming His disciple. "And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it." Luke 14:27, 28

Was Jesus uninformed about salvation being a free gift? He knew that He would die for us and then rise three days later. This He explained to His disciples but still He talked about the cost of being His disciple.

In evangelical circles the cost of becoming Jesus' disciple, or the cost of being saved, is rarely if ever spoken about. Why is that? Something that the Lord Jesus Christ spoke about so earnestly, and warned that if you don't first count the cost you may not be able to finish the task of being Jesus' disciple, should be shared with everyone who might be a candidate for repentance and conversion.

It may be that this is not usually spoken of because it is considered to be counter- productive if you want many people to make a profession of faith. That profession doesn't take very long and doesn't cause any inconvenience or self-denial. The rewards promised for a profession of faith are great and eternal so many may jump at the opportunity to have "all this and heaven, too."

Yet, Christ taught us to count the cost. What does our salvation cost? First and foremost, it cost Christ His own life's blood, after suffering much abuse and ridicule. That is a very high cost for the gift of salvation for you

and me.

What does the gift of salvation cost us? It costs us ourselves. If we really believe and desire to be Christ's disciple, which indicates that we have received the gift of salvation, we should follow Paul's exhortation in Romans 12:1, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." The cost to us is our bodies as a living sacrifice.

Part of the cost to us is that we are called to obedience. If we refuse to obey what God's Word teaches us, is that not an indication that there may be something wrong with our faith? God will be the judge but it is a concern. Romans 1:5 reads, "By whom we have received grace and apostleship, for obedience to the faith among all nations, for his name." According to this verse, after conversion we have received grace, not for salvation but for obedience. Obedience to God's Word is not always convenient. However, it is the best way to live.

Other verses also indicate that there is a cost for being Christ's disciple, or for salvation. Matthew 16:24 reads, "Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." This verse teaches us that self-denial is part of the cost of being Christ's disciple.

You or I might say, "I don't want to be a disciple, I just want to be saved." Is that possible? Let's not take a chance on that one. I understand that when Christ spoke of being His disciple He equated that with being saved. Another aspect of the cost of being saved has to do with service. Jesus did teach that as children of God we are to be servants. Matthew 20:27, "And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant."

Supposing God gives you the conviction to help spread the Gospel to another country. There is the cost of learning a foreign language and of adjusting to a different culture. That may not be so easy. There is a cost. There is also a cost of time and patience to visit the sick and needy in your own local church. You are not your own, you are bought with a price, the blood of Jesus Christ.

Believers are called upon to have unity and to speak the same thing. That does not come without cost. You must lose yourself, you must be humble. Even if you are humble, there may not be unity as we would desire for it to be. People are different and differences arise. Even Paul and Barnabas had their differences. "And the contention was so sharp between them, that they departed asunder one from the other." Acts 15:39. There is a price to pay for unity and harmony among God's children. The cost is humility and a willingness to take the short end.

Jesus said we should count the cost before we start to build our spiritual house. It will cost us our own selves but strangely enough, a life of obedience to God's Word is the best life to live. We can rest in the Lord, we can have a deep joy and peace. Count the cost and go for it. We are no good at running our own lives anyway.
